## Playground, pier to honor boy

ORMOND BEACH — The city will remember Cameron Brenneman in two places.

At its last meeting, the Ormond Beach City Commission unanimously voted to name the playground at Sanchez Park, 329 Sanchez Ave., after the young man and a memorial plaque will be placed on a fishing pier at the same park.

"He was a fisherman," Mayor Ed Kelley said at the meeting. "He fished. People came to me and have said he was such a fisherman and he helped them fish."

Cameron, 12, was killed in an automobile accident in January. He attended Ormond Beach Middle School, and lived a couple of blocks from Sanchez Park. Classmates Hayley Remigio and Hayleigh Ruddell approached the city about naming the park after Cameron.

The playground is slated for a redesign this year. The girls have

urged a racing theme to honor Cameron's enthusiasm for motor sports. He was a regular go-kart racer at the Volusia Speedway Park in Barberville, where he was rookie of the year, and held the record for Quarter Midgets. In 2007, Cameron won the "Little 500" at the New Smyrna Speedway, too.

## Beachside cleanup planned for Saturday

DAYTONA BEACH — The City will have a beachside community cleanup Saturday, May 19, from 8:30 to 11:00 a.m.

Volunteers will meet at the Peabody Auditorium, located at 600 Auditorium Blvd., and are encouraged to wear comfortable attire.

Efforts will be concentrated on public right-of-ways on the city's beachside. The cleanup will span from Atlantic Avenue to Halifax Avenue and Orange Avenue up to Driftwood Avenue.

Two Saturdays ago, more than 50 volunteers dedicated their time cleaning up the core of Midtown, according to Weegie Kuendig, the coordinator of the cleanup efforts. Ms. Kuendig expects the same turnout this Saturday.

"This is a cooperative

effort with the city, with residents and businesspeople volunteering," Ms. Kuendig said.

Volunteers will get assigned to a certain area and are asked to return to the original meeting place by 11 a.m.. Materials and tools for the cleanup will be provided by the city.

The main items found are bottles, wrappers and cigarette butts. Ms. Kuendig explained she has yet to discover anything "bizarre" during the cleanups.

"We pick up trash, bag it up and get rid of it," she said.

The city has allowed three ways people can participate, according to Ms. Kuendig.

"They can either clean up in front of their homes, in their neighborhood or join us in cleaning up parts of the city," she said.

## Elections candidate: do more to get residents registered

VOLUSIA COUNTY — When voters go to the polls, trust is everything, according to Teresa Apgar. She said if people don't know whether their votes are counted, they're likely to lose electoral enthusiasm.

"I'd like to find a way to give every voter a receipt, to let them know their vote was cast," Ms. Apgar said.

Ms. Apgar is one of four candidates running for Volusia County Supervisor of Elections. She said there have been times she voted and wondered whether it was counted. It's a curiosity no voter should feel, she said.

The former ad-sales executive is well known in West Volusia. Among her many community involvements was founding DeLand's Faith, Hope and Charity Society. The society helps the City of DeLand to sponsor events and projects with donated, rather than taxpayer,



funds.

Ms. Apgar currently serves on the West Volusia Hospital Authority, which is responsible for managing indigent care. Her interest in the Supervisor of Elections position goes back to her days at Hollywood Hills High School, Hollywood. The Supervisor of Elections there used to loan the school ballot boxes for student elections. It hooked Ms. Apgar on the importance of voting, and the power of a supervisor to get young folks interested in elections.

"I want to work with high schoolers to get them pre-registered, when they're 16, 17," she said. "It's the supervisor's job to go to the high schools."

While the supervisor's

## Crime Stoppers honors local law enforcement

The Crime Stoppers of Northeast Florida 14th Annual Community Banquet Honoring Law Enforcement was held Wednesday, May 16 at the Plaza Resort and Spa in Daytona Beach.

Deputy Sheriff John Stacy Braman, Volusia County Sheriff's Office, was named Crime Stoppers officer of the year for Volusia County.

In November 2011, while taking a domestic violence suspect into custody, Deputy Braman was shot in the right shoulder and left arm and also sustained a ruptured eardrum. Despite serious injuries, Deputy Braman, with the assistance of a backup deputy, acted with exceptional bravery and professionalism to subdue, disarm and handcuff the

shooter. Deputy Braman was able to survive the gunfire because of his remarkable poise and quick tactical thinking under fire, Crime Stoppers officials say.

