Attention job seekers

Skate park to get big expansion

ORMOND BEACH — Skaters at Nova Community Park will get more room for air, Ollies, Caballerials and nosegrinds once a proposed expansion of the skate park is complete.

"We don't have the dates down yet," Ormond Beach spokeswoman Loretta Moio said. "We still have the design to do. We're planning on having it completed by 2013, by the

end of that year."

The Volusia County Council recently awarded the city a \$225,000 ECHO grant toward the proposed expansion. ECHO, or Ecological, Cultural, Heritage, Outdoors, is a program created by the county to help cities and not-for-profit organizations provide public recreational opportunities.

The skate park expansion will cost about \$450,000. The city will use capital-improvement funds in addition to the grant.

Former Ormond Beach commissioner and mayor, Carl Persis — who took a county council seat in 2005 — said he's happy to see the skate park expanding.

"I was thrilled about that," he said. "I was a commissioner, maybe mayor, when that park opened. I pushed for that,

Another world

Thousands visit this tiny town for its metaphysical and spiritual traditions

Editor's note: This is the second story in a three part series about Cassadaga's past, present and future.

Cassadaga is a quaint town — Old Florida. Most of the houses date to the early- to mid-20th century. The roads are narrow — they were laid out for horses, not cars. With no fast food, convenience stores, or other signs of the 21st century, Cassadaga could be as quiet a little town there ever was.

Except for the tens of thousands of visitors who flock there every year. They walk on a metaphysics fault line probably most never notice. Some are seeking alternative healers, such as Reiki practitioners who claim attunement to direct universal life energy that promotes health. Others are seeking metaphysical classes to expand their psychic horizons. But most probably go for the multitude of psychic and medium readers.

Officials: 'Hogs on the Hill' cost money, but paid off

HOLLY HILL — Every year during Bike Week, Holly Hill officials watched as the throngs of bikers rode past. The Harleys rattled businesses' windows, but the riders weren't stopping to walk in the doors. To the south, Daytona Beach was the bikers' destination. To the north, Ormond Beach. Holly Hill was just a couple of miles they rode through to get to those places.

"They were just driving through Holly Hill. We

really didn't capture a lot of that business," city manager Jim McCroskey said. "The commission told me to go out there and capture all the money I could from Bike Week."

So, this year Holly Hill rolled out its premier "Hogs on the Hill," complete with a vintage bike show, barbeque galore, vendors, a parade, and Jimmie Van Zant rocking alongside Molly Hatchet.

But unlike the Molly Hatchet song says, the wine is never free in "Gator Country." Someone always pays for the party. In this case, a lot of the tab

was picked up by the city's Community Redevelopment Agency.

"We're bringing them in, and we had to spend a little money," Mayor Roy Johnson said. "It's a learning thing. We're finding out what we did right and what we did wrong."

Mr. McCroskey said the city spent about \$40,000 from its CRA fund, but recouped much of that, and was left with assets to boot. It's impossible to count the number of bikers who hit Hogs on the Hill over its six days.

Local student wins social studies fair — again

DAYTONA BEACH — Sananda Muhammad is a regular at Social Studies Fairs.

The Campbell Middle school seventh grader once again won this year's Volusia County Social Studies Fair a few weeks ago.

Muhammad, 14, placed first in an individual category for his project: "The Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade: Amistad and the 13th Amendment."

It's the third time that Sananda has won first place at the County Social Studies Fair. He also won back in the fourth grade when he was at Horizon Elementary School in Port Orange and last year as a seventh grader when he attended Silver Sands Middle School in Port Orange.

Sananda credits plain old hard work for his success.

"I go through the process of what is needed for the project to be suc-

cessful," he said. "I study hard and work hard. I put in the time and effort that is needed."

Winning this year had a different feel than in previous years, Sananda said.

"There were a lot of old and new faces there supporting me," he said. "I had friends from both Campbell and Silver Sands there."

Tough and controversial subjects for his projects have been the norm for Sananda. Each year, he chooses his topics for specific reasons. Last year, his project was entitled "Segregation: Debated and Changed the Little Rock 9." It grew out of bullying and racism he said he had experienced at school.

"This year, I watched the movie 'Amistad' and I wanted to know more about it," he said. "I picked it out of a collection of books and movies and chose it for my project."

This year's project, "The Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade: Amistad and 13th Amendment," was broken down





Beware of 'fishy' stories about fish

Recently I spoke at the Ormond Beach Public Library before a lively crowd of 70 to 80 people. My topic was fishing and as usual, when I was done my audience had several questions for me. When I was asked if I actually eat the fish from the "nasty" Halifax River I was ready, for that is the query I field most often.

Of course, the answer is yes and I explained that over the years I have raised my family on seafood taken from local inshore waters. I told my interrogator that when my children were young I had operated a 50-gallon saltwater aquarium for their pleasure but it was in reality a great live bait container. As I netted my shrimp and mullet, the by-catch would be an assortment of all of the juvenile critters that can be found locally. My aquarium had stingrays the size of a half-dollar and acrobatic mantis shrimp as well as various tiny crabs and such.

But the most important occupants of my fish tank were the baby snook and sea trout. Both of those were so very fragile that if I allowed the PH of the water to get slightly off they would die. I used the trout and snook as my "test strips" for the aquarium. After that I always believed that if those two fish are thriving in the rivers, the water must be healthy. Of course, that is not scientific, but it works for me.

The person who had asked the question then said that the Halifax water seemed too brown and dirty. At times that is true, but brown does not neces-



sarily mean polluted. That color comes from the tannic acid in the many oak leaves that wind up in the river. Right now the Halifax River water is very clear and green. Most people never see that because they are not out before the boat traffic begins churning up the water.

