**F.A.I.T.H. assembly, Trayvon Martin march merge**

DAYTONA BEACH — Coming up with a solution to the homeless problem in Volusia County was supposed to be the main topic of discussion at the annual meeting of an association of area churches Monday evening.

Volusia County Council members were invited to the annual F.A.I.T.H. Action Assembly and were asked to come up with a funding source to raise at least \$950,000 to support the county's 10-year plan to end homelessness.

But first, the group acknowledged the hundreds of college students, Daytona Beach residents,

members of Occupy Daytona and others supporting the Trayvon Martin movement who caught organizers of the assembly off guard as they marched to First Baptist Church Monday where the assembly was being held.

Seventeen-year-old Trayvon, who was unarmed and carrying a bag of Skittles candy and a can of iced tea, was killed February 26 in Sanford by a member of the gated community's neighborhood watch group.

The incident has galvanized the nation with charges of racial profiling because Martin was black and was dressed wearing a hooded jacket, which the shooter commented on

during 911 calls.

Many of the protesters in Daytona Beach, who were black, white, young and old, wore jackets with hoods and carried bags of the candy and a can or bottle of iced tea.

Other marches and protests took place all over the country Monday, one month to the day of Martin's killings.

Organizers of the F.A.I.T.H. assembly did not alter their program, but several ministers did incorporate the issue in their remarks when it was their time to speak about the homeless issue.

**Chiefs question 'Stand Your Ground'**

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Sheriff Ben Johnson's a big supporter of gun rights. He thinks citizens should be able to make trouble for the criminals that come looking for it.

When appropriate. "However, it's my belief that the 'Stand Your Ground' law as currently on the books is too broad in its application because it doesn't require citizens to at least attempt to de-

escalate a situation by retreating first if at all possible before using lethal force," he said in an e-mail response to queries. "The effect, in my view, is that the law does, on occasion, result in the endangerment of law-abiding citizens. While all of the facts aren't known yet, it's very possible that we just saw a

very tragic example of this in Sanford."

Sheriff Johnson was referring to the Feb. 26 shooting of Trayvon Martin in Sanford and the 2005 state law known as "Stand Your Ground." Backed by the National Rifle Association, supporters say the law expanded the rights of Floridians to act in self defense. Opponents, such as the Brady Center to Prevent Handgun Violence, say the law is letting people get away with murder.

The Associated Press has reported that Florida Department of Law Enforcement statistics show before the law was enacted in 2005, there were about 13 justifiable killings by citizens a year in the state. After 2005, that increased to about 36.

**A LEGACY OF LEADERSHIP**

Jimmy Huger's life defined by righting wrongs

DAYTONA BEACH — By the early '60s, Jimmy Huger had seen enough of America's gaping racial divide in his own backyard.

Black people couldn't attend shows at the city-owned Peabody Auditorium. They couldn't go swimming in the Atlantic Ocean except at Bethune Beach. In fact, they weren't even

allowed on the beach side of the Halifax River after dusk, unless they could prove they were working.

The city golf course, where black people couldn't play until 5 p.m., is where Mr. Huger decided to take a stand. He woke on a Saturday and told his wife, Phanyne that he was going golfing.

"She said, 'You know better than that,' and I said, 'Better than what?'" he

recalled. "My taxes supported this property. Why couldn't I play?"

At the course, he plunked his money down, hopped in a cart and told workers there to have him arrested so he could sue. He finished his game.

Three days later, Daytona Beach commissioners ended yet another remnant of Jim Crow and desegregated the golf course.

This wasn't the only color

line that Mr. Huger (pronounced hue-ger) has crossed. Throughout his 97 years, he's made several groundbreaking career moves: first black Daytona Beach city commissioner, first black Volusia County councilman, member of the first group of black U.S. Marines.

This weekend, his fraternity, Alpha Phi Alpha, is holding a three-day "Legacy Celebration" in his honor. It

will include a golf tournament today to benefit Mr. Huger's scholarship fund, a gala reception at the Daytona Beach Hilton on Saturday and a Sunday service at Mr. Huger's church, Stewart Memorial United Methodist Church.

"It's been one helluva interesting ride," Mr. Huger said recently from his home of five decades, overlooking

# Herb Faire returns to Ormond Beach

ORMOND BEACH — Seventeen years ago the Seaside Herb Society of Ormond Beach started what could be the most fragrant and flavorful fair in town.

On Saturday, March 31, the 17th annual Seaside Herb Faire gives the public a chance to bask in the aromas of fresh rosemary, basil and lavender; taste

foods prepared with herbs; and talk to the experts who grow them.

"If you're using herbs, you need to start educating yourself about tasting herbs and see what you like," says Carol Chillemi, vice president of the Seaside Herb Society and Herb Faire chairwoman.

The fair will offer the opportunity to purchase locally grown herbs, native Florida plant species and specialties from visiting

nurseries. The uniqueness and quality of the event draws people from as far as St. Augustine and Palm Coast.

