## Proposed bill allowing cities to provide ambulances killed

DAYTONA BEACH — After area representatives decided against it this week, a proposed Florida House bill that would have allowed cities with populations of at least 30,000 to provide their own ambulance service will not be considered in the next legislative session.

The Volusia County delegation, elected state officials who represent

the area, pulled the bill after hearing opinions from local citizens and government officials.

The Daytona Beach City Commission had shown support for the legislation.

The Ormond Beach City Commission voted to not support the proposed bill and an EVAC spokesman said allowing cities to start their own service would be disruptive.

Currently, EVAC, operated by the nonprofit company Emergency

Medical Foundation, Inc. is the only entity allowed to operate an ambulance service in Volusia County.

Daytona Beach Fire Chief Gary Hughes said the city could provide better service and the revenue stream would offset the cost of the city's fire department.

He said the department already

has the equipment and the

## Life is a 'grind' for skaters at park they helped design

DAYTONA BEACH — The new Skate Park in Daytona Beach was designed with a lot of input from actual skateboarders. That's why recreation director Percy Williamson said he believes it's the "finest skate park in the country."

It features an urban scene with stairs and railings so the skaters can grind, jump and do all the things they are now doing on public property.

"Local kids helped design it," Mr.

Williamson said. "We had a series of meetings with actual skateboarders and they told us what they wanted. So we have an eight-foot bowl, a half pipe, a ramp and all the features they asked for."

The facility is also open to BMX bikers and in-line skaters.

Mr. Williamson said there is a huge skateboard community in Daytona Beach and they are very excited about the park.

"I came here in 2003 and I've been working on this ever since," he said.

Mr. Williamson said he believes

the city will be able to host skateboarding competitions and bring in revenue in the future.

Skateboarders are not all kids.

"The age range goes to the late 40s," Mr. Williamson said. "The typical skateboarder is between seven and 20 but there is a significant middle age population that still skateboards."

He said that hopefully the park will alleviate some of the skateboarding problems at the Daytona Beach Bandshell, courthouse and City Hall.

"The police won't have to chase

them off," he said.

The new facility, located at Bethune Point Park on South Beach Street, is open seven days a week from 7:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m.

All minors must have a waiver signed by a parent. Skaters 17 and under are required to wear helmets and knee and elbow pads. BMX bikes must be equipped with "park pegs" which prevent damage to the concrete, and riders must wear certified helmets.

The park was funded with a \$400,000 ECHO grant and \$400,000 from the city's general fund.

## Wilhite now faces civil suits and criminal charges

VOLUSIA COUNTY — E Douglas Wilhite, the shaggy-headed on-air personality and owner of WELE-AM 1380, has more than just multiple criminal charges alleging the sexual victimization of minors to face in court now. This week, the guardians of two alleged victims filed civil suits in Seventh Circuit Court asking for jury trials against Mr. Wilhite and his wife, Sherry.

In July, the self-avowed nudist was charged with sexually assaulting, on multiple occasions, a teenage boy living at the couple's Ormond Beach home. Then, in mid-October, 15 new charges came from the testimony of seven more teenagers, boys and girls between the ages of 14 and 16: contributing to the delinquency of several minors, lewd and lascivious conduct, exposure and showing children pornography.

In reports, police have described an environment rife with booze and nudity, drugs and porn. On Oct. 15, when Mr. Wilhite was being

arrested for the second time this year at his grand Walnut Court house, the 56-year-old again answered the door in full-frontal nudity. During the first arrest, officers finally convinced him to put some clothes on. This time, nightly news reports showed he decided to go to jail wrapped in a shiny blanket provided by police.

Mr. Wilhite is accused of prodding the teens with alcohol, prescription drugs and porn between February and May, then encouraging them on several occasions to get naked and have sex with the 15-year-old boy in the couple's care while watching and masturbating.

"This is not a case about the defendant's lifestyle, the nudist lifestyle," said Volusia County Sheriff's Office spokesman Gary David-See WILHITE, A11

## B-CU grad hopes to 'Repower America'

DAYTONA BEACH — A Bethune-Cookman University graduate is doing his part to get America plugged in to clean energy.

Keon Williams graduated last year with a degree in political science and since last June has worked for Repower America, a nonprofit organization launched by former vice president Al Gore in 2008.

Repower America, and its state affiliates, called Repower Florida, advocate clean, renewable and efficient energy sources.

Mr. Williams, who previously worked on President Barack Obama's election campaign, is the Repower Florida field organizer for Volusia, Flagler and Brevard counties and said he has been talking to fraternities, clubs and other groups at local universities.

"The biggest initiative I've been talking about is the Repower Wall," Mr. Williams said.

The Web site repoweramerica.org has a "wall" where people can place their own video with a statement about the need for protecting the environment and converting to clean energy.

Mr. Williams said it replaces the old-fashioned petition.

"It's amazing. Everybody is responding well to it," he said. "It's a way of using new media in the technology age. Legislators can view the wall and see how many people in their district are concerned about the environment."

One of the points Mr. Williams makes in his talks is that converting

# City to hold Riverfest next weekend

ORMOND BEACH — Something divides Ormond Beach.

But the divider, the Halifax River, is an important part of the city and will be celebrated in a new festival at Rockefeller Gardens and Fortunato Park.

The river provides beautiful scenery and recreational opportunities and will be the focal point in Riverfest on Nov. 21 and 22. The event will feature food, music, rowing on the river and much more.

