### VCHD offers flu shots

The Volusia County Health Department is offering flu vaccine at its clinics from 8 to 11 a.m. and 1 to 4 p.m., Monday thru Friday.

The prices are \$25 for a flu shot, \$45 for high-dose flu zone (65 and older) and \$65 for pneumonia shot. The health department accepts Medicare Part B and non-HMO.

The east Volusia county health department clinics are located 1845 Holsonback Drive, Daytona Beach and 7171 W. Canal St., New Smyrna Beach.

## Ormond sets tentative tax rate

ORMOND BEACH — Elected officials unanimously approved a plan last week to avoid a property-tax rate increase next year for general operations.

But overall, taxes will go up because of a decision made by voters last year.

Property-tax payers would pay \$3,8933 per \$1,000 of taxable value for general city operations under the plan.

The proposed rate is the rolled-back rate, which will generate the same amount of money as this year, plus additional income from new construction and annexation. State law defines a rate above the rolled-back rate as a tax-rate increase.

"This is the rolled-back rate and according to the state definition, no tax increase," Mayor Ed Kelley said.

In addition to the property tax for operations, city taxpayers will be assessed three property tax rates to pay off bonds.

Combined, all four property-tax

rates total \$4.2014 per \$1,000 of taxable value. Elected officials vote on the general operating property-tax rate every year, but the tax rates for the bonds are approved by voters and remain unchanged every year. Last year, voters approved the latest bond issue, to acquire, design and build a new oceanfront park.

## New office, retail on Granada approved

ORMOND BEACH — While the national economy sputters in a post-recession daze, the Granada Boulevard business corridor here is cooking with the proverbial gas.

Continued evidence of a vibrant district is the recent City Commission approval of plans for a 9,222-square-foot multi-use development with offices, retail and restaurant space at 1287 W. Granada Blvd., across from Lowe's.

"Private investment is important," said Joe Mannarino, Ormond Beach economic development director. "If it happens, it shows we have a strong enough market to make an investment in the area, which is welcome."

Mr. Mannarino said the property owners will likely market the site to a developer and look for tenants for the building.


"They don't really have any tenants at the moment," he said.

An attempt to call one of the owners, Maurice Thompson, was not successful.

"It's difficult to say how marketable the project is," Mr. Mannarino said. "We're still in a recession, but the (Granada) corridor is healthy. There's not a lot of vacancies on the corridor. It has good access to I-95 (Interstate 95). It's well traveled."

## Homeless man becomes advocate, activist

DAYTONA BEACH — When a hurricane is threatening to come through town, as Irene did recently, most homeless advocates are scrambling to make sure as many homeless people as possible have shelter from the storm. When advocate Brad Carter does that, he's not just helping others. He's helping himself.

Mr. Carter, 44, is homeless and has been for most of the past four years.

Unfortunately, he ended up awake all night during the rains that came with Irene, sitting on a bus bench.

"Being outside in the rain is like most nights," he said. "Long and stressful. I don't sleep at night anyway."

But that hasn't stopped him from becoming a busy advocate for the homeless, creating a non-profit group called HOME — Homeless and Others for Meaningful Exchange. Through the group, which has gained support from local officials and social service organizations, Mr. Carter hopes to bring to light not just the struggles of the homeless while they are on the streets, but the almost insurmountable task of getting off the streets.

His story is one of not only

keeping hope alive for himself, but also the thousands of other people homeless in Volusia County this year (according to a Florida Council on Homelessness report, 2,215).

"The biggest problem with being homeless in Daytona is getting some sleep," said a droopy-eyed Mr. Carter as he slumped in a chair at the Halifax Urban Ministries, a place everyone calls HUM, recently.

Homeless people can get a shower at HUM, or get their laundry done. But the facility does not offer beds. Sleeping in public is illegal and homeless people risk being ticketed or even arrested for trespassing or

sleeping in public. "I'm so tired," Mr. Carter said. "Everyone needs sleep."

Florida has the third-highest rate of homelessness in the nation, with 58,000 people homeless on any given day, according to the Council on Homelessness.

A native of Jacksonville, Mr. Carter's last job was as a baggage handler at Palm Beach International Airport. He quit five years ago, after the promise of a better job, which never materialized. Remembering youthful visits to Daytona Beach, he bought a \$29 bus ticket and ended up here.

## Some officials upset about location of veterans' plaque

ORMOND BEACH — An art museum built and dedicated to honor veterans came in the line of fire from some city commissioners recently.

