Ormond Beach woman determined to open home for children

Maria Max has had a dream for many years. She wants to open a home where abused or neglected children can stay until they can be placed in foster care, adopted or returned to their own home.

"Every child needs and deserves a bright, healthy, happy start in life," Ms. Max said.

As owner of Community Thrift Boutique in Ormond-by-the-Sea, her dream is to provide a safe haven and she has recently purchased a house in Ormond Beach. The home cost \$42,000 and a used van was bought for \$6,000, she said. Renovations are estimated at \$50,000 and funds are being raised to complete the work.

She is in the process of obtaining a 501c3 so those donating toward the shelter will be eligible for tax-free donations.

Ms. Max, her husband Dave and other volunteers are working on renovating the home so it can meet the stringent regulations she knows she will face before the home can take in children.

"We will be caregivers and will provide a place of safety until the children are returned home, adopted, or placed in foster care," Ms. Max said.

She is hoping to house children, ages 4 to 6, to stay for a short time.

"Older children bring in problems they already have," she said, explaining why she is aiming for younger children.

Ben Johnson seeking another term as sheriff

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Ben Johnson was first elected Sheriff in 2000, and hopes voters will give him four more years at the job.

"I started as a road deputy," he said. "I've worked all over the agency. I grew up in the agency."

Mr. Johnson, a DeLand native, started working as a patrol officer at the Volusia County Sheriff's Office on Oct. 15, 1971, just a few years after his 1968 graduation from DeLand High School. He attended police academy at Daytona Beach Junior College,

now Daytona State. He continued his education and holds a criminology degree from Rollins College. He retired from the Sheriff's Office in 1998, and mounted a run for to be the county's top cop when former Sheriff Ed Duff said he was stepping down.

"I'm very proud that since I've been Sheriff violent crime is down 51 percent," Mr. Johnson

said. The overall crime rate in Volusia County has dropped slightly more than 10 percent since 2001. Mr. Johnson said that there are a number of things that have gone into the large crime reduction. For example, he said the Florida Legislature has given the criminal-justice system more options to keep violent criminals incarcerated longer. Additionally, he said that police training has gotten better, and technology is helping deputies and investigators in many ways. However, Mr. Johnson said that taking full advantage of the positive changes in law enforcement

requires a deep understanding of the department and the county it serves.

"I have institutional knowledge," he said. Among other credits, Mr. Johnson is president of the Florida Sheriff's Association. He's also a graduate of the FBI's National Academy.

Mr. Johnson said as Sheriff he's aimed to curb crime, in large part, by curtailing the demand for drugs.

"We've got to get more money into rehabilitation, especially for our younger people," he said.

"I was abused at age 5 by a caregiver," she said, adding she had very supportive parents to help her through.

"I don't want to see anyone else go through that," Ms. Max said. "No one should go through any abuse."

Ms. Max said she is a retired teacher who also has worked at shelters for abused children for many years.

"I worked for the Kids Zone in DeLand and just decided I wanted to do something on a local level," she said.

"My philosophy is it should never hurt to be a child. It is our responsibility

to be their voice," she said.

Christine Davenport, executive director of the Children's Home Society, has talked with Ms. Max and given her a copy of the guidelines for group homes prescribed in the Florida Administrative Code.

The requirements include qualified staff, client-staff ratios, and health and safety requirements, as well as liability insurance when the home is up and running.

"Local building codes also are more stringent for group homes," said Ms. Davenport.

She also said Ms. Max has been very supportive of the Society's residential program over the years.

"This is her dream (Ms. Max) and she has a heart for children," Ms. Davenport

said. Ms. Davenport added there is a need for more parents in Volusia County.

Ms. Max said she feels the system for taking care of young children is too over-worked and her home would house five abused children at any time.

She said she would contract with the state as an emergency shelter, taking children from infants to age 10, but prefers those ages 4-6.

