Business incubator celebrates first year

Eleven entrepreneurs getting guidance on starting their own businesses

DAYTONA BEACH — The Volusia County Pumpkin Festival will draw hundreds of thousands of fall aficionados from throughout Central Florida every year for a weekend of everything autumn: the pumpkins, the carving, the cooling temperatures, Halloween, Thanksgiving.

That is if Scott Chesley

convinces someone with the wherewithal to host the proposed annual festival to go for the gusto. When he does, Mr. Chesley is confident that good promotion will draw more than 100,000 people to the event. That's 100,000 people with dollars. Dollars they will spend.

Mr. Chesley owns Festival Design, one of 11 businesses now enrolled at the University of Central Florida Business Incuba-

tor, 601 Innovation Way, at the Daytona Beach International Airport. The entrepreneur is thrilled to be part of the program that he said will have a much bigger economic benefit to the area than most realize.

"I think what this is bringing to the community will shock the community," he said. "I'm talking into the hundreds of millions of dollars."

The UCF Business Incu-

bator opened in July last year, and was the ninth the university started since 1999. Another opened since then.

"The business incubator is a place to start a company," Doris "Connie" Bernal, site manager said. "The entrants have a lot of resources to work with

here.

They have professionals who help them with a number of areas."

Businesses pay anywhere from \$270 to \$1,000 a month to have office space at the incubator's facility. Most are paying

No price tags allowed

Outreach warehouse offers food, clothes, furniture for free

LAKE HELEN — Suzie Burbridge had just started feeling the financial strain of gaining custody of her five grandchildren a few years back when she heard a knock on the front door of her Orange City home.

It was Carole Fritz, founder of Last Chance Outreach Ministries in Lake Helen, asking if she needed a loaf of bread.

"One day I made lunch for all five kids and it took one-and-a-half loaves to do it," Ms. Burbridge says on a recent afternoon at Last Chance. "So the next day when they came back, I said, 'Yes,' again. Then I decided it was time for me to pay this forward."

Ms. Burbridge is one of about a dozen of Ms. Fritz's regular volunteers at Last Chance, a hulking warehouse at 133 E. Ohio Ave. that's stuffed to the ceiling in parts with food, clothes, toys and furniture. Two walk-in coolers donated by a Chick-Fil-A, souped up with A/C units, keep all the perishables edible.

Not a price tag in sight. The mission and its leadership has led Ms. Burbridge to look at Ms. Fritz as family in such a short time.

"Now," Ms. Burbridge jokes, "my mom and sad say, 'Remember us?' Your real parents?"

Ms. Fritz beams from her cluttered perch of a desk near the back of the warehouse. Short and bubbly, with a directness that comes from being a single mother of seven, the 75-year-old former bus driver founded this ministry 15 years ago with her new husband, Lauren. She gets this kind of praise all the time.

It's not why she does it.



A lifelong resident of the region — starting in Ormond Beach, then Daytona Beach and Ponce Inlet — Ms. Arthur has made Holly Hill her home for eight years. She and former Ponce Inlet police administrator Penny Currie are facing off in the Aug. 14 primary for the open District 2 seat on the Holly Hill City Commission.

Ms. Arthur said she moved to the city on the advice of her brother-in-law, former mayor Bill Arthur.

"He was such an inspiration, the dedication he had for this city," she said. "And once I was here, he said, 'You should run for city commission.' And here, eight years later, I'm finally running."

It's only after accruing an education and real-world experience that Ms. Arthur attempted this foray into politics.

After obtaining a bachelor's of arts from Daytona State College and some coursework at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, Ms. Arthur began a path in real estate that branched out to marketing in 2000.

Her Promotional Research Inc. in Daytona Beach currently has about 70 employees.

From that perspective, Ms. Arthur believes Holly Hill is long overdue for an image revamp.

"We would draw a lot more business and people if we could tweak our reputation," she said.

That can be done in a variety of ways, she said. Money from the city's community

redevelopment agency could be spent to install streetscaping, bury power lines and help entrepreneurs improve signage in the city's gateways, particularly those along seen-better-days South Ridgewood Avenue.

A bolstered image can also come, she said, by strengthening law enforcement, cleaning parks and building a stronger community that bands together, "where Holly Hill residents are supporting Holly Hill businesses."

As a commissioner, Ms. Arthur said she would attempt to spearhead those efforts.

"I want to bring that business experience," she said, "that dedication, that determination and passion to city government and to our community."

Loretta Arthur is the other candidate in the race.

"Obviously, I've been interested in my community for a very long time," she said. "This was the next step, to try to do something else for my community."

Born in Titusville, Ms. Currie's family moved to Daytona Beach when she was 7 and has lived in the Halifax region ever since.

She and husband Forrest, a retired Holly Hill police sergeant, have lived in the city for 19 years.

He's lived here his whole life. Her father-in-law, Gordon Currie, served as city commissioner and mayor in the 1980s.

After six years as dispatcher with the Ponce Inlet Police Department, Ms. Arthur was promoted to administrative supervisor. Five years after that, she became certified to add crime scene technician to her duties. She's also been an

advisor for Holly Hill's Police Explorer program for a dozen years.