The Herb Faire will have offerings for both gardening and culinary aficionados. Looking for fresh basil to create that fabulous recipe? No need to settle for common sweet basil — at the Herb Faire there will be many varieties to choose from. Can't find fresh savory for grandma's secret stuffing recipe? This is a chance for both professional and home chefs to pick up the more elusive herbs, such as savory and borage, not found in box stores.

Fragrant herbs like lavender can also be purchased, and an expert lavender grower will be a featured guest speaker. Other speakers will share tips and tricks of herb cultivation and the many different uses for aromatic plants.

The Seaside Herb Society of Ormond Beach began the fair to promote herb gardens, share knowl-

edge of the many different uses for herbs and to promote awareness. Founded in 1993, the society meets monthly. Speakers and cooking demonstrations are part of the program, and an Herb Team of the Month makes a presentation at each meeting. The Seaside Herb Society of Ormond Beach meets the third Saturday of every month from October through June. Meetings are open to the public.

Ms. Chillemi looks forward to "spreading the good news about how herbs can have a positive impact on your life," she said. "Not just with gardening, but with aromatherapy and health."

She said using flavorful herbs allows creative cooks to cut back on salt and other unhealthy additives.

Funds raised at the fair are used to support the Herb Society and for Daytona State College culinary scholarships.

Breakfast treats such as scones, quiches and biscuits will be available for

# A hot air balloon is just a wicker basket attached to a flamethrower

I don't fly very well. When it comes to commercial flights I am what is commonly known as a "white knuckler." That could be due to the fact that I am too aware of the mechanics involved, but actually I believe it began long ago on a cold windy airfield in Missouri.

Just two days before my 21st birthday, I was drafted into Uncle Sam's Army and sent to Fort Leonard Wood, Mo. for basic training. When that was completed I was ordered to fly to Fort Gordon, Ga. for Military Police school. This would be my first flight.

As I loaded onto the big twin prop plane I remember thinking that it was a tired looking old bird. I don't know what model it was but I can tell you aviation buffs it was only a step up from the old DC3. As we waited for take off the pilot kept revving the engines. As he did that the big aluminum wings would flex up and down. Knowing a little about metal fatigue, I was instantly worried. Over and over the engines would rev and the wings would go up and down. I told the fellow next to me it would have to beat its wings a lot faster if we were going to get airborne (insert nervous laugh here).

Eventually it did get up, but not too far. They announced that we were flying at 1,100 feet, but I don't believe we ever even attained that low altitude. I could tell the model of each car we passed over. It was an unsettling experience.

After MP school I would spend a lot of time flying in a Huey helicopter over the Bavarian Alps. The Warrant Officer

who was my pilot was constantly smoking pot and buzzing the deer we saw in the mountain meadows. Also unsettling.

These days I will fly when I absolutely have to but I don't enjoy it. Some time back I had become enamored with hot air balloon flight. Watching the big brightly colored orbs floating along, they seemed safe to me. Thinking that might be a good way to get over my fears, a few years ago I headed over to DeLand for a balloon meet. When I arrived the weather had turned nasty and there was only one balloon that was inflated. The man who was working on it was short and stocky and looked right out of central casting. He had a long beard that was probably red at one time but was now just yellow and dirty. I asked if he was the pilot.

"Well," he replied, "I can get it to go up and sometimes I can make it come down, but once we are in the air the balloon kind of has a mind of its own." He asked if I would be interested in

going up with him. Now I have to tell you I am a good sized lad at about 225 pounds and the basket that carried his passengers was made of wicker. I won't even sit on wicker furniture when I am visiting someone's home for fear of falling to the floor. Now I was being invited to go soaring about in a wicker basket that was attached to a giant flamethrower.

Once again, the mechanics of that worried me. I declined.

Still, I thought I might like to go ballooning, so last week I stopped down at the New Smyrna Beach Municipal Airport where the people were practicing for the big weekend hot air balloon festival. My plan was to bum a ride and alleviate all of my flying fears. When I arrived and saw that my plan was actually going to work, however, I chickened out once more. News that a balloon had gone errant and been forced to land miles from its designated area did not help. As I stood staring at the balloon and smelling the burning fuel the thoughts of old red beard washed over me again.

So now, I am 0 for 2 in hot air balloon flights. I am still intrigued by the things and I hear there is a balloon festival going to be held soon up at St. Augustine. Maybe I will go there and finally be able to get over that army airliner with the flapping wings....or maybe not.

HOLLY HILL — It was "Hogs on the Hill," or a pig in a poke. Depends on who's telling the tale of Holly Hill's premier city-sponsored Bike Week event March 9 to 19 at 327 Ridgewood Ave.

City Manager Jim McCroskey, Mayor Roy Johnson, and three commissioners were happy as pigs in the mud over the event. Commissioner Liz Towsley Pat-

ton, however, said they can put lipstick on a pig, but it's still a pig. She said the event was poked by lewd activities and poor accounting.

Several citizens and local businesspeople had tantalizing tales to tell the Holly Hill City Commission at its last regular meeting Tuesday. Most stories included a cast of Jell-O shots, massage and bike-wash girls simulating sex acts with customers and a few dancing in cages.