Maggie Sacks said Ormond MainStreet, a nonprofit organization that promotes the area, has been working on the plans for a year, and she thinks it will be the biggest festival ever in the city.

"With the new Rockefeller Gardens we thought it would be a perfect time to promote the area and the natural beauty of the river," she said. "We've got this beautiful river and it's really underused. We want to celebrate it and the natural environment."

The event is free except for food and beverages.

Thirty-five bands, mostly folk music and bluegrass, will entertain on three different stages on both days and food will be sold by local restaurants.

"Most of these musicians

play all over the state at places like the Suwannee River Festival," Ms. Sacks said.

Kayak races will run from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Satur-

day, sponsored by the Ormond Beach Kayak Center. All skill levels will be able to participate.

The races will be sprints from Fortunato Park to Rockefeller Gardens.

Other attractions include a market place, a display of fire engines and other trucks, a children's corner, and for adults, a beer and wine garden.

Kicking off the event at 8 a.m. Saturday will be the Pilgrim's Family Fun Run/Walk. Those who wish to participate are asked to bring a non-perishable food item for the Halifax Urban Ministries (food can be dropped off even if you do not partici-

partate.) The route will be two miles, said Ric Henderson, run/walk organizer and member of Ormond Mainstreet.



The walkers/runners will walk under the bridge from the Casements to Fortunato Park, and then over the bridge over to Cassan Park and then back over the bridge to Rockefeller Gardens.

"I know this is two miles because I paced it off with a measuring device," Mr. Henderson said.

Mr. Henderson suggested that clubs or businesses walk together to show their support for the city or Halifax Urban Ministries.

Registration for the run/walk will be available from 6:30 to 7:15 a.m. Opening ceremonies will be conducted by Mayor Fred Costello at 7:45 a.m. and the run/walk will begin at 8 a.m.



The Riverwalk concept has been discussed by the City Commission for years. Ormond Beach Mayor Fred Costello does not have any authority to "hire architects" or "spend the people's money," and has never done either.

The staff did and the cost was within the spending authority of the city manager.

The city commission authorized staff to investigate a concept that would provide a riverfront restaurant anchor for the downtown area and any parking spaces and benches would be public. The Riverwalk, with or without a restaurant, will be totally for the people to gather. These are conceptual plans, which do not go through the planning board. If the project were to graduate to site plan, then it is possible it could go as a special exception, which would require planning board review and then City Commission review.

Mayor Costello has requested that Ormond MainStreet weigh in on the conceptual plans before the project advances and is on record that he will support what Ormond MainStreet recommends. Mayor Costello has stated that he believes Ormond MainStreet will recommend the project be downsized so as to keep Pilgrims' Rest Church in its current location, and as previously stated he plans to support their recommendation. Staff is also meeting with the Ormond Beach Chamber to discuss the project and receive their feedback. In addition, a public workshop is planned for December/January.

Police said the new boyfriend, Dustin Lind and the ex, Jordan Hess agreed to meet at the bandshell to settle their differences. Several of Lind's friends came to help him, and police said when someone in the other group started to beat up Mr. Lind, his friends took out a knife. Police said Raymond North, 23, stabbed Robin Wunsch, 16, once in the chest, killing her. Desiree Juras, 22, suffered two stab wounds and the ex boyfriend, Hess, was stabbed in the upper arm. Suspect North escaped, according to police, with the help of Dallas Mobbs and Carl Beck. All three were later arrested at an apartment in South Daytona. While North is charged with first-degree murder, the other men face accessory charges. Despite their gang affiliation, police don't believe the stabbings were motivated by gang related activities.

### Judge will receive reprimand

The State Supreme Court will publicly reprimand a Volusia County judge for her dealings with a convicted felon. The judicial qualifications commission recommended the sanction in August after it found Judge Mary Jane Henderson demeaned the office by

loaning Henry Wheeler money for an apartment, cell phone, cab fare and other things. Judge Henderson acknowledged her actions gave the appearance of impropriety. A date for the reprimand before the high court hasn't been set.

### Sarah Palin to speak at chamber event

Former Republican Vice Presidential candidate Sarah Palin will be the guest speaker at the annual Daytona Beach/Halifax area chamber of commerce meeting. Chamber officials confirm Ms. Palin has committed to an hour speaking engagement at the Feb. 15 meeting. The chamber is currently soliciting sponsors for the event and won't reveal Ms. Palin's speaking fee.

### Governor visits area school

Governor Charlie Crist recently stopped at Hinson Middle School in Daytona Beach to applaud a program designed to help break the poverty cycle for homeless and disadvantaged school children. Resident and community activist Forough Hosseini created the program called Food Brings Hope. Governor Crist met with children who are part of the program in six area elementary and middle schools. Organizers offer tutoring and nutritional information and reach out to families to ensure kids have enough to eat. The governor called the program, which has seen stunning success as grades and

school attendance improves, the kind of effort we should all be involved in, helping one another. The program is funded by a community endowment that focuses on needs other social service organizations don't address.

### Food drive a success

Florida Hospital Memorial in Daytona Beach was delighted that a two-day effort to fill the pantries at local charities was a success. They believe they reached their goal of 7,500 pounds of food. The eighth annual food drive was organized by Hospital Chaplain Farzad Nourian, who said the need is greater this year with new families who had not struggled before, now needing community help just to survive.