It is a fact that all of the local seafood markets sell fish caught in our brackish inshore waters and well they should. The rest of the world is suffering through a severe fish shortage but we have an abundance right at our doorstep. Some of our more environmentally conscious citizens will only eat farm-raised fish. That is a noble and well-intentioned act but it is probably not as good for the planet as they might believe.

The most popular farm-raised fish is salmon. In order to feed them, the

oceans are being raped of billions of important small baitfish. It takes around five pounds of fish meal to grow one pound of farm-raised salmon. Removal of all of those baitfish is interrupting the marine food chain. Right now, no one knows what the long lasting effects will be, but we know it is not good. The salmon are raised in big net cages that contain thousands of fish. The concentration of excrement they produce is left to be washed away by the tide. That proves toxic to the surrounding waters and the resulting algae blooms can effect waters for miles.

A slightly better choice of farm raised fish would be tilapia or cat fish. Both of those will eat food derived from plants, though the pollution is much the same. Another disturbing fact about farm raised fish is that it is not as healthy for

you as the wild variety. Farm-raised fish are more fatty and contain more chemicals. If you buy salmon at the market, you will find that the fish labeled wild Pacific salmon cost more. Fact is that much of the fish you purchase with the wild label is farm-raised. Not only that, it turns out it is not from the Pacific either. Pacific salmon die after spawning while the less preferred Atlantic salmon can spawn repeatedly. Which would you chose to raise?

When you buy salmon, ask questions. If the vendor does not have the answers go elsewhere. When you buy fresh fish it should never smell fishy. If it is in filet form push it with your fingertip. If it bounces right back it is good. If the dent you made remains, pass on it. Most fish we buy have been frozen. That is fine as long as it has not been thawed for too long. Ask how long it has been in the case and if you are not satisfied, ask for fish from the freezer that has remained frozen.

Never buy fish that has been thawed and refreeze it. When you buy fish be sure that you are ready to use it as soon as possible. If you buy fish whole make sure it has been handled properly. The eyes should be clear and the smell should be mild. My wife Lana has cooked more fish than most people on the planet and she tells me that on occasion she will leave the filets in the refrigerator for three or four days before cooking them. Although that is a long time for us that fish always turns out to be much fresher tasting than anything you can buy at the market.

As it stands right now our inshore fish are great to eat. As for the future, well, let's just keep our fingers crossed.

Ormond to accept household hazardous waste

ORMOND BEACH — Volusia County will host its annual household hazardous waste collection event from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. March 30 in the parking lot at the Ormond Beach Public Works Department, 501 N. Orchard St.

Only household hazardous waste will be accepted. No businesses. Residents may bring the following items for free disposal: solvents, pesticides, up to 10 fluorescent lamps, auto batteries, motor oil, other household chemicals, household batteries, gasoline, pool chemicals and old paint.

Do not mix chemicals. Label if possible. Insulin users may drop off used needles in approved containers for proper disposal. Containers will not be returned or replaced. Volusia County residents may bring their household hazardous waste to the Tomoka Landfill in Daytona

Beach or the West Volusia Transfer Station in DeLand year-round for free disposal or exchange and the Swap Shop during normal operating hours.

"I have \$525,000 in my budget to help businesses," he said. "Is Hogs on the Hill worth 10 percent of it? I think yes."

Local business owner Mark Madden said he didn't notice any difference in his Bike Week sales. He owns Ace Hardware at 261 N. Ridgewood Ave.

"Business is just as good with or without Hogs on the Hill," he said. "Business was status quo."

He added that in following years it seems likely Hogs on the Hill will grow among an important consumer base.

"I also heard comments that they were pleased that it stayed a family-friendly event," he said.

The city spent about \$14,000 on T-shirts, promotional water bottles, advertising and renting a large tent for the Holly Hill Historic Preservation Society to host the vintage bike show.

The T-shirts and water bottles were sold at the event. The city recouped its investment in those, and overages went to benefit the Holly Hill Police Explorers and Holly Hill Chamber of Commerce.

The city rented a seven-acre empty lot for the event—327 Ridgewood Ave. They then rented small spots to vendors to set up booths to sell wares or food and drink.

"So our local businesses had a shot to come out and get some money from the guys going through Holly Hill," Mr. McCroskey said. That cost \$1,000. "We turned around and rented it out for \$1,000, so the cost was neutral."

Additionally, the city had to put money into preparing and dressing the site.

"The site cost me about \$26,000," Mr. McCroskey

said. "But, we'll be able to use \$6,000 of it at public works."

Mr. McCroskey explained that the city purchased equipment for Hogs on the Hill that will be used elsewhere.

"We went out and bought a \$6,000 generator to have electricity at the sight," he said. "But, it'll be used at our (water and sewer) lift stations. In an emergency it'll be used to power our lift stations."

The event attracted 23 local vendors, according to Mr. McCroskey — more than expected.

A portion of taxes paid into Holly Hill's community redevelopment area are placed in a trust fund to be spent in that zone only. Those funds can be used for redevelopment projects, including special events, that enhance the value of the area.

Members of the Holly Hill City Commission, who are also the Community Redevelopment Agency Board, said Hogs on the Hill was a success, and worth the price tag.

"I think it is," commissioner Donnie Moore said. "When you consider the amount of traffic down there and spending money with local vendors. The local businesses say they're having a better year than ever."

County relies on the kindness of strangers

Much like Blanche DuBois, Volusia County has always depended on the kindness of strangers. Whether it's visitors, such as the recently departed bikers, or employers in other counties, Volusia's economy would be decrepit without the help.

