Joshua Fruecht began his position as city clerk on Tuesday, July 5.



Beach Street surviving but not flourishing

Editor's note: Beach Street flourished as a downtown community center for years in Daytona Beach. It was a place to shop, dine, meet friends and for a while, even gamble. In recent years, the area has come upon more challenging times. But officials, once again, have plans for a revival. This is the second story in a three-part series that will look at the past, present and future of Beach Street.

DAYTONA BEACH — Pat and Marge Garlock said they enjoy shopping along the downtown Beach Street riverfront.

The Ormond Beach couple particularly like the Angell & Phelps chocolate store and factory, as well as Jessup's jewelry store.

"In fact, I bought the earrings I'm wearing now at Jessup's," Ms. Garlock said.

Yet, the couple sees room for improvement in the downtown, limping along with empty store-

Schools: dress code or uniforms

VOLUSIA COUNTY — If a dress code doesn't get students to pull up their pants, take off their caps and cover their cleavage, Volusia County School Board members are ready to require uniforms.

"The ball's in their court," board member Judy Conte said. "They can show us our confidence in them was well founded or not."

At a recent meeting, the board adopted a dress code similar to one Seminole County started in the 2010-2011 school year. A dress-code committee headed up by Nancy Wait, director of communications, had considered uniforms. With direction from the board, the idea was put on hold in favor of a less stringent dress code. The board will do a compliance review in January. If members feel students aren't complying with the new dress code, uniforms might be next.

"This will be fun, ha ha, for the first couple weeks," board chair Stan Schmidt said at the meeting. "It's up to the students where this will go beyond this."

Walt Griffin, executive director of high schools in Seminole County, said implementation of the dress code there went smoothly, and compliance came easily. He said much of the reason for this was a vigorous public-awareness campaign that started seven months before the dress code went into effect. Volusia has far fewer months to publicize the dress code; the

New program will help shoppers 'Buy Volusia'

VOLUSIA COUNTY — With a click of the mouse one can send dollars and jobs somewhere else.

"When someone sits at their computer and is about to hit the "buy" button, that takes money out of the county," Phil Ehlinger, Volusia County's director of economic development, said. "That threatens the job of the guy down the road. The more you do Internet shopping the more you hurt your own community."

But, Mr. Ehlinger and other local business supporters want to change that soon. "Buy Volusia" is a program that will create an Inter-

net site populated by Volusia County businesses. Local shoppers can find what they need from local sellers, and oftentimes still be able to buy with the click of a mouse, but the money will feed the local economy rather than spread over the world.

"It's a program to educate citizens and reward customers and a program to promote our local business community," Chamber president Larry McKinney said.

According to recent reports from the Agency for Workforce Innovation, Volusia County's unemployment rate is at 10.5 percent, down from 11.4 percent last year. About

Persis to retire from OBMS, run for chairman

ORMOND BEACH — Carl Persis plans to retire after 35 years with Volusia County Schools in November, but will continue pursuing his second career in local politics.

He will not return to his position as principal at Ormond Beach Middle School next month, but will act as "principal on assignment" until his retirement.

A Volusia County Council member for the past seven years who previously spent seven years as a city commissioner and then mayor in Ormond Beach, Mr. Persis plans to run for Volusia County Chair-

man in next year's elections.

"I just had a fantastic career with the Volusia County school system for 35 years, serving as a principal for 27 of those years at five different schools," Mr. Persis said. "I'll miss that. I loved the excitement and challenge."

Schools Superintendent Margaret Smith said the district prefers to not make administration changes while school is in.

"It's tough to make those changes in the middle of a school year" Ms. Smith said, "This way, it will just be an easier transition for everyone."

'Ghost' memorial erected for young man killed on bike

HOLLY HILL — Christina and Mark Robb have had an especially hard time moving past their son's death.

The reminders are everywhere.

For one thing, the woman who is charged with killing Bruce Robb in a hit and run crash last November lives just around the corner from them and they see her drive by from time to time.

Secondly, the spot where Bruce, 19, was killed while riding his bicycle home

from a friend's house that chilly night is on the road where they live — Calle Grande Street — and they drive past it every day.

So, their recent decision to put up a permanent memorial to Bruce in that dark spot was a difficult one.

"It's hard (to see the memorial)," Christina Robb said, "but it's a comfort too. There's a mix of emotions."