In an interview after the meeting, Ms. Patton said she got phone messages from residents complaining about highly-visible cages with erotic dancers turning Ridgewood Avenue into an outdoor adult-entertainment zone. She said she investigated the claims, and found it to be more disturbing than described. Ms. Patton said she confronted Mr. McCroskey about it.

"When the city manager was told, he said, 'Bikers will be bikers,'" she said.

Other commissioners sharply disagreed that Hogs on the Hill had become a den of licentiousness. In a separate interview, Commis-

sioner Donnie Moore said he went to Hogs on the Hill every day and didn't see any skin sin.

"I didn't witness anything I heard Commissioner Patton complaining about," he said.

Mr. McCroskey said there was a dancing cage, and he'd had it removed. The owner of the cage (unknown to Mr. McCroskey, he said) moved it to a more discreet location. Mr. McCroskey said he had it removed again.

At the meeting, former Mayor Roland Via, told the commission that the city had "lost its moral compass."

"I speak for many citizens and businesses who say the image is disintegrating," Mr. Via said. "We've gone from being the City with a Heart to being a city with a bar. The 10 days we sponsored the Hogs on the Hill booze bash set us back 10 years."

Ms. Patton said since Hogs on the Hill finished she's asked Mr. McCroskey for better accounting for what the city spent on the event, and finally looked at related paperwork. In a separate interview, Mr.

McCroskey said he estimates the event cost about \$35,000 from the city's Community Redevelopment Area fund. However, he's awaiting repayment for some expenditures and for some credit-card expense reports to give a final accounting.

Ms. Patton said Mr. McCroskey isn't counting a lot of the pork in his estimate. She noted that his numbers don't include the overtime hours that city employees and police worked during the event.

"If he stands up there and says we spent \$40,000, there is no way it adds up to that," she said. "It's much, much more."

But Mr. Moore, who said he worked closely with Mr. McCroskey on the accounting of the event, said Ms. Patton is reaching.

"I think she asked him questions and got answers, but they weren't the answers she was looking for," he said. "I can't see there being any dishonesty or hiding of the facts or anything and I'm a very skeptical person, especially when it comes to government."

# Chitwood says self-defense law needs work

DAYTONA BEACH — Chief Michael Chitwood has no doubt in his mind: “Stand Your Ground” confuses the otherwise straightforward notion of justifiable homicide.

He said in recent years Daytona Beach has seen the white, black and gray of the controversial 2005 law that’s gotten national attention after the shooting of 17-year-old Trayvon Martin — who he said did not deserve to die.

“That kid didn’t know why the guy was following,” Chief Chitwood said. “Trayvon was acting in self defense. I look at his actions — I would have acted that way.”

While Chief Chitwood’s department is playing no role in investigating the shooting, the chief said it was a tragedy long in the making, because of the Florida Legislature muddling the concept of self defense with Stand Your Ground.

“We’ve had a few jobs in the past when we’ve had a ‘law-abiding’ citizen with a permit (to carry a concealed weapon) shoot at a drug deal gone bad,” he said.

The chief said while his department wanted to make arrests in those cases, the State Attorney’s office told him not to bother — there wouldn’t be prosecutions due to Stand Your Ground.

Chief Chitwood said there are times Daytona Beach residents have been

forced to shoot in self defense and he’s glad they did.

“We had one earlier this year,” he said. “An 82-year-old homeowner shot a man breaking into his home. That one was easy — a no brainer.”

In that January shooting, the homeowner heard the unmistakable sounds of someone trying to break into his property. He didn’t hesitate — the homeowner got his gun. On the business end of the gun was Tyler Orshoski, a 24-year-old Holly Hill man with about a dozen arrests for a variety of crimes including burglary. Mr. Orshoski was wearing a mask and gloves, and had tools such as a flashlight and screwdriver. He died not long after getting hit by an apparent warning shot fired through the door.

Chief Chitwood said no one can compare that self-defense claim to the strange affair of Leonard Murphy and Terrance Gatlin. According to police records, in August, 2010, the two met for an alleged drug deal. The reports say Mr. Gatlin met with Mr. Murphy on the pretense of selling him more than \$2,000 worth of prescription drugs. He then tried to rob Mr. Murphy, who shot him thrice.

Mr. Murphy had a valid permit to carry a concealed weapon, and claimed self-defense. He wasn’t charged in the shooting.

“Under the self-defense claim, they are now out buying pills, take out their .357s and shoot their deal-

er,” he said. “He got ‘self defense’ even though they were in the commission of a felony.”

Records show that a Leonard Raynard Murphy was arrested in July, 2009, on charges of aggravated battery with a firearm and shooting into an occupied vehicle.

The chief said Daytona Beach Police wanted to arrest Mr. Murphy after he shot Mr. Gatlin — the State Attorney’s office said otherwise.

“I’ve seen cases where we believed we had probable cause to arrest,” he said, “and they said, ‘Yeah, uh, we’re not going to prosecute.’”

