## Art classes bring out creative side of those with autism

TREASURE COAST — Most of the time, children on the autism spectrum are misunderstood. There's never enough time, resources or patience to give these special children the quality of care they deserve. They sometimes get lost in the shuffle between special education classes and mainstream classrooms.

However, a newly formed nonprofit housed in Jensen Beach is giving these children an outlet.

Arts for Autism of the Treasure Coast, founded by Rachel Selph of Port St. Lucie, offers art classes as a

way for autistic children to express themselves.

Each of the classes, which are held several times throughout the week, are taught by a group of trained volunteers. The children are encouraged to express themselves with paint, glitter and glue and at the end of each session, have a product to be proud of.

"Children on the autism spectrum are usually very visual," Ms. Selph said. "We have children who range from very high functioning to some who don't speak at all. Each one are paired with a volunteer and helped to express the ideas that are living in their heads."

The organization has specialized ways to get each child engaged in the activities. Each participant, depending on their level of functioning, absorbs the instructions and creates works of art that are then placed on the walls of the facility.

"We let the children hang their paintings wherever they want to," Ms. Selph said. "Some of them are hanging upside down and some are crooked, but it's all part of how the students express themselves."

Some of the works of art will be

framed and sold at an upcoming fundraiser.

"We are trying to raise money for art supplies and for generally keeping the nonprofit afloat. There's no paid staff, and all of the art instructors are here voluntarily

MARTIN COUNTY — When Judi Snyder began working as a library page 34 years ago, things were a lot different.

Advances in technology, different needs from the community and changes in how books are cataloged, organized and classified have adjusted life at the library, but one thing has remained the same for Ms. Snyder, her love of books.

"When I started working for the library it was after hurricane David came through the area," said Ms. Snyder. "A chain of events and love of books ended with me

## Website focuses on tracking lagoon water quality data

TREASURE COAST — FAU's Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institute has launched a new website to provide real-time water measurements concerning the Indian River Lagoon.

The information comes from the first of Harbor Branch's Land/Ocean Biogeochemical Observatory units placed in the lagoon to measure important environmental parameters including temperature, salinity, dissolved oxygen, turbidity, water color, chlorophyll that is indicative of algae in the water column, and nutrients such as nitrates and phos-

phates. The website, <http://fau-hboi.loboviz.com/>, is accessible 24 hours a day.

FAU Harbor Branch has a long history of conducting research and monitoring in the lagoon, which is one of the most biodiverse estuaries in North America. Its research includes relating seagrass status with water quality; determining the causes of macroalgae and harmful algal blooms; studying marine mammal health; and population and mercury in the food web and ecosystem change. The LOBO units, and the accompanying website with high quality, freely accessible, real-time data, will trans-

because they either have a child on the autism spectrum or because they love the idea of helping these wonderful children.”

Parents who bring their child to the art classes have an opportunity to network and talk about ideas that have helped with dealing with the sometimes frustrating life with an autistic child.

“It can be trying,” said Ms. Selph, whose daughter was diagnosed with autism. “It can be hard on the parent and the child, so whenever there’s a chance to talk to someone who knows what you’re going through and who you can bounce ideas off, it helps.”

There is a waiting list for children to participate in the class. However, if there are more volunteers and more art supplies, more children will be able to benefit from the program.

Art supplies can be dropped off every Saturday to Arts for Autism of the Treasure Coast, located at 2317 N.W. Federal Highway, in Jensen Beach.

becoming a library page. Years later, I still love books, but I’m working with them in a different capacity.”

Ms. Snyder is retiring Aug. 3 as the current Community Libraries Manager with the Martin County Library Sys-

tem. She has filled many positions during her time with MCLS. Beginning as a library page shelving books in 1979, she worked her way up to Library Manager in 1999.

From there she became Associate Director for Library Public Services in 2005, and in 2012 was named Community

Libraries Manager. Her pet projects are the annual BookMania! festival and Chautauqua South arts and education series.

“My crowning achievement was not only creating BookMania!, but being responsible for producing an event that achieved national recognition for the Martin County Library System,” said Ms. Snyder. “Similarly, Chautauqua South is an amazing cultural and educational addition to our library system. ## Is a holdback really a holdup?

borrowed the money from them to pay for the car.

My father's answer to my question about holdback was that it was an increase in the amount of the invoice that we paid General Motors which was not really part of the price of the car. It was just an extra amount added to the real price of the car and included in the invoice. At that time it was 2 percent of the MSRP [suggested retail], so if a new Pontiac Bonneville had an MSRP of \$10,000 and a true cost of \$9,000, the factory invoice would be \$9,200. I asked my father, "When do we get the \$200 back?" He said, "At the end of the year." I asked him

if they paid us interest on our money and I can remember him laughing loudly and saying no.

