Daytona leisure services programs won't be cut

DAYTONA BEACH — Drove of residents flocked City Hall for a workshop outlining the Daytona Beach Leisure Services budget, and were ready to take the podium to keep community programs and activities from being cut, but it turned out they didn't need to.

The City Commission agreed last Wednesday to maintain Leisure Service programs and have more opportunities for collaborations and volunteering, instead of outside private investment, which was proposed earlier in the year when budget shortfalls threatened many of the department's programs.

Percy Williamson, Director of Leisure Services, was praised for working with those shortfalls and for his budget proposal for the upcoming fiscal year.

"There's a lot of empha-

sis and human activity behind those numbers and I was just pleased to see the public come out to take a look and participate in their government," Mr. Williamson said.

The 60-page report revealed 440,580 individuals participated in Leisure Services programs and activities last year in 37 parks and facilities, and eight special events took place.

One popular program, the Mayors Backpack Give-a-way, has reached 3,250 kids and will kick off during the first weekend in August this year.

The budget for Leisure Services is projected to be \$2.86 million for 2012, and \$2.94 million for 2013. Also noted was a slight reduction in Leisure Service staff, going from 52 staff members this year, to 47 for 2013.

"We're doing more with less in our city," Commis-

Matousek defends Clerk post for first time since '96

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Diane Matousek started working for Volusia County's Clerk of the Circuit Court at the age of 18. She worked her way up the ladder for two decades before she felt she could do a better job than her boss of bringing the office into the technological age.

"There was hardly any automation," she recalled. "We were still using typewriters. It was awful. It took all the guts I had, but I won."

In 1993, she served her first term. This fall, she'll face her first opposition since 1996. Former county judge Steve deLaroche and former deputy clerk Christi-

na Sanders have filed so far to run against her. The filing deadline: June 8.

All three candidates consider themselves conservative, but Ms. Matousek says she stands apart in other crucial ways.

"They don't have the experience or the knowledge of the clerk's office as I do," she said. "My record as clerk is impeccable. I would suggest asking them why they think they should be running against me."

After starting as clerk, Ms. Matousek, 57, of Orange City, immediately set to work creating an interactive website that automated many filing practices and research activities that, before then, required a trip to the courthouse.



It was so ahead of its time, she said, that the county was able to own one of the most user-friendly domain names for a clerks office anywhere: www.clerk.org.

The benefits to attorneys, title agencies and even speeders paying a traffic ticket are evident, she said.

"It saves them man hours and our office as well," she said. "It was a win-win situation."

But all that's common knowledge now. She's got

Donation boxes may face city regulations

HOLLY HILL — Their a frequent sight: the dumpster-like donation boxes in parking lots that ask for used clothing. Many who stuff those boxes with their old sneakers and T-shirts probably expect those items are going to local charities to be distributed to those in need.

They would be partially right. Some clothing donation boxes do benefit local charities, but the majority of them are for business and some of them are out and out fraudulent. At least one local government is looking at ways to control them.

Holly Hill City Commissioner John Penny asked city staff recently about getting clothing drop-off boxes out of town. "Basically, they're doing business in the city without getting an occupational license," he said. "I think they need to be cleaned up."

According to Steve Ducharme, owner of Suncoast Textile Recycling, which has about 500 clothing donation boxes in Florida, the clothes put in the boxes are often heading to overseas markets. Whether they're benefiting charities depends. He said many in the donation-box business misrepresent themselves as charities when they're not.

"There are hundreds of millions of dollars involved," Mr. Ducharme said. "Everybody is getting in on it."

Some of Suncoast's boxes are in Volusia

County including 10 in and around Holly Hill. Those boxes generate money for ResQue Me, an animal-welfare grant organization.

Jim McCroskey, city manager, said the clothing collection boxes are structures, thus if they're not permitted construction they violate the city's building codes — codes Holly Hill will soon start enforcing. No one has ever gotten a permit to put a clothing donation box in Holly Hill, according to Mr. McCroskey.

