

## River walk idea examined

ORMOND BEACH — The idea of building a restaurant, promenade, marina and other facilities at the northwest corner of the Granada Bridge has been working its way through advisory groups and residents will soon get a chance to have their say.

Building a river walk has been talked about for several years, Planning Director Ric Goss told the Leisure Services Advisory Board recently.

He said the river walk started as an idea for a promenade south of the boat launches at the southwest corner of the bridge.

"Over the years, that went away," he said. "In 2007 when the redevelopment plan was approved there was an idea in the plan that we should strive to put some type of destination at

one of the corner parks on the west side of the bridge."

Last March the city commission directed staff to develop a concept for discussion. In September, the commissioners reviewed drawings for the concept at a city commission meeting.

Mr. Goss said the commission now wants the concept to be reviewed by the Leisure Service and Quality of Life Advisory boards, Ormond MainStreet and the Chamber of Commerce. The next step will be discussion and public input at workshops in December and January.

"I'm here to bring you the concept that germinated in the redevelopment plan," he said to the Leisure Services Board. "They want to know if you think it has merit and what you like about it."

Mr. Goss said there are two

## Seabreeze finances athletic complex improvements

ORMOND BEACH — Several improvements will be made to the Ormond Beach Sports Complex thanks to a check for \$600,000 from Volusia County Schools.

The payment is for utilization of the baseball and soccer fields by Seabreeze High School for a 10-year period, said Ormond Beach Leisure Services Director Robert Carolin.

Half of the money will be for maintenance and half will be spent on capital improvements.

In the past, the city and school had an agreement that the school could use the complex and the city would be able to utilize the school's gymnasium and classrooms.

"It turned out that this was not a fair deal," Mr. Carolin said.

The Seabreeze facilities were not available many times when the city wanted to use them, he said.

The new agreement will benefit both the city and the school, Mr. Carolin said.

"It's a great inter-local agreement and a great partnership with Seabreeze," he said.

The \$300,000 for improvements is not earmarked for any specific projects. The Ormond Beach Leisure Services Board and the Quality of Life Board will go over a list of potential improvements and make recommendations to the Ormond Beach City Commission.

Seabreeze has sent a "wish list" of projects that include a softball field and a press box, but the city has the final say in what is done.

"The philosophy is that Ormond Beach has invested a tremendous amount of money to make it possible for Seabreeze to utilize the complex for their athletic program," Mr. Carolin said.

He said it was agreed that the

## County may close Holly Hill library

HOLLY HILL — Holly Hill Middle School teacher Robert Tyler said his students depend on the Holly Hill Public Library. So news of its possible demise is upsetting to him.

"I can't imagine them even considering closing this library down," he said recently. "I come in here after school and I see kids lined up to use the computers."

Mr. Tyler, who teaches seventh grade civics and eighth grade history, also said he uses material from

the library to teach his classes.

The library may become a victim of the economic crisis. Volusia County is considering closing it as well as Cornelia Young Memorial Library in Daytona Beach in an effort to reduce cost, said Lucinda Colee, county library director.

Rose Schuhmacher, executive director of the Holly Hill Chamber of Commerce, said she is trying to get concerned citizens to come to a Library Advisory Board meeting at 1:00 p.m. on Dec. 4 at City Island Library Center and protest

the proposed closing.

"I think it's a travesty of justice that they would do away with a library that serves a city," she said. "You have kids that ride their bikes there to do their homework."

Ms. Colee said these libraries are targeted because they are close to other libraries.

"What staff is looking at is where we have overlapping libraries," she said. "Holly Hill will still be served. We have two very large facilities three miles from the site."

In the last fiscal year,

# Dream-A-Wish remembers forgotten children at holidays

PORT ORANGE — It would be hard to find a truer version of Santa for miles around than Pastor Woody Keiser.

For a dozen years now, the 75-year-old has been re-creating Santa's Workshop in and around his Port Orange home at 232 Sand Pebble Circle, not primarily for holiday gawkers and wonder-seekers, but

for children he believes are most in need of his devotion.

The organization he and his wife, Patricia, founded in 1997 with their own savings is called Dream-A-Wish, a Make-A-Wish-like foundation with its mission geared toward children with terminal diseases and special needs. Each year since, they've raised more money and bigger piles of toys to deliver with that time-honored Kringle flair to disabled children across the region.

Eight years ago, Woody and Patricia started donning the St. Nick and Mrs. Claus duds to deliver the toys themselves.

"The children who have nothing wrong with them, they don't need me," says Keiser. "I take care of children where everybody has said, 'Ugh. It's so hard to get through to them.' Somebody has gotta put their arms around them and just say they're loved. They deserve so much love and dignity, and I'm going to give it."