The retired counselor and teacher for abused children said, "We are now asking the community to assist us in creating a safe and healthy environment for these children."

She is seeking new materials, fixtures, and skilled and unskilled labor to get the shelter up and running.

"The community has watched us for eight years and sees what we're doing," said Ms. Max.

She also provides clothing, furniture and other goods to other nonprofit organizations.

"Our shop is a drop-off place for eight agencies," Ms. Max said.

She is encouraged by the offers of help she has received from people and organizations in the community.

Florida — America's great melting pot

Our Florida presents a unique look at the diversity of our great nation. People of varying speech patterns and accents are living side by side here in the Sunshine State. Although physically the state is about as far south as you can go in the U.S., it is not really a Southern state. I believe it began as one, but that ended when air conditioning was invented. As soon as word got out that you could survive the Florida summer heat and humidity with as little as a 110-volt, 5,000BTU window unit, the folks from the north came pouring in. After the border was breached, the flow could not be contained. New towns and subdivisions were built to accommodate the rush. The new communities were advertised all across the country and the world. Two of the largest pre-fab towns in Florida are the nearby Deltona and Palm Coast, but most of Volusia County was settled by people who were not original Floridians. If you visit New England, you will find that maybe 90 percent of the people there are possessed of that distinctive

down east accent. If you look hard enough, you might find some with New York or Alabama accents, but they will be few. Here in Florida, you might talk to people on one block and hear the "aboot" of Canada, the "youse guys" of Brooklyn, the "ya'll of the true South and the "a-yah" of New England. Some of these accents are so foreign that neighbors have trouble communicating. As you may know, I was raised in the Cajun country of Southwest Louisiana, so I know a bit about dealing with accents. If you have ever seen the TV show "Swamp People," where the Cajuns hunt alligators, you know that the printed captions are very useful. Old Troy Landry speaks as though he has a constant mouthful of gumbo, but I understand him perfectly. When I worked in the Chicago area, the Mid-Westerners liked to claim no

accent at all. Wrong, Polish sausage breath! The Chicagoans have a very distinct accent as portrayed by the Bear fans on the TV show Saturday Night Live. I can listen to a person for 30 seconds and tell you if they have called Chicago home. Texas is another place with a distinct speech pattern. There is a mix of Southerness and Mexican and very easy to recognize. Californians may all look like news anchors, but they too have a different flair for the English language. There the dudes are gnarly and the chicks are bitchin'.

I have to admit when it comes to speech patterns, I am very prejudiced. A thick New York or Boston accent just hurts my ears. I can deal with it, but not for long. When I was but a lad and drafted into Uncle Sam's Army, I was thrown into a barracks with fellows from all across America. Boys being boys, eventually someone played a nasty prank on me and made me very mad. So mad that I took the kid from Manhattan outside and taught him to have a little respect for the south. When another G. I. informed me that the New

York boy was not my antagonist, I really didn't care. Anyone who talked like that deserved a good butt-whippin'. Eventually I mellowed. Meeting my wife Lana helped a lot, but it was not easy. You see, when we met in Ormond Beach in 1973, she had just moved down from New Jersey and had a heavy Jersey accent. That sound was like fingernails on a blackboard to me. It was to be the biggest obstacle to our union, but she was just so doggone cute. I had to go for it. Luckily over the 38 years of our marriage, her accent has softened. I suppose living with an "aw shucks" guy like me had to rub off on her (heaven forbid it worked the other way). No, these days I have become more lenient to the Northern immigrants whom I encounter in my neighborhood and around the county. Still, whenever I find someone possessed of that true liltin' "Song of the South," I have to linger. A good ole southern accent is like music to my ears. Some of ya'll Yankees are all right, but I'm fixin' to tell you, dad gummit, ya'll sure do talk funny!



Program tracks computer if it's stolen

We live in an age where even the most basic laptop is still powerful enough to perform the typical tasks that users demand.

