Pier opening looks good for May; waiting on turtle permit

DAYTONA BEACH — Workers continue getting the Daytona Beach Pier ready for a proposed May 22 opening. But there may be a hang up: sea turtles.

"We are still waiting on (Florida) Department of Environmental Protection state permits on turtle lighting," Paul McKittrick, deputy city manager, said in an interview. "We're confident we'll get it."

City officials are starting to see the light at the end of the pier, so to speak, after years of little to no progress on getting the structure back to its former glory.

The former owner of the pier, Carlsberg Management Company, handed it over to the city in 2004. When the company transferred ownership, it got a 35-year lease with an option to extend it to 70. Carlsberg subleased the pier to Diland Corporation. Because of the attraction falling into greater disrepair, Daytona Beach bought out that lease for \$1.3 million.

In 2007, workers repaired the pier's pilings. It was closed in 2009 for workers to do additional restoration work. Last year, the city worked out a deal with Ignite Restaurant Group of Texas, owner of

the national chain Joe's Crab Shack, to lease the pier's 16,400 square feet of commercial space.

If the state comes through with the needed permits, the pier will most likely reopen minus a familiar fixture: the 175-foot Space Needle. The ride was installed during the height of the nation's space program in 1969.

Daytona Beach spokeswoman Susan Cerbone said in 2011 that the ride "needed a lot of maintenance and replacement" and it was removed in 2011.

According to Mr. McKittrick, the city requested

Ormond Beach history shaped by African nations

ORMOND BEACH — Liberia and Sudan have been in Ormond Beach since the late 1800s. Now they'll have signs to let folks know.

Former Michael Gibson said Liberia and Sudan have gone unrecognized by the broader community for too long.

"The information and history records for black people in Ormond at the time, not many records were kept," he said. "We worked hard to uncover bits and pieces of information."

In Ormond Beach, Liberia and Sudan do not refer to the two African countries, but to historically black working-class neighborhoods along Granada Boulevard and Washington Street. The north side is traditionally known as Sudan, and the south side, Liberia.

The latter was founded by freed American slaves in the 1840s. They got help from the American Colonization Society, which believed freed slaves would prefer to be back in

Africa, where they'd also have a better chance to retain their freedom and thrive as a people. Mr. Gibson said the country was a powerful inspiration to American blacks before and after the Civil War.

"Liberia was the first independent country in Africa," he said. "It was founded by former American slaves. The capital was Monrovia, after President (James) Monroe."

Back in Ormond Beach, freed slaves started settling in the area after the Civil War, along with people who traveled from Liberia. That's according to Mr. Gibson's research. Some of the freed slaves' families heading to Ormond Beach kept alive the knowledge that they came from Sudan.

"Even in slavery, they didn't lose their memory," Mr. Gibson said. "Through all the brutality of slavery, someone had the wherewithal to say, 'Wherever I am in this land, I know where I'm from and we're going to keep that name-sake in our heart.'"

As time wore on, according to Mr. Gibson, the two

School district cites distraction as No. 1 cause of accidents

VOLUSIA COUNTY — School children can be distracted by anything, anywhere. Even when they're crossing streets. Mix that with traffic and accidents happen. Sometimes they turn deadly.

In the wake of 24 vehicle-on-student accidents that resulted in two deaths so far

this school year, Greg Akin, director for student transportation services, recently reported to the Volusia County School Board steps the district is taking to ensure students' safety.

"All 24 accidents we had, someone was distracted. Either the driver or the student or both," he said in an interview after a recent meeting.

There are few changes that can be made, Mr. Akin said, except to tell students and drivers to pay attention.

Seventh grade is the most hazardous year for students, the reports show. Of the 24 students in vehicle-on-pedestrian incidents, nine were in that grade. Three more were in other middle school grades.

Holly Hill debates Internet café location near 'school'

HOLLY HILL — The definition of a school is the question the City of Holly Hill will have to wrestle with in an application for a business license from an Internet café.

However, the question may be moot if the owner of Cyber Monkey, an Internet café, or sweepstakes center, decides to find a friendlier place to locate.

At its latest meeting, the Holly Hill City Commission took City Manager Jim McCroskey's advice to hold off on approving an application to open Cyber Monkey II at 1757 N. Nova Rd., Unit 110. Cyber Monkey has been in Port Orange, 1665 Dunlawton Ave., for several years.

Complicating things for the proposed Internet sweepstakes center in Holly Hill is the fact that Encore Baton and Dance Studio is

located close by. The ordinance allowing Internet cafés puts a 500-foot separation from any school.

"The baton school kind of set off the discussion on schools," Mr. McCroskey told commissioners. "Is a baton school something that should be considered for separation purposes? Only the commission can decide that."