His all-volunteer organization has grown to serve 22 schools with a high concentration of disabled students. Their teachers come in advance to Keiser's light-festooned home to select the best present for each child. Volunteers then come and wrap the presents and put them in boxes

marked for delivery by one of Keiser's decked-out motorcycle sleighs.

On his third tour of the Middle East with the Army's 101st Airborne Division, Sgt. Tony Brown, one of Keiser's first toy recipients years ago, wrote the organization an e-mail in March that made Mr. Keiser cry.

"...I just remember back (to) when I had my cancer and think, 'If I can make it through anything,'" Sgt. Brown wrote. And it was because of people like Keiser, he wrote, "people that put themselves last to help and encourage (others) to push on" that motivated him in his recovery.

"So I don't remember if I ever told you thanks, but it's always better late than never," he said.

On his Web site, www.dream-a-wish.org, Mr. Keiser chronicles dozens of children his organization has helped with "Once-in-a-Lifetime" gifts — a small portion of the thousands of lives his organization has touched: the boy who dreamed of meeting Dale Earnhardt and got free passes and the use of a motor home next door to Dale and his family on race day; another boy who wanted to ride a boat, and was bequeathed the use of a pontoon boat for a family trip to Silver Springs

and a special bicycle to accommodate his special needs; or the girl who dreamed of a trip to the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville, who was brought onstage for a visit with Laurie Morgan.

Mr. Keiser sees the Christmas donations as his chief responsibility, though. Next year, he hopes to expand to even more schools — funding provided.

Toy donations have increased with the advent of deposit boxes in all Walgreen's stores in Volusia and Flagler counties. Growth is downright realistic now. A local entrepreneur donated a Santa's Workshop at 947 Beville Road. Three storage spaces have been donated: two for the storage of toys and sleighs; the third for keeping about \$25,000 in handicapped equipment — from mobility scooters to toilets and crutches — that Mr.

Keiser offers rent-free to children and adults in need.

And, he adds, "You ain't seen a home decorated until you see my house."


His electric bill for the month before last Christmas: \$412.

Pastor Keiser's labor is finally revealed on Dec. 1, when his home comes alive for all the comings and goings. It wouldn't feel right without all the bustling.

"I'm the richest man in the world," attests Mr. Keiser. "Money ain't riches. It's wealth, but what I have is riches. My name opens doors, and I'm very proud of that. I'll never stop this: Only the good Lord will stop me."

Mr. Keiser will be at the Sunshine Park Mall on Ridgewood Avenue in South Daytona from 5 to 8 p.m., Friday, Dec. 4, giving free rides on one of his trike sleighs. Call (386) 682-6404 to help him fill his sack.

proposals. A low impact version would have a

10,000-square-foot restaurant and the historic Pilgrims Rest Primitive Baptist Church would remain in place.

The other concept would be on a grander scheme, with a restaurant, meeting space and retail stores that total 30,000 square feet.

He said people have been asking questions he can't answer because a feasibility study has not been done.

"We wanted to do a feasibility study but it would have cost from \$75,000 to \$100,000," Mr. Goss said. A feasibility study would

answer questions such as whether or not a restaurant in that location would even be viable.

It would also look at how a public/private partnership could be created between a restaurant operator and the city, which owns the land.

## Foes debate Amendment 4

DAYTONA BEACH — Floridians face a decision next year that could have a profound impact on land development and the future of the state.

Amendment 4, also known as the Hometown Democracy Amendment, will be on the ballot in 2010. If it passes, residents will be able to vote to approve or deny any development projects that require a change in their municipality's comprehensive plan, which governs growth.

Two speakers debated the issue recently at an event sponsored by the League of Women Voters at a Daytona Beach restaurant.

Lesley Blackner, an environmental lawyer who lives in Palm Beach, founded Hometown Democracy, Inc.,

Her opponent in the debate was Rebecca O'Hara, a lawyer and legislative director for the

Florida League of Cities.

Ms. Blackner said she is working to pass Amendment 4 after years of frustration in watching officials rubber stamp changes to comprehensive plans that have led to overdevelopment.

She said a marriage of government and the real estate industry has created a growth machine.

"Amendment 4 takes the keys to the comprehensive plans away from commissioners and gives them to the voters who I think will be more sober drivers," she said. "It's our quality of life, our little piece of paradise being ruined by overdevelopment."

Ms. O'Hara said she opposed Amendment 4 because of many potential problems it would cause.

"It's unfair to categorize the opposition as part of the growth machine," she said.

She warned of a "tyranny of the majority" if Amendment 4 passes, saying in a representative democracy, officials take into account the rights and opinions of minorities.

Another issue, she said, is that currently it's easier for developers to "sprawl" rather than increase density in cities because comprehensive plans prevent it.

"These ideas are new and require plan changes," she said. "Smart growth will suffer with Amendment 4."