### County looking for input on bridge

Volusia County officials have sent out notices to area residents who live in and around the Veterans Memorial Bridge on Orange Avenue, asking them for input on what should be done with one of the few remaining draw bridges in the county. The bridge, built in the mid '50s, is rundown and deteriorating and has parts so obsolete, county officials can no longer get replacement parts. It costs nearly a million dollars for yearly maintenance and the bridge often gets stuck or has to be closed for days on end. A high-rise bridge is among options the county is considering, but a new high-rise would cost more than \$50 million and the

county could not shoulder that without significant state and federal help. The county will also consider ongoing rehabilitation until they just can't any longer and they may even think of removing the bridge entirely.

### Lottery ticket was never claimed

The winner didn't beat the clock and a small fortune slipped through his or her fingers. Lottery officials told WESH 2 a winning fantasy five ticket, purchased in Ormond Beach, went unclaimed. The ticket was purchased at a Kangaroo Express on U.S. Highway One near Airport Road in the May 6 drawing. The jackpot was shared by four winners, but only three came forward before the recent deadline. Whoever had, and probably lost the winning ticket, lost out on a share worth more than \$58,000.

### Woman turns in live grenade

Police officers see a lot on the job, but this was one for the books recently in South Daytona when someone brought a live grenade to the police department. Police said a woman was cleaning out her garage and found an old pistol and the grenade. Her son-in-law boxed them and drove them up to the police department. South Daytona police called the bomb squad in and they quickly learned the grenade was live. Bomb squad officials carefully taped up the pin and took custody to detonate it.

# STRIP MINING: Local man draws Spidey

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Sometime around 1958, just after Alex Saviuk had started grade school in Manhattan, his dad bought him his first comic book, a Superman. A spark alighted in his eyes.

Like everyone else his age, he'd already seen it in black-and-white on the tube.

"I was amazed to see all the color," the now 57-year-old Saviuk said on Tuesday from the kitchen of his modest Port Orange home. "After that, after I had my homework done, I'd be at the kitchen table drawing comics, when everybody else was watching cartoons in the living room."

A notable career has bloomed where that love was rooted. Since 1997, Mr. Saviuk has drawn the Sunday Spider-Man comic strips, with stories directly from the comic God (also known as Stan Lee). On Sunday, he's a featured guest at the sixth-annual Daytona Beach Comic & Toy Show — a local reunion of sorts for the comics-loving set, he said.

He encourages serious artists of all ages to bring their portfolios for an honest-but-encouraging critique, or at least have him sketch up a Spidey on the spot.

Some friends, after hearing him speak to aspiring artists and google-eyed youngsters at conventions, have told him he should teach more. He's thinking over how that would fit into his schedule.

"My mother always said, 'Why don't you get up at 8 and work 9 to 6 like the rest of us?'" he recalls. "But I can't see pictures in the morning."

By the afternoon, he's usually ready, drawn by the deadlines and the images piling up in his brain. Putting pictures of his heroes on paper is still what drives him.

After graduating from the School of Visual Arts in his native

Manhattan, Mr. Saviuk spent a few months doing storyboards for ad agencies until a chance meeting at an East Coast comic book conference with the president of DC Comics, Mr. Saviuk was pimping his own magazine at the show. He bragged to Phil Seuling, the show's organizer, that he'd already sold 500 copies. None of that mattered. They saw his work. They liked it.

"How would you like to work with DC Comics?" Mr. Saviuk recalls the president asking him. He'd been waiting years to hear those words.


That broke Mr. Saviuk in. He ticks off the characters he's drawn, for DC Comics, Marvel and other publishers: Green Lantern. The Flash. Superman. Aquaman. And, of course, Spider-Man.

All around his home are reminders of those early days. He points out a statue of the purple Phantom on the piano in the foyer, mentions how he drew the figure for the sculptor to mold that one. And that one. And... Another bookshelf is stacked with figurines. On the walls is an equal measure of run-of-the-mill home décor and keepsake characters just resting up as Mr. Saviuk's fall-back retirement investment. (As Spidey says on a giant retail display that Mr. Saviuk once drew: "BUY COMICS FOR FUN AND INVESTMENT.")

He moved to Florida in the early '90s for those same kind of financial considerations.

"My family (who already lived) here, they sent floor plans," he said. "We could get a four-bedroom with a yard, no snow to shovel, for the same price as a two-bedroom flat in New York."

A few years later, after sustaining himself with work like an Iron Man book and an X-Files series for TOPPS, Marvel called

It's one of the purist forms of the medium, the strips he now creates. He's watching a new generation of comics being created on computers, but it doesn't worry him.

"There's always going to be the die-hard fans who like to read — wherever they have to do it," he said. "Or, like me, they like picking up something printed and turning the pages, something that's drawn on paper with pen and brush, as opposed to it being done on a computer." Doing the strip is like being able to ignore all that flux.

It's just him and the mission: to communicate as much as he can without the words getting in the way.

In recent years, he's also enjoyed some forays into the film industry, storyboarding movies — some good, some bad — like "Lonely Hearts," "Hoot," Hillary Swank's "The Reaping" and the critic-panned "Never Back Down." It stokes another of Mr. Saviuk's fires.

"Being a solo illustrator, I'm usually holed up in a studio, and as a natural extrovert, it's great working with this big team on a common goal like that," he said.

And all this keeps Mr. Saviuk pretty busy these days. He's not rich, by any means, he says; but he's blessed.

"You have to have a passion to just sit there and keep doing it," he says. "That was always me."