And with features such as built-in wireless and enormous hard drives, the reasons for getting a full-blown desktop machine are getting fewer and fewer.

All of the things that people are used to doing on a desktop machine work on most laptops with the advantage of not being tied down to a desk.

With a typical laptop you have the freedom to work anywhere you can pick up a wireless signal. If you work at home, then there is no need to be tethered to a desk in the far corner of the house. Bring the laptop out into the living room or (even better) out by the pool. Or pack a bag and head on down to the local coffee house and get some work done there.

It's OK, stretch your legs, be free.

There's no doubt about it, portability is one of the major reasons people get laptops. But the convenience of portability is a two-edged sword. For instance, have you ever "misplaced" your desktop? Have you ever worried that someone would break into your car and steal your desktop?

Having your laptop turn up missing is a sickening feeling. Whether it's been misplaced or stolen, not finding your machine where you left it can be the beginning of a really bad day. The moment you realize your machine is lost a number of things go through your head: is my password strong enough and when was the last time I backed anything up are often the first things that go through your head.

Unfortunately, because laptops are so portable, things such as misplacing them or having them stolen obviously happen more than their desk-bound counterparts. But there is something you can do about it.

Fire up your web browser and go to www.preyproject.com (no hyphens). Take a look at a free program called Prey that can help you should the unthinkable happen.

Prey is like "Lojack" for your computer. The free version allows you to track up to three computers and their pro version allows you to track up to 500 comput-

ers at a time (great for small businesses with laptops distributed to the staff) in the event that they go missing.

Setting it up is simple; create a free account and then download a small and lightweight application from the Preyproject website and install it on the computer that you want to track. Then, should your machine turn up missing, go back to the Preyproject.com website and log into the free account that you just created.

From the web interface you should see the computer listed as a monitored device. Click on the icon representing your computer and this will bring you to a configuration page with one key control listed at the top the "mark as missing" switch. Throw that switch to the "missing: yes" setting and click the save changes button and then wait. You now have a much better chance of recovering your laptop than you had without running Prey.

What happens behind the scenes is the laptop is looking out across the Internet to the PreyProject control signal. When you mark the laptop as "missing" in the Prey control panel the Prey program sees that it's listed as

missing and starts sending reports back. You can change the interval of the reports, but the information it sends is what's going to help you recover your equipment.

Prey uses either the device's GPS or the nearest WiFi hotspots to triangulate and grab a fix on its location and also takes a picture of the thief with your laptop's webcam.

The system will also capture screen shots and system information. You may be able to catch the thief as he uses your stolen system to log into Facebook or email. You can also trigger certain events such as wiping stored passwords or putting up a message stating that the computer is stolen and to call you.

Now I'm sure some of you are probably thinking none of that will do any good if the thief wipes out the hard drive and this is true, but the fact remains that a program such as Prey (especially for free) does even the odds somewhat. You will have a much better chance of recovering your machine with Prey than without it.

Looking gloomy in the business sector

Some disturbing information from Altamira Village project – the developers are going forward with an additional four-unit building despite only having one tenant signed up.

The building is next to the CVS Pharmacy, so it will have Dunlawton Avenue frontage, but adding more empty storefronts to an area already overloaded with them isn't good. We had started to see some progress in Volusia County on filling up the empty spaces. There are only so many national chains that generate high volume business looking to locate in the county, so you have to count on some local businesses to fill the space.

That brings to mind someone like Richard David and his funky music shop on Nova Road in South Daytona. Richard mostly looks at his shop as a hobby and isn't looking for high-volume business, but if your kid wants to learn guitar and you're looking for an inexpensive instrument and sheet music, it's a great place to go. He probably isn't paying that high a rent at the strip center at 2250 Nova Road, but his business, and hundreds of others like it in Volusia County, definitely couldn't pay the high price that a new strip center on Dunlawton would charge. So with half the market, or more, out of reach, a new strip center with just one tenant could sit empty for quite some time.