The number of clothing drop-off boxes around town has dramatically increased in a short time, he said, and he believes many property owners may not even

SAVE program aims to let homeless work off tickets

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Dwayne Johnson is homeless. That's how he ended up with about \$750 of fines to pay off.

"I got caught sleeping in the jungle twice," he said. "That's a 'no trespass.' I was given \$250 some odd tickets. Then I got caught with an open container. That's \$250."

Mr. Johnson uses "the jungle" to describe sleeping outdoors. Those fines were likely to get Mr. Johnson in jail for failing to appear in court. Instead, they got the 54-year-old back in school, thanks to the new Sentencing Alternatives for Volusia Enforcement, or SAVE, Docket. The program will officially launch on Wednesday, June 6, at the Volusia County Courthouse Annex in Daytona Beach.

But the program coordinator, Ginny Kent, has spent the last couple of months getting homeless and indigent people who've been ticketed for minor offenses into community-service hours for preemptive credit toward fines — and to court, so they can get that credit. She said the goal of SAVE is

not just to give indigent and homeless individuals a way to pay off fines, but to help them get the services they need to better their lives.

"When a person comes in to see me, what I'd really like them to do is get services for themselves, for credit toward fines," she said.

The Volusia County Council approved a \$50,000 grant for the program. Ms. Kent works for Haven Recovery Center under that county grant.

The new court program, spearheaded by County Judge Belle Schumann, is aimed at reducing the number of bench warrants issued for failure to appear. When police ticket individuals for minor offenses, such as public intoxication, they're required to pay a fine by a certain date, or appear in court. Notices for court appearances are usually mailed, but homeless people don't get mail. Many don't know that they're supposed to be in court. If they do, they often don't show up for a number of reasons, including lack of transportation.

Every year, Volusia cops stop about 4,000 people for minor offenses and give them tickets. About 80 per-

cent of those ticketed don't make it to their court dates. When police officers stop those individuals for minor offenses again, they end up having to take them to the Volusia County Branch Jail. It costs about \$71 a day to have an inmate at the county jail.

Judge Schumann said issuing bench warrants for homeless and indigent people who fail to appear in court costs the county and its cities a considerable amount of money. She said most judges would prefer not to issue those bench warrants, but under the current system, they have to.

"When they don't show up in court," she said, "I don't have a lot of choice."

With the new SAVE docket, when local police ticket individuals for minor offenses, they give them a bright orange flyer that explains the program. Individuals can call Ms. Kent and get referrals for doing preemptive community service that earns \$10 an hour toward the fines. Additionally, judges who hear SAVE docket cases have much latitude to give defendants credit for self-

other improvements — not to mention 300 employees — to oversee today. And in the coming two years, two major advances will consume much of the clerk's time.

The office will be converting to an e-filing system that will allow attorneys to file casework electronically from anywhere. Meanwhile, the entire American judicial system will be transitioning,

she said, to a computer network that will fully integrate court systems at all levels.

Now isn't the time to lose her institutional memory, she said.

"I have gone to conference after conference, meeting after meeting, learning about how this is actually going to work," she said. "It would be a travesty for somebody to come in with such a learning curve."

Ms. Matousek, who also supervises county recorder functions, earns a \$138,000 salary — commensurate,

she said, with CEOs of companies with 300 workers and such varied responsibilities.

And aside from her competition, she said she hasn't heard many complaints from voters.

"They may have criticized me when they received a summons for jury duty in the mail," she joked, "but for the most part, people who do business with our office are extremely satisfied."

LIFE IN THE TANK

One of the best things about living in warm sub-tropical Central Florida is being surrounded by all of the lush, fleshy plants. Many of us are able to grow bananas, citrus and other tropical fruits in our own back yards. I have friends who do well with avocados and my wife Lana and I enjoyed our papaya trees until they were frozen out in 2009. Each summer we could look forward to big red meat papayas from our own trees.

