Opinions differ on historic district's effect on business

DAYTONA BEACH — Some say zoning to protect historic structures hinders business development and others say it enhances economic growth.

These opinions are clashing as the City Commission considers approving special historic zoning for the Seabreeze Historic District, which is on the national register.

The commission approved the zoning ordinance unanimously in a

first reading recently, even though a couple of the commissioners expressed concerns about its effect on businesses. It will come back to the commission for a final vote on Jan. 6.

A historic zone classification would mean that the city's Historic Board would have to approve any demolition or exterior alteration of a building in the zone that is considered a "contributing" structure. New construction would also be reviewed.

Determining factors include age, architectural style, and how much it

has been remodeled.

Generally, the Seabreeze zone would be from University Boulevard south to Auditorium Boulevard. The west and east boundaries would be the Halifax River and State Road A1A.

The Economic Development Advisory Board recommended to the commission that the historic zoning should only incorporate the area between University and Glenview

Boulevard, a residential area. Board member Carl Lentz said if

Commissioners to revise parking ordinance

ORMOND BEACH — Caj Pinero has a visitor to her home each year for Bike Week and was worried where they would park when she heard about a new code being considered by the city.

The new rule would ban parking in the front yard of a home except on an

"improved" surface, which was defined as a durable material such as concrete or asphalt. An exception was provided for driveways built before 1998.

Ms. Pinero does not have room in her driveway for the visitor's vehicles along with the ones that are already parked there.

Her problem may be solved. After hearing from residents at a recent meet-

ing, the commission decided to table the matter and reconsider it after staff makes several changes.

"The ordinance is wrong," Ms. Pinero told the commissioners. "We are on a fixed income and can't afford a driveway."

The ordinance allowed a variance for social events up to 24 hours, but Ms. Pinero said she sometimes has a visitor for a week and

there is no room for them to park in the driveway.

The commissioners heard from about a dozen other residents who spoke against the proposed ordinance.

Some said there were several drivers in their household and they couldn't fit all the cars on the driveway while others said building a permanent driveway would be a financial hardship.

Doug Thomas pointed out that Ormond Beach has an ordinance that says four unrelated people can live together in a house.

"There isn't enough room to get that many cars in some driveways," he said.

Another resident, Marvin Miller, said the ordinance would create problems.

"You'll have every crank

City says no to liquor at The Casements

ORMOND BEACH — The city commission has rejected a proposal to allow hard liquor at private social events on city-owned property.

The proposal to allow hard liquor at private social events was made by the Leisure Services Department. Director Robert Carolin told the commissioners that the staff at the Casements believes more receptions could be booked if hard liquor were allowed.

He said many times weddings are held at the property but the reception is moved to another location where drinks stronger than beer and wine can be served.

Commissioners said they did not like the idea of hard liquor being served at social events, such as dinners, wed-

dings and receptions on city property.

"Having a drink is perfectly legal," said Commissioner Bill Partington. "Thousands do it without a problem but there are always a few who ruin it for everyone else."

Commissioner Troy Kent said he was OK with people taking the reception to another location.

"I'm thinking about the Casements getting wrecked," he said.

Mr. Carolin told the commissioners that allowing liquor was just a small part of the requested changes. He said the revised ordinance would allow nonprofits to charge admission for community events where they sell beer and wine, which would bring in more money for the organization and also for the

city. This is currently prohibited.

Other changes include allowing nonprofits to have an event more than once a year and to serve beer or wine outdoors in Rockefeller Gardens. Currently, events with

alcoholic beverages must be conducted indoors.

Being able to have events with beer and wine outdoors would bring in "considerably more money," because they could be much larger, Mr. Carolin said.

The commission directed city staff to rewrite the proposed ordinance without allowing hard liquor and resubmit it for consideration at a later meeting.

Other area cities allow hard

Commission seeks more control over spending

DAYTONA BEACH — The City Commission may have found a way to be more in the loop when it comes to city government operations.

A month ago, commissioners complained at a meeting that they were not kept informed about projects by city manager Jim Chisholm.

The commissioners are now considering a resolution that would require commission approval for spending in excess of \$25,000 on a project.

The current rule states that the city manager does not need commission approval unless an expenditure is more than \$25,000. The revised ordinance says if multiple expenditures on a single project reach \$25,000, he must get commission approval.

Commissioner Pam Woods cited the example of spending on the Daytona Beach Pier.

"In the past year, we had outside legal counsel, an outside economic report and we had Logan Diving work on the pilings. We had two appraisals that were done that never, ever, came to us for a vote," she said. "This was way over \$25,000. That's what I want to come before us. Then we can say, 'Go forth and

do this, Jim.' But I want it to come to us first."