Therein lies the cause of local economic angst. When people see a lot of empty

storefronts, they think there's something wrong with the economy. They can't see that an area has become overbuilt. But what can be done about it? Sadly, there's nothing a county or its citizens can do. A private developer has the right to build what they want on land they've acquired. All you can hope is the developer adheres to the local market situation and isn't looking to just poach businesses from existing centers.

The business news was mostly bad, or at least not good, following a Fourth of July holiday that had a lot of area merchants smiling. But July's festivities quickly return to a long, hot summer where the drive to do more is tempered by the stifling heat. Still, there are a few cool breezes blowing. Consider this tidbit from Stirling Sotheby's International Realty. Rachel McGrath and Debbie Keilin in the firm's Spruce Creek Fly-In Marketing Center have had four recent sales totaling \$2.2 million to foreign buyers.

- The four sales include:
- A golf course residence at Spruce Creek Fly-In that sold for \$450,000 to buyers from Heilongjiang, China.
 - A hangar home at Spruce

Creek Fly-In that sold to Argentine aviation enthusiasts for \$545,000.

- A waterfront luxury home on the Intracoastal Waterway off Peninsula Drive in Port Orange that sold to a Swedish couple for \$975,000.
- A two-bedroom ocean-front condominium in Daytona Beach that sold to a couple from Ontario, Canada, for \$152,500.

Another eye-popping deal was the Mallards of Brandywine. CFLP Mallards LLC, an entity of Och-Ziff Capital Management of New York, acquired the 168-unit apartment complex in DeLand in March for \$6 million. Och-Ziff just flipped it to private investors for \$7.75 million. Cole Whitaker and Hall Warren of Hendricks & Partners of Orlando negotiated the deal on behalf of the seller.

Back to the gloom: Despite continued high seat occupancy, Daytona Beach International Airport still has only eight commercial flights, according to the July flight schedule. Delta Air Lines has five daily flights to Atlanta and US Airways has three daily flights to Charlotte, N.C.

Initial claims for unemployment compensation were at 1,868 in June, compared to 2,102 in June 2011. While the decline is welcome, it still shows there are a lot of struggling businesses out there. If claims could ever get back down

closer to 1,000 a month, then it would signal that business is robust and hiring more workers than it is laying people off.

DeBary got some good news with Springview CommerceCenter picking up another business. Alabama-based Hydra Water Service has bought an office/warehouse there for \$935,000 and moving its Florida operations from Stanford.

On the restaurant beat, Mel's Diner has opened at Gulfstream Village in Port Orange. Sadly the owner's name isn't Mel or Alice or even Flo — it is Phyllis Dessoye. But judging by all the other area diners that only open for breakfast and lunch, it probably should do well. Another place is trying the building with the A-frame center at 2225 S. Ridgewood Ave. in South Daytona. Riff Raff's Flip Flop Bar and Grill definitely has a stand-out moniker. It's also another good place for live music. As always it's impossible for little ole me to keep up with all the restaurants' opening and closing, so if you see something new, please send me an e-mail with a few details.

Individually designed weight loss is simple, balanced, time-tested

One look at Anne Rabeaux would persuade anyone to order whatever she's having for breakfast, lunch and dinner. Maybe even Brussels sprouts. But the owner of the newly opened Physicians Weight Loss Centers office in Ormond Beach said there is an easier way for you — yes you — to lose weight. She's tanned, trim and toned with clear blue eyes which light up easily, conveying enthusiasm for everything she talks about, especially her profession.

A native of France and licensed nutritionist there, Ms. Rabeaux came to the United States six years ago. A passion for wellness and helping others drove her to become a licensed practical nurse and phlebotomist. She graduated with honors from Daytona State College, worked for two years as a hospice nurse and was determined to find a way to help people live happier, healthier lives.

"I wanted to open my own weight loss franchise, but due to my health background, I didn't want to follow any crazy weight loss programs," Ms. Rabeaux said.