Now we have high expectations as we nurture a new pair of fledgling papaya trees in our jungle-like back yard. Growing tropical plants and fruits is a fun thing to do but one of the most rewarding projects I ever undertook was to maintain a large saltwater aquarium. When I installed the 55-gallon glass tank in our Florida room our kids were both young and right away our friends began to compliment me for doing that for the children. I accepted their praise under false pretenses, for I really had put the tank in to keep my fish bait alive.

Back then, I was young and hardy and threw my cast net almost every day. I considered it blasphemy to buy bait when the river was full of it free for the taking. At first, the kids didn't mind watching all of the shrimp and mullet swimming around but after a while they tired of that. Little by little the look of our fish tank changed. As a by-catch I started to bring up all sorts of interesting little creatures from the Halifax. Some were exotic, some were common; most all interesting.

One of the first things I put into the tank was a small piece of a tree branch that had barnacles growing on it. A barnacle is a small shellfish that has a hand-like appendage that reaches out to sweep food into its shell. All day

long the tiny hands were at work. To the children this was mesmerizing. Soon I added an oyster; a clam and a blue crab the size of a penny. Mangrove snapper are plentiful in our waters and I put several of no more than an inch in size into the aquarium. The snapper were very aggressive and would attack things much larger than themselves. When they get into a feeding mode they can change color and sometimes went from their usual reddish color to purple.




My kids loved the little sheephead that I caught. No larger than a quarter with those famous vertical black and white stripes and a full set of choppers. Sheephead get their name from their formidable teeth that reminded early fishermen of a sheep. That little guy was very shy and would only come out of hiding to eat the bits of shrimp I dropped in.

Another black and white fish that resides here is the spadefish. They are a true tropical and can be purchased in pet stores, but many live right under our bridges. Their body and fin configuration gives them the look of a spade in a deck of cards. Pretty little creature with a black vertical stripe that goes right through the eye. While the sheephead was shy, the spadefish was people friendly. As soon as our children pressed their noses to the glass it would come right over. I suppose it was as cute and cuddly as a fish can get.

One day I netted a stingray about the size of a silver dollar pancake and there was the star of my show. What an acrobat! The stingray liked its food to be served alive and when I would drop in a tiny shrimp the ray would follow it around until it could pin it to the bottom with its flat body. As it pressed the shrimp to the bottom all sorts of trembling and quaking of its body would take place as it moved the shrimp up to the mouth. Once it had it firmly in its jaws it would begin to swim all around the tank as though it was proud of the catch. This would go on much longer than seemed necessary before it settled down to dine.

Another unique little creature was the mantis shrimp. So homely it could have been the prototype for the creature in the "Predator" movies, it was ever active. The bottom of my tank was lined with crushed coral and the mantis shrimp would swim to the bottom and gather up a few arms full next to its ungainly body and swim to the top where it would release the coral. This would go on over and over all day, every day.

If you are looking for a fun hobby get yourself a cast net and begin throwing it around the local docks. There are all sorts of wonderful and entertaining creatures in our waters. You never know what will come up next. If you live near fresh water, the same is true there. These days I have a 500-gallon tank recessed into the floor of our screen room and it contains koi (Japanese carp) that I put there 15 years ago. When I dropped them in they were barely an inch and a half. Now, they will weigh six or seven pounds each. Word is they will still be there long after I shuffle off this mortal coil. I am now taking offers from caretakers for that eventuality.

Some say food trucks hurt restaurants

ORANGE CITY — Gram's Kitchen manager Rhonda Hogue doesn't have a problem with how the Food Truck Bazaar has been pulling into town on the first Sunday of the month. She just doesn't want to be neighbors.

"It's a little too close for comfort," she said last Thursday while doling out stuffed cabbage and cornbread at the Taste of West Volusia in DeBary. "It's right at John's Appliance next door. And we get a drop in business whenever they're here."

That's how those who run many eateries feel about the bazaar, said Councilman Gary Blair, who told his colleagues at a recent meeting that he'd called the city's approximately 50 restaura-

teurs in recent weeks and nearly all voiced concerns.

"(They) felt it wasn't fair these people can come in," he said, "make lots of money, leave town and not live up to the same standards as they do."