The most recent employment report from the state shows Volusia employers had only 900 more workers in January than in January 2011. But there were about 4,000 more county residents employed in January than in the year before. That means more than 3,000 workers found jobs outside the county. Of course, these are all estimates, but it definitely means the roadways will continue to be jammed with the morning and evening commute.

Speaking of jammed roadways, if the number of bikes in the area streets were any indication, Bike Week was on an upswing this year. While specific numbers to gauge it won't be available for awhile, it will be surprising if the end-of-winter biker rally didn't help add more to the area's economy than in the past two or three years.

But the picture still isn't pretty for area economic

developers, who obviously have a lot of work to do to allow more residents to stay in Volusia for good jobs. In the end, the Streetcar Named Desire didn't take Blanche where most of us would want to go.

Despite the painfully slow-growing area economy, commercial investment continues. Ormond Beach real estate investor Mark Venables paid \$1.255 million for the retail center at Pelican Drive and U.S. 1 in Edgewater. The strip center is mostly full and Edgewater could see some more commercial development in the near future.

Orlando's assault on the image of Daytona Beach is still going strong. Orlando-hotels.org was thoughtful enough to report that rates were way up along the beach, way too pricy for

Spring Breakers, who should go to Orlando instead, I guess. The report failed to note the rates most likely were higher because it was Bike Week.

At least one area manufacturer is going strong. Sparton Corp. got another \$13 million from the U.S. Navy for its ERAPSCO joint venture to build sonobuoys. About 47 percent of the work will be done at Sparton's plant in DeLeon Springs. According to the Employ Florida Marketplace, the plant is hiring.

Race fans apparently flew into Daytona Beach International Airport in greater numbers. Traffic through the county airport was up 15 percent in February with more than 50,000 people traveling through there.

With Port Orange the county's bright spot when it comes to commercial development, The Pavilion at Port Orange still isn't going upscale. It's next

building will be for a Dollar Tree store next to the new Party City.

The city of Daytona Beach is hoping to help facilitate local hiring, hosting a job fair from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Thursday, March 29, at Volusia Mall. Offsetting any good economic news is the rapidly rising price of gasoline. The average price hit about \$2.86 early this week and the increase shows no signs of stopping until it tops \$4. So far, it doesn't seem to have slowed down travel too much, but you have to think that fewer families will be day-tripping to the beach.





Gaff's Meats has new owners, new name, same quality

ORMOND BEACH — The name is familiar: Gaff's. So is the location: 663 S. Nova Road, Ormond Beach. What isn't familiar (not yet, anyway) is the new ownership.

For the past 30 years, this quiet roadside market and deli has been a mainstay for discerning shoppers. And it still is. Though there have been some alterations over time, the shop looks relatively the same as it always has. But just recently there was a major change — a change in name.

As soon as a new sign goes up, the former "Gaff's Quality Meat" in Ormond Beach will officially become "People's Premium Meats." In fact, newspaper advertisements already reflect the change in name.

The new owners are Renaldo and Regina Martins. A native of Brazil, Mr. Martins emigrated to the U.S. in 1966

to join his family in Massachusetts. There, he opened a small fried chicken outlet, then later expanded it to include a delicatessen. After selling the business, he returned to Brazil and opened a health club. Upon returning to the States, specifically to this area, Mr. Martins and his wife saw an opportunity to re-engage in the food business. With their collective expertise, the couple has put their energy and enthusiasm into the current operation.

In the two months since the Martins took over, changes have taken place, and more are in the wings. To begin, they've lowered the prices. Indeed, their motto "We are the price pleasers," is proudly displayed on the marquee. It is also reflected in the products they carry. Deli meats, such as boiled ham and turkey breast, out-compete supermarket prices by a significant margin. The meat case itself stretches the entire length of the back wall, dis-

playing an ample variety of choices. Included are cheeses, chicken, pork and beef, plus ready-to-go entrees such as shish-kabob and chicken florentine. There are also several prepared foods available, including homemade meatballs and lasagna, twice-baked potatoes and more.

For sausage aficionados, look no further than People's Premium Meats. Starting with their own recipe for smoked sausage, the impressive selection includes some non-traditional varieties, such as buffalo chicken (a big seller), plus traditional Italian and bratwurst. In all, there are 10 different sausages to choose from, each of them freshly made on premises.

But People's Premium Meats is not just about meats. The shop also has a complete line of fresh salads and sandwiches. The homemade chicken salad is by far the most popular salad, while roast beef is a favorite among sandwiches. As one customer stated while sitting at an indoor table, "This is the best roast beef sandwich in town!" The shop also offers weekly specials (advertised in local papers) and daily in-store specials.

On hand are baskets of fresh fruits and vegetables: Tomatoes, peppers, potatoes, onions and garlic are just a few. The shop also carries hard-to-find vintage wines, a selection of dessert items and cold beverages. In addition,

the front shelves are stocked with essentials such as marinades, sauces, spices, pasta products, soups, and a host of other ingredients for most any recipe. There are also a handful of Brazilian products, including Yoki flour, seasoner, guava paste, plus the Brazilian equivalent to Coca-Cola — Guarana.

Among the services PPM's offers is catering. The business can accommodate parties of up to 100 people. It also offers free delivery for parties of 25 or more.

One of the more obvious aspects of the business is the outdoor barbecue pit, otherwise known as "Gaff's Famous Fabulous BBQ." Located on the north side of the main building, the BBQ pit has been a big draw. For a small price, passers-by can get a quick meal or take-out. Several wooden picnic tables allow convenient seating for "dine-out" customers. The menu boasts everything from

BBQ ribs and brisket, to chicken wings and half-pound burgers, to "feasts and platters." The BBQ pit is open Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays from 11 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Mr. Martins has big plans for his new venture. He looks to expand the interior so as to add more products, also to enlarge the outside seating capacity. In the meantime, he is getting to know his customers. But his greatest goal, along with his dedicated crew of eight, is to serve his customers' needs.