Mr. Chisholm said the pier was discussed many times with the commission.

"What we didn't discuss was all the little components," he said.

Mr. Chisholm suggested that he issue a report on projects to keep the commission informed, rather than require preapproval for spending.

"I think this will create some problems for departments trying to get the job done for the city in an efficient manner," he said.

Mayor Glenn Ritchey concurred, giving the example that there could be an emergency at the water plant and there wouldn't be time to wait for a commission meeting to get approval on spending.

Commissioner Richard Shiver suggested having a contingency fund to take care of such emergency situations.

"I don't want to stop (Mr. Chisholm) from running the city, but I want to know what's going on," he said.

Commissioner Shiela McKay-Vaughan said she could live with a contingency fund, but could not live with the city writing several \$25,000 checks that are all related to one project.

Seabreeze Boulevard were included, it would put "additional pressure" on the businesses there.

"We've seen a dramatic decrease in occupancy among businesses," he said. "A historic zone would require a business owner to spend additional time and money to remodel or do anything extensive. The zone would add more government bureaucracy to development."

Local businessman Jim Morris said the area south of Oakridge Boulevard should not be in the historic district because it has the Ocean Center, a water park and a parking garage. "North of Seabreeze is beautiful. You have owner occupied homes and they made up their minds to make their neighborhood look better," he said. "South of Oakridge, you've got large institutional structures and also an absence of owner occupation."

He said he did not believe people would buy and fix up historic homes in the area because (he believes) it would be a bad investment and the historic zoning would impede current owners from demolishing or remodeling the buildings.

"It's unfortunate, but it's an area that's been overgrown

with urban development really to the point it can't be recovered," he said.

A counterpoint was made by city manager Jim Chisholm, who said in every place he's traveled, he's seen historic structures in mixed commercial and residential areas.

"You don't tear it down, you fix it up," he said. "South of Oakridge, we need to offer incentives and write codes to make improvements. From what I've seen in other communities, the commercial district is where they thrive."

People fight historic preservation because they don't understand it, said Tracey Remark, who lives in the Seabreeze historic zone and serves on the Planning Board. "They are asking you to take out a commercial area," she said. "Commercials areas work in Savannah, they work in New Orleans, and they work in Jacksonville. City staff does not have to reinvent the wheel. They can call any of these places to see how it works. It's a matter of making things work for business as well as historic preservation."

Edith Shelley, who is on the Daytona Beach Planning Board and the Downtown Redevelopment Board, said historic zones are prime areas for small business incubation.

"In city after city, desirable, small, high-tech businesses choose to locate in historic districts," she said.

She also said studies show that historic preservation makes areas less vulnerable to the ups and downs of real estate values.

The renovation of houses would put people to work, said John McGinnis, president of the Seabreeze Neighborhood Association.

"Another benefit is that we have the ability to generate historic tourism, which has become very popular," he said.

Several commissioners mentioned that it is important to preserve area history.

"We may not have the history of England or even South Carolina, but it's important that we pass on our heritage to the next generation," said Commissioner Derrick Henry.

Mayor Glenn Ritchey said he had supported the effort for a historic zone from the beginning because he is a "big believer in neighborhoods."

There should be give-and-take between the two sides, according to Commissioner Richard Shiver.

"The business people I've talked to are afraid of it. I think we should not include Seabreeze Boulevard in the zone," he said.

Commissioner Robert Gilliland said he would support the resolution in the first reading, but he had "serious concerns" about the commercial impact.

"If it's more difficult to invest here than other cities those dollars will go someplace else. That's a fact of life," he said.

Conserving while you cook

It takes a lot of energy – both physical and electrical – to prepare meals for family and friends during the holidays. Whether you're cooking holiday dinners for relatives or baking cookies for an office potluck, keep these tips in mind to minimize your electricity usage in the kitchen:

Don't waste energy by unnecessarily pre-heating your oven. Some foods, such as bread and desserts, require preheating, but holiday meal

staples such as turkey and ham don't.

Keep the oven door closed. Ovens lose lots of heat when opened and require significant energy to heat back up to the appropriate temperature. Instead of opening the door to check on your food, turn on the interior light and look through the oven's window.

Oven-bake as many items together as you can. Although some items may cook at different temperatures, many items can be cooked at a standard temperature.

Use smaller appliances such as crock-pots,

microwaves and toaster ovens when possible. These can be much more energy-efficient for side dishes or small meals.

• Match the size of your pan to the size of the heating element. For example, when using an electric cook top, a 6-inch pan on an 8-inch burner will waste more than 40 percent of the heat produced by the burner.

Choose glass or ceramic pans for the oven. These pans heat faster than metal ones and allow you to set the temperature 25 degrees lower than a recipe suggests for the

same cooking time.