"I was responsible for 12 years for the development, maintenance and implementation of the budget for the police department there," she said. "That experience alone will help me tremendously. However, being involved in government, I learned how all the departments (work). It gives me a better understanding. I wouldn't have that on-the-job training curve that a lot of people (require) when they go into elected office."

She said she's standing on a campaign platform made of three primary planks.

The first entails spending funding to the city's community redevelopment agency strictly on infrastructure and beautification projects and not so much for promoting the endeavors of private developers.

"The CRA seems to be helping the development and promoter community in this city more than any other areas," she said. "And I want that

looked at."

She also wants the new commission seated in January to perform a full review of the budget and to bolster code enforcement efforts. The City Commission recently voted to raise the city's millage rate of 6.95 to 7.59, putting the city's rate near the top of the list in Volusia County.

"We need to have department heads justify their expenditures," she said, "and we need to do that in order to get a handle on our budget."

Yet, more expense might be necessary in at least one regard, she said. With one police officer and one part-timer now doing the work of four code-enforcement officers just a few years ago, the city is in dire need of a sprucing, she said.

"That means we're not allowing our image to improve," she said. "And if we do that it will improve our tax base because businesses and families will want to come to this community."

The explosion of the quirky Bob Denver

I was among the thousands of people who showed up to watch the implosion of the Ormond Memorial Hospital a while back. My wife Lana more or less dragged me along, but once there, I was happy that I had agreed to come. I had never seen an implosion and it came off just as expected. Loud and dusty with a lot of crumbling masonry.

As I stood there among the curiosity seekers, I was reminded of Dobie Gillis. I suppose I should explain to you youngsters who that is. Back in the late 1950s when television had three networks and was still trying to find its way, someone came up with the idea of a show about high school kids. At that time it was a revolutionary idea. Teenagers were a part of many hit programs like "Father Knows Best," "The Life Of Riley" and "Ozzie and Harriet," but the real stars of those shows were the adults. Teenagers were portrayed as

younger clones of their parents in look, attitude and dress. In "The Many Loves Of Dobie Gillis," there were several actors in their late 20s portraying teens in high school. They were the lead actors and actually not too different than the teenagers in those other

shows. Most wore clothes just like their parents and had hair just like their parents. Most, but not all.

One character on that show who seemed to march to a different drummer was Maynard G. Krebs. Maynard was labeled a "beatnik," or one who chose a more rebellious lifestyle.

Maynard wore a tattered sweatshirt that showed several prominent stains, a hat that had been stylishly cut up and heaven forbid, a goatee. In those days, kids never had facial hair. Their fathers didn't and neither could they. Maynard was a free spirit who never went to school and never worked and somehow managed to get by. His best friend was the star, Dobie Gillis.

By now you are probably asking, just what this has to do with the Ormond Beach implosion? Well, in almost every episode, Dobie would encounter his friend Maynard and ask how he had spent his day. Maynard's stock answer was that he had been downtown watching the wrecking ball take down the old Barlow Building. At that time

I was 14 or 15 years old and I couldn't imagine anyone spending time watching the demolition of a building, but I loved that he did it. As I watched the show, I couldn't identify with Dobie or any of the other boys. I saw myself as Maynard G. Krebs. As it turned out, he prepared me for the free-spirited lifestyle that I embraced in the late '60s. When the "tune in, turn on and drop out" movement hit America, I had already been schooled by Maynard.

Sometime in the middle 1980s, I was on a late night flight from Chicago to Orlando to see my father, who was then terminally ill. Lo and behold, on the same airplane was the actor Bob Denver. Yes, the same Bob Denver who gained much fame on "Gilligan's Island." I had to go over and say hello. I am certain that most fans who approached Mr. Denver had a comment about his role as Gilligan, but I told him that Maynard G. Krebs had changed my life. At the mention of Maynard, I saw a definite twinkle in his eye.

"Thank you for remembering," he said. He died in 2005.

As the big cloud of dust arose where the hospital had been, the crowd cheered. I couldn't help it but as I walked to the car I began to whistle the theme song to The Many Loves Of Dobie Gillis. Thank you, Mr. Denver.



county. The attorney said that as the county reels from the housing collapse, it's often stood in its own way for local recovery.

"What's held Volusia County back all these years is the divisions," he said. "The east versus west division, and the divisions between the political entities and divisions in the business interests. While that's mildly tolerable in good times, we're not in good times."

He said, "I have worked with county government and city government for 20 years. There's a resistance to sitting down and talking."

Mr. Daniels said there are

a few things the county council needs to do to attract more and better-paying jobs to the area.

"The tax rates are pretty high," he said. "One way to reduce the tax rates is to get the economy going."

He said during economic recoveries and boons, governments can more easily reduce taxes, because properties are worth more, and ownership more widespread. However, Mr. Daniels said that to attract business governments need to reduce their taxes first.

Another draw for business, Mr. Daniels said, is quality of life.

"We have to protect Volusia County's environment," he said. "That's one of the draws for the economy to attract high-wage jobs."

Additionally, Mr. Daniels

said that, if elected, he'll advocate gearing the Daytona Beach International Airport toward being an aeronautics-industry park.

