### Parks, boat ramps closed for triathlon

A triathlon scheduled for this weekend at East Island Park under the Stuart Causeway has been relocated to Jensen Beach due to health advisories that have been issued in and around Stuart waterways.

The event will now be based at Jensen Beach Public Beach, where the south end of the parking lot will be closed to the public from 4 p.m. Aug. 2 to 5 p.m. Aug. 4.

The cycling portion of the event temporarily will close the park and boat ramp at East Island Park under Stuart Causeway and Jensen Beach Causeway Park from 6 to 10 a.m. Aug. 4.

Vehicles and trailers under the bridge at the time of the closing will be towed at the owner's expense. Both causeways will remain open to traffic throughout the weekend, subject to heavy traffic controls.

## Diver fulfills long-held dream at the end of the 'tail'

### Spending time flapping her fin, blowing bubbles

PORT ST. LUCIE — For more than 20 years, Cynthia Lott learned to swim with the fish, get up close and personal with the reefs but there was another life waiting for her under the sea.

Ms. Lott is an environmental specialist III for the Department of Environmental Protection for the southeast district of Florida and a state of Florida unit dive safety instructor.

Being under the water, the ins and outs of the oxygen tanks, flippers and underwater safety are no stranger to Ms. Lott.

"I put individuals through rigorous training and safety training and once a year I put them through training for rescue and oxygen administration," she said. "I authorize their diving activities for the Department of Environmental Protection, make sure they have a good plan for their type of work and that they have everything they need."

During a DEP meeting in Tallahassee, she talked to a fellow dive instructor about what they wanted to do when they retired.

"I just said to her, 'Just think! You can become an opera singer!'" she said. "And she was like, 'No way, I want to be a mermaid!' and I said, 'Get out! I've always wanted to be a mermaid!'"

It had been a childhood dream of Ms. Lott's.

In high school, while Ms. Lott attended school on the West coast of Florida, Weeki Wachee Springs had an essay contest on why that student would want to be a Weeki Wachee mermaid.

Weeki Wachee holds mermaid camps throughout the year, teaching students and adults how to swim underwater like a mermaid and use compressed air tubes.

"I was a surfer, I always surfed and I was a surfer until I was 50," Ms. Lott said. "I always thought being a mermaid was cool. I didn't win the contest though and my heart was broken."

Many years later, she signed up for a camp at Weeki Wachee called Sirens of the Sea.

"I spent three days there and learned an awful lot and realized it is more difficult having mermaid skills than we have as divers," she said. "You're not wearing a face mask, a scuba tank, weights, a buoyancy vest or anything... you're just swimming with a tail."

The small breathing hose that most of the mermaids use was the hardest for Ms. Lott to learn to use.

"It is like a small hookah hose," she said. "You have to open your mouth while under water, insert the hose, spit out the water, turn on the air and then try not to float up to the top."

After being a little discouraged — after all, she was a state certified diving instructor — Ms. Lott learned how to use the breathing tube after three days when most took more than three months to learn.

Being a mermaid has given Ms. Lott a new appreciation and respect for pro-

SEWALL'S POINT — The Town of Sewall's Point awarded its most prestigious award to environmentalist Captain Don Voss, Operations Director of Marine Cleanup Initiative, in recognition of his organization's ongoing efforts to educate and inspire the residents of Florida to keep our underwater environment and ecology free of debris.

Captain Don and an army of dedicated divers and volunteers have cleaned over 300,000 pounds of debris from the lagoon, estuaries, inlets, and near shore reefs of the Treasure Coast.

## The top 10 mistakes when car-buying

- (1) Believe the newspaper and TV ads. It never ceases to amaze me how outrageous and unbelievable the car dealers' claims are. Just when I think that they can't get any worse, I see one that tops them all. Last month, one dealer was advertising in the newspaper and TV that if you bought one vehicle from him you got a second vehicle for free. The "facts and fine print" would reveal that the first vehicle was a very expensive one with a huge markup of over \$6,000 and the second vehicle was only the "use" of one for two years... a lease. My father always said, "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably isn't." Astoundingly, the general manager of this dealership had the gall to say on TV, "This is not a gim-
- (2) Buy a car on impulse on the first day you start shopping. Can you believe that this is the way most people buy cars? It truly is. There is something about a new car that excites people and appeals to them on an emotional level. People let their feelings short circuit their logical thought processes. Overcome that emotion that tells you that you must drive home that shiny new car right now. Go home and think about it. Talk it over with your spouse and friends. Research the model of car you looked at and the price on the Internet. Always drive the car you chose before you sign any papers. You should take at least a week or two in the decision making process before you buy a car.
- (3) Trade your old car in to the dealer you buy from without shopping its value. Most people have no idea what their trade-in is worth when they come in to buy a new car. They rely entirely on the appraisal by the selling