At issue was the placement of a plaque at the Ormond Memorial Art Museum honoring the city's residents who served in World War II.

Commissioner Troy Kent

complained the plaque had been moved several years ago from the lobby entrance off Granada Boulevard to a nearby hallway linking permanent and rotating exhibits at the museum.

"Move the plaque back to its original place," Mr. Kent said. "This place was built by these gentlemen. Our country was defended by these gentlemen."

Mr. Kent had made the same request several years

ago. He renewed the request at the Sept. 6 City Commission after a complaint from one veteran, whom he did not name.

Several commissioners joined Mr. Kent at the meeting and nearly made a motion to move the plaque as part of approval of a routine \$43,640 management contract the city has with the art museum.

Susan Richmond, muse-



**Officials hope tourism study  
will help target ad dollars**

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Hotel beds without visitors' heads cost Volusia County tax revenue. So, at its last regular meeting, the Volusia County Council selected Strategic Advisory Group of Duluth, Ga., to look at countywide tourism and convention mar-

keting to see if it can be improved.

"I'm hoping what we get is an understanding of a better way to use our tax dollars," Councilman Carl Persis of Ormond Beach, said in an interview after the meeting. "If they find that half our advertising dollars could get better results, I'd like to know that and see what happens."

The county and company will have to draft a contract. Council members said they

expect the marketing study will cost about \$100,000 that will come from the county's general fund. Whether the study will find ways to attract more tourists and their dollars is uncertain.

Bob Davis, president and CEO of the Hotel & Lodging Association of Volusia County, said he's cautiously optimistic the study could benefit local tourism businesses. However, he said that largely depends on whether Strategic "talks to the locals." He supported the company's selection over two others that made presentations at the council meeting.

Mr. Davis said about eight million people visit Volusia County annually, down by about 800,000 in recent years. He attributes that to the sluggish national economy, not to lackluster advertising practices.

Volusia County collects a 3-percent tax on short-term rentals that is allocated to three advertising authorities — Halifax Area, Southeast Volusia, and West Volusia — charged with attracting more tourists. Additionally, the county estimates that tourists pay about a third of area sales taxes, which they predict will be down more than \$700,000 from the last fiscal year.

In the 2009-2010 budget, the county allocated about \$6.8 million to the three agencies. That slipped to slightly more than \$6.2 million in 2010-2011. If passed by the council, the proposed 2011-2012 budget will allocate about \$6,850,000.

County Chair Frank Bruno said that while council members don't know whether the study will necessarily yield information for generating more visitors, it's an important

# A TALE OF TWO COLUMNS

Some of you may not know that I have been writing the fishing column in this paper for the past six years.

Yep, that's me bringing up the rear of the Hometown News. What? You didn't recognize me? Must be the hat.

That is a disguise I cannot shake. Back when I got the job of fishing writer I was asked to come to the newspaper office for a head shot that would run with each column. The fellow who called me asked if I had anything distinctive to wear. When I said I didn't he asked if I owned a hat. I don't wear a hat, not even a cap when I fish but there was an old hat that had been hanging around the house for some reason. So I brought it. Little did I know it would brand me forever.

After a few years I began to do speaking engagements and I also wrote a book. My very first book signing was a big success with a constant line and lots of folks there to swap stories. I sat at my table with the hat on until I tired of it and took it off. As soon as I removed the straw topper, I noticed that people became reluctant to approach me. They would stand back and whisper to each other as if they did not know me. But when I donned my chapeau once more people quickly came over. I began to try this out at each event. Sure enough, as the fishing guy I cannot appear without the hat and I suppose if I spoke as the Land Lines guy I would have to do it bare headed. In order to help get past this dual personality problem, I will now offer you one of my favorite fishing stories here in the Land Lines space.

## Fishing is a thinking man's game

When I first landed on these shores around 1970 Ponce Inlet's Inlet Harbor was a plain, no frills fish camp and restaurant of the type that gave old Florida its charm. Back then you could order all of the snapper or grouper you could eat for \$2.29. If you didn't mind a few bones you could get throats and ribs for \$1.69. Naturally the meal came with a big order of hot, salty and greasy fries, cole slaw and scrumptious hush puppies. A fine

repast indeed.