With the passage of Stand Your Ground in 2005, Florida became the first state to revise the concept of self-defense from “duty to retreat,” to “stand your ground.” Legal experts have explained in the press that the essential difference is Floridians used to have a responsibility to avoid or attempt to escape danger when outside the home. Citizens had a right to self-defense if they couldn’t avoid or get away from dangerous situations. With the legal change, citizens, many legal experts say, now have no responsibility to try to avoid or escape danger.

Daytona’s top cop said that before and after 2005, the 82-year-old homeowner was in the right. He said before 2005, Mr. Murphy would have been in cuffs charged with murder, or manslaughter. After 2005, he walked.

That’s the black and white. What about the gray?

Chief Chitwood said that’s the January case of

Karen Granville, a woman in her 60s who grabbed her gun, stepped outside her house and confronted Rodrick Willis in her yard as he fled police. She was often dubbed “The gun-toting grandma.” Things turned out well — Mr. Willis didn’t test her resolve. However, Chief Chitwood said if Ms. Granville had shot, it’d likely been deemed a justifiable homicide, although she’d inserted herself into the chase and assumed police powers not given to her by the state.

“I know Ms. Granville, and I like her,” the chief said. “But, had she shot that guy, we’d be having the same argument.”

He noted that she’d told the press that John Wayne was her hero. The chief said “Stand Your Ground” shouldn’t be a license to act like a movie hero.

Chief Chitwood said he hopes the Florida Legislature makes changes to the “Stand Your Ground” law through a special session or during the next legislative session. He said he doesn’t believe the application of the current law matches what legislators intended in 2005. He said he’ll happily travel to Tallahassee to testify before any committees how the law has affected life in Daytona Beach.

In the meantime, the chief said citizens should take a lesson from the training cops get — even if you don’t have a duty to avoid or escape danger, it’s a good idea to step aside and call for backup if you can.

“Let common sense rule the day,” he said. “Live to fight another day, and be a good witness.”

campus Monday as the students prepared to march down Mary McLeod-Bethune Boulevard to Ridgewood Avenue where First Baptist Church is located.

The Rev. Monroe gave the call to order during the F.A.I.T.H. assembly and chose to recognize the students and the Trayvon Martin issue.

"No justice. No Peace. No Justice. No peace," he said. "Faith moves mountains. Faith moves mountains."

Dr. L. Ronald Durham, pastor of Greater Friendship Baptist Church in Daytona Beach, helped organize a rally in Sanford March 22 supporting Trayvon and his family. It attracted thousands including Civil Rights giant Al Sharpton and Martin Luther King III.

Dr. Durham addressed the students before they began their march to First Baptist.

"We don't want the march to end at the church," he said. "The Trayvon Martin incident that has galvanized you needs to be highlighted so this never happens again. It could have been one of you."

Dr. Durham's church is part of F.A.I.T.H.

"What F.A.I.T.H. does all year long is what your rally is about tonight," he said to the marchers. "Elected officials have come to realize F.A.I.T.H. does not go away. Justice does not have a price tag."

Addressing the homeless problem is not new to F.A.I.T.H. (which stands for Fighting Against Injustice Toward Humanity).

The group was instrumental in get-



ting county council members last December to fund Sentencing Alternatives for Volusia Enforcement, also known as the SAVE Docket. SAVE provides sentencing alternatives to paying fines for homeless individuals charged with minor offenses.

Deacon Charlie Welch, a member of Mt. Carmel Missionary Baptist Church, said F.A.I.T.H. was able to "move a mountain" when they got support for SAVE.

"We were appalled at the difficulties facing people who lived on the streets," said Mr. Welch.

County Council members Joyce Cusack, Josh Wagner, Andy Kelly, Carl Persis and Frank Bruno all agreed that there is a need to identify a funding source to support the county's 10 year plan to end homelessness.

County Council At Large Member Cusack said the county should not be the only entity working on the problem.

"Everybody needs to be part of the solution," said Ms. Cusack.

Volusia County Chairman Frank Bruno said he would work to find additional funds to address the problem.

Councilman Josh Wagner said all of the council members bring a different set of skills to tackle the problems they face.

County Council Members Joie Alexander and Pat Northey chose not to attend the event.

The council members agreed to report back to F.A.I.T.H. in May on their progress on coming up with a funding source.

and Volusia's top cops are having different experiences with it. Sheriff Johnson wants the 2005 "Stand Your Ground" law rewritten to keep criminals from claiming its protections. So does Daytona Beach's Chief Michael Chitwood and DeLand's Bill Ridgway.

Other chiefs think the jury's still out about whether Stand Your Ground is a valuable tool in the fight against crime or a license to kill.

The shooting of 17-year-old Trayvon Martin has garnered the law international attention and sparked many questions about whether the Sanford Police could arrest shooter George Zimmerman after he claimed that he'd killed the unarmed boy in self-defense — even if the department doubted the story. The Brevard-Seminole State Attorney's Office has scheduled a grand jury to review the shooting on April 10. Additionally, the U.S. Justice Department is now involved in the case.