When possible, cover your pots and pans. This can help cook your food more quickly and keeps the cooking temperature higher, which allows you to turn down the stove.

Only use as much water as you need in a pot. Every extra drop requires more energy to heat and increases the cooking time.

liquor at private social events on their properties and spokesmen say there have been no problems.

Carol Lucas of the New Smyrna Beach Parks and Recreation Department said they rent out three different buildings for parties and have not had a problem in the 10 years she has been there.

"The biggest problem has been wedding cake icing stomped into the carpet," she said. "The parties have to be out of the buildings by 11

p.m. and I think that's the secret. They are not there at two in the morning getting rowdy."

She said many times the parties move to another location in the city to continue the festivities after 11 p.m.

She said business is brisk. "We're booked for the next year and it's 80 percent weddings," she said. "If I had some extra money I'd buy a building and start my own business."

Susan Cerbone, spokeswoman for Daytona Beach, said the city rents out several facilities for social events including weddings and allows hard liquor.

"We charge an extra \$50," she said. "I'm not aware of any problems."

The Holly Hill Recreation Department has a more stringent policy.

Only wine or champagne can be served, said Chuck Beach of the Recreation Department, and must have less than eight percent alcohol.

"No alcohol was allowed until about eight years ago," he said. "And then they decided to allow wine based products in case they want to make a toast. And we double the fee if they want to have wine."

complaining about everyone in the neighborhood," he said. "This is a hardship for people with small homes and a working mom and dad and working kids."

Some of the commissioners said that they had received many phone calls and e-mails from people in favor of the ban, saying multiple cars parked in yards was unsightly and harmed property values.

Commissioner Troy Kent said he sees the problem in his own neighborhood.

"It's not fair to the neighbors," he said. "This could become a real problem if we don't do something. But I'm ready to start bending. I think we should look at the possibility of allowing a gravel driveway."

Commissioner Bill Partington said the commission needs to "balance quality of life and aesthetics with the rights of property owners."

A suggestion offered by Mayor Fred Costello would allow parking in the side yard parallel to the driveway if the driveway is full of cars.

"I think that will resolve most of the issues," he said.

The commission directed City Manager Joyce

Shanahan and staff to redraft the resolution for the commission to consider.

The changes that will be studied by staff include: allowing parking in the side yard beside the driveway on material such as gravel, stones or mulch; changing the social event variance from 24 to 72 hours; and considering an extended stay permit.

Mr. Partington said the commission has a history of taking on a controversial subject and listening to residents' opinions. He believed the ordinance could be changed to accommodate most of the speakers.

"We want to listen and get it right," he said.

The commission has dealt with strong public opinion at least twice this year.

E-mails and phone calls from residents about a river walk idea that had been discussed by the commission caused the commissioners to schedule workshops to get input from advisory boards and the public.

Another hot topic earlier this year was the redesign of John Anderson Drive. The commission heard from a roomful of people opposed to one of the ideas, which was to make the street one-way north bound. The one-way idea was tossed out.

"It may be more efficient for you, Jim, and I appreciate your problem," she told the city manager, "but I don't think that it provides transparency."

The commission decided to continue the matter to the next meeting. Meanwhile, city attorney Marie Hartman will revise the language regarding emergency funds.

In October, the commission had an item on the agenda to discuss communications problems between the city manager, staff and commissioners.

At that meeting, Ms. McKay-Vaughan said it was a serious issue.

"Several times we didn't get enough information and we had to pull things from the agenda," she said. "I want to see the city commission in charge of what goes on in the city."

Mayor Ritchey said he wanted to see "demonstrated improvement" in communications.

"We need to improve what we do and how we do it," he said.



She didn't know the friend was behind on payments and understands companies come after delinquent customers, but when she went to the car company, Daytona Auto Sales to retrieve her gifts, they were not there and a business spokesman refused to tell her where she could find the repo man. She was devastated and crushed that her daughter's Christmas was stolen. WESH 2 spoke to the dealership. The dealership spokes person said they were very angry at the publicity and said there was nothing

in the car when they repossessed it. A generous local businessman from Orlando, Jeff Emory, saw our story and went shopping for Ms. Bright and her daughter, replacing all the lost presents and buying even more. Mother and daughter were just overwhelmed with the kindness.

