Daytona seeks to charge for city sports leagues

DAYTONA BEACH — When Thomas Rowland was young, decades ago, city-owned fields were open to practice and play on. They were never inaccessible.

Now, the city looks to charge little league programs, such as the Daytona Beach Pop Warner Association, a usage fee for the first time ever to practice and compete on the fields at Derbyshire Park.

Mr. Rowland, local Pop Warner commissioner, said if the city imposes the fees, it could cripple his program and leave hundreds of kids unable to participate, since they'd have to increase reg-

istration costs.

"If they charge us anything we might as well shut our program down," he said, "because we just don't have that kind of money. We're not supporting kids when we're taking away programs like this. If we don't take care of these kids now, the police chief is going to be taking care of them."

Percy Williamson, the city's director of leisure services, told Mr. Rowland the program would be subject to a daily \$75 fee for the use of each field at Derbyshire. Needing four fields, the daily total would reach \$300 for just a practice day. Game days would cost the league \$400, after allocating \$1,000 for officials.

Mr. Rowland has already created a schedule

for the upcoming season, and presented it to the Volusia and Brevard County Pop Warner Association last week in Titusville.

"You just can't wait in the ninth hour to try to

County studying new budget

Council to set property tax rate at next meeting

VOLUSIA COUNTY — County council members went home with about 700 pages of proposed budget to digest.

"We'll be digging through this thing for the next few months," Volusia County Council member Josh Wagner, Port Orange, said.

At its last regular meeting Thursday, July 12, County Manager Jim Dinneen gave the council his proposed 2012-2013 budget.

"What I'm recommending is the starting point," he said to council members. "The (tentative tax) rates could not go up, but they could go down."

At its next regular meeting, the council will have to adopt an initial property-tax rate.

The manager's proposed operating budget is just more than \$582 million, about \$7.8 million less than the 2011-2012 operating budget, \$590.2 million. About a third of the operating budget will come from property taxes, around \$192 million.

Mr. Dinneen is asking to council to tentatively adopt the general-fund rolled-back property-tax rate, \$5.89 per \$1,000 of assessed non-

Four vie for Daytona Beach Mayor

DAYTONA BEACH — Gwen Azama-Edwards thinks the image of her city is in need of a makeover.

Right now she sees disconnect between City Hall and residents, a business-unfriendly climate, and crime-ravaged neighborhoods — things she believes can be corrected by taking action rather than just talking about it.

"I believe in this city being the best it can be," she said. "... That's not just talking, that's also doing."

And she said that's how she plans to act if elected mayor.

Ms. Azama-Edwards, 63, is one of four citizens in the running for

DAYTONA BEACH — Two years ago, Derrick Henry was embroiled in scandal after he was arrested on charges related to voter fraud. Today, he's climbing back up in an attempt to serve the City Commission again — this time, as mayor.

Mr. Henry, 43, is running in a four-person mayoral contest that also includes Zone 1 commissioner Edith Shelley, former commissioner Gwen Azama-Edwards, and motel owner Fred Hoffmann. The former commissioner won elections in 2008 and 2010, but was brought down in scandal when he was arrested on charges of con-

DAYTONA BEACH — Fred Hoffmann has never held elected office or served on any municipal boards. But the mayoral candidate sees that as a strength, not a weakness.

"We don't need people with government experience, that's why some things never change," he said. "You should demand improvement. ... I believe I'm the only one who can effect that out of the people who are running."

The New York native is one of four candidates in the running to replace the outgoing Glenn Ritchey as the city's mayor. He's up against Zone 1 commissioner

tell us that you're going to make a change. You just can't do it that way," Mr. Rowland said.

Some help might be on the way, though. An inter-local agreement between the city of Daytona Beach and Volusia County School Board could soon allow for leagues to access public school facilities in order to offset an increased rental rate of Municipal Stadium proposed by the city.

"I think it will allow for Municipal Stadium to continue to have high school activity, which is a good thing, and it will also enable other programs to utilize other facilities that have already been built," said Saralee Morrissey, director of site acquisitions and inter-

governmental coordination for the county school board.