"We have to build a relationship of trust and consistency," he said. "Our focus is on good quality products and service."

Family takes produce from farm to front porch

DAYTONA BEACH — The milkman may be nowhere to be seen, but the produce man — or women — is right around the corner.

Starting in August 2010, father Jan Pittard of Ormond Beach and his daughter Nicole Pittard-Lebron, of Jacksonville Beach, have been building a web of customers across Volusia County who want fresh, local fruits and vegetables delivered to their doorsteps.

Called Front Porch Pickings, the business has grown from about a dozen weekly deliveries to nearly 300.

"We thought when we got into this that we would be

gravitating toward older people who don't want to get out," said Mr. Pittard, 62, who also runs the marketing firm International Profile Data. "But we've got a lot of families too that are trying to get their children to eat healthy and they just don't have the time to get out and look for the good stuff. They depend on us for that."

The father and daughter team spend the beginning of each week sourcing local produce at area farms and farmers markets. Then they meet on Thursdays at a double storage unit off Jimmy Ann Drive, complete with a walk-in cooler, to pack solar-shielded bags with their bounty.

It started with the borrow-

ing of an idea. With a degree in environmental engineering from the University of Florida, Ms. Pittard-Lebron, 35, found herself laid off from her job in land development after the housing bubble burst. With two young children, she was looking for a job that would fit around her family obligations. She had been a customer of a produce delivery business in Jacksonville for about three years. One day, she called her father and asked if he wanted to get one started in Volusia County.

"I said, 'Dad, you've got nothing going on right?'" Ms. Pittard-Lebron recalled.

He laughed. "Oh, yeah, nothing going on. But I said, 'Let's give it a shot,'" he said.

For a baseline price of \$20, customers get five types of vegetables and three types of fruits, along with suggested recipes for what's included and a bio or two about the farmers who grew their food.

One recent week, that meant red lettuce, cabbage, potatoes, carrots and sweet onions, as well as a pineapple, strawberries and tangerines. For two weeks' worth, customers pay \$36.

Customers can get a small or large mix of certified and uncertified organic produce (\$26 or \$47), and also bags that contain only certified organic products (\$30 or \$53).

"We always go local and organic first," Ms. Pittard-Lebron said, "but sometimes you just can't get it. Some farmers are certified organic while others aren't certified, but we do make sure they use sustainable practices."

Using local farmers, Mr. Pittard-Lebron added, helps customers reduce their carbon footprints. According to the Center for Urban Education About Sustainable Agriculture in San Francisco, most produce consumed in the United States has traveled an average of 1,500 miles from soil to dining room.

"This is coming right out of the ground a day or two before you eat it," Mr. Pittard said. "It's not gassed or colored or genetically altered."

Customers can call or e-mail ahead to swap out certain produce items for others, as long as they make arrangements before deliveries are made on Thursdays and Fridays.

Operations have been confined to the northeastern coastal regions of the county until recently, when the business expanded west to DeLand and south to New Smyrna Beach.

Julio Medina, an employee who's helped the Pittards organize the effort from the beginning, said it's an honor to work somewhere with such a viable mission.

"This is a great amenity,"

he said, just before heading out on a Daytona Beach/Port Orange run. "Some people are so appreciative. This one lady, she's last on my route, and she asked me in to have some French onion soup. I said, 'I can't eat that. Those aren't my vegetables.' And she said, 'Of course they're yours, you dumb boy.'"

The soup was delicious, he said.

Matt Schrage, a professor of integrative health science at Stetson University, said the Pittards are benefiting not only their customers by making it more convenient to eat healthier food, but also the environment — by rewarding and promoting sustainable, organic practices at local farms.

"It's ideal if you can go directly to the farmer, but today's busy lifestyle makes it difficult for some people to do that consistently," he said. "So if you can provide a service that's streamlining that and cutting down on the cost, it's helping (customers) overcome that obstacle. The more people who can be brought into the mindset of eating locally grown organic food, the better."

On a recent morning delivery, Ms. Pittard-Lebron was reminded of how her busi-

to get us a park in Ormond Beach. It was such a hit."

Robert Carolin, the city's leisure services director, said the skate park is about 12,000 square feet, and was opened in 1999, the year Mr. Persis became mayor. The expansion will double its size, and add areas for beginning and younger riders, and for more advance ones.

"We're in the middle of the road now," he said.

When the park is expanded, the city will have someone monitor the park from opening to closing. The cost will be offset by snack and soda sales.

"Part of the expansion is to give the kids a place to

sit down and get refreshments," Mr. Carolin said.

The skate facility is open from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. daily. It was refurbished a couple years ago and attracts an estimated 1,400 users a month. Mr. Carolin said the park attracts skaters from all over Central Florida. It's occasionally used for skating competitions and festivals. He predicts after the expansion it'll become more popular to event organizers.

Mr. Persis said skate parks quickly expanded throughout Florida shortly after Ormond Beach built its facility.

F.A.I.T.H. needed to address reading problems, homelessness

Fighting Against Injustice Toward Harmony, or F.A.I.T.H., is on another mission and this time they hope "to do justice" for the children attending Volusia County Schools and help the homeless in the area.

F.A.I.T.H. will host its annual action assembly on March 26 at 6:30 p.m. at the First Baptist Church of

Daytona Beach, 118 N. Palmetto Ave.

Terre Tumminello, a member of F.A.I.T.H. and of Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church, said their goal is to get 2,000 people to turn out for the action assembly.