In the dining room, he whips from a case an example of the 6-panel Sunday strip he's been drawing since 1997, then the six 3-panel

dailies he inks. Three signatures are scrawled along the bottom: Saviuk, Stan Lee and his letterer.

capable people that would be necessary. The rescue

trucks are exactly the same as the EVAC ambulances, he said.

“We get there first and do all the work and then the EVAC ambulance rolls in,” he

said. “They take them to the hospital and collect all of the revenue for the trip.”

EVAC spokesman Mark O’Keefe denied that Daytona Beach firefighters get to the scene first.

“Only 1.8 percent of the time, do firefighters provide care before EVAC arrives,” Mr. O’Keefe said.

Daytona Beach City Commissioner Richard Shiver voted to support the bill.

“I was a firefighter for 25 years and I’m sure the fire department can do it more efficiently,” he said. “We have seven fire stations strategically located.”

Mr. O’Keefe said EVAC is an efficient company providing a community service at low cost to the taxpayer.

“Breaking it up would jeopardize public safety by disrupting a coordinated ambulance service,” he said.

The only Daytona Beach commissioner voting against the bill was Shiela McKay-Vaughan, who said it was too simplistic.

“This bill says if you have a population over 30,000 and you want it, you can have it,” she said. “I lean toward the county handling ambulance service but that’s not the issue. There needs to be discussion and negotiation between the city and county.”

The Ormond Beach City Commission was unanimous in voting to not support the bill.

Mayor Fred Costello said Ormond Beach has always sought to work with other cities.

“I think we’ve all said we’re willing to partner with other communities in Volusia County in a mechanism that will provide the highest level of service at the lowest cost,” he said. “We don’t believe we all need to have our own this and our own that. We can share. The swat team is a good example.”

son. "This has to do with illegal acts committed against or in the presence of juveniles. Mr. Wilhite — or anybody else — can walk around their house all day naked if they choose to."

According to police, Mr. Wilhite told two of the girls

that his wife had recently attempted suicide and that he'd feel "oh so much better" if he could just watch them have sex.

The seven most recently revealed victims didn't report having sex with Mr. Wilhite, but five said they got naked to play billiards at Mr. Wilhite's insistence, sheriff's reports state. About half told investigators they had sex

while Mr. Wilhite masturbated — including one alleged incident in Mr. Wilhite's car on their way to church. In other reported incidents, two girls acknowledged having sex with the boy in Mr. Wilhite's care, thinking they were alone, only to spot Mr. Wilhite on a later occasion watching through the bedroom window while he masturbated.

Two girls said Mr. Wilhite grabbed their buttocks; one said he rubbed his genitals against her.

Police began investigating on May 18, when Sherry Wilhite reported the boy had run away. Questions about Mr. Wilhite's lifestyle led the Sheriff's Office's Sex Crimes Unit to investigate.

The boy was found in June, hiding in Virginia. Investiga-

tors were told by the boy about months of sexual abuse. Three months later, they had seven more alleged victims and 15 more criminal charges.


A judge posted \$1.5 million bond in mid-October, then released Mr. Wilhite to home a few days later to prepare for the coming onslaught.

Then this: On Oct. 28, the

guardians of two girls filed suit in Circuit Court seeking a few hundred thousand dollars in damages from the couple for negligent supervision of their children and the "reckless and intentional infliction of emotional distress."

One of the girl's guardians alleges that Mr. Wilhite



# Dietician: how to spend less on better food for your family

**VOLUSIA COUNTY** — Nearly every family could stand to save a few dollars these days. And family meals could probably stand to be healthier and less wasteful.

How to both save money and better feed a family was the topic of a recent talk, "Stretching Your Food Dollars," by registered dietician Jill Taufer.

The best tips to save money and avoid waste? Plan ahead, and around what you already have on hand; make a list; know the essentials and stock up when they're on sale; create

a budget and stick to it; buy what's in season; comparison shop; eat before you go; and if possible, shop more frequently to avoid overbuying and wasting food.

Jim Jamiel of South Daytona said he is lucky to live close enough to his local grocery store that he can walk and shop for just the items he needs, planning his leftover meals as well.

"I cook for myself, and shop every day," he said. "I knew a lot of this information already, but it's always good to learn more."

Mr. Jamiel said he reads the Hometown News' Coupon Queen column every week and has learned

new ways to save by following her advice.

Ms. Taufer recommends "cook once, serve twice," or making double batches and packaging or freezing leftovers immediately to avoid throwing food away. Smart shoppers also buy just the amount of food they can safely store and use before it spoils. Another helpful hint is to take leftovers for lunch, and avoid fast food and ready-to-eat meals that are often unhealthy, over-salted and expensive.

"Plan it, buy it, eat it," was the summary of the session.

Next to wasting a lot of food, Ms. Taufer, who works for the Volusia County/University of Florida Extension office, said Americans also spend too much of their

food budget on meat. To cut down, she said families should try "going vegetarian" a few nights a week, and look for leaner meats on sale. Canned tuna and salmon are high in protein, low in fat, easily stored and inexpensive.

Andrea Hardy of Ormond Beach said beans are a good meat replacement.

"I am always open to new ideas and ways to save," she said. "Beans are cheap, filling, full of protein, good nutrients and fiber. And they can be prepared so many different ways."

Fresh is always best, Ms. Taufer said, and local farmers markets are great places to buy produce at reasonable prices, but frozen fruits and vegetables are also valu-

able. "Next to fresh," Ms. Taufer said, "frozen is best. They often cost less, and are easy to store so you have them available to help you get those five servings."