Mr. Rowland has also informed the Pop Warner Association that the city would allow the Daytona Beach leagues to use the fields at Hinson and Campbell middle schools at no charge. The Daytona Beach City Commission will have a final vote on the agreement at their first meeting in August.

"Football fields are at a premium right now, so to have these two available will be a big help," Mr. Williamson said.

However, Hinson and Campbell facilities don't meet certain requirements, according to the Pop Warner Association commissioners. Without access to restrooms, a concession stand and a proper score board, the fields can't be used for football games.

The other 12 commissioners in the association were shocked to learn of a possible fee for the Daytona Beach leagues, Mr. Rowland said. None of the 12 programs pay a fee to use their local facilities.

The Daytona Beach Pop Warner Association also incorporates tutoring in their program, which requires all players maintain a 2.0 GPA in order to play, but the city might impose a charge to use the facilities for tutoring as well.

"If I don't have a building for (the tutors), I can't have them sit out in the sun try-

ing to teach a kid," Mr. Rowland said. "The city of Daytona should be embarrassed the way we deal with our kids here."

Mainland and Seabreeze high schools will continue to use Municipal Stadium for athletics, and pay a certain rental rate that is agreed upon through contract by the start of the school year, and theoretically, the city will be able to house programs and run leagues using existing facilities.

The agreement will be effective for one year, and either party can terminate the agreement.

exempt value. According to the Volusia County Property Appraiser, the average home is just more than \$103,000.

The current rate for the operating budget is \$5.78 per \$1,000. The rolled back rate is the tax rate that would generate the same amount of ad valorem taxes as the previous year, minus new construction. Due to reduced property values and slowed construction in

recent years, the rolled-back rates have been increasing.

The property appraiser has tentatively valued Volusia at \$23.7 billion, the fifth year of decreases. In 2007, the appraiser valued the county at more than 43 billion.

The county council will

have to adopt the 2013-2014 budget by Oct. 1, the start of the fiscal year. It will have budget adoption hearings at its first and second meetings in September.

Quality people are not going to sign on to direct and storyboard for a show about people who make fish tanks or a bunch of obnoxious young people who are forced to live together.

Unless we stage a revolt, we will be forever stuck with cameras following around the wives of hip-hop stars, athletes, mobsters, the Kardashians, Gene Simmons or Paris Hilton. No doubt the profit margin for those gems is through the roof, so we are bound to get more of the same. As I am writing this, I am hearing that Jessica Simpson will soon be back. Maybe she will reprise her bit about chicken or tuna. So far that's about as good as reality TV has had to offer.



Political novice throws hat in ring for County Council

VOLUSIA — A political newcomer, Shannon McLeish hopes to fill the District 4 Volusia County Council seat. She said she's not a polished professional politician.

"I'm concerned for my family and my community," she said. "I'm not a politician and have a deep seated fear of speaking in public."

Ms. McLeish, a Florida native, moved to the area from Winter Park in 2001. She's a small business owner, a freelance writer and editor working at her Ormond Beach home. She graduated from the Univer-

sity of North Florida.

"In our neighborhood, we have houses a block away from city hall with signs that say 'Fore-closed,'" she said. "Just about everyone I know, their home is worth less than they paid for it."

She said in the midst of the persisting housing crash and slow economic upturn, local government has the best opportunity to help

spiracy to commit voter fraud and illegally obtaining absentee ballots.

He said his actions were "a mistake of the heart" motivated to increase voter turnout and his supporters believe the charges did not represent the situation.

"I always try to distance myself from it," he said. "I always try to let people know who I am to inform them of the legitimacy of my candidacy and the real issues that face the city."

Although the charges were dropped, the incident resulted in him losing his city commission seat and resigning from his job with Volusia County Schools after he was reassigned from his assistant principal position at Mainland High School.

Moving forward, Mr. Henry wished to give elected office another try because serving his community is "a natural fit" for him.

A lifelong resident of Daytona Beach, Mr. Henry developed a taste for leadership and serving the community early in his life. He was class president at Mainland High School and actively volunteered for United Way and the Special Olympics. As an adult, he gave 5,000 volunteer hours from 2004 to 2010 in the Derbyshire neighborhood where he grew up, and ran a program at Daytona State College for at-risk youth that prepared them for college.