Beware of shoplifters

Police warn this time of year there are bad Santas out there. Law officers see an increase in shoplifting this time of year and warn retail store-owners that all workers have to be on their guard, in addition to those doing security in the businesses. Daytona Beach police Sergeant Mike Griffin says thieves are the guys looking around a lot in area stores to see who might be watching them. They typically wear big clothing to hide items and try to disappear into big crowds. Police say clerks who interact with suspicious shoppers may prevent thefts because thieves don't want to be identified. Sgt. Woman attacked after car broke down

An Ormond Beach woman was choked until she was unconscious twice after police say thieves followed her from a Daytona Beach gas station

and robbed her when her car broke down. Theresa Moore had just purchased a used car and was gassing it up at the Valero Gas Station on Derbyshire at Eighth Street. She noticed three men in a red truck, but didn't think much about them until she got back in her vehicle and drove down the street. That's when her new used car made a noise and she got out to check it out. Ms. Moore says suddenly the men were there. She says they jumped out of the truck, grabbed her and starting going through her pockets while another one of the men strangled her. She passed out and when she came to, she thought the men were gone, so she jumped into her car. Instead, the victim says the men attacked again, stealing her purse containing cash, credit cards and personal information, while choking her again. Coin hobby turns gold

DAYTONA BEACH — Silver Coast Coins is a busy place these days.

One reason is that many people are selling gold to take advantage of the fact that it is now at its highest price in history.

Owner Jay McBride, who has been in the business since 1973, said it's a good time to sell gold.

"I think the price will come down," he said. "Right now there's a huge demand nationwide."

Gold is just part of this family-owned business on East International Speedway Boulevard. They also buy and sell items such as silver, collectible coins, jewelry, paper money and silver serving sets.

People are not only selling gold, but buying it as an investment.

People are also buying silver, because it's more affordable than gold, Mr. McBride said.

Lance Wilson, Mr. McBride's son-in-law who works alongside him, said the latest rage is the Canadian Maple Leaf one-tenth ounce gold coin.

"With coins this small, you can sell part of your gold and keep some of it," he

explained.

In these days of electronic bank transactions, owning gold is an opportunity to see and touch your investment.

"We are one of the few places you can buy physical gold," Mr. Wilson said. "You can't get it at the bank. And you can take it anywhere in the world. An ounce of gold is an ounce of gold anywhere."

Mr. McBride's first love was rare, collectible coins.

"I always wanted to have a coin shop since I was a little kid," he said.

He opened his first shop in Rapid City, S.D., and discovered Daytona Beach while visiting coin shows around the country.

"The shows in Daytona Beach were really spectacular so I decided it would be a good place to move my business, plus I wanted the sunshine," he said.

He moved his business here in 1988.

He said these days he does more business with bullion (bars, ingots and gold or silver coins without collectible value) than collectible coins because rare coins have become too expensive for average people.

As an example, he said an 1893 F silver dollar was worth \$300 20 years ago and now it's worth \$3,000.

"If people have something

they think is valuable, they should bring it in," he said. "We'll tell them what it's worth at no charge."

Mr. McBride said people with something to sell often shop around and then end up coming back to his shop because he offered the best price.

"We get business through word of mouth," he said. "After 37 years we've made a lot of friends and we see the same people over and over."

Many people who enjoy collectible coins have an interest in history, Mr. McBride said.

"You never know who held

that coin," he said. "You wonder ... Did they lose it playing poker? You're holding an actual piece of history."

He is still looking for one elusive coin.

"I've seen just about everything, but I still want a \$4 gold piece that was made between 1879 and 1880," Mr. McBride said. "There are only a few of them. I'm still waiting to find one."





to a party with him. Instead, police said Mr. Troxell took the victim to a vacant home that was for sale, telling her it was his parents' house and to prevent them from waking up, they would have to sneak in through the pool area. Mr. Troxell ran when the woman started to scream, but hours later police said he met another woman at a nightclub and told her the same story. Police say Mr. Troxell took the second woman to another vacant and for sale home on Northbrook Drive, where he pulled out a screwdriver and raped her on a back screen porch. That victim managed to stab Mr. Troxell with the screwdriver and steal his wallet before he took off and police quickly identified the suspect, then found him riding a bike in the area unable to explain the stab wound on his face.

Family of murder victim wants answers

The family of a Daytona Beach man murdered the day after Thanksgiving is pleading with the killers to come forward and asking anyone in the community who may have information to do the right thing and call police. James Tolbert, 34, was stabbed and shot outside his apartment on Baldwin Lane near Division Street. A lone witness saw two young men running from the scene, but that's where the leads end. Mr. Tolbert's mother, stepfather and the mother of his 12-year-old daughter say they need closure and hope someone with information will come forward. Police said drugs and drug paraphernalia were found in the victim's apartment along with cash, but nothing was taken, so they can't be sure if the murder has a drug connection.

