## IS IT GAMBLING?

**Supporters of Internet cafés say they are nothing more than a fun place to spend an evening playing games while opponents call them gambling houses and are intent on banning them from the state**

DAYTONA BEACH — On a recent quiet Saturday evening, Charlotte Odegaard is manning the register at her U Lucky Dog Internet café on North Atlantic Avenue and playing a game of Angry Birds on her iPad.

In the small strip mall space that could house a diner or consignment shop, two long rows of computer terminals flash silently, each displaying the colorful graphics of different games of chance. One elderly customer is silently playing keno, or what aficionados refer to as "the other

poker." A sunset view of the beach glows dimly through the open front door.

"This is a relaxing place to meet friends," Ms. Odegaard said. "I don't have any problems with the city and they haven't had any problems with me."

But not everyone likes the plethora of Internet cafés springing up lately. What Ms. Odegaard refers to as a "relaxing place to meet friends," many others refer to as thinly veiled gambling houses intent on skirting the state's anti-gambling laws and bring-

## It was all about the (lack of) money in 2011

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Most of the stories out of Volusia County government in 2011 revolved around money, more specifically, the lack thereof.

### Raised up

The last time Volusia County employees got a pay raise was 2008. In November, the Volusia County Council voted to give most a 3.5 percent pay hike. Council member Joie Alexander, New Smyrna Beach, was alone in voting against the raise.

"The main reason is simply because many I know in the private sector

have had to cut employees or cut hours," she said. "That thought of a raise was laughable to many in the private sector. We'd be tone deaf if we weren't hearing that from the private sector."

In December, the county adopted a local-hiring preference ordinance for vendors and contractors that are local or use local labor. In this case, local was defined as Volusia, Brevard, Lake, Orange, Osceola, Flagler and Seminole counties. Businesses located in those areas get up to a 5-percent preference on bids for county jobs.

Fighting Against Injustice Towards Harmony, an organization of local

## Employment officials 'somewhat' optimistic about 2012

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Four years after the economy took a nose dive, terms such as "economic downturn," "long recession" and "jobless recovery" have become cliché. Whatever it's called, it started with the bursting of the U.S. housing bubble, which many econo-

mists say peaked in December 2007. The effects have dogged the local, national and world economies ever since.

But good news seems to be emerging. According to the U.S. Labor Department, initial claims for unemployment insurance dropped to about 364,000 the week ending Dec. 17. That's the lowest number for initial

claims since April 2008. Florida has, or is poised to, break and stay below 10 percent unemployment, the lowest levels in about two and a half years. That's a two point drop in unemployment from the previous year.

All good news for Volusia? Are jobs coming to town?

Rick Fraser, president of the local Center for Busi-

ness Excellence, said the local economy is likely to keep improving throughout 2012 — maybe.

"I'm getting increasingly optimistic that 2012 will show us continued improvement in not only employment but the economy in general," he said. "I continue to see good trends. (Unemployment) remained stable or dropped

over the last several months. I see reports about improved retail sales and consumer confidence."

But...

"I don't have a crystal ball," Mr. Fraser added. "If there's another world event out of our control that causes the economy to sputter, my predictions are out the

## Begging for food downtown banned

DAYTONA BEACH — Asking for food on Beach Street can now fetch up to two months in jail and a \$500 fine.

At its most recent meeting, the Daytona Beach City Commission added requests for food in the downtown business district to its anti-panhandling ordinances. About a dozen meeting attendees spoke against the restriction. Two spoke for it.

"It's giving the police an extra tool to keep shopping areas open," Todd Null told the commission. "(Beach Street business owners) have been very gracious to the homeless who come by, but there's a very small percentage that are very aggressive, and that's what we're trying to stop."

Lani van Petten spoke for Fighting Against Injustice Toward Harmony, or FAITH, a local organization of churches and faith groups. She said that if the commission passed the ordinance it would be reneging on its purpose and responsibilities.

"We're looking mostly at decriminalizing homelessness as an objective FAITH wants to reach," she said. "This looks to be going in the wrong direction. Our city commission is the one to bring us together to find solutions, not criminalizing homelessness."

The commission unanimously approved the new panhandling restriction. Commissioner Patrick Henry said the vote wasn't about criminalizing home-

# Jay's Hope: Family who lost a son to mental illness starts fund to help others

It was the call parents have nightmares about receiving — the one telling them their child is dead.

