## SWIFT REPORT ON NAVY YARDS

IT IS IN THE HANDS OF SECRETARY MEYER, WHO IS GIVING IT CAREFUL CONSIDERATION, ACCORDING TO WASHINGTON SPECIAL.

The New Orleans Times-Democrat recently contained the following special from its Washington correspondent:

"So important does Secretary Meyer consider the report of the Swift board, which has investigated the southern navy yards, that he decided today to cancel his engagement to go to New Orleans with President Taft. Instead he will hide himself in Massachusetts for a week or ten days to give it careful consideration.

The report, it is understood, recommends the abolition of the Southern navy yards, in that respect following the recommendation of the general board of two years ago, which was acted upon, so far as the New Orleans station is concerned, by Secretary Newberry a few hours before he went out of office. The suggestion has been made that Secretary Meyer has determined to follow the lead of his predecessor and decided not to become the guest of New Orleans."

## CHANGES IN CAR SERVICE

CONSTRUCTION WORK CAUSES A CHANGE ON NORTH AND WEST HILLS, AND PART OF THE BELT LINES.

Street car patrons will do well to read and be governed accordingly the following, issued yesterday:

Notice to the Public.

Beginning Tuesday, October 19th, and until further notice, through service on the West Hill line will be discontinued on account of construction work, and West Hill patrons will take North Hill car, transferring to West Hill line at LaRue and DeVilliers streets.

On Wednesday morning, and until further notice, service will be discontinued on that portion of Gregory street between DeVilliers and Palafox streets. North Hill cars will continue south on DeVilliers street to Government street, east on Government to Palafox and south on Palafox to the wharf, leaving the wharf on the even hour and every ten minutes thereafter.

A Belt car will operate on that portion of the Belt line east of Palafox street, i. e., from the Transfer Station to the American National Bank building, the western half of the Belt line being taken care of by North Hill cars.