She also said comprehensive plans are large, complicated documents that would be difficult for

laymen to read and understand. She said there would be a "sound bite" campaign to sway voter opinion.

Ms. Blackner countered that most of the documents are "gobbledygook," because the government has never had to put things in a way that people could understand them.

A speaker from the audience said the public should have a say in changes to comprehensive plans because once you build in a natural area you can't undo it.

Ms. O'Hara said that's also the danger with Amendment 4.

"If you get it in the constitution, you can't get it out," she said.

Audience members leaving the restaurant remarked that it was a good debate.

"Who won?" John King of Ormond Beach asked rhetorically.

He said that both debaters made good points on a complicated issue.

# Fire services encourage fire safety

After an uncharacteristically quiet and dry hurricane season, fire officials in Volusia County are on alert for possible brush fires and are encouraging residents to practice fire safety.

"We are close to 600 on the drought index throughout the county," said Volusia County Fire Services Deputy Chief Kathy Weaver. "What these numbers are telling us is we may have an early start to the brush fire season, which typically begins in January. We already have had some small brush fires. And, as we begin to have colder temperatures, the chance of brush fires will increase." (The drought index is on a scale of one to 800 - with one being saturation and 800 being desert dry.)

Residents are encouraged to take steps to protect their property from brush fires, including:

- Design and landscape your home with brush fire safety in mind. Allow a 30-foot buffer of non-combustible material around your home.
- Use noncombustible materials on the roof and regularly clean the roof and gutters
- Teach family members how to use a fire extinguisher. Install and regularly test smoke detectors
- Inspect chimneys twice a year and clean them once a year
- Rake leaves and dead limbs and twigs. Clear all flammable vegetation
- Have a garden hose long enough to reach any area of your home and property



garbage can. Williams had been fatally shot once in the chest. Police learned Williams and a group of men had been at the lot much of the day drinking. They later learned one of those men, 42-year-old Tony Williams, no relation to the victim, had been firing rounds from a gun and fired at the victim, unaware their was still a round in the chamber. Police said Williams had recently been released from prison and should not have had a gun at all. Williams faces a number of charges, including manslaughter. Police said another man, Eric Oliver, 25, could face charges of helping Williams dispose of the body.

### Man accused of trying to kill his girlfriend

A Daytona Beach man is accused of trying to kill his live-in girlfriend, allegedly chasing her down the street with a gun and threatening neighbors who tried to intervene. Investigators said Christopher Hartzell, 35, who has a lengthy criminal history, argued with the victim in their apartment on North Halifax Avenue, then hit her several times with a gun, knocking her over. Police said Hartzell fired the weapon at the victim, but missed and she ran outside. Hartzell chased her according to investigators and pointed the gun at several people who tried to help the woman. He was arrested near the apartment and though police have not found the weapon, they did recover a bullet as evidence.

### Bar fire appears to have been deliberate

A closed bar near Ormond Beach burned twice within days and investigators said in both cases, the fires were deliberately set. The first blaze gutted half of the back of the Boot Hill Saloon on U.S. Highway 1 near Airport Road and investigators with the State Fire Marshal's office found signs an accelerant was used to set the fire. Two nights later, another fire broke out at the bar and investigators found a gas can inside. The Boot Hill, owned by the same folks who operate on Main Street in Daytona Beach, is only opened during special events like Bike Week and Biketoberfest. The manager, at the scene of the first fire, told WESH 2 he had recently chased away a homeless man who had set up house inside the bar. The building and property are for sale.

### Pedestrian killed

An Ormond Beach man was killed when highway patrol troopers said he walked into the path of a pickup on U.S. Highway 1 north of Airport Road. Troopers said Bruce Bolduc, 53, had just left the Iron Horse Saloon shortly after 8 p.m. and walked onto U.S. Highway 1 in front of a pickup truck. He was killed instantly. The driver of the pickup, from Michigan, was not charged.

### Judge to face public reprimand

The Florida Supreme Court has ordered a Volusia County judge to

come before it on Dec. 8 for a public reprimand. Judge Mary Jane Henderson's troubles stem from her dealings with convicted felon Henry Wheeler. Court investigators said she loaned him money for an apartment, cell phone, cab fare and other things and the court found her actions demeaned the office. Judge Henderson admitted her actions gave the appearance of impropriety though she said she was acting in good faith to help someone get back on their feet.

### Baby fine after fall from second story

A 10-month-old baby wasn't hurt at all after a fall from a second-story window in Daytona Beach. Fire rescuers said the window was open, with a screen in place at the Sail Point Bay apartments on Beach Street. The mother went to the bathroom and when she came back immediately noticed the screen pushed out and the baby missing. Mom ran out and found the infant girl in a flower bed that luckily cushioned her fall. The family had the baby checked out just in case, but tell WESH 2 she's fine.