Just to the north of the restaurant was a stocked pond where the children could do a little fishing while their parents sat on a bench to digest the copious amounts of seafood they had just enjoyed. The pond was about 80 feet long and 30 or 40 feet wide and was well-stocked with grunts and sailor's choice to keep the kids entertained. The adults could enjoy watching the schools of big tarpon, jacks and red fish that constantly cruised laps around the outer perimeter of the pond. The rule was that you could only fish the pond with the tackle provided by the Inlet Harbor Bait Shop and that consisted of a cane pole strung with ultra light line and a small barbless hook. With that rig, it was impossible to catch the big fish. Still, every once in a while a full grown northern tourist would be overcome with the sight of the big reds and give it a try. The result was always the same. If they did succeed in hooking one of the big

bruisers, the line would pop like the report of a 22-rifle.

One fine winter's day after I had eaten four or five plates of grouper ribs I wandered out on to the deck to watch the fish in the pond. Just then a battered pick-up truck backed down to the water's edge and out hopped a grizzled old man. He went straight to the bait shop and plunked down his \$1.50 for the cane pole and the small pack of dead shrimp that was included. Instead of coming up onto the deck where most chose to fish he baited up and tossed the shrimp into the water right behind his truck where the pond ended in a little sandy beach.

"Going to do a little fishing?" I yelled.

"Yep, Gonna catch me one of them big reds," he answered without looking up.

Now I must tell you, I was more than a little amused. This fellow was obviously not a tourist and should know better. I settled back to watch thinking this should be good for a laugh. Sure enough he began to dangle his shrimp in front of the big reds each time they passed by. When another kind of fish would attempt to bite it he would jerk it away. He was persistent and it was only a matter of time before a redfish took the bait. I prepared myself for the loud snap that would surely follow. But then a strange thing happened. The old man set the hook mightily and then threw the cane pole into the water.

I was astounded!

The fish swam away with the pole but the man seemed not to worry and turned his back to sit on his tailgate and enjoy a dip of snuff. I could tell by the motion of the pole that the hooked red was back swimming with the school doing laps around the pond. After some time the fish and pole began falling behind and it was obvious the fish was getting tired. At just the right time, the man waded out into the water and put his hand into the gill of the fish. He pulled what had to be a 20-pound redfish out of the water and into the bed of his truck. With a sly wink in my direction he pulled away.

I do hope you non-fishermen liked that story. If you did you might need a copy of my book. Turn to my fishing column for ordering instructions. Don't be shy. I'm the guy in the hat.



## THE LEGAL CORNER

**Prevention of Bicycle Fatalities**

Florida has one of the highest rates for bicycle fatalities in the nation. Unfortunately, many of the accidents involving bicyclists could be prevented.

Florida recently enacted legislation that requires drivers of a vehicle overtaking a bicycle or other non-motorized vehicle to pass at a safe distance allowing at least 3 feet between their vehicle and the bicycle.

If your children are under the age of 16, they are required to wear a helmet when riding a bicycle at all times. It is also wise for anyone riding a bicycle to wear a helmet. The use of a helmet could prevent traumatic head injuries.

Many accidents occur while drivers are distracted and fail to recognize bicyclists on the road as they are approaching them. Cell phones and computers are often the culprit of such distractions. Florida has not yet passed legislation disallowing the use of cell phones or computers while driving, but common sense would tell us to avoid doing so while operating a motor vehicle. A motor vehicle can be a dangerous instrumentality. Accordingly, we should all be proactive when operating our automobiles and refrain from using our cell phones and computers while driving.

Quick Answers to Common Legal Questions

### What Should I Do After Being In a Motorcycle Accident?

Motorcycle accidents can be severe, resulting in crippling injuries and even fatalities. If you have been involved in an accident, there are several steps you can take to increase your chances of financial and physical recovery:

- Don't leave the accident scene. Even if you weren't at fault, do not leave the scene until the police arrive and information has been collected from each party involved. If you fail to stay, you could be at risk for a hit and run felony.
- Gather critical information. This includes contact information from any parties involved in the accident as well as any witnesses present.
- Call the police. This is important in order for you to present your side of the accident and to get it documented. If the police do not show up to the scene, you can still file a report by going to a police station.
- Do not sign anything from an insurance company. Often, insurance companies will want you to make a statement of the accident right away. This, however, could be used against you later on.
- Seek medical attention. It is imperative that you seek necessary medical treatment as soon as possible after the accident occurs. Even if you think your injuries are minor, going to the doctor right away can help determine if there is anything problematic. Also, failure to seek attention can provide the defense for the insurance company that if you were really hurt, you would have sought prompt medical attention right away.
- Seek professional legal consultation from a motorcycle safety attorney to help you recover any benefits you may be entitled to as a result of another party's negligence. Hiring a motorcycle crash attorney can offer guidance and knowledge for victims hurt in a car crash of other types of personal injury claim.