In an interview after the meeting, John Liszewski, operations manager for

Cyber Monkey, said the business is interested in opening, not fighting city hall. He said public resistance to the proposed location expressed at the meeting sent him looking for another location.

"We don't want to hassle with anybody," he said.

Fran Williams, business manager for Encore, said she was unaware of the issue, and that she didn't feel she had enough details to comment. She said city staff

members haven't approached her to see if the business should be considered a school under the Internet-café ordinance.

"I don't know much about the Internet cafés and what they're about," she said.

Ms. Williams said the baton and dance school has been opened for about four years. It has about 75 students, and operates weekdays after school until 8 p.m.

Celebrate marine animals at Marine Science Center Turtle Day

Since 2002, Volusia County's Marine Science Center in Ponce Inlet has cared for thousands of turtles, birds and other living creatures.

Again this year, hundreds of citizens are expected to join the county in celebrating animal rehabilitation and raising awareness about marine life and the environment when the Marine Science Center holds its 10th annual Turtle Day from 10 a.m.-3 p.m., Saturday, April 21. Beach-

side animal releases will end the day at 3 p.m. Releases will be at the Beach Street ramp in Ponce Inlet.

A wide range of artists and crafters will join environmental groups such as the Halifax River Audubon Society, Canaveral National Seashore, the Volusia/Flagler Turtle

Patrol, and the Volusia Sea Turtle Society. There also will be crafts, face painting, live music, food and Ritter's ice cream.

Turtle Day is a celebration of bird and turtle rehabilitation in Volusia County. As of April 2012, the Marine Science Center received 936 juvenile to adult size sea turtles,

15,418 hatchlings and washbacks, and 842 miscellaneous reptiles (gopher tortoises, freshwater turtles and snakes), bringing total number of reptiles received by the Marine Science Center to 17,196 since it opened in 2002.

The April 21 event will culminate in the likely release of a sea turtle from the sea turtle rehabilitation center. Several gulls and pelicans are scheduled to be released as well. The Mary Keller Seabird Reha-

ilitation Facility at the Marine Science Center has received 8,961 birds since opening in 2004. Sea turtle and seabird releases are subject to change due to animal health or environmental conditions.

Swimming with manatees — those were the days

While back, in my fishing column, I told the story of how my kayak had been capsized by a manatee. It happened when I mistakenly believed the sea cow was entangled in a rope and buoy. The manatee probably became frightened and surfaced right under me as I tried to free it. As it turned out the animal was not ensnared but towing a GPS tracking device installed by the state. The result was an early morning swim in the Halifax by yours truly and the loss of a good fishing rod, but all in all it was an exhilarating experience and one that I will remember fondly.

When I wrote that column I knew that it was going to elicit a lot of response from my readers and it did. I was aware that some would let me know that I had been stupid for not recognizing the tracking device.

Thanks for pointing that out. Repeatedly.

Others wondered if I had been afraid of drowning. I was not but thanks for caring. The majority of responses to that column asked if I had been afraid of the manatee. Huh? That I was not expecting. I have to admit I was taken aback that so many folks are fearful of those gentle creatures.

Several asked me just how big the creature was. The inference was that the larger the size the bigger the fear factor. Well, the manatee in question had to be between 1,000 and 1,200 pounds, but when it comes to manatees the larger size only means more manatee to love. They are completely harmless.

I want to say that they are as lovable as water-going dogs, but that would be inaccurate, for there are

dogs that are aggressive. In all of my years in Florida I have met many manatees and have yet to find one capable of thinking an evil thought. Most of them are overtly friendly to people and some are shy but all are docile. Years ago, before rules were put into place prohibiting touching and feeding manatees, I remember giving one a clump of grass at boat side. The big rubbery mouthed sea cow sucked my entire forearm into its mouth to get the grass. I loved it.

Back then, the Gulf Coast community of Crystal River had several boats running "swim with the manatees" tours. That area has a large population of manatees that stay there year-round, allowing visitors an opportunity to enjoy the warm summer water in the presence of sea cows. Some of them were rightfully boat shy but all of them were people friendly. If you jumped into the water and swam away from your boat, a couple of manatees would come to join you.

Once when I had my wife, son and

daughter there, I may have enjoyed the ultimate manatee experience. The four of us were about 70 feet from our boat and surrounded by four or five manatees. I had been snapping away with my under water camera and exposed all of the film. As I headed for the boat to stow the camera, I was doing my best Ryan Lochte impression and swimming as fast as I could for I did not want to miss a minute of the fun. I was wearing mask and fins and a snorkel and as I stroked along with my face down in the water I soon saw a big brown snout appear in my mask. A big manatee had overtaken me from behind and come up beneath me. Swimming toward the boat it gently lifted me from the water on its back and soon I was high and dry and getting a ride. I was still stretched out prone in the swimming position but right on top of the sea cow. I think it was playing with me or perhaps trying to keep me from leaving the fun.