The couple felt that whatever pain they might experience from seeing the

Volusia County Pretrial Services gains re-accreditation

Volusia County Pretrial Services gained re-accreditation from the Florida Corrections Accreditation Commission June 28 during its quarterly meeting in Bonita Springs.

An office of the Seventh Judicial Circuit Court Administrator's office, Pretrial Services assesses and supervises qualified defendants who are released from jail while their criminal case is pending. Persons under the supervision of Pretrial Services maintain contact with court officers, comply with a variety of conditions and attend scheduled court dates and events.

"While a lot of their work is behind the scenes, our Pretrial Services staff provides an invaluable service to the Court. They give judges the information they need to make informed release decisions. They also supervise non-sentenced individuals while their cases are pending. All of this is done to ensure public safety," said Chief Judge William A. Parsons. "The ability to release qualified individuals to pretrial supervision also helps reduce housing costs at the jail. None of this would be possible without the financial and philosophical support from Volusia County Government."

First accredited in 2008, Volusia County is one of five

Pretrial Services agencies currently accredited by the Florida Commission since it started pretrial accreditation in October, 2007. In granting accreditation, the commission confirms that an agency has met required standards in areas such as personnel policies, organization and management, general principles governing the pretrial process, first appearance, release conditions and electronic monitoring.



Volusia County Schools Dress Code

The following information is intended to clarify the Volusia County Schools dress code and should be used as a guide. The complete dress code is posted online at <http://myvolusiaschools.org>.

HEAD	ACCEPTABLE	NOT ACCEPTABLE
No caps, visors, hoods, bandanas, sunglasses or other head gear, except with administrative permission.		
UPPER GARMENTS All garments must cover shoulder to shoulder. All garments must be long enough to clearly overlap the beltline or stay tucked. NO halter tops, tanks tops, spaghetti straps or muscle shirts.		
LOWER GARMENTS Undergarments and the buttocks MUST remain entirely covered even while seated. Dresses, skirts and shorts must be at least mid-thigh or below in length.

school year begins Aug. 22. Mr. Griffin offered Volusia officials a tip for getting middle and high schoolers to comply with a dress code. "Engage students in the process from the very beginning," he said in a telephone interview. "Most of the schools did something positive."

Some Seminole schools had fashion shows early in the academic year featuring trendy attire that conformed to the new dress code. That's an idea at least one Volusia principal is willing to try.

"We might look at some type of a fashion show if that was student driven," Jim Trager, principal of New Smyrna Beach High said. "I think the fashion show is a neat idea."

Ms. Wait said that when she visited Seminole schools the students were largely complying with the dress code.

"At the elementary and middle, they're neat and orderly," she said. "At the high-school level, I was surprised by the high level of compliance. I maybe saw three students out of compliance, and those were

shorts."

Under the new policy, students can wear nothing on the head, except with administrator permission for medical, religious, or school-activity reasons. That includes hats, visors, hoods, bandanas, and sunglasses.

Shirts must overlap belt lines, and those that hang to mid-thigh must be tucked in. Tops must cover the chest shoulder to shoulder. Shorts, skirts and dresses must cover to at least mid-thigh. Pants and shorts must completely cover undergarments and the buttocks. Cleats, slippers and shoes with wheels are banned from campuses, with some exceptions.

Principals may permit cheerleading uniforms — which don't otherwise comply with the code — and grant other exceptions related to "school sponsored activities or programs."

Ms. Wait said last October about 4,000 people took an online survey about implementing a dress code. She said there was strong support for uniforms.

"Significantly, most people who responded were parents," she said. "About 75 percent. Then we had some students, some teachers and some members of the pub-

lic. Eighty percent felt a district-wide dress code should be established, and they were leaning toward it being more stringent."

Under the adopted policy, individual schools may require uniforms that include "collared shirts, sleeves, khaki or dark pants or shorts." Allowed shirts could be school colors. In an informal survey of some middle- and high-school principals, all said they would give students a chance to comply with the district dress code before considering uniforms.

Details of the dress code are at the district's website, myvolusiaschools.org. Additionally, Ms. Wait will use the district's robo-call system, Direct Connect, to advise parents of the dress-code policy in July, and again in August. She's also asking schools to put announcements about the new dress code on their marquees and websites.

