

## Jobs market continues slow growth

VOLUSIA COUNTY — A sign of the times: Governor Rick Scott and the newly-formed Department of Economic Opportunity recently celebrated the announcement of a 10.3-percent unemployment rate. More accurately, the celebration was that the state's October unemployment figure is the lowest in 28 months.

"It's a slow painful path, that's for sure," said Rick Frasier, president of the local Center for Business Excellence. "The good news is that it's an improvement, but it's nothing to write home about."

The economic-opportunity department recently took over the functions of the Agency for Workforce Innovation. The Florida Legislature created the department during its last session.

Volusia's October unemployment rate was identical to the

state's, 10.3 percent. The county's September unemployment rate was 10.8 percent. Its unemployment rate was 12 percent in October last year. Volusia's unemployment rate has hovered over the state's throughout this year. Job growth in hospitality seems to have narrowed the gap.

## Local man continues fight against HIV/AIDS

Jeff Allen, Chairperson of the Partnership for HIV/AIDS Planning of Daytona Beach, is one of the many soldiers on the frontline in the battle against AIDS. Since 1995, Allen has been working behind the scenes with community partners to make a difference. He is dedicated to empowering, improving and maintaining the quality of life for all persons living with HIV/AIDS.

One of Allen's work duties is determining how to spend federal dollars designated for participants of the Ryan White Program in Volusia and Flagler counties. The program offers HIV positive persons assistance with services not covered under other programs. Allen is well known for his efforts in being a driving force in the efforts to expand the availability of HIV treat-

ment, prevention, housing, advocacy and education programs to low income and disadvantaged families.

According to the Volusia County Health Department, there are slightly more than 1,400 people living with HIV/AIDS in Volusia and Flagler counties. Florida ranks third in the number of adult AIDS cases nationwide. With AIDS being a disease that has plagued the world for the last three decades, advocates like Mr. Allen are dedicated to raising awareness and saving lives. Mr. Allen is a member of the World AIDS Week Committee here in Daytona Beach. The committee has scheduled a number of events to recognize World AIDS Day.

Mr. Allen shares his personal feelings about the AIDS epidemic, why he's working so hard to help others and why

## Occupy Daytona Beach movement hitting the streets

ORMOND BEACH — Since starting in September on Wall Street as a localized protest against corporate greed, big-bank bailouts and income disparity, the "Occupy" movement has quickly spread all the way across the globe. In fact, on Oct. 15, dubbed by Occupy supporters as their "Day of Rage," nonviolent protests were held in more than 80 countries worldwide.

That day also marked the first big event for Occupy Daytona Beach, Volusia

County's local chapter. The daylong event was held at Tusawilla Park near the intersection of Nova Road and International Speedway in Daytona Beach and featured teach-ins, general assemblies, speakers and a sign-waving demonstration outside the Steak 'N Shake at the same intersection.

Although it was the group's first event, the rally drew about 400 people throughout the day with a one-time peak of 250, said Shannon McLeish, an organizer of Occupy Daytona.

"People hung out for the

whole day, just talking and sharing stories," she said. "I was very pleasantly surprised."

Another indication of the event's success, Ms. McLeish said, were the several groups of motorcyclists who chose to put their Biketoberfest plans on hold to check out the event.

"We weren't sure how it would work (going up against Biketoberfest), But the bikers love it," she said. "Those who didn't stop were honking or revving their engines all day."

Since the Occupy Day-

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Dr. Carol Eaton knows how valuable an associates degree can be.

"If you start at a community college, you can go anywhere — including a college president," she said in a recent interview.

Ms. Eaton took the reins at Daytona State College in August. Her higher education started with an associates degree at a community campus, State University of New York at Cobleskill.

While Daytona State no longer wears the long-familiar "community college," she said it will always be a community institution primarily responsive to changing local workforce needs.

"There is the part of our mission at a community college that we're preparing the workforce," she said. "A number of students come for very specific job training."

Ms. Eaton capped her education with a Ph.D. in

## Ormond Beach seeks out its veterans

ORMOND BEACH — Veterans, report your AO's!

The City of Ormond Beach is asking resident veterans to call in their areas of operation (in civilian life, their addresses and phone numbers), so that inviting them to veterans events is easier.

It was Commissioner Bill Partington's idea, and the City Commission unanimously approved it.

"The city does a really good job of honoring veterans and we want to make sure we don't miss anybody," he said. "Particularly the World War II group. We're losing the opportunity day

by day to honor them."

Mr. Partington said he's not a veteran. More accurately, he doesn't think of himself as a "veteran," although he donned the uniform for two years.

"I did a stint in the Army Reserve during college," he said. "I was never deployed or anything like that. I don't think of myself as a veteran, like these guys who were in World War II."

Of the 16.1 million men and women who served in the armed forces during World War II, only about two million are living, according to a recent report by the Department of Veterans Affairs. The youngest are

# Fire Department offers tips for safe holiday meal preparation

Cooking fires continue to be the most common type of fires experienced by U.S. households. This is even more apparent during the holidays. There is an increased incidence of

cooking fires on Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve Day, and Christmas Day. Cooking fires are also the leading cause of fire injuries in residences. These fires are preventable by simply being more attentive to the use of cooking materials and equipment.

Don't become a cooking fire casualty. Learn the facts about cooking fire safety today.

### Safe cooking tips

The kitchen can be one of the most hazardous

rooms in the home if cooks don't practice safe cooking behaviors.