Man shot in drive-by shooting

A 21-year-old Daytona Beach man was shot once in the leg overnight and tells police he was a victim in a drive-by shooting. Derek Wendell said someone in a passing vehicle shot into his car at the intersection of Madeline Avenue and Sunset Cove Drive in Port Orange. Mr. Wendell said the suspect car followed him from Daytona Beach Shores where he stopped to get gas, all the way into Port Orange, and then opened fire. Mr. Wendell said after he was wounded, he drove further into Daytona Beach, where he stopped at a convenience store for help. He said he did not recognize the people in the suspect vehicle.

Women sentenced to 15 years for DUI manslaughter

A 23-year-old woman will serve 15 years in prison after pleading no contest in Volusia County to DUI manslaughter. Motorcyclist Chris Maloney, 44, was killed in Holly Hill last January when the driver of a Jaguar slammed into him, pushing him into several vehicles in front of him. Police said Erika Selman was drunk that night and abusive with police. She was also sentenced for resisting arrest.

Daytona Beach police officer will be prosecuted

WESH 2 has learned the

State Attorney's office will prosecute a Daytona Beach Police officer arrested in September. Holly Hill police stopped veteran officer Janet Hawkins after they saw her racing down side streets and blowing through stop signs and intersections. Police said once stopped, Officer Hawkins was verbally abusive, calling Holly Hill officers' rednecks and corrupt. Hawkins was reportedly furious that her son had been arrested in an unrelated incident. Officer Hawkins is charged with resisting arrest and obstruction and has entered a written plea of not guilty.

Cops arrest copper thieves

A copper thief drew the attention of the "coppers" and firefighters when he was spotted on the roof of a vacant restaurant in Daytona Beach. Police had to bring in a bucket truck from the fire department to bring Gregory Goreham, 31, down. He was on the roof of a restaurant in the 200 block of north U.S. Highway 1 when a passing police officer spotted him. The suspect was hiding in an air conditioning vent on the roof surrounded by freshly cut copper. Two people waiting for him on the ground were also arrested and charged as accessories.

Burglar sentenced to two years

A burglar, who was identified by Daytona Beach police through new technology called touch DNA, is going to prison for two years. Dean Dagostino, 43, used a porous coquina rock to bust a window at the Ultimate Omelet shop in late May, and steal cash from the restaurant. Police had his DNA on file because he was in jail, accused in another burglary. Investigators matched it, to DNA they got off that rock. Mr. Dagostino will also spend three years on drug offender probation.



Billy's best now on tap at iconic grill

ORMOND BEACH – How would you like your grouper? Sautéed? Broiled? Stuffed? Grilled? Blackened? Lightly dusted?

Well, if you're dining at Billy's Tap Room & Grill in Ormond Beach, you will be handed a list to help make your decision easier.

You see, Billy's is famous for its grouper, and features 23 ways to prepare it. That's right, 23 ways.

But—there is a 24th way, too. If you don't see the right combination to your liking, tell the chef how you would like to have it cooked.

Sautéed Chef Shawn Beers, a 12-year kitchen pro at Billy's, said he is amazed at all the ways kitchen manager and chef Clay Pletcher can create so many grouper recipes.

“I've never seen him do so many orders [of grouper] in one night and get them out the door,” Mr. Beers said.

Owners Maria Szabad-Reisch and Bobby Szabad, purchased the restaurant, first opened in 1922, in 2006 from Monk and Jackie Noell, knowing very well the implications of inheriting a neighborhood icon.

“There is a lot of history here and we feel we're only the temporary holder of the tradition that is Billy's today before we turn it over to someone else,” Mr. Szabad said.

For Maria Reisch, owning a restaurant was her dream come true. She is originally from Holland and was the former owner of the beachfront motel Old Salty's Inn in Daytona Beach Shores.

“We're proud to continue a legacy in Ormond Beach,” Ms. Reisch said.

As the current stewards of Billy's,

not many changes have taken place since 2006. However, recognizing the economic downturn, Mr. Szabad said it was time to do what they needed to do: drop their prices on the menu.

“It's our way to help our diners through some tough economic times,” Mr. Szabad said.

Ms. Reisch said these days we all need help.

“Diners will still have the dining experience but with lower prices.”

Calling it Billy's Best—Best Menu, Better Prices, Mr. Szabad said, “One thing we're not doing is sacrificing quality and quantity with that price drop.”

Maria Reisch and her husband tweaked their menu items, keeping all the favorites, but adjusting the prices downward.

"We don't do things a la carte. You get a veggie tray, a bread basket and a salad along with your entrée," Mr. Szabad said.

The grouper is only one of many signature dishes at Billy's. Filet mignon has been a favorite of diners for many years and the seafood menu starts with mouth-watering crab cakes that will rival any dish coming from Maryland chefs.

