## Day care for special needs children now open

MARTIN COUNTY — Bringing special care to the county's special needs children, the Martin County Prescribed Pediatric Extended Care will be celebrating its grand opening with an open house from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. on May 18.

The organization, located at 310 S.W. Ocean Blvd. in Stuart is a medical day care for special-needs

children that have a multitude of medical needs. The children range in ages from newborn to 20 years old and are taken care of by pediatric nurses and therapists.

"We want to be able to help as many exceptional children as possible reach their fullest potential," said Evelyn Duah, Martin County PPEC administrator in a press release.

In addition, the Martin County School District provides an educator to

help school-age children meet their goals.

Currently, the facility serves 20 children, but has the capabilities to serve up to 30. The facility is open Monday through Friday to offer 12-hour care per day.

In conjunction with the open house, guests are asked to bring a donation of canned goods to the event.

"Many families living on the Treasure Coast are struggling to put food on the table," said Ms. Duah.

"The goal is to gather as many food donations as possible, to make a difference in the lives of these families."

The public is invited to the open house and to learn more about the facility. There will be a ribbon-cutting ceremony, tours of the facility, live music and several different activities for the children.

## Recycling company achieves record-breaking recycling rate

PALM CITY — Prior to 2009, the Martin County landfill had never operated a construction and demolition recycling facility. Just four years later, the county can proudly announce that of all the construction and demolition material dropped off at the Palm City C&D Recycling Facility in March, 86 percent was diverted for recycling or reuse. This is in thanks to the partnership between Martin County Solid Waste and their sub-

contractor, R3 Recycling.

R3 Recycling was selected in 2009 as Martin County's first subcontractor for the handling and recycling of construction and demolition debris. In order to divert reusable products from being disposed of in landfills, R3 Recycling sorts through materials such as cardboard, plastics, concrete, wood and carpet, and other recyclables, handling approximately 35,000 tons of construction and demolition debris annually.

On average, the company consistently diverts

more than 75 percent of this local waste, which extends the lifecycle of products that are dropped off at the transfer station and lowers the cost of waste management resources.

"The challenge given to us by the county was to recycle a minimum of 50 percent," said Jeff D'Adamo, vice president of R3 Recycling. "We're proud of the fact that we've been able to successfully surpass that diversion rate and were able to do so well ahead of schedule."

In just a few years since

becoming fully operational at the Palm City landfill, R3 Recycling has not only met and exceeded Martin County's recycling goal, but has consistently been at or above the state's goal of achieving a 75 percent diversion rate by the year 2020 — seven years in advance of the target deadline.

"As our first subcontractor, R3 has exceeded our recycling diversion rate expectations. R3 is doing its part to help Martin County attain the state's

We're happy to divert this waste to INEOS BioEnergy Center and be part of this world-changing facility that's right here on the Treasure Coast."

As of April 1, the vegetative waste that is collected through Martin County's

residential curbside program and delivered by commercial contractors to the Martin County Transfer Facility will be sent to the Indian River BioEnergy Center in Vero Beach. Martin County produces an annual average of 49,000 tons of vegetative waste which will then be converted to 1 million gallons of bioethanol and renewable power.

An exciting new partnership turns Martin County's vegetative waste into energy in the form of bioethanol and renewable power.

By providing its vegetative waste to the BioEnergy Center, Martin County is doing its part to "think globally and act locally." Converting this waste into clean, renewable energy helps America to achieve more sustainable energy independence.

The partnership with INEOS New Planet BioEn-

ergy also provides added benefits by eliminating the need to grind vegetative waste at Martin County's Transfer Facility, which increases efficiency and reduces community impact.

It is estimated that when the Indian River BioEnergy Center begins to operate at full production, eight million gallons of advanced cellulosic bioethanol and six megawatts of renewable power will be produced using renewable biomass including yard, vegetative

and agricultural wastes.

"We're pleased that Martin County has such a strong commitment to the environment and a willingness to embrace advanced technologies in order to find solutions for waste conversion and improving recycling rates on a regional level," said David King, site manager and president of INEOS New Planet BioEnergy.

2020 legislative goal for 75 percent diversion," said Pat Yancey, Martin County's Solid Waste Administrator. "Their facility is helping Martin County maintain its reputation as an environmental community and be among the first counties in the state to achieve this recycling goal."

Mr. D'Adamo attributed the sustained increase in the first quarter of this year to improved processing techniques and finding new outlets for reusable materials. He also noted that the installation of a new, 70-foot picking station feed system in August of 2012 improved their accuracy and efficiency, cutting the time needed through manual sorting by the company's 22-person staff in half.