Here are some safety tips to help:

- Stay in the kitchen when frying, grilling, or broiling food. If the cook must leave the kitchen for even a short period of time,

turn off the stove

- When simmering, baking, roasting, or boiling food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer

- Stay alert! To prevent cooking fires, cooks have to be alert. Cooks who are sleepy, drinking alcohol, or have taken medicine that may be drowsy

- Keep anything that can catch fire - potholders, oven mitts, wooden utensils, paper or plastic bags, food packaging, towels, or curtains - away from the stove

- Keep the stovetop, burners, and oven clean

- Wear short, close-fitting or tightly rolled sleeves when cooking. Loose clothing can dangle onto stove burners and catch fire if it comes into contact with a gas flame or electric burner

- Plug microwave ovens and other cooking appliances directly into an outlet

- Never use an extension cord for a cooking appliance, as it can overload the circuit and cause a fire

safety goggles to protect eyes from oil splatter

- Make sure the turkey is completely thawed and be careful with marinades. Oil and water do not mix; water causes oil to spill over causing a fire or even an explosion hazard

- The National Turkey Federation recommends thawing the turkey in the refrigerator approximately 24 hours for every five pounds in weight

- Keep an all-purpose fire extinguisher nearby. Never use water to extinguish a grease fire. If the fire is manageable, use an all-purpose fire extinguisher. If the fire increases, immediately call the fire department for help

### If there is a cooking fire

- When in doubt, just get out. Leave the house, close the door to help contain the fire. Call 9-1-1 or the local emergency number after you leave

- If a cook does try to fight the fire, be sure others are already getting out and have a clear path to the exit.

- Always keep an oven mitt and a lid nearby when cooking. If a small grease fire starts in a pan, smother the flames by carefully sliding the lid over the pan (make sure to wear an oven mitt). Turn off the burner. Do not move the pan. To keep the fire from restarting, leave the lid on until the pan is completely cool

- In case of an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed to prevent flames from burning clothing
- If there is a fire in a microwave oven, turn it off immediately and keep the door closed. Never open the door until the fire is completely out. Unplug the appliance if it the outlet can safely be reached

- After a fire, both ovens and microwaves should be checked and/or serviced before being used again



### Turkey fryer safety tips

- Use turkey fryers outdoors a safe distance from buildings and any other combustible materials.

- Never use turkey fryers in a garage or on a wooden deck

- Make sure fryers are used on a flat surface to reduce accidental tipping.

- Never leave the fryer unattended. Most units do not have thermostat controls. Cooks must watch the fryer carefully, the oil will continue to heat until it catches fire.

- Never let children or pets near the fryer even if it is not in use. The oil inside the cooking pot can remain dangerously hot hours after use

- To avoid oil spillover, do not overfill the fryer

- Use well-insulated potholders or oven mitts when touching pot or lid handles. If possible, wear



# You eat the turkey, I'm going to the car show

Thanksgiving and cars. Cars and Thanksgiving. For over 50 years the Daytona Beach area has been the nation's No. 1 destination for classic car enthusiasts on the four-day Thanksgiving weekend. The Turkey Run, which is centered in the infield of Daytona International Speedway this weekend, will host nearly 5,000 rod, custom and antique show cars.

While Daytona Beach is one of the world's most recognizable trademarks for all things automotive, practically all that happens there had to first come through the small community of Ormond Beach. Most of us know the story about how auto racing began there in 1903 but few realize that the success of the land speed records set there would encourage Daytona Beach to hold their own. Men like Segrave, Campbell, Lockhart, Keech, and DePalma set unbelievable speed records on the beach and when Capt. Malcolm Campbell averaged the ultimate speed of 276 MPH in 1935 he inspired a couple of interested onlookers to develop the oval beach road track.

First Sig Haugdahl, himself a former world record holder, and then William H. G. France, a local mechanic, took a try at using the beach for stock car racing. The eventual result was NASCAR and the speedway.

The Turkey Run (formerly The

Turkey Rod Run) also owes its origins to Ormond Beach. Back in 1958 a group of antique car owners met in that city to create The Birthplace Of Speed Association. Their plan was to hold a parade and car show each Thanksgiving weekend. It just so happened that Big Bill France was looking for some help in publicizing the first race at the new super speedway he had just built in a rural area west of Daytona Beach. Mr. France was able to convince the men and women of The Birthplace Of Speed Association to hold their first celebration in February of 1959. After that, the event would settle into its regular schedule of the parade on Friday and the Show on Saturday after Thanksgiving. That first show in 1959 drew a most impressive array of beautifully restored antique vehicles. There was Duryea's, Mercers, Cords, Dusenbergs, Maxwells, and many more. There was also a nice bunch of customized hot rods at the gate. The problem was that the Birthplace Of Speed events were

designed for restored or original automobiles. The disgruntled hot rodders were turned away. Having nothing better to do they moved a few miles south to the Bell Aire Shopping Center for an impromptu show and shine. As the years passed the hot rods outgrew the originals in popularity and the number of cars at the shopping center and across the street at the La Playa Hotel would far outnumber the antiques at Ormond. Eventually the Turkey Rod Run moved to the speedway and became a national attraction.

In Ormond Beach, the Gaslight Parade and car show is still going strong and now in its 54th edition is one of the nation's oldest. The parade will begin at 7 p.m. on Friday night from the Casements and proceed east to A1A and then south to Harvard Ave. On Saturday, the car show will be held in Fortunato Park on the east end of the big bridge from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m.

The Ormond Beach Gaslight Parade and car show are both free to spectators. The Turkey Run will operate all four days. Call (386) 255-7355 for information. Our community is very fortunate to host such an internationally famous car weekend and we owe it all to the little seaside community of Ormond Beach.

Quick Answers to Common Legal Questions

### Driving Under the Influence of Mobile Phones

#### Distracted While Driving

Using a mobile phone while driving has become almost second nature for many drivers, but it is proving to be a dangerous task. Over the last 15 years, the number of cell phone subscribers has increased by 1,262.4%, among who are also drivers on our roads. The use of cell phones while driving has led to an epidemic in auto accidents (called the "distracted while driving" phenomena.)