Of course my next question was why they do that. He told me that the reason they gave him was to help dealers sell their cars for more money so that they didn't go broke. He said that because they didn't get their holdback money for such a long period of time, they began to think of their invoice as being the actual cost of the car. General Motors felt that many dealers were such poor businessmen that they might sell their cars so cheaply that they would go out of business.

Now, because GM was kind enough to hold back hundreds of thousands of dollars of the dealers' money [and pay them no interest on it] but return the money to them once a year, they could

help the dealers make a bigger profit and maintain adequate working capital.

At that time I thought this was the biggest bunch of boloney I had ever heard and I was sure that this was a scheme by the manufacturers to keep a free float of millions of dollars of their dealers' money under the guise of helping the dealers. I asked my father why the dealers didn't strongly object to this and he said that most dealers actually "liked" the idea of holdback. When I heard that, I thought that maybe GM and the manufacturers were right about the dealers not being smart enough to sell their cars for a reasonable profit.

It took me a few more years in the business before I understood what was really going on with holdback. It was a "no brainer" as to why

Back in 1968 when I first went into the retail car business with my father, I can remember asking him, "What is holdback?"

I was learning the business and had been studying the invoices on new Pontiacs that General Motors sent us when they shipped a new car that we had ordered. We had to pay the invoice immediately when it was issued, sometimes even before the car arrived at our dealership. Actually, in most cases, it was our bank or GMAC who paid GM and we

## Bank makes its presence known in state

Weston-based Florida Community Bank is making the transition from a holding company for the assets of failed banks to one of the state's largest banking operations.

FCB recently completed its first negotiated acquisition, buying Great Florida Bank of Coral Gables. Based on Great Florida's most recent report of outstanding shares of common stock, the deal is valued at about \$42.5 million with FCB paying \$2.34 for each share.

FCB, a subsidiary of Bond Street Holdings, was formed in 2009 and used to maintain the assets of failed banks in cooperation with the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. Great Florida

also was in shaky condition, but FCB already was involved in turning it around, FCB President Kent Ellert said in a telephone interview. "Based on the pricing, we feel OK about the assets of Great Florida."

The combined operations put FCB as the fourth largest bank based in Florida with assets of \$4.4 billion and 67 offices along both Florida coasts.

Mr. Ellert doesn't expect any of the offices will close. "Very little overlapped between our two operations," he said.

FCB is now poised to become a statewide bank, something Florida hasn't had with a state-based bank in several years. It will need to move into the Jacksonville, Panhandle, Tallahassee and Tampa Bay markets to do it.

In the news release announcing the deal, Mr. Ellert said, "The transaction with Great Florida Bank is truly a 'game changer' for our Company as we have been eager to expand our presence in Miami, Florida's largest metro market. We are a Florida-based, Florida-focused company and the merger with Great Florida Bank adds significant scale to our brand and will result in meaningful synergies that will benefit customers and communities of both institutions."

"Consistent with our previously completed eight successful acquisitions, this merger will significantly enhance our Florida footprint and will provide a foundation for us to augment our commercial lending team to further generate organic growth," he

said. M. Mehdi Ghomeshi, President of Great Florida Bank, said in the news release, "This merger is a win for our stockholders, customers and banking franchise. This business combination significantly enhances our combined abilities to be one of the financially strongest and most competitive community banking organizations in Florida. We are confident that this merger is a highly attractive strategic alignment for all of our constituents."

The transaction is expected to be completed by the end of the fourth quarter of 2013, subject to customary conditions, including receipt of regulatory approvals and the approval of Great Florida stockholders.

form these long-standing research efforts while providing this information to all who wish to see or use it.

“This real-time data will allow us to determine critical baselines for the lagoon’s environment and its relationships to its plants and animals,” said Dennis Hanisak, Ph.D., who leads FAU Harbor Branch’s LOBO efforts. “We also will be able to study significant events, such as water discharges, algal blooms, and storm events and how these events relate to ecosystem changes in the lagoon, as they happen. This LOBO technology will provide researchers, colleagues, governmental agencies, students of all levels, and the general public unprecedented IRL environmental data, real-time.”

The LOBO units were developed by leading chemical oceanographers and estuarine researchers, have been tested, proven and improved over time, as well as have a national and international presence in Canada, California, Oregon, Delaware, Maine and the west coast of Florida. FAU Harbor Branch’s LOBO units will integrate into the National Ocean Observatory Data System, allowing comparative studies both within the state and on a national scale.