Mr. Pletcher has been with Billy's Tap Room & Grill for 21 years now, with the last 10 years as kitchen manager and head chef.

Mr. Pletcher said his favorite section in the kitchen is broiling but likes cooking steaks on the grill as well.

"Our grouper recipes have evolved over the years," Mr. Pletcher said. "Early on we only had three to four ways to fix it. Now we're up to 23."

Mr. Pletcher is among several staff with a long history with the restaurant on East Granada Blvd.

General Manager Robert Wulfekuhl has run the restaurant for the past 14 years. He said consistency is the key to any business, especially in restaurants.

"We have several long-time

employees. Everyone knows what to do and they do it consistently every night," he said.

Perhaps the most well known employee at Billy's is Rick Ash. He's the first one you meet when you walk through the front door. He's the bartender and has been serving patrons for the past 18 years.

Rick is a pro at mixing tasty concoctions. Be sure to ask for after-dinner drinks for just \$7. "He's one of a kind," Mr. Wulfekuhl said.

"We were very happy to have all of the staff stay with us when we bought the restaurant," Ms. Reisch said. "We're one big happy family."

Mr. Wulfekuhl also cited Spanky, 16 years as a grill master; Dave, eight years as the meat man; and KC, 14 years, prepping salads and desserts, as reasons for the restaurant's success.

Ms. Reisch said two of her servers have also been with the company for many years.

"Debbie Eggers has been here for 12 years now and Bonnie Silva, eight years," Ms. Reisch said.

Roy Reinholz of Ormond Beach, enjoying a glass of wine at the bar, said he's been coming to restaurant for several years now.

"Rick [Ash] is very friendly and he knows everyone who comes to the bar. I could be away for weeks but when I

return, he'll say, 'Hi, Roy.'"

Mr. Reinholz said he enjoys the ambiance of the restaurant. As far as food goes Mr. Reinholz said he certainly has no complaints.

"The specials are great," he said. "I love the steaks and the variety [on the menu] that's offered."

Items on the improved Billy's Best menu that debuted this past week includes a 4-oz. Maryland-style jumbo lump crab cake, which makes for a fine appetizer for \$12.95.

Grouper prices begin at \$21.95 and a filet mignon starts at \$20.95.

Other items on the menu include: Jackie's wedge salad (\$7.95); fried sea scallops (\$19.95); clams and shrimp (\$18.95); chicken Granada (\$15.95); and London broil (\$19.95).

The restaurant features a main dining room, the bar area and two banquet rooms, The MacDonald Room, named after founder Billy MacDonald, and the Shockney Room, named after Ted Shockney, uncle to former restaurant owner Monk Noell.

The Rotary Club of Ormond Beach has met in The MacDonald Room for the past 52 years and continues to do so every Thursday evening.

Both banquet rooms retain their historic décor with deep wood finishes and photograph collections depicting the early history of Ormond Beach and Daytona Beach.

One photo shows tycoon John D. Rockefeller giving a golfing lesson to a very young Billy MacDonald. It was entitled "A million dollar lesson."

Diners won't find plastic or chrome anywhere inside the restaurant either. The interior has maintained its historic charm with original wooden booths and floors.

"These are all good examples of the history we have here at the restaurant," Mr. Szabad said.

Multi-stacking coupons can add up to greater savings

Last week I introduced you to the concept of multi-stacking, a term I use to refer to any deal at the grocery store that involves applying multiple discounts to the purchase of the same items.

Through multi-stacking, shoppers can enjoy even greater savings at the register each week, leveraging the power of store coupons, manufacturer coupons and additional sales or special promotions being held at the store.

My favorite deals are "money-back" supermarket sales, in which part of what you pay for your items is returned to you at checkout

in the form of a Catalina coupon good for money off your next purchase.

One of the stores I shop at recently had a "spend \$30, get \$15 back" sale on a variety of items. I get very excited when I see these sales, because that \$30 is the total before coupons are factored in pre-coupon, I call it.

This particular deal included a variety of cereals. All of them were priced at \$2 a box. By buying 15 boxes I could reach the \$30 spending mark and qualify for the special sale.

Now, right away, I suspect a few of my readers may be snickering a bit. Fifteen boxes of cereal? In one shopping

trip? You bet!

At my store, these great, high-level, money-back sales tend to come around only once every few months or so. When they do, it's a great opportunity to stock up on the cheap. Cereal is an excellent item to add to your grocery stockpile at home. It typically doesn't outdate for 11 months or more. And when you buy more, you save more.

I always take advantage of these sales when they come along. And I can't remember a time when I paid more than a quarter a box for a name-brand cereal. Really. That's actually the high end of what I'll pay. I typically pay much less than that for cereal, as you'll see during my story of this \$30/\$15 sale.