"We do justice because we already know that we are our brother's keeper and we know that we are the voice of those whose voices are too weak to be

heard," Ms. Tumminello said. "We know that without the F.A.I.T.H. Organization nothing will be better and unless we are working to correct the injustices in our community that we see every day, nothing will change but the date."

The F.A.I.T.H. Organization is comprised of 30 religious congregations in Volusia County. For the past 11 years, it has mobilized large numbers of people around issues including the clean-up of countless drug hot-spots, the re-establishment of a drug treatment program in the county jail and helping to pass a local hiring ordinance at the county level to help local employers and employees.

The plight of the area's homeless is one of two issues they will bring before members of the Volusia County Council who have been invited to attend the action assembly.

"Any thought that we are separate from our brothers and sisters in our streets, or any place in the world, is only an illusion," Ms. Tumminello said.

According to a press release provided by F.A.I.T.H., in Volusia Coun-

ty, homelessness has increased by over 60 percent in the last five years and there are more than 2,000 homeless children in Volusia County schools.

F.A.I.T.H. hopes to bring to Volusia County a Homeless Trust similar to one that is operating in Dade County.

The Trust has a dedicated funding source that is sustainable. The Trust attracts additional money from state and federal initiatives. For every dollar that the Trust takes in locally, Miami-Dade County has received \$5 from U.S. Housing and Urban Development.

All of the funding supports Miami-Dade County's existing 10-year plan to end homelessness.

The Trust is funded by a luxury tax (also called a "local option food and beverage tax") as stated in Florida Statue Title XIV-212. Customers of businesses that gross over \$400,000 a year and sell alcohol will pay a 1 percent tax on their bill that will go directly to this trust for the use of programs that prevent homelessness and move people out of homelessness.

F.A.I.T.H. will host its annual Action Assembly on March 26 at 6:30 p.m. at the First Baptist Church of Daytona Beach, 118 N. Palmetto Ave.

JoAnn Schafer of Ormond Beach is a F.A.I.T.H. Volunteer.

"We must protect our most precious resource, our children," Ms. Schafer said.

F.A.I.T.H. also has been working with Volusia County Schools to come up with ideas to help improve the reading of area students.

The Action Assembly will be asking Volusia County School Superintendent Margaret Smith to work with F.A.I.T.H. to improve reading scores.

Jessica Robillard Cacho, another F.A.I.T.H. spokesperson said that

in 2011, 26 percent of third graders (1,167 students) in Volusia County were reading below grade level. Nearly one fourth of those students come from seven out of 49 schools.

By the time children reach high school, 47 percent of them are reading

below grade level. That means that in 2011, 2,205 out of 4,691 eighth graders were not reading at grade level, Ms. Cacho said.

The number of students that qualify for free and reduced lunch has increased by 10 percent in the last year. In 2011, 67 percent of students in the district qualify for free and reduced lunch.

Superintendent Smith will be asked "to work with F.A.I.T.H. to move quickly about making the necessary changes we think will benefit our children and families," Ms. Cacho said.

"It will take further research to find a curriculum that directly meets the needs of the majority of our students and can accelerate the learning of each of our students."

"I just loved it from the second I came the first time," said frequent visitor Denise Williams of Satellite Beach. "There's an energy about the place. There's a different feeling — a different feeling than anywhere else."

And, yes, she visits the readers when in Cassadaga.

A lot of people went into making Cassadaga Florida's metaphysical Mecca. Of course, there's George Colby, the Spiritualist trance medium who believers say followed spirit guides from New York to found the Southern Cassadaga Spiritualist Camp. It occupies 55 acres, or about half, of the town. Mr. Colby arrived in Volusia during the 1870s.

About a century later, in 1970, the late Ernie Sekunna followed his spirit guides to the town and opened the Universal Centre of Cassadaga, now Brigid's Well and

owned by his son, Matthew Sekunna.

"(Cassadaga) used to be more about the Spiritualism itself," Mr. Sekunna said. "When my father opened this store, it opened up more of the psychic sciences here. He was the first one with tarot cards, palm readers, and other forms of metaphysics, not just dogmatic Spiritualism."

Spiritualist mediums eschew psychic devices such as tarot cards for doing readings. They're typically not interested in forecasting people's futures, but rather in facilitating contact between physical and spiritual beings.

County Road 4139, Cassadaga Road, is essentially the dividing line between the two approaches to metaphysical readings. In addition to Brigid's Well, there are five other places on Cassadaga's north side to get tarot card, and other, readings. Mr. Sekunna said his father was unpopular with

many of the Spiritualists at first. But, attitudes softened, because his business was getting more visitors to town and everyone benefited.

Anne-Marie McCormack is co-owner of 6th Sense Connection, a more recently opened metaphysical shop in Cassadaga. The sixth-generation psychic medium said many readers are attracted to the town for the same reason Mr. Colby was — the energy.

"The veil between the worlds is at its thinnest here," she said.

Cassadaga has had an unwanted energy over the years, too: a power to evoke fear, superstition and rumors. And attract thrill seekers. Perhaps the most famous rumor is about the "Devil's Chair." That's the one that draws a lot of thrill seekers, too. The legends vary, but they all have the same basic spooky element: There's a seat in the Cassadaga Cemetery called the Devil's Chair, and if one sits

on it at midnight, he or she will see Satan.

What none of the legends account for is that there is no cemetery in Cassadaga. There is a cemetery in neighboring Lake Helen, home of several Christian churches and a pretty good pizza parlor.

Since the 1800s, many sermons were preached in local pulpits against Cassadaga. They included warnings against demonic activity and declarations of God scattering the Spiritualists elsewhere. Some of that still exists. Rev. John Ferro built a church, Dunamis Community & Outreach Center, about a mile from the Spiritualist camp. According to the church's website, the Lord told him, "it was time to possess the land in Cassadaga."