My wife Lana, who adores all creatures great and small, had to be monitored when on our boat. Without warning she would take a head first dive off the moving vessel at the first glimpse of a manatee. My only warning was a shout of "MANATEEEEEEEEE" followed by a splash. Our family has played with them for years. Not once did any of us ever feel in danger. Of course, with anything that large you must give them room, but I could never be convinced that one would harm you on purpose.

Please remember my stories are from long ago. Touching or harassing manatees these days carries a heavy fine. As for my readers who feared for my safety, I would say "you should be so lucky!"

City Planner Tom Harowski said whether Cyber Monkey II moves onto another location, or sticks to the proposed one, the city will probably craft an answer to the question, "What is a school?" If it doesn't, then the city has to use the definition in the Webster New Collegiate Dictionary — the 1983 edition.

"I don't even think we have one of those around city hall," he said.

The Holly Hill City Commission recently approved zoning that allows the controversial Internet sweepstakes facilities on Nova Road. In previous interviews,

Mr. McCroskey said it was a pragmatic decision the commission made as the Florida Legislature seems deadlocked over outlawing them.

"The county already permitted them on Nova," he said. "We said if we're going to have them, let's have them on Nova Road, too."

The sweepstakes centers operate in a legal loophole. Rather than winning money by playing games, customers are purchasing sweepstakes tickets and find out by playing casino-like Internet games whether they've won anything. A narrow distinction, but a distinction that's bedeviled law enforcement and prosecutors.

Mr. Liszewski said about 90 percent of the folks who

visit Cyber Monkey in Port Orange are retirees as interested in socializing as gaming.

The city has approved two Internet cafes on Nova Road

earlier this year, and voted to allow the local Disabled American Veterans to convert its arcade at 605 8th Street into an Internet sweepstakes center.

River Springs Middle School in Orange City has had six incidents between students and vehicles this school year — by far the most of any school in the county. However, Ormond Beach Middle School had one of the county's two fatalities — Cameron

Brenneman, 12. Cameron was killed when a family member accidentally struck him after picking him up near the school, instead of the designated student drop-off and pickup area.

The other, and more recent, fatality was on Feb. 2. That morning, 16-year-old Brandon Vera was fatally injured while walking to University High School, about a half mile

from River Springs Middle.

Silver Sands Middle in Port Orange, has had two vehicle-on-student accidents, the second most this school year. The other Port Orange middle school, Creekside, had one accident, as did Heritage Middle, Deltona, and David C. Hinson Middle in Daytona Beach. Most of the accidents involved only minor injuries, if any.

Parent Erika Fahlbusch, River Springs Middle, said more days than not students walk or bike in front of her without apparent heed.

"Children, they don't pay any attention to traffic, whether they're walking or biking," she said. She drops off and picks up her 13-year-old daughter at the school. "I don't know if it's lack of knowledge of rules of the road, but it's ridiculous."

She noted that the Orange City middle school, like all in the county, doesn't have crossing guards. The Volusia County Sheriff's Office supplies crossing guards to elementary schools. The guards are trained and certified according to Florida Department of Transportation standards. It's been a sore issue for the Volusia Schools since at least the 1990s that the Sheriff's Office doesn't put guards near middle schools. The department has always insisted that it has limited resources, and it deems elementary children in greater need of the service than middle schoolers.

Four of the county's stu-

dents involved in vehicle incidents this school year are in elementary school.

Ms. Fahlbusch said administrators at River Springs serve as informal crossing guards, but they seem to have little influence on students' behaviors. She said middle-school traffic safety probably starts at elementary. She said neither her daughter nor 7-year-old son were taught something she recalls well.

"From what I remember, it was engrained in me to look left, right and left again," she said. "I remember I learned it in a classroom setting in elementary school. I don't think that's happening with them."

Mr. Akin said the district is planning traffic studies next school year to advise cities and the county where additional traffic signage might help reduce traffic risks. In the meantime it's trying to educate parents to reduce foot and bike traffic around schools to reduce accidents.

"One of our big pushes is to get parents to use the parent loop, and for those that qualify for using transportation to use transportation," he said. "We've done some (parent traffic loop) surveys. On average, anywhere from 10 to 15 minutes, they're all clear. That's not that long of a time."

High schoolers have been involved in eight of the 24 vehicle incidents this year. The only high-school driver who hit another student was a youth who accidentally ran over his girlfriend's foot while backing up.





Good, bad news on fate of big box stores

Just when it looked like the high vacancy rates of commercial buildings in Volusia County was coming down, it's skyrocketing again with Food Lion and Sears Holdings shuttering several stores.

The end comes Sunday for Kmart stores in New Smyrna Beach and Orange City, and the Sears Essentials in DeLand, leaving some huge space to fill. Food Lion stores have already closed.