"You've got Embry-Riddle (Aeronautical University)," he said. "You've got the business incubator out there. You've got a 10,000-foot runway, which not many do. You've got a lot of vacant land. And you've got a lot of engineers around here."

The 59-year-old is a Florida native. He lives in Daytona Beach with his wife, Angela. They have four adult daughters. Three live in the area, one out of area. While the county council is non-partisan, Mr. Daniels is a Democrat. However, he said his voting record is independent, and he dislikes political partisanship. (386) 255-8118

While Mr. Richards has never held elected office, he's on the Volusia County ECHO Advisory Committee and Ormond Beach's Housing Authority and Historic Landmark Preservation boards. He has numerous professional and volunteer credits, including membership in the Volusia County Bar Association, the Salvation Army's Daytona Downtown Streets Team, and the Daytona Beach Young Professionals Group.

The 36-year-old moved to the area from New York when he was 12. He studied business and law at the University of Central Florida, Rollins College and Stetson University. He said lowering

property-tax rates will help solve many problems in Volusia.

"Other counties have lower tax rates and people are more likely to move to them," he said. "When you start bringing the taxes down and people together, you can start getting that economic development."

Mr. Richards said, if elected, he'd advocate for an advisory board made up of local small business folks to look through the county's and cities' business permitting processes and regulations to find inefficiencies that can be eliminated.

Additionally, he hopes to expand the county's use of evolving technology to make it more accessible and transparent.

"(We need) to get as much information out there, public, as we can," he

said.

Mr. Richards said he'd like to expand the University of Central Florida Business Incubator at the Daytona Beach International Airport, which the county funded for three years, and start other small-business programs. He believes area colleges and universities would be eager to help develop more local entrepreneurs.

"One of the things I'd like to do is work more closely with our local schools," he said. "We have Embry-Riddle (Aeronautical University), Stetson and a number of other great schools."

The launch of the Red Cross hurricane app comes just before what is traditionally the busiest period of the Atlantic hurricane season. Features of the app include:

- One touch "I'm safe" messaging that allows users to broadcast reassurance to family and friends via social media outlets that they are out of harm's way;
- Location-based NOAA weather alerts for the United States and its territories users can share on social networks;
- Remote monitoring of personalized weather alerts where family and friends reside
- Locations of open Red Cross shelters;
- Simple steps and checklists people can use to create a family emergency plan;

• Preloaded content that gives users instant access to critical action steps, even without mobile connectivity;

• Toolkit with flashlight, strobe light and audible alarm; and

• Badges users can earn through interactive quizzes and share on social networks.

National Red Cross experts in health, safety, and preparedness have thoroughly reviewed and field-tested the information and advice provided in this app.

The Hurricane App follows the recently released Red Cross First Aid App which has had nearly 600,000 downloads in just six weeks. Testimonials and positive reviews have shown how dozens of people already have used

Tourism and its dollars are on the rise

Tourism has been on the upswing in Volusia County this year as renovated hotels reopen, which you may not have noticed, and draw in more visitors with their own marketing efforts.

In June, the 3 percent bed tax collected countywide was at \$662,899, up 6.7 percent from \$621,540 in June 2011. Unlike May, when the Halifax area was down slightly, all three tourism districts were up with Southeast Volusia rising a sharp 15.3 percent.

Some of the renovated hotels you may not have noticed include the EconoLodge Daytona Oceanfront at 1601 S. Atlantic Ave. and next door, the even bigger Holiday Inn Resort Daytona Beach Oceanfront at 1615 S. Atlantic Ave. and the Lexington Inn & Suites, 2323 S. Atlantic Ave. in Daytona Beach Shores.

Not only to those hotels coming back on board provide more rooms, but they also increase the amount of marketing that targets the Daytona Beach area. Together with gas prices remaining below last year and a slowly improving economy, it has added up to a much better year for the hospitality industry in Volusia County.

It's not over, yet. There also are plans to renovate two closed hotels and create a new Hyatt Place and Residence Inn by Marriott, both

in Daytona Beach Shores, and the Hampton Inn on Flagler Avenue in New Smyrna Beach should be open by the end of the year.

Metcare is adding to its area healthcare facilities for seniors, building out two units at Nova Ace Plaza, 420 S. Nova Road, Ormond Beach. The 3,200-square-foot office and patient care facility will have four employees, including a physician, and open this fall. It will be Metcare's seventh patient care facility. It also has an oncology center in Ormond Beach.

The number of flights didn't increase any for August at Daytona Beach International Airport, but there should be more seats available. Delta Air Lines is bringing back more service with Boeing 757s. It will continue to have five daily flights to Atlanta while US Airways has three daily flights to Charlotte, N.C.

Sunoco continues to take steps to rebuild gas station/convenience stores in the area. The company paid \$875,000 for the old Waffle House property at 1566 W. Granada Blvd., next

to Interstate 95 in Ormond Beach. Sunoco eventually will have 13 company-owned stores in Volusia County.

Since Mattress Firm bought Mattress Giant, it has been converting stores in Volusia. The latest to get the Mattress Firm name is at the Shops on Saxon, 1169 Saxon Ave., Orange City.