A special award — The Spirit of Law Enforcement — was given to Dr. Frank Farmer, formerly Florida's surgeon general and head of the Department of Health, for his efforts in setting up a prescription drug database to curb narcotic drug abuse throughout the state. This tracking system is designed to make it more difficult for people to obtain multiple prescriptions and hundreds of pills from various pain clinics.

"The Spirit of Law Enforcement Award is given when someone, in law enforcement or not, does something that embodies what law enforcement is

about—protecting and serving the community," Crime Stoppers of Northeast Florida Board of Directors President Jorge Carvajal said.

He said Dr. Farmer was chosen as this year's recipient for his commitment to the "pill mill data base".



# Ormond Beach Middle Schooler wins state award for biofuel project

ORMOND BEACH — Ormond Beach Middle School's David Truilo, 12, is too young to drive, but he already knows what he wants to fill up his gas tank with when he is able to — nanochloropsis oculata.

Most sixth graders could probably not even pronounce that scientific name,

but David used the algae to take a top spot from the recent Florida Science & Engineering Fair.

"My project was which type of algae creates the most efficient biofuel," he said. "Another biofuel is ethanol. It hasn't been working out well, because of how expensive it is to create ethanol."

Ethanol is a family of plant-based motor fuels. It's often used to augment or

replace petroleum.

"(Algae) is cheap, and can produced almost anywhere," David said.

David's mother, Julia Truilo, said the family was pleasantly surprised when he won first place in the environmental science junior division at the recent State Science & Engineering Fair.

"He has always been very interested in the environment," Ms. Truilo, said. "That's one of his passions."

David said that his idea about using algae for fuel isn't unique. Indeed, Florida is home to Algenol Biofuels, a company working toward large-scale commercialization of algae-based fuels. According to a U.S. Department of Energy study, the nation could produce about 21 billion gallons of algal oil a year. That's equal to about 17 percent of the imported petroleum oil. The biggest downside to algal oil, according to the energy department, is water — growing algae to produce fuel takes a

lot of water.

However, David said there's a good tradeoff.

"The one thing that makes (algae) a really good biofuel is because when it grows it takes in a lot of carbon dioxide and carbon monoxide from the atmosphere," he said. "When it's burned, it produces them, but not as much."

The youngster said there were a number of good competitors at the state science fair who taught him a lot.

"I've always been very interested in how what you learn in science class can be easily moved into the real world," he said. "Science — it's in your everyday life."

The win got David a nomination to compete in the Society for Science & the Public's Broadcom MASTERS — Math, Applied Science, Technology and Engineering for Rising Stars. Finalists will be announced on August 29. If David is one, he'll get an expenses-paid trip to Washington D.C. from Sept. 28 to Oct. 3.

He has a tip for those in the adult world: "Never stop thinking you're a child and keep asking yourself the questions you don't know. And never be afraid to ask the questions no one else is asking."

Mayor Kelley suggested the memorial plaque at the pier. At the meeting, he said he was reluctant to name the park to honor Cameron. He said that few in the community associated the playground with the lad.

"If he had helped on the park, I'd be comfortable with it," he said.

He noted that the Andy Romano Beachfront Park, 839 S. Atlantic Ave., was so named by the commission to honor a man well known for his beach advocacy.

Commissioner Troy Kent said the mayor was thinking like an adult, not a child.

"For a child, the heart of a park is a playground, and Cameron was just a kid," he said.

Mr. Kent said that Cameron, living so close to Sanchez, likely spent much time at the playground and his friends had many experiences with him there. However, Mr. Kent said that adults would more likely remember a 12-year-old who fished at the pier.

"I'm also OK with the city getting a plaque and putting it on the pier," he said. "I'm OK with doing both of those."

Cameron's was one of two school-traffic related deaths this year. He was hit while being picked up at Ormond Beach Middle School. The other, and more recent, fatality was on Feb. 2. That morning 16-year-old Brandon Vera was fatally injured while walking to University High School in Orange City.

The youths' deaths have the Volusia County Schools investigating ways to improve pedestrian safety around schools.

# Hey cats, time for your rock 'n' roll history lesson

"Rock 'n' roll is here to stay" were the sage words of Danny And The Juniors back in 1958. Boy, did they nail it!

For almost all of us, rock 'n' roll music has been with us for our entire lives. In my own hometown the daring new sound exploded on the scene in 1956. I was 13 years old and the perfect age to take the long magical ride that has been the evolution of pop culture and rock 'n' roll. What a ride it has been.

In the very beginning it was difficult to find so called "race" music on the radio. When you did most of it consisted of young white kids covering old rhythm and blues standards that had never been heard on white radio. Pretty quickly, some real originals began to show up. I loved the sounds of groups like Buddy Holly and The Crickets and Gene Vincent and The Blue Caps.