So far, there has been some redevelopment of big box holes, such as the old Kmart in Port Orange where TGI Friday's, Bealls Outlet and a RE/MAX office are new tenants. There's just one spot remaining there. Save-A-Lot has taken up some empty space, including part of Food Lions in Deltona and Holly Hill. Save-A-Lot also moved into the Bealls Outlet space in Port Orange when it moved to the old Kmart.

But Save-A-Lot may have hit its limit in Volusia County, which leaves Aldi as the big hope to fill parts of "white elephants" as big empty buildings are called. So far, Aldi has opened one store in Daytona Beach, but in other markets it has entered in Florida, it has put in multiple stores. Just to the south in Brevard County, Aldi already has six stores. While Aldi usually won't comment on future plans,

you can bet more stores are coming to Volusia.

Empty strip centers were starting to get some tenants as the economy improves, but the vacant big boxes will definitely head off a surge in new commercial construction.

Downtown Beach Street is finally getting some traction with an investor buying **Beach Street Courtyard**. The residential part of the building already was full of renters, but now Paul Zap Inc. plans to finally take advantage of a cool courtyard for an Italian restaurant. Hopefully the company will have luck with leasing the two street-front commercial units as well.

With Ivy Lane Bistro set to reopen, Windy City Bar & Grill already open and Scuttlebutts opening soon, the south end is looking a lot better. Now if the north end could just get more businesses.

Consolidated-Tomoka Land Co. found a property to buy and use the funds it got from selling the vacant Barnes & Noble building in Lakeland. The Daytona Beach-based company paid a whopping \$7.4 million for

a Walgreens in Boulder, Colo. It's the first time Consolidated-Tomoka has ventured outside the South to buy a property and apparently a Walgreens building is much more expensive in Colorado than it is in the South.

The Daytona Beach area could get a little added fun with construction starting on **Lucky's**. The old Cycle World nee Klassic Kars building is getting remodeled into an entertainment center with a bowling alley, arcade and restaurant. Across the street from the Daytona Flea & Farmers Market should give it plenty of traffic.

In a follow up, it looks like **Sunoco** plans to at least rebuild some of the properties it got from First Coast Energy. In Ormond Beach, the company is talking to the city about rebuilding old Shell stations at 1546 W. Granada Blvd., 3 N. Yonge St. and 460 S. Atlantic Ave. That

would remove three eyesores from the Ormond Beach landscape.

On the restaurant watch, permitting continues for a Krystal at 1120 N. Woodland Blvd. in DeLand and for a Jimmy John's at 2 Perrott Drive in Ormond Beach. Also, construction has started on another Salsa's, this one in the old Woody's Bar-B-Q site in Port Orange.

Hudson's Furniture, a chain of stores that has grown stealthily, has opened its 14th store. This one is in the former Williams Furniture and Design Center on State Road 44 in New Smyrna Beach. It is sharing the property with John's Appliance & Bedding.

In some semi-good news, the price of gasoline finally stopped going up. It had dropped to \$3.95 early this week. That doesn't mean it won't go up again, though.

Ormond Beach communities largely forgot how their neighborhoods got their names. He hopes the signs will help them remember.

According to city spokeswoman Loretta Moisiso, the city commission recently approved making and erecting the signs. She said city workers will make the signs along with other projects, so there's no way to calculate their cost. However, she said it's negligible.

"They're in production by the city sign shop and should be up by June," she said in a phone interview after the commission approved them. "They're going to be standard 2 by 2 aluminum signs that are brown with white lettering."

The signs will note the historic neighborhoods' names, and urge readers to find out more about their history by visiting the city's website: www.ormond-beach.org.

Mr. Gibson, who organizes the annual "I am Ormond Beach" community reunion,

now lives in Southfield, Mich., his wife's hometown. The couple plan to relocate to Ormond Beach in coming years. Mr. Gibson said Mayor Ed Kelly was largely responsible for getting local interest in the signs.

The mayor said that he'd been unaware that neighborhoods in his city were named after African countries. He enjoyed finding out about it, and how it came to be. Mayor Kelly said it made him more proud of the men and women who'd settled Ormond Beach.

"I'm kind of a history

buff," he said. "Anything we can do to connect the present with the past gives the community a different sense."

This will be the fifth year of the Ormond Beach Reunion on July 12 to 15. A ceremony to celebrate the new signs will kick off the festivities.

"We're going to do a public ribbon cutting on (July 12) as well," he said. "That'll be 2 p.m."

The signs will be placed at the corners of Granada Boulevard and Washington Street.

Ex Navy man shows off natural splendor of old Florida

DELEON SPRINGS — The native wildlife started lining up for Captain Frank Wiltse as soon as he lulled his pontoon boat from the dock one recent morning at DeLeon Springs State Park.