Holly Hill is getting one of its first new commercial projects in awhile. Demolition is starting on the old wood-frame buildings at 700 Ridgewood Ave. to make room for Budgen Construction to erect two buildings. One will have seven units for retail tenants and the other will have 10 units for light industry.

O'Reilly Auto Parts is moving into Volusia, buying the old restaurant building at 145 N. Nova Road in Daytona Beach for \$675,000. It's not exactly what Midtown Redevelopment Area leaders wanted, but at least it will be

an improvement over a long-time empty building.

On the restaurant beat, Stonewood Holdings is leasing the first floor dining room at Sunset Harbor Yacht Club and will open SW Grill, which will be open to the public. Stonewood, which is now down to 16 restaurants after closing its remaining one in North Carolina, has been focusing more on expanding its Peach Valley Café chain. It now has four in Florida and plans two more, including one in Port Orange.

Ringhaver is seeking rezoning for land adjacent to its heavy equipment sales and leasing operation on North Tomoka Farms Road in Daytona Beach. The company wants to build a facility for repair or renovation and sales of specialty vehicles.

Surfboard builder NCounter has leased 1,050 square feet of space at Winston James Development's Beville Road Business Park in South Daytona.



Ormond periodontist uses latest technology for patient comfort, healing

You have to have gum surgery. You're not looking forward to it. Or are you, sort of?

What if your procedure included the latest technology: lasers to minimize pain, treatments to accelerate healing, a beautiful office — complete with ultra-leather chairs, which conform to your body, and floor to ceiling windows revealing colorful, lovingly tended gardens? Let's say a cheerful, friendly office staff was on hand to lift your spirits. And just suppose a graduate of Notre Dame, Boston and Emory Universities, with a kind demeanor, great sense of humor and passion for incredible medical gadgetry — along with advanced treatment options

— was going to perform your procedure?

If you are rolling your eyes and dismissing possibilities, you probably are not a patient of Dr. Raymond A. Kenzik, DDS, PA.

Periodontal disease is inflammation and infection that destroys tooth-supporting tissues. Plaque and tartar irritate and inflame the gums. Bacteria and the toxins they produce cause the gums to become infected, swollen and tender.

ing, swelling, tissue removal, and recovery time. "Technology in dentistry has changed hugely," Dr. Kenzik said. "Laser has allowed us to treat common-variety periodontal conditions, the kind that cause tooth loss, comfortably and with equal or better success than in the past." The i-CAT, cone-beam 3-D imaging system is one of several seriously advanced instruments Dr. Kenzik implemented to save patients time and money. "It reduces the radiation field to exactly what we need, delivering much more information, not only for implants but for other procedures," he said. "Before this, patients had to go to the imaging center, then wait for their results. This system saves them time and hundreds of dollars," he said. Platelet-rich plasma therapy uses platelets from the patients' own blood to aid healing. Bone morphogenetic proteins induce formation of bone and cartilage. Dr. Kenzik uses both to improve the health and appearance of his patients' smiles.

He said the use of titanium roots has significantly reduced the need for dentures in many patients. He's not all gums. Dr. Kenzik also offers teeth whitening, TMJ treatment, pediatric care, dentures and partials, implants, bridges and sports dentistry. How many continuing education credits must all of this require? "The state requires 30 every two years. I probably average about 120 a year. I always was kind of a nerd," he said smiling. He and his staff get along which, he said, results in very positive staff-patient relations. It's a comfortable work environment. Since he opened the Ormond Beach practice in 1982, huge strides have been made in dentistry. Those advancements make patients happier to see him. "It makes things enjoyable when your perio patients can give you a hug after surgery," Dr. Kenzik said. By the way, don't forget to ask for a dental floss business card when you visit. Raymond A. though. "What brought me here?" she asks, repeating the question. Silently, she looks up and smiles.

Visitors, totaling as many as 100 or more a day, are asked to make a donation when they leave, but if they can't, they're sent on their way with no sour looks.

They aren't asked for personal information either, like Social Security numbers or last names. Just a first name and home city will do.

"The only thing I need to know is do they have a need, what the need is and how I can help," Ms. Fritz said. "The people who come in here, they're embarrassed enough because they're in a situation they shouldn't be in. So why make it so much harder for them to come back by asking a million and one questions?"

She doesn't know anywhere else around that the needy can get such anonymous aid.

"There's nobody in the county or even the counties around us that I know of that does everything just for donations," Ms. Fritz says. "We're special that way."

It's often a logistical nightmare. One day, 100 cases of pita bread need to be picked up from Orlando; the next, 2,000 lbs. of cheesecake is on offer in Sanford. Every family with kids has been getting a month supply of Christmas-themed mini-M&Ms since the holidays. It's not a problem: She's still got two pallet boxes half-full of the stuff.

"I've got the experience to handle it, though," she says. "My background has prepared me."

After raising her children without a dime from their father in Pennsylvania, working as a dispatcher and bus driver, she met Lauren, now the ministry's ordained pastor, and they soon moved to Deltona in 1994.

"This all started with two bags of clothes," Mr. Fritz recalls. "It just progressed from there."

That donation for a needy family turned into dozens. Over the next dozen years, the donations filled the cou-

ple's garage, front porch, living room and even backyard.