A new public outreach video also was released to educate the community on the Indian River Lagoon and the research that is conducted by FAU Harbor Branch scientists in the lagoon - [www.youtube.com/watch?v=GSxeDCtsOZc&feature=youtu.be](http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=GSxeDCtsOZc&feature=youtu.be).

# Warning issued regarding use of synthetic drugs

TREASURE COAST — The Florida Department of Health is warning the public about the health risks associated with illicit synthetic substances. Often used to achieve the same high typically produced by drugs such as marijuana, ecstasy, cocaine, and amphetamines, illicit synthetic substances are life-threatening and addictive.

“Illicit synthetic drugs are dangerous to Florida’s children, adults and families,” said Dr. John Armstrong, state surgeon general and secretary of health. “These drugs destroy lives, and are threats to public health and safety.” The number of people using illicit synthetic drugs is growing in Florida. The American Association of Poison Control Centers reported that in 2012 Florida poison control centers received 5,202 calls involving exposures to illicit syn-

thetic substances, a considerable spike compared to 2,906 calls in 2010. Synthetic marijuana, often known as “K2” or “Spice,” is one of the substances whose popularity is “alarmingly high,” as noted by the Office of National Drug Control Policy. According to the 2011 Monitoring the Future survey of drug-use trends among youth, 11.4 percent of 12th graders used K2 or Spice in the past year, ranking it the second

most common illicit drug used by that age group. Often sold as incense and falsely marketed as “natural,” labels of Spice claim the product contains a psycho-active material taken from plants. Chemical analyses actually reveal that the active ingredients are instead synthetic cannabinoid compounds. Because these chemicals are considered to have high potential for abuse and no medical benefit, the Drug Enforcement Administration designated its five

active chemicals as Schedule I controlled substances, making them illegal to sell, buy, or process. Anyone experiencing an adverse reaction to an illicit synthetic substance should contact their local poison center at (800) 222-1222. DOH protects, promotes and improves the health of all people in Florida through integrated state, county and community efforts. Follow them on Twitter at @HealthyFla and on Facebook.

years, yes? On your motherboard is a small battery, such as that found in a watch. When that battery runs down, you will have to hit F1 every time you boot and reset the clock. With the battery dead it loses track of time when it powers down and all BIOS settings have to be reset on boot up. Un-plug the system, open the 'can' and look for a watch-like battery (probably about the size of a quarter) and replace it. That ought to correct the issue. Hope that helps and thanks again for reading." - Sean

The next day I opened my email and found the following e-mail from George: "Hello Sean. Thank you so much for the info on the dead battery. I never thought of that and yes, my machine is over seven years old and I have never opened the 'can,' but the way you explained it, I think I can do that. I will let you know how I make out. Again thank you so much for your help."

And the day after that: "Hello Sean. Just a follow up on your advice regarding replacing the computer's battery. It worked like a charm. I looked in the computer manual to find the info on the battery (CR2032), purchased a replacement from Radio Shack, opened the 'can' and even I accomplished this task. Will wonders never end? Again, thank you so much for your help and keep writing those interesting and informative columns in Hometown News."

Just as I suspected! Consider just how much time could have been wasted had we not thought about what was going on and instead just assumed that the change of hardware was the culprit. I can't help but think just how many older systems are still in service out there and how many people are having to hit the F1 button every time they have to boot. If this sounds like you, try replacing the battery; you may have the same success as George.

### A view on the Zimmerman case

For the past one and a half years, the nation has watched and listened about the death of Trayvon Martin. the manufacturers liked it but at last I understood its attraction to us dealers. Because we had to pay an extra amount over the true price of the car and not see that money for up to a year, we began to think of the invoice as the true price, even though it was actually inflated by hundreds of dollars. Because all manufacturers added holdback to all dealers invoices, the net effect was to raise the price of all cars to all buyers by the amount of this holdback. I know this is a dirty word, but it is price fixing on the grandest of scales. This might have been something that Henry Ford, Alfred Sloan, and Walter Chrysler

concocted while playing golf at Bloomfield Hills Country Club outside of Detroit.

Another neat thing about holdback for us dealers is being able to tell our customers that we are only charging them “X dollars” over invoice. Or, we can tell them that we will sell them this car at invoice with no profit to us at all! [There's a sucker born every minute]. Dealers often have “invoice sales” with copies of the invoice pasted on the car windows. Who doesn't believe that an invoice is the cost of the car? The truth is in the semantic skulduggery ... “Mr. Customer, I solemnly swear to you that this is the exact price that I paid the factory for this car. In fact, here's a copy of the invoice.” That's what the dealer “paid” the factory all right, but it's not what the he paid the

factory after he got his holdback check in the mail.