Hank and Susan Ashby got that call in 2010. A police detective told them their 25-year-old son, Jay Carter Ashby, had taken his own life.

What does anyone do with

news like that? In the case of the Ashbys, they grieved, learned to cope and then did something to try to prevent other families from going through the heartbreak they were suffering. They set up a fund to help the other "Jays" out there, who just like their son, suffer from mental illness. They call it the Jay's Hope Fund.

Jay had a normal child-

hood, his mother said, complete with fishing, sports, art and music.

"We have wonderful memories of him furiously dribbling a basketball down the court or soccer field," she said. "In high school he enjoyed participating in sports, was in several honors classes, and worked part time. He was a delightful youngster with a big smile

and easy laugh."

But Ms. Ashby said things gradually began to change. She and her husband wrote off some of Jay's behavior to normal teen rebellion, but then began to see mood swings, a gradual withdrawing from his longtime friendships, and paranoia. Later the changes became more pronounced and in his early 20s, Jay was diagnosed with schizoaffective disorder, a severe mental illness that causes elevated and depressed moods and distortions in perception.

Jay kept getting worse — he ignored his appearance and secluded himself. During his early 20s he was seen by numerous counselors and therapists and was in and out of various public and private treatment facilities. But he became less aware of his need for treatment and medication, and as Jay began slipping deeper into mental illness, his parents felt truly alone.

Ms. Ashby said when Jay was able to reach out, he frequently had to wait for help.

"Although well-qualified mental health experts were available in the area," she said, "a long waiting list prevented Jay from getting help when he needed it the most. Jay finally took his life while still on 'the list.'"

The Ashbys are supportive of local agencies such as Stewart-Marchman-Act, the agency that now manages the Jay's Hope Fund, but they



recognize a need for improved services. The Fund was created shortly after Jay's Valentine's Day death to publicize the need to provide better services for those suffering from serious mental illness and to honor the memory of their son by helping others facing similar challenges. They also hope to

bring about a better understanding of mental illness.

"We felt that the funding emphasis should be placed on early intervention and long term follow-up care and not just crisis intervention," Ms. Ashby said. "Ongoing treatment and medication



# Health Dept. offering flu shots

**VOLUSIA COUNTY** — Flu season is coming. If you have not received your flu shot yet, the Volusia County Health Department reminds you it is not too late. The department is offering flu and pneumonia vaccine at all four clinic locations in Daytona Beach, New Smyrna Beach, DeLand, and Deltona.

"With 36,000 people dying annually from flu illnesses nationwide, it is important to get vaccinated and take all preventative measures to protect yourself and your family against influenza," said Health Department Director Dr. Bonnie J. Sorensen. "The flu season is unpredictable, but most of the time seasonal flu peaks in January, February or even later. Get vaccinated now."

Flu vaccines are being offered at all health department clinics Monday thru Friday from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. East Volusia County clinics are located at 1845 Holsonback Drive, Daytona Beach and 7171 W. Canal St., New Smyrna Beach.

The prices are \$25 for a flu shot, \$45 for a high-dose flu zone (65 and over) and \$65 for a pneumonia shot.

The health department accepts Medicare Part B, non-HMO.

Also during the month of December, the health department is offering free flu prevention kits while supplies last. The kits include pocket tissues, hand sanitizer and flu prevention brochures.

### Who should get vaccinated?

•Everyone 6 months of age and older should get a flu

vaccine  
•Vaccination of high risk persons is especially important to decrease their risk of severe flu illness

•People at high risk of serious flu complications include young children, pregnant women, people with chronic health conditions like asthma, diabetes or heart and lung disease and people 65 years and older

•Vaccination also is important for health care workers, and other people who live with or care for high-risk people to keep from spreading flu to high-risk people

•People who care for children younger than 6 months old

window."

Events such as the seemingly escalating European debt crisis.

Jim Cameron, senior vice president of government relations at the Daytona Regional Chamber of Commerce, is feeling moderately hopeful about 2012, too.

"Quote, cautiously optimistic," he said. "We've got potential employers looking at this area. We've got the assets employers are looking for."

The chamber of commerce surveyed local businesses two months ago. About 200 responded.