In a 2006 "Charisma" magazine article, Mr. Ferro attributed psychic and mediumistic readings found in the town to demonic entities.

"(Readers) are working in the area of familiar spirits," he told the magazine. "A familiar spirit can give you some really true information about your life because they are following your life. If people are not biblically grounded they can easily be seduced."

Ms. McCormack said that the only demonic entities antagonists find in Cassadaga are those they have with

them. "I've always felt Cassadaga is what you bring to it," she said. "You bring love and light, you'll find love and

light. You bring scary things, you'll find scary things."

Despite rumors, sermons and metaphysical competition, the Spiritualists have held on, and Cassadaga is the oldest active religious community in the Southeast. That probably has a lot to do with folks such as Lylia Brachin, from Morriston. She enjoys visiting Cassadaga and getting readings, but said many of her neighbors would disapprove if they knew.

"I like the town and believe in Spiritualism," she said. "My neighbors would probably burn me at the stake for coming to a place like this."

in three phases in 'Revolution, Reaction and Reform.'

Phase 1, "Revolution," deals with the commercial aspect of the slave trade. Europeans were trading spices, peppers, gold, jewels, guns and more with the Africans, which eventually led to the trafficking of humans.

Phase 2, "Reaction," looks at the Amistad slave revolt when African slaves took over a slave trading ship off the American coast.

Phase 3, "Reform," speaks of the Emancipation Proclamation and the 13th amendment. The 13th amendment to the US Constitution granted freedom to slaves and outlawed slavery in America.

He put together a poster board with information and graphs and built a couple of replicas of the

ship.



When Neil Sedaka takes the stage at the Peabody Auditorium on Tuesday, March 27, his fans are in for a treat.

"I do all the Neil Sedaka hits, which I still love and I do some of the hidden treasures or the forgotten children," he said in a recent phone interview with *Hometown News*. "I refer to my songs as my children. Some of them were buried in LP's and I'm so very proud of them."

The legendary singer/songwriter may also play "surprise the audience" with a classical piano solo.

Mr. Sedaka turned 73 earlier this month, but instead of slowing down, he continues to reinvent himself. In the case of the classical music, though, it's more like going backwards.

The Dish: Not your everyday restaurant

ORMOND BEACH — Though the concept of "tapas" ("small plate") is customary in some countries, it is relatively new in the States. But the style is quickly catching on. The idea is to serve menu items in portions where dishes are shared and tasted among groups of two or more people. Appetizers, snacks and entrees are served on small plates, allowing a generous way of trying different foods.

Fortunately, locals have a place to try this dining style. It's called "The Dish" — a comfortable low-key tavern and grill on W. Granada Boule-

vard. Their motto is, "Your Plate or Mine." Opened in October of 2009, The Dish has become one of the most popular eating establishments around. The tapas-style of dining has been a big hit for both new and repeat customers.

But the menu doesn't stop there. For more traditional diners, there are standard portion meals available as well. Either way, with over 100 items to choose from, The Dish has you covered.

Entering the restaurant, the cozy atmosphere is immediately felt. To the right is the bar and lounge, where liberal libations are always available. To the left is the dining area — inti-

mate booth settings, plus plenty of tables for two, four, or more including seating for large parties. There is also a patio where five outdoor tables can accommodate an additional number of patrons.

The interior decor is a delight in itself. The walls display paintings by local artists, and all of the artwork is for sale. The art is "changed out" once a month, giving exposure to more artists, and giving customers something new to see each time they visit.

After my guest and I settled in, we ordered the "happy hour version" of a glass of wine. Our server, Christina,

outlive me," Mr. Sedaka said. "I still hear them on the radio. I've been writing for almost 60 years now and to hear 'Calendar Girl,' 'Breaking Up is Hard to Do,' 'Love will Keep Us Together,' and 'Laughter in the Rain' after all these years is a great accomplishment."

But, he's not one to rest on his laurels or his royalties. "It's a very trendy fickle

business. You have to raise the level of Neil Sedaka," he said. "You have to reinvent him. You have to try things out of your comfortable sphere. If you don't develop and grow and raise the level, then you get bored and the audience gets bored."

To this point, in addition to his pop recordings, Mr. Sedaka has released some children's albums including "Waking Up is Hard to Do" inspired by his grandchildren, original Christmas albums, and a Yiddish album.

Additionally, his classical roots popped up in 1996 when he recorded "Classically Sedaka" in the United Kingdom, a place he penned lyrics to some of the most beloved classical tunes.

That album, by the way, has become a collectors' item. It was not released in this country and is out of print. A brand new copy currently sells for between \$124 and \$255 on Amazon.com and even used copies start at \$19.99 and skyrocket upwards. Like the Eveready Rabbit, Mr. Sedaka just keeps on going.

"I like to keep it fresh," he said.

He also has another album coming out next month called "The Real Neil" with 15 new songs. He is most proud of the fact that he has also written a piano concerto and a symphony.

"I recorded it with the London Philharmonic Symphony a few months ago," he said. "I will be performing with them in October at the Royal Albert Hall. That's unusual because very few pop people — McCartney, Billy Joel—have done classical as well."

The very prolific Mr. Sedaka has received numerous awards in his lifetime. He has had eight No. 1 hits on the U.S. and European charts, been inducted into the Songwriter's Hall of Fame, was given a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, and had a street named after him in Brooklyn, his home town. But there's one accolade that is conspicuously missing. He has not been inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Over time, there have been

several efforts to change this. One fan in Belgium is currently circulating a petition that has almost 14,000 signatures from Sedaka fans all over the world and is growing daily. "I think that Neil Sedaka is one of the most underrated artists," said Jozep Van Gorp who is the fan behind the petition. "It's what can I do as a fan for an artist whose music influenced my own life. He may not be the greatest rock-'n'-roller of all time, but I'm sure he influenced many artists in the world, even artists that are already in the Rock and Roll Hall Of Fame."