### Deliveryman robbed

New Smyrna Beach police are looking for two suspects who robbed a restaurant deliveryman in the 400 block of Palm Street. The armed suspects flagged down the deliveryman as though they had ordered the food and when the victim got out of his car, one of the suspects pointed a gun at him and demanded his money and the food. The suspects made off with it all on foot and despite a long search, police said the suspects were not found.

### Gunman robs restaurant employees

A lone armed man robbed the manager of Dustin's Bar-B-Q in Ormond Beach as the manager was leaving for the night. The suspect pulled out a gun and ordered the manager to turn over all his money, keys and cell phone. Another employee, who was walking out about the same time, heard the commotion and was forced to give over his cell phone as well. Police are still looking for the gunman.

### Local cab drivers want fees to be fair

Cab drivers who work exclusively at Daytona Beach International Airport admit the economy has hit them hard, but they say outsiders who work the airport have left them feeling like things are just not "fair." John Perras, one of nearly 20 cab drivers who work the area said his company pays \$250 a year per taxi for an airport permit, along with a \$70 city licensing fee, cash for drug testing for drivers and vehicle check expenses. Perras' beef is with out-of-town drivers who can pick up fares at the airport with out any of those payments or requirements. Out-of-town drivers pay just \$5 or \$10 per load of passengers, depending on whether they're in a car or van, and go. Locals said they believe out of towners should face the same permitting process they do and the fees that go with it, to level the playing field. WESH 2 spoke with airport officials who said they are

willing to meet with in-town drivers to see if there's something they can do to make the locals better able to compete.

### Two bodies found in Ormond-by-the-Sea home

Volusia County Sheriff's investigators said a mother made a grim discovery when she showed up at her son's Ormond-by-the-Sea home, concerned because she hadn't heard from him. Her boyfriend opened the door a crack and saw someone lying in the living room. The couple called deputies who arrived and discovered two bodies on the floor in the house. As of this writing, deputies are still trying to determine how the men died but tell us both bodies had signs of trauma.

### Radio station owner's trial begins

The owner of an Ormond Beach radio station accused of sex crimes against children was set for trial this last week. Douglas Wilhite, owner of WELE Radio, is accused of repeatedly having sex with a 15-year-old boy at Wilhite's home. The trial was first set to go last month, but was post-poned when other teens came forward claiming Wilhite, an admitted nudist, provided alcohol to them, showed them porn and encouraged them to have sex with each other so he could watch.

### Museum volunteer charged with grand theft

A South Daytona Auto Museum, dedicated to the legends that built cars and raced them years back on Daytona Beach, is in jeopardy after police there said a volunteer worker stole thousands of dollars from the non-profit business over three years. Deborah Burdick, 56, the founder's step-daughter, is charged with grand theft after police said she stole at least \$21,000 and perhaps more. The museum board got wise in August when Burdick allegedly asked a member to sign a blank check. An internal audit found Burdick had repeatedly riced to the bank with museum money, padding her personal accounts. The museum, located in the Sunshine Park Mall, is a treasure of early NASCAR memorabilia and operates with donations and grants. Staffers are hoping they can keep going after the huge money loss.

### Man found guilty of beating girlfriend's son

After a day-long trial, a jury found a Port Orange man guilty of beating his girlfriend's son. Thomas Betty, 55, was arrested in March after the 12-year-old boy showed up at school with bruises and other injuries. Betty will be sentenced next month and is facing up to five years in prison. Police initially accused the boy's mother with neglect, but the state never filed charges against her.

### DCF employee arrested

An employee with the Department of Children and Families was arrested this past week, accused of raping a 7-year-old girl. South Daytona Investigators said Ronald Thornton, 56, was visiting his son's home in that city when he sexually assaulted the child described by police as a family friend. \$300,000 is not only for future improvements at the complex, but also to pay back the city for improvements made in the past.

The \$30,000 per year for maintenance covers the school's usage of the field, Mr. Carolin said.

He said the total budget for maintenance is \$800,000, and based on how much Seabreeze uses the complex, their share of the cost is \$30,000 per year.

Among the projects requested in a letter from Seabreeze Principal Robert Wallace are: a stand-alone, regulation softball field for the women's team, refurbishing the dressing rooms at the soccer facilities, and the following additions to one of the baseball fields: a press box, visitors bleachers and netting to prevent balls from going into a canal.

At a recent Leisure Services Board meeting, Doug Thomas said the city should apply for matching grants.

"I'd like to turn this money into a lot more," Mr. Thomas said. He suggested there might be grant money for building bleachers that conform to the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Mr. Carolin said that topic will be discussed at the next Leisure Service Board meeting. He said the board will probably suggest to the City Commission that they go forward with some projects and apply for grants for others.

4,337 people used the Holly Hill library, she said. She said most of them also used the City Island Library Center and Ormond Beach Public Library.