Bob Wallace, principal of Seabreeze High, said he believes students may grumble about the new dress code, but will adhere to it.

"I'm sure they'll do a good job in compliance," he said. "I think our kids understand what's required of them."





Memories are all that's left of shuttle

It's not about spinoffs. It's not about experiments. It's not even about jobs. It's about leading the way. It's about the Final Frontier. About the adventure, the beauty, and the risk of spaceflight. That's what space shuttle flights mean to me.

I approach every shuttle launch with a mixture of dread and anticipation. I've covered more than a hundred launches for WESH-2. Memories of the worst are inseparable with memories of the best. I've seen what can go wrong when rocket engines ignite or when a shuttle lands, and I can't forget those things as I approach the launch of Atlantis on STS-135.

Nor can I forget the

serene feeling of weightlessness, which I experienced on a NASA training flight. I'll always feel privileged to call people like Story Musgrave, Bob Sieck, and the late Guenter Wendt my friends. And I can't forget the beauty: the orange and white smoke and steam clouds of liftoff, the amazing blue of the Earth seen from space, and the contrails streaming off the wingtips of a landing orbiter in the morning sun. I love the drama of the shuttle's

predawn final inspection, when a small team peers through the vapor clouds that hiss from the engines and relief vents of a fueled shuttle.

The space shuttle is the most successful but least appreciated spacecraft of all time. Flying the shuttle for 30 years is an extraordinary, even stunning accomplishment on the part of the technicians and engineers of the Kennedy Space Center. And when I talk to them about the end of the Space Shuttle Age, they don't lament their own loss of income. They don't talk about their mortgage payments or their children's college funds.

They talk about losing world leadership in space

exploration. They talk about a retreat from the Final Frontier. They talk about dismantling the most talented team of space professionals ever assembled.

So that's what I'll miss: the vision. The true believers who process and launch the shuttle are sure that they are on the doorstep of the future. They, too, love the adventure and the risk and the beauty of space-flight.

fronts in the post-recession economy.

"If we had an anchor store like a Walmart here, that would draw people," Mr. Garlock said.

The Garlocks were among fans waiting on a recent night for a Daytona Cubs Minor League Baseball game to begin at Jackie Robinson Ballpark, which sits on City Island across the Halifax River from the downtown.

"I live up in Holly Hill and I only come down here for the ballgames," said Steven Free-to of Holly Hill, as he sat at a picnic table next to the stadium with his wife, Catherine, and son, Michael.

"It really looks beautiful,"

he said of the downtown.

Beach Street does look inviting from the ballpark. Landscaped medians and palm trees line the street and many of the historic buildings are painted bright tropical colors. But a closer look reveals that many of the storefronts in those brightly colored buildings are deserted. To the north, the street is a ghost town of former auto dealerships where the only activity comes from a few young boys skateboarding on the vast expanses of cracked pavement.

Only a few years ago, downtown Beach Street appeared poised for success. Two condo towers were expected to replace the outgoing auto dealerships. Hotels were expected along South Beach street and on the beachside just across the International Speedway Boulevard bridge.

"Everybody was so excited," said Paul McKittrick, deputy city manager. "We were going to have 500 to 600 condo units downtown and hotels. It was going to be a renaissance. Then the national economy went south."

Hopes rose again when Daytona State College announced plans for the Mike Curb School of Music at the News-Journal Center. The school was expected to bring up to 1,000 students a day downtown before that plan, too, fell through.

The News-Journal Center has also not been the economic engine it was expected to be for the downtown, said Al Smith, chairman of the Downtown-Balough Road Redevelopment Area Board.

When the center was built, Seaside Music Theater held out the prospect of several professional theatrical productions each week. Theatrical shows brought patrons to the Beach Street dining and entertainment spots.

"It was painful to watch that all go away," said Mr. Smith, an entertainment promoter and former owner of Angell & Phelps Restaurant and Chocolate Factory.

Seaside Music Theater went out of business and the college took over the News-Journal Center in 2008.

As in many downtowns, most of the retailers packed up and moved to the malls to take advantage of the throngs. Without the variety of shopping, efforts to establish the downtown as a dining and nightclub district have had some success.

Faye and Bud Haas of Port Orange enjoy dining at Stavro's and McKay's Irish Pub. They also list the chocolate store as a favorite.