- dealer. The dealer can make it appear that he is giving you a lot of money for your trade by taking some of the high markup on the new car and showing it as part of the appraisal value. Check Kelly Blue Book ([kbb.com](http://kbb.com)) and [Edmunds.com](http://Edmunds.com) on the Internet. Get at least three bids from other dealers of the same make for your trade. Make the purchase of the new car and the sale of your trade two separate transactions. Remember that you do get a sales tax break by trading in your car to the dealer you buy from.
- (4) Use the dealer's financing without checking with your bank or credit union. Shop for the best price on your financing just like you shop for the best price on your trade-in and the best price on new your car.
- (5) Believe this, "This low price is good today only." This is one of the favorite ruses used by car sales people and dealers. In 99 percent of the cases, you can buy that car for the same or an even lower price later. The only time that you can't is when factory incentives expire on a certain date, typically at the end of the month. If that is the claim, demand to see the written factory incentive by the manufacturer.

- (6) Fall for this, "Make me a written offer with a deposit and I will submit it to my manager." This is the standard operating procedure at most car dealerships. This is to get you psychologically engaged in the buying process. Once you have signed a buyer's order and written out a check, you will remain in the dealership for a while and are more likely to buy. The salesman knows that. Insist on getting their best price on the car you have selected. You should never make the first offer. Once you have their price, compare it with at least three other prices from other dealers on the same make and model.
- (7) Follow this advice, "Take this new car home and see how you like it." This is the famous "puppy dog" technique so named because once you take a puppy dog home overnight, who has the heart to return it the next day? You, your neighbors, and friends will see that shiny new car parked in your driveway. It sure looks good! How can you explain to anybody that you didn't buy it?
- (8) Agree to this, "I'll buy the car if you can get my monthly payments below

“Most of us tend to think in terms of our monthly budgets. We might feel that we can afford a new car as long as it costs us less than \$350 per month, but there is a big difference between \$350 per month for 36

months and \$350 per month for 72 months. I recommend that you finance a car for no more than 42 months, preferably 36.

(9) Believe the salesman when he says, “You have my word on that.” Be absolutely sure that every promise or commitment made to you by your sales person is in writing and signed by a

manager. That salesman may not work there when you have occasion to ask for that “free loaner car” that he promised you anytime you bring your car in for service.

(10) Fall for this, “All dealers charge a dealer fee and we can't remove it from the invoice.” In fact, all dealers do not charge a dealer fee. I don't. But unfortunately most do charge this “gotcha” ranging from \$495 to \$1,000. It is true that Florida law (which should prohibit dealer fees entirely) requires that the dealer fee appear on all invoices. If you charge just one customer a dealer fee, you must charge everybody. The state legislators, in their infinite wisdom, decided if a car dealer is going to take advantage of even one buyer, he must take advantage of all of the buyers....never discriminate. But the loophole in this stupid law is for you to demand that the dealer reduce the price of the car by the amount of the dealer fee, making it a wash.

# Record year for unclaimed cash, property

Florida Chief Financial Officer Jeff Atwater announced another record breaking year for unclaimed cash and property returns. During the 2012-13 Fiscal Year, CFO Atwater's Bureau of Unclaimed Property returned more than \$212 million in unclaimed cash and property to families - an annual increase of more than \$23 million from when he first took office.

Additionally, the Bureau of Unclaimed Property approved 327,313 claims, also a new annual record.

"Each year, we continue to exceed our goal of reuniting more Floridians with their unclaimed property," said CFO Atwater. "With a one-in-four chance that you or someone you know has unclaimed property, I urge everyone to check our unclaimed property website today."