Physicians Weight Loss Centers was founded in 1979 by Chuck Sekeres. His desire to help unite people with healthier lifestyles inspired him to create medically supervised, nutritionally sound weight loss and management programs. The formulas worked and

PWLC locations began to surface across the country.

"Patients come in and say they did this program 20 years ago in another state and it worked. They say, 'You're here!' And they want to try it again," Ms. Rabeaux said.

She explained the problem, and the solution, co-exist in the DNA, is the hereditary material in humans and almost all other organisms.



altogether."

Daily meal plans and weekly grocery lists, which provide choices and substitution options galore, are designed to make the program easy to incorporate.

"The plan is simple and well-written, as well as medically supervised," she said. "That's why it has worked for 33 years."

Prior to the maintenance phase there is a second medical consultation, EKG and blood work analysis. Ms. Rabeaux said this allows the doctor to validate the plan in place.

Human chorionic gonadotropin, or HCG, is a hormone often controversially associated with rapid weight loss. Although the center's doctors may refer it for some patients, Ms. Rabeaux said she much prefers the individually adapted weight loss plans.

"If they really want it, we offer it and they'll be seen by a doctor, but I'd much rather go the natural route with foods people have been eating all of their lives," she said. "My first idea is education. Let's start with a diet adapted to you."



De Vinci's serves up old-fashioned and authentic Italian excellence

Two things you need to know before you visit DeVinci's Italian Restaurant & Pizzeria: First, bring a hearty appetite; and second, have a craving for some of the best Italian food in town. Located on North U.S.1 in Ormond Beach, DeVinci's is a must for those who are looking for authentic Italian fare.

Owner Dominick Falletta knows the joy of preparing good food. But how he got into the business is a story all its own. It began 45 years ago when he immigrated to the U.S. from his home in Palermo, Sicily. Soon after, he found work at one of the most famous dining establishments in New York --- 'Mama Leone's'. Seven years later, he was

working for Famous Ray's, a well-known pizzeria in Greenwich Village. In time, however, Dominick Falletta was ready for a change. He moved to Florida and opened his own restaurant 'ouch of Italy in New Smyrna Beach. After 12 years of operation, he sold the business and moved to Ormond Beach, where he opened another restaurant, Bella Sera, in the Trails Shopping Center. Eventually, he sold it, then retired.

But retirement for Mr. Falletta was short-lived. It didn't take long for "the itch" (as he put it) to return. When a restaurant called 'DeVinci's' became available, he saw an opportunity to once again do what he loves --- prepare and serve quality Italian food. In October 2010, Dominick Falletta became chief and chef of yet another restaurant ven-

ture. On the day I arrived at DeVinci's, I was warmly greeted by co-owner, Tom Zahnen, and server, Chelsea Graver, who has been with the business since it opened. A short while later, I was introduced to Mr. Falletta and his son, Marco, who also tends to the business. I then settled into a booth in the mid-section of the restaurant. As I would soon find out, dining at DeVinci's isn't just a meal --- it's an experience.

The atmosphere at DeVinci's allows a relaxing, unhurried pace. I started with a glass of wine. From there, it was perfection all the way. The menu offers a "what's what" of familiar Italian mainstays --- calzones, stromboli, pasta dishes, baked dishes, seafood, and more.

There is also an ample choice of appetizers, such as fried cheese ravioli and garlic knots; and salads, such as Greek, spinach and antipasto.

And of course, there is pizza. At DeVinci's, the crust and sauce are both homemade, and each pizza is hand-crafted, then topped according to customer choice. The list of toppings includes items such as chicken, shrimp, artichokes and eggplant. In addition, DeVinci's offers two types of pizza: New York style, thin crust, in three sizes (personal, medi-

um and large), and Sicilian, or deep dish, at a sizable 12 x18 inches. There is also pizza by the slice. Five specialty pizzas are offered as well: Bianco, Meaty, Hawaiian, Alfredo Carbonara and Chicken Parmigiana.