Driving while distracted is estimated to contribute as much as 13% of all traffic crashes in the United States, while other studies put this figure as high as 25%. A 2002 Harvard Center for Risk Analysis calculated that as many 330,000 people are injured every year as a result of drivers using cell phones.

#### Shocking Statistics

The statistics associated with cell phone usage and auto accidents is nothing short of shocking. In 2008 it was estimated that, at any given moment, over 800,000 Americans were making calls, texting, emailing or using a smart phone application while driving during the day.

A recent US Department of Transportation Consumer Reports study recently showed that:

- 63% of people under the age of 30 admitted to driving while using a cell phone
- 30% admitted to sending a text message while driving
- 56% of teenagers admitted to talking on cell phones while behind the wheel
- 48% of American children between the age of 12 and 17 said that they had been a passenger in a car while the driver was texting
- 34% of American teenagers between the age of 12 and 17 admitted to text messaging while driving
- 21% of all fatal car crashes involving American teenagers between the age of 16 and 19 were the result of cell phone usage in one form or another
- 50% of all drivers between the ages of 12 and 14 texting while driving
- The risk of an auto or truck accident is 23 times more likely while texting

As you can see from these statistics, car crashes have taken the lead as the number one cause of teen deaths. Because of increased cell phone usage by teen drivers, teens are also trending to have three times more fatal accidents as other drivers.

#### Practice Safety When Driving

The age of technology is here to stay. When the automobile was introduced in 1769 (recorded as the first vehicle to move under its own power) the first auto accident was soon to follow. The subsequent injuries to millions of people from car accidents led to a host of new safety inventions and motor vehicle laws. Now the introduction of the cell phone and the increase in "driving while distracted" auto accidents and truck accidents has created the need for safety devices and laws for the motoring public (such as limiting the more dangerous aspects, like texting, of this new technology).

mathematics education from State University of New York at Albany, and quickly headed back to the classroom, a place native to her.

"I loved school," she said. "I was always a good student, top of my class. I always thought I wanted to be a math teacher."

The longer Ms. Eaton taught, the more she realized how profoundly administrators' decisions affected students. She decided the office was where she belonged.

"I saw it as an opportunity to impact more students' lives," she said. "You do have tremendous opportunities to have programs in place to make students successful."

A confessed workaholic who sees no need for recovery, Ms. Eaton came to Daytona State from Fredrick Community College in Frederick, Md. She was the president there for six years.

She said her biggest goal is to keep Daytona State on the cutting edge using evolving educational tools — technology that's making college increasingly

portable.

"The classroom is very different than when I was in school," she said. "The technology available to our faculty members and students is very different."

One technology that doesn't interest Ms. Eaton is television. She doesn't watch it, she said, leaving her more time to not see movies.

"I just don't watch movies," she said. "I haven't been to a theater since I don't know when. I'm dull."

A bit of jazz and reading is more Ms. Eaton's thing.

"When I'm reading for pleasure, then I will do fiction," she said. "I like the murder mysteries."

The mathematician has also been able to leave her first educational love behind. She leaves the Mathematics Institute's Millennium prizes for others to win. She has no urge to finally prove or refute the Hodge conjecture; she's got students on the brain.

"I don't read any mathematic books anymore," said Ms. Eaton, who beat out 44 other candidates for her job. "I read a lot of things about higher-education history."

She sees her new job as, among other things, a patriotic exercise in protecting

liberty. After all, she started her education career on America's Bicentennial.

"The commitment we have to democracy demands that we have public education," Ms. Eaton said. "I don't think self-government, democracy, is possible unless we have an educated citizenry. We, as a community college, share in the mission of educating a democratic populace."

Ms. Eaton beat out 44 candidates for Daytona State's top job. She said her 35 years in education is the only thing she could have done.

"There might have been other careers," she said. "I don't know, I never thought of another career."



now 84. The department and Associated Press have estimated that their numbers are thinning by about 1,000 a day.

There are about 22.7 million veterans in the United States, more than a million in Florida and about 70,000 in Volusia County. Technology has reduced the number needed in the military over the years, and the veterans department estimates that there will only be 14 million veterans nationwide by 2035.

Last month, the city put a notice in its water bills asking veterans to call its leisure services department with their contact information. Loretta Moisiso, the city's public information officer, said so far, 55 have replied, about half the number that enjoyed a recent city-sponsored Veterans Day dinner at the Ormond Beach Senior Center.

"We have no idea what the number of veterans is in Ormond Beach," she said. "We did have 106 veterans at that Veterans Day celebration on Nov. 13. This was the eighth year for that dinner."

The County Chair, Frank Bruno, is pleased that Ormond Beach is trying to identify its veterans. He served in the Army while the Vietnam War was in full swing, and recently spoke at the Ormond Beach Art Museum and Gardens' Veterans Day memorial. Like Mr. Partington, Mr. Bruno discounts his service, noting that he never left the Americas. His brother was in combat duty in Vietnam when Mr. Bruno was in the military, so he was kept stateside.

"I think a lot of the cities are all having more events today than ever before," he

said. "I think any recognition of our military is fabulous and we should be doing it."

In addition to the annual Veterans Day dinner, the city has sponsored a Memorial Day remembrance for the last 22 years.

Mayor Ed Kelley hinted that Santa Claus might have another event in his bag for Ormond Beach veterans.

"We do plan to recognize all the veterans in the very near future, and we don't want to miss anyone," he said.

tona Facebook page was created in September, it has amassed more than 1,400 fans.

Ms. McLeish said she believes one explanation for that growth is the willingness of group members to immerse themselves within the community in order to speak their minds.

"We've only been at this for about a month and we're getting a great response," Ms. McLeish said. "People are definitely getting the message."

During a sidewalk demon-

stration on the corner of W. Granada Avenue and Beach Street in Ormond Beach this past week, a crowd of about 35 greeted traffic with chants and signs such as "We are the 99-Percent." "People over Profit." "Save the American Dream" and "Honk for Jobs."