During CFO Atwater's tenure, the Department of Financial Services has returned record amounts to Floridians, totaling more than \$535 million since January 2011 and a record-high \$24.7 million in June 2011 alone.

Since the program's inception 51 years ago, the Bureau of Unclaimed Property has successfully returned \$2 billion to Floridians.

The 2013 Bureau of Unclaimed Property's next statewide auction will be held Aug. 23-24 at the Fort Lauderdale Airport Hilton. The auction, which is open to the public, will include more than 80,000 individual items, including jewelry, watches and rare coins, with a minimum reserve value in excess of \$650,000. Featured items include a 5.82 karat diamond ring, an 8.6 karat diamond and gold watch, four American eagle gold bullion coins, a 59-piece sterling silver flatware set and one, seven dollar 1776 continental

currency note. These items were turned over to the bureau after being recovered from abandoned safe deposit boxes.

Currently, the bureau holds unclaimed property accounts valued at more than \$1 billion, mostly from dormant accounts in financial institutions, insurance and utility companies, securities and trust holdings. In addition to money and securities, unclaimed property includes tangible property such as jewelry, currency, historical items and other miscellaneous articles from abandoned safe deposit boxes.

Unclaimed money, including earnings from the auction, is deposited into the state school fund, where, until claimed, it is used for public education. There is no statute of limitations, and citizens have the right to claim their property at any time at no cost.

## The mysteries behind the print command

If there is one basic function that everyone is familiar with and yet shrouded in mystery, I would have to say that would be the "print" command.

Again, everybody is familiar with the print command – click the print button and your printer spits out a hard copy. But the reason it's shrouded in mystery is there are a ton of options and controls available, most of which no one takes the time to learn, that give the user a lot more control over the printer output than many people are aware they have.

Let's take a look at some of these functions and see if we can figure out what some of them are good for and why we would want to use them.

Using the print button in the toolbar of many applications (or the "Quick Print" option in Word) will do just that – quickly send whatever is onscreen to the printer using the "default" settings. What that means is that the computer has a series of preset settings that it will use "by default" if you don't tell it to do something different.

For instance, if you have more than one printer set up (perhaps your "real" printer and maybe a fax program listed as a printer) then the computer will have one printer set up as its default - If you don't tell it to print to another device then that's the one it's going to print to. Other defaults include paper size, whether or not you want to print in color or grayscale and print quality. Clicking the print button on the tool bar will send the print job to the printer using these default settings.

But what about if you want to change something? Suppose you want to print to a different printer or maybe you want to print using the low quality settings (draft) to save some ink, how can you adjust these settings if the print job sends straight to the printer when you click print?

To get to the print menu that gives you full control look for the "File" pull-down menu at the top left hand corner of whatever program you are trying to print from. Now, be aware that not all programs have the "File, Edit, View..." pull down menus that we've grown fond of over the years. You may or may not see the file pull-down menu if you are running Vista or Windows 7, but that doesn't mean we can't get to where we want to go.

If you have a "File" pull-down menu, click it. You should find the print command listed and clicking that will pull up the print window. If you don't have the File pull-down then on your keyboard press and hold the CTRL button and then click P. That will open the print command the same as clicking File then Print.

Now, I know what some of you are thinking, "Why go through all that business with the File pull-down menu when CTRL + P does the same thing?" Well, the reason I try to steer people in the direction of the pull-down menus is simply because there are other commands in there right next to Print that may not be available with the keyboard shortcut.

For instance you may notice a command called "Print Preview" when you click the file pull down menu. Print Preview is a great command that saves paper by actually showing you a preview of what's about to come out of the printer should you commit and click print. The preview saves paper by letting you decide what adjustments you want to make before sending the print job to the printer.

Now, back to our print command, clicking Print in the File pull-down or pressing CTRL+P will open the print dialogue box and the first thing it will show is what printer it's going to send to. This is where you can tell the computer to send to a device other than the default. Clicking the Properties button lets you change things like paper size, quality and color. The properties menu will change from printer to printer but the core is the same. It's the place where fine changes can be made on the printer.

Further down the print dialogue box you can tell the computer what pages to print and how many copies and after making any changes here, clicking print will then send the job to the printer with the changes that you selected.