As I entered the cereal aisle, I was on the lookout for in-store coupons. It's always a good idea to scan for coupons that may be in dispensers or on the shelves of your supermarket.

When I see coupons for products I like I always take a few, because I will have those coupons on hand next time a

sale comes around. Sometimes, the coupon you need to sweeten a deal is hanging right in front of you on the shelf. Keep your eyes open!

That was the case with my cereal buy. As I added 15 boxes to my cart, I spied a tear pad of \$1 coupons for the cereal hanging on the shelf right under the boxes. So I took 15 of them. I never clean out a store of coupons; there are typically more than 100 coupons on a tear pad. Don't be afraid to take what you will use. Remember, coupons are placed there in the hope that you will use them and try the product.

I headed to the register with my 15 boxes of \$2 cereal and 15 \$1 coupons. The cashier scanned my cereal and the register total came to \$30. I handed the cashier my \$1 coupons; after they were redeemed, my bill was \$15. I paid \$15 and I received \$15 back in Catalina coupons good for my next shopping trip. So I got back the same amount of money I spent on the cereal. My 15 boxes of cereal are, essentially, free.

I've stressed this point in previous columns but I can't say it often enough: shoppers

must think of coupons as cash. They are essentially a form of cash, for shoppers and for the stores where we do business.

When a supermarket has a sale like a "spend \$30, get \$15 back," shoppers still spend \$30 on the items. My \$1 coupons "paid" for \$15 of my \$30 spending and the store will get that \$15 back from the manufacturer when it redeems the coupons.

The \$15 in Catalina coupons that I received function just like cash in the store. They're good for anything I want to buy on my next shopping trip. So I view this as having exchanged one form of cash for another, but I'm still holding the \$15 in my hand that I just paid for the cereal. It's just in the form of a coupon now. And you know how much I love coupons!

This week's dinner: Fresh ham. Everyone knows about smoked ham, but not fresh ham. It's not always available in local markets. Fresh ham is ham that has not been smoked or cured. It's much less expensive than loin of pork and the meat is lean and delicious.

Start the feast with your choice of two great appetizers.

ROASTED VEGETABLE TART (NIB) serves 6-8

This recipe is compliments of Carapelli Olive Oil company, famous in Florence, Italy, since 1893. It's a relatively easy and excellent appetizer.

- 4 plum tomatoes (Roma), coarsely chopped
- 1 small eggplant, unpeeled and cubed
- 1 medium red bell pepper (seeded, cut in strips that are 1/2-inch wide and 1 inch long)
- 1 large zucchini, cut lengthwise in quarters and then into 1/4-inch slices
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/4-cup extra virgin olive oil, divided
- 1/2-teaspoon salt
- 1/8-teaspoon ground black pepper
- Cornmeal
- Half of 9-ounce package refrigerated pie crust*
- 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan or Romano cheese

*Note: Use piecrust sold boxed in sheets, not formed in a tin. It can be found in the dairy section.

Heat oven to 450 degrees. In bowl, toss all vegetables with garlic, 3 tablespoons olive oil, salt and pepper. Place vegetables in a large pan. Bake 30 minutes until

golden brown.

Place piecrust on a pan which has been lightly sprinkled with cornmeal. Place roasted vegetables onto crust, leaving a 2-inch border. Fold the dough up (pleating as necessary) to partially cover the filling around the round edges. Brush crust with remaining oil.

Reduce oven temperature to 425-degrees. Bake 15-20 minutes until crust is golden brown. Sprinkle with cheese, cut into wedges and serve.

SPINACH-FETA AIOLI ON CROSTINI (NIB) 8-10 appetizers

Aioli is garlic mayonnaise that originated in southern France. This appetizer is made like bruschetta. The end result is superb and may be made lower in fat by using low-fat creamed spinach and low-fat or fat-free mayon-

naise.

- 1 9-ounce package creamed spinach
- 3/4-cup mayonnaise
- 1 4-ounce package crumbled feta cheese
- 1 garlic clove, pressed
- 1/4-teaspoon ground red pepper
- 1 loaf French or Italian bread, cut diagonally into 1/2-inch slices

Thaw creamed spinach in microwave at medium (50 percent power) 5-6 minutes. Stir together mayonnaise and next 3 ingredients; stir in creamed spinach.

Spread creamed spinach mixture evenly on bread slices, and place slices on baking sheet.

Bake at 350-degrees for 10 minutes or until cheese melts. Serve immediately.

FRESH HAM serves 10 or more

Ask the butcher to bone and tie the ham. Save the bone for a special occasion spaghetti sauce (adds great flavor). By removing the skin and the fat you will have a wonderful, lean roast pork. For a special treat, have the

butcher bone the meat and leave the skin (rind) on. It will become crisp and delicious, albeit loaded with fat. Either way, the recipe is the same.