You might be thinking, so we're talking about \$200 more or less on a \$10,000 car. Who cares? Don't forget, that was over 40 years ago. Holdbacks have expanded considerably and now instead of several hundred dollars we're talking several thousand. Also, dealers no longer have to wait a year to get their hold back money back. Now they get it back monthly. Manufacturers even changed the names of these monies they hold back. These are innocuous names so that, if you see them on the invoice, you will have no suspicion... names like floor plan assistance, advertising, PDI, Administrative or DAP. Of course there are also cash rebates to dealers that don't even show on the invoice. I estimate the

average car invoice today includes \$3,000 to \$4,000 in hidden holdbacks to the dealer. Holdbacks are also applied to factory or distributor accessories like “protection packages” [wax, undercoat, window etch, roadside assistance], floor mats, window tint, etc.

The bottom line is that you don't rely on the dealer's factory invoice to determine the price you are willing to pay for a car. And be especially suspicious when the dealer quotes you a price of “X dollars over invoice” or actually shows you the invoice. You've heard the old joke, “How can you tell when a politician is lying?” Answer: When his lips are moving. “How can you tell when a car dealer is lying?” Answer: When he shows you the invoice.

# Rain, rain, go away, I want to go outside and fish today

With all this rain, you could build an Ark then troll from it. Well, the weatherman has not slowed his revenge, so I will try talking nice about him, no more attacks on the poor guy... this week I'll talk about rain.

Let's go to the beach! An overcast sky can give the surf-caster more time on the beach because the fish will not disappear trying to get away from the bright sun. There are plenty of baits along the shore, with the whiting and croakers keeping the snook and tarpon up close and on the hunt. Pay attention to bait size and try to match the profile. Not to say they will not eat big bait, because they will, and then there are those

big jack's that will eat anything they can get.

These fish will test your equipment, so be prepared. A piece of shrimp on a No. 4 size hook will find plenty of whiting and croaker to take home so do not forget the ice along the shore; the fish are out there all day.

The inlet still has ugly water from the lake, but is still holding fish. On the north jetty there are plenty of drum, sheephead and big snapper. They will keep you busy. On the south jetty big

snook are taking live baits through most of the day. These fish are the breeders, so a quick catch and release is mandatory. These fish go always back to the cross-roads, and that is where most of the big tarpon are to be found. Low light for the silver kings, live baits preferred.

Moving up the Indian River, on the east side, anglers should find a grassy edge to locate trout. Fish early with top water lures and as the sun rises use a bait that works below the surface. And yes, live shrimp if you can find them.

On the west side from County Line Road north it is red fish, low light in two-feet of water and there is more flounder in the mix also.

There are also plenty of snook on both sides of the river eating whatever you are presenting. Yes the season is closed, yes they are here to spawn so let them go quickly.

Early mornings from the bridges will bring tarpon and snook and if clouds give us a break, big snapper and drum continue along with the lady fish and jacks. The bridges have been busy fishing.

Offshore, with the threat of rain, we are not seeing too many anglers. Those who do go out stay close and play with cobia from 20-feet out. The favored location has been the Sand Pile and Bull Shark reefs but there is plenty from the House of Refuge north to the Power Plant.

The only dolphin I have heard about have been in the 20-foot zone and a few king's in the 60- to 100-foot zone, but anglers are having too much fun playing with the cobia.

Wouldn't it be nice if this

week we could stop construction of the Ark and get back to fishing?





# Growing your own pineapples for fun

This week I would like to talk about a topic that is fun to do and has a delicious ending. Why not try growing your own pineapples?

The pineapple is one of the world's most exotic and unique fruits. If you recall in the early history of our area,

especially Jensen Beach, pineapple plantations were an abundant commodity. The fruits that you grow yourself will probably not be as large as the ones you buy in the store but they are fun to grow and sweet when they finally ripen. You can grow your pineapple plants in pots for your porch or patio or even directly in the ground. Pineapple plants planted directly in the ground will yield a larger fruit.

The pineapple is actually a member of the bromeliad family. You may have seen or own some of these interesting, colorful ornamental plants. One of the unique features of these plants is that they absorb water and nutrients from water that is caught in the "reservoir" in the center of the plant. The pineapple differs in the fact that it absorbs its nutrients more like a regular house-plant through the root system. Pineapple plants require bright light in order to thrive.