"For us, our ultimate goal is to help

this community achieve 100 percent waste diversion," Mr. D'Adamo said. "Recycling, in its many forms, is an essential part of creating a healthy, sustainable Martin County."

R3 is a subcontractor for Martin County, meaning that all purchases and investments made by R3 Recycling for their recycling and sorting systems are paid for by R3, not the County.

# How to catch up on past columns

One question I am frequently asked is, "Where can someone obtain past columns?" Sometimes people remember a particular subject matter I covered a while ago, or maybe they missed an issue.

Often I will get these requests from people asking me to e-mail them a copy of a past column.

In just about every case, I find the people asking are surprised to learn that *Hometown News* has a Web site with an archive of recent past columns.

Let's take a look. Fire up your Web browser and visit [www.MyHometownNews.net](http://www.MyHometownNews.net) and take a look around.

If you enjoy the print version of the *Hometown News*, then you are going to love what you find online.

Once you get to the home page, you will see links along the top that will take you to the classified section, rack locations (a great way to find

a copy in your area), a way to contact the paper and links for advertising information and featured advertisers.

Along the left bar, you will find news links for each of the counties the paper is published in: Brevard, Indian River, Martin, St. Lucie and Volusia.

Following these links will allow you to read the top stories in each area for the week, which is a great way to stay informed, especially if a story you may be interested is printed in an edition that is several counties away from you.

Below the county news link list, you will find links to all of the features for each week: classifieds, rants & raves, dining guide, entertainment, etc.

Of course, a link to my column is listed as "computer/technology."

There are many more links than I've listed. If you have a favorite columnist and miss an article, you can find it here. Also, sometimes a columnist's submission for the week may get published in one edition but not another; here's a way to keep up to date.

One of the nice features of this Web site is the column archives. Let's say you are looking for a past issue of one of my columns. Click the "computer/technology" link and this will bring you to my most recent column. Underneath the column title, click "archives" and you will have access to the last six months or so of everything I've written.

The same holds true for all the regular columns.

Looking for one of Arlene Borg's recipes? Click the "cooking/food" link and then "archives" under Arlene's name and they're all there.

The right bar on the main page has even more features: date and time, subscription information, a mailing list and a calendar.

And, of course, I need to mention the weather and "Jail court live webcams links located on the left side bar near the bottom.

If you haven't already, I invite you to take a few moments to log onto *Hometown News* online and have a good look around.

The Web master who runs the site has, in my opinion, done an awesome job of tying together all the editions of *Hometown News* into one comprehensive site that's easy to navigate and has something for everyone.

My congratulations to them — they've done a great job pulling it, and keeping it, together.

I fully understand why you must choose your objectives carefully and then focus those limited resources in your fight against crime and unfair and deceptive businesses and individuals.

I respectfully suggest that you consider the deceptive advertising and sale of automobiles by Florida car dealers as one of your focused targets. Speaking to advertising, the easiest way for you to learn how prevalent deceptive car advertisements are would be to go online and read the auto classifieds in any major Florida newspaper. Viewing the editions of newspapers will allow you to also read the fine print which is helpful in discovering the almost universal "bait and switch" nature of these advertisements.

The TV, radio, and direct mail advertisements are arguably even more deceptive. The TV and radio "fine print" disclosure is nonexistent, because it cannot be read or heard by anyone even with the sharpest eyes and hearing. The car dealers don't even try to legitimize many of their direct mail advertisements because they know they fly below the radar of the regulators since they can specifically target all recipients.

Speaking to deceptive sales practices, I consider myself an authority on this because I have been "mystery shopping" car dealers in South Florida weekly for several years. I send in a mystery shopper who purports to be responding to an advertised used or new car.

In the vast majority of these hundreds of shopping reports I've discovered unfair and deceptive sales practices. In many cases salespeople will openly admit to the shopper that the advertisement is a lie and that its sole purpose is to get people to come into the dealership.

Probably the most common violation is the failure to disclose the "dealer fee." In recent years most dealers have begun charging customers for their "electronic filing fee," marking up their cost for tag and registration by as much as \$300-\$400. This new version of the dealer fee most often not disclosed on vehicle buyer's orders as is required by Florida law for the dealer fee although it is a dealer fee by another name.

A car purchase is the second most expensive purchase a person makes and, unlike a home purchase, the purchase is made about every four years. For most Floridians, nothing else requires a higher percentage of their earnings than their cars. If I'm right, and most transactions involving car purchasing in Florida includes deceptive advertising and sales practices, this should be a priority item for your office to regulate.