"For the most part, what

we're hearing from small employers is, 'We're holding our own,'" Mr. Cameron said. "For the most part they're saying, 'We can see that we could hire some people.' I'd say roughly 20 percent of the people we surveyed said they'd be hiring one, two, three people next year."

Mr. Fraser said he's already seeing that trend of incremental hiring.

"(The Center for Business Excellence has) some funding for on-the-job training," he said. "That's where employers, usually small employers, they can contract with us to offset the costs of an employee for the first 60 days. The last two to three months I've signed more of those

contracts with employers than I have for the last two, three years."

Mr. Cameron also noted the steady increase of passengers over the last year at the Daytona Beach International Airport, which he believes is a good barometer of local economic activity. According to airport reports, the number of passengers enplaning and deplaning in 2011 was just over 424,000, compared to almost 381,000 in 2010.

Phil Ehlinger, director of Volusia County's Department of Economic Development, said he believes 2012 will bring moderate economic and employment gains to the area. However, he said two things are slowing growth: lingering effects of the housing crash, and mismatches in jobs and job seekers.

"There are jobs available," he said. "However, some of the folks who are looking for jobs don't have the skills to fill them."

The county's unemployment rate for November was 10.3 percent, slightly higher than the state average. The national unemployment rate was 8.6 percent. In the last year, the state added almost 100,000 jobs. However, that didn't keep pace with population growth.





If fireworks are part of your New Year's celebration plans, here are some tips for staying safe:

- Take precautions: Always keep a hose and a bucket of water nearby in case of emergencies
- Light one at a time: Never light two or more fireworks or sparklers at the same time
- Keep it outside: Only use fireworks and sparklers outdoors on flat, hard surfaces in clear areas and away from houses, buildings and dry grass
- Have adult supervision:

Never allow young children to light or handle fireworks or sparklers. Be aware of the minimum permitted age in your state. Adults should always be present when lighting or handling fireworks or sparklers

- Stay alert: Never mix alcohol or other substances with fireworks or sparklers
- Stay clear: Never hold a lit firework in your hand. Keep as far from them as possible when lighting
- Let sleeping fireworks lie. Never try to relight fireworks or sparklers that do not ignite. Wait 15 to 20 minutes before approaching them, then soak them with water and throw them away

•Protect your pets: Animals are often frightened by the sounds of fireworks. Protect your "best friends" by keeping them indoors, secure and away from the loud, sudden noises

Most importantly, check local and state legislation to identify which products are legal and only purchase those permitted by law. Also, always check the label and instructions on fireworks and sparklers to ensure they come from a reliable, legal and licensed source.

are needed to maintain basic functionality."

The fund is administered through the Stewart-Marchman-Act Foundation with input from the Ashbys as to how the funds will be spent.

"The story is about a family but the issue affects everyone," said Deborah Zeoli, Stewart-Marchman-Act Foundation President. "There is a stigma attached to mental illness which makes the problems worse. We want people to understand what mental illness is, how treatment works, and that people can be fully functional with mental illness."

Chet Bell, Stewart-Marchman-Act CEO, said the money from Jay's Hope Fund stay local.

"Jay's Hope Fund is designated for supportive services to those in our community with severe mental illness," Mr. Bell said. "This population has so many needs — ranging from housing to healthcare — that frequently go unmet. These funds will address part of that need. Hank and Susan have responded to Jay's death and honor his life by donating their time, talent and resources to support persons with severe mental illness."

This year's fundraiser for Jay's Hope Fund took the form of flowers, known as the Jay's Hope Bouquet. Sold at \$50 each, the bouquets, produced by Flamingo Florist and Gifts of Holly Hill, were sold in October (Mental Illness Awareness Month) and delivered Thanksgiving week. A portion of each purchase was donated to the Jay's Hope Fund.

"We have all lost someone loving and dear to us — if we had a chance to save them,

to keep them here with us, we would have done it," said Flamingo Florist manager Debi Miles.

The bouquets were specifically designed to reflect the Ashby family, Ms. Miles said. "The fugi mums that look like a starburst represented Susan and Hank Ashby who burst with faith and hope in their efforts," she said. "The bright colored flowers were for Jay, for the very vibrant young man he was. And we added a single candle that represented hope."

Both the Ashbys and the florist hope to make the fundraiser an annual event.

ing in lucrative returns for café owners from the pockets of their usually working class or retired customers.