Mr. Van Gorp has not yet sent the petition to the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland. He is "waiting for the right time" and more signatures. He encourages Sedaka fans to go to www.sedaka.be/ or to search "Sedaka petition" on the Internet to sign the petition.

Mr. Sedaka is aware of this petition and others efforts as well.

"It would be nice," he said. "I would love to be in before I say goodbye to the world. It's a shame that so many great ones have been overlooked. Connie Francis, who I wrote songs for, has been overlooked as well as so many others."

But Neil Sedaka is not sitting around and waiting for that to happen. In addition to writing more songs, returning to his classical roots, and performing all over the world, he is looking forward to a totally new adventure.

"There is a musical play based on my life coming out in London's West End this fall," he said. "It's called 'Laughter in the Rain' and actors plays me, my wife, Elton John, Carole King and Connie Francis. The kid who plays me is an unknown Brit and he's absolutely terrific."

He's proud of the play, he said.

"To me that's a great accomplishment," he said. "For a couple of months I'll be coming out as the real Neil Sedaka at the end of the show to do a couple of songs with the ensemble. Now that's exciting!"

Bountiful outing no 'fluke' for New Jersey fisherman

With the March winds in full blow I was very reluctant to allow my guest to pick a day for a fishing trip a whole week in advance.

Miracle of miracles the appointed morning dawned as calm as could be hoped. I welcomed Bill Kudlik and his dad Lou on board my 17-foot Polar just as dawn peaked over the High Bridge in extreme Northeastern Volusia County.

At the request of Executive Director Lori Gillooly I had donated a trip to Habitat for Humanity and Bill had made the winning bid at their fundraiser. Lou was down from New Jersey for a visit and both men were anxious to fish.

With the tide extremely low

and just beginning to come in I knew I had some time to kill before the water would be high enough to get back onto the mud flats where the redfish live. I motored to an old favorite sea trout hole with the hopes of catching a couple as we passed the time. My new fishing buddies seemed a bit apprehensive when I insisted that they each use my famous chartreuse jig on the light tackle that I was providing. It did take a while for the first fish to come on board but when Bill landed a

nice 17-inch trout the mood immediately improved.

Bam! Bam! Lou and I each hooked up with keeper trout. Now we are fishing! I then went through a stretch where nothing would stick to my hooks but Bill was hot and kept putting fish in the box. Finally Lou and I got back into the game and soon nine nice trout were on board. Most of the fish we caught were keepers and we only had to release three or four.

After a while it became apparent that the trout had tired of seeing the jigs and quit biting. That was fine for the water had risen and now it was time to hunt red fish. With my little 50-horse Evinrude tilted way up I worked my way far back into the flats. I cut the engine

about 200 yards from my red fish hole and began to use the push pole and electric trolling motor.

We were making steady headway but I didn't like what was happening and told the guys so. We were going with the tide but the wind was in our face and causing the water to lap up against the bow of the boat. Just that little bit of noise would be enough to scare off the reds that I hoped were there. I was forced into making the decision to turn around and soon started up the outboard once more.

We would have to drive a bit to get all the way around the desired spot so that we could approach with the wind. Now as we drifted in much more quietly I hooked a

17-inch red right away. I had instructed the men to put a half-inch of fresh shrimp on their jig hooks and that worked fine. Bill picked up a 16-inch red and soon Lou's rod bent in that familiar arc that lets you know you are connected to a nice redfish. Lou is in his 80s but seemed to get younger as the fight wore on. After I put the net under his 22-inch redfish I shook his hand for a job well done. His red sported 16 spots and had it been a count-the-spots tournament Lou would have been in the money. That battle finished that hole and after a short move we were into them once more. Six more reds in rapid succession would keep us all smiling. Eventually Bill would land a fat 17-inch flounder to round

out his inshore grand slam of red, trout and flounder. Very nice!

Of course when the flounder came on board my New Jersey friends couldn't help but shout: Fluke! Fluke!

By morning's end we had caught more than 20 fish and had a lot of fun. The wind had been blowing over 20 mph the previous day and would be back up to 25 mph the following day but somehow Bill had picked the right day to fish.

was very helpful in pointing out the more popular items on the menu. We also got some input from Patrick Graham, the general manager, as well as Brad Disch, an operating partner whose name was used for the restaurant, natch. Both gentlemen were gracious and helpful in our selections. With such experienced personnel in the house, we couldn't go wrong.

To begin, a cup of Lump Crab Bisque rang a gustatory bell for me, while my guest chose the Classic French Onion Soup.

"This is the best French onion soup

I've had in Florida," my Connecticut friend said. Both of us sampled, and both of us agreed that the soups were wonderful. We then moved on to the real sharing part of the dining experience. Our "shares" started with Eggplant Medallions, served with herb and garlic marinara sauce, and Fire Grilled Veggies — zucchini and yellow squash on brown rice,

accompanied by two tangy sauces: Low-sodium soy ginger and creamy horseradish. Excellent!

The Dish menu is worth navigating at a leisurely pace. The menu has six major categories: The Crock; Fresh From the Garden, chilled or hot; Pizzas From the Wood Stone Oven; Carnivorous Creations; Poultry; and Dishes From the Sea. Since we had already chosen from the "Crock" and the "Hot," we were on our way to "Creations." This took some doing, as everything looked tempting. We finally decided on Filet Mignon Au Poivre, prepared with peppercorn brandy cream sauce, and grilled Lollipop Lambchops, served with frazzled onions. Both delicious!