Soon the radio stations began to play songs by the actual black R&B artists. People like Chuck Willis, Clyde McPhatter, Clarence Frogman Henry and Lavern Baker filled the airways with toe-tapping hits. Right about then Chubby Checker stole The Twist from Hank Ballard and The Midnighters and his record had the whole country dancing.

In the 1960s, the music took several directions with the Beach Boys' West Coast sound soon followed by the British Invasion of the Beatles, The Rolling Stones, and the Animals, to name a few. Folk rock became a national phenomenon with people like the Byrds and Bob Dylan. By the end of the decade the psychedelic sound was in full bloom headed up by Jefferson Airplane and The Grateful Dead. The '70s brought us Disco and dance music.

That was in direct contradiction of the Hippie movement of the late '60s. With disco, couples actually dressed to go out and dance the night away. An unexpected sidelight of disco was the Urban Cowboy effect that made rock based country music more mainstream. That, too, spawned a lot of dancing.

Punk rock came along to offset the slick production of disco. Heavy metal music was big in the '70s with groups like Black Sabbath and Led Zeppelin leading the way. In the 1980s rock 'n' roll music welcomed videos and the MTV generation was born. Some say the music suffered for it but everyone has an opinion.


Now here we are well into the 21st century and rock 'n' roll shows no signs of slowing down. When I was a kid in the '50s I owned a suitcase filled with 45 rpm records. These days, kids have thousands of songs available at

the click of an Internet button. It's a different concept but the love of rock 'n' roll music remains a constant.

Forgive my short capsule of the history of rock. I purposely left out many of your favorites for lack of space. My intention was to give a brief rundown of some of the many directions the music has taken. Have you ever really stopped to consider exactly how rock 'n' roll came to be? We all think we know, but do we actually? On Wednesday, May 23, Mr. Darryl Gentry will answer those questions in his class at the Casements of Ormond Beach. The class is titled "The Birth Of Rock 'n' Roll" and is bound to be fun and informative. Recently, I met with Darryl at a McDonald's to discuss this column and he and I had so much fun going over music history, nearby diners were abandoning their Egg McMuffins to listen in.

Darryl formerly taught the same subject for three years at Yavapai College in Prescott, Arizona. I can tell you he knows his subject well. While my ramblings above are a brief history of rock 'n' roll, Darryl only covers the very beginning. He discusses 1952 (when the first R&B songs aired) to 1962, which provide some surprising background into how we became a rock 'n' roll generation.

Like a lot of us, when I met with him I went in believing I already knew it all but as we said in the day, "Hey cat, I was so wrong." Do you know how and why radio went from being so wild and inventive in the early days to become a stacked top 40 format? I didn't. Have you ever heard of Hunter Hancock, the first DJ in America to play black R&B for a general audience? In the class you will learn all about that plus the origins of Doo Wop and Rockabilly and hear a lot of music as well. It is Darryl's intention to do a series of these classes so if you can't get in on Wednesday sign up for his next one. Give him a call at (386) 763-4152. This is going to be a blast!!



# Most banks no show at economic summit

DELTONA — Representatives from an integral segment of the financial world were conspicuously absent last Friday at an economic

summit held at Deltona City Hall.

Convened by Congressman John Mica, R-Winter Park, the discussion was aimed at putting bureaucrats, chamber executives, bankers, academics and

politicians in the same room with entrepreneurs seeking help to grow or start their businesses. Nearly 100 were in attendance.

"We can't make you the winner," Congressman Mica said to a handful of prospective entrepreneurs in the audience, "but we can get you in the competition."

All but two major lenders, Pinnacle Bank and venture capitalist Warren Kaplan, stayed away, though. Some believed it was due to how most banks these days appear nervous to provide business loans to anyone but those with a Small Business Administration guarantee.

"Where are the rest of the banks in the county today?" asked real estate consultant Ferd Reinlieb of Enterprise. "And why do we have to go to only private lenders once we get past guaranteed loans?"

It isn't fair to harp on the community banks, said David Bridgeman, CEO of Pinnacle Bank. He told attendees that community banks make up just 11 percent of the financial system but dole out about 40 percent of all small business loans. Those,

in turn, create about 60 percent of all new jobs.

"When you go to a community bank or local bank," he said, "understand that their world has changed. Regulations have come down on us so hard. ... We've been doing traditional lending and investing, so we get the wrath of Washington because we're the ones they can beat over the head with a stick."