# Clerk's counsel explains change in policy on arrest reports

The Clerk's office completely understands your readers' concerns about the change in access to the home addresses of individuals arrested in Volusia County. Our office used to provide these addresses on our website, but they were removed due to a Florida Supreme Court Administrative Order that prohibits the electronic release of litigant or defendant addresses.

The Administrative Order is AOSC07-49: Revised Interim Policy on Electronic Release of Court Records, and it specifically limits what the Clerks' offices may provide to the public electronically. You can find the Order on the Supreme Court website or by running an Internet search.

While the Clerk must abide by the Order that prohibits the electronic

release of this information, the addresses are still public record. The addresses can be viewed by coming to the Clerk's office in person, or individuals may request a paper copy of the information from our office for a fee set by statute. In short, these records are still available to the public, but unfortunately, the Clerk can no longer provide them to the public electronically.

Of course, we are aware that our inability to provide this information through our website makes it less convenient and more costly to obtain. However, we

must abide by the law. The good news is that there is a committee and workgroup at the State level that is currently writing electronic records standards. Our hope is that once these standards are adopted, the Clerks' offices in Florida will be able to provide more information electronically to the public.

**Editor's note:** After much research and deliberation on our options to attain the addresses of those arrested, we have come to the conclusion that at this time, Hometown News does not

have the staff or resources it would take to gather the home addresses. We will continue to run the arrest reports that include the city where the arrested person lives, and continue to hope that there is a change in the law that would allow this information to once again be distributed electronically. Our publisher has written letters to the state supreme court and our legislators letting them know that we believe the extraction of the addresses from the electronic reports places an undue burden on community newspapers and we invite our readers to do the same. In the meantime, readers who want to see the addresses of those arrested should understand that they are still public records and available by contacting the Clerk's office or arresting agencies.

um director, said the criticism came as a surprise.

"Honoring veterans, that's the whole reason that we're here," she said. "We were founded as an art museum and a memorial to World War II veterans."

In 1946, artist Malcolm Fraser offered his collection of spiritual battlefield scenes as a permanent collection, if a museum honoring veterans was established. World War II veterans answered the call, adding an exhibit space to a small cottage at 78 E. Granada Blvd.

"It's heart warming," Ms. Richmond said. "It reminds me of the old-time barn raisings. They got back from the war and pitched in to help build the museum."

A plaque with names of Ormond Beach's 147 white residents who served in

World War II, 12 of whom died in service, was originally placed in the lobby off the Granada Boulevard entrance.

A separate plaque honoring the city's black veterans was displayed at a Reading Room at U.S.1 and Tomoka Avenue. After demolition of the Reading Room, the plaque listing black veterans was lost. In 1999, after a 25-year effort by resident Andrea Hall, a new plaque was made listing all of the city's veterans, black and white.

"My uncle was born and raised in Ormond," Ms. Hall said. "He went away to World War II. When I was a kid, age 14, I remember him talking about the plaque and how their names were not permitted to be on it. I was just a kid. When I got to be a woman of 40 or so, I approached the City Commission. They said it was a wrong they'd like to correct."

Years ago, the plaque was moved a few feet to the hallway between the rotating art exhibits and the permanent display of Mr. Fraser's works.

Because of the traffic and lack of parking on Granada Boulevard, most museum visitors park south of the building and walk through the Memorial Gardens to use the south entrance, rather than the north entrance on Granada Boulevard, Ms. Richmond said.

"In my mind, it would diminish the prominence of the plaque to move it back to its original location," Ms. Richmond said.

Visitors can escape to the sanctuary of the lush gardens and art exhibits, where the devotion to veterans has carried forward with a plaque commemorating Ormond Beach residents who served in World War I and a sculpture depicting an eternal flame remembering Korean War veterans. Plans

are to dedicate a Vietnam Veterans War memorial on Veterans Day this year, Nov. 11.

Admission to the museum is free, but a \$2 donation is requested.

A call to Troy Kent to learn the name of the veteran who complained was not returned.

However, there might be peace and more understanding about the location of the World War II plaque.

Mayor Ed Kelley said he's satisfied with the location of the World War II plaque at the museum. The mayor admits he always enters the museum from the south side, not the Granada Boulevard entrance where the plaque was placed originally.