- 7 pound shank half fresh ham
- Garlic powder
- Salt and pepper

Score rind with a sharp knife. Sprinkle roast with seasonings. Place on a rack in roasting pan. Roast at 325-degrees, 35 minutes per pound. Meat juices should run clear.

Prepare gravy according to recipe in previous columns.

Remove the rind and cut up with scissors. Carve meat in thin slices. Serve with applesauce.



FISHING WITH DAN

Christmas gift giving is a breeze if your mate likes to fish. Bait shops and department stores display a bounty of great items that will make any fisherman smile.

Of course, a good percentage of December's perfect picks will wind up being sold for pennies at your February garage sale.

To keep that from happening there are a few common sense rules to follow.

The very first thing to consider is where your recipient falls on the experience scale. Fishing is one of those iconic activities that almost everyone professes to love while, in fact, only a few pursue avidly.

It is sort of like everyone on the planet claiming to like spicy food when most cannot stand a bland dusting of black pepper. Make the gift fit the fisherman.

If your caster stands on a

to experience.

A tackle box or bag is an easy choice, but bigger is not always better. If you have never seen your fisherman throw a cast net don't buy a 10- or 12-foot net. One of four or five foot diameter will work much better for a beginner or a senior citizen. Hooks are changing. Now circle hooks are required for some offshore applications and will probably soon be the only legal bait hook in Florida.

Red ones with a laser point are fine products. If your caster uses a lot of plugs or stick bait type lures, a big box of treble hooks would be great. The hooks that come on lures need to be changed quite often. Lures are very personal and if you are not sure go with a gift card. I have been given lots of tackle that I will never use, but kept so as not to disappoint the giver.

This year the ultimate gift for any fisherman would be

my book "I Swear The Snook Drowned." (Did you really think I would pass up this chance for a plug?) Don't forget Captain Leo Hiles' redfish primer "Fish Sense." While his is a valuable instructional manual, my own was written for entertainment purposes. Either book can be enjoyed by those who fish or those who dream of fishing. Call Capt. Important tips for taking care of your Christmas tree

It's getting to the time when many of us will be decorating our trees for the holidays.

A great alternative to an artificial tree and/or a live tree is a Norfolk Island pine. They are available at most

retailers and come in several sizes. Some even come already decorated and ready to go.

The Norfolk Island pine does require a well-lit area of your home if you are going to keep it indoors for an extended period of time.

These trees have distinctly flat branches and short soft needles. They thrive in humid environments, which makes them right at home in Florida. The soil conditions for this tree should be on the moist side.

A sure sign the tree is not getting enough moisture is when you start to see a lot of dead lower branches. The Norfolk pine does not regenerate its lost limbs or needles, so it is important to stay on a steady watering schedule. If the tree is over watered, you will begin to see areas of bright yellow needles that fall off easily.

To avoid this condition, be sure the plant is not standing in water. If you purchase a tree with foil wrap on it, be sure to slit the foil so water can drain from the pot. It is not recommended the trees be pruned, as the plant can lose its symmetrical shape.

If you are one of the many Americans who are buying a live tree this year, here are

a few tips to help you with the process.

Since live trees in our area are trucked very long distances to their destination, picking out the freshest looking tree is extremely important. Make sure your tree is green with minimal brown branches. Check the needles of the tree and be sure that they are flexible and do not fall off when you brush the branches.

Another good check is to bounce the tree lightly on the cut end to see how aggressively the leaves fall off the branches. Avoid trees that shed leaves aggressively with this procedure.

Another point to consider is the location the tree will be placed. Be sure to get accurate measurements of the area so you can get a tree that is tailored to its location.

You have finally picked out your prize tree so what's next? The most important task is to get your tree in its stand and located where it will spend the remainder of the season. If it has not been done at the place of purchase, cut off about an inch from the bottom the tree before mounting in the stand. This will greatly aid the tree in absorbing water.

Once the tree is mounted, be sure to add water immediately. The sooner all this is done the better. Now it's time to decorate your new tree with all the goodies you have been collecting the past couple of weeks. Use caution when using lights, especially if you use the larger C-7 type lights.

As long as the tree remains moist and the needles pliable, the tree will not be a huge fire hazard. As the tree ages and you get near the end of the season, more caution is advised since the tree structure will become drier in nature. The new LED lights are the most energy efficient and safest alternative. They are more expensive but the energy savings will quickly help them pay for themselves!

Now that all the work is done, the time has come to sit back with your favorite beverage and enjoy your masterpiece!