But it's not just stricter regulations that make bankers leery of lending, said Robert Goetz, program director for Seminole State College's entrepreneur training program in Sanford, in an interview after the summit. It's the profit motive.

"So many banks lost an enormous amount of investment funds from 2007 to 2009," he said. "But now they're overcompensating by making no loans. It makes me angry because they're in the business of making loans. They play an enormous role in capitalism. But right now, most banks are looking for risk-free, and that does not exist."

Even with Small Business Administration loan guarantees, many small business hopefuls can't get off the ground due to this squeamish lending.

"A lot of the folks I talk to, they need \$25,000 and \$50,000 small loans," said Van Canada, manager of Daytona State College's Small Business Development Center. "And

even with SBA guarantees, banks rarely get involved with them."

Congressman Mica agreed that infrequent lending was a stumbling block.

"Every time I come back from Washington," he said, "I hear the same thing: It's hard to get a loan. ... Business owners are probably the most oppressed by all these new regulations and they are probably the least responsible for the financial meltdown."

It wasn't just banks that came under fire at the summit. Carol Gilbert, owner of Gilbert Medical Transcription Services in Altamonte Springs, just lost out on a bid for services with the Florida Department of Health to an Ohio company. She asked Congressman Mica to push for a change in state law.

"Put it back to where Florida businesses get the preferences," Ms. Gilbert said. "I had to lay off two people. So

I'm here talking on their behalf as well."

Much of the summit was spent extolling the virtues of government efforts to create jobs. Aside from SunRail station excitement— recent estimates put the new (temporary) job count at 10,000 — much of the insight came from leaders of business incubators, such as the county's incubator at Daytona Beach International Airport. So much success has been experienced at that one, said airport director Rick Karl, that county leaders are looking to locate another in West Volusia.

"We don't know exactly what part of (West) Volusia County it will be located," Mr. Karl said, "but we're moving forward."

Everyone at the summit was well aware of the ultimate goal: job creation.

The Small Business Administration's Eduardo Ramos said partnering with higher educators and magnet high schools will ensure a steady stream of skilled workers here to keep companies from seeking cheaper labor elsewhere.

"We want to create jobs in the U.S.," he said. "We don't want to create jobs overseas."

Congressman Mica said he was encouraged by the breadth of knowledge exhibited at the summit — and perhaps a little discouraged too.

"We've probably raised more questions than we have answers today," he said. "Hopefully, this is the beginning of additional meetings and not just meetings and talk, but action."



# Quture Inc. leases Daytona building

In a market the size of Volusia County, sometimes something new and unique will fly under the radar. Well, not that far under. The company did issue a news release.

**Quture Inc.** has leased the A.M. Weigl building at 200 Magnolia Ave. in Daytona Beach for a research and development center. Quture is headed up by Landon Feazell, who came to the area with his wife and son when they bought the Three Bridges property south of Port Orange on Strickland Bay and turned it into Sunset Quay Outfitters, a kayak rental and eco-tour business.

Feazell has developed several businesses over the years, mostly focusing on quality control for medical-related processes for hospitals, doctor offices, government offices and insurance companies. Quture does similar quality control software development.

"As our partners and employees have come to learn, we thrive on providing a professional working environment with the latest in high-tech communications and business solutions in a comfortable setting enriched by surrounding entertainment options for Quture's upscale client demographic," Feazell said in the news release.

The center will have only a few employees, but it's definitely the type of place that downtown Daytona

Beach needs.

A good omen for today's **employment report** is that the number of claims for unemployment compensation continues to go down. In April, claims were at 1,650, down 20.6 percent from 2,079 in April 2011. Claims would have to get down closer to 1,000 a month for the jobs market to really look good, but it's getting closer.

**Builders** continue buying up lots in the area. Gallery Homes of DeLand bought 48 lots at Glenwood Springs in DeLand for a bargain basement price. At less than \$10,000 each, Gallery should be able to build houses priced at under \$150,000. That would be more competitive with the price of houses in West Volusia that has been shrunk by foreclosures.

**Commercial real estate** investors also continue showing interest in the area. John Babalis, a West Virginia investor, paid \$1.993 million for the new Dollar General

property in Daytona Beach Shores. In other dollar store news, construction has begun on the Dollar General at Spring Garden and Pennsylvania avenues in DeLand.

the other hand, you can enjoy lower gasoline prices. At \$3.61 early this week, the average price is down more than 30 cents from last month and last year.

In the restaurant watch, **Outback Steakhouse** has started building its replacement restaurant on West International Speedway Boulevard in Daytona Beach. It is moving from a spot behind a couple of fast-food places to a very easy-to-see spot at West ISB and Midway Avenue.