Three years ago, the now-retired Ms. Fritz went looking for a place to keep her trove, as well as the troves of a half-dozen local congregations. She found it in Lake Helen (population: 3,000).

To get the word out, the couple cooked up 100 lbs. of donated chicken and rice for an impromptu barbecue at Hopkins Hall. They knew the community had pockets of rich and poor residents. So she sent a volunteer around on a motorcycle to hand out free tickets to anyone who thought free and barbecue sounded nice in the same sentence.

She got Mayor Buddy Snowden to show up and help serve about 500 people that day.

"We had a restaurant in DeLand agree to make all the rice and vegetables," she said. "It didn't cost us a dime. We had all nationalities come, and that was the goal, to bring people together. If you don't, there's always going to be a separation."

From then on, a steady stream has poured through the warehouse. It's a non-denominational crowd. And

not everyone is needy.

One recent afternoon, 28-year-old Melissa Gill, a local stay-at-home mom, brought a bag of donations and went away with some toys for her children and a cake for dessert.

"We didn't come to take, we came to give," she said. "But look: I'm leaving with chocolate cake."

They've even hosted two weddings and two funeral wakes in this warehouse, for people who couldn't afford anything special.

Anything that starts piling up too high is sent to even needier areas. They've sent extra food and clothes as far away as Haiti and Mexico, and to hard-hit areas in Pennsylvania and Kentucky. And when families aren't able to come to the warehouse, somebody from Last Chance is happy to come to them.

"It comes in as fast as we can give it out," Mr. Fritz said, dwarfed in a back room by mounds of donated goods. "It's a blessing."

And it's far from over, his wife promised.

"It's been an adventure, a real long road," she says. "But I'm not done yet. Not by a long shot."

\$270 to \$350. While that's pretty inexpensive rent, it's not why the businesses are there. The entrepreneurs did a lot of work to hang their shingles there. To get in the program, prospects go through a rigorous application process that includes making repeated presentations. They have to show that they have business ideas that'll work, that they have the dedication to make them work, and the resources they'll need to see them through until the ideas start generating sufficient income.

Importantly, too, the applicants have to show that they're dedicated to their ideas, but not hung up on how to turn them into reality.

"If an entrepreneur is not coachable, we cannot help them," Ms. Bernal said.

If entrepreneurs are tentatively accepted into the program, they start by taking an eight-week class at the university, Excellence in Entrepreneurship. The course cost \$400.

"The class is part of the application process," the site director said.

Michael Panebianco, owner of Bounce Forward,

said the class turned out to be more important than he thought it'd be.

"It introduced us to legal things and marketing professionals," he said. "(Entrepreneurs) need a bigger rolodex, and (the business incubator) gives us that."

Larry Curran, co-owner of Choose Rain, said he, too, was glad for the class, and other help. He said that while he's run and grown existing businesses, that didn't prepare him as much as he thought it did to open Choose Rain.

"I'm 65," he said. "I've been in business all my life. I thought I knew what it takes to open a business. The incubator fills in the holes. It fills me out - it fills my holes."

Ms. Bernal said nine companies are at the business incubator, and two are off site. Additionally, two companies have graduated from the first stage of the incubator's program and moved out. Another two candidate entrepreneurs are taking the class. Ms. Bernal said she's regularly working with another three to help them prepare for applying.

"I never leave any client behind, because they don't know how to present," she said. "Sometimes the entrepreneurs are good with their ideas, but

not with their presentations."

The Volusia County Council approved about \$1.4 million to renovate the business incubator's 10,000-square-foot facility, and another \$750,000 to run it for three years. It was the second attempt at having a UCF business incubator in the county. There was one from 2003 to 2007 at Daytona State

College's Advance Technology College. The need for more classroom space pushed out the incubator.

County Chairman Frank Bruno said that at its first year, he's pleased with the business incubator.

"This is a success story," he said. "First year and 11 businesses are coming out."



Hull's Seafood offers fresh and local fish

ORMOND BEACH — You don't have to go fishing to find the freshest seafood in Volusia County. Hull's Seafood Restaurant on Granada Boulevard offers just that.

Located on the intersection of West Granada Boulevard and Ridgewood Avenue just a block away from the Granada Bridge, Hull's is the destination of choice for those who aren't experienced fishermen but want to know what a fresh and locally caught fish tastes like.

Hull's opened in 2004 as a takeout restaurant that spun off from the neighboring Hull's Seafood Market, which has offered fresh fish in the community for more than 30 years.

And owner Jimmy Hull knows what makes a fresh fish. That's because he catches some of the fish served at the restaurant from his commercial fishing boat, sometimes venturing out seven days a week.

Upon walking into Hull's Seafood Restaurant for the first time, I noticed a clear undersea theme based on the paintings of ocean scenes that hang from the walls, as well as the mural that faces the kitchen depicting Mr. Hull's fishing boat out in the open sea. The restaurant has an inviting atmosphere and friendly staff, and is more spacious than it appears

from the outside with plenty of tables for indoor dining and a few picnic tables outside for outdoor dining. While the dining area and kitchen were only built for takeout service, it has since expanded to a full-service restaurant — but except for the addition of a new fryer, the kitchen is still the same as it was when the restaurant first opened.