Drivers were quick to show their support, especially to the last request. In the hour-and-a-half the group protested, rarely would more than 10 seconds pass before another car horn blasted through the area.

This came as no surprise to Ms. McLeish.

"Everywhere we go we hear nothing but horns," she

said. "99 percent of people agree with us because 99 percent of the country is struggling."

Even the loudest horn in the world, however, cannot create jobs, which begs the question: How effective are these Occupy efforts?

"I don't think I'm having any effect at all," sign-bearing Lisa Martin said at the Ormond Beach event. The 72-year-old has participated in dozens of political protests throughout her life, beginning with Vietnam War protests during the 1950s. "Sure, there are horns, but what are we supposed to do?"

Ms. Martin said she believes the next step is to share a specific "call to action" with movement supporters.

"The government is responsible for creating jobs, so our next sign should be 'Do X for jobs' or explaining

ways to demand infrastructure jobs, for example," Ms. Martin said.

Critics have often accused Occupy groups of lacking focus, a critique with which Ms. Martin said she agrees.

"We need to create a clear and concise explanation of our objectives right away," she said. "Right now, we aren't really focused where we should be."

Meanwhile, Occupy Daytona supporter Linda Walker of Edgewater believes the group makes strides toward progress every day by reminding locals that these are national issues that don't stop at Wall Street.

"Each day, more people are starting to sense what it means to be a part of the 99 percent," Ms. Walker said. "We can't be afraid to talk about it. We have to make this as much of an issue as we can."

That is, of course, while

still keeping their protest peaceful, said Ms. Leish, who admits her tempers still flare when she hears of violent interactions between protesters and law enforcement around the country.

"We firmly believe in the nonviolent protest," she said. "Still, when we see our fellow Americans maced and hit with batons, that's an outrage. That charges us up." Also frustrating, Ms. McLeish said, is the way movement supporters are depicted on the news.


"They say we're a bunch of unwashed hippies who don't have jobs and who want a

free ride," she said. "That's not the truth."

If recent events are any indication, Ms. McLeish may be onto something. The honks heard came from cars driven by people of a variety of different ages and races. That, Ms. McLeish said, trumps any false advertising.

"The media can slander us all they want, but when the American people who are struggling hear our message, they know what we are doing is true."

"Volusia County is a rela-

tively medium-sized county, and hospitality gained 2,200 jobs over the last year," Mr. Frasier said. "...

hospitality has led the way in creating jobs the last couple months."

The nation has fared the protracted economic downturn better than Florida, but is improving more slowly. According to the state's economic-opportunity department, last month's national, seasonally-adjusted unemployment rate was nine percent. The previous month, it was 9.1 percent. A year ago, the nation had a 9.7 percent unemployment rate, while Florida's was 11.8. Florida has had a higher unemployment rate than the nation since February, 2008.

Mr. Frasier said numerous national and international events are putting headwinds against the local economy. For example, Greece and Italy have had debt crises escalate to changes in their governments.

"How that affects us locally is with all the uncertainty in the world local business people are reluctant to step out and hire people even if they need to," Mr. Frasier said. "They don't know what the future holds. I think all of what's happening in the world is making business people hold back. The people that hire people are playing it close to the vest."

He said that there are ongoing efforts to spur

more localized economic activity to offset the affects of national and international events. For example, he noted, the Volusia County Chamber of Commerce Alliance is hosting the Buy Local Volusia Business Expo. The event will be on Dec. 13, at the Daytona International Speedway. Organizers hope to bring local businesses and shoppers together.

"The whole idea is to promote buying locally to help stimulate the economy here," Mr. Frasier said. "If they're successful, they can stimulate the economy locally."

State economists are predicting a slight improvement in holiday spending over last year, according to Mr. Frasier. That, he said, should get retailers adding temporary workers, which should add more kindling to the local jobs market.

"It will get money in the pocket of people who have been unemployed for awhile," Mr. Frasier said. "The next two reports, November and December, should reflect those additional hires for the holiday season."

He added, "I think what came out in the unemployment report—it wasn't negative. It shows we're going the right direction. We're all saying, 'Come on, let's go faster.'"

**From newser.com: Congress declares pizza a vegetable**

Thanks to Congress, pizza is considered a vegetable — at least in school lunches. Proposed new school lunch standards from the USDA would have limited potatoes in school lunches (think French fries) and stopped counting less than a half-cup of tomato sauce as a vegetable (think pizza), but food companies complained via \$5.6 million worth of lobbying, Talking Points Memo reports. A spending bill released rejects those suggestions, ensuring pizza

and French fries will continue to be served. Federally-subsidized school meals must contain a certain amount of vegetables, and now pizza, with its two tablespoons of tomato sauce, can continue to be one of those vegetables. The USDA's proposed changes also

included limiting sodium and increasing whole grains, the AP reports, meaning that efforts to make lower-sodium, whole grain pizzas will also be delayed. "While it's unfortunate that some members of Congress continue to put special interests ahead of the health

of America's children, USDA remains committed to practical, science-based standards for school meals," says a USDA spokesperson.

events such as World AIDS Day are so important.

Q: Why is it rewarding for you to work in the AIDS field?

A: It is important for me to be involved because the more we see positive influences by people that have HIV/AIDS working to end the fear and stigma of the disease, the quicker we will slow the progression of the spread of the disease. People that have experienced rejection and intolerance are afraid and rightly so. We see violence being demonstrated towards people who have HIV, even those who are not homosexuals. Until we work together to unite with one another and to combat healthcare disparities, the more people will senselessly die. I personally find this unacceptable! I also feel that since I have lived more than 26 years

with this disease while many others have not, it is my responsibility to bring about awareness in the honor of those bright individuals who are not here today to carry the torch.

Q: What is World AIDS Day?