The state and many area cities seem intent on doing something about getting rid of them.

Dueling bills in the Florida legislature would either ban or require strict state regulation of businesses like Ms. Odegaard's. Daytona Beach, Port Orange, South Daytona and many other cities have passed moratoriums on new permits for the cafés. Other cities, like Ponce Inlet and Daytona Beach Shores, wasted no time in banning the storefronts outright.

Ms. Odegaard's not going to fret just yet, though.

"They change their minds more than I change my underwear," she said of lawmakers. "Until I see something passed, I'm not getting worried."

## Gambling or not?

Internet cafés, also known as cyber cafés, got their start in the early 1990s, with the advent of the Internet. Back then, most people did not have a home computer and the cafés offered a way for people to browse the Internet and check e-mail and also have a cup of coffee or a meal (hence "café" in the name). Now, because most people have home computers, simply browsing the Internet is no longer the lure, according to opponents.

"It is the simulated gambling that brings people in the door," South Daytona Community Development Director John Dillard said.

The city recently placed a moratorium on new cafés.

The businesses, now also known as Internet sweepstakes cafés or convenience casinos, still sell Internet time, typically through the purchase of phone cards. But that purchase doesn't just get customers Internet time, it earns

them credits toward Vegas-like computerized sweepstakes games.

Customers pay for their time, sit down at an assigned terminal and either surf the Internet or seek cash prizes by playing a game — from poker and slots to roulette and blackjack.

What makes it legal, supporters say, is the games are just a fun way to find out what predetermined sweepstakes amount the customers have won — they don't actually win money because of their great poker hand. There are a predetermined number of winning entries paid out over a finite period.

State Rep. Scott Plakon, R-Longwood, sponsored a House bill that would ban the cafés.

"The café owners say it's not really gambling because the outcome is predetermined, but tell that to the person in the seat," Mr. Plakon said. "They believe they're gambling. Slot machines are known as the most destructive form of gambling. I call it the crack of gambling."

Ms. Odegaard disagrees. She has worked at U Lucky Dog for three years. She and her husband bought the place in September, 2010.

"I don't see any negativity with this," she said. "It's a safe, fun place to hang out and make friends. It's no different than people playing scratch-offs or looking under the cap of a 7-Up can to see if you win something. Some people justify a ban by saying we prey on people, but we don't force anybody to come in here."

She replies to the question of whether it's gambling or not with a joke.

"We don't use the 'G' word here," she said.

But her customers do. At one of a few center terminals, Ina LaPointe of Daytona Beach is catching up on some computerized Keno. Normal-

ly, she goes to another storefront closer to her house, but she uses this one on days she has to drop off her granddaughter at work nearby.

"I like to gamble," she said. "I enjoy it. I work. I pay my bills. So this is my fun."

They could do it online at home, says a 61-year-old woman sitting near Ms. LaPointe, who didn't want to share her name. But, "you can't meet anybody sitting at home on the computer," she said. "And it's cheaper than a shrink."

## What harm?

When many of the local cities have discussed banning Internet cafés, they talk about the "element" they bring with them and how they will be detrimental to the neighborhoods they open in. In a zoning dispute last May, Port Orange Vice-Mayor Dennis Kennedy said he would like to keep them out of the city altogether.

"... Frankly, I think the better areas for these aren't in Port Orange," he said.

The city is currently being sued by Allied Veterans of the World, a company that owns several Internet cafés throughout the state, for what a spokesperson calls "discrimination." The lawsuit, one of several Allied Veterans is involved in throughout the state, is pending.

Though Police Chief Mike Chitwood has publicly stated his desire to keep Internet cafés on a tighter leash, police investigator Jimmy Flint said last week that "we have not had any problems at those Internet cafés. I even talked to the chief, who would know specifically if these places were a problem, and he said, 'No.'"

That's not to say they haven't been a problem for other law enforcement agencies. South Daytona and Port

Orange officials say the Internet cafés in their cities have more than the normal number of police reports filed from their locations.

Many of the state's county sheriff's have asked legislators for a statewide ban, citing the large pots of cash that accumulate in the businesses during an average day. Recently, a three-man armed robbery at one Apopka café ended in one death.

According to a statement from the Seminole County Sheriff's Department, crime increased 14 percent after nine of the businesses sprouted up in that county.