As my guest and I sat at our table, restaurant manager Eileen McGill greeted us and spoke about how

the restaurant prides itself on fresh seafood.

"You'd have to get your feet wet to get it any fresher," Ms. McGill said.

The menu offers a wide selection of seafood prepared many different ways, whether it's grilled or blackened, or on a platter or in a sandwich. There's also a "Lil' Mates" menu for lighter portions, as well as a "Land Lovers" menu for those who prefer beef, chicken or pork.

The local catches vary by the season. What's in sea-

son in the summer includes grouper, sea bass, wahoo and albacore tuna. Farm fish such as salmon and tilapia are not local, Ms. McGill said.

Just because something is sold in the seafood market next door doesn't necessarily mean it's also offered at the restaurant. But, for an additional fee, guests can have the kitchen staff prepare fish purchased at the market for them.

"We're not in the 'no' business," Ms. McGill said about the variety of options offered. "We see ourselves as our own little entity, a unique jewel in the community."

To taste the variety offered on the menu, my guest and I decided to split a broiled platter (\$29.99) that includes shrimp, scallops and a Maine lobster tail, and a fried platter (\$25.99) that includes clam strips, oys-

ters, shrimp and a crab cake. Ms. McGill also recommended we try the blackened grouper and sea bass fillets. Each dish comes with a side of two homemade hush puppies, which go well with the restaurant's signature remoulade sauce.

But that wasn't all. We also decided to try an order of conch fritters, as well as a "fan favorite" appetizer, the smoked fish dip, a dip containing a mix of smoked mahi and whitefish served with crackers.

My guest and I agreed it was the best seafood we've

ever had. The blackened sea bass was excellent, highly recommended for someone who's not into fish, with a taste and texture more like steak. The broiled lobster tail was another highlight, as were the fried oysters. But we were highly impressed by the fried shrimp, which at first glance doesn't look like the typical fried shrimp because it's light on the batter, yet still had that taste you would expect from a fried food, without all the grease.

We also agreed we ordered too much food for two peo-

ple, Needless to say, both of us returned home with a box filled with leftovers in tow.

If you're craving fresh-tasting fish but want to leave the rod and reel in the garage, Hull's Seafood Restaurant is the place for you.

BACK-TO-SCHOOL

2012-2013

Volusia sharpens pencils in preparation for new standards, much more in 2012-2013

Teachers aren't so different from students when it comes to mixed feelings about starting a new school year.

There's some melancholy over watching the lazy days of summer slip through their fingers. They may trudge apprehensively toward schedules, lesson planning, grading and the challenges sure to arise. Then there's the sense of excitement, new beginnings, fresh faces, fixing up classrooms and anticipating the rewards of shaping young minds, watching students grow over the course of the year.

This will be Patti Lapinsky's 20th year teaching in Volusia County Schools.

She's looking forward to being a reading coach, a position she's held in the past. Educators in this role work most frequently with teachers to improve their reading instruction.

According to the Literacy Coaching Clearinghouse website, reading coaches must be successful teachers who are very knowledgeable about literacy development, curriculum and instruction.

Reading coaches don't guide just reading teachers. Ms. Lapinsky said a science teacher might just as easily require assistance to help his or her students better comprehend the curriculum content.

"In reality, I really love going back to school. I think it's all the new supplies, the

exciting plans for my classroom and especially the students and all of their promise and potential. They are really what drive my love for teaching. I love their energy and enthusiasm - it's contagious!" she said.

Ms. Lapinsky has not exactly been a career creature of habit, playing it safe in a particular school or grade level. She has taught both elementary and middle school, worked with mainstream, gifted and exceptional education, or ESE, students. In addition to being a reading coach, she's been a writing coach.

"I'm not one of those teachers who wish for perfect classes each year," Ms. Lapinsky said. "I actually like the kid who doesn't fit in the box, the kid that's an enigma and I have to work to figure them out and how to get them to like learning, kind of like a puzzle. Don't get me wrong, I appreciate the easy kids too, but I appreciate a challenge."

There will be changes this year which may or may not challenge Volusia County educators.

First, the unfurling of Common Core Standards, or CCS, a nationwide initiative to implement a set of expectations for student knowledge and skills high school graduates will need to have mastered to be successful in college and careers.

According to the Florida Department of Education's website, development of the standards was a collabora-



tive effort. The Council of Chief State School Officers and the National Governors Association Center for Best Practices worked with representatives from participating states, a wide range of educators, content experts, researchers, national organi-

zations, and community groups.

The final standards reflect feedback from the general public, teachers, parents, business leaders, states, and content area experts and are informed by the standards of other high-performing nations.

"We will roll out (kindergarten and first) this year, but we will be working with teachers at the elementary and secondary school levels to prepare for implementation of these standards beyond grades K-1," said Bambi Lockman Volusia County Schools' deputy

superintendent for instructional services. "The ground-work has been laid and, while it will change the way teachers teach, in some cases, it allows students to be more engaged in interdisciplinary studies."



Another program Volusia County schools will be implementing this year is the Volusia Instructional Management System, or VIMS, which, Ms. Lockman said,

has three components: the grade book system, instructional curriculum maps, to direct teachers as they implement the new core standards, and a data system.