**Brown & Brown Inc.** has expanded its presence in New England by buying Endlar Insurance of Dedham, Mass. Endlar, which specializes in condo insurance, has annual revenue of about \$4.6 million.

One soft spot in an otherwise growing economy is Delta Air Lines and US Airways still aren't offering more flights at **Daytona Beach International Airport**. With the same number of seats available as last year, traffic has been down slightly for the past two months. Travel experts expect the airlines to keep flights at the level they are now, so expect crowded airplanes this summer. On

**Sparton Corp.**'s DeLeon Springs sonobuoy plant helped the company to a good fiscal third quarter. Sparton reported revenue of \$55 million as foreign sales of its underwater detection devices improved. Its net income was \$2 million, down from \$2.5 million last year because of accounting changes.

Five area banks have partnered to help bring JA Finance Park to Volusia County, only the second Junior Achievement district in the state to have it.

The online simulator helps teach high school students about personal finance and career opportunities in finance. # Students urged to be Crime Stoppers, too

Hazing, bullying, drugs and weapons in schools dominate the headlines more and more these days.

The success of Crime Stoppers of Northeast Florida's Student Crime Stoppers Program for elementary, middle and high school students is prompting Crime Stoppers board members and area educators to consider a similar program at the college level.

Crime Stoppers is a non-profit organization which supports citizen participation in crime solving through a toll-free tip line. Callers, who remain anonymous, report suspected criminal activity and are eligible to receive cash rewards for information leading to arrests.

Jorge Carvajal is the 2012 Crime Stoppers of Northeast Florida Board of Directors President and works as a deputy sheriff for Volusia County.

He said the concept is simple and effective. "It works. It's free. We'll pay you," Mr. Carvajal said.

He said fear often discourages people from calling 911.

"If an 84-year-old woman suspects there is drug activity next door she may be afraid to call 911, have an officer come talk to her and then have that officer go to question the neighbor," Mr. Carvajal said. "She may fear retaliation. She may feel endangered."

He explained that through the anonymous tip line a caller can take as much time and make as many calls as he or she deems necessary to describe the situation and related concerns. The information from each call is filtered to the appropriate law enforcement agency and investigated. A subsequent arrest can mean a reward of up to \$1,000 for the caller.

Students may be even more at risk for neglecting to report deviant or dangerous behavior among their peers due to fear of retaliation or of being ostracized.

Crime Stoppers of Northeast Florida Executive Director Alyson Durrance said a Northeast Florida student initiative was prompted by the Columbine High School shooting.

"A Crime Stoppers board member who worked in the State Attorney's Office actually went to Columbine after the shooting and found out some of the kids knew something violent was planned before it happened but they were afraid to say anything," Ms. Durrance said. "He didn't want it to happen again."

Student Crime Stoppers is promoted through an annual poster contest for elementary, middle and high school students. Winning posters are stationed in all classrooms in the four-county area.



The posters include Crime Stoppers' toll free anonymous tip line. Grand prizewinning posters are also displayed on VOTRAN buses throughout the 7th Judicial Circuit including Volusia, Flagler, Putnam and St. Johns Counties.

"We want to be able to give these kids the ability to reach out, voice concern and know it will be handled," Mr. Carvajal said. "Whether theft, hazing, drugs or any other illegal activity; we have the ability to get that off of the campus and they get a little pocket change. It's a win-win situation."

Ms. Durrance said student awareness and program participation is on the rise.

"I can tell you that each month at the board meeting the sheriff's liaison gives a report," she said. "It seems like every month we're getting student tips that lead to arrests and rewards."

Crime Stoppers of Northeast Florida Coordinator and Volusia County Sheriff's Investigator Bill Wilson said student tips nearly always result in rewards.

"Students are pretty accurate," he said. "Their tips are not like some of the vague narcotic tips we get. And very rarely do we get a student who just wants to get someone in trouble because they don't like that person."

Now, Crime Stoppers of Northeast Florida and area educators want to take the student tip program to the college level.

"Basically we have so many schools and a couple of them came to us and asked how they could work with us," Ms. Durrance said. "With hazing, drugs

"Dr. Farmer and law enforcement officials throughout the state pleaded with Tallahassee to get it done," Mr. Carvajal said. "If a doctor is abusing his abilities to write prescriptions, Dr. Farmer is committed to pulling his license to practice within the state of Florida."

