## Chief retires, replacement named

STUART — After nearly 14 years in the position, Stuart Police Chief Edward M. Morley is set to retire on Sept. 30.

Longtime Assistant Chief David Dyess will take the job beginning Oct. 1.

Chief Morley said he has no clear plans on how he'll spend his retirement, but had been consid-

ering the move for about two years in light of the city's early retirement plan.

He has served as the area's police chief since 1999, and has had a 35-year law enforcement career.

Before coming to Stuart, he retired

from the Delray Beach Police Department, where he'd served since 1977.

"I'd like to thank the residents of Stuart for the honor of being their police chief," he said, adding that his 64-member staff had become like family.

## Walk will raise funds for cancer patients

MARTIN COUNTY — About 200 supporters of an effort to fight breast cancer are set to take to the streets next month for Indiantown Community Outreach's second annual breast cancer awareness walk-a-thon.

The event is set for Oct. 20 and will cover 5 kilometers or about 3 miles.

Indiantown Community Outreach is working with the Susan G. Komen Foundation, which identified Indiantown as an underserved area for cancer education and resources.

"We need a lot of manpower for what we do," said Jackie Clarke, CEO of the local nonprofit organization. "We're working to bring awareness in the hope that one day the world will be free of breast cancer and every other kind of cancer, as well."

When the group organized its first walk-a-thon fundraiser last year, it generated enough community support to serve about 800 low-income women with no or insufficient health insurance to cover the cost of their medical care. It provided mammograms, education on breast health, financial assistance with medical bills, translation services and transportation to healthcare providers.

Indiantown Community Outreach is also looking to broaden its outreach amid growing numbers of breast cancer cases among men.

"We speak a lot to women but we have to have information for men, too," Ms. Clarke said.

Last year's walk generated about \$7,000 to the group in cash and donations, including a 36-inch flat-screen television that served as a grand prize.

Organizers hope to raise around \$10,000 this year. They're seeking sponsors to donate prizes and lend other support.

"This is a small community but the businesses have always been very

# Educational programming gamers national interest

MARTIN COUNTY — Martin County's reputation as a pioneer in public education took a giant leap this week when the Education Foundation of Martin County's educational programming was showcased in a national forum. Lisa Rhodes, executive director of the Education Foundation of Martin County, was a featured speaker at the Arts Education Partnership's 2012 national forum in Chattanooga, Tenn. The topic: STEAM, Martin County's version of STEM, an acronym for science, technology, engineering and math. Martin County took the approach one step further and added an "a" for "arts,"

calling it their version of the program "STEAM." The addition of arts was prompted by the belief that the arts play a vital role in developing critical and creative thinking skills, which are all crucial components of innovation, Ms. Rhodes explained. "The goal is to meet the needs of an increasingly knowledge-based economy driven by innovation, the foundation of which lies in a dynamic and well-educated work force," said Ms. Rhodes. Among the foundation's STEAM initiative programming featured at the Arts Education Partnership national forum were specific innovative classroom projects, re-engineering algebra, art in public places, artist residencies and other project-based learning activities and professional development opportunities for teachers. The Education Foundation is currently expanding these opportunities in part due to a grant from the Community Foundation for Palm Beach and Martin counties.

"That's probably the hardest thing about retiring."

Under Chief Morley's leadership, the police department amassed several honors, including The Webber Seavey award, which is an international award for quality in law enforcement.

He also led the department to its first and subsequent accreditations by the Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission.

His tenure saw the implementation of new

specialty divisions, such as the motorcycle and gang units. He also led the city through response and recovery from three major hurricanes between 2004 and 2005, and was later instrumental in the approval, design and construction of the city's public safety building, staff said.

Paul Nicoletti, city manager, appointed Assistant

Chief Dyess to the position.

At 43, the new chief has already spent more than half his life with the agency.

He joined the Stuart Police Department in 1990 and has since served as a tactical officer, detective, road patrol sergeant, detective sergeant and

## Paying bills online saves time, stamps

Well, it's that time of the month again; it's bill paying time. Have you ever noticed how close the end of the month is to the beginning of the month?

The monthly ritual seems to never end but it has become worlds easier with computers, the Internet and online bill paying services that most utilities have added to their systems.