These sentiments could become more pronounced across the county now that the bazaar has stretched out and sunk in its hooks.

"We agreed to try it one time," said New Smyrna Beach Parks Superintendent Liz Yancey, "and everybody got a wonderful response, so we're gonna try it again."

Created by TheDailyCity.com founder Mark Baratelli from Orlando, the Food Truck Bazaar first came to Volusia County at the parking lot of the Orange City Lowe's in March, then moved to John's Appliance on Route 17-92 for its May 6 event.

Last week, despite Mr. Blair's lone "no" vote, the Orange City Council granted the regular convoy another three-month permit — starting on June 3, this time at the Kmart plaza on Saxon Boulevard.

The previous gatherings were from 5 to 8 p.m., but summer hours will be 6 to 9 p.m.

Roland Simmons, owner of the Pier 16 seafood restaurant on 17-92, said city leaders aren't thinking about the businesses with a true investment in the city.

"I pay \$10,000 in property taxes here," said Mr. Simmons, who's owned the restaurant for 21 years, "and these food trucks, they buy a temporary permit. They come into town, put on their little show and lots of people spend their money there. But they don't have bank accounts here."

If times were different, he said he might not be so obstinate.

"We're all struggling here in Orange City," he said, "and that's the last thing I need, for the city to bring in something like this to take money out of the pocket of people who do business in Orange City."

Orange City leaders said they would revisit the issue when considering another three-month permit in late summer.

Orange City Vice Mayor Paul Treusch said he might not visit the bazaar if area restaurants offered similar fare.

"I don't think I would patronize one of the food truck folks if I could get that specific kind of food at a restaurant," he said.

Several other cities like New Smyrna Beach, Edgewater, Port Orange, DeLand and Deltona have invited the bazaar to set up in a more sporadic fashion.

Deltona Mayor John Masiarczyk said he ate his first chicken and waffles at

the bazaar when it appeared on May 9 at Deltona's Concert in the Amphitheatre Series at Lyonia Preserve.

He expects the convoy to return for future engagements, though he understands how a city with more restaurant offerings might have gotten flack.

"I can see Orange City's issue, with all those offerings on 'restaurant row' on Saxon (Boulevard) and Enterprise (Road)," he said.

"It would probably have a negative impact."

But, he added, "Competition is what America is all about. I don't know if this is just a fad, but it's happening all over the country. So if the public supports it and they comply with all the regulations, I don't see why it would be a concern."

That seems to be the stance in East Volusia too.

The city of New Smyrna Beach didn't receive any complaints about inviting the bazaar to its Fifth Friday event in late March on eatery-rich Flagler Avenue, held in conjunction with the merchants association.

The trucks return to the city's Riverside Park on June 9 for the city's 125th anniversary celebration. After that, it's back on Flagler: Aug. 31, Nov. 15 and, tentatively, Feb. 21.

Still, insisted Ms. Yancey, the parks superintendent, "we're not going to overdo it and if we start getting any complaints, whoa, that's it, we're done."

In Port Orange, the city invited the bazaar to take part in its Family Days celebration in early March. According to Jill Geddy, executive director of the Port Orange Family Days Community Trust, it should be back next year.

"I'm sure if it came every week or every month," she said, "that it might bother the restaurants, but so far we've heard nothing but positive."

Mr. Baratelli didn't return several calls for comment.



Want to buy a cheap house? Better hurry

At long last, the mountain of inventory of houses on the market in Volusia County has been trimmed to a high hill. Anyone wanting a cheap deal on a foreclosed house should get on the move.

While sales of existing single-family houses was down in April in Volusia overall, Realtors were reporting the number of available houses is down. With the Federal Reserve keeping interest rates extremely low, the demand should stay high and prices should increase for the rest of the year.

The lower inventory has helped spur more action by home builders, despite what the report on building permits says for April. There were 45 single-family houses started in the month, but according to the U.S. Census Bureau that was down from 91 in April 2011. However, I can't find the 62 houses the bureau claims were started in Daytona Beach that month. A check of city and county records only turns up 7. So, if anyone knows where 62 houses were started within the city of Daytona Beach in April last year, please let me know.

