CUT A GREAT COAST CANAL

Is the Object of the Mississippi to the
Atlantic Waterways Association,
Now Assembled in Jacksonville

Jacksonville, Fla., Nov. 16.—Con-
nection of the Mississippi and the Atlan-
tic by means of a great inland water-
way is the principal object of the con-
vention called in this city yesterday.
The Mississippi-to-Atlantic Inland
Waterways Association, of which Sen-
ator Duncan U. Fletcher, of Florida, is
president, is in charge of the conven-
tion. The aims of the convention are
announced as follows:

"Peeling that the full industrial de-
velopment of the southeastern states
must depend on improved transporta-
tion facilities, we favor the adoption
and prompt execution of a compre-
hensive plan of waterway improvement.
We especially favor and call for the
construction of a deep inland water-
way along the eastern Gulf coast, to
connect the Mississippi river with the
Atlantic ocean, together with the im-
provement of the Gulf slope rivers, in
such manner as to open up new terri-
tory to water transportation.

"We favor the execution of the work
under federal appropriations adequate
for prompt and certain completion of
the entire project; and, in case the
state of the public treasury forbids
sufficient appropriation at an early
date, we favor the issuance of bonds
in such amount as to insure the com-
pletion of the work in a business-like
manner."

The convention is being attended by
hundreds of enthusiastic delegates.
Governor Giehrst was present and
made an elaborate and logical speech.

HOMICIDE AT OAK HILL

One of Volusia's County Commis-
sioners Compelled to Shoot in Self-
Defense

New Smyrna, Nov. 16.—County Com-
missioner S. R. Owens shot and im-
mediately killed W. F. Robinson at Oak
Hill, twelve miles from this place,
Saturday night about dark. Owens
and Robinson met near the depot.
They spoke and Mr. Robinson told
Owens he wanted to rent a house from
him. Owens told him that his houses
were all rented but one and that he
wanted to use part of that himself,
and he told Robinson that he did not
think that they could live in the same
house peacefully. Robinson became
very angry. Owens turned to walk
away from Robinson, when the latter
caught him by the lapel of his coat
and began to slash him with his pocket
knife. Owens drew his revolver and
began firing and did not stop until
Robinson fell with one bullet through
the heart and two in the head.

Owens was wounded in five different
places. One cut on the back of the
neck would probably have been fatal
if it had not been for the linen collar
he wore, which was cut in two. Even
as it was there was an ugly gash on
the side of his neck. The verdict of
the coroner's jury was that the killing
was justifiable.

Owens is a prominent turpentine
operator at Oak Hill. Robinson was
a saw mill man. He leaves a family.

tion declaring the United States
Steel Corporation "a most aggressive
and formidable enemy to the organ-
ized movement."

SHERIFF SHIPP SENTENCED

The Supreme Court Gave Him Ninety
Days' Imprisonment and His Dep-
uties Shorter Terms

Washington, Nov. 16.—Ninety days'
imprisonment was imposed yesterday
upon former Sheriff J. F. Shipp of
Chattanooga, Tenn., by the supreme
court of the United States for con-
tempt of court in failing to prevent
the lynching of a negro named John-
son, convicted of rape, but whose ex-
ecution had been stayed by the court.
Luther Williams and Nick Nolan
were sentenced to imprisonment for
ninety days in connection with the
lynching. Jeremiah Gibson, jailer,
Henry Padgett and William Mayes,
all of Chattanooga, Tenn., got sixty
days. Chief Justice Fuller, who pro-
nounced the sentence, designated the
United States jail in the District of
Columbia as the place of imprison-
ment.