MARTIN COUNTY — Finding the perfect spot in south Florida to spend some relaxing time close to home, whether it's a meal on the waterfront or an overnight stay at a resort, the spot is right under many of our noses.

The spacious restaurant has three areas to accommodate guests. The waterfront area was quiet and was perfect for those who wanted to enjoy a dinner that rivaled the beautiful view. There was also a room that could be partitioned off from the other areas so larger parties could enjoy privacy. The elegant dining room had wooden ceilings and large windows offered a breathtaking view of the marina.

The third area in the restaurant held a full bar, stage and area for dancing.

There is also a swimming

pool area, other private dining rooms and a space in front of the marina with chairs and tables if guests prefer to sit by the water.

"Guests can feel comfortable and sit wherever they want when they visit us. The same food options are available at all of the bars and all of the areas of the restaurant," Mr. O'Keefe said.

The restaurant also plays host to many of the areas fishing tournaments and is the favorite place for high school reunions.

While I was enjoying the view, I was served house specialty She Crab soup. This award-winning appetizer was full of mushrooms, lumps of king-crab, simmered with heavy cream in a shrimp and lob-

ster stock. The soup was delicious and enough to make a meal out of.

Mr. O'Keefe suggested I try the roast pork dip sandwich, and I'm glad he did. The tender meat is thinly sliced and topped with melted Swiss cheese. The sandwich is served on a warm, soft roll with onion

**Excellent bites despite the rain**

Well, July certainly was a rain filled month. Despite all the wet weather, fishing has still been pretty good. It's that time of year when bait begins to cover the beaches and the big fish follow.

Snook, tarpon, big jacks, bonita and Spanish Mackerel will all be on the catch list.

Fish early or late in the day... the key is to locate the bait and then fish around it. Hordes of silversides and glass minnows will begin to form in what appears to be a large black cloud on the surf's edge. That's where you will find the fish.

The best way to do this is to go from one access point to another. Walk up the dune and look, if there's no bait, move on the next beach until you find it.

Tiger shores, Walton Rocks and the House of Refuge are all good locations to start. For the live bait fans, bring your sabiki rigs to the beach with you and the pilchards should be close enough to catch. Try a small whiting/croaker... that will

get the job done, too.

DOA bait busters were red hot last year and I don't think that will change. The color is your choice, but make sure it's a deep runner. Spoons and jerk baits work well when the fish are honed in on the smaller baits.

The river has been plagued with dirty runoff from Lake Okeechobee, however, the area from power plant north has still held a lot of fish in somewhat nicer water.

With the tannic color of the river, darker baits work best. Root beer is my top choice. Trout and reds can be found in 1-3 foot of water. Start with the top water plugs and move to a suspending bait as the sun goes up.

Catch and release snook fishing has been excellent at

both the St. Lucie and Fort Pierce inlets. If available, use live bait.

Offshore, activity has been better over the last few days. Dolphin has been reported from 180- 220 feet out, as well as an excellent wahoo bite. We weighed fish here at the shop from 20- 40 pounds. Always, have a bait down in your spread, whether it by a planer, cigar lead or downrigger. Split tail mullet and large ballyhoo are excellent baits for the wahoo.

The cobia bite has tapered off considerably, but a few small fish are still hanging around the bull shark barge and the sand pile. Make sure that fish are 33- inches before you gaff it.

The only bait to speak of has been north up the beach. Look for the birds and you will find the bait.

I'm hoping for a little less rain in August. What about you?

# Treasure Coast Lionfish Safari collected large numbers

The inaugural 'Treasure Coast Lionfish Safari' was held July 19-21 and despite afternoon summer thunderstorms, brought in some of the largest lionfish ever caught in local waters.

This invasive species is gaining attention as its numbers grow out of control while devouring native game and food fish stock offshore, as well as in our lagoon and estuaries.

Research scientists, Dr. Jim Masterson from Harbor Branch Oceanographic and Dr. Nic Eugene from the Smithsonian Institute were

on hand to verify sizes and counts.

Florida Fish & Wildlife Service also collected data from stomach dissection, contributing in the effort to understand what the Lionfish invasion is feeding on in the offshore reef and inland breeding habitat. Study continues but FWS identified a predominate diet of black sea bass, scud, shrimp, cardinal fish and goby from this catch.