Regardless, the big builders

had already started 35 houses in the county through the first half of May and should easily outpace the 45 houses started in May 2011.

Of course, for folks still struggling to pay their mortgage, all of this is meaningless and prices still haven't increased enough to help them out. There is a program still available that may help, though. The Home Affordable Refinance Program, or HARP, will let you reduce your monthly payments. Your mortgage has to have been acquired by Freddie Mac or Fannie Mae. You can check with your bank about the program if you think you qualify. Thanks to Realtor Diane Kirvan for pointing that out to me.

There is a silver lining in the foreclosure mess. A lot of people were able to buy houses cheap, which should allow them to have more disposable income to spend in other areas of the economy.

Consolidated-Tomoka Land Co. is moving forward with its plans to add 146,000-square-feet of space at its Gateway Center on Mason Avenue Extension in Daytona

Beach. The company's existing building at Mason and Williamson Boulevard is nearly full, so it probably hopes to have the new building available when it does fill up. The space can be built out for light industry, offices or retail.

Also on the **commercial real estate** front, the doctors of Pulmonary Practice Associates have bought the building they are in at Orange City Town Center for \$650,000. Cox Enterprises has sold the former Penny Saver building in DeLand for \$260,000 to Mainstreet Property Management. The building was one of the properties that Cox kept in the News-Journal deal with Halifax Media. However, it may not get to keep the money as there is a pending lawsuit by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corp., which is trying to cover the

unfunded portion of the News-Journal Corp. pension plan. Probably hoping to eventually cash in on Sunrail when it extends to DeLand, an investor has bought the Pelham Square property adjacent to the railroad for \$600,000.

As **Sunoco** continues rebuilding the old Shell stations it got from First Coast Energy, it has bought land behind the one at U.S. 1 and Granada Boulevard for \$330,000. It must plan on that Sunoco being a big one.

There's a possibility that the next project at The Pavilion at Port Orange could be a **Chuck E. Cheese's**. Area parents will have one more place to take their children to enjoy unbridled chaos.





know they're there.

"I would say I noticed maybe two or three the first of the year," Mr. McCroskey said. "Now there's probably one on every third property. They exploded overnight."

Surprisingly, Mr. Ducharme, who says he gets property owners' permission before placing a box, is pleased when cities clamp down on the clothing drop-off boxes. He said there's always a legal way to put or keep them up, and he's willing to follow the law. Others, he said, don't follow local ordinances and their boxes are taken down. He said when cities, or property owners, remove donation boxes it rids him of unsavory competitors.

"It happened (recently) in Macon, Georgia," he said. "They're going to charge us a \$200-a-box fee, and that's perfect for me."

Additionally, with or without the boxes, Mr. Ducharme said Suncoast will collect lots of used clothes to sell. He buys in

bulk from thrift stores, too.

"The more successful the thrift store in getting donations, the more likely they are to sell to me," he said.

He said it's not unusual for his company to buy \$5,000 to \$8,000 a month of clothes by the pound from thrift shops. One shop, he said, regularly sells him more than \$10,000 a month of clothes.

According to the Secondary Materials and Recycled Textiles Association, Goodwill Industries sells more than \$100 million of clothes to member companies annually. Clothes collected through Suncoast's drop-off boxes, Mr. Ducharme said, benefit several local non-profit organizations and churches. Suncoast contracts with not-for-profit organizations around the state to place their names on the donation boxes.

"We give back roughly \$100,000 a month to various charities," Mr. Ducharme said.

He said a donation box will typically generate about 500 to 1,000 pounds of clothes a month, and he sells them for 30 to 40 cents

a pound. Even after sharing with charities, he said he makes money.

"If you have 100 boxes out, and you're selling it at 30 cents a pound, you're making a pretty good living," Mr. Ducharme said.

Mr. Penny said now that there's discussion about the donation boxes on the city commission, he'll urge that they craft ordinances to allow them, but with tight regulations. He noted that there seems to be a growing trend among businesses to use portable storage units for various purposes.