Crime Stoppers was incorporated as a 501(c) 3 tax-exempt organization in 1996. It was formed by members of the Daytona Beach Rotary Club following the murder of one of the club's members during a home robbery. The organization expanded to include the whole 7th Judicial Circuit, which includes Volusia, Flagler, Putnam and St. Johns Counties in late 2004 and was renamed to Crime Stoppers of Northeast Florida.

The program, dedicated to taking criminals off the streets, encourages citizens to call a toll-free number with anonymous tips about criminal activity. Cash rewards up to \$1,000 may be given for information leading to arrests.

Gary Davidson of the Volusia County Sheriff's Office called Crime Stoppers "a remarkably effective program."

He said the program's simplicity and the anonymity it provides create a solid foundation for assisting law enforcement in case solving. But he said it's not always about financial gain.

"I should mention that while some people are motivated by reward money, many people provide useful information that helps solve a case and never seek the reward money," Mr. Davidson said. "They simply want to help keep the community safe and put criminals behind bars."

Mr. Davidson said crime in Florida is on the decline. He referred to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement's recently released 2011 Annual Uniform Crime Report. It shows the state's crime rate dropped 0.8 percent compared to 2010, a 41 year low. According to the report Volusia County experienced a 1.8 percent drop in total index crime, which includes murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson.

"We can't attribute the decline to any particular reason," Mr. Davidson said. "But we have a combination of very aggressive law enforcement and strong community involvement including neighborhood watch groups and Crime Stoppers."

Mr. Davidson said enhanced penalties, changes in sentencing laws

and new statutes are also driving numbers down.

"We're not jumping for joy, necessarily. The numbers are still too high and our goal is to see them go down more," he said. "The point is it's going in the right direction."

According to the 2012 Crime Stoppers of Northeast Florida fact sheet, during the fiscal year July 1, 2010 – June 30, 2011 the number of tips received was 2,758, resulting in 205 arrests. The value of property recovered through tips was \$101,071. The value of drugs taken off the streets through tips was \$359,483. And the value of rewards approved was \$29,887.

Crime Stoppers President, Mr. Carvajal, is also a Volusia County deputy sheriff and was once an investigator liaison, responsible for taking anonymous tips.

"The program works," Mr. Carvajal said. "It's a fantastic tool for the community and for law enforcement. For people who don't feel safe or don't want to call 911 this is the way to go," he said.

He said while tips and arrests are up in recent years there has not been a dramatic increase in rewards sought.

"In '07 we prepared for a worst-case scenario due to the worsening economy, the likelihood of losing funding and the amount of rewards we expected to be collected, Mr. Carvajal said. "But we didn't see much of a claim increase."

Rewards are paid for by grant dollars through the Crime Stoppers Trust Fund, administered by the Office of the Attorney General and more fully by contributions from private citizens, social and civic groups and businesses. Typically, no taxpayers' dollars are used to fund Crime Stoppers' programs.

Each year, officers from the four-county area sheriff and police departments are nominated by their departments to receive Crime Stoppers' Officer of the Year award. Mr. Carvajal said each officer nominee has demonstrated exemplary effort and ability.

# Local cyclists ride, unite to keep trails

DELEON SPRINGS — A group of Central Florida cyclists were offered hydration and applause as they rolled through DeLeon Springs on their way to Athens, Ga. recently.

Members of the DeLeon Springs Community Association welcomed the group enthusiastically, grateful for the impetus behind the mission.

Dubbed 24 Hours to Twilight, the ride was spearheaded by cycling enthusiast John Moorhouse who said the group is, in part, trying to create awareness for DeLeon Springs, particularly a series of mountain biking trails located there.

Chuck Lennon Park, adjacent to DeLeon Springs State Park, consists of 136 acres, covered pavilions, grills, restrooms, tennis courts and two playgrounds. The park, dedicated to Chuck Lennon for his commitment to the betterment of the DeLeon Springs community and its youth, has four separate bike trails, spanning six miles.

But lately there's more to the park's story.

Within the trails there is an area of fairly steep

inclines, declines and jumps.

There's talk of danger, as in liability-type danger, and word is Volusia County officials are nervous. Rumor has it the trails may be closed.

JC Figueredo, long-time cyclist and owner of JC's Bikes and Boards in DeLand, said he helped build some of the jumps and obstacles at Chuck Lennon Park. He said he would classify the trails as intermediate.

"They could be a little advanced if you're a beginner but really they're pretty beginner friendly," he said. "I mean it's nothing like you're gonna go out there and die."

Volusia County spokeswoman Pat Kuehn said the county is not looking to close the trails.

She said the International Mountain Biking Association, or IMBA, approached the county with an offer to maintain the trails in exchange for permission to hold special events there.