"I think where it is, the plaque is visible to people," Mr. Kelley said. "I'm real satisfied with the reason. It's a nice museum. They do a real good job promoting Ormond Beach."

**Body building — and more — returns to Daytona Beach**

DAYTONA BEACH — If your idea of a body building show is a bunch of muscle-bound guys in Speedos standing on a stage flexing, the Daytona Beach Classic may surprise you.

Not to say the show, to be held at the Peabody auditorium next weekend, won't include muscular men — it most definitely will — but it will have so much more.

"This show is for anyone who is a fitness and healthy lifestyle enthusiast," said Daytona Beach Classic co-promoter Michael Matassa. "Anyone who likes to see what hard work and commitment to something can do for you."

And, of course, admirers of the human body won't be disappointed.

While the men will compete in traditional body building, the show will also feature female athletes, competing in

three different categories — fitness, figure and bikini.

"The sport has evolved to the point where the main attraction isn't the men with the bulging muscles," said Daytona Beach Classic co-promoter Michael Matassa. "It's the sexy, athletic women."

Mr. Matassa said the Daytona Beach Classic is the first show of its kind here in several years and he is happy to bring it back.

The owner of a home valued at \$175,000, minus \$50,000 in homestead exemptions, would pay a city tax bill next year of \$525.17 under the plan. Individual tax bills will vary depending on the property value and also include taxes from other agencies, such as Volusia County.

Cost of the oceanfront park bond issued to the same typical homeowner will be about \$17 next year.

"That's quite a bit less than my Bright House bill," Commissioner Bill Partington said, measuring city services such as parks, police and fire protection against the overall tax bill. "Ormond Beach taxpayers get a good bang for the buck."

Also on Tuesday, the City Commission unanimously endorsed an \$83-million total budget for next year, about \$4 million higher than this year, mainly because of the new oceanfront park and other capital improvements, such as replacing racquetball and basketball courts at the Nova Community Center.

A final public hearing on next year's property tax rate and budget is scheduled for Sept. 20.

General operations account for \$28.5 million of the overall budget, about \$750,000 less than this year.

Slumping along with the national housing market, taxable city property value dropped \$150 million, 5.72 percent, from \$2.63 billion to \$2.49 billion.



"There's not one thing that leads someone to be homeless," Mr. Carter said. "There are a lot of poor decisions along the way. One of my poor decisions was not joining the (military) service right out of high school. Instead, it took me seven years to get through a 2-year school."

An even more difficult hit came five years ago when his mother died. "It hit me hard," he said.

Mr. Carter sometimes gets work through temporary hiring halls, but has yet to land a job. "Homeless people get a bad rap," Mr. Carter said. "People think we're all addicts."

Florida Council on Homelessness figures show 44 percent of people wind up homeless because of some disability such as substance abuse, mental health or a development disorder. For others, the step toward homelessness could be prompted by such things as a layoff of bad divorce.

"A lot of homeless people have skills," said Mr. Carter, who has put together a list of area homeless people and their work skills and experience, which he shows to potential employers.

Although some social service agencies are geared to helping the homeless, those agencies only help people who are addicts, veterans (who make up 13 percent of homeless), or those with some other disability.

"If you're just down and out, there isn't much available," he said.

The stereotypes are difficult to overcome while hunting for a job, he said. Employers want to know phone numbers, home addresses and whether a person has transportation to the job.

"If you're honest about being homeless, they ask how you're going to keep clean, keep your clothes clean — they think you're an addict," he said.

Donations to HOME have helped the group publish a newsletter. A recent issue tells how a judge provides sentencing alternatives, allowing

the homeless who face charges such as trespassing or sleeping in public to avoid court costs by performing community service.

HOME and Mr. Carter have drawn some attention, including a recent spot on the CBS Evening News, which referred to Mr. Carter as "one of the state's brightest points of light."

He will also get a regular slot on WELE (1380 AM) to discuss homeless issues. "We might profile homeless people to show we're not all addicts," he said.

Big John, owner of the radio station, said Mr. Carter will be on his regular show on the second Wednesday of every month about 4:30 p.m.

"He's been on twice already," Mr. John said. "Matter of fact, I made the CBS news for about seven seconds."

Mr. John believes Mr. Carter's quest to better inform the public about homelessness is worthwhile.

"We want to educate the community," he said. "People will call in and ask him questions. I'll ask him questions. It will be good for people to learn that street people are not their enemy. There but for the grace of God, you or I might be out on the street."