For many years I have attempted to persuade the Florida Automobile Dealers Association, FADA, to regulate themselves. Although the chairman and president of FADA are receptive to this, they have been unable to get agreement from the executive committee and directors. I have suggested that FADA ask dealer volunteers in the various markets around Florida to monitor advertising and investigate consumer complaints.

If a dealer was found to be engaging in unfair and deceptive advertising and/or sales practices, FADA would send him a warning letter. If he ceased and desisted from these practices that would be the only action taken. If the dealer did not, FADA would notify your office and you would take whatever actions necessary to bring this car dealer into line.

I think it is in the best interest of Florida car dealers to

## Wildcats take championship



# Preparing your yard for storms

With the Atlantic hurricane season just days away, we are again going to be faced with a challenging year, according to NOAA forecasters. Most of us remember all too well how much work it was to get your yard "hurricane ready" in just a few hours. Now is the time to plan and prepare your yard so if a tropical storm whirls on our doorstep, getting ready won't be so complicated.

The first thing you should do at the beginning of hurricane season is to trim all your trees and bushes. Get rid of any foliage that is dead or might be hanging your house. If you any dead or weak trees from last years storms, cut them down so they don't have a chance to do damage this year. Take a tour of your yard and make a list of items that would be dangerous to leave lying around. This list should include patio furniture, loose garden ornaments, small potted plants, yard torches, arbors and even your gas grill. If you have a shed or gazebo, you might want to add extra tie downs to be sure they stay put and don't wind up in Kansas. You can start early by limiting what you keep out in your yard during the peak months of August and September. If you own a

swimming pool, you can throw all your patio furniture into the pool to help keep it from traveling across the state.

There are many plants you can put in your yard that are both attractive and also seemed to hold up fairly well during a hurricane. Hibiscus, Plumbago, Firecracker plant, Ixora, and even my roses seemed to hold up very well during our twin hurricane marathon in 2004. You may also want to consider some plant varieties such as Palmetto Bush, Passionflower, Azalea Bush, Wax Myrtle, Live Oak and Southern Magnolia. These plants seemed to hold up well during past bouts with tropical systems. They also add a natural beauty to your yard.

If you live near the ocean, planting becomes even more of a challenge because you need to have plants that resistant to salt spray. Remember that a hurricane can carry the ocean mist far inland with its 70 plus-mph winds. Plant varieties such as Indian Hawthorne, Saw Palmetto, Confederate

Jasmine, Society Garlic, Daylily, Pittisporum, Oleander and Mexican Petunia can do very well in areas where salt spray can be a problem. Gardenia plants also can fare well with less than 25 percent damage and full recovery after one growing season.

When planning your landscape, if you are going to plant large trees, you should always keep the distance from the tree to the house greater than the height of the tree when it is full grown. If you have any trees that are weak or leaning, either have them secured or remove them if they are within striking distance of your home. Another thing to look for is exposed roots. If the soil has been washed away from the roots of your trees, the root structure may be weakened and allow the tree to topple easily. Fill in these areas with soil back to the original ground level.

As you can see, with a few common sense tips and some good planning, you can have both an attractive and safe yard this hurricane season.

## Hwy 55: Burgers, wings and fries, oh my

There's not too much more that spells old-fashioned Americana than hamburgers and rock and roll. Maybe that's why dining at Hwy 55 Burgers, Shakes and Fries in the Treasure Coast Mall seemed like a trip inside a time capsule to a 50s era diner with great food, groovy tunes and super-sweet desserts.

When my dining companion and I walked toward the mall on Saturday afternoon, we noticed the throngs of movie goers and thought, 'what an ideal location for a burger place.'

With a walk-up window outside the mall across from the movie theatre, a walk-up area inside, and inside seating in a secluded area that's ideal for taking a break from the hustle and bustle of walking the mall, Hwy 55 seems to have all aspects of 'eating at the mall' covered. But, it's much more than that. The 'burger place' is a restaurant, with friendly waitresses and plenty of seating, coupled with a full menu of delicious diner food.

"There are 120 Hwy 55 Burgers in North Carolina," said Joe Scheibelhut, restaurant manager. "After being in construction for 30 years, I used to eat at Hwy 55 Burgers all the time in North Carolina. When this franchise opportunity came up, my wife and I jumped at the chance to open the first one in Florida. When this spot opened up in the mall, we knew it was perfect."

Patrons can seat them-

selves at the bar in front of the restaurant with a bird's-eye view of the grill or in one of the many booths that line the Marilyn Monroe and Elvis Presley-adorned walls.

We were lucky to get to the hot spot before the lunch crowd arrived, and it was obvious by the time we left that they were in for a busy afternoon.

