## ONLY PROLONGED THE AGONY

Nine Men Escaped from Car Ferry No. 2 to Freeze to Death in an Open Boat

Erie, Pa., Dec. 14.—With her flag at half mast, the state fisheries boat Commodore Perry, Capt. Jerry Driscoll commanding, brought to this port yesterday the dead and frozen bodies of nine of the crew of the Bessemer and Marquette Ferry No. 2, which left Conneaut, O., Tuesday morning, carrying 32 men and which probably founded. For the past 48 hours the Commodore Perry had been scouring the waters of eastern Lake Erie for traces of the car ferry, but until a tiny ten man yawl was sighted fifteen miles off this port had almost given up hope of being able to ever tell a portion of the story of the fate of the big car ferry.

The Perry came abreast of the drifting and half waterlogged yawl, the men gathered at the side of the fish boat say that they had arrived too late. The nine occupants of the boat, which was marked "Bessemer and Marquette No. 4," were frozen stiff in death. Taking the yawl in tow the Perry made all steam for this port.

The cook of the car ferry was the only man to wear an overcoat. The eight other men were dressed in overalls and jumpers, indicating that the departure from the ferry boat had been hurried. In the bow of the boat was found complete clothing for one man, and it is believed that the yawl originally contained ten men and that one, becoming crazed, had discarded his clothing and jumped into the icy waters.

Albert J. Weis of this city, treasurer of the Keystone Fish company and the Blair State Iron Works, was a passenger on the ill-fated boat. His relatives and friends had not yet given up hope until the boat containing the nine men was towed into this port. His body has not been found.

Officials of the car ferry company stated that the loss of the ferry, including the cargo, would amount to \$50,000. The vessel was valued at \$150,000, while the cargo was worth at least \$50,000.

He was injured on the side and it is feared internally hurt. His machine was wrecked.

## THREE INDICTMENTS AGAINST JOEL AND GLICKSTEIN

The final report of the federal grand jury, made to Judge Locke Saturday afternoon of last week, contained indictments against Harry Glickstein and L. D. Joel, both of whom are well known merchants of this city. Glickstein was adjudged a bankrupt last year upon a voluntary petition, and it is charged in one of the indictments that he made false statements regarding his interest in the Railroad Wreck Sale at Ocala. Another indictment charged him with having concealed certain goods of merchandise.

A third indictment was returned against Glickstein and L. D. Joel, charging them with conspiracy in the above mentioned bankruptcy proceedings. Glickstein and Joel were arrested this morning and were given a hearing before Judge Locke, who fixed bond in the sums of \$2,500 and \$1,000 respectively. The required amounts were promptly furnished by the defendants, and a further hearing of the cases will probably be given later during the present session of the federal court—Jacksonville Metropolis, 13th.

## DAMP STATE OR DRY?

Fight Next Fall will be to a Finish.  
Both Sides are Preparing for the Battle

Tallahassee, Fla., Dec. 14.—While on

the surface of things the coming senatorial fight promises to be the big event in Florida politics next year,

there are forces silently working

throughout the state preparing for a

fight which will erupt in bitter feel-

ing and hard fighting any political

struggle which has had Florida in its

grasp for years. The famous McMullen

prohibition resolution will be

voted upon by the people of the state

next November. If a majority of the

electors declare for it state-wide pro-

hibition will be inscribed upon the orga-

nization law of the state. If not, local

option will still prevail.

Controlled from Jacksonville

The fight against the measure is going

to be controlled from Jacksonville. An organization is understood to have

been formed in that city already to

aid in the fight. It is stated that this

organization is made up entirely of

business men connected in no way

whatever with the saloons. It is also

generally understood over the state

that Pleasant A. Holt of Jacksonville

will manage the campaign. There are

few able politicians in Florida and if

he is at the helm the fight made

against the state-wide measure will be

a hard one.

ure a new newspaper has been launch-

ed at Tallahassee, edited by John C.

Trice, who for many years was enga-

ged in newspaper work in the state,

but who has retired from it for several

years because of his health. The paper