Dopey-looking cormorants posted like sentinels on battered dock posts. Floating flocks of white-billed, duck-like coots. A fat osprey piercing the water for food.

The retired sea captain, who started his adult life with four years in the U.S. Navy during the Cuban Missile Crisis before serving with the U.S. Merchant Marine for 27 years, takes a slower pace these days. As captain of the Fountain of Youth Eco/History tour boat, he devotes his workdays now to teaching visitors and unknowing locals about the area's often-overlooked significance.

Like how the spring, which devotedly gushes 19 million gallons of water a day from the aquifer, was

once the center of existence for the Mayaka Indians.

In 1984, he said, one of the tribe's dug out canoes was found. Archeologists estimated it to be about 4,000 years old. A few years later, they found another, this one a few thousand years older.

At least four Indian mounds are located within walking distance. The park manager's house sits atop the most prominent one overlooking the spring.

"This was their I-4," the 74-year-old tells a boat full of passengers from as far away as England, as he motored down the Spring Garden Run into the mile-and-a-half-long Lake Woodruff. "And this is where we're going today."

In the back of the boat, his partner, 79-year-old Ruth Knuebel of DeLand, starts rattling off a long list of animals they've seen taking drinks along this route.

The black bears and Florida panthers, wild boar and coyotes. And then there's all those float-

ing logs that turn into alligators when you get a closer look. Captain Frank says most tourists are preoccupied with finding these creatures.

"Frank, you didn't wake up any gators this morning," prods Ms. Knuebel, whose own tour boat, a steam-engine replica called the Beresford Lady, gave eco-history tours for a decade before being destroyed in the Groundhog's Day tornado of 2007.

Back then, Captain Frank was working with her on her boat. Now, she's working with him on his.

It takes about 20 minutes of scouring the shore for an alligator to be spotted. Captain Frank cuts the engine and floats closer. He brings 8-year-old Colton Kaminski to the helm and has him estimate the distance between the gator's eyes and snout with his forearm.

"If that distance is 9 inches," he tells Colton, "then that gator is gonna be about 9 feet long and 9 years old. Isn't that cool? You're the only one in your class that knows that."

Colton's eyes widened. "It was cool," he said.

"Now I know how to see how old all the alligators are."

As if on cue, a gangly blue heron swooped from one tree to another, somehow managing to control a 6-foot wingspan with a 5-pound body.

"Kinda pretty back here, huh?" Captain Frank asks his passengers. "Hard to believe it's so pristine. Used to be that 60 percent of the state used to be like this. Now, there's 20 percent remaining. That's all that's left."

Captain Frank's history lesson ensues. Though legend would have it, he said, that Spanish explorer Ponce de Leon wandered throughout the state in search of Florida's Fountain of Youth, historical records show no evidence that he ever ventured anywhere near St. Augustine or DeLeon Springs despite early bragging from those tourists attempting to lure tourists from northern states.

"According to his ship's record, though," Captain Frank said, "he landed in Melbourne, about 125 miles to the south, then he sailed around the southern tip (of Florida) to Tampa

Bay. There's no proof he ever came up here."

Ms. Knuebel told her colleague about her alleged lingering headache, just as the boat passed a stand of Carolina willow trees. The salicylic acid in the bark was the Mayaca version of Tylenol.

"It never fails to amaze me the incredible body of knowledge the locals had of what they could and could not eat," Captain Frank said. "A student once asked me how they knew, and I told him, 'They fed their enemies first.'"

Passing by large lily pads, Ms. Knuebel talks about how the tubers were one American Indian food source and how their yellow flowers were popped like popcorn over a fire.

"I've been on the St. Johns so many years," Ms. Knuebel said. "It's just a beautiful thing that never gets boring. It changes, believe it or not."

A passenger asks Captain Frank if he's seen any bald eagles. "Sure," he says, then transitions into another story.

British honeymooners were onboard a few years

We need a better road map to science education success

Florida students have a destination they're driving toward: a diploma that signifies they're ready for the challenges ahead, equipped with all the experiences and knowledge that will help them be successful. Their teachers guide them to that goal, but to be truly effective as educators, teachers need an accurate education road map that outlines what needs to be taught.

Ask 20 high school physics teachers what knowledge and skills are imperative to cover in their courses and you are likely to get a variety of responses, agreeing in some areas but diverging in others. This is not an ideal situation since that would mean a graduate in Polk County might then possess a higher or lower skill set than a Duval County graduate.

That's where the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards come in. Unfortunately, Florida's standards in science are currently a weak road map to science literacy success. Our students deserve something better and there is a way to accomplish that.