Mr. Henry strongly believes improving infrastructure such as the city's roads, sewage and drainage

the job of the city's top elected official in the Aug. 14 primary, along with Edith Shelley, Derrick Henry and Fred Hoffmann.

She was a city employee for 15 years, serving as city clerk and assistant to the city manager. Currently she is the president of a consulting firm that provides guidance on politics and ethics, and hosts the radio show "Truth with Gwen Azama-Edwards" on WELE 1380 AM.

She also served two years as city commissioner for Zone 4 from 2003 to 2005 and ran for mayor unsuccessfully in the past. During her time as a city commissioner, city leaders approved economic incentives aimed at bringing new businesses to the area, she said.

Bringing new business into town remains a top priority, and Ms. Azama-Edwards would help stimulate that by promoting existing city staff to economic development positions. If this can be done, she said, the city could play more of a role than Volusia County leaders in

economic development initiatives.

But economic development isn't just about new business. That also comes through historic preservation and beautification efforts, she said.

"They too are part of the economic engine," she said.

If elected, Ms. Azama-Edwards said she plans to have "action oriented" visioning summits within her first 100 days in office that would address issues among residents, business owners and young people in the community.

Her goal is to "promote the things that make it great and work to improve on the things that make it not so great."

She supports the goals of the city's police, code enforcement officers and community group in their efforts to reduce crime and keeping the city clean.

"We've got to clean up the city, not just in terms of trash," she said. "We've got to clean it up in terms of housing, infrastructure, the types of activity we even allow to go on in the city. They (stories that portray Daytona Beach negatively) end up on the Inter-

Mr. Hoffmann, 60, said he's running because he wants to make the city operate more efficiently, which can help lower taxes. For example, he supports having the city's fire department handle non-emergency transport calls instead of the county's EVAC ambulances.

His belief that Daytona Beach should be run like a business is rooted from his background. He has a business management degree and has been self-employed his entire professional career.

He is the owner of the Sun Plaza Motel on Ridge-wood Avenue and several rental properties; in addition, he is a licensed real estate broker for First-Trust Realty Inc.

If elected, Mr. Hoffmann would fight for relaxed code enforcement in the city. Officers in the city's code enforcement department are cross-trained as police officers and have the authority to arrest people, but he

believes the job of code enforcement should be limited to inspections.

Lowering crime "on the same budget" is another of his top priorities. Staffing additional patrol officers at regular pay and hiring new officers that are city residents could give the city's police department 60 percent more labor hours without the need for overtime, he said.

"You can have more personnel without increasing the budget," he said.

Mr. Hoffmann wants to see city leaders attract new business by offering tax breaks and waiving building permit fees. Orlando and Kissimmee offer similar incentives, a reason he believes businesses are more attracted to those cities than Daytona Beach.

"If Daytona does nothing to attract companies, that's exactly what they will get - nothing - just as in years past," he said.

Mr. Hoffmann said the area's homeless population should have the right to public protection "whether they choose to be homeless or because of

former commissioners Derrick Henry and Gwen Azama-Edwards and newcomer Fred Hoffmann for the mayor's seat in the Aug. 14 primary. She currently serves as a city commissioner representing Zone 1, where she's served since 2010. She resigned to run for the mayor's seat in March.

She has been an active volunteer in Daytona Beach for since she moved down to the area 33 years ago with her husband, Denis. Her past service includes time as chairman of the Vision Board, chair and vice chair of the Planning Board, and a member of the Downtown/Balough Road Redevelopment Board.

Ms. Shelley and her husband Denis, both natives of San Antonio, Texas, work together in a law firm, Lega-

cy Estate Planners, where Ms. Shelley serves as government relations specialist. But it's her job as city commissioner that takes up most of her time.

"When people follow me around, they're quite surprised at what my day looks like," she said.

Ms. Shelley's top priorities are expanding economic opportunities, safer streets, and promoting city pride.