And while law enforcement dislikes the immediate harm of increased crime, gambling support groups say Internet cafés cause indirect harm to those who patronize them.

Brian Kongsvik, the director of the 1-888-ADMIT-IT helpline for the Florida Council on Compulsive Gambling, said more than 1,000 Internet cafés have sprung up around the state in the last half-dozen years.

Two years ago, when the organization started tracking them, 68 callers to the help line cited Internet cafés as their primary addiction. Last year, it was 122. The number is on pace to be higher this year, he said.

"We know there is a significant population that's affected by these establishments," Mr. Kongsvik said. "And it's our opinion, not the state's or anybody else's, that they may very well be attracting a population of people that would not necessarily drive to a des-

tinuation casino to gamble, but now, they're right there on their street."

In defense of the establishments, gaming lobbyists and owners regularly compare the cafés to playing the Monopoly game at McDonald's. Mr. Kongsvik finds this to be misguided.

"Never, in my 22 years of dealing with problem and compulsive gamblers, has anybody called us and told me that they're losing their house, have lost their job, are getting a divorce or are in financial dire straits because of the Monopoly game at McDonald's," he said.

## Future restrictions

State Rep. Plakon said banning the businesses outright as opposed to regulating them is the right thing to do.

"To merely regulate these businesses would create thousands of gambling establishments around the state," Mr. Plakon said. "Wouldn't that be the largest single expansion of gambling in the state?"

Several owners of Internet cafés in the Daytona area refused to comment for this story. Managers running storefronts for the Allied Veterans of the World referred calls to the company's St. Augustine headquarters where a receptionist referred questions to Jacksonville attorney Kelly Mathis.

That call was forwarded to Sarah Bascum, spokeswoman for the Florida Internet Café Coalition, who didn't return several calls for comment.

lessness, but protecting everyone from aggression. He bristled at suggestions members of the commission were unmoved by the plight of the homeless.

"I've been feeding the homeless since I walked out of college," he said.

Mr. Henry said that homelessness does appear to be increasing.

"Let's sit down and have a round table and find some solutions to help the homeless," he said to the commission.

Commissioner Pam Woods said that much is done in Daytona Beach to help the homeless, and that made her comfortable to add the new panhandling restriction.

"There is a place to go and get a hot meal," she said. "You don't have to be down on Beach Street, there are multiple food pantries."

churches and other faith organizations, proposed and backed the local-hiring ordinance. While the organization was happy the ordinance passed, some were exasperated that it'd taken years.

"Old ideas are new again," said Joyce Pearce-Riddell co-chair of the organization's jobs committee, before the council passed the ordinance. "This is what we proposed to the council three years ago: regional preference through the (Center for Business Excellence). We were told, 'Can't do that—can't require people to register with the CBE.'"

## Dial 911 to get Volusia County

This year the county consolidated emergency dispatch services into its care. Since the 1990s, Volusia County has rolled around the idea of handling all emergency calls, but some cities had resisted. As cities faced increasing budget pressures, those that hadn't already let the county handle their 911 calls seemed happy to make the shift. The move added about \$8 million to the county budget, but was estimated to save cities about \$7 million, according to local media estimates.

In recent years, the non-profit Emergency Medical Foundation, better known

as EVAC, had been in triage. In October, the county took over the ambulance service. In the 2010-2011 fiscal year, EVAC received about \$1.5 million from the county. Its budget was just over \$17 million. The projected budget for this fiscal year was about the same. However, EVAC needed a \$4 million subsidy from the county. County manager Jim Dinneen projected that the county could run ambulances for less, because it has social-services options the service didn't. "I'm going to try to reduce the services of EVAC where other services better fit what (callers) need," Mr. Dinneen told the council. "We need to cut down on people calling us frivolously, as a taxi service. We're talking about having a social services part of this."

those 61,630 students can wear nothing on the head while on campus, except with administrator permission for medical, religious, or school-activity reasons. That includes hats, visors, hoods, bandanas, and sunglasses.

Shirts must overlap belt lines, and those that hang to mid-thigh must be tucked in. Tops must cover the chest shoulder to shoulder. Shorts, skirts and dresses must cover to at least mid-thigh. Pants and shorts must completely cover undergarments and the buttocks. Cleats, slippers and shoes with wheels are banned.