Before hitting the stores, shoppers should study their grocery store circulars and use the Internet to search out coupons and deals, Ms. Taufer said.

Also, shoppers should be thoughtful at the grocery store.

"The most expensive items are placed at eye level," Ms. Taufer said. "So look up and down, eat before you go to avoid impulse buying, and stay away from the middle aisles, where non-essentials and snacks are often found."

That basic math you learned in school can and should be used on a regular basis at the grocery store, when comparing the prices of store-versus-name brands, and checking the unit prices of similar products. Sometimes a smaller package may be the better buy. Last but not least, be alert and aware as you checkout. Mistakes happen.

## Holly Hill Police remind motorists to 'Lock it or Lose it'

Hoping to halt the easy theft of cars left running as drivers dart into convenience stores or fuel their vehicles, the City of Holly Hill Police Department unveiled a new public awareness campaign recently.

The initiative places warning signs at gas pumps and entrances to convenience stores urging customers to protect their vehicles. In addition, bumper stickers affixed to all Holly Hill police vehicles state: "Lock it or Lose It! Secure your vehicle and Remove all Valuables!"

The bold red adhesive signs identify Florida Statute 316.1975, which prohibits drivers from leaving keys in an unattended motor vehicle at any time.

The sticker signs will be available to all area convenience stores and other "quick stop" businesses such as gas stations and drug stores where people are inclined to leave their cars idling while they run in for "just a minute."

Holly Hill Mayor Roland Via, who assisted in developing the new initiative

and obtained City Commission support, said he hopes the awareness campaign will cause customers to think twice before leaving their cars running.

"I encourage our citizens and visitors to take these simple measures to protect themselves. Don't make yourself an easy target for criminals," he said.

According to Holly Hill Police Chief Mark Barker, 75 percent of all thefts of property from vehicles could have been prevented simply by locking the vehicle and taking the keys. Nationally, an estimated 25 percent of motor vehicle thefts occur when owners leave the keys inside an unlocked car.

Chief Barker said that there has been an increase area-wide in auto thefts from convenience store parking lots.

"This is a crime of opportunity, and the vast majority could be prevented simply by locking the vehicle when it's unattended," he said.

Citizens who wish to obtain bumper stickers or alert signs for their business, may call Community Programs Officer Rommel Scalf at (386) 249-9419.

### Preventing vehicle theft and burglary

•Drivers are reminded to turn off their vehicles, remove the keys and secure valuables out of sight any time they exit their vehicle. This includes when pumping gas, stopping for a cup of coffee or a soda at a convenience store, or stepping out of the vehicle for any reason.

•A vast majority of vehicles are stolen, not by savvy mastermind thieves' hotwiring cars as seen in the movies, but simply by sitting down in the unattended vehicle and driving away with the keys that were left in the ignition for them by the owner!

•Car thieves have learned to prey on victims by watching and waiting for an opportunity at gasoline stations, convenience stores, take out restaurants and locations where bills are paid.

•Victims frequently feel comfortable at these locations leave their keys in the ignition, vehicle running, and stepping out of the car. They believe their close proximity will provide protection for the vehicle because they are "...only going to take a minute...". They are wrong!

•Always secure your vehicle. Remove the keys. Remove all valuables or secure them out of sight or in the trunk. Many victims report that a perpetrator reached into their vehicle, grabbed their purse, laptop, or backpack and ran away while they stood nearby pumping gas, or loading packages. Opportunistic thieves can strike in an instant.

•As the holiday season approaches many persons will be shopping, carrying packages and traveling from location to location looking for the best deals. Be sure to secure all packages out of sight in the trunk. Ask for an escort if carrying items of high value when leaving the store.

•Drivers are reminded that Florida Statutes require them to remove the keys from their vehicle at any time they leave it unattended; and if their vehicle is stolen with keys they have not secured; they may be issued a Florida Uniform Traffic Citation for the violation.

to new sources of power would create thousands of jobs.

"We think it's ironic that this is the 'Sunshine State' and instead of using solar power the legislature is thinking about drilling off the coast of Pensacola," he said. "Solar power would create jobs. You would need people to make them and then people to install and repair them."

Mr. Williams says he gets involved in community projects such as beach cleanups to spread the word.

He said he doesn't use the term "global warming" because in some places, it's actually getting colder.

"It's not global warming, it's climate change, and it's caused by fossil fuels," he said. "We're trying to tell the government that converting to clean energy will create jobs and protect the environment."

Mr. Williams said he hopes to attend graduate school next year and major in public policy.

He said his experience with Repower America will be beneficial in his career.

He said he enjoys working with Repower America because he has always been interested in the environment.

"When I was in high school, I was in a public speaking class and would often discuss the relationship between technology and the environment," he said.

Residents of Volusia County could help do their part in saving the environment by encouraging the use of solar power, Mr. Williams said.

"With the economy the way it is, individuals are not investing in solar panels," he said. "The government should set an example and invest in solar to show they are serious about reducing their carbon footprint. The cost of inaction will be much greater than any current investment."

taped her having sex with the boy under his care.


"As a direct and proximate result of the production, promotion or possession of such child pornography," states the court filing, "(the girl) has suffered mental anguish, emotional distress, pain and suffering, humiliation, loss of enjoyment of life, and the expense of psychological and psychiatric care and treatment."

The two separate suits go on to claim that Sherry Wilhite "knew or should have known" about Mr. Wilhite's alleged illegal activity and been more concerted in protecting the boy under their care, as well as the other teen visitors to their home.

