## SLOW PAYMENT OF POLL TAXES

Only a Small Number Are Qualifying for Special Election.

Only a small number of persons who are registered have qualified for the special election of October 1 by paying their poll taxes, and unless the number increases to a material extent the registration books will show only a small increase over the number of qualified voters now on the books.

It was expected that when the books were opened that the qualified vote of the county would be largely increased, but so far that has not been the case, and not one hundred have qualified since the books were opened.

There still remain, however, ten days in which those desiring can qualify, and it is expected that a few days before the closing day large numbers will call and settle their taxes. The books show a total of about 5,000 registered voters, but of this number only about 3,000 are now qualified to vote.