Florida's science standards were revised in 2008, replacing a previous set that were grossly substandard. A lot of hard work was poured into our new standards, and those who produced them should be commended. It was a monumental task tackled by enthusiastic professionals. But their working conditions were far from ideal. The time frame from start to finish was much too short and the busy framers and

writers worked on it part time in addition to their own occupations. The result was an improvement over the previous standards, but it was later discovered that errors and oversights had crept in. Florida's science standards fell short of the world class product everyone wanted. The goal was an A. We wound up with a C, according to an official review by the Thomas B. Fordham Institute.

That leaves Florida with a dilemma. Keep in mind that student assessments are developed based on adopted science standards. This means that standards drive what happens in the classroom.

How do we get our science standards to an A? One possible solution that we here at Florida Citizens for Science advocate lies in the efforts of the National Academy of Sciences to create Next Generation Science Standards. This project is similar to Common Core standards in mathematics and English/language arts that Florida has already signed on to. So far, 26 states are participating in the NGSS development, which recently passed the framework stage and is about to dive into the standards' writing stage. The states-led project has the full support of the National Science Teachers Association and the American Association for the Advancement of Science. Nationally

recognized experts and world class scientists are engaged in this. Unfortunately, Florida isn't involved.

If Florida joins this project now, we're not obligated to commit to NGSS adoption when it's done, making it a low-risk venture. But not joining means missing out on the opportunity for Florida educators to influence the final product. Working with others states will spread the financial load, making the effort a lot cheaper for Florida's taxpayers. We encourage the Florida Department of Education and the Florida Board of Education to put our state in the forefront of this worthwhile endeavor. A poll released in March showed that an impressive 97 percent of voters believe "that improving the quality of science education is important to the United States' ability to compete globally." It would be foolish to "circle the wagons" around a current state standards/assessment system that is not providing students what they need. Anything that allows us to compare learning gains across districts and states helps us to understand how to better support science learning.

Scientifically literate graduates are an essential part of Florida's future. We owe them the best possible science standards. Let's not fail them!







bids to reopen the ride, which was closed in 2005,

and things are looking good the ride will be preserved. When it would thrill riders again is uncertain.

"We've had several inquiries from people

expressing interest in renovating the Space Needle, or replacing it with a new ride," he said.

The Daytona Beach Pier first opened in 1900, but was damaged by fire in the early 1920s. It was rebuilt in 1924, and extended to 1,000 feet with a casino and space for ballroom dancing. The grand pier attracted famous entertainment acts such as the Dorsey Brothers.

After the 1971 opening of Walt Disney World changed Florida's tourism patterns, Daytona's pier and nearby boardwalk fell into decline. By the 1980s, the area was declared "blighted," and efforts to revitalize it began.

Hurricane Floyd narrowly missed Florida in 1999, but high and rough seas snapped 266 feet off the pier. The portion was never replaced. Today, the pier is 745 feet long.

Mr. McKittrick said the city is investing about \$4 million of capital improvement funds in restoring the pier. Additionally, Ignite is funding renovations on the commercial space. DeLand resident and frequent Daytona Beach visitor Rhonda Torres said the pier is well worth the investment.

"Joe's Crab Shack will be nice, but (the pier is) historic," she said. "It's been around forever. (Daytona) wouldn't be the same without it."

She hopes, too, that the Space Needle will come back.

"I love it," she said. "That was the height of my glory going down there."

FDEP officials did not return phone calls for this story.

Columnist followed his own path in life

James Preston Tucker, a psychic by trade and a columnist for *Hometown News* for nearly 10 years, came into the world as a surprise, a niece recalled Monday.

"And for the remainder of his life, he remained a surprise at what he did," said Ellen Tucker, the niece.

Mr. Tucker, 73, who wrote "Spirit Guide" and "Star Scopes," was found deceased on April 11 at his home in Jensen Beach, a Martin County Sheriff's Office report said.

The house had no signs of forced entry, the report said.

Neighbors told investigators that Mr. Tucker had been ill and bed-ridden

around the time of his death.

Funeral and burial arrangements for Mr. Tucker have not been finalized or announced.

Steve Erlanger, publisher of *Hometown News*, expressed sadness about Mr. Tucker's death.

"Everyone from the *Hometown News* family was terribly saddened by the news of James' passing," he said. "James has been part of our family since the very beginning. Tammy Raits (*Hometown News* managing editor) and several of our crew, and I had worked with James back in the old Forum days. When we knew we were going to start *Hometown News*, we knew James had to be a part of it."

Mr. Tucker was born on

Nov. 29, 1938, in the small town of Rocheport, Mo., on the Missouri river.

"Jim was a surprise baby," his niece said.

His oldest sister, Anna Margaret Stroud, was more than 20 years old at the time of his birth, she said.

His father, Henry Dewitt Tucker, was a Methodist minister, she said.

"Ladies of the church shared with me that she (his mother, Kathleen Estelle Munro Tucker) was not showing at all (when she went to the doctor)," Ellen Tucker said. "The doctor was ready to do an appendectomy when he realized she was in labor."