DeLand police chief Ridgway said he's skeptical that the law has made citizens any more or less able and willing to respond to threats, or police more or less able to make arrests.

"I don't believe we've seen something substantial to say it's making a difference," he said.

The chief said a series of recent high-profile cases involving questionable Stand Your Ground claims — including the September 2010 shooting of Operation Iraqi Freedom veteran David James, 41, by Trevor Dooley, 69 — will likely have the Florida Legislature reviewing Stand Your Ground.

"I think the legislature will take a look at the law," the DeLand chief said. "I wouldn't say they'll repeal it, but refine it."

Since the Sanford shooting, there's been a growing chorus of legislators saying they'll examine recent self-defense claims and the applications of the law. Some legislators aren't waiting to speak out against questionable claims.

(Mr. Zimmerman) stepped over the line, I think," State Rep. Dennis Baxley, of Ocala, told Fox 13 News, Tampa Bay. He sponsored the bill. "There is nothing in that law that authorizes you to pursue and confront."

Most Volusia police chiefs say they've been fortunate and haven't had citi-

zens use deadly force outside their homes in recent memory.

"We haven't applied the law here — we haven't had a circumstance," Holly Hill's chief, Mark Barker, said.

Ponce Inlet Police Chief Frank Fabrizio, too, said that he's unsure of the effects of Stand Your Ground. He said it's not been used in his town. He added that investigations reveal facts, and those decide whether individuals are charged with crimes. He said the law hasn't taken away any police investigatory powers.

"I am not sure if drastic changes are necessary, but if the law could be improved to protect law-abiding, innocent citizens, I would be supportive of

the revision," he said in an e-mail response to queries.

In other e-mailed responses, chiefs Gerald Monahan of Port Orange, and Bill Hall of South Daytona, echoed Chief Fabrizio.

According to Sheriff Johnson, Volusia deputies have seen two cases of justifiable homicides in recent memory. One happened as Stand Your Ground was being considered in the Florida Legislature, in April 2005. In that case, an Osteen resident shot an acquaintance who had become violent after being asked to leave the home. In March 2006, after the law took affect, a man had to shoot a knife-wielding attacker in Deltona.

"In both these cases, the shooters were legitimately

in fear for their lives and investigators saw no information or evidence that cast doubt on their stories," the Sheriff said.

The phrase that makes a difference to Sheriff Johnson is "legitimately in fear for their lives." That's why he thinks "Stand Your Ground" should be amended.

"I would support a change in the law to require citizens who are in legitimate fear for their safety to attempt to retreat if at all possible before using lethal force," he said.

# Boaters transformed into official manatee watchers

While spending several days a week on a boat might seem relaxing, Tony and Bonnie Jitto often find themselves fuming mad out on the water. The couple spends at least four days a week exploring the marshy outback in and around the St. Johns and Halifax rivers for gators and their prehistoric neighbors, the manatees. They estimate coming across at least 50 fishing bobbers, with gnarled monofilament lines attached, in the water every year. And they can't count the number of times a boat will zip by at top speed in a manatee zone. "Every time we see a bobber, we pick it up," Mr. Jitto said. "And we go really slow, nothing above 2,000 rpms. One time, I saw someone going 25 mph in a manatee zone — he had it wide open — so I blew an air horn. It

scared everybody on my boat, but he just didn't care. He just kept cruising along." The Jittos were among a half-dozen boaters who recently attended a Manatee Watch class that taught them how to photograph and chronicle manatees by the scars on their backs. Held by Volusia County's Manatee Protection Program at the Marine Discovery Center in New Smyrna Beach, the program trains volunteers to document manatee sightings in the interest of bolstering a database used by scientists to study the creatures' movements and habits. "It helps us know all of what's happening out there," said Wayne Hartley, a retired ranger at Blue Spring State Park who continues to research the local manatee population with Save the Manatee. "Unless people see it and report it and know how to report it, we don't know

about it." Mr. Hartley gave attendees tips on how to identify manatees according to their individualized scar patterns, then copy those markings onto scar sheets that are faxed to the county's environmental management department. Mr. Hartley has been identifying manatees by such markings since the 1970s. These details alert researchers if a familiar manatee has chosen greener pastures elsewhere or now migrates to another winter resting place, said Georgia Zern, manager of the county protection program. "A lot of people live on the waterways here — boaters and fishermen — and they're the ones who usually see manatees the most," she said. "If we can get some of those folks to do accurate sightings, then we can get a lot of useful data from that."

Florida's manatee population has benefited from the extra attention and protected status, said Tonya Long, a biologist with the county protection program. Last year, nearly 5,000 were counted during an aerial count — the highest number since the state started counting the population annually. "You can see this nice upward trend in numbers," Ms. Long said, "so we're really happy to see that." Volunteers also received detailed information on physiology and behavior of manatees to determine, for instance, whether a gathering of manatees has been trapped by lowering tides or is just flopping about in a mating frenzy.