"I like to go to Riverfront Park (across Beach Street from the downtown at Orange Avenue)," Ms. Haas said. "They fixed up the street nice. I'd like to see it kept as it is."

One proposal before the city would tear up the medians to convert Beach Street from a four-lane to a two-lane road, in hopes of slowing

down traffic and getting people to stop downtown. No decision has been reached on the idea.

William and Delores Smith said they used to go to Beach Street when they lived in Holly Hill, but usually only go to the ballgames now that they live in Bunnell.

"What I really miss is the dime stores," Ms. Smith said.

Her husband said a brand name department store, "or even a dollar store," would help draw people to Beach Street.

Jean Dickson of Daytona Beach, attending a recent Cubs game with her husband, Don, said she used to visit a scrapbooking store downtown, before it closed.

"We don't go downtown for the shopping," she said. "We go downtown when they have festivals, like the art show."

Gary Harris of Daytona Beach said one of the problems downtown is the homeless population.

"I like to go to the library," he said of City Island Library, across the river from downtown. "They (homeless) use the bathrooms there as second home. I go around to the side of the library and they're all over."

As dismal as some believe it is downtown, others are taking the optimistic approach and opening new businesses there.

Cinematique, the non-profit theater dedicated to art house films and cultural programs, moved downtown in November 2010. Previously, the cinema had rented screens at local theaters to show films.

"We have always had a goal to have a dedicated cinema to play our own films on our own schedule," said Stephanie Mason-Teague, Cinematique executive director. "Being centrally located downtown is best for our kind of cinema."

"The response from our membership has been wonderful and we've done more transient business from people downtown who have noticed a film playing at a theater," she said. "We're the only full-time theater downtown."

And the city has works in the plan for a revitalization of the area. A riverfront master plan approved last year outlines ambitious public improvements for the entire length of Beach Street, including reconfiguring parking and enhancing Manatee Island. A new retail study suggests the downtown district could generate support to fill the vacant storefronts and another 86,000 square feet of retail space and recommends going after a national name retailer.

Ms. Mason-Teague supports getting a national chain store downtown.

"I love mom-and-pop stores, but the truth is you need a nationally recognized store to get people to come

Proposed flood insurance rate maps on display

Flood insurance rate maps for the Daytona Beach area are being revised to reflect current flood risk.

Property owners are encouraged to review the preliminary maps as flood designations might have changed. The most significant changes are in the area bordered by Beville Road, Mason Avenue, U.S. 1 and Nova Road.

If a property is mapped into a higher risk zone or the Base Flood Elevation changes, flood insurance premium could increase.

Property owners need to understand their options following changes to their community's FIRM. One of their options might be "grandfathering," which is a National Flood Insurance Program rule that was created to recognize

property owners who carried a policy before the maps became effective or built to the correct standards relative to the flood map in effect at the time of construction.

Individual property owners can appeal the proposed BFEs or protest other information included on the preliminary maps. Both the appeal and protest must be supported by technical or scientific data and submitted to the appropriate community officials within the 90-day appeal period.

Large maps are currently on display in City Hall's lobby along with comment cards for residents to fill out if they have questions or concerns.



Volusia County exceeds state in percent of A and B schools

The percent of Volusia schools earning an "A" or "B" exceeded the state with 77 percent of elementary schools and 100 percent of middle schools making the mark.

High school grades will not be released until November because the additional data that is now included in the grade calculation will not be

available until that time.

27,000 unemployed Volusians are seeking work.

Statewide, unemployment in May was 10.6 percent, the lowest since August, 2009. Nearly a million Floridians are unemployed.

Mr. McKinney said Volusians get about \$16 billion annually in various forms of income. He's unsure how much Internet and other forms of out-of-area buying costs the local economy.

"I think we can come up with a reasonable estimate of how much money leaks out of the county," he said. "Let's say it's 30 percent. Thirty percent is \$5 billion. If we could keep just 10 percent of that in the county, that's a lot of jobs."

To get Volusians buying at home, Buy Volusia will have several features, according to Mr. McKinney. The county will share its database of business licenses to help create an online system for shoppers to have an easier way to see if local businesses might have the goods or services they're seeking.

"The software we have will pull from the county's business licenses and populate the site," Mr. McKinney said. "They can search for a business, a product, or by someone's

name if they know it. They can search by city."