She said there were 1,442 people who only used the Holly Hill library and this is the number of people that would be impacted by the closing of the library.

Ms. Colee said there are eight and a half open positions in the library system that can't be filled because of a hiring freeze. It's becoming more and more difficult to staff all of the libraries, she said.

None of the staff openings are at the Holly Hill library, Ms. Colee said, but there are one and a half openings at the Ormond Beach Public Library and Holly Hill is considered part of the Ormond Beach region.

Ms. Colee will present her recommendation for closing the library at the Dec. 4 Library Advisory Board meeting.

The public is welcome to attend and make comments, she said.

The County Council will

consider the recommendations of Ms. Colee and the advisory board at a Dec. 10 County Council meeting, Ms. Colee said. There will be an opportunity for public comment.

Ms. Schuhmacher said that Holly Hill, which owns the property, only charges the county one dollar per year to rent the building for the library.

"They are doing away with a library where the city is giving them a building," she said. "I get emotional about it. I basically feel they are taking advantage of Holly Hill like they are second class citizens."

Ms. Colee said county staff is not taking the decision lightly.

"We've been studying this for several years," she said. "We're trying to maintain quality service."

Douglas Reilly is a Holly Hill resident who frequents the library.

"I think it's a very valuable resource for the area," he said. "It's on the bus line so it's very convenient to people who live here. I borrow DVDs because I can't afford to rent them anymore. The county should rethink how they try to save money."

The world's most expensive bottle of beer went on the auction block last Saturday; just don't expect to drink it.

According to Andrew Aldridge of the British auction house Henry Aldridge and Son, the contents are downright undrinkable. That's because the beer bottle, which is still about 80 percent full, survived the famous fiery crash of the Hindenburg in New Jersey more than 70 years ago.

According to the auction catalog, a local fire chief recovered the pitcher and several beer bottles from the crash. He gave five of the bottles to colleagues and one to the Lowenbrau brewery. The pitcher bears the logo of the Hindenburg's company. The other bottles have been lost.

looked at the total package of salary and benefits, rather than quibble about each item, Mayor Roland Via said after the meeting.

He said the commission and Ms. Wingo agreed on a total package of salary and benefits worth \$171,000.

Ms. Wingo will be able to determine how much she wants in salary and various benefits as long as she sticks to that total.

Originally, Ms. Wingo asked for \$204,000 and the commission countered with \$149,000.

Ms. Wingo came back

with a figure of \$174,000 and both sides finally agreed on \$171,000.

After the meeting, Mayor Via said he has confidence the package provided to Ms. Wingo will be a good investment.

"Ms. Wingo will give us more than a return on our money," he said. "She'll bring in more grants, more cost saving measures and make up for the additional money with her expertise."

He said that her negotiation skills were impressive.

"She's a tough negotiator and we highly respect that," he said. "We believe she'll negotiate on behalf of the city with just as much tenacity. She demonstrated her negotiating ability."





# Poinsettias offer delicate beauty for the holidays

With the holidays rapidly approaching, soon one of the most popular plants on earth will be available for sale.

The plant I am referring to is the colorful poinsettia plant. These beautiful plants are most commonly known for their red color but they also can come in many other colors such as white, pink or multi-colored.

Since most retailers offer mass displays of these gems, you will have an almost unlimited choice to bring home. As beautiful as these plants are, they are also very fragile and you must handle them gently or the delicate branches will break and fall off.

During my lifetime, I have unpacked and displayed no less than 100,000 of these beauties and I still do not tire of their delicate appearance.

Poinsettias have an interesting history that

dates back to the 14th century. In fact, during the period from the 14th to the 16th century, the Aztec Indians called poinsettias *cuetlaxochitl* and they used the sap to control fevers and the leaves, or bracts, to produce a red dye.

The actual botanical name for the poinsettia was coined by the German botanist Wilenow. He called it *euphorbia pulcherrima*. He first discovered the plant growing through a crack in his greenhouse and was so amazed at the color, so gave it that name which means very beautiful.

For many years, and in fact still today, many people believe that poinsettias are poisonous. The truth is they are not. It is true, however, that some people are allergic to the white sap of the plant and skin irritation can develop. If you are one of those people with sensitive skin, handle the plants with care.

For a retailer during the

holiday season, having a fresh batch of poinsettias is like a pot of gold at the end of the rainbow. These wonderful plants create an eye-catching display that will certainly draw a crowd. So, with all these choices, how do I pick that perfect plant?

First, look for plants that have been removed from their sleeves. Many retailers will display the plants with sleeves intact, and if plants sit on the shelf too long, this can cause the leaves to yellow and drop and eventually, the plant may die. Choose plants that have been removed from their sleeves.

If you do choose a plant that is sleeved, remove the plastic as soon as you get

home.