"The No. 1 overall goal is to improve the quality of life for the citizens of Daytona Beach," she said. "When people think of places they love to visit, it's places where people love to live. Our priorities need to be focused in that area."

On the economic front, she supports promoting the International Speedway Boulevard corridor's economic infrastructure as an asset, particularly due to its proximity to Interstate 4, Daytona International Speedway, and Daytona

Beach International Airport, and wants to work with colleges and universities to recruit businesses that meet their graduates' skills.

She said infrastructure improvements, such as an upcoming \$20 million Orange Avenue restoration project, would be key to economic development and upholding appearance standards. Finding grant funding to help support those improvements remains a priority among commissioners, she said.

Ms. Shelley supports improving customer service within City Hall and making government more accessible and accountable.

To provide for greater accountability, she wants to improve the process of evaluating city employees such as the city manager so that, if an employee receives a low rating, the evaluation offers suggestions for improvement to bring that

rating up.

"We should have a policy in place saying, 'How do we bring that 3 to a 4?'" she said.

A more careful evaluation of the city's budget would be a priority as well. Inspired by budgetary processes in Port Orange, she suggested starting work on the budget for the following fiscal year as soon as the budget for the current fiscal year is adopted, as well as spend a daylong session over a weekend to analyze different departments and programs.

Ms. Shelley said accountability and accessibility on the part of local government will help move the city forward into the future.

"I will continue to ride my bike throughout Daytona Beach (if elected)," she said. "I will continue to be accessible."

The good, the bad and the ugly

Volusia County's employment report for June looked like a "spaghetti western" – good, bad and ugly.

The good is the number of Volusia workers employed is up by about 2,700 from June 2011. The bad is there are still about 23,000 county workers unemployed. The ugly is the non-agricultural jobs report that shows the number of jobs in Volusia is down 1,300 from last year.

Obviously, most of the jobs Volusia workers are finding are outside the county. Fortunately the big metro areas of Jacksonville and Orlando are adding jobs. Orlando, which includes Lake, Orange, Osceola and Seminole counties, was up 9,800 jobs in June from a year ago. Jacksonville, which includes Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau and St. Johns counties, was up 3,200 jobs.

There is some hope for Volusia with manufacturing jobs up 100 from last year. Construction jobs were still down 400 jobs, but with home building continuing to pick up that is bound to change. Retail, which was down 700 jobs from last year, probably will remain down until some big stores open. So far, the only one in sight is the BJ's Wholesale in Port Orange, though. The professional and business services sector, which was down 900 jobs, will continue to be a problem area until there is significant improvement in the economy.

Another bank is joining Chase Bank and PNC Bank in expanding in Volusia County. Chase recently opened its Port Orange branch at 3825 S. Nova Road and earlier this year opened in Ormond Beach. It also has plans to open an office in New Smyrna Beach. It already had offices in DeLand and Orange City. PNC Bank recently opened a new office at 1661 Taylor Road in Port Orange. It also picked up some new offices in acquiring RBC Bank.

Now Tavares-based Reunion Bank is getting in on the action, expanding its Port Orange office by 2,000 square feet. While Reunion Bank, or builder Sun Glow Construction, would not respond to requests for comment, it's a good guess that Reunion is planning a big new office at 785 W. Granada Blvd. in Ormond Beach. In its summer newsletter, Reunion said it would be adding an Ormond Beach office. Sun Glow, which is doing the Port Orange work for Reunion, has submitted plans to the city of Ormond Beach for a two-story bank building.

Daytona Beach-based Brown & Brown Inc. report-

ed another successful quarter, generating revenue of \$290.9 million, up 17.9 percent from \$246.8 million in the second quarter of 2011. The insurance brokerage network's net income was at \$42.5 million, up 11.5 percent from \$37.04 million last year. Yet, it didn't meet analysts' expectations. The company earned 29 cents per share of its stock, but the consensus of analysts who follow the company expected 31 cents per share. The company is on track to stay above \$1 billion in revenue this year, but is a long way from its new goal of \$2 billion in revenue.