A: World AIDS Day, observed Dec. 1 each year, is dedicated to raising awareness of the AIDS pandemic caused by the spread of HIV infection. It is common to hold memorials to honor persons who have died from HIV/AIDS on this day. Government and health officials also observe the event, often with speeches or forums on the AIDS topics. Since 1995, the President of the United States has made an official proclamation on World AIDS Day. Governments of other nations have followed suit and issued similar announcements. It is also a time for me to personally remember the bright light of the individuals that I have known who have passed from this disease.

Q: What do you hope to gain out of having a World AIDS Week? What message would you like to leave with the community at large today?

A: The week includes all populations of the community; men, women and children. It also includes all sexual orientations. The entire community is affected in one way or another. This is the vital message of every World AIDS Day: that AIDS

does not discriminate. It can strike any member of your family if they don't protect themselves and others. I'm sure my mother never thought her son would contract AIDS. It's the same within all communities, third world or not. If we are not educated about how to protect ourselves, then we are at risk. If I could ask one thing from our community, I would ask them to be loving, and truly feel that NO ONE deserves to get this disease, whatever their background, orientation, color, or religious belief.

Q: What can community members do to help?

A: They can get involved in some way to promote education. The schools have limitations on them as to what they can and cannot teach. But as parents, we can decide what we want to talk about in our own homes. I can remember how I was amazed at how accepting my parents were of me when they found out I had HIV. I am sure that they would have educated me about this disease had they know about it themselves.

But they did not know anything about it from their generation. I have talked to all of my nephews and family about the disease. They get it. My nephews have always known how to protect themselves. I pray they will never have to go through what I have had to go through living with this disease.

Q: What is the theme of this year's World AIDS Day and why?

A: The theme for World AIDS Day 2011 is 'Getting to Zero'. After 30 years of the global fight against HIV/AIDS, this year the global community has committed to focusing on achieving three targets: Zero new HIV infections. Zero discrimination. Zero AIDS-related deaths.

Q: If there was ONE thing that you wished to accomplish at World AIDS Day this year, what would it be?

A: In 2009, there were 2.6 million new HIV infections and 1.8 million people died from AIDS globally. Moreover, in 2011 people living with HIV were still subject to restrictions on their travel and/or stay in 47 countries, territories and areas. And it was also true in the US until this year. Let's all be more compassionate and work towards universal access (to care and medications) for everyone!



# Poinsettias pretty but fragile

With the holidays rapidly approaching, soon one of the most popular plants on earth will be available for sale. In fact, I have already seen them in limited quantities at some mass retailers.

I am referring to the colorful poinsettia plant. These plants are commonly known for their red color, but they also can come in white, pink and multi-colored.

As beautiful as these plants are, they are also very fragile, and you must handle them gently or the delicate branches will break and fall off.

Poinsettias have an interesting history that dates back to the 14th century. From the 14th to the 16th century, the Aztec Indians used the sap to control fevers and the leaves were used to produce a red dye. The botanical name for the poinsettia is Euphorbia Pulcherrima, which means "very beautiful."

Many people believe that poinsettias are poisonous. The truth is that they are not. However, some people are allergic to the white sap of the plant and skin irritation can develop. Those people should handle the plants with care.

For a retailer during the holiday season, these plants create an eye-catching display that will certainly draw a crowd.

How do you pick that perfect plant? The first thing you want to look for is a plant that has been removed from its sleeve. Many retailers will

display the plant with the sleeve intact, and if the plant sits on the shelf too long, this can cause the leaves to yellow and drop, and eventually, the plant may die. If you do choose a plant that is sleeved, remove the plastic as soon as you get the plant home.

The next thing you want to look for is a plant that has little or no pollen showing on the flower clusters. This is a good indicator of the maturity of the flower bracts.

You should always choose plants that have a lush, green color to their foliage and a good healthy appearance. Avoid plants that look droopy or have yellowing leaves.

Once you have chosen your gem and have your plant in its new home, some standard TLC will ensure that you get a long lifespan from your new houseguest.

If you are keeping your plant indoors and it is not near a good light source, occasionally put it in a sunny location so it can get the light it needs to maintain a healthy look. If the plant starts to drop leaves excessively, it is probably not getting enough bright light.

Always keep your plant away from cold drafts and low temperatures. Poinsettias will not do well if the tempera-

tures drop below 45. You should also check your plants for soil moisture daily and be sure your plant has good drainage and does not sit in standing water. Keep the plant evenly moist but not soaking wet.

If you follow these simple tips, you should be able to enjoy your plants through the entire holiday season. After the holidays are over, you can plant them outdoors in a protected location, such as under a tree, and you can enjoy them year after year.

Many retailers will have early shipments of these colorful plants from one to two weeks before Thanksgiving. Shop around for the best prices and plant quality.



This week's dinner: Fresh ham. Everyone knows about smoked ham, but not fresh ham. It's not always available in local markets. Fresh ham is ham that has not been smoked or cured. It's much less expensive than loin of pork and the meat is lean and delicious.

**ROASTED VEGETABLE TART (NIB) SERVES 6-8**

This recipe is compliments of Carapelli Olive Oil company, famous in Florence, Italy, since 1893. It's a relatively easy and excellent appetizer.

4 plum tomatoes

(Roma), coarsely chopped  
1 small eggplant, unpeeled and cubed  
1 medium red bell pepper, seeded and cut in strips that are 1/2 inch wide, 1 inch long  
1 large zucchini, cut lengthwise in quarters and then into 1/4-inch slices  
4 cloves garlic, minced  
1/4-cup extra virgin olive oil, divided  
1/2-teaspoon salt  
1/8-teaspoon ground black pepper  
Cornmeal  
Half of 9-ounce package refrigerated pie crust\*  
2 tablespoons grated Parmesan or Romano cheese

Heat oven to 450 degrees. In bowl, toss all vegetables with garlic, 3 tablespoons olive oil, salt and pepper. Place vegetables in a large pan. Bake 30 minutes until golden brown.