# Will Spiritualism keep its hold in Cassadaga?

CASSADAGA — Spiritualism was born on the American frontier on March 31, 1848. By the 1870s, New York trance medium George Colby brought it to Volusia County. By the 1890s, dozens of Spiritualists founded Cassadaga and forever became part of the Volusia landscape.

Maybe forever. As America's and Volusia's religious and physical landscapes change, can Cassadaga hold on to its character as a remote religious community? "My sense is that it is holding its own, but that it needs to adapt to changing patterns of belief and practice in the larger culture," Stetson University religion professor Dr. Phillip Lucas said in an e-mail response to queries. "The old

style Spiritualism often seems quaint to the younger generation."

Spiritualism — which can be seen as the logical religious descendent of the American Revolution and the religious freedoms it brought to citizens — was all the rage in the 19th century. There's evidence that it reached into the White House in the form of séances, the upstart religion's centerpiece.

Séances undoubtedly seemed exciting and new back in the day of hymnals, church pianists and lecturing ministers. Something else was new about Spiritualism, too. It was a democratic religion that opened the pulpit and leadership roles to half the nation for the first time.

"Women didn't get to speak at the platforms of any church until Spiritualism came around," Louis Gates, co-pastor of the Colby Memorial Temple, said. "It wasn't a boy or man who heard the raps, it was girls." Those important raps

heard around the world. "Mr. Splitfoot, do as I do." With those words and two claps, a teenaged Kate Fox inadvertently started a new religion that claimed to prove what others could only preach—there was life after death. Either a spirit answered with two inexplicable raps, or sisters Margaret and Kate Fox pulled one of the greatest hoaxes in our nation's history.

Mr. Lucas said many Americans were attracted to the new religion and its mediums — who claimed to facilitate contact between the physical and spiritual worlds — because the Civil War left so many with dead loved ones.

As Spiritualism went from movement to religion, it adopted many of the religious trappings of the day — hymnals, church pianists and lectures. The number of Spiritualist churches rapidly grew, and organizations such as the National Spiritualist Association of Churches formed. Before long, America had a

religion it was exporting to Europe.

By the 20th century, much of the rage was dying down and adherents started falling off. Some were joining new and growing metaphysical movements that now had the more exciting offerings, such as Wicca with its various festivals with drum circles, daggers and anachronistic dress. Others were heading back to Christian churches that were throwing aside hymnals and pianists in favor of electric guitars and thick drums. By the 1980s, many Spiritualist churches were closing, including Camp Silver Belle, an 80-acre Spiritualist community near Ephrata, Pa. The land is now covered by condos and fast food restaurants.

DeLand writer and medium Elizabeth Owens, author of "How to Communicate with Spirit" and other popular titles, said Spiritualism and Cassadaga are going strong despite encroaching land development and changing religious dynamics.



She predicted both the town and its religion will continue growing well into the 21st century. Ms. Owens said other religions might do things that are more exciting, but ultimately people who are interested in spiritual nourishment abandon flash for substance.

"Those questions that bombard people with seeking minds are never settled in any generation," she said. "Why are we here? What happens when we die? Spiritualism answers those questions very effectively."

She also said, unlike most other religions, Spiritualism is recently drawing younger converts.

"When I first came into Cassadaga (in the 1980s), it was an older group of people" she said. "When a friend of mine came into it in the '70s, she was the youngest person, and she was in her 30s. (But recently,) I notice in church a lot of young people. I'm there every Sunday. I mean young people in their 20s."

Anne-Marie McCormack is owner of 6th Sense Connection, a metaphysical shop in Cassadaga. She said after

America exported Spiritualism to her native Great Britain, it attracted the likes of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle and has a strong presence to this day. Britain now exports popular mediums, such as Ms. McCormack, back to the U.S.

"It's quite big," she said. "It's quite big in Britain. Every small town in Britain has a Spiritualist church."

Other Brits offer a more humbling assessment of Spiritualism's continuing success in the British Isles.

"I wouldn't say that it's that big, but you would find a small group in most towns, yes," Emma Burns, a resident of Devon, England, said. "There's a lot of Wiccans, spiritists (similar to spiritualists) and pagans down here."

She added that there's a Spiritualist church not far from her home.

To celebrate Spiritualism's 164th anniversary, Mr. Gates will have a transfiguration and trance demonstration from 7 to 9 p.m. on March 31 at the Slater House Education Center, 1188 Chauncey St.

## Blues legend King plays Peabody

The legendary B.B. King will be live on the Peabody Auditorium stage at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, March 31.

Throughout the 1990s as well as the 1980s, 1970s, 1960s and 1950s, there has been only one King of the Blues -- Riley B. King, affectionately known as B.B. King. He has defined the blues for a worldwide audience.

Mr. King has mixed traditional blues, jazz, swing, mainstream pop and jump into a unique sound. His singing is richly melodic, both vocally and in the "singing" that comes from his guitar.