One idea Mr. Carter wants to get out there is about using vacant housing to shelter the homeless. U.S. Census figures show roughly 40,000 vacant housing units in Volusia County.

"We've recently discussed fixing them up and staying in them," Mr. Carter said. "That's the kind of thing we talk about at our (HOME) summit meetings."

Shiela McKay-Vaughn, a former Daytona Beach city commissioner, supported Mr. Carter after seeing his efforts to help not only himself, but others. Ms. McKay-Vaughn serves on the HOME board.

"Here's a group of homeless people trying to help themselves," Ms. McKay-Vaughn said. "They're not asking for a handout. They're saying we want something, but we don't know how to do it."

She helped arrange a meeting between Mr. Carter and Daytona Beach Mayor Glenn Ritchey.

Ms. McKay-Vaughn also is a member of the Tiger Bay Village Project, an effort to get Volusia County to donate land on Indian Lake Road for a tent city for the homeless. The tents would eventually be replaced with barracks.

Volusia County Council members have not directed their staff to move on the Tiger Bay Village Project. However, County Council members support the idea of a forum on homeless issues, possibly to be sponsored by Stetson University. Nothing has been scheduled as yet.

On a recent day at Halifax Urban Ministries, Jeff Moran said hello to Mr. Carter as he sat on the porch of the building. Back in May, Mr. Moran said Mr. Carter helped him find some day labor work.

"Everybody knows him," Mr. Moran said of Mr. Carter.

Sometimes, the other homeless call Mr. Carter the president. He just smiles in response.

"I tell them I'm not the president of the homeless," Mr. Carter said. "I'm president of HOME."

Despite the challenges and disappointment of life on the street, Mr. Carter said he has hope for the future, not only for himself, but other homeless. He hopes there will be a place where the homeless can sleep. For himself, he hopes for a job, an apartment, a dog and a cat, a wife and even children.

"I have hopes," he said. "You won't see me jumping off a bridge."

## Eagle Scouts give back

DAYTONA BEACH — Four Boy Scouts wanted to give back to their old elementary school for their Eagle Scout projects so they chose an extensive beautification project at Ortona Elementary School on Grandview Ave. in Daytona Beach.

The boys, Seabreeze High School juniors Corey Wile, Ridge Stewart and Sean Whealan and Dwight Buchanan, who recently moved to Kentucky, are all from Boy Scout Troop 401. They chose different projects on the Ortona Elementary campus. Scoutmaster Steve Butts approved the huge project, but the individual scouts designed the plans, solicited donations, recruited volunteers, managed all the work, and got in the trenches for a lot of the labor.

In May, Dwight cleared the front flowerbeds, ripped out many of the old plants, and planted flowers

in the outside garden visible from the parking lot. He also enlisted the help of retired art teacher Tom Evans to paint a new dolphin mural above the flowerbed, to show off the Ortona mascot.

Ridge created a new courtyard by completely clearing the area, installing new sod and bushes, and an irrigation system. Patio stones and concrete benches were painted with bright colors. Much of the materials, including a dolphin sculpture, were donated.

A time capsule from 2002-2003 was also relocated with a memorial marker.

Ortona Elementary school Principal Marie Stratton said the students noticed the changes on the first day of school.

"The flagpole area in the courtyard is now a place where teachers or parents can gather or students can sit and read. It all looks like a new campus," she said.

Two remaining projects

will complete the facelift for the school.

Corey will refurbish the pond this month. He plans to drain the water, fix a leak, and install new plants and timbers.

In October, Sean will be working on the last phase of the project, a butterfly garden. He wants to enlarge the garden, put in special plants that attract butterflies, and install a walkway for the children.

Family members, friends, scouts from Troop 429, alumni and even Home Depot employees gave of their own time to help.

Ridge said the Scout motto of "be prepared" was true for his project when many tasks didn't go exactly as planned. He said this has taught him responsibility in how to bring a large job together.

The Eagle Scout is the highest rank attainable in the Boy Scouting program. All four students plan to go on to college after they graduate from high school.

Volusia County.

"Look at the design of the buildings, the landscaping, the overall investment the city has placed on Granada with medians, sign requirements and landscaping," Mr. Mannarino said. "It's a very unique corridor. One of the reasons people invest in that area is because the city maintains the corridor and requires strict design standards."

The property owners have five years to develop the site and can get a two-year extension, under the plan approved at the City Commission's meeting on Sept. 6.