"He has been an excellent administrator and shown great leadership," she said. "We will definitely miss him."

A principal on assignment fills in for other administrators who have to be absent and also "helps out with projects at the district level," Ms. Smith said.

memorial would be worth the awareness it would bring to others.

"We hope by seeing it drivers will recognize that bikers use the road too," Ms. Robb said, "and that they are killed on the roads."

The memorial is a Ghost Bike, "a small and somber memorial for bicyclists who are killed or hit on the streets." The first Ghost Bike was created in St. Louis, Mo., in 2003, according to ghostbikes.org. Currently, there are believed to be more than 150 of them in locations around the world.

"We found the website and just thought it was the right thing to do," Ms. Robb said.

The memorial is simple. It is one of Bruce's old bikes strapped to a tree on the other side of the ditch where he was found dying the night of the crash. Like all Ghost Bikes, it is painted stark white, completely covered from the handle bars to the tires.

A small sign on the front tire has a picture of a smiling Bruce and states "DRIVE SAFELY. In memory of BAD-BONES BRUCE."

Badbones is a nickname given to Bruce after he broke a few bones skateboarding.

"It gives people a place to go," Ms. Robb said. "Family and friends can go and see it and stop there, maybe plant flowers or leave a memento."

Perhaps someone will leave a treat for Clover, Bruce's beloved pit bull puppy who was killed with him that night.

Tiffany Rose Fletcher, the woman charged with killing Bruce, surely sees the memorial as well. She is out on bail until her trial. There have been continuances — the latest one last week — that have delayed the start of her trial.

A pre-trial hearing is now scheduled for later this month.

Holly Hill Police Chief Mark Barker said he likes the memorial — a "stark reminder" there are bicyclists on the road.

"It's quite touching and its benefit is twofold," he said.

"It helps with the grieving and healing process for the family and it has the added benefit of increasing driver awareness."

Chief Barker is working on a memorial of his own — a sidewalk and bike path for that dangerous stretch of Calle Grande. Currently in discussions over funding and logistics with Volusia County and Ormond Beach, he hopes the three governments can find a way to fund it "sooner rather than later."

Last week, Ms. Robb said, someone stole the tires from Bruce's memorial — neighbors tried to chase the guy down but could not catch him. Overnight, two more tires, painted white, appeared back on the old bike.

While the Robbs like the simplicity of the memorial to their "super sweet" son, they say Bruce himself might have something to say about it.

"Oh, he was so full of life and energy," Ms. Robb said with a little laugh, "he probably would have wanted something bigger, more colorful, more outlandish."

Cover up, mosquitoes are back

The rainy season has arrived, and the mosquitoes won't be far behind.

"The annual onslaught of mosquitoes has been delayed by a late rainy season, but it's starting to pick up," said James McNelly, Volusia County's new mosquito control director. "We're seeing more mosquitoes in our traps and expect residents to start noticing them in their backyards very soon."

Mosquitoes usually emerge in large numbers five to seven days after a major rain. They lay eggs on dry ground, and as standing water builds up, the eggs hatch.

Mosquitoes are most active at dawn and dusk. If you must go outside at these times, wear long pants, long sleeves and shoes with socks. Apply mosquito repellent to clothing and exposed skin, and use mos-

quito netting to protect children younger than 2 months.

"Take a walk through your yard so you can see where water is collecting," McNelly advises.

He offers these suggestions:

- Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and broken appliances.
- Turn over empty pots and buckets.
- Replace the water in birdbaths and pet dishes at least once a week.
- Clean out eaves, troughs and gutters.
- Pick up beverage containers and cups.
- Drain water from boats and tarps.
- Cover windows and doors with screens.
- Avoid over-watering your lawn.
- Maintain the proper chemistry in swimming pools, and empty plastic pools when not in use.

Mosquitoes can transmit serious diseases including West Nile virus, Eastern Equine Encephalitis and St. Louis Encephalitis virus.

According to the Centers for Disease Control, the chance that a person will

become ill from a single mosquito bite remains low. The risk of severe illness and death is highest for people older than 50.

Symptoms of a mosquito-transmitted virus include fever, headache, tiredness, dizziness and confusion. West Nile virus also may cause a rash or muscle weakness.

Animals can get sick from mosquito bites, too. Horses should be vaccinated against Eastern Equine Encephalitis and West Nile virus. Cats and dogs should receive monthly heartworm treatments.