Next, look for plants that have little or no pollen showing on the flower clusters. This is a good indicator of the maturity of the flower bracts. You should always choose plants that have a lush, green color to their foliage and have a good, healthy appearance. Avoid plants that look droopy or have yellowing leaves.

While choosing your plants, handle them carefully so as not to break the adjoining plants so everybody can have a chance at getting a prime-looking plant.

Once you have chosen your gem and you're home, some standard TLC will ensure you get a long lifespan from your new houseguest.

If you are keeping your plant indoors and it is not near a good light source, occasionally put it in a sunny location so it can get the light it needs to maintain a healthy look. If the plant starts to drop leaves excessively, it is

probably not getting enough bright light and you need to move it.

Always keep your plant away from cold drafts and low temperatures. Poinsettias will not do well if the temperatures drop below 45. Check your plants for soil moisture daily and be sure they have good drainage and do not sit in standing water. Keep the plant evenly moist but not soaking wet.

If you follow these simple

tips, you should be able to enjoy your plants through the entire holiday season.

After the holidays are over, you can plant them outdoors in a protected location, such as under a tree, and you can enjoy them year after year.

A DCF spokesman told WESH 2 Thornton did not work directly with children in his capacity as a food stamp processor, but because Thornton had worked for

DCF less than a year and was still on probation, he was immediately fired.

### Teens arrested for burglary

Edgewater Police arrested three teenagers, two of them brothers, and said the teens burglarized more than half a dozen vehicles over one recent weekend. Police said a victim spotted the teens, 13, 14 and 15, rifling through his vehicle and briefly chased after them. Police caught up with the teens on another street. # Roasting a turkey? Just pretend it's a large chicken

Hello, smart shoppers, it's turkey time! Check out my cookbook special at the end of the column.

Any brand turkey is good; how you cook the turkey will determine its moistness. For my turkey, I make my German Aunt Margie's sausage stuffing. According to my daughter-in-law, Lisa, "It should be patented!"

Roasting your first turkey can be a terrifying cooking experience; just pretend it's a very large chicken. Make the stuffing and as many vegetables as possible a day or two before to make your life easier.

I know times are extremely tough, but if you're reading this column you have something to be thankful for.

God's blessings!

## ROAST TURKEY

Thaw turkey, remove giblets from the cavity and neck. Remove any fat and soak in cold, salted water for at least one hour. Doing this gives the meat a fresher flavor. Rinse and dry with paper towels.

Follow roasting instructions on the turkey bag. Be sure to use a heavy-duty metal pan. Rub turkey with canola oil, sprinkle with salt and pepper. For a small turkey, place breast side down on a sprayed v-rack. Turn right side up the last half hour of roasting.

Another trick is to season and place in a paper supermarket bag in the roasting pan; leave bag

open. No basting is necessary. Tear open bag the last half hour, baste and roast 'til golden.

For a large turkey, place on a rack in the pan, season as directed. Make a tent of heavy aluminum foil and place over top of turkey. This will prevent the moisture from escaping. Baste occasionally and roast until done. Remove foil 1/2 hour before done for a crisp, crackly skin.

If you choose to stuff the turkey, the stuffing must be cold to prevent the growth of bacteria. Loosely stuff both the body and neck cavity; the stuffing swells as the bird cooks. Close openings with turkey skewers and string. Tie wings and legs and roast as directed on the package.

Here's a method that will free up the oven for the vegetables, it beats any cooking method for a turkey 20 pounds or more.

Put the turkey, tented with foil, in a 200-degree oven at 10 p.m. the night before. At 10 a.m., turn oven to 325-degrees, roast about 2 hours or until a meat thermometer inserted in the thigh registers 170 degrees. Increase time according to size. Baste often. Results: a tender, juicy bird.

You can also remove

turkey from oven in the morning and put it back into a pre-heated oven two hours before you plan to serve. Although the cooking time should be 180 degrees, the bird will keep cooking once it's out.

For an end result that is easier for serving and lower in fat, place stuffing in a large covered casserole rather than in the bird. Put in the oven for the last hour and baste with a squirt of turkey drippings.

## TURKEY GRAVY

Remove turkey to platter. Pour drippings into a saucepan. Add 1-2 cups water to the metal pan, bring to a boil, scraping up the browned pieces. Pour into saucepan. De-fat juices by adding at least 12 ice cubes to the saucepan. Let sit until the fat congeals and clings to the cubes. Remove remaining cubes and fat with a slotted spoon.

In a large jar, put 2 cups cold water and several tablespoons flour. Cover and shake well. Bring liquid to a boil, adding more water for more gravy. Using a strainer, slowly pour the flour mixture into pan, stirring constantly until boiling each time, until desired thickness is achieved. Taste and adjust seasonings.