Most of the site will be offices. Retail and restaurant uses cannot exceed 20 percent, even though the owners wanted up to 49 percent retail-restaurant uses. City planning staff recommended only 20 percent because businesses have struggled at the Amaral Plaza on North U.S. 1, because of a lack of visibility, signage and building layout.

While city staff saw a potential for the same problems at the newly approved development, Mayor Ed Kelley did not.

"I ideologically disagree with telling someone who has invested a million dollars what to put there," Mr. Kelley said. "I would have supported 49 percent (retail and restaurant) instead of 20."

However, the property owners did not attend the City Commission meeting to make their request in person.

The mayor said business has a different dynamic on Granada Boulevard versus North U.S. 1, where traffic travels faster.

"Who's to say they won't be successful (with more retail-restaurant at the Granada site)," Mr. Kelley said.



investment, comparing it to businesses such as NASCAR that frequently do large

marketing studies.

"I think it's an important study that's long overdue and we'll get results that are measurable," he said in an interview after the meeting. "The more people in our

hotels the more tax they generate, the more we advertise and get conventions in town."

Councilwoman Joie Alexander, New Smyrna Beach, also said the study won't have to necessarily provide tips for attracting more visitors to be worth the expense.

"When you look at the millions of dollars we get from tourists, we need to know that we're doing right and targeting every area we can," she said.

Member Josh Wagner, Port Orange, compared the study to his law practice.

"I run a business," he said in a phone interview. "I want to know what marketing dollars are generating clients. (The county council is) the right organization to do it, because we oversee the budgets of the three advertising bureaus."

Mr. Persis noted that during presentations Strategic and the other two companies seeking the study contract had already identified a marketing area that the county's advertising authorities could further develop: social media. That, he said, gives him assurance that there's much more a marketing study will uncover.

"All the companies were telling us it's so much cheaper to use targeted social networking advertising," he said. "They seem to know that that is the way to go."





# When the question is 'What's for dinner?' Meatloaf is a good answer

Hello, smart shoppers.

When "What should I make for dinner?" keeps going round and round in your head, ground beef often comes to mind.

Remember what I have

told you in the past. Do not buy ground beef, buy a bottom, top or eye round roast or round steak when on sale and ask the butcher to trim the fat and grind the meat. Now you're having a "good for you" ground beef, not one that

is grease-laden. Fat in meat is the bad saturated fat, extra virgin olive oil is the good monounsaturated fat. When using virtually "fat-free" ground beef, add some olive oil for moisture.

Today's column will offer up some deliciously different ways with ground beef.

We'll have Pattie's meatloaf and barbecued meatloaves. My cousin's daughter-in-law, Pattie, invited us to dinner and prepared a delicious meatloaf. When I asked her for the recipe she informed me that she got the idea from her mother-in-law, Jeannie. When Jeannie told her to use dry Italian bread and Pattie didn't have any Jeannie suggested stuffing mix such as Stove Top moistened with any cream soup. Pattie used basic ingredients requiring two pounds of ground beef. I made a giant meatloaf that was great and froze the extra for another meal.

A box of stuffing mix contains 2 1/2 cups. With Jeannie's ratio (one pound of ground beef to one cup of stuffing to one egg per pound, plus other stuff, I created this recipe. Since you can't cut an egg in half I used a whole one for the half pound.

Barbecued meatloaves are a delicious take-off on meatloaf. I found the recipe years ago, made a few changes to suit our tastes and filed it as a favorite. Enjoy, see you next week.

## PATTIE'S MARVELOUS MEATLOAF REGULAR AND LOW-FAT

- 2 1/2 cups stuffing mix (try the store brand)
- 1 10oz. can concentrated cream soup (I used 98 percent fat-free cream of celery)
- 1/2 cup catsup
- 2 1/2 pounds "fat-free" ground beef
- 3 large eggs or 3/4 cup egg substitute
- 1 cup chopped onion (1 large)
- 1 tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- Several sprigs fresh Italian parsley, chopped or 1 tbsp. dried
- 1 tsp. each salt and pepper
- 3 tbsp. extra virgin olive oil (use only for fat-free choice)
- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder, optional

Place stuffing, soup and catsup in a medium bowl, mix to moisten; let sit for 15 minutes. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, place meat and remaining ingredients. Add stuffing, scrub your hands real well and mix all together thoroughly.

Making two loaves, place in a large baking pan.