Five teams of four divers participated in the event, bringing in a total of 278 lionfish ranging in length from 2 to 15- inches. The three winning categories included largest, most, and smallest.

Nova Southeastern University marine scientists, Ben Barker and Adam Nardelli, put an additional bounty of \$80 on the smallest lionfish captured alive.

The bounty was collected by Maria Hickerson, member

of Team Frapper.

The three winning teams collected more than \$3,000 in cash awards and prizes.

## Understanding killer honeybees

One of the sure signs of the summer season is the sight of honeybees fluttering from flower to flower in search of sweet nectar that is needed for the bees to produce honey.

More often than not, these small creatures normally mind their own business at hand. This scenario is slowly beginning to change.

With the introduction of the Africanized bees, you no longer can assume that the bee you see is going to leave you alone. The problem is that only a bee expert can tell the difference between an ordinary honeybee and one that is Africanized. Killer Bees are slightly smaller than their honeybee counterparts.

Similar to the imported fire ant, Africanized Honey Bees have been brought to our country by "accident." The bees are cousins of bees that were imported to South America in an attempt to breed more efficient honey bees that are better adapted to a tropical climate. This all transpired in 1957. The problems began to mount when they found that the bees were multiplying much faster than expected. Some of these bees "escaped" from their intended area and the migration began.

Killer Bees acquired their name because they tend to be much more aggressive than normal honeybees.

They will chase down people or animals for long distances and in much larger numbers than normal bees. You can initiate an attack by simply getting into the bees territory. You do not have to disturb the hive in order to get attacked. This is what makes them so dangerous.

It is now known that the bees have arrived in our area. It is a good idea to simply assume that when you see a honeybee, assume it might be a killer bee and stay clear of its path. These bees can make hives in almost any structure so be aware of large numbers of bees coming and going out of trees, walls or virtually any object that has a hollow area. Normally, a few bees around your flowers doing their normal routine will generally not be a problem. Remember that bees are necessary for pollination of flowers, fruits and vegetables.

In the unlikely event you are under attack from a swarm of bees, run and find shelter as soon as possible. When you are in a safe area away from the bees, determine if you will need medical

attention. If you have been stung several times, and have symptoms such as breathing difficulties, seek medical attention immediately.

Local pain and some swelling is a normal occurrence and does not always require medical attention. If you have known allergies to bee stings, seek medical attention no matter what. In addition, if you suspect you have encountered killer bee activity, notify authorities immediately.

One of my favorite plants to plant during the summer months is the Mexican Heather. These plants boast colorful lavender, purple or white flowers. They do well in both summer and winter. They do well in full sun as well as partial shade and will tolerate temperatures as low as 28 degrees. Even if they freeze to the ground, there is a chance they will grow back. They have excellent heat tolerance but do best with regular watering. They can grow to be three-foot tall but can be easily trimmed to fit your needs. They can be propagated from plant cuttings in the summer and they also can be grown from

seed. The most common variety in retail stores is the Allyson, which has purple flowers. I also use Heather in my bedding area. The combination of the three flowers makes a great contrast of color in a flowerbed and you have the advantage of using flowers that tolerate our intense heat. You can also add some Dusty Miller to the mix for a real treat. The silver-white colored leaves can really add the flower mix for a picture perfect garden!

# Want to try out the thrill of a competitive tournament?

If you are 50 years old, or will be soon, and want to experience the thrill that

comes with competitive tournament golf, you should look into the Senior Amateur Golf

Tour. This tour is open to men and women of all skill levels who will turn 50-years of age or older during this calendar year. In Florida, there are three tours in our area, West Palm Beach, Orlando, and North Central; a fourth is in the Tampa-Sarasota area.

Each tour has its own schedule of events. The current West Palm schedule started in March, and has six events left out of its 15-event 2013 schedule. The Orlando Tour also started in March. The 16-event schedule has five tournaments remaining between now and October.

Prizes are funded from player entry fees with the total purse depending on the number of players at each event. An optional skins pool is also conducted at each event.

At year's end, the top points leaders in each flight receive an invitation to represent their tour and compete against other top SAGT members at the 36-hole National Championship.