## TURKEY STUFFING

Enough for a large turkey, 22 pounds or more; leftovers freeze great.

- 1 pound pork sausage (roll)
- 4 large onions, chopped
- 6 large stalks celery, chopped
- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- Turkey liver, chopped (optional)
- 2 teaspoons sage
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1/2-teaspoon black pepper
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley
- 1 large loaf white bread
- 2 cups chicken broth, canned or homemade

Break up sausage and brown in skillet. Drain and set aside. Add canola oil to skillet. Sauté onion, celery and turkey liver.\* Add seasonings. Return sausage to pan and cook a few minutes.

In a large bowl, break bread into small pieces. Add sausage mixture and broth. Mix thoroughly. Taste. Add more salt if necessary. Cool and stuff turkey or cook in casserole as explained above.

\*Liver can be discarded or added raw to cooled

stuffing. It will cook in the baking.

## What's all the 'Skype' about?

If you spend any amount of time surfing the Web you are bound to run across the name "Skype."

You may occasionally see a "Skype me" button on a Web site or even embedded in an e-mail.

Skype is one of the leading "voice over IP" services on the Internet. It's a program/service that turns your computer into an easy-to-use Internet phone allowing you to place calls to any other Skype user for free, or any "real" phone number for a very low fee.

I know, I know. People have been talking about cheap (or even free) phone calls over the Internet for years and I think I even wrote a column about another VOIP service, Vonage, awhile back, but what is it about Skype that warrants a closer look? What is it that makes Skype special?

Well, for starters: price. It's cheaper than other services out there, certainly a lot cheaper than your standard plain old telephone system.

It's free to call other Skype users and outgoing calls to regular, non-Skype phones ("SkypeOut") range around 2 to 4 cents a minute. For a low yearly fee, about \$30 as I write this, you can sign up for unlimited outgoing calls. Or, periodically, you can load up on credits to use when making outgoing calls. There is a little meter at the top of the program that tells you how many credits you have left as you use them.

Also, they have special rates for international calls.

Inbound calls are handled a little differently. You can either be set up to receive inbound calls only from other Skype users or you can, for a low yearly fee, buy a "SkypeIn" number. Pick whatever area code you like and start receiving calls. If your computer is turned off or you don't answer, you have the option of letting the call go to voice mail or forwarding the call to another number, such as your cell phone. The quality is surprisingly clear.

So far, since I've been using it, no one that I have called on a regular phone has suspected that I was calling from my computer, and no one that has called my SkypeIn number has even suspected that they were talking to me on my computer. Or at least the ones that I've asked haven't anyway. So far, I have not heard any distortion or experienced any of the issues that plagued early attempts of VOIP.

There are even some pretty sophisticated devices out there that work with the service, such as desk and cordless phone modules that plug into the USB port of the computer, giving the system a

true telephone feel rather than that "ham radio operator" feel that computer headsets can often give you.

They have Wi-Fi handsets that connect you to your Skype service anytime you have access to wireless Internet, eliminating the need to have a computer on all the time and there are even conversion kits, again surprisingly cheap, that let you convert your home's phone wiring to Skype.

I was reading about one system that (when connected to your house wiring) lets you plug in ordinary household phones (wired, cordless, etc.) into any jack in the house and be able to make and receive Skype calls.

With my current phone bill as high as it is, I could see how a system like that could save a lot of money.

If you like the idea of making cheap, long distance calls without a lot of hassles setting it up, point your Web browser to [www.skype.com](http://www.skype.com) and read up on it. The software is free to download and sports a guarantee that it's free of spyware and other malicious software.

The site is laid out well with information readily available, but if you do have questions, call me at (888) 752-9049 and I'll answer what I can.

# Hometown News **SUPER BUY\$** of the week

## 'Super' debate: Do everyday low prices beat couponing?

Last week I touched on a topic that's of intense interest among my super-couponing students: where do shoppers get the best deal, at a supermarket or a supercenter?

The former has a reputation among most shoppers for being "more expensive," the latter is widely considered to be the better value due to its "everyday low pricing." But savvy shoppers know that the sale prices of the supermarket almost always beat the everyday prices of the supercenter.

To test the idea, I recently took a field trip of sorts and compared prices on more than 20 common items at both types of stores.

Here's a sample of the price differences I found on six popular name brand products at an "everyday

low price," or ELP, from a supercenter and at a supermarket or SM.

Single-serve fruit cup: \$1.97 ELP/\$1.50 SM  
 Half-gallon organic milk: \$3.50 ELP/\$3.99 SM  
 Frozen pizza: \$4.75 ELP/\$4.99 SM  
 Dishwasher detergent tablets: \$4.26 ELP/\$3.99 SM  
 4-pound bag of dog food: \$6.97 ELP/\$4.99 SM  
 Juice pouches: \$1.98 ELP/\$1.49 SM

I found the everyday low prices at the supercenter were higher, in most cases, than the prices for the same products at the supermarket.