Place piecrust on pan which has been lightly sprinkled with cornmeal.

Place roasted vegetables onto crust, leaving a 2-inch border. Fold the dough up (pleating as necessary) to partially cover the filling around the round edges. Brush crust with remaining oil.

Reduce oven temperature to 425-degrees. Bake 15-20 minutes until crust is golden brown.

Sprinkle with cheese, cut into wedges and serve.

\*Use piecrust sold boxed in sheets, not formed in a tin. Can be found in the dairy section.

**SPINACH-FETA AIOLI ON CROSTINI (NIB) MAKES 8-10 APPETIZERS**

Aioli is garlic mayonnaise that originated in southern France. This appetizer is made like bruschetta. The end result is superb and may be made lower in fat by using low-fat creamed spinach and low-fat or fat-free mayonnaise.

One 9-ounce package creamed spinach  
3/4-cup mayonnaise  
4-ounce package crumbled feta cheese  
1 garlic clove, pressed  
1/4-teaspoon ground red pepper  
1 French or Italian bread loaf, cut diagonally into 1/2-inch slices

Thaw creamed spinach in microwave at medium (50 percent power) 5-6 minutes. Stir together mayonnaise and next 3 ingredients; stir in creamed spinach. SPREAD creamed spinach mixture evenly on bread slices, and place slices on baking sheet. Bake at 350-degrees for 10 minutes or until cheese melts. Serve immediately.

**FRESH HAM SERVES 10 OR MORE**

Ask the butcher to bone and tie the ham. Save the bone for a special occasion spaghetti sauce (adds

great flavor). By removing the skin and the fat you will have a wonderful, lean roast pork. For a special treat, have the butcher bone the meat and leave the skin (rind) on. It will become crisp and delicious, albeit loaded with fat. Either way, the recipe is the same.

7 pound shank half fresh ham  
Garlic powder  
Salt and pepper

Score rind with a sharp knife. Sprinkle roast with seasonings. Place on a rack in roasting pan. Roast at 325-degrees, 35 minutes per pound. Meat juices should run clear.

Prepare gravy according to recipe in previous columns. Remove the rind and cut up with scissors. Carve meat in thin slices. Serve with applesauce.







# A day alone on the boat? A very happy birthday to me

Each November it is a birthday gift to myself to spend a day alone on the water. While I enjoy company, once in a while a solo trip is good for the soul.

As it turned out I had picked a great day. The morning dawned not quite as cool as it had been and the wind that had been blowing for days had finally lain. I launched my 16-foot Carolina Skiff at the public ramps near Turtle Mound. If you are not sure where that is, find it easily by going out to A1A in New Smyrna Beach and heading south. After about five miles you will encounter a toll booth entrance to Canaveral National Seashore. If you are there to launch at Turtle Mound there is no charge and the ranger will wave you through. The ramps are only about a quarter-mile past the gate.

Whenever I fish the Mosquito lagoon my first emotion is always jealousy. I envy the water quality and pristine marine environment that is so sorely lacking in the inshore near my home in Ormond Beach. Right away I could see that this trip would be one of

those rare times when the water in the Lagoon is high enough to allow me to go just about anywhere I pleased.

I began up around Cedar Creek and jugged up a couple small trout right away. With trout season closed I enjoyed the action but I was there with redfish on my mind. Searching farther north I push-poled into the tight mangroves east of the Three Sisters. There my chartreuse jig picked up a feisty under-sized red of 14 inches.

I was encouraged. At a quarter before 9 a.m. I was just off the mouth of a creek that was maybe 25-feet wide. My first cast into the center of that inlet brought no results. Next, I tossed my 1/8 Oz. jig over to the far edge and perilously close to a submerged oyster bar. Before it had time to settle to the bottom a fish had it and sent up a tell-tale

boil. I set the hook and felt the awesome strength that lets you know you are attached to a broad shouldered, head shaking, power wagon of a big red. I hustled to get the fish away from the sharp oysters and when it was over the grass I chuckled out loud at my good fortune. Now I could relax and enjoy the fight.

By the time I put the net under the fish it had shrunk somewhat from my first estimate but it was still a nice 21-inch red.

A good birthday present, indeed.

Heading south, I crossed the Government Cut and found the fishing to be a bit slower there. Eventually, I did find a good school of trout near the oyster lease west of the mouth of the Cut. I had several hits and quite a few managed to release with no help from me. The two I landed there would have both been keepers during trout season. By the time I put my boat back on the trailer I had landed three reds and five trout, which made me a pretty happy birthday boy.

Now that the great seaweed episode has subsided, the surf is picking up. My neighbor and fishing buddy John Rector landed a nice 20-inch red in short order and I am hearing about lots of blues. The big mullet are there, so watch the birds for a clue to the action. If you catch it right a cooler of tasty silver mullet can be yours with one throw of a cast net. This is a great time to be fishing. If you miss it, you only have yourself to blame.

“Depending on the financial need of the family, they might qualify for up to 50 percent off the regular fees.”

Ms. Johnson also suggests giving gifts of **specialty classes**, such as cycling, yoga, pilates, Zumba, kickboxing or swimming for the more active recipients on your gift list.

“Often times, people get into habits and stick with what they usually do. By going outside the lines, you encourage them to try something new ... something they really might enjoy while focusing on different parts of their body. There are some new, exciting classes out there. At the Y, for example, we’re certified to offer the new Les Mills training courses like Body Pump and Body Combat. Those are new and fun.”

Gyms and fitness centers throughout Volusia County also offer different kinds of classes, including the new **boot camp training programs**. There are individual and group classes for everybody from toddlers to seniors and from chair exercises to the latest intense full-body military style TRX workouts.