The other public company based in Volusia – Consolidated-Tomoka Land Co. – also reported a successful quarter financially. The Daytona Beach company's revenue for the second quarter was \$4.8 million, up 30 percent from \$3.7 million in the second quarter of 2011. Net income was at \$599,600, up from \$318,800 last year.

After two or three months of little or no gains, Daytona Beach International Airport saw a 12 percent increase in passenger traffic in June at 49,860, compared to 44,687 in June 2011.

Builders are starting to go a little farther out on a limb,

building more speculative housing. Henin Homes of Maitland is building a spec house at Rivera Bella in DeBary with 1,928 square feet of living space and priced at \$218,900. Also there, the company is building a model home called the Turino that has 3,369 square feet of living space and is priced from \$329,900. At Halifax Plantation in Ormond Beach, Vanacore Construction is starting to build a spec house at 3242 Tralee Drive.

On the restaurant beat, Tommy Johns Grill has opened at 1064 Ocean Shore Blvd. in Ormond-by-the-Sea. Now I know what you're thinking, but no, it's not named after the baseball player. The owner is John Georgopoulos and his father's name is Tommy and his son's name is Tommy. It's largely a Chicago-style restaurant with lots of hot dogs, sausage and beef, but also serves plenty of other items. On the other end of the dining spectrum, here's one I missed. Blau, a Mediterranean grill, has opened at 175 S. Nova Road in Ormond Beach. It serves a unique menu of fine cuisine. Blau is located in the space that was used for a Tijuana Flats, probably one of the few failures of the Orlando-based chain.



Quiet July so far, but so was the season of Andrew

Hi everybody. We are about two months into the Atlantic hurricane season.

The season had a very early start with four named storms before the end of June. Since then, the action has quieted down with no opportunities for a named storm on the immediate horizon.

At present, the conditions in the Atlantic and Caribbean are just not prime for tropical development.

It is important to note that July is normally not a very active month, with the conditions in the Atlantic really starting to come together around mid-August. This will usually happen when the waters

start to heat up and the wind shear is at its lowest. Remember to keep this in mind, as the season progresses.

In 1992, the entire beginning of the season had no named storms. It looked as though it was going to be a quiet season, since nothing was forming in the Atlantic basin. But on Aug. 14, a tropical wave emerged off the coast of Africa. With a large pressure ridge in place, the wave quickly moved west toward the

hurricane breeding grounds.

On Aug. 18, the system began to create a rotation, and the beginning stages of a tropical system were emerging. As the system moved toward the north-west, it ran into an area of extreme wind shear that all but entirely tore the system apart. Hurricane hunters could no longer find a definitive center.

As the low moved toward the west, a high-pressure ridge built across the Southeastern United States at the same time that the wind shear relaxed over the Atlantic. The system began to spin, and on Aug. 22, Hurricane Andrew began his march toward the East Coast. The initial forecast

called for a landfall near Jupiter, with winds of 100 mph. Little did we know, at the time, how far off this forecast was going to be.

As Andrew moved west, it started to become apparent that the ridge was much stronger than originally thought. The system was not going to re-curve at all, but maintain a westerly course instead.

On Aug. 23, Andrew became a Category 5 hurricane, with winds of 155 mph.

As Andrew made landfall near Homestead, the eye wall was smaller and convection had increased. Andrew hit with a vengeance, as the small eye devastated anything in its path. Winds were reported

to gust as high as 200 mph.

This storm not only changed the landscape of South Florida, but it also changed the way insurance companies do business. Many insurers folded under the heavy load that Andrew caused. It was as if an atomic bomb went off.

As the above example shows, a slow July does not mean we should write the season off. Storms can form suddenly and are often unpredictable. Take advantage of this slow period to get your hurricane supplies and to make a plan in case another Andrew ever heads our way.

For the greater part of July, our weather pattern has been fairly dry, due in part to a high-pressure ridge

that has built over the region.

This has helped to suppress the precipitation and thunderstorms.

Some storms have been allowed to form, primarily where the sea breeze boundary forms during the afternoon hours. This is usually prevalent around the I-95 corridor, about 10 miles inland.

This could change as we get into the latter part of July and early August. We are approaching the heart of the rainy season and the peak season for African tropical waves. Be sure to keep your eye to the tropics!