Additionally, under the policy, banned are clothing, jewelry and accessories that convey "messages that are: crude, vulgar/profane, violent/death-oriented, gang related, sexually suggestive, promote alcohol, drugs or tobacco, or promote illegal activities or products."

In January, the Volusia County School Board will evaluate compliance and results of the new policy.

"It's pretty much been stated in open meetings that if we don't see compliance, we can change it, up to and including uniforms," said school board member Stan Schmidt. "That's sort of the ultimate. It's now up to the students where we go with this. You can express your individuality. You're just not going to show your butt, or whatever."

Additionally, students at Volusia's schools are now under a new policy aimed at preventing dating violence on campuses. The school board adopted the state-mandated policy despite misgivings among its members. Before the policy's adoption, new school board co-chair Judy Conte said that the district already had policies against bullying, intimidation and violence. Now, she said, school administrators will have to do something many teenagers struggle with — figuring out what their romantic status is.

"Define dating," Ms. Conte said in an interview. "It puts principals in a position of having to define if Suzy and Tommy are dating or just hang out."

## Divvy it up

Reapportionment didn't go smooth this decade. In a break with tradition, the Volusia County School Board and The county council split ways over redistricting. Normally the two adopt the same political maps. Then, the county went past its Sept. 15 deadline for approving a decennial reapportionment plan. DeBary residents, upset over their town being divided between county council districts, filed suit. The suit was later dismissed and the new maps have been approved.

## Schools still struggle

The Volusia County Schools look a little different this year. Student enrollment had been decreasing since the 2007-2008 school year. That decline likely stabilized this school year, and the remaining students are dressed a little more conservatively.

According to the district's annual 20-day count, Volusia has just more than 61,630 students among its 69 schools, about 50 fewer than last year. However, the district anticipated having about 500 fewer students than last school year. In May 2007, just over 64,000 students attended Volusia's public schools.

# Apply these useful apps to your phone or tablet

If you own a smart phone or a tablet computer, you know it's all about the apps.

Applications, or apps, are little programs that take information from regular websites and reformat them into a form you can actually read on smaller screens.

They first appeared with the first iPhones, probably as an afterthought. But if most people are honest, they will admit the apps are at least as important as the phone itself — and in many cases are far more useful.

The problem is, there are tens of thousands of these things. And that can make it very hard to sort the good from the bad. Of course, usefulness varies with the individual, since many apps are highly specialized. But there are some apps that are universal — useful to virtually everyone.

In this week's column, I'm going to run down those I think almost everyone with a smart phone or tablet should download. Even better, every one of them is free and available for both Apple and Android ecosystems.

Let's start with Yelp, one of dozens of apps designed to help you find a restaurant, business, service — or simply something to do — no matter where you are in the United States. The great thing about the app is that it ties into your phone's (or tablet's) ability to determine its location. So when you launch Yelp, it immediately knows where you are and tells you the closest anything you need, be it restaurant, theater, nightclub, shopping center, etc. This is especially useful when you are traveling and unfamiliar with the area you may be in at the time.

To make it even more useful, there are user reviews attached to most businesses to give you an idea of what to expect. Sometimes you have to take these reviews with a grain of salt, but over time, you learn to cull out the chronic complainers and the planted reviews (from

business owners and friends) that gush about how wonderful everything is. What's left can help you decide if the business deserves your business.

Yelp also provides maps to help you find your way once you have decided where it is you want to go.

Another great app to have while traveling is Gas Buddy. This handy little program is pretty no nonsense and can quickly tell you where to find to the closest cheapest gas, no matter where you are. (Prices are reported regularly by a small army of users.) You have the option of sorting by closest station or lowest price but all the stations shown are going to be close to your current location.

To get even more bang from Gas Buddy, consider going to the regular website using a full size PC before leaving on your trip. A handy "heat map" allows you to see gas prices across the entire United States in a glance. It's color coded so you can quickly zoom in on the location along your journey with the lowest gas prices and plan stops there ahead of time.

Want to keep up on the latest news? There are lots of apps to choose from but USA Today is arguably the best. No annoying pay walls or registration requirements here. It's all free and perhaps the easiest to navigate among the myriad of news sites. There is not a lot of depth here and the focus is national by design. But most folks are in a hurry these days and this is quick way to keep up with what's happening. Unlike the print edition, it is updated constantly so you can keep up with breaking news as well. And if you have a tablet, USA Today's tablet edition is first-rate — reformatted to take advantage of bigger screens.