Another item on DeVinci's menu is "Marco's Stromboli Challenge," which goes like this: Order a 3-foot long stromboli loaded with toppings for \$22.99 and if you can eat the whole thing, sauce included, in 30 minutes or less, it's free. Though many people have tried, only three have ever finished the 'Challenge,' one of whom added a cannoli! OMG!

DeVinci's also offers dishes that are not on the

menu. Posted on the board the day I was there were two specials --- Spinach Cannelloni and Penne Rustica. Both sounded great, and very tempting; but my palate called for eggplant, so I stayed with the menu.

When I was ready to order, my server, Chelsea, surprised me with a plate of garlic knots and a cup of Chef Falletta's homemade marinara sauce. Absolutely delicious! I could have dined on that alone! But since everything at DeVinci's is homemade breads, sauces, soups and more, I decided on variety. I couldn't resist a slice of pizza, New York style, with added mushrooms. I then ordered a small garden salad made

of crisp Romaine lettuce. For the main course, I chose the "Godmother Combo," a combination of manicotti, stuffed shells and eggplant florentine. Not long after, the entree arrived --- hot and bubbly, and brimming with melted cheese. This was not a micro warm-up (DeVinci's doesn't use microwave ovens) --- this was straight from a real oven. It was wonderful! And authentic.

But it wasn't over yet. Once again, a surprise --- this time a homemade cannoli. It, too, was hard to resist.

In addition to the evening fare, DeVinci's serves lunch from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. The menu includes

Italian subs, pasta dishes and baked dishes; also lunch specials, Monday through Saturday. New to the lunch selection is a chicken-bacon flatbread, plus wheat wraps --- Greek, Italian and chicken Caesar. Take-out and delivery is also available.

For those who like excellent Italian food prepared the old-fashioned way, DeVinci's is it.

Enjoying the Daytona Beach Pier and its fishing

I took a trip to Main Street to get my first look at the newly remodeled fishing pier and was duly impressed. With a fishing rod in one hand and a pad and pencil in the other, I was able to stroll out onto the planks unencumbered. No gates or fees to negotiate. The pier offers free fishing daily from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. in the summer months and from 7 a.m. until 5p.m. in the winter. Hallelujah! Someone finally got it right. I did not see bait being sold on the pier, but I'm pretty sure that will come. When I arrived, it was nearly low tide and the Atlantic was very calm. At 7:30 in the morning there were already

20 fishermen trying their luck, and a quarter of those were kids. Countless strollers supplied a continuous stream of questions for the anglers. "What is that thing? What do you usually catch here? Can you eat that? And do you ever catch sharks?" were the most common queries. I met a nice young couple who was

out for a walk before breakfast. Chris and Sandy Ledbetter were down from Crossville, Tenn., to attend the races and had decided to linger in their nearby hotel to enjoy The World's Most Famous Beach. I gave them a little racing history and pointed to places where the land speed records had been set. We spoke of the fishing and I admitted that my own efforts had so far been futile. We watched a few nice whiting come up and I mentioned that they were the most common fish in the surf and pretty good eating, too. We spoke of the pelagic species like mackerel and blue fish that often provide action on the local

piers. The Ledbetters were appropriately impressed with our area and told me they would love to move here. Together we watched dolphin playing in the waves and then a nearby angler landed a spadefish. The fisherman snapped a quick picture, showed it to us and then released it. Spadefish are a nice species to show to tourists, for they are as close to a tropical as we have swimming locally. I was hoping on my first visit to the pier to speak with a fisherman who had fished it on opening day. I imagined that after being closed for several years, there must have been some nice fish lingering below. I was not

able to find that person, but one fellow told me that the construction workers had done very well before it opened. Each day before and after work they had landed nice reds and black drum. I knew it! I missed out. The Daytona Beach pier is in nice shape. The floor planks are new and the rails are sturdy. It looks as though it is ready for the tempests that will eventually test it. I enjoyed being out once more in the place where I have caught so many fish and once even saw a concert from the early 1960s group, The Shirelles. The parking there is iffy and you will have to work at it some but

the value of a fishing pier to a Florida community is incalculable. It provides entertainment for young and old and inspires tourists like the Ledbetters to dream of living here. As an aid to the Chamber of Commerce, it is invaluable. Oh, by the way, if you go, you may also notice that there is a pretty nice restaurant, there as well.