She said the birth also was unusual because his mother carried him behind, instead of in front of her internal

organs.

When the birth occurred at the parsonage, the whole town knew because the walls were thin, Ms. Tucker said.

"Ladies gathered up baby clothes and diapers and that was his welcome into the world," she added.

Besides the circumstances surrounding his birth, another unusual event involving a doctor occurred when as a young man he and his friends played around with a pistol, his niece said.

He accidentally shot himself in the leg and a doctor had to use a new medical technique he had just learned at a conference to save Mr. Tucker's leg, the

Where and how to get your bait in front of a hungry fish

Each week I field questions from newcomers to the inshore fishing game and even some from the veterans. I am always happy to help anyone have more fun whenever I am able. Questions about limits and lengths are common as are those on choosing the proper equipment.

I suppose my most perplexing query is the one concerning where to catch fish. I try to give tips on fish whereabouts in almost every column I write. As I relate my experiences on the water I make it a point to tell the reader the general area where I made my catch. Still, some folks are disappointed that I am not more specific and they let me know it.

First off, it can be difficult describing the exact man-

grove bush or oyster bar that held fish and secondly the fish are almost never in the same spot every day.

If you are a regular reader you know that I fish all over the area. My general range is from Haulover Canal at the southern edge of the county north to Matanzas Inlet in Flagler County. Every now and then I will venture to the western part of Volusia County to fish Lakes Monroe, Woodruff and Crescent in the St. Johns area.

If I was able to tell you where the fish are on any given day I would be there

as well. Fish move about and that causes me to move about. When you read that I had a good day in a certain area be sure to try it there as soon as possible, but when you go, be prepared to search that entire area for the best fishing.

OK, that being said, let's talk about a few things that may help your search be more successful. Most of us know that oyster reefs make good fish attractants, therefore any bar that is exposed at low tide gets a good deal of fishing pressure. If you can locate a submerged oyster bar that stays out of view you may be onto a hidden treasure. If you are fishing in deeper water and your bait is constantly being snagged on shells, make a note of that place. At times there may be

fish there.

If you are fishing with natural bait for sheepshead and black drum always look for the barnacles. A good rule of thumb is to fish the east bank of any land or island because our prevailing winds usually knock down trees on that side. Any downed trees that have been there awhile should be a good spot for heads and drum.

Fishing the flats is not quite as simple as it may look. Many folks make the mistake in assuming that clear water of one foot or less can't possibly hold fish. In that type of condition, you want to look for places the predators can hide to ambush food. A grassy bottom near a sand spot may provide that. If you are on the flats at high tide you

might concentrate on the inner coves. As the water drops, you might be better off fishing the points of land at either end of the same cove. Stay out into the deeper water and cast to the points where the water is at least a foot deep.

One of my favorite tricks is to fish old crab pot buoys. Anglers pass dozens of crab buoys on every trip. Most are not good fish attractants, but if you find an old green, crusty bobber marking an abandoned trap, you may be in a good spot. My old buddy Al Houser will tell you that through the years I have put us on lots of fun by fishing an abandoned crab trap.

Many of the fish I catch comes from being a keen observer of my surroundings. Big fish pushing water

is a slam-dunk, but a jittery school of baitfish could be a more subtle indication of hungry predators. Watch the bottom. Reds will root up mud clouds as they search for shrimp and crabs. Impressions of flounder on the bottom in shallow water will tell you that they are around. Cast out into deeper water where they have probably relocated.

Well, that's about all I have for today but be sure and keep those questions coming and I will try to answer each and every one.

niece said. Much of his life was spent growing up on a farm in Columbia, Mo., and in 1957, Mr. Tucker graduated from Hickman High School, Ms. Tucker said.

Although he got a bachelor's degree in agriculture from the University of Missouri, working in that field was not part of his future, his niece said.

Mr. Tucker moved to California in the early 1960s and became public relations director for Taco Bell, she said.

He left the job, but later regretted that, saying at the time he didn't believe Taco Bell was going to make it, Ms. Tucker said.

During the ensuing years, he sold real estate, did various types of jobs and sought success as a musician and country music songwriter in Nashville, his niece said.

Although he "was a good

singer and a good guitar player," it was tough to compete, she said.

He also was an architectural welder and some of his work is still evident in Columbia, she said.

It was believed he had been named after a millionaire in Texas and Ms. Tucker believes he was influenced by that, she said.

"He wanted to be somebody very famous and he wanted to be a millionaire — and it never happened," she said. "I think through the years he recreated himself many times in his attempts to be famous and somebody important."

But although he may have not achieved the fame he wanted, Mr. Erlanger said he became well known.

"He had followers from all the country," Mr. Erlanger said. "People that read his column or the horoscopes while vacationing somewhere along the east coast of Florida would follow his writings on our website. He had fans and admirers that just

waited each week to read his words."