It seems almost everyone has investments these days and there's no better way to keep up with the roller coaster markets than the excellent CNBC app.

Although it's available for both Apple and Android platforms, the Apple version is vastly superior for some reason. In my opinion, this is perhaps the best designed app I have ever seen for the iPhone. Every screen provides multiple options for accessing more information, through hot links, tabs, screen scrolls and sliding menus. It's a remarkably well thought-out design.

You can easily keep tabs on US and foreign markets in real time (no 15 minute delays here), as well as the status of your own stocks and even do research on stocks you may want to own. Better yet, you can create a portfolio or all your stocks, mutual funds and ETFs and quickly check on them at a glance throughout the day.

There's also news and video from the CNBC financial channel, constantly updated throughout the day.

Much of the functionality of the iPhone version of the app has been left out of the Android version but you still get a quick overview of the markets on Android and can create your own portfolio.

Finally, I had to choose a game. And no surprise here, I'm going with the wildly popular Angry Birds. There are many incarnations of this game and you have to pay for the ones with advanced levels. But the free versions provide plenty of fun too.

The premise here is pretty odd: Birds become slingshot ammo in an assault against pigs in fortresses made up of blocks of wood, ice, stone and other materials. Take them all out with the limited bird ammo at hand and you move to the next level. It's whimsical and funny and suitable for all ages.

The fact that the developers of these game are now mega-millionaires should give you an idea of how addictive this game can be. Check it out.

# A big old snook took me and the peanut on a wild ride

I took my kayak down to Sleepy Hollow Park, which lies between Port Orange and New Smyrna Beach. If you go looking for it, watch the east side of U.S. 1 just south of the three bridges of Spruce Creek.

When I slid the Green Peanut in, the water was slick with the wind mercifully calm. The tide was just at the end of its incoming phase.

My goal was to replay the spot where I had so much fun on my very first trip in the Peanut a little over a year ago. On that outing, I had gotten into the big reds. I could only hope for the same success.

As I pushed back through the mangroves, I could see bait moving all about. That's

always a good sign; the big fish always follow the bait.

As I began moving tighter and tighter into the brush, I could see fish feeding hard. Right where a big oyster bar connected to the mangroves on the shore, a very large predator exploded on a school of finger mullet. The little silver fish shot into the air in every direction, mimicking a New Year's Eve skyrocket.

Oh man! That sent my

blood pumping. Throwing my red and white Mirro Lure, I made a pretty good cast, but I had guessed wrong. I had thrown the plug about 15 feet from where the explosion had occurred thinking the fish had moved in that direction.

Nothing.

On my next cast, the bait splashed down right where the action had first happened. I didn't even have time to give it a twitch. The plug disappeared and the line sizzled off at a right angle to the cast.

My foe made a long run. A very long run. Snook! Not just any snook but a big one. It's times like this when I anguish over my stubborn persistence of fishing 10 pound mono without a leader.

The big fish was pulling hard and sharp. Oysters were everywhere. When it turned out to deeper water and away from the shells, I felt better but still wondered if the damage to the sheer line had already been done. Just then the big female tried to jump but was so fat she could only get about halfway out of the water.

Now I was having fun.

Back and forth the snook raced trying desperately to throw the treble hooks. As snook will do, when the fight was finally over, she lay up quietly alongside the kayak as I used my grippers to hold her head.

I was at least 100 feet from where I had made the

hookup. I ran the tape measure down her length and found that the fish was 30 inches and more if you were to pinch the tail. I released her without boating her for both of our safety. Those sharp gill plates can do a lot of damage.

As I watched her swim away, I tried to remember the last big snook I caught. It was certainly before the cold winter of 2009. Now with the sun beginning to peak up, I could see fish feeding all around. I made about a dozen more casts before another snook took the bait. This time it was a 20-incher and much more manageable. I had a few more hits but caught no more. By 8 a.m. they stopped biting and feeding altogether.

Boy, it was a long time since I had such snook fun. I took it as a good sign for our fishing future.

Snook season is closed right now, but let's release them all anyway and give them a chance to recover. Here in Volusia County, we are on their northern range, and it will take a few good, warm winters in a row for us to get them back. If that happens, there will be fun times ahead for all.