Many shoppers believe that using coupons to buy products at the supercenter with its everyday low pricing will save them as much, if not more, than

watching for sales at a supermarket and using coupons there. This is just not the case.

As you will see, on my shopping trip, I bought milk and pizza at the supermarket and paid significantly less for them than I would have paid at the supercenter using the same coupons. Let me walk you through the numbers.

During my comparison-shopping trip, the supermarket was running an additional promotion. If you spent \$30 on featured items you received a coupon at

checkout good for \$10 off your next shopping trip. So, a third of my supermarket expenditure would be returned to me in the form of a Catalina coupon printed out at the register. That coupon is just like a \$10 bill that I can use the next time I shop at the store.

Now, considering that a third of what I pay is coming back to me, the comparison really gets interesting.

Here's what the prices on my individual purchases at the supermarket now look like with the Catalina savings figured in:

Fruit cup: \$1.97 ELP/99 cents SM  
 Organic milk: \$3.50 ELP/\$2.63 SM  
 Frozen pizza: \$4.75 ELP/\$3.29 SM  
 Dishwasher tablets: \$4.26 ELP/\$2.63 SM

Dog food: \$6.97 ELP/\$3.29 SM  
 Juice pouches: \$1.98 ELP/98 cents SM

Notice that the prices of the milk and pizza, originally more expensive at the supermarket, have now dipped well below the supercenter's prices. And, we haven't added in savings from our coupons in yet!

Here are the coupons I used with these items, along with the post-coupon prices at both stores:

\$1 coupon for fruit cup, after coupon: 97 cents ELP/-1 cent SM  
 55-cent coupon for organic milk: \$2.95 ELP/\$2.08 SM  
 \$3 coupon for frozen pizza: \$1.75 ELP/29 cents SM  
 \$2.50 coupon for dishwasher tablets: \$1.76

ELP/13 cents SM  
 \$3 coupon for dog food: \$3.97 ELP/29 cents SM  
 \$1 coupon for juice pouches: 98 cents ELP/-2 cents SM

At the supermarket, I ended up paying significantly less than if I used my coupons to purchase the same items at the supercenter.

Both the fruit cup and the juice pouches were not only free after the coupon, but the store paid me a few cents in overage to take them home. And I certainly couldn't have taken a frozen pizza or a bag of dog food home for less than 30 cents each at a supercenter.

By the end of my shopping trip, the difference between the prices in both items was incredible.

# Head north for fun fishing

Do not be overly impressed with published reports of spectacular catches in the Halifax. There are a few fish to be caught, but success will take a lot of work and even more luck.

Between Tomoka Basin and the Dunlawton Bridge fishing is a poor as I have ever seen it.

While the water retains the color and consistency of coffee, the catch is more low-fat milk — only about two percent of the fish remain.

To find more action, I towed up to the State Road 100 Bridge in Flagler Beach. I launched in the pre-dawn and motored north to the Sea Ray Boat Works canal. That cut has a long-standing reputation for big sea trout.

I had to smile when on my first cast a trout had my jig a split second after it hit the water.

It turned out to be just a bit shorter than the legal length of 15 inches as were the next six that came in rapid succession.

No matter, they were all perfect fun size. Before leaving, I did manage to boat two 16-inchers to take home.

By the way, spotted sea

trout season is closed in Volusia County until the new year, but are legal north of the county line. That's another good reason to fish north.

Continuing to target trout, I moved on up the river about three miles to where the bank is lined with rocks. The water there is fed by Matanzas Inlet and is beautiful green and clear just the way we wished the water in Volusia County would be. To avoid snagging my jig on submerged rocks I went with the Mirro Lure Floating Twitchbait and right away began to get short hits, but no takers.

It took me a few minutes to realize that the trout I was missing were actually mangrove snappers.

With that in mind, I switched to the suspending twitchbait, which is about a third smaller than the full sized Mirro Lure.

Even though I have caught six-inch mangos on six-inch plugs, I wanted to make it just a bit easier for

the little scrappers to hook up.

That worked nicely and soon I had a five fish limit. All were between 12 and 14 inches and came in on the plug. Not one throw back of less than 10 inches was caught. Five keeper mangrove snapper on a plug is somewhat of a rare happening these days.

Back at the boat ramp, I met young Ryan Bounds of Palm Coast who was launching his jet ski. Much to my surprise he brought along a fishing rod and a few lures.

When I questioned him about it he replied: "This is my redfish machine!" He told me he could fish places no boat could reach and enjoyed a lot of success with his unorthodox fishing vessel. Now let me say right here I am no fan of those noisy sea-going motorcycles, but I love to see young folks out fishing. If a jet ski is what it takes — so be it!