During the peak mosquito season, May through October, Volusia County ramps up its mosquito-control efforts, which include stocking ponds with minnows, managing production sites on tidal wetlands, and spraying with trucks and helicopters.





Satisfy a sweet tooth with low-fat pineapple desserts

Just because you're trying hard to cut the fat and cholesterol doesn't mean you can't have desserts.

I received a letter from a reader who wanted to make my lemonade but can't have sugar. In a future column, I will discuss diabetes, but many recipes that require sugar can be made using a sugar substitute. Each box of substitute has the sugar equivalent listed; just follow that. Splenda is an equal exchange for sugar.

Today's desserts are all about pineapples. Pineapple is a superior fruit and is good for you whether it's fresh or canned. Always buy packed in its own juices.

We'll have an easy pineapple pie thanks to my favorite beautician, Gina Thompson, and Flora Hull's pineapple cake, which comes with a very special story. All the desserts can be made low-fat or fat-free, and I promise you won't be able to tell the difference.

Before moving to Port St. Lucie, I ran sewing schools in Palm Beach County and up north. Many years ago, Flora Hull joined one of my sewing classes in the hopes the distraction would help her overcome her grief over the loss of her husband. At the end of the 10-week course, she came to class with this wonderful cake along with

the recipe.

During that time, we became close, and she knew about my family and four children. Her husband had been a professional saxophone player and had played with many of the big bands of his time. With no children to give his sax to, it remained in the closet.

Along with her wonderful cake came a gift. "Your classes," she said, "have helped me more than you could possibly know, and I know my husband would want me to give you his sax so that maybe one of your children can learn to play it."

My son Steve learned to play and joined his high school band. He was the only student in the marching band with a Sterling Silver saxophone.

FLORA'S PINEAPPLE CAKE

This cake was always fat-free. By using the egg substitute, you can make it cholesterol-free, as well.

- 2 eggs or egg substitute
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 20-ounce can crushed pineapple in its own juice

Beat eggs and sugar

together. Add flour and baking soda. Mix thoroughly. Stir in pineapple and juice. Pour into a 9x12 pan that has been sprayed with cooking spray or greased and floured. Bake at 350 for 35-45 minutes until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

You can stop here and sprinkle the cooled cake with powdered sugar, or you can follow the original recipe and top it with cream cheese frosting. The cake is frosted while it is still warm.

CREAM CHEESE FROSTING

This frosting can only be made low-fat, not fat-free. Fat-free cream cheese becomes runny when beaten.

- 8 ounces cream cheese, regular or low-fat
- 2 tablespoons butter or a butter substitute, softened
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/2 box 10X confectioner's sugar, sifted if necessary

Using an electric mixer, beat the cream cheese,

butter and vanilla together. Add sugar.

Note: The mixture will seem extremely stiff. Do NOT add milk. As you beat in the sugar, it will melt and soften. Add more sugar only if necessary.

GINA THOMPSON'S PINEAPPLE PIE (NIB)

Regular and low-fat, serves 8-10

If you have 10 minutes, you can make this superb dessert. By using fat-free sour cream and a low-fat graham cracker pie shell (Keebler), you will have a rich-tasting yet low-fat dessert. Keebler also makes a large pie shell, which will fit the filling, but it does not come low-fat.

Pudding is and always has been fat-free.

- 1 regular size store bought graham cracker pie shell
- 1 large (5.1-ounce) package vanilla instant pudding, regular or sugar free
- 1 large (16-ounce) container sour cream
- 20-ounce can crushed pineapple in its own juice

The pie shell does not require baking, but 10 minutes in a 350-degree preheated oven will give you a crisper, more flavorful crust. While shell is baking,

blend sour cream with pudding powder (do not prepare according to package directions). Add pineapple and juice, blend well. Pour into cooled pie shell and chill.

Serve with whipped

topping.



I caught lots of snapper of the yellow tail and mangrove variety and even a few muttons. I had fun with two undersized grouper, but most of the excitement came from the small barracuda that were everywhere. My red and white Mirro Lures now bare marks left behind by those toothy rascals.

When you fish natural bait in the Keys, you will

catch lots of grunts. My wife, Lana; her sister, Alma; Alma's husband, George; and I enjoyed a meal of those abundant and tasty reef fish.