A large crowd, many of them former patients and employees, gathered early in the morning to watch the event. Orlando-based Central Environmental Services, Inc. (CES) conducted the demolition process and implosion and estimates that 75 to 85 percent of the materials generated from the demolition were recycled. Florida Hospital Memorial Medical Center closed the main part of Florida Hospital Ormond Memorial in July 2009, but maintained operations of a cancer center on-site until October 2010, when the new Comprehensive Cancer Center (located across from Florida Hospital Memorial Medical Center in Daytona Beach) was opened.

communities with self-help economic recovery. Ms. McLeish hopes to expand the county council's outreach and accessibility to the public.

"We have to include the public more," she said.

While she's never held an elected or appointed office, Ms. McLeish has served as the chair of Social Justice Committee at her church, the Unitarian Universalist Society of the Daytona Beach Area, Ormond Beach. Additionally, she's represented her church at F.A.I.T.H., Fighting Against Injustice Toward Harmony,

a coalition of numerous area religious organizations that work together to solve social ills. Additionally, the 44-year-old is involved with Occupy Daytona.

Ms. McLeish said the county's economic-development resources and efforts should be aimed at making more locals successful entrepreneurs, rather than trying to attract larger companies to relocated operations or offices to the area. She said if elected, she'd push for the county council to have workshops with small businesses aimed at making more of them.

"I've had a number of small business owners tell me how restrictive the regulations are," Ms. McLeish said. "I want to sit down and have workshops, and say, 'Small businesses, what can we do?'"

She said that if Volusia County helps small businesses to start and thrive, more aspiring entrepreneurs will make their way to the area with ingenious concepts that'll become turn into dollars in the local economy.

"We want to make (Volusia) a place people want to be, and that's small businesses," she said. "How do we empower the community and small businesses to make it a place people want to live?"

Born in Michigan, Mr. Doran moved to Central Florida as a child. He got his law degree from the University of Florida. He first moved to Volusia County in 1978, and was an officer on the Daytona Beach Police Department.

Mr. Doran said if elected, he'd set the county on the path of reduction.

"I'd reduce county control over non-core functions, such as the Ocean Center," he said. "(The county has)

sprawled into controlling a number of government services that are not core government functions. I'd reduce county government."

The Ocean Center — 101 N. Atlantic Ave., Daytona Beach — is a 205,000-square foot convention center the county opened in 1985.

"No one else in the country, that I know of, is doing what we're doing: having the county run (the area's main convention center), and not doing a very good job of it," Mr. Doran said.

The 56-year-old is single and has two adult sons living in the area.

systems must be a priority because he sees poor infrastructure as one reason why residents and businesses are leaving the city.

"We lost 3,000 residents in the last Census count," he said. "As long as you have such attrition you're not going to have an increase in business."

He also supports relaxing impact fees and other "red tape" at City Hall that makes it difficult for new businesses to locate within the city.

Mr. Henry sees a disconnect between residents and city leaders — a position shared by his opponent Gwen Azama-Edwards — and believes the new mayor

must bring in "transformational leadership" that will help the city evolve and bring about greater government transparency.

He believes city employees such as police officers should be required to live in the city to work for the city.

Asked about where he stands on reducing crime, Mr. Henry said he would expand recreation programs and mentoring programs with the aim of keeping at-risk youth off the streets.

"Aside from giving (city staff) the resources to fight crime, we need a mayor who can give alternatives," he said. "You want to have a mayor who can work to create programs and an environment that would reduce crime from happening."

Mr. Henry is married to

Dr. Stephanie Henry. He has a 25-year-old son, Michael, and recently celebrated the birth of his second child, Derrick Jr. Patrick Henry, Mr. Henry's older brother, currently serves as a city commissioner representing Zone 5.

Mr. Henry believes what Daytona Beach needs is a mayor who can unite different sectors of the community on the issues.

"For too long we've had several heads falling against one another, (such as) beachside residents and the black community. They have not been unified. My candidacy I would offer the best opportunity to unify the conflicting elements of Daytona Beach."