Place on rack in center of oven and broil until top

of loaves are brown (helps make a better gravy). Remove pan from oven. Preheat oven to 350. For a one pot meal, place cut up potatoes (large chunks) and halved carrots around meat and bake for 1 hour or until vegetables are almost tender. Add 1/2 cup water or beef broth to the pan and cover with foil continue baking for 15 minutes or until veggies are tender.

Using a slotted spoon, remove vegetables. Place meatloaf on platter and pour remaining juices into a small saucepan. If you used regular ground beef, de-fat by adding several ice cubes. Be sure to add enough cubes - you don't want them to all melt before the liquid is cold. Let sit until all the fat has congealed and clung to the cubes. Remove remaining cubes and fat with a slotted spoon. Add 1/2 cup water to pot and prepare gravy by adding 2 heaping tablespoons flour to 1 cup cold water in a jar. Cover and shake until blended. Add slowly to boiling liquid adding gravy master for color and a packet of powdered beef bouillon for flavor. You can also use store bought gravy to add to the liquid.

## BARBECUED MEATLOAVES SERVES 4 REGULAR AND LOW FAT

Ground beef may be used in place of the pork if you choose.

3/4 lb. ground beef

- 1/4 lb. lean ground pork
- 1/4 cup bread
- 1/4 cup milk - whole, low-fat or skim
- 3/4 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 1 tbsp. parsley flakes
- 1 medium (1/2 cup) onion, chopped
- 2 slices white or wheat bread
- 1 tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tsp. chili powder
- 1/2 cup catsup
- 1/3 cup white vinegar

Soak bread slices in water, squeeze. Mix with meat, crumbs, milk, parsley, salt, pepper and half the onion. Shape mixture into 8 oblong loaves and place in shallow baking pan.

Combine the remaining onion and other ingredients, heat. Pour sauce over loaves, cover pan and bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 45 minutes. This recipe freezes great, simply bake it, portion it out and freeze, or prepare it and freeze to be baked at serving time.

# Summer of the flounder over, ready for the fall of the red

The inshore water is beginning to cool, signaling the end of a very long and unusual summer for yours truly. Instead of my normal hot weather habit of stalking the big single reds that cruise Tomoka Basin or ripping out the schools of trout that gather in the southern Mosquito Lagoon, I spent my summer catching flounder.

So single-minded was I that I abandoned all others. Since I found the flatties either from my kayak or on foot, my two outboard boats were woefully neglected. I did make sure that both had sufficient gas treatment in the fuel tanks and made an attempt to fire them up every now and again. Still, an unused vessel can create all sorts of ways to let you down.

Now, with the crazy flounder season winding down I am thinking reds. I have three spots in mind where I expect success. By the time you read this I intend to have tried them all. First I will make the long drive from Ormond by the Sea to the Shiloh Marsh, which is down near The Haulover Canal just south of the Volusia County line. The place I fish there is very difficult to get to since there is no boat ramp anywhere nearby. I will either

dump my little Carolina Skiff in off the canal bank or try it with the Green Peanut.

Whichever way I go I expect to get a lot of action from my red and white Mirro-Lure. The type I swear by is named "Floating Twitch Bait" on the package. It is an innocuous

looking plug that floats but will dive on the retrieve. If you are able to sight fish reds you may use it as a top water lure by winding it back slowly. If you can't see the reds you can submerge it and wait for the invisible underwater strike. It is a deadly bait for reds, trout or snook.

Another place I will visit is Sleepy Hollow Park near the Three Bridges south of Port Orange on U. S. 1. Once more there is no boat ramp there so I will either wade or take my kayak. This spot calls for my

chartreuse jig. Reds and snook will be the target. Fishing the shrimp tail very slowly I expect lots of small fish but I know that the big heavy hitters are always around there, too. The many sharp oyster shells there make it very difficult to land an oversized red with my 10-pound test line, but the fun is in the trying.

Thirdly (is that a word?) I will take my 17-foot Polar up to the big mud flats west of High Bridge near the Flagler County line. That area is

famous for big battling redfish. Most who fish it regularly opt for a free lined live mullet but I will go with my jig tipped with a half inch of dead shrimp. This is shallow water fishing and you must be quiet. I will use my push pole and leave my electric trolling motor on the deck. Just one "clink" of a propeller striking an oyster can spook every red for a quarter mile.

Those are a few spots you might want to try. If you find my directions just a bit vague,

good. Exploring an area thoroughly and finding the prime spots is a big part of the fun and I wouldn't want to deprive you of that. Great red fishing is just beginning, so get out and give it a try. If you go on a weekend be sure and take a kid along.