Despite his attorney's claims of innocence, Mr. Wilhite told police upon arrest that, "after speaking with my attorney, I know now what I was doing with the children was criminal."





## Can shoppers save more at supermarkets or supercenters?

In my super-couponing classes, I'm often asked whether it's easier just to shop at a supercenter, large grocery-discount store combinations that offer "every-day low prices," or shop at a traditional, "more expensive" supermarket using coupons to achieve greater savings.

If you've used coupons for any length of time, you know that it's possible to achieve much better savings at the supermarket by following the sales and matching them with coupons.

The reason? Believe it or not, the "every-day low price" strategy is the culprit. Supercenters maintain low prices, avoiding the traditional cycle of sales and price cuts common at supermarket chains.

At a supercenter, a \$2.50 box of cereal will sell for \$2.50 this week, next week

and three weeks from now. Meanwhile, over at the supermarket, the price of the same brand of cereal is fluctuating from high to low. It may be \$2.99 one week, \$2.49 the next and \$1.99 the next.

Many shoppers find comfort and a sense of confidence knowing what prices will be week after week at a supercenter. But the truth is price fluctuations make supermarkets the best places to shop for someone who's trying to save even more money.

As we've learned, making the most of the supermarket's price cycle can be advantageous to shoppers. When the price of a certain cereal brand takes a dip to \$1.99, it's less expensive than the supercenter's price. That's when we move in and use our coupons to bring the price down even more. Sure, we could use the

same coupon at the every-day, low-price store. But when the sale price of the item at the supermarket drops below the every-day low price of the supercenter, we save even more buying the item at the supermarket.

Recently, a new supercenter opened in my town. During its grand opening the store was abuzz with people lining up, excitedly waiting to take advantage of the low prices. I was curious to compare the new supercenter's prices with those at other supermarkets in our area. I had just been to the supermarket the previous day and I had my receipt showing the sale prices

(before my coupon savings) on 21 different items.

As I strolled the aisles of the new store, I was shocked to see the difference in prices on the same items I'd just purchased at the supermarket.

What shocked me was how high they were.

Of the 21 items on my receipt, 14 of the products' "every-day" prices were significantly higher at the supercenter than the sale prices I'd paid one day earlier at the supermarket, in some cases, several dollars' more on a single item.

Six of the products I purchased were more expensive at the supermarket, but we're talking pennies more, not dollars, in many cases, the difference between \$1.97 and \$1.99. And while it's true that the regular prices of the supermarket sale items are

often higher, smart shoppers aren't paying those regular prices. We watch for sales and price drops, then move in and buy what we need when the price hits that low.

Again, while I certainly could have used my coupons at the supercenter to buy the same products, I brought the supermarket's lower prices down even more by using my coupons there.

Low prices aren't the only aspect of saving big, however. Supermarkets often offer additional promotions that can cut your grocery bill significant-

ly. Next week, I'll share the rest of this story and you'll see how I took those groceries home from the supermarket for 69 percent less than I would have paid using the same coupons on the same items at the supercenter.

# Homemade apple pie worth all the peeling and the slicing

**H**ello smart shoppers. Last week it was special pie crust and today it's apple and pecan pies.

If you've never tasted a "homemade" apple pie then you've never tasted apple pie. The biggest job in making apple pie is the peeling and the slicing. If you followed my lead in a past column, you have many frozen and waiting to be thawed.

When we first came to Florida in 1974, I couldn't seem to find any good apples at a price I wanted to pay. Certain apples must be used. Others, such as Macintosh, turn into applesauce. What always bothered me about apple pies is that unless you first poach the apples, which is more work, once the pie was baked there was a large space between the filling and the top crust.

I tried something that was so successful; I make my apple pies no other way.

Canned, pie-sliced apples are wonderful. I don't mean pie filling that is seasoned, I mean just apples in water.

They are made by many companies and are sold in most supermarkets.

No time for stories today, holiday recipes are a must. Next week, "It's turkey time!"

## APPLE PIE makes one 9-inch pie

If you choose to use fresh apples you must use a tart firm apple. Varieties such as golden delicious, Cortland, Braeburn, Spartan and Granny Smith are your best choices.

1-1/2 cans (20-ounce) sliced apples drained, or

five to seven tart apples, peeled, cored, and thinly sliced  
 3/4-cup sugar (or use 1/2 sugar and 1/2 Splenda sugar substitute)  
 1/4-cup dark brown sugar (packed)  
 1 tablespoon flour  
 1/2-teaspoon cinnamon  
 Dash nutmeg  
 Dash salt  
 1 tablespoon lemon juice  
 2 tablespoons butter or butter substitute

Roll out dough to fit a 9-inch pie pan. Trim even with rim of pan.

Mix all ingredients except butter together and add to apples. Place in prepared pan, dot with butter. Roll top crust and place on top of apples. Trim with scissors so crust extends 1/2-inch beyond rim. Carefully lift top crust around edges and moisten bottom crust with water.

Fold top crust over bottom crust and press together. Flute edges to create a rippled effect with your fingers or press all around with the tines of a fork.

Using scissors, cut slits or curved slits to resemble a tree branch with leaves in the top crust. Brush crust with milk and sprinkle generously with sugar. Do not put milk or sugar on the edges.

Bake on a cookie sheet in the lower third of a preheated 425-degree oven for 10 minutes. Lower temperature to 350 and continue baking for 30 minutes until crust is golden and filling is bubbly.