Over the years, he has developed one of the world's most readily identifiable guitar styles. He borrowed from Lonnie Johnson, Blind Lemon Jefferson, T-Bone Walker and others, integrating his precise vocal like string bends and his left hand vibrato, both of which have become indispensable components of rock guitarist's vocabulary.


Since he started recording in the 1940s, B.B. King has released more than 60 albums, many of them classics. His first No. 1 hit was "Three O'Clock Blues."

He also has been bestowed 15 Grammy Awards by his peers; was inducted into the Blues Foundation Hall of Fame in 1984 and into the Rock n' Roll Hall of Fame in 1987. He is a founding member of the John F. Kennedy Performing Arts Center and received the Grammy "Lifetime Achievement Award" in December of 1987.

At age 86, he is still light on his feet, singing and playing the blues with relentless passion.

Opening for Mr. King is Victor Wainwright and the WildRoots. Big soul sounds of vocalist and blues man Victor Wainwright is backed by one of the tightest bands on the scene: the WildRoots, a piano, drums and guitar quartet.



# I don't know who needed to be saved more — me or the manatee

A fishing trip that begins with high expectations can be ruined in many ways. Your outboard engine may not run, the weather may turn ugly, your fishing equipment can fail you and, of course, there are times when the fish just won't bite. Those are all bad, but not long ago I found an entirely new and different way to end a fishing trip.

After enduring several days of high winds, I was really looking forward to getting on the water. At dawn, I launched my kayak from the ramp at the end of my street and headed over to the spoil

islands just east of Tomoka State Park. Before the wind, I had been having some success there with trout, reds and flounder.

Sure enough, almost right away I caught a nice keeper trout. On my next cast, a big sail catfish hit my top water bait like it was a snook. Once I had it in the Peanut and was gingerly releasing the pointy creature, some-

thing caught my eye. There was a bobber about the size of those used to mark a crab pot, and it was moving. As soon as I got rid of the catfish, I paddled over for a closer look. The bobber was a strange looking thing painted red, yellow and green and attached to about 10 feet of plastic sheathed rope. When I tugged on it, I found out that it was attached to a full grown manatee. As I pondered what to do about it, the manatee headed south and east toward the boat channel.

I took off for shore and asked my friends Billy and Sue Grubbs if they would call the State Park for help. I went back out to keep an eye on the sea cow until help could arrive. The Grubbs' 19-year-old granddaughter, Epiphany, launched her kayak and came out to help. Now each Spring, the Halifax becomes the highway for all of the yachts that are going back north, and at that moment, there were four bearing down on us. I was afraid for the manatee and began splashing the

water with my paddle to try and keep it out of harm's way. The thing was determined to swim right down the center of the channel, and Epiphany and I could not change its mind. I finally gave a hard tug on the rope, and I suppose I frightened the poor creature for it surfaced right under my kayak and flipped it over.

Off it went, but now I am swimming in the boat channel with the big yachts bearing down on me. Epiphany gathered up my gear that was floating and began towing me to shore. Soon it was clear that I was too much weight for her and I began to swim and she struck out for the Green Peanut that was drifting toward Ponce Inlet. Luckily the captain of the first yacht saw us and slowed. As I bobbed about in the center of the channel, he asked me what I was doing.

"Taking my morning swim," I replied. You can't lose your sense of humor no matter that you are an old guy who is trying to keep from drowning. I always use a

tossable boat cushion as a back rest in my kayak so if I had needed a life preserver, I did have one available.

Once on shore I was able to talk to the manatee people in Jacksonville, and we discovered that the buoy attached to the sea cow was a GPS tracking device. Now I have to tell you that this rig-up is a terrible way to follow the movement of the animal. It was very cumbersome and heavy to tow. Never once did I consider that a government agency would do such a thing to our beloved manatees. When I told those folks that I was going to write about it in the *Hometown News*, they wanted to make sure I had all of the information.

It turns out that three state agencies and a manatee rehabilitation group are behind this. I began getting phone calls from people that wanted to make sure they came off in a good light but I have to tell you, I can't do that. To me the whole thing just seems wrong. I know there must be a lot of science behind it but surely they

could come up with something more compact. They assured me that the rope has a breakaway feature in case the animal becomes ensnared, but that is not good enough. I have to think that device will kill a few. Now if you believe that my report is partly sour grapes for the hundred bucks of fishing gear that I lost, you would be partially right. But my main concern is for the manatees. Search stock footage of "manatee towing a GPS device" on the net and see what you think.

And while I couldn't save that manatee from his obviously unwelcome burden, I will be forever grateful to Epiphany and the entire Grubbs family for saving an old salt like me from the briny deep.

# Traditional Italian Easter pies can be sweet or super spicy

**H**ello smart shoppers, hope you had a good week.

Please note, some of this week's recipes contain Crisco. It has been around since 1911. Before that time, lard (pork fat) was used. Today's Crisco has no trans-fat, whether you purchase the blue or green label.

Easter is coming! This column will give you recipes for very old, traditional Italian Easter pies. If it weren't for the requests I have received, I would never have thought to print them. They're time-consuming but with some, tradition is tradition.