# Save energy, costs while cooking the holiday feast

The holidays get expensive and it's not just gifts and toys. It takes a lot of energy to entertain friends and family in the home and more energy means more energy costs. FPL offers these energy saving tips that can add up to real savings.

- Don't waste energy by unnecessarily pre-heating your oven. Some foods, such as bread and desserts, require preheating, but holiday meal staples such as turkey and ham don't.
- Keep the oven door closed. It's tempting to check the turkey's roasting progress by opening the oven door, but it's not worth the heat-loss and the significant amount of energy required to bring the oven back up to the desired temperature. Instead, turn the oven light on and look through the interior window.
- Choose glass or ceramic pans for the oven. Believe it or not these types of pans actually heat faster than metal ones. Because they heat faster, cooks can set the temperature 25 degrees lower than the recipe suggests for the same cooking

time, which saves on heating costs.

- Match the size of the pan to the size of the heating element. For example, when using an electric cook top, a 6-inch pan on an 8-inch burner will waste more than 40 percent of the heat produced by the burner.
- When possible, cover pots and pans. This can help cook food more quickly and keeps the cooking temperature higher, which allows cooks to turn down the stove.
- Use smaller appliances such as crock-pots, microwaves and toaster ovens when possible. These can be much more energy-efficient for side dishes or small meals.
- Oven-bake as many items together as

can. Even though some items may cook at different temperatures, many items can be cooked at a standard temperature.

- Gently remind guests to turn off lights and fans when they leave the room. Stopping one ceiling fan from running all the time and turning at least one light off when you leave the room can save you more than \$7 a month in energy costs. Remember, fans do not actually cool the home. Fans only improve the circulation of air, making people feel cooler.
- Before overnight guests arrive, switch out guest room and common area lighting to compact fluorescent light (CFL) bulbs. Each CFL bulb installed will save about \$50 in energy costs over the life of the bulb.



perhaps made from the newer dry wicking fabrics, they'll feel better about themselves and are more likely to go to the gym."

Prices for fitness clothing vary, of course, but I found several ladies' moisture wicking tops for less than \$20 at local department stores, and bargain hunters who are Internet savvy should be able to stretch their dollars even more.

"Gym bags also make great gifts," Ms. Johnson said. "The new ones are designed to keep your shoes and damp clothes separate. People generally don't splurge on nice gym bags for themselves. There are all kinds out there."

Ms. Johnson has also been seeing a lot of the innovative, less structured workout shoes.

said Ms. Johnson. "Exercise mats are another gift idea. Most people don't change them out often enough ... and whether we like to admit it or not, we do sweat!"







# GIFT WRAPPING TRICKS AND TIPS

The holidays are here and that means shoppers have started to stockpile gifts for those they love. Once the shopping rush is over, the time to wrap all of those great finds and treasures has come.

Although some people are gift-wrap gurus, there are many others who feel that their wrapping skills are lacking. Regardless, anyone can create delightful wrapped gifts with a little know-how.

## Prepare

The first step to wrapping is to have all of the supplies in one place. There are some people who have actually dedicated small rooms as

gift-wrap stations. While you don't have to go this far, find a large table and keep your tape, tags, paper, ribbon, scissor, pen, and other accessories nearby.

## Other tips

There are different tips that can help with wrapping.

type of paper you can stagger other pieces and make a collage of papers so there's no waste.

- Use ribbon to dress up a gift and direct the eye away from any imperfections.
- Keep a stack of paper scraps and use it instead of tissue paper to fill in gift bags.
- Keep scissors sharp for clean cuts.
- Pack smaller items or oddly shaped things into a different container that is easier to wrap.
- Roll up clothing and place into a paper towel tube to turn the wrapping into a candy cane shaped gift.

screen, is more powerful and probably is still the only choice for Apple fanatics. But if you just want to find out what the big deal is about tablets, and don't want to spend an arm and a leg, the Kindle Fire and Nook Tablet probably will be good choices. Both tablets will be capable of streaming HD video (albeit from different specific collections) and tapping into each store's respective music and print libraries as well as running a special collection of apps. Both are wi-fi only. No 3G option.

Prices are dropping quickly on the many of the iPad wanna-bes out there, including the Samsung Galaxy Tab, Toshiba Thrive, Motorola Xoom, Acer Iconia and others. Expect most of those to be quite a bit cheaper than a comparable iPad (although probably not as cheap as the Fire) after Thanksgiving, if not earlier. All run on the Android

operating system, which will look and feel different from the custom-built versions of the same OS used on the Kindle Fire and Nook Tablet. Any of those larger tablets would be a good choice if you want a bigger screen than the Fire and Nook have but don't want to spend the big bucks for an iPad. Expect to pay between \$300 and \$450, depending on the size and features.

Many tablets offer the same 3G option as the iPad but the best advice is to skip that unless you are sure you need it. A tablet that can access the cellular network is not only more expensive on the front end, it costs the user \$30 a month or more for a data plan. Wi-fi only tablets don't require a data plan.

Also, you probably should avoid the "no-name" tablets. They may cost a lot less but there's a reason for that. No-name tablets are likely to suffer from poor reliability and build quality, dated or closed operating systems, and/or a lack of

applications that will run on them.

If price is no object, the iPad is still the best of the bunch.

### E-book readers

This was a hot category last year and is likely to be even hotter this year, again thanks to Amazon. It has cut the price on its base Kindle e-reader to \$79, about \$50 less than last year. That model would be the best choice if you want the best deal and are a big reader. The black and white e-ink screen on the Kindle is easier on the eyes over the long haul than color models and is readable even in bright sunlight.