"This little question about clothes boxes is probably going to become a bigger issue of these detached structures around town," he said. "I know there are businesses around town using these shipping containers."

Mr. Penny said that the commission should look into whether Florida laws allow the city to charge companies fees for having the clothing donation boxes in town, too.

"I'll bet there's 30 to 40 in town," he said. "If half are legit and we're generating income off this, that's a pretty good deal."





Pet Street clinic offers top-notch care for furry friends

ORMOND BEACH — Back in 2009, something special happened for area pets and their owners. A new pet care clinic opened at 299 W. Granada Blvd.

This state-of-the-art clinic, the "Pet Street Veterinary Care Center," is owned and operated by Dr. Willem-Jan Van Deijck, a graduate of the University of Utrecht in Rotterdam, Holland.

Dr. Van Deijck (pronounced

"Van Dyke") began his veterinary career in 1999. He later came to the United States and joined a veterinary clinic in Palm Coast. Not long after, Dr. Van Deijck moved to Ormond Beach and began his own practice.

With a love for all animals, Dr. Van Deijck offers the latest in high-tech know-how, plus his personal expertise in diagnosing and treating most any problem our furry (and not so furry) friends may encounter. The majority of his patients are of course cats and dogs; but he also treats exotic pets, such as iguanas, turtles, hamsters and guinea pigs.

While some veterinarians specialize in a particular field, most are on the "front line" of practice --- conducting wellness exams, and providing a gamut of medical services for our pet-pals. For Dr. Van Deijck, there is a combination.

"I like the hands-on approach and contact with my clients," he said. "I also like dentistry and surgery. They're both of special interest to me."

A tour of Pet Street shows the doctor's commitment and genuine concern for his patients. The facility is virtually spotless, including the back rooms where most veterinary work is performed. From surgery tables to tubules, from lab equipment to monitors, this avant-garde clinic is equipped for almost anything -- including emergencies.

The treatment area houses a number of sizable and secure pet kennels, each with in view for frequent monitoring of both pre-op and post-op patients. Pet Street also has

an isolation unit for pets who may have a life-threatening or contagious disease.

Just off the treatment area is the operating room, where the latest in digital technology keeps track of the patient's vital signs -- heartbeat, blood pressure, respiration and more. The pre-operative process often means x-rays and at Pet Street the procedure is simple. By using a digital computer, images are processed without the added risk of radiation exposure. Hence, no more films with grayish results; no chemicals to mess with; no more distortions: Just a clean accurate image of the problem.

Also in the treatment area is a shallow "table-tub" covered by a stainless steel grating.

This is where pets get their teeth cleaned. Called the Vet-Pro 1000, this modern dental delivery system can "grade" teeth. On a scale of 1 to 4 (with 4 being the worst) teeth are graded as to condition, after which recommendations are made for improved dental health.

During the cleaning and grading process, the pet's teeth are also probed for pockets of decay. The pet is of course sedated during the entire procedure. Dr. Van Deijck stated that nearly 85 percent of all dogs and cats over the age of three have the beginnings of periodontal disease. He also stated that even though pets become more active and alert after dental treatment, they should have a recheck within two weeks.

"There is little difference between humans and pets when it comes to the need for good dentistry," Dr. Van Deijck pointed out.

Laser therapy is another treatment available at Pet Street.

"Cold laser therapy" is a proven remedy for pain relief and is most often used to reduce swelling and inflam-

mation. This drug-free procedure is especially useful for arthritis and "hot spots."

During the laser process, photons are directed to the affected tissue, thereby reducing inflammation and increasing blood flow, which reduces pain. The tiny machine captures the physical features of the patient, then calculates the correct wattage and length of time for treatment. There is no sedation involved; in fact, the procedure is relaxing for the patient. Laser is also used for weight management, disc disease, liver and kidney problems, and ear infections.

At Pet Street, the patient's well-being comes first. After any medical procedure, there is a recheck.

"We do a follow-up or call back," Dr. Van Deijck, said, "and send e-mails and cards as reminders." In addition, Pet Street has a unique program called "Feline-friendly stress-free Wednesdays."

