PENSACOLA COMMISSION CO.'S DAILY MARKET REVIEW. Cotton yesterday opened 5 to 7 points ower on weaker cables and during the first hour sold 3 to 5 points below the opening calls because of a continued weakening abroad. Toward market became more steady and advanced 10 to 15 points over the low and closed near the top prices. Liverpool closed weak but the American markets gained some encouragement from the financial shownings and the improvement in stocks. Spots were unchanged but showed a fair demand.

The stock market opened unchanged to advance, but during the morning sold off a fraction to 1 point on realizing. Toward noon the market again assumed a more bouyant spirit and prices rapidly advanced to new higher Since the break in the early fall, Sugar leading with a gain of \$7.50 per share over the close of the day previous. Other good issues showed gains of 1 to 1 points and closed near the top. Money showed an improvement, and call rates varied from 6 to 10 per cent.

Wheat opened 1-4 to 5-8 higher, but sold off 1 3-8 cents for May early in the morning under realizing, a slackening of the demand and lower foreign prices, closing 1 cent below the first call. Corn was unchanged to an advance of 1-4 at the opening, but eased off 1 cent under realizing and a let up in demand, closing a fraction over the low. Oats were firm at about the closing prices of the day previous, the market being quiet.