Columnist finds visit to friend's recommended course well worth trip

I've learned a valuable lesson already this summer. When a trusted friend has been telling you that you should play a certain golf course because it is likely to be one of the best you have ever played, listen to that friend.

My friend, Bill Fiedler, works for Billy Casper Golf Management and for years he has been trying to get me to play at Victoria Hills Golf Club in DeLand, just off Interstate-4 west of Daytona. I've passed on the opportunity many times simply because it's a little farther than I like to go for just a round of golf. After teeing it up there a few weeks ago, I should have loaded up my clubs and made the drive a long time ago.

Victoria Hills GC was designed by award-winning designer, Ron Garl, a good friend of mine and Florida resident. It's not every day that a golf course architect gets such a wonderful canvas to work with. Ron made great use of the rolling hills and foliage, as well as the mature oaks and pines to create a spectacular course.

"When you get a place like this you try really hard not to screw it up," Ron told me. "We're very proud of what we created at Victoria Hills."

He has every right to be proud. When my group finished our round we had nothing but praise for the course and the staff.

The par-72 course plays anywhere from 4,900 to 7,149 yards long depending on which set of tees you choose. Garl has always prided himself in creating a course that challenges golfers of all abilities, while still allowing them to enjoy their round. He hit a home run here.

The course winds through some of the most beautiful terrain in Florida. It's not often we see elevation changes such as those at Victoria Hills, or the variety of trees and foliage.

While the course is part of a community, care was taken by the St. Joe Company, which owns the development, to allow Garl and his team to build the course on some of the best portions of the land available. Thanks to that care, you will hardly notice that there are homes along the course, as they sit well away from play. The course has a wonderful "parkland" type feel to it.

The holes offer a huge

variety of ways to play them. There are doglegs right and left, as well as short and long holes.

Thanks to the elevation changes, proper club selection is a must. More than once, I found myself wishing I had taken a different club for my shot.

There are a couple of severe doglegs that tempt one to "cut the corner," leaving a much shorter approach. There are also a few holes where brute strength and distance are required. The balance in the design makes for a wonderful round. You'll find yourself using every club in your bag, as well as most of the shots in your resume.

Victoria Hills GC has ample room around the greens and off the fairways for those who tend to miss their preferred target a few times each round. Once on the green though, you will need to bring your best putting stroke. The greens are large with many gentle undulations and are each perfectly manicured.

The finishing holes begin with one of the best par-3s in the state. Depending on the tees you are playing from, the 14th hole can require one to use any club in the bag from a wedge to a long fairway wood.

Next is the shortest par-5 on the course where you

can make up for the stroke you may have just given away. A trio of large oaks guards the center of the fairway and a drive to the left of them awards you with a short second shot.

The 17th hole is another risk-reward hole. This dogleg right has a huge bunker guarding the corner. Hitting your drive over the bunker gives you a wedge into the green. It's a great hole if you need to make up some ground on your partners.

The finishing hole is my favorite on the course. This stunning, but long, uphill par-5 is guarded by numerous bunkers. The green is framed by magnificent oaks and pines reminding you one final time just how glorious this track of land truly is.

Currently Victoria Hills GC is running special rates through September. You can reach them at (386) 738-6000, or online at www.victoriahillsgolf.com.

Victoria Hills is definitely one round of golf that I found to be well worth the trip.
