### FWC asks public to report sightings of rare snakes

Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission biologists are asking the public to report sightings of three rare snake species: Florida pine snake, southern hognose snake and short-tailed snake. Citizens can help with research on these species by reporting sightings online.

All of these snake species have been petitioned for federal listing.

The three species are found in dry, upland habitats and spend most of their time underground. They are only occasionally seen moving along the surface or crossing a road.

## Anti-bullying initiative begins

MARTIN COUNTY — Martin County Sheriff William Snyder has a zero tolerance policy for bullying. A policy that led to the announcement of a new No Bully Zone initiative.

The initiative was announced just in time for the start of a new school year and was inspired by all of the violent events that have received national recognition in the past few months.

Sheriff Snyder wants nothing more than to make school a safe

place for children so he created a way for the Sheriff's Office, superintendent and schools in the district to work together to stop the harmful effects of bullying.

"We want to create a climate where bullying is not tolerated," said Sheriff Snyder.

According to the sheriff, bullying is all about an imbalance of power, the strong tormenting the weak, but, "I plan to bring the balance back into the relationship," Sheriff Snyder said.

He wants students to know they are not alone, to see him and his officers as big brothers in green

uniforms who will always stand behind them.

But he knows that students aren't always likely to step into an office to submit a report.

"We really needed a way for a young person to reach out to us without drawing attention to themselves," Sheriff Snyder said.

Now all a bullying victim has to do is submit a report online from their computer or phone in the

privacy of their bedroom or car. Once they've entered their

## Red heel events bring awareness to violence

TREASURE COAST — It's not often that one gets to see grown men traipsing around town in red high heels, but that's exactly the picture the public will be privy to at Safe Space's annual Walk a Mile in her Shoes event this October.

Men of all ages, many of whom will be sporting bright red stilettos, will

come together at three locations on Saturdays in October in an effort to show their opposition to domestic violence and their support of the work Safe Space does.

Because real men step up.

Women and children are invited, too, of course, but it's the brawny males dedicated to walking a mile in four-inch heels that really raises awareness for victims of domestic violence.

Jill Borowicz, CEO of Safe Space, knows that in the battle against domestic violence, women can't stand alone.

"We want men in this fight with us," Mrs. Borowicz said. "We want them to walk hand-in-hand with us in this."

Mrs. Borowicz knows it's a difficult topic to discuss, but the event helps raise awareness and funds for Safe Space's many protective and empowering

services in a fun and light-hearted way.

Families walk together, red footwear abounds, signs are raised in support and awards are even given to the largest team at each event, the most spirited walker, and the walker who raised the most money.

"It's a really fun way of getting out a very serious message," Mrs. Borowicz said.

It also helps raise

awareness for Safe Space and their services, including education programs, support groups, court advocacy and emergency shelters for women experiencing domestic violence.

Last year 350 men alone came out and slipped into a pair of heels and about \$40,000 was raised at all three walk locations. There were double the

## Mosquito Control advises residents to use caution

TREASURE COAST — Many residents were alarmed last week after three cases of mosquito-transmitted dengue fever were reported, but according to Gene Lemire of Mosquito Control there is no cause for alarm.

Last week the health department alerted Martin County Mosquito Control to the cases and they immediately took action, sweeping the area sur-

rounding the initial incident with mosquito foggers and inspecting yards for breeding grounds.

Teams canvassed a five to six block area, knocking on doors and treating areas where they found evidence of the species of mosquito that spread the illness that causes flu-like symptoms.

Dengue fever is spread when a mosquito bites an infected individual and then proceeds to bite others. The three infected

## Business incubator brings endless possibilities to area

MARTIN COUNTY — Whether starting a new business or growing an existing one, Martin County entrepreneurs have a new resource in Indian River State College's business incubator.

While IRSC has operated a version of the incubator for several years now at Stuart Square, they are adopting a new model and moving the service to the IRSC Stuart campus to serve small businesses better and help keep Martin County

a great place to live and work.

"We want to be the place where Martin County comes for business services," said Elizabeth Gaskin, Provost of the IRSC Chastain campus in Stuart.

Where before the program was more about leasing office space, it's now about serving business by offering workshops, individual mentoring, and shared workspace. The on-campus incubator will offer a more dynamic environment while utilizing access to faculty, students and more exten-

sive business services.

The incubator can help those with a brilliant idea form a business plan so they can hit the ground running as well as those with an established business realize their full potential. The Small Business Development Center will be on hand with free business consulting, too.