Next stop on the menu, the Sea. By then we were getting a bit full, so we opted for a couple of shooters — a large fresh oyster submerged in a jigger of zingy sauce. Wow!

But that wasn't the end. With all the great food selections at The Dish, surely the 'Sweet Treats' are equally as tasty. Though pleasantly stuffed, we found enough room for dessert. The choic-

es were divine; but we went for the Red Velvet Cake, a half portion divided in two, which allowed an ample sampling of a really great treat. Oh, what a meal!

In addition to great food and a relaxed environment, The Dish also has entertainment. Live music is on tap every Saturday evening from 8 to 11 p.m., and Open Mic Night is offered the 2nd and 4th Friday of each month from 9 to 11:30 p.m. Two-for-one Happy Hour is offered every day from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m.

What is the most unique quality of The Dish? As Patrick Graham put it: "The atmosphere — a place where locals can 'hang out' — the artsy, boutique-ish style that separates us from all the other restaurants in the area."

Indeed, from start to finish, The Dish is the best!

Try meatballs, sausage, ribs, braciole and a special cake

Hello smart shoppers, hope you had a good week. This column has additions to my spaghetti sauce that completes the feast.

A Casata cake or a cannoli cake, an Italian specialty, tops off the menu. Ricotta, the soft creamy cheese used in pasta dishes, is also used in fillings and frostings for cakes. Love

Cannoli? The filling is made with ricotta. Enjoy. See you next week.

ITALIAN MEATBALLS serves 4 or more regular or low fat

When you use 'fresh ground' beef, meatballs can be low-fat. My meatball recipe was handed down to my mother. A combination of ground beef, pork and veal can be used but we prefer

them only with beef.

I can remember as a teenager being told, "There are seven ingredients in the recipe plus the meat." You must count on your fingers: salt, pepper, egg, garlic, cheese, parsley and bread.

If you use regular ground chuck or beef, which contains a fair amount of fat, the seven ingredients still holds true. When using fresh, virtually fat-free ground beef, an eighth ingredient must be added to keep the meatballs

from going flat; that is bread crumbs.

NOTE: Using fresh ground beef? Add 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil per pound.

- 1 pound fresh ground "fat-free" beef
- 2 large eggs or equivalent amount of egg substitute, or 3 egg whites
- 4 slices white bread or equivalent of Italian bread
- 2 medium cloves garlic, chopped
- 1 tablespoon plain bread crumbs
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2-teaspoon black pepper
- 5 or 6 sprigs fresh Italian parsley, chopped, or 1 tablespoon dried
- 1 handful grated Romano cheese

Soak bread in water, squeeze dry. If using Italian bread (preferred), remove as much crust as possible. Place all ingredients in a bowl and mix with your hands. Shape into balls a little larger than a golf ball.

Years ago you would fry the meatballs, but now, to cut down on fat, we bake them. Place on a cookie sheet that

has been treated with cooking spray. Bake at 350 for about 30 minutes.

Meatballs should be cooked in the spaghetti sauce an additional 30 minutes. Over-cooking will make them fall apart.

ITALIAN SAUSAGE FOR SPAGHETTI SAUCE

To reduce the fat, cut sausage into 3- or 4-inch pieces. Prick all over with a fork and bake on racks in a cooking rack at 350 for about 30 minutes. Add to spaghetti sauce and cook for 30 minutes longer.

HINT: If you use both sweet and hot sausages, place a toothpick in the hot sausage to avoid unwelcome surprises.

PORK SPARE RIBS FOR SPAGHETTI SAUCE serves 4-5

Cut ribs apart between each bone and trim as much fat as possible. Place on rack in cookie sheet, bake at 350 for 30 to 40 minutes until browned. Add to sauce.

Ribs should be cooked in the sauce for about 1 hour or until fork tender.

BRACIOLE serves 6

Ask the butcher for braciole. Years ago flank steak was used; today we use round steak.

This is my family's recipe. I recently had braciole with a sprinkling of breadcrumbs added to the meat and it was very good.

- 1 pound braciole or round steak
- 3 or 4 large cloves garlic, chopped
- Several sprigs fresh Italian parsley, chopped
- Grated Romano cheese
- Salt & Pepper
- White string
- Spaghetti sauce

Score meat, cover with waxed paper and pound to flatten and tenderize. Cover meat with next five

ingredients. Roll and tie securely with string. Brown in a little oil or cooking spray. Add to sauce. Cook for 1-1/4 to 1-1/2 hours until meat is fork-tender. Remove from sauce, cut away string and slice in 1/2-inch pinwheels.

ITALIAN CASSATA CAKE (NIB)

This recipe is from my cousin Ermalina. The cake is purchased from the bakery of a supermarket or a bakery store. I presume from her instructions it is a high cake.

- 1 sponge cake
- 1/3-cup raspberry jam
- 1 cup confectioner's sugar
- 1 cup candied fruit
- 1 container (2 pounds) ricotta
- 3/4-tablespoon orange liqueur
- 3 squares semi-sweet chocolate, chopped fine
- 5 tablespoons pistachio nuts, chopped

Beat ricotta in a large bowl until smooth. Add sugar, chocolate, nuts and candied fruit (save best pieces of fruit to decorate top of cake).

NOTE: Candied fruit is hard to find during the year, buy extra around the holidays or ask for it at your local bakery. Cut cake into thin layers (3 or 4), moisten top of layers with liqueur, spread a little jam over top of layer and top with some ricotta mixture. Continue stacking layers, leaving top of cake plain.

Chill until set, (at least 2 hours). Cover top with leftover ricotta mixture or dust with confectioner's sugar. Decorate with reserved fruit.