"We get a lot of people coming in for lunch right before going to watch an afternoon movie or vice versa," Mr. Scheibelhut said. "There's always a nice crowd in here."

While enjoying a cool fountain soda and listening to old rock and roll tunes, we looked over the menu. We noticed that besides burgers by the dozen, made every way you can imagine, there

were wings, cheesesteaks, grilled cheese sandwiches and a shrimp po' boy. One thing I noticed throughout the menu was the 'John Boy & Billy' sauce that topped everything from chicken sandwiches to shrimp burgers to wings.

We couldn't pass up the chance to see what the fuss was about, so we ordered wings with the specialty sauce. To accompany our wings, we tried the highly recommended cheesesteak and of course, a cheeseburger.

During the quick wait for our food, we were treated to a sample of frozen custard. The creamy dessert is made fresh daily and can be combined with a number of sweet treats... but, more on that after lunch.

Our food came out steaming hot and smelling incredible. I couldn't wait to try the John Boy & Billy sauce on the wings. The sauce was everything I hoped for. There was just enough barbeque taste to bring in a smoky flavor, but after a bite or two, the heat from the peppers gives the sauce a nice kick. I imagine this sauce on any of the sandwiches would be a nice addition.

Our burgers were singles, but they can be ordered as doubles or triples. The burgers were cooked from fresh meat and grilled to perfection. They came with a lettuce and tomato and were served with topping choices of chili, coleslaw, onions, ketchup, mustard, mayo and pickles.

# A day trip to a great golf course

Judging from the reviews of locals, The Majors Golf Club in Palm Bay is well-liked and many play it several times each month. I last played here more than seven years ago. I remember that I really liked the course and had meant to get back much sooner than this.

Like many courses, the dry conditions we have experienced over the past few years have taken a bit of a toll on The Majors. Water levels in the lakes and ponds are well below normal and while the greens and tees are lush, some of the rough and fairways have suffered.

The par-72 course features five sets of tees allowing everyone to find their comfort zone. The very back set plays to just under 7,000 yards. This is much shorter in comparison to when I played here last and the course could be stretched out to a daunting 7,300 yards for a true "major-like" feel. More on the reasons behind this later.

The course is built on a tract of beautiful land filled with lakes, wetlands and preservation areas. With rolling terrain, the course has a more Carolina than Florida feel to it.

At The Majors Golf Club, major champions of the game are celebrated with a commemorative plaque on each tee paying tribute to one of golf's best. In the dining room there is a truly unique piece of memorabilia. As you look around the room you will find pictures complete with the authentic signature of every Masters champion to date.

Located just minutes west of I-95, The Majors is not only convenient, but offers a huge range and practice putting green and a 3-hole "Short Course" to tempt you to drop in as well.

The course opened in 1999 and quickly received rave reviews. Palmer's design team blended the traditional



styles of Ross and Mackenzie with a modern flair to provide the golfer with a tract that was not only unique and challenging, but memorable at every tee and green.

Now for the reason that the course has lost a chunk of its length and, in my opinion, some of its endearing traits.

Some years ago the developer decided that building a couple of streets with 90+ homes where the stretch of holes 12-14 sat would be better than keeping the original layout intact. This meant the extinction of one of my favorite holes on the back side, the 13th.

One of Palmer's design traits is a short, drivable par-4 fraught with danger. This is what we used to have at the 13th. Instead of a relatively straight hole, fraught with bunkers and pines, measuring a mere 322 yards from the very back tees, we now have a rather plain hole with townhomes down the right side. You can no longer hitch up your pants in true Arnie-like fashion and test your bravado and skill.

The 12th hole was originally a dog-leg left par 4. Now the green sits oddly to the right just over a canal with a large waste area that serves double-duty as a cart path, guarding the approach. The hole just feels wrong.

The par-3s are here are some of the best I have played. They vary greatly in length and in how the wind affects shot selection. On the shortest, I hit a 7-iron and on the longest I was faced with a 5-wood into the wind.

The finishing holes are, as expected, difficult yet rewarding. The 15th is a mid-length par-3 with an island green. Sixteen is my favorite hole on the golf course. A good tee shot leaves one with a downhill approach to a green perfectly framed by tall pines and a small hill and protected by water left and bunkers right.

The 17th is a par-5 reachable in two for the longer hitters, but they must avoid a large waste area near the green. The finishing hole is one of the toughest par-4s you will play. The shortest route to the green involves hitting a tee shot that leaves you facing a second over a large marsh to a very large green. Pars on any of the closing holes could win you a few dollars for a stop at the 19th hole.