To save pie for future use, prepare but do not lift crust or brush with milk. Freeze unbaked.

To use, thaw for three to five hours on countertop or overnight in the refrigerator. Bake as directed. If pie is still frozen simply bake a little longer until bubbly.

To make many pies triple the Shaker pie crust recipe.

The following will make approximately 1 large, 4 medium and 1 small apple pie, along with enough dough for at least 2 pumpkin pies and some

pie crust cookies.

7 20-ounce cans sliced apples, drained  
 4 cups sugar (or use 1/2 sugar and 1/2 Splenda sugar substitute)  
 3/4-cups dark brown sugar, packed  
 1-1/2 teaspoons salt  
 1 cup flour  
 1 tablespoon cinnamon  
 1/2-teaspoon nutmeg  
 Juice of 1-1/2 lemons  
 2 tablespoons butter or butter substitute for each pie

Follow above instructions. Do not mix ingredients with apples until crusts are prepared — the sugars and salt will produce too much liquid.

## PECAN PIE

High fat, high cholesterol, this must be a "special occasion" dessert.

3 large eggs  
 1 cup light corn syrup  
 1 cup sugar  
 2 tablespoons melted butter or Smart Balance butter substitute  
 2-1/2 teaspoons vanilla  
 Dash of salt  
 1 cup pecan halves or pieces (pieces make it easier to cut the pie)  
 1 unbaked deep dish 9-

inch pie shell (homemade or frozen)

Using a whisk, beat eggs slightly. Add next five ingredients, then nuts. Pour into pie shell.

Bake on a cookie sheet in a 400-degree oven 15 minutes. Lower temperature to 350, continue baking 30 to 35 minutes. Filling should be slightly less set in center than around edges.

Cool, chill and serve with whipped cream, topping or vanilla ice cream.



# With artificials, you may feel like 'sir cast-a-lot'

Before I took a week off to hawk my new book, I promised to get back to beginning with artificial baits. I had mentioned some plugs that are tried and true and reiterated my confidence in the soft tail shrimp jig.

Aside from chartreuse you would be wise to own tails in white, yellow, motor oil root beer and red and white. I did not talk about spoons, but every tackle box should have a small silver and gold spoon.

If you fish from jetty or pier, you will need some Sea Hawk, clothespin-type lures. They are heavy and

will stay down in the water column. Those are also great for the surf when the blues or mackerel are in close.

I can't stress enough the importance of casting into the current to allow your lure to wash back toward you.

Predatory fish sit looking into the current for food to come to them. You will catch fish casting against the tide, but retrieving

with the current is always best. Fishing a swift flow with a top water lure is difficult. The added speed will make it near impossible to get a natural looking presentation.

If you find yourself in a fast running stream, go to your jig. In some cases all you will have to do is toss your bait upstream and just allow the water to provide the action. When you take up the slack many times you will already be hooked up.

If you are a new user of artificials, you may tire from all of the casting and retrieving that is required. A good light, smooth

working rod and reel will help relieve some of the stress from your arm and wrist. A few ounces means a lot when you are making a couple of hundred casts.

If you find yourself tiring, reduce your number of casts by only throwing to fish you can see. Sight fishing is a big part of casting lures. Watch the water. Learn the movement of a trout or red or mullet. Any subtle variation in surface tension is a good target. Of course, nervous baitfish or feeding predators deserve several casts.

As a beginner your best targets will be blue fish,

jacks and ladyfish. Those three indiscriminate eaters require little finesse. When they are in feeding mode you will have success by throwing most any lure near them. There is no incentive to continue casting like catching a few fish.

Remember when you go to buy your tackle, most of the artificial baits you see in the stores will never catch a fish and are there to catch you. Stick with the time tested lures. You know the great part about becoming a lure fisherman is that you can fish any time for a few minutes or an hour with little prepa-

ration or fuss. I leave the house with a rod and two or three baits in my pocket, and I can fish anywhere, anytime. Think of the money and mess you will save by not having to buy fresh bait constantly. Have a little patience and gain some confidence and you will never look back.

# Hobe Sound course offers challenge, beauty

If there is one thing I despise, it's a golf course overrun with homes.

When Lost Lake Golf Club opened in 1992, it was cut through pristine wetlands in Hobe Sound.

The Jim and Tom Fazio-designed course featured tons of nature. No two holes ran side-by-side, making each stand apart. One of the problems with today's new courses is that they are often an amenity for a developer, meaning that along with fairways and greens, come roads and homes.

I first played Lost Lake in 1995 and fell in love with it. Over the years, as the development matured, homes and roads went up where many trees once stood. As the homes went up, the fairways felt narrower. The greens lost some of the framing they had to aid your approach shots. I fell out of love with the course.

A few weeks ago, I traveled back to Lost Lake to see how time had treated her. Many of the scars I remembered from my last time out have disappeared. As the course has matured, the trees and landscaping put up when the homes were completed has grown in and taken hold. The holes where I remember feeling like I was playing from someone's back yard no longer feel that way. I enjoyed playing the course once again.

Lost Lake Golf Club is a semi-private club with five sets of tees to challenge golfers of any ability. From the back tees the course measures a shortish 6,850 yards. Not long by today's standards, but you need to remember this is a Fazio masterpiece that carries a slope rating of 135.

The landing areas are tight and there are several forced carries with water coming into play on 13 holes. You simply cannot miss fairways if you hope to conquer this layout.