"That prompted our parks department to look at the trails," she said. "We're looking at the twists, turns and jumps to make sure they're safe."

Ms. Kuehn said a safety audit will be performed at

the end of May and the results will be presented to the Volusia County Council, possibly in June.

"There's no predetermined decision here," she said. "We don't want anybody to get hurt."

Volusia County Council member Pat Northey said she thinks there are some concerns about one trail in particular being "more rigorous than the average person can do."

"I think one of the jumps is pretty steep and there is a rock or a stump or something at the end of the jump," she said.

That jump is located in the "advanced skills" area of the trails. Mr. Phelps said his section accounts for about one-quarter mile of the trails and is "the only jump area." He said there is a tree at the end of one jump but to his knowledge no one has ever hit that tree.

Ms. Northey said she would like to see the trails remain open to riders. She said there is an inherent risk in most things people do.

"We're willing to take the risk of cars on the beach, and the beach is a playground," she said.

Ms. Northey said Volusia County is rich with recreational opportunities.

"There is great economic value involved with people coming in from all over the region," she said. "We have great natural resources and the public has paid, taxed themselves for their use."

Confident that a favorable resolution to the trail issue will be reached, Ms. Northey credits county manager James Dinneen, with putting "boots on the ground" and examining the trails.

"I think the council supports coming up with a resolution," she said. I don't think this is anything we can't overcome or shouldn't try to overcome."

24 Hours to Twilight participant Holly Horner said she attended Stetson University but didn't know then that the trails at Chuck Lennon existed.

"I was disappointed because at that time I didn't even know Chuck Lennon was there," she said. "We had nothing to do on the weekends."

Ms. Horner said she doesn't agree with the risk argument. She said there are potential risks involved with many recreational and every day activities.

"If that's the case then close all of the beaches and rip out the sidewalks," she said.

and weapons there was an idea to extend the program to colleges.

Bethune-Cookman University Crime Prevention Outreach Specialist Cheryl Lawson-Young said she's looking forward to working with Crime Stoppers.

"We would like to enhance what we have ongoing at B-CU with our Wildcat Student Watch Team and it just seems appropriate to take it to the next level to strengthen and make students aware of the tools out there," she said.

Ms. Lawson-Young said Bethune-Cookman's student watch team, which has been assembled for two years is "absolutely" effective.

"They help to design and identify a focus for awareness monthly," she said. "It's been a great tool to get the word out and provide peer to peer direction."

Ms. Durrance said the proposed college program is in the "brainstorming phase" as Crime Stoppers decides on a college-level competition similar to the poster contest to promote awareness among that student population.

"Maybe an essay contest," Ms. Durrance said. "It's early on in working out the logistics."

Poster contest awards are presented at school board meetings throughout the four-county area. This year's Volusia county winners will be announced at the meeting on May 22.

# Get a 'taste' of West Volusia restaurants at annual event



# Cutting calories and fat? You can still enjoy delicious ice cream sundaes

**H**ello, smart shoppers. I've been meaning to talk about something very important, so here goes.

I watch in disbelief as I see scores of you still buying stick margarine. It can't be possible that you haven't heard or read about how bad margarine is; it is one molecule away from plastic.

Stick margarine usually contains trans-fats and is a proven carcinogen. It also contributes to heart disease. Butter substitutes usually come in tub form, have no trans-fats and a certain amount is recommended daily. Please read labels.

My preference is Smart Balance in its original form (not light). It can be used as a substitute for margarine

or butter in all recipes. It's almost as hard as butter; you can even fry with it.

Have you been taking advantage of all the pre-packaged varieties of salad greens of all description? I love the mixed baby greens and other mixes. I even buy the pre-packaged spinach, even though it doesn't taste like the spinach I remember. The good thing is the absence of sand. Years ago when you bought spinach in bunches you could never get rid of it all.

A while ago I gave you the recipe for my cousin, Jeannie's kale and beans.

After my saying I hate kale she insisted I try it her way. Since I was only making a small amount, the bagged kale was too much. I purchased a 1/2 pound from a bunch, stripped off the leaves and discarded the tough stems. I have to admit, it was good.

Recently I made kale soup using the 1 pound bag; what a mistake. The leaves weren't stripped, the kale was just cut up stems and all and the tough stems ruined the soup. Please, if you saved the recipe, specify fresh not bagged kale.

Trying to find something different to satisfy your sweet tooth? I tried something I heard of years ago, forgot about then recently read about in the newspaper.