If you want to spend a little more and like the idea of a touch screen, there are two good choices: For \$99, you can get a touch screen version of the Kindle or the competing Barnes & Noble Nook Simple Touch. Barnes & Noble recently

slashed the price of its Nook by \$40 so it can compete head to head with the Kindle. These two readers are very similar so the decision comes down to personal taste. Study each model, including the libraries they can access, and choose the one you like the best. Most color tablets can also be used as e-readers but don't work as well as the dedicated black and white readers, whose e-ink displays most closely mimic the printed page. Still, Barnes & Noble does make a color version of its Nook e-reader and recently cut the price from \$250 to \$199.

### Smartphones

These gadgets are always a popular choice for gift-giving, since almost everyone can use one and new models seem to hit store

shelves on almost a daily basis. Apple's new iPhone 4S is a good choice for Apple fans and newcomers to the smartphone world, since the OS is arguably better than the many Android competitors and the apps are often more capable. And with prices starting around \$199 (with 2 year contract), it won't break the bank. Opt for the older, but almost as capable iPhone 4 if money is tight — it starts at \$99, half the price of the 4S. Or the even older iPhone 3GS, which in some cases, is free with a two-year contract. The iPhone 4 looks almost identical to the 4S but lacks the 4S internal improvements, including a faster processor and better camera.

On the Android front, the choices are more numerous and complicated. Among the newest offerings is the Samsung Galaxy Nexus, due in mid-November and the first to run on the new Android 4 operating system code named Ice Cream Sandwich. This dual-core phone is 4G LTE capable, the fastest data service available, and has a larger screen than the iPhone. Prices have not been set but expect to pay between \$200 and \$300 (with contract) to have this latest and greatest smartphone. Other options include the less popular Windows-based and Blackberry phones. Steer clear of those unless you need any special features they may offer. Apple and Android are now the dominant players in the cell phone marketplace.

For those who don't need the latest technology but still want the convenience of a cell phone, consider a pay-as-you go service like Tracfone. If you don't need a lot of minutes or the most modern smart phone, you can get a year's worth of cell phone service for less than \$9 a month (You also have to buy the phone, which generally costs from \$20 to \$50).

# HDTV's

Prices continue to fall on HDTV's, while the feature-set improves. The sweet spot can be found in the 46-inch to 50-inch models, which are now going for as little as \$500 and are likely to go even lower as the holidays approach. The price of 32-inch models is now routinely below \$300. That could make HDTV's a good choice for gift-giving this year.

The big push this holiday season, however, will be the more expensive models with wired or wireless Internet connectivity, which is usually tied to a feature often called Smart TV. These TVs have built-in apps, similar to the ones found on smartphones. There are lots of different apps but most consumers probably will focus on those that allow for the direct streaming of movies or TV shows, including Hulu, Vudu, Netflix, CinemaNow, Blockbuster and others.

You can also buy standalone boxes from a variety of companies that do much the same thing or Blu-ray players that include the Smart TV feature. In concept, this is a good idea. But the implementation is lacking in my experience. Smart TV features can be slow and clunky, and just don't bring much usefulness to the party unless you don't have cable. They are certainly not worth paying a huge premium for.

Ditto for the other HDTV gimmick that was the hot ticket last year, 3D. It works, but content is limited and you need to buy a special 3D Blu-ray player to watch 3D Blu-ray movies and the glasses you have to wear are a pain. If you can get 3D or smart TV for little or no extra money, go for it. But generally speaking you're better off sticking with a good basic HDTV. Look for a name-brand LCD or plasma model in the size that best fits your budget with 1080p resolution. See **GIFTS, 42**

tion (that's less important on screens less than 40 inches). Picture quality and reliability have improved to the point now where almost all available models are very good. However, if you want a TV with the widest viewing angles, go for a plasma set.

If price is no object, go for the absolutely huge 80-inch LCD HDTV's that are available this year. Cost: about \$5,000.

### GPS

Like nearly every other electronic device, the cost of standalone GPS units has been falling fast in recent years. They start at less than \$100 and you can get a top of the line

model, with voice recognition for around \$300. While the el-cheapo models work, most consumers will be happier with a more advanced model with features like text-to-speech (the names of the roads are spoken), lane-assist (tells you more about the next turn, including the number of turn lanes, which side of the road the exit is on), and Bluetooth (pairs with your Bluetooth phone for hands-free phone calls). Stick with a name brand, like Garmin, Tom-Tom or Magellan and go for at least a 4.3-inch screen. The larger 5-inch screens don't cost a lot more so if you like idea of a bigger screen, go for it. Speech recognition, which allows you to control the device with voice commands, also is a convenient feature but sometimes it is not well implemented. Check online reviews before you buy. Lifetime maps and traffic service are also are desirable features if you plan to keep the GPS unit for more than a year.

### Odds and ends

If you or someone you know suffers from remote control clutter, solve it with a unified remote that allows you control everything with one device. I have tried lots of them but the best I have found is the Harmony One from Logitech. It handles up to 15 devices and all programming is done via the Harmony One Web site, so there are no frustrating multi-number codes to enter. And when you are done, it's easy to start your TV, stereo receiver, cable box, DVD or Blu-ray player and gaming devices with one touch. The customizable LCD touch screen on the Harmony One is activity-based. So to watch TV, you simply choose "Watch TV" and all the correct devices come on with all the right settings. Ditto for "Play Video Games" or Play DVD."

The Harmony One is not cheap —

between \$150 and \$200, and the setup can be challenging. But it can save you a lot of headaches and allow you to shove all those other remote controls into a drawer somewhere. (Harmony also makes less expensive versions starting at around \$30 that can be programmed online.)

Another good inexpensive gift from someone who has an iPod or other music device that supports Bluetooth is a good pair of wireless Bluetooth stereo headphones. Everyone who has ever used earbuds knows the cord that connects the earpieces to the player can be a pain. Bluetooth headphones, which cost between \$30 and \$100, allow you to get rid of the cord, without loss of sound quality. Shop online for the best selection and price since these gadgets are scarce and expensive in area most retail stores.