The idea is to reduce the amount of stress to cats when they visit the clinic. As such, Wednesday mornings between 8 and 12 are for felines only, no doggies -- except for emergencies.

Boarding is also available at Pet Street. Accommodations include three inside dog runs, and a "kitty condo" --- complete with connecting rooms, scratching post, and a plate-glass view of the outdoors. Boarders, however, must have a patient-doctor relationship with the clinic, and be up to date on vaccinations.

Dr. Van Deijck is a member of the American Veterinary Medical, the Florida Veterinary Medical, and the Volusia-Flagler Veterinary Medical Associations.

The clinic is located at 299 W. Granada Blvd. Hours are 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday-Friday, and 8:30 a.m. to noon Saturdays. Phone (386) 265-4444.

Trying to watch movies with UltraViolet is ultra-frustrating

Well, it sounded like a good idea anyway. Buy a video, Blu-ray or DVD and get the rights to stream the movie to any digital device you own.

It's an initiative called UltraViolet. But that turns out to be a misnomer. Ultra-bad would be more accurate. Ultra-difficult to set up. Ultra-hard to use. In fact, it takes an Ultra-genius just to figure out how to get this thing to work. In some cases, it doesn't work at all.

First off, let's talk a system that does work: Apple's iTunes. If you buy a movie that has a digital copy feature that works in iTunes, the process is simple. Insert the disc. Enter the secret code that came with the disc. The movie copies into iTunes. All Apple devices can access it. Simple. Easy. Straightforward.

Not so with UltraViolet, which launched several months ago with great fanfare.

If you buy a DVD or Blu-ray with UltraViolet support, be prepared for a long slog through an arcane maze that requires the creation of multiple accounts on multiple websites with multiple passwords.

The first step is to create an account on the UltraViolet website, uvvu.com. Be prepared to hand over a bunch of personal infor-

mation and set up three secret questions and answers to ensure you really are who you say you are. We don't want just anybody accessing this movie!

OK. Now what? Good question. It turns out this website is not a central clearing house for all your super-secure UltraViolet movies but simply the place where you must create an account.

If you want access to a streaming version of your movie, you have to go to a different website run by the Hollywood studio that produced it — in my case, Paramount. Now you must figure out how to navigate the website to a place where you create yet another account with another password and another set of super-secret questions that can link to the super-secure UltraViolet website. Then and only then can you enter the secret code that gives you the ability to stream the movie to all your digital devices.

Well, OK, maybe not all of them.

Using a regular PC or laptop, I found I could stream the movie OK, assuming a fast enough Internet connection. Actually downloading the movie to your device is another matter. Figure an hour or more to a PC. It took several days on my iPod Touch. That's right. I

said days.

I could never get the streaming to work on my Motorola Xoom Android tablet. So much for streaming anywhere on any device. There is no Paramount app for Android as there is for Apple. If you try to go to the Paramount website and watch the movie that way, you hit another roadblock. You can see the movie in your account once you sign on, but you can't watch it. The media player does not function in the Android Internet browser for some reason. (Keep in mind, I am running the latest and greatest version of the Ice Cream sandwich OS).

OK. Maybe there is a solution on the UltraViolet website. Hey, look; my movie is listed! But when I hit the play button, it simply redirects me to the Paramount home page. Is this crazy or what?

After some research (not on the UltraViolet website, which is nearly worthless when it comes to providing any useful information), I discover that the website Flixster has a deal to stream UltraViolet movies to any device. So I download the Flixster app to my tablet, create yet another account with new name

and password, and eagerly await the chance to stream my movie.

Too bad that didn't work either. After several futile attempts to get Flixster to link with UltraViolet, I gave up. I could never get it to list the movie I just purchased. Are you sold on UltraViolet yet?