Hot caramel sauce over vanilla ice cream is wonderful, but the price for those little jars it's sold in makes it quite expensive. Sweetened, condensed milk, like magic, turns into caramel sauce. The can is 14 ounces. I happened to have a can of the fat-free version and since my friend Betty had a birthday coming up I thought I'd give it a try.

Peel the paper off the can, place the unopened can in a small deep pot, cover with water and cook, uncovered for three hours, replacing water as it boils down. Let cool. When you open it you have a thick, sticky caramel sauce that can be thinned with a little milk if you choose.

When I made her a sundae with Breyer's sugar-free (has half the fat of regular ice-cream) vanilla ice cream topped with warmed caramel sauce, toasted, chopped pecans, low-fat whipped cream or topping and a Maraschino cherry you would think I had plucked a star from the sky.

Cutting the fat and cholesterol and many times the sugar doesn't mean you can't have sundaes, banana

splits, floats and ice cream sodas, you just make some changes.

The varieties of low-fat and fat-free ice creams are endless, but if you try Breyer's in vanilla, chocolate and even butter pecan you'd swear it was mislabeled, it's so good.

A sundae using all high-fat ingredients can have 650 calories. You can cut off more than 450 calories if you do it my way.

I constantly preach cut the fat, cut the cholesterol, but a diabetic diet also specifies the same thing. In many sauces you can use a sugar substitute such as Splenda in place of sugar. Cutting the fat and cholesterol is what I'm all about. The surprising bonus is you also lose weight.

Enjoy. See you next week!

Finally, the experts have learned what we always knew. Chocolate is good for you! There are chemicals in chocolate that are responsible for this. Research shows that chocolate also contains protein, calcium and antioxidants, which may help prevent many chronic diseases including cancer and coronary heart disease.

Remember, you can't eat the whole box; a little each day goes a long way. The scientific name for chocolate, *theobroma cacao*, means food of the gods.

2/3-cup light corn syrup  
1/2-cup cocoa

Check store brands for the corn syrup; many are much cheaper than name brands.

Place corn syrup and cocoa in a small saucepan, cook over medium heat and slowly whisk together until blended and warm.

Before the slow three weeks, redfish had been steady but small with a large one being about 22 inches. Now I was catching zero reds — not undersized, nothing.

I had taken about all of that I could stand so I got up early and set my jaw for some serious fishing. I headed down to the three bridges where Spruce Creek meets U.S. 1. Launching my kayak in the morning darkness, I headed for a redfish hole that I had been working since the 1970s.

After paddling the Green

Peanut about a mile, I eased into place and began fishing very carefully. The chartreuse jig tipped with fresh shrimp bits was my bait of choice. I cast that area for over an hour and when I was finished I had a flounder. No reds, no trout and nothing else. My sure-fire redfish hole had let me down.

As I shoved the Peanut on top of my truck I told myself that my setback was only temporary for I was heading up to Port Orange and Miller's Creek and there I know exactly where the redfish live. After a long paddle against the strong tide I tied up to a mangrove and put the jig and shrimp to work once more.

Nothing, nothing, nothing — no flounder! My, oh my! What's going on? Okay, I thought, this calls for desperate measures. Pushing the kayak ever north I eased into a big hole between two oyster bars just south of Donald's Bait and Tackle on Dunlawton. As

Bullwinkle the moose said: "This time for sure!" I cast the jig so many times I was beating the water into a froth. No reds, no flounder. Unbelievable. Three can't-miss redfish holes produced three flounder. As I headed for the truck I reminded myself to thank the fishing gods for what I did catch.

Once back at home in Ormond-by-the-Sea, I filleted the flat fish and smiled at the big pile of potential fish sandwiches that they yielded. By then I was either too tired or too lazy to take the fish carcasses down to the Halifax at the end of my street so I decided to wait for morning to do that. That can be a gamble for a bucket of fermenting fish bodies kept overnight can become very pungent.

Early the next morning I held my breath and headed off to the river with my stink pot. I congratulated myself on getting out of the yard before my neighbors had begun pounding on the door with the torches and pitchforks. As you know I can't go near the water without fishing so once I had dumped my fish parts into the river I began flinging the jig around.

Right away a nice fat 16-inch trout hit the jig and then another and another. Next a larger one hit and finally fell back into the river as I tried to lift it onto the dock. In a half-hour I had caught three nice trout and barely missed a limit. This is at the end of my street where I never expect to catch much. I had actually topped my previous day when I had paddled for miles not to mention the gasoline it took to get down to Spruce Creek. I'll tell you, this fishing thing can sure be exasperating, doggone it.