VIMS is not to be confused with the Volusia System for Empowering Teachers, or

VSET, the gist of which is contained in a 165-page online document filled with sections and subsections of explanatory jargon, charts and graphs, and, word is, that's only half the actual contents.

VIMS is new. VSET was piloted in 14 schools last year. All schools will be using VSET this year.

Volusia County Schools' spokeswoman Nancy Wait explained the differences.

"VSET is the evaluation system for teachers. It will not directly affect parents and students. It is separate from VIMS, which is about how we teach, grade and provide instruction," she said. "They are inter-related, after all (teacher) evaluations are based on performance in the classroom."

What do these changes mean for teachers, students and parents?

For Julie Murray, a kinder-

garten teacher at Blue Lake Elementary School in DeLand, CCS means less-scripted instruction and more creativity in the classroom.

"It's a really good thing because with the economy the way it is, people are so much more mobile, transient, and the Common Core Standards curriculum ensures educational content will be the same for students everywhere in the county," Ms. Murray said. "Yet teachers will have the flexibility to deliver that content differently, to make the method of instruction our own."

She said VSET should work together with CCS as a less subjective teacher evaluation tool than Volusia has seen in the past.

"This system is data and fact driven," she said. "Administrators and other evaluators will validate findings factually, not subjective-

ly, and teachers will have more opportunities to meet with administration."

Ms. Lapinsky said her school, and the whole district will work hard to implement CCS.

"It involves challenging students and getting them to read and write throughout their subjects, ensuring students receive a high-quality education, no matter where they live," she said.

As for the new teacher evaluation system, Ms. Lapinsky said she embraces change and plans to look at the positive aspects of that, too.

"I think most of our teachers are fairly excited as we move forward," Ms. Lockman said.

Andrew Spar, president of the Volusia Teachers Organization, or VTO, called CCS "good work."

"We really do support Common Core because stan-

dards should be the same everywhere," he said. This is narrowing the curriculum, offering students much deeper levels of understanding. It's a better approach than ever before."

Mr. Spar said the VTO also supports the VIMS notion of using technology to lessen paperwork and manage student data. But, he said, implementing the three new procedures is a lot at one time.

"It's a bit of overload and the concern is: are we going to miss the potential that's here? We're spinning so fast to keep up," he said.

Chrissy Burke of Ormond Beach will march two students to Ortona Elementary School this year. She has one daughter starting kindergarten and one going into first grade. She said she's never heard of CCS, but that

HELP YOUR CHILDREN UNDERSTAND WHO AND WHEN TO CALL

The best time to prepare for an emergency is before it happens. During an emergency, it's easy to become disoriented or upset, so you need to have all the important phone numbers readily available ahead of time. Write each phone number clearly so that it will be easy to

read. Use a pen with dark-colored ink; this is seen the best when you are in a hurry or the lights are dim. Make sure that babysitters and relative familiarize themselves with the list. Once you have filled in the appropriate numbers it is time to practice with your children.

TEACHING YOUR CHILD HOW TO CALL FOR HELP

Have your child practice dialing and speaking into a telephone. Your child should know:

- 1 - How to dial 911
- 2 - His or her full name & full address
- 3 - How to give a short description of the emergency.

Prompt him or her with questions that an emergency operator would ask, such as "What is your name?", "Where are you calling from?", and "What is the emergency?"

Stress that the description should be short ("Mommy fell down") and that he or she should be calm and stay on the phone.

Practice until your child feels comfortable.

No one wants to think about an emergency happening at home, but it's better to face that possibility than to be caught unprepared. So keep emergency numbers close by. It's a small step that could have big consequences.

her eldest daughter was given a "practice test" last year. Ms. Burke thinks it may have been a type of placement tool, or baseline, for something new in first grade.

"She scored above the 56th percentile in how she processes putting words together and comprehending words as they're put into a sentence," she said. "I'm so happy they're both going to a school where each grade has only two classrooms and each class has a minimum of 12 to 18 students with one teacher and two teacher aides. Every, single child gets the same exact attention," Ms. Burke said.

"The biggest part for parents to understand will be standards-referenced grading -- grades that reflect what a student should know and be able to do -- versus a grade that reflects a test or homework score," Ms. Wait said.

Coming clean about cleaning all types of fish

Not long ago a reader sent a rant to this paper complaining about the column where I mentioned that I had been bitten by a flounder while cleaning it.

The lady took me to task for my insensitivity toward the poor animal. She was correct in that my efforts were not conducive to the flounder living out its life cycle. Truth is, from the second the fish hit my jig, its destiny changed from swimming around the Halifax trying to eat other fish to a definite date with corn meal and hot grease.

This type of note comes my way quite often. I am well aware of the views of the folks from PETA. Through the years, that organization has attempted to end all fishing and hunting. If that is your true belief, fine, then you should live it. I do have a problem with folks who only give lip service to such a cause. I am a meat eater. I would never pretend not to be.