One of the most rewarding ways to grow your plants is by growing it from scratch. If you prefer a shortcut, many nurseries carry pineapple

plants already started and ready for planting. Your first step is to find the pineapple to use for your project. Look for fruit that looks healthy and has nice green leaves. This will help to produce a better plant.

Many people simply cut off the tops of the fruit and try to plant them in the ground, flesh and all. This usually will not work well as the fleshy parts will rot and this will lead to rotting of the roots as well. The best way is to grasp the leafy part of the plant and twist (hard) and it should come out with a part of the center. If you use the method of cutting off the tops, you must cut away the fleshy areas of the pineapple so only the core remains.

The next step is quite simple. Remove some of the lower leaves as you would if you were trimming a shrub. Set aside for a day or so before planting to help prevent root-rot.

The next thing you need to do is to get the roots of the plant started enough so that it will "take" when it is planted in the soil. Simply place the core in some water (a shallow bowl will do) for a couple of weeks or until you see visible signs of root development. Change the water occasionally to prevent it from stagnating.

Once you see some root development, it's time for

the fun part. Choose a 12-inch or larger pot (clay is the best) and also purchase a good quality potting mix that features good drainage. Cactus soil will work great as well as Jiffy Mix or a compatible brand of seed starting soil. It is wise to place a 2-inch layer of stones at the bottom of the container to help keep water that drains from contacting the roots.

Finally, plant the crown as you would any houseplant in the soil and water well. Keep the plant evenly moist for best results. Do not over water or allow the plant to become bone dry. As the plant grows, bear in mind that many of the original leaves will drop and new growth will begin to take their place. This does not mean the plant is dying, it is a natural process. As the plant grows, you can report it into a larger container if you desire, or even plant it outdoors.

Remember that it can take three years for the plant to produce fruit so you may want to plant several plants at different times to help keep a more steady supply of fruit coming. Also remember that these plants will not tolerate very cold temperatures so be sure to protect them during periods of colder winter temperatures. You may occasionally fertilize with a liquid soluble fertilizer such as Miracle Gro but be sure not to overdo it.

# Enjoying the world's oldest open

As I write this from the comfort of my recliner, The Open Championship is being played. Just as I did a couple weeks back, I will wake early this weekend, sit down with my tea and crumpets and enjoy golf competition being played on a venue unlike any I've played here in the States.

Okay, I don't really care for hot tea and I confess to never having had a "crumpet," but I think coffee and an English muffin will do. The oldest major in golf happens to also be the only one not played on this side of the "pond."

The Open treats us to a totally different game from what we are used to playing or watching. Golf here is played mainly through the air. We have lots of water hazards, not too much wind and soft, over-watered fairways and greens. Open courses are golf courses in the truest sense. Bunkers are actually penal. In stark contrast to here, pros want no part of any bunker in this week's event.

There are several reasons why I love The Open. It is not just that it is the oldest of the majors. I think it's because it is played on courses that are as courses were meant to be. Golf originated with the bored and solitary shepherds of the Dark Ages. It was a quiet way for them to pass the time without going crazy from boredom while endlessly herding their flocks around the meadow.

Sheep are gentle, lovable creatures, but hardly stimulating company. So, shepherds would pick up a lump of wood and a fairly round stone and whack it about while one sheep followed another around the fields from sun-up to sunset. They didn't keep score or argue over who had the better stick or rock. It was simply something to pass the time.

The terrain over which shepherds watched their flocks was a rolling, natural

meadow. The closer to the sea, the more rolling it became and the more entrenched with long grass, heather and sharp, thorny gorse. It was there that the game became more skill-driven. Who wants to knock a rock around on an empty, flat piece of yard anyway?

On those meadows, golf evolved. Of course, there are organic things that just seemed to happen. Mother Nature was the only course architect back then. She allowed the wind and rain to shape the land. The animals hid from the frigid air and spray from the sea in small pits. Shepherds rightfully feared hitting their rock into one of these pits. I'm guessing the sheep were not very fond of those moments either.

Over time, some shepherds became quite good at this game and in 1860 the very first Open Championship was played. By then, golf had reached the point where it was a proper game, with proper rules and the best player usually won. A tradition was born and it has grown more glorious with each passing year. With the exception of bombs dropping during world wars, nothing has stopped this event from taking place each summer.

The Open is a romantic celebration of the way our game is meant to be played. It encourages risk and rewards those fortunate enough with a wee bit of luck. Even those who play safe may suffer from an unfortunate bounce here and there. It closely emulates real life with all the crazy