Business Incubator memberships start at \$25 per month and include services like business planning and help with how to get a new business started successfully.

individuals all worked at the same place, according to Mr. Lemire. Fortunately, all three are back home and healthy and no more cases have been reported.

"Hopefully it's over with," Mr. Lemire said.

The type of mosquito is a non-roaming variety, according to Mr. Lemire, and while his team treated more than 150 homes in the area that were unknowingly breeding mosquitoes, he believes the problem has been resolved.

Mr. Lemire said residents shouldn't be overly concerned with contracting a mosquito-transmitted illness like dengue.

"It's a rare occurrence," Mr. Lemire said. "It has only occurred twice in Mar-

tin County and has never turned into an epidemic."

But as public safety is one of Mosquito Control's goals, there are a few things they recommend people do to limit their exposure to the pests.

When outside, use mosquito repellent and wear long sleeves and pants. In your yard, flush out breeding colonies by turning over empty containers like buckets, tires and dog bowls that can collect water and encourage egg laying.

Mr. Lemire also recommends cleaning out birdbaths on a weekly basis and removing any unused vessels that hold water.

Mosquito Control will continue to perform periodic checks and maintain their mosquito fogging routes five nights a week, but Mr. Lemire said residents can relax knowing there is really no cause for concern.

Another membership is \$200 per month and includes guidance on funding and legal issues, assistance with marketing and public relations, even access to meeting space and business technology.

"We're really trying to create a hub for businesses and business services in Martin County," Ms. Gaskin said.

It's important, she said, because small business are what Martin County is all about and she wants to help them succeed.

"But we're not just offering a big batch of services, we want to make sure we meet the needs of each individual client," Ms. Gaskin said.

They do so by meeting small business owners one-on-one to determine where they are and where they want to end up and then creating a personal-

ized road map to success.

It's all part of IRSC's goal to benefit more than just its students, but the community as a whole, and Ms. Gaskin, for one, is excited about the possibilities.

contact information and what school they attend they can describe in detail what they have been experiencing.

A supervisor for the Sheriff's Office then screens the submissions and refers each case to the person best able to handle to situation. Sometimes that person will be a parent or teacher, but when necessary, School Resource Officers or law

enforcement officials may step in.

"I think it's going to be a great tool," Sheriff Snyder said.

It's the first program like it in the state of Florida and his goal is to be proactive, making a stand against bullying before it gets out of hand.

"We can do better than allow our children to go to school in a state of fear," Sheriff Snyder said.



In my role as consumer advocate, I've written a book, Confessions of a Recovering Car Dealer, write a blog, [www.EarlStewartOnCars.com](http://www.EarlStewartOnCars.com), Twitter, @earloncars.com, [www.YouTube.com/EarlOnCars](http://www.YouTube.com/EarlOnCars) and a column for the *Hometown News*. I host with my wife, Nancy, a weekly radio show on WSVU, "Earl Stewart on Cars."

It's a live call-in talk show that attracts one of the largest audiences in that time slot and car owners of all makes call me for advice and with their comments. I speak publicly all over South Florida at Chambers of Commerce, Rotary and Kiwanis Clubs, churches and synagogues, condo associations, public libraries and any

other organization that asks me to speak.

I'm proud to say that I've been invited to speak at the annual installation banquet meeting of the famous 82nd Airborne Division this Dec. 8. I've been interviewed and quoted often by the national media including CNN, Fox, ABC, NBC, CBS, the Wall Street Journal, USA Today, NY Times, Automotive News, US News and World Report, Fortune Forbes, and the Associated Press.

I've lobbied for better laws and enforcement of existing laws with Florida politicians including testifying before the Florida Senate Commerce Committee in an effort to outlaw the dealer fee. I also work with the Florida Automobile Dealers Association, FADA, in efforts to create an enforceable code of ethics that can improve the sales practices, advertising and the image of Florida car dealers.

As a consumer advocate, to be totally objective, I cannot exclude Toyota dealers, the

Toyota distributor (Southeast Toyota), or Toyota Motor Sales/Toyota Motor Corp. from criticism. How would it look for me to point out problems with only Honda, GM, Ford, Chrysler, and other non-Toyota dealers and manufacturers? When a Toyota dealer runs an illegal or unethical ad, it's my duty to point this out to him and the public, just like I would a Honda or Ford dealer.