Here's the way life used to work every month: the bills would come in at the beginning of the month (as they still do) and then, I'd go through each one with the checkbook and a book of stamps. I'd write a check, write it in the check book, stick it in the envelope along with that month's payment stub, write my return address on the outside of the envelope, stick a stamp on it and drop it in the mail. Every month like clockwork, it was a chore that consumed a bunch of stamps, checks, time and usually resulted in a little writer's cramp.

How are things now? Well, the bills still come in every month like clockwork but the hassle of writing checks and dropping them in the mail is almost a thing of the past. Sure, the chore of sitting down and "paying the bills" is still there, but with my trusty pc and my Internet connection, I can get the job knocked out in half the time that it used to take and I can get a book of stamps to last months now.

So, what's involved? Well, it helps to have a credit card (or a "check card" with the Visa logo that most banks are happy to provide), a computer and an Internet connection. It also helps to know the web addresses of the companies that you wish to pay online, but the nice thing about that is they usually print the web address somewhere right on your monthly statement.

Connect to the Internet and navigate to the companies' website whose bill you are trying to pay and follow the onscreen instructions. Hint: you will usually find a link that says "pay online."

Follow that link and you are on your way.

Now, here's the catch; each website is setup different from the others so you kind of have to think about what you are trying to do on each site and follow their particular set of links.

Some sites may have you sign up first; that is to create an account on their website first before you can pay your bill online, but you only have to do that the first time; once the account is created, the next month when you log in (remember the username and password when you set it up) all of your information from the last time should be already there.

Not comfortable using a credit card online? Well, you are actually safer with credit card orders because the bank spends an enormous amount of resources preventing fraud and will usually back you up if something does go wrong but hey, I can understand the worry. In lieu of a credit card, many sites will allow for electronic fund transfers by asking for your bank account and routing numbers (is that really safer?) or you may even have luck checking to see if your bank's online system allows for web-based bill pay to the companies you pay each month. Most online banking systems these days provide for it and if they don't, you can also check PayPal. They've been offering a bill-pay service for a while and you may be surprised at who you can use them with.

Let's go back to paying the bills individually. Let's see, you can navigate to [www.fpl.com](http://www.fpl.com) to pay your electric bill. You have to set up an account online first, but then every month, log back in and make a payment.

Do you have a telephone setup through AT&T? You

## Jewelry store combines low prices, great service

STUART — An upswing in business in the last year is proof to administrators of Miracle Jewelry Exchange that the Stuart company is on the right track.

Known for its low prices, and specials such as 99 cent watch batteries, the store revamped its staff in recent months to gain in-house expertise and set itself apart from competitors.

On board is a jeweler with more than three decades of experience. There's also a diamond setter on premises.

"It's definitely an advantage to be able to do clients' work as they wait," said Frank Bianco, who owns the store with his wife, Christina. "Our business has really taken off this year."

The changes in staff are strategic investments for the nearly 5-year-old company that specializes in custom work and jewelry design.

When one customer wanted a ring with the yin-yang symbol on its outer edges and a solitaire in the center, staff did the work in-house. Another who wanted a piece inspired by a traditional Irish design didn't have to go further than the local store.

"We can take their idea and turn it into whatever their imagination can conceive," Mr. Bianco said.

"We've done more custom work this year than we did the previous four years, and we make it affordable whereas most places don't."

With the store's diverse customer base, orders range from engagement and wedding rings, charms, annivers-

sary presents and an array of hand-made pieces that complement the store's line of watches, gems and brand-name jewelry.

"We try to cherry pick so we always have special pieces," said Mrs. Bianco.

Miracle Jewelry Exchange is also building its purchasing business, developing a reputation for paying high prices for gold and silver.

"People aren't selling their jewelry as an investment windfall. They're doing it because they've had some sort of hardship," Mr. Bianco said. "To take advantage of that would be a terrible thing to do."

But Miracle Jewelry Exchange excels at maintaining low overhead expenditures, and paying close

attention to its pricing structure.

"One of my slogans is 'low overhead equals low prices,'" Mr. Bianco said. "Times are tough. You can't charge people what you used to charge in the 1990s. Jewelry is still a luxury item."

The approach is paying off. Come Christmas, the Biancos plan to expand into Port St. Lucie with a store at 1012 S.W. St. Lucie West Blvd.

"I come from a background in the hospitality business, so I try to incorporate that into our business," said Mr. Bianco, who once operated two Stuart night clubs.