Over the past seven years or so that I have written this column, I have always encouraged my readers to take as much care with the fish as possible. As for me, I value each and every critter in the water. Whenever I come upon a fish bank where some thoughtless angler has left a catfish or stingray on the bank to die, I am saddened. Those fish and other so-called trash fish are a valuable part of the marine ecosys-

tem. Dead baitfish or shrimp that have been left behind should always be put back into the water where they can be recycled by Mother Nature. I don't live on the river, but I make it a point to put all fish parts from fish I have cleaned back into the water. The writer said she was a fisherman. I wonder how humane she is with the live bait she uses? Small animals are just as sensitive as large. As a fisherman who uses artificials about 90 percent of the time, I am proud of the fact that I usually don't have to kill shrimp, mullet and any other natural bait.

A few years back I helped my friend Al Hauser catch a 60-pound barracuda in the Halifax. At the end of a one-hour battle, I was able to lift that huge 'cud into Al's boat. After suitable time to admire the great animal, I insisted on putting that fish back alive. When I wrote about that, I took a lot of heat from readers. People were appalled that I had released such a major predator into water where people swim. Truth is, that big fish was such a beautiful specimen, I could never kill it for nothing. It was not to be used as food. It took a long

time for the barracuda to grow to that size. In good conscience, I just couldn't kill it so that folks could take pictures and "ooh" and "aah" back at the bait shop.

Actually, I don't know the best way to kill a fish. Commercial fishermen who supply the markets and fast food places usually throw them on ice right away. I don't know how humane that is, but it is the norm for most of the fish we eat. The flounder that bit my thumb with its last gasp had been caught on a hot day. In order to keep it fresh, I had placed it on a chain stringer and attached it to my kayak where it could be kept in the water alive and therefore fresh for the table.

By the time I got it home, it was near death from its ordeal. Several others on that stringer were already totally dead. When I went to it with a sharp knife, I obviously believed it to be a goner or I would not have foolishly put my thumb into its mouth. I paid for my mistake. Just remember, all of those burgers and fish sandwiches you eat came from animals that did not die of old age.


By comparison, there were 240 backpacks provided to Daytona Beach children in the first year of the program.



All about handicaps

It's the measure of any golfer. It's usually the first question from a golfer's mouth after meeting new playing partners on the first tee. What's your handicap?

Golf is a unique sport in that players of all abilities may compete fairly with one another at the very same time, on the very same field of play.

In tennis it's nearly impossible to take on Novak Djokovic. Imagine trying to match ground strokes with the world's best tennis player. I think I'd have trouble even seeing the ball!

How about digging in at the plate and taking a cut at a fastball from Detroit Tigers' ace, Justin Verlander? No thanks!

And there is no way in this world that I'm putting on pads and trying to chase down and tackle Arian Foster of the Houston Texans.

Take on British Open champion Ernie Els on the links? Sure, I can do that. I may even have a chance, using my handicap index and a little luck. All I have to do is play to, or better than, my potential and I could take him down.

Most golfers have an idea of how they score. Usually the answer to what is your handicap comes back as, "Well, I play bogey golf, so I'm an 18." Truth be told, that isn't quite right, but it's not a bad place to start.

There used to be a time when you had to belong to a club or organization to get a handicap service. In fact, in order to have a USGA handicap index, you must belong to one, but you can get an unofficial one easily these days.

Thanks to the Internet there are numerous sites that offer a service. In order for your handicap to be official however, you must be subject to "peer" review. This keeps golfer from inflating their handicap by posting bogus scores in an effort to gain more strokes on the golf course.

I keep track of my handicap through Yahoo. Many courses around the country are already in the site's database and all you have to do is click the proper buttons and fill in your score. Yahoo does all the number crunching and tells you your latest handicap index.

The USGA requires you to have 20 scores posted to get an official handicap. You are also required to post every round. No hiding those bad score-cards to keep your handicap low or tossing out those good rounds to keep from giving strokes to your buddies.

The beauty of the handicap system is that it

rewards better golfers. Two golfers may both card an 85 on separate courses, but that doesn't mean they are playing at the same level. The handicap system shows the golfer shooting the 85 on the harder course is likely the better player.

If you look at a score-card you will notice the course has two ratings. One is a course rating. This is what a scratch golfer should shoot playing from his normal set of tees.

The other is a slope rating, which is a number that tells you how difficult the course is. Courses with more forced carries, out-of-bounds, water and the like will have a higher slope rating. The USGA uses 113 as a standard.

If you don't have access to the Internet or would simply like to keep track of your handicap yourself, the procedure is relatively easy.

First you must calculate your index for each round. Subtract the course rating from your score for the 18 holes. Take this number and multiply it by 113. Then take that number and divide it by the slope rating. This number is the differential. Take the average of the lowest 10 of your last 20 rounds and multiply by 0.96. Now you have your handicap index.

Once you know what your index is, what do you do with it when you get to the golf course?

Since you don't always play the same golf course or from the same tees, you have to calculate your index before teeing off at the first hole. After all, if you're playing a very difficult course, you don't want to give your opponent more strokes than you should or miss getting an extra one.

To figure out how many strokes the course must give you for a round, you take your handicap index and multiply it by 113, and then divide that number by the slope rating on the score card. Round to the lowest whole number and you have the number of strokes you will be given.

Now if I can just find Ernie's number. It's time to put my handicap to work.