Newcomer Ida Wright seeks District 2 seat, change for Volusia County schools

Ida "Lucy Duncan" Wright said she's a mother first. And that's why she's challenging incumbent Dr. Al Williams for his long-held Volusia County School Board District 2 seat on Aug. 14.

"I'm running because I'm a parent," Ms. Wright said in a telephone interview. "Members of the school board are parents, but none of their children are currently in the school system. It's really hard for them to relate to the issues we face today. I have a son in the system."

Ms. Wright, 45, has a Bachelor of Science in business administration from the University of Central Florida and a Master of Business Administration from Stetson University.

She is a business administration instructor and academic assessment coordinator at Bethune-Cookman University College of Business.

"Because of my position at BC, I am well connected with issues facing education. I work primarily with freshmen and I see firsthand many of the deficits students bring with them to college."

Paramount among those deficits, she said, is lack of critical thinking skills. She faults excessive standardized, or "high-stakes", testing. The New York Times Company's website, about.com, defines high-stakes testing as "a single assessment that is given with the knowledge that important decisions or consequences are riding on the result."

Important decisions like funding, and Ms. Wright said she feels strongly about this type of testing's impact on Volusia County schools.

She said freedom in teaching and in learning, as it pertains to creativity and critical thinking skills, has disappeared from today's classrooms due to the use of testing as a "punitive measure" which promotes "regimented thinking" for students and teachers.

"Standardized testing should tell you where you have deficits in curriculum. I am not in favor of testing unless the information from its assessment is used properly," she said. "The purpose of assessment is to determine how to allocate funds and human resources. It should not be used in a punitive manner toward children, teachers and schools; that is your budget driving your curriculum when the curriculum should drive the budget."

In the final analysis, Ms. Wright said, any standardized test should be used as a diagnostic tool to gauge where there is room for improvement.

Ms. Wright said she has found that even high school students who are "college-ready per our current standards" such as those in Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate programs, do not have criti-

cal thinking skills necessary to move to the next level and beyond.

"We make sure they learn what they need to learn for the exam and then they dump the information," she said. "They have not been taught the skill of transferred learning. They need to have education as well as practical experience."

Ms. Wright said she'd like to see partnerships with community businesses for students who are not college-bound.

"I would ask them, 'What are some of the basic skills you see students lacking?' Then we may be able to implement apprenticeships so when they do leave high school they are ready, trained with an understanding of a particular industry and can make a decent living," she said.

As the parent of two sons, one who graduated high school in 2005 and one who is set to graduate in 2017, Ms. Wright said she's been

involved as both parent—active in the Parent-Teacher-Student Association and Student Advisory Council—and educator long enough to understand the problems she sees are not just local. She said action must be taken at the local level first with the ultimate goal in mind: change at state and federal levels.

And the only way to bring about that change, she said, is to vote.

"You need a school board member who is well-rounded and versed, not just in policy," Ms. Wright said. "What type of citizens are we going to have in 10 or 15 years? If we don't fix education, it will impact our quality of life, and that concerns me."

net and extend the wrong image of who we are and what we're about."

Resolving the disconnect between residents and city leaders, she said, would require a new city manager. She believes current city manager Jim Chisholm, who over the last year has sought city management jobs in other cities such as Sarasota, "will have to go ... for the good of the city."

"I don't believe there will be change if we keep him at the helm," she said.

Ms. Azama-Edwards, who is married to The Rev. Larry T. Edwards of Saint John Missionary Baptist Church in Holly Hill and has two sons, Curtis Azama and Anthony Azama, said she believes the major function of government is to enrich people's lives, and she aims to do that if elected.

Lulu's Oceanside Grill celebrates fifth anniversary

On July 30, one of the area's premier eating establishments, LuLu's Oceanside Grill, will celebrate its Quinquennial Anniversary. In the five years since this popular restaurant first opened its doors, LuLu's has made an indelible impression, both on locals and visitors alike. And its easy to see why: The food. The ambience. The comraderie.

Conveniently located near the intersection of Granada Boulevard and A1A, LuLu's is a great choice for excellent food and a relaxing atmosphere. And it all begins as soon as you walk through the double doors.