If you have never been to the Florida Keys, you could be disappointed. The beaches and nightlife depicted in the Beach Boys video "Kokomo" are surprisingly sparse. Sand is at a premium there. Of course, if you boat or fish, you will be in hog heaven.

One thing everyone can enjoy is the sundown celebration at Key West's Mallory Square. We landed there about 5 p.m. and headed straight for Fat Tuesday's for a frozen rum

concoction.

As we strolled the main drag, the mandatory strains of Jimmy Buffett songs drifted out to the sidewalk. At Sloppy Joe's, we saw three Hemingway look-a-likes holding court at the bar.

Around the corner at the great writer's real favorite watering hole, we looked for my business card among the thousands on the walls. I had placed it there more than 10 years ago, so our search was futile.

Great art museums beckoned us in, and the paintings there amazed us.

Finally, it was time for the sundown. You need not inquire as to when it is; the whole town empties in a

westerly direction.

At the square, we saw street performers eat fire and walk tightropes while one fellow balanced a kitchen range on his forehead. Another jumped through burning hoops while a pretty girl escaped from chains.

The Keys were good fun and good fishing, but, as usual, it is good to be back home. You just can't beat Volusia County.

Get far out of town and play a round at beautiful course

There is something special about getting out of town to play golf. Head to one of the most beautiful courses and places I have ever visited and the trip becomes indescribable.

That place is Cap Cana in the Dominican Republic. I was fortunate enough a few years back to cover the inaugural Champions Tour event there and simply fell in love with the people and the resort.

Cap Cana is on the eastern tip of the island of Hispaniola and is a quick flight away from most of South Florida's airports. Constructed just outside Punta Cana on 30,000 acres of land featuring 3.5 miles of pristine white-sand beaches, lush vegetation and a limestone bluff that provides dramatic views of the turquoise-blue sea, it could easily be heaven on earth.

The development is putting the final touches on its second of three planned Jack Nicklaus-designed courses. Already completed are a sprawling clubhouse and pool, bungalows, models of the residential property you can purchase, one of the largest man-made marinas in the Caribbean, the Golden Bear Club and Spa,

the luxurious Secrets Sanctuary hotel, a world-class tennis facility, a polo and equestrian center, cafes and a European-style casino.

Punta Espada (Tip of the Sword) is the original course on the development and quite possibly my favorite golf course in the world. The course begins its visual festivities at the first tee. From atop a 30-foot bluff, you can see most of the golf course, the beaches and the Caribbean Sea. The course features five sets of tees, allowing you to play the course anywhere from 5,052 to 7,396 yards.

With the prevailing breeze coming from the northeast, you have to make your club selection very carefully. Fortunately, Cap Cana continues the Caribbean tradition of caddies. My caddie, Rolando, was fantastic. Just from watching me warm up before my round he had a good idea of my game. He was astute at giving me the right dis-

stance and club suggestions. His help on the undulating greens saved me several strokes.

In all, 15 holes have views of the sea. Eight of the holes play to, from or along the sea. There are seven holes where the green is nearly surrounded or framed by the surf. There are also large bunkers and coquina rock areas framing the lush green of the fairways and greens.

The sixth hole is a par-5 with an unusual feature. Located down the left side of this dog-leg left is a large vertical rock sink hole. Getting to this green in two will require a bold second shot over this crevasse.

The hole most photographed at Punta Espada is the 13th. This downwind par-3 that plays

a stout 249 yards from the tips is truly spectacular and requires you to carry the ball over the sea onto a large green. There is room to bail-out to the right, but your pitch shot is back toward the splashing sea.

The finishing holes run to and along the sea. If you thought your tee shot at 13 was unnerving, the one at 17 will test you, as well. Once again, you must tee off over the sea to the fairway. Being a short hole, it also tempts you to bite off some of the distance. The green is small and missing it on your approach means finding water or sand.

Your day ends at the 18th, a long par-4 that plays into the prevailing wind. A long iron or fairway wood will likely be your club of choice on your approach shot to the

elevated green located on a peninsula partially surrounded by water.

Once your round is complete, it's time to refuel and refresh. The clubhouse has a huge locker room with all the amenities. The menu at the bar features local, fresh seafood dishes and refreshing drinks.

All I need is a few dozen of my buddies to pool their money with me and buy a vacation place here.