The greens are filled with bumps and hills, forcing you to be on your game with the flat stick, as well. The tournament tees play to 6,481 yards, followed by the club, senior and forward tees, which play to 6,045, 5,574 and 5,106 yards, respectively.

One thing I always like to see on a course is a drivable par-4 and a reachable par-5. Well, reachable for golfers of most abilities, that is. The fourth hole measures 340 from the back tees and practically begs you to drive the green. Temptation does come with a price should you miss right, where water runs the length of the hole.

The seventh hole is a very reachable par-5, playing a mere 485 yards from the tips. After a solid drive, golfers have to ignore the beautiful rock waterfall short and left of the elevated green and thread their approach between that and a large oak behind and right if they hope to make an easy birdie or perhaps an eagle.

The front-nine closes with one of the best par-4s on the course. The 413-yard hole demands an exacting tee shot. From there, it's an approach to a green framed by a large hill with the beautiful clubhouse sitting behind.

The back-nine begins with a twisty par-5. To reach the 10th hole in two, golfers must hit a long drive and then dare to carry a large lake to a small, narrow green perched atop a sizable hill. Even laying up takes serious concentration as you must aim well away from the green and hit a precise shot to a narrow-fairway.

Lost Lake's closing holes are some of the best in the area. The par-3 16th looks easy from the tee, but miss this small green and you will pay dearly. Seventeen isn't long, but its green is deep and severely sloped. Golfers need to make sure they hit their approach shots to the proper level or risk three-putting.

At 441 yards from the tips, the 18th is a monster. Wayward drives wind up in the marshlands or deep rough. Just like the ninth

hole, number 18 has its green tucked into a hillside with several bunkers protecting it. After putting out it's a short walk over to a well-deserved beverage at the clubhouse.

I had a great time playing Lost Lake for the first time in many years. I'm so pleased to see that the course has matured nicely. The staff is as friendly as ever and the conditioning of the course was superb, just as I remember it.



# It's Mainland vs. Seabreeze tonight

DAYTONA BEACH — Municipal Stadium will tonight host the latest match-up in one of the state's biggest high school football rivalries — the Mainland Buccaneers vs. the Seabreeze Sandcrabs.

"This is just one of the greatest," said Mainland head coach John Maronto. "We are ranked as one of the top 33 high school football rivalries in the nation. It just speaks for itself."

Seabreeze quarterback Matt Thompson is also fired up.

"It is just big," Thompson said. "Everyone knows each other and grew up together. It's almost like you are fighting your brother."

There are many reasons other than just proximity for the rivalry.

In the early part of the last century, the two schools were one — Daytona High School. Its mascot was the Buccaneers as Mainland's is today.

Both Schools use Municipal Stadium, with 10,000 seats, as their home field. And both teams are headed to the playoffs.

The Buccaneers (7-2) are the district 2-6A champions and the Sandcrabs (6-3) are the district 13-5A runner-up.

So, how will tonight's game shape up?

Seabreeze's Thompson is a dual threat (1,883 passing yards with 19 touchdowns and five interceptions add 497 rushing yards and five touchdowns). Thompson has plenty of help in running back Brian Young (580 rushing yards and six touchdowns, 244 receiving yards with two touchdowns) and receivers

Dominique Roberts (323 receiving yards and five touchdowns), Devonte Mack (418 receiving yards and five touchdowns), John Christopher (533 receiving yards and five touchdowns) and Bret Kramer (catches for 300 yards and two touchdowns).

"They have a lot of weapons and can put up a lot of points," Coach Maronto said. "It all starts with

Thompson. He is the trigger."

Seabreeze head coach Marc Beach said he is not expecting an easy win.

"It all starts off with us blocking up front," he said. "If we can protect I think that we will have a chance. If we

The Buccaneers defense is led by Antwone McGuire (60 tackles, seven sacks). He also has plenty of help with Cortez Davis (three interceptions), Ricardo Allen (40 tackles, one interception), Anthony Hamm (58 tackles, two sacks), Kenneth Kirksey (54 tackles and five sacks), and Mike Squilloccote (58

tackles). The Bucs allow 13.2 points per game while the 'Crabs

as explosive offensively," Coach Beach said. "We have to limit the big play. If, we can do that we will be OK."

The 'Crabs secondary must cover Ross and Davis.

"Our defense has to stop the homerun ball," Seabreeze wide receiver Roberts said. "They can beat you with the pass or the run. You never know what they will do. They have so much talent."

The Bucs offensive line is massive and more experienced than Seabreeze's defensive front.

"We have a veteran and strong offensive line and good receivers," Coach Maronto said. "We just have to play mistake-free football."



Latharius Giles (43 tackles and three interceptions) has become the play maker in the Crabs secondary.

The Crabs are led defensively by Chris Banks (80 tackles, 2.5 sacks). Teammates Aquith Bradshaw (65 tackles, 1.5 sacks) and Austin Brenham (48 tackles, 4.5 sacks) will be counted on to help stop Lane and Bell.

Seabreeze's defense gives up 20.3 points per game while Mainland scores 30.3 points per contest.

On the special teams, Mainland's Jonathan Linkenheimer (23/29 extra points, 3/7 field goals with a long of 49 yards) has a strong leg but Seabreeze's Shelton Jackson (30/35 extra points, 7/9 field goals and a long of 42 yards) is more accurate.

With the teams being so closely matched, it is hard to predict a winner for tonight, but one thing's for sure, it's going to be a close and exciting game and will go a long way in continuing this great rivalry.