Just inside is the hostess station, where guests are immediately welcomed. To the left of the station is an open bar and lounge with a number of unique seating arrangements. On one side of the lounge is a span of glass windows that offers a view of the ample-sized patio where, along with the fresh air, customers can enjoy their favorite food or drink. To the right of the station is a short walkway that leads to both the dining area and the outdoor patio.

When my guest and I arrived at LuLu's, we were greeted by the managing partner/owner, Jeff Bartholomew, who then escorted us to a large comfortable booth. Beginning with the back dining room, Mr. DeFilippo pointed out that it can accommodate 60 to 70 people, and that "it's a private room, perfect for parties." The center room has mostly booths — four-seaters and six-seaters, each with a view of the outdoors. A third dining room rounds out LuLu's total seating capacity of 200. But the main attraction is the décor. Gracing the walls of each room are huge posters of "beauties in bathing suits" from the '40s and '50s, plus several old movie posters, many having a beach-fun theme. 


Having fun with tarpon, the silver king of fishes

As I stepped out my front door into the predawn darkness the wall of heat hit me like the exhaust from a Greyhound.

I stood for a minute taking in the stillness before shoving my kayak atop the Explorer. At the end of my street, I slid the Green Peanut into the Halifax and began my paddle across the boat channel.

First light was just breaking behind me over the peninsula. It was breathlessly still and quiet. I knew that the Atlantic — just a bit over a quarter mile away — would be calm on this morning, but on the silent river, I could hear the sound of waves washing up onto the beach.

As I paddled the air was so hot and humid, I could feel the dampness in my lungs.

Across the bay in the Tomoka State Park, campers had managed to keep their fire smoldering all night, probably to keep away the insects. The wispy smoke had traveled up the water's edge, stopping here and there to drape selected trees like the spun silk of catawba worms.

A dog sounded a warning that I was near.

Good dog. Overhead a flight of cormorants flew south in a reverse "V" formation. I wondered how they found their way without a leader.

At my fishing destination the tide had stopped at dead low and nothing was moving. I made a cast with my jig and watched to see how far the rings would travel from the splash. No bait swimming; nothing feeding. I beached the kayak and began to wade the shore.

The water was murky, but with my flip flop-shod feet, I could feel indentations on the bottom where flounder had spent the night. Off to the east the sun was now coming up behind cotton candy clouds of pink and blue. Nothing hit my first 25 offerings and I began to think that perhaps the flounder tracks were old ones. Noticeably absent were my main competitors for the delicious flatties. No dolphin anywhere. Porpoises

are the ultimate flounder hunters. They know that the flounder will be hidden in the sand and mud, so they swim along two at a time, their snouts just grazing the bottom. When they spook a flounder into bolting, the chase is over in seconds.

A flounder can swim surprisingly fast, but is no match for a dolphin. When the dolphin is actively floundering, I pay close attention to their path. Their path can tell you how far off the bank the flounder have moved, and thus where to cast. No dolphin on this day. I was on my own.

As often happens, the flounder waited for full light to hit. Bam! Bam! Bam! Three quick hits and three quick misses. I knew that the fish had all hit the soft

plastic without taking the hook.

Farther out in the river, a large school of baitfish was swimming by, and although I couldn't see anything, feeding I made a cast. Before my chartreuse jig could settle to the bottom, a good fish had it.

The fight was fun and since I was out in the river a ways, the trout shot by me and beat me to the beach.

A fat 17-inch spotted sea trout was my prize. I followed the bait pod down the river, but could muster no other hit. Now, the sun was full up, so I paddled over to the islands.

Right away, I began to get hits, but nothing was taking the jig until a 14-inch flounder came to the boat.

I was in about 4 feet of water when my jig shot into

the air in the mouth of a 30-inch tarpon.

Wow! At the apex of its jump, the silver king shook its head and the jig was sent 20 feet in the opposite direction. I had no chance to do anything but watch. It then dawned on me that as low to the water as I was in the kayak I had been looking skyward to watch the flight of the tarpon. What power!

If God had not intended us to fish, there would be no such thing as a tarpon.