"It's in the way you treat the customer, treating them like your guest and offering

them advice and service."

Congress passed a law a few years ago that really shook up publicly owned companies. It's called Sarbanes-Oxley, named after the congressman who sponsored the bill.

Basically, this law says the CEO and other high echelon management of a publicly owned company cannot get off the hook from wrong doings because he claims he didn't know what his employees were

doing. I believe the same rules should apply to all businesses, even if their stock is not publicly held. The boss should always be held accountable for the actions of his employees and this should apply especially for car dealerships.

Most of the employees customers come into contact with in a car dealership are paid on commission. Those employees get a percentage of the profit the company makes on the transaction.

Car sales people, service sales people (also called service advisors or assistant service managers), parts sales people and the mechanical technicians who work on your car are mostly all paid on commission. This method of pay tilts the relationship between the customer and

employee in somewhat of an adversarial manner. The employee wants the profit to be as high as possible but the customer wants it to be low.

In a car dealership that has talented, fully engaged and ethical management, this potentially adversarial relationship is kept in a fair balance. Without the oversight of upper and middle management and careful hiring practices, some employees will exploit a customer to increase his commission.

What brought the subject of this column to mind was a call I received yesterday from a 78-year-old widow from Fort Pierce. She called to thank me for writing my column and to tell me that she wished she had read some of my columns before she bought her 2005 used Mazda. This was the first car she had bought on her own. Her husband had always taken on this responsibility. She paid the dealership a huge profit on her purchase. She was sold a maintenance package that she believed cost only

\$25 but it really was \$2,500. She was rushed to sign the papers at night because the dealership was closing.

In the morning, when she realized the mistake, she drove back to the dealership and asked to back out the sale but was told it was too late. She was told she had signed all the papers and that they had already sold her trade-in even though she had not given them the title. When she asked to speak to the general manager, three different employees identified themselves as the general manager. I get a lot of sad calls like this.

The owner of that dealership should know what's going on. I'm giving him the benefit of the doubt by saying that he doesn't know because if he does know it's even worse.

The owner should look at the big picture and the long-term view of his business. You can take advantage of customers and benefit in the short run, but you eventually "pay the piper" when your bad reputation spreads far enough.

Most of the bad things I hear about car dealers from their customers are not illegal things. They are simply unethical and not the way one human being should treat another.

Refusing to refund the money of an elderly widow after she realized that she had been taken advantage of is not illegal, but it sure stinks.

Jim Press is the top executive for Toyota over all of North America and he is also the only non-Japanese to occupy a place on Toyota's board of directors. He was quoted in the book, "The Toyota Way" by Jeffrey Liker, as saying, "It's what you do for a customer when you don't owe him anything that is the true

they can garner some info from them. Dolphin were the same story, great one day and the next still looking, so this brings me back to the weatherman; that rain or threat will shorten a day.

Bottom fish saved the day with lanes, muttons, mangroves and plenty of yellow tails to put in the box. Hard to go look when you know you can bend a rod on just about any reef. Sardines were the favored bait.

Beach fishing was full of surprises. Tarpon and big red fish on the incoming tide,

yes even with the brown water. The fish were there and eating was the game, top water, jigs, mullet, as I said, they were eating. The mouth of the inlet was the location and yes, a little north up to Bathub, excellent bite. Please put a single barb hook on your spoons.

Snook were at Walton Rocks and plenty of big croaker and whiting kept most busy; a few blues and some pompano but not to target. Lots of mullet, so the bite run most of the day. If it looks like a mullet throw it and let's see what the surprise is.

Going north getting away from the brown water it was trout and more trout, all slot and bigger from the Stuart Causeway to Middle Cove using top water and suspending baits. Low light was the answer and after sun up

things slowed down, well let's say they turned off.

Red fish on the west side of the river from County Line Road to Walton Road very busy but you had to fish low light. These fish are in 2 feet and yes you can use your fly rod. As long as the tide was moving the fish were chewing at the bridges, snapper, drum, lady fish, a few trout and some blues were holding attention, but as the sun went down in moved the snook and it was busy all over again.

Flair Hawk and Bomber

lures top the list but with so many mullet, live bait was hard to beat. Try hooking your mullet on the bottom or the top of his tail. You will notice he swims a little different. Now cast the fish into the bait school and hang on.

Now if the weatherman will give us a few days without rain we could get back to some really good fishing.