At least I still have the Blu-ray disc. Pity the poor fools who shell out extra money to get a streaming version of a movie they

already own. Walmart is now pushing a deal where you take your DVD or Blu-ray to the store and they will sell you streaming access via UltraViolet. The cost is \$2 to \$5 per movie depending whether you

want standard def or HD. A word to the wise: Don't waste your time or money. UltraViolet is perhaps the most poorly thought out, poorly executed, difficult to use streaming video initiative ever conceived. Given my experience, it won't be around for very long, which means anyone who paid extra for this "service" will get screwed over one last time when UltraViolet shuts down.





Monitoring your cholesterol is imperative for good health

Hello smart shoppers, hope you had a good week. Did you know that if you have high cholesterol your children may have it, too? What I have to tell you both shocked and troubled me. My daughter-in-law, Jen, has had some sad life experiences. When she was only 20 she lost her mother to leukemia. To honor her

mother's memory, Jen donates blood as often as possible. A while ago, while donating blood, the nurse mentioned that her cholesterol was high (259). Jen

called me and asked if the nurse was right and I told her it was very high but she needed a fasting blood test to get the true results. Jen was only 34, yet her total fasting cholesterol was 249, the good cholesterol was way down and the bad, damaging cholesterol was high. Her triglycerides were out of sight.

According to the American Medical Association, total cholesterol must be 200 or lower, HDL (good cholesterol) 60 or greater, LDL (bad cholesterol) lower than 100 and triglycerides 100 or lower.

I told her she was a heart attack waiting to happen (harsh words, but they were necessary) and dietary changes must be made. She was trying to have another baby, so statins were not an option. She cut the fat, the half and half, the fast food fries, etc. She followed the suggestions I am constantly making in my columns for low or no fat, especially in my cookbook. Even though she works very hard and physical tending to more than 100 animals, she followed my advice and joined a gym.

The best news I had gotten in a long time was that just before Christmas,

through diet changes and exercise alone, Jen now has a total cholesterol of 197 and all the numbers are where they should be. She is both slimmer and healthier.

The first question you may be asking is, "Why is she telling me this?" Why do so many people start falling apart as they approach their 50s? Are you 20, 30, 40 and feeling fine? Have you ever given a thought to having a cholesterol test? The answer is probably no, because you're too young, but it seems there is payback to what you eat, which includes obesity, heart disease, cancer and diabetes. I guess the old adage is true, "You are what you eat."

When Jen mentioned her cholesterol problem to her pediatrician, he suggested that my then-6 year-old granddaughter be tested.

Well, her cholesterol came back at 220. The doctor said children of parents with high numbers should be tested and their diet changed to low fat. Unbelievable.

A reader asked for a recipe for garlic rolls. I created one a while ago, when I couldn't find a recipe, so here it is. There's nothing better in

the summertime than fruity, creamy salads or desserts; here's a great one for you. Enjoy. See you next week.

GARLIC ROLLS

Herbs such as oregano, parsley, etc. may be added to the oil.

- 1 package Parker House rolls or small frozen dinner rolls
- 3 or 4 medium cloves garlic
- 1/4-cup extra virgin olive oil

Peel garlic, chop in a mini chopper. Add oil and process until garlic is very tiny. Set aside.

Bake rolls in oven as package directs. When almost done brush on garlic mix. Return to oven and bake about 2 minutes longer. The longer garlic cooks, the milder the flavor.

AMBROSIA regular and low fat

This recipe dates back to the 40s and called for whipped-cream dressing. In that time, there was no such thing as whipped topping. I've made some significant

changes and it is delicious. Any kind of fruit may be used, even drained fruit cocktail. I used fat-free whipped topping and fat-free sour cream.

- 2 bananas, sliced
- 3/4-cup diced orange
- 1/2-cup seedless grapes, halved
- 1/4-cup chopped dates*
- 3 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1/4-cup coconut
- 1/3-cup miniature marshmallows
- 1/4-cup heavy cream, whipped
- 1/2-cup sour cream
- Sliced toasted almonds, optional
- Lettuce leaves

Mix together first seven ingredients. Blend sour cream and whipped cream or topping, mix with fruit. Chill.

Serve atop lettuce leaves, or as a dessert, sprinkled with almonds.