Pizza Rustica is a spicy meat pie. I will give you a family recipe and another from a friend.

Ricotta pie is a sweet, cheesecake-like dessert that's not too hard to make with a sweet cookie crust. It requires the optional addition of candied diced orange and citron. I always thought citron meant all kinds of candied citrus, didn't you?

I went to my World Book encyclopedia. The citron tree, native to Asia, bears a grapefruit-size lemon-like fruit with a thick rind. The fruit is considered inedible, but the aromatic rind is candied and used in baking.

While reading this information, I remembered a huge tree my parents had in Boynton Beach. It was there when they bought the house and we could never understand why anyone would plant such a strange tree with inedible fruit.

Noticing the tree, an Asian family knocked on mom's door and asked if they could buy the fruit. Mom told them to help themselves, but they insisted on paying. Twenty-five cents apiece seemed fair and they picked several.

A few days later, many more friends appeared and as the tree was getting bare, the price went up to 75 cents each. When I finally learned what citron was I put two and two together; mom and dad had a citron tree.

## PIZZA RUSTICA NO. 1 (NIB)

4 ounces each of Genoa salami, Prosciutto (Italian ham), boiled ham and hot

dried salami or pepperoni  
12 eggs  
1 cup grated parmesan or Romano cheese  
1/4-cup coarse ground black pepper  
One 15-ounce container ricotta cheese

You can cut the heat by using sweet, dried salami and reducing the pepper. Do not add salt, the meat is salty.

Cut meat in small pieces or thin slices, set aside. Beat together remaining ingredients. Add meat, blend well.

Fit pie crust into a 9-inch by 13-inch by 2-inch deep glass baking dish, fluting the edges. Pour in filling and if you have enough leftover pastry, basket weave strips across the top. Bake at 375-degree oven for 1 hour or until eggs are set. Serve warm.

### Pie crust:

You can use my pie crust recipe or store bought pastry sheets, instead.

1 cup flour, sifted  
Pinch of salt  
1/2-cup solid shortening, such as Crisco  
Ice water

Sift together flour and salt, cut in shortening. Add water, 1 tablespoon at a

time, until dough sticks to your fingers. Roll out on pastry board and fit into baking dish.





# Get a better grip on clubs and improve your game

In golf, proper grips are a necessity. We depend on grips to control the club and transmit to the ball where to go. We also depend on grips to tell us how well we struck the ball.

Today's grip market is huge. When I was a kid, grips were either black or "victory" green. Grips now come in many colors, weights, sizes and compounds.

The proper grip size will allow your hands to work better with your club. Something too large will prevent you from releasing the club properly, robbing you of power and distance. A grip that's too small may speed up your hands, causing you to hook the ball dramatically.

Golf Pride ([www.golfpride.com](http://www.golfpride.com)) is still the mainstay among professionals and amateurs alike. The New Decade and Tour Velvet lines are quite popular. They feature versions with chord in them for extra grip when things get wet, a few different colors to fit your personality and even different firmnesses to match the "feel" you prefer.

With all of the interchangeable clubs on the market, you have to be careful not to use a "ribbed" grip. Otherwise, when you move that shaft to a different setting, your grip is lined up incorrectly. The Tour Velvet line is designed with that in mind.

Lamkin ([www.lamkin.com](http://www.lamkin.com)) is

*ingrips.com*) has been around since 1925. This company has seen its share of technological breakthroughs. The new 3GEN technology features dampening that is more than seven times that of rubber. It also doesn't absorb moisture and stays soft and tacky.

The result is a grip that protects golfers' arms and hands from the jarring shockwaves created at impact. 3GEN also is a form of synthetic rubber that has much lower torque than the polyurethane grips, meaning golfers don't feel the grip twisting or sliding around the shaft during the swing.

The new R.E.L. 3GEN line comes in 11 different colors and several sizes.

NO1-Grip ([www.no1grip.com](http://www.no1grip.com)) is one of the most popular grips from the Asian market. Engineers have designed a high performance grip thinking along the same lines as those building a racecar. To go fast, a racecar must have perfect grip with the track. To hit the golf ball well, the golfer must have a perfect grip with the club.

IOMIC ([www.iomicusa.com](http://www.iomicusa.com)) is

another company on the cutting edge of technology. The company's new grip material is called "IOMAX," and it gives golfers great feel and control.

IOMAX is a combination of five elastomers that give just the right amount of adhesiveness, water resistance, friction resistance, soft feel and protection against UV rays.

Because IOMAX is naturally white, the company can make grips in any color. They are also manufactured using high-temperature injection molding, which produces a finished product with minimal weight variation.

One grip that I'm looking forward to trying is from Etile Grips ([www.etilegrips.com](http://www.etilegrips.com)). I've seen these dunked in a bucket of water and handed to me feeling nice and tacky and ready to go. This is a grip perfect for Florida summers.

Etile Grips are made from an elastomer resin containing silica material for increased grip and water resistance. The WCS line features a weight control system that allows golfers the ability to back-weight and perfect the balance of their clubs and putter.