For nearly 20 years, Mr. Tucker, for whatever reason, lost contact with his family.

When his mother died in 1984, family members searched for him without avail, his niece said.

But in the early 2000s, he regained contact with family members, who were surprised to learn he was running the Mystic Chronicle in Jensen Beach, Fla., and that he did palm readings and regression hypnosis where people learn about their past through the technique.

"It was a far step from Midwestern life in what he was doing in Florida and a far step from growing up as the son of a Methodist minister," his niece said.

She said she believes he often wore purple as a tribute to his mother, who was into gardening and grew flowers that were purple.

"I knew he was referring to his mother and how positive she was and how giving and loving she was," Ms. Tucker

said.

But while some may remember him as a palm reader, a columnist or a musician, Mr. Erlanger recalls him as a friend.


"James became a friend over the years," he said. "He was especially fond of my son, Austin; he called him the little wizard. I knew he took Austin's passing very hard."

"James, I'm sure had a colorful past, but for the 16 years that we knew him, he was nothing but a quality guy, good-hearted, generous and giving. All of us, as well as our readers, are going to miss his words of wisdom and insight each week. May God bless him," Mr. Erlanger said.

He's survived by one brother, Dan Tucker of Goodlettsville, Tenn.

He was preceded in death by two sisters, Ms. Stroud and Mary Elizabeth Devore and two brothers, Frank Tucker and Dewitt Tucker Jr., who died as an infant.

"Jim felt he was reincarnated from Dewitt," his niece said.





Stellar course within a short drive

Many of you may not realize this, but we have one of the nation's top public courses within a couple hours drive of us. I am talking about Crandon Golf Club on Key Biscayne in Miami.

Crandon has quite a unique history, having played host to the Champions Tour for nearly two decades. The course has been rated in the top-10 by "Golfweek" and "Golf Digest" rates the course in its America's top-75 Courses.

The course sits on the island paradise of Key Biscayne, just 10 minutes from the hustle and bustle of downtown Miami. Crandon is pure golf, enveloped by the tropics. The holes run through forests of mangroves and lush tropical foliage. There is an abundance of water everywhere.

The first thing one notices on the course is how secluded it is. After driving over the Rickenbacker Bridge and past dozens of joggers, cyclists and people just relaxing by the bay, you arrive at the course. Right next door is the tennis center at Crandon Park, home to the Sony Ericsson Open, the second largest professional tournament in the United States.

At the golf course, it's easy

To forget how close you are to downtown Miami until you get to the 18th fairway and glance across the bay and see the magnificent Miami skyline. If you happen to play late in the afternoon, be sure to bring your camera as the sunset can be quite spectacular.

Crandon Park offers a unique playing experience with seven saltwater lakes, mangrove thickets, daunting bunkers and dramatic views of Biscayne Bay. It's also the only course on the continent to boast a subtropical lagoon.

Four sets of tees allow you to mix and match to find a good blend for your game. If you feel like testing your game against what the touring seniors faced, try the championship tees, measuring just a tad over 7,300 yards.

One of the best par-4s I have ever played is the seventh, dogleg right, plays to more than 400 yards from all but the front set of tees. "Golf Digest" named the holes as one of its greatest holes in golf.

To conquer this beast you must hit a solid drive that hugs the right side to give yourself a better second shot. The approach is long and must carry water to get to the green, which is surrounded by bunkers and mangroves. Just the view from the fairway is something special.

Throughout your round it's easy to get lost in the tranquil atmosphere surrounding the course. That is until you hit a few loose shots and find yourself looking in the mangroves for that new golf ball.

The course is also home to a plethora of wildlife. Beautiful herons and cranes fill the waterways along with a couple of crocodiles. Yes, crocodiles, not alligators. We even had a visit from a friendly raccoon who wondered if my playing partner was finished with his sandwich and chips.

Each hole at Crandon is unique and the layout will have you using every club in your bag. Water comes into play on all but five holes. There are four stout par 3s measuring from as short as 130 yards to well over 200. The fourth is a true three-shot par-5 that plays to over 600 yards from all but the forward set of tees.

The final hole is a wonderful, short par-5 that

features a beautiful view of downtown Miami. Just don't get too distracted, as this is a great hole to make up ground on your opponents or bury them with an eagle or birdie.

Carts come equipped with GPS to aid in your club selection. Every sprinkler head is also marked to assist those who prefer to walk. The range is even lit for those wanting to work on their game at dusk or into the evening.

The clubhouse opened in 2004 and includes a nicely stocked pro shop, restaurant with patio seating, as well as men's and women's locker rooms with showers. Towels are available for a small fee, or you can bring your own.

Crandon Park Golf Course is well worth the drive from our area. With a beach across the street and plenty of hotels and restaurants nearby, one could turn the day into a relaxing weekend away.