As you might surmise, I get a lot of heat from many car dealers. Many accuse me of being the reason they have such a bad image. The latest Gallup Annual poll again ranked car dealers last in ethics and integrity among all professions. Car dealerships also receive the greatest number of complaints among all retail businesses. Car dealers want to shoot me, the messenger, rather than look in the mirror.

Whereas you shouldn't be surprised that other car dealers don't like my role as

# Water farming pilot project gets nod

Three-year project aims to redirect water run-off from estuary, river

TREASURE COAST— As part of the broad effort to restore and protect the St. Lucie River and Estuary, the South Florida Water Management District approved a water farming pilot project to store excess water on fallow citrus land before it can flow to the estuary.

"Working with local landowners to identify property for water storage is an integral part of our strategy to address high flows into the estuaries," said Daniel O'Keefe, SFWMD Governing board chairman. "This pilot project on citrus land highlights the District's expanded efforts to implement near-term solutions that make a difference."

Under the pilot program, Caulkins Citrus Company will pump water onto 450 acres of its property located along the St. Lucie Canal in Martin County. This can

capture an average of 6,780 acre-feet of water a year that would otherwise flow along the canal from Lake Okeechobee and surrounding basins into the St. Lucie River and Estuary.

The three-year pilot project will provide vital information on the proposed concept of retaining storm water on citrus properties.

With Lake Okeechobee still rising from above-average rainfall, the private landowner on this project is already pumping water onto the property on an emergency basis under an agreement with the District. To date, approximately 200 acre-feet of water have been diverted from the watershed that drains to the St. Lucie Estuary.

The District issued a request for water farming pilot project proposals in April in close coordination with several partner agencies including:

- Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services
- Florida Department of Environmental Protection
- U.S. Department of Agriculture, Natural Resources Conservation Service

Five proposals were evaluated and ranked. Caulkins Citrus Company, the first ranked respondent, came to an agreement with the District, which will invest approximately \$1.2 million in the project, or about \$76 per acre-foot per year of storage.

Managing water on these lands, known as the Dispersed Water Management Program, is one tool to reduce the amount of water flowing during the wet season into the lake and discharged to coastal estuaries for flood protection. Private ranchlands in this program currently provide a storage volume of more than 60,000 acre-feet.

Shallow water retention also provides groundwater recharge for water supply, potential for water quality improvements and rehydration of drained ecosystems.

The program encourages property owners to retain water on their land rather than drain it, accept and detain regional runoff or do both.

## Know where to look for answers

Most of the time, when I get calls for computer help I can usually figure out how to fix things out instinctively. Why? Well because I examine the contents of the different menus looking for the option that will most likely get me closer to my goal (while keeping in mind whatever it is I'm trying to do).

As an added bonus, just about every program out there that has pull down menus have "Help" listed as the last one to the right. So, by the time I get to the last pull down menu I can always open that programs help file and do a search on what I'm trying to do. The help file will then list all the topics that contain whatever words I searched on and from there I can usually figure out how to take the next step.

Let's take a look at this in an example. Let's say I'm writing my column with a typical word processing program and I wanted to make the next line that I type bold and larger. Let's also say that I only have a very basic understanding of computers. At this point I have two choices, I can stare at the screen with a blank expression and then call Bob (who's pretty good with computers) and ask him or, I can start looking around the screen for something that may help me reach my goal.

As I move my mouse (and my eyes!) around the screen I notice a couple of things; first at the top of the screen, above where the words are being typed, there are (usually) rows pull down menus and buttons available. And, as I move my mouse slowly over the buttons, little boxes pop up telling me what each button does. When I click on the "File" option it opens (or "pulls down") and I can see all of the commands that are available that have to do with Filing. As I move my mouse to the right, the File pull down menu closes and the Edit menu opens displaying all of the commands available for editing.

Next the View pull down menu opens and then the Insert menu opens. As each menu opens I look at all the options available and for each one I ask myself, "Does this option look like it will help me change my text to bold and larger?" And as each menu does not present an option I go on to the next one eventually getting to the "Format" pull down menu.

When Format opens, I see it lists Bullets and numbering... Borders and shading... and what's this? Font?? Hmmm.... Let me think... I'm trying to change the formatting of my text and text is made up of "fonts," Thinking I may be on the right track, I click the Fonts option and a screen opens that allows me to change the characteristics of the type. Bingo! Exactly what I am looking for! It says I am typing in Times New Roman, Regular, Size 12. I change the specs to Times New Roman, Bold, Size 14, click OK and voila! My typing is now larger and darker.

Ok, so, that rather tame demonstration is just an example of how intuitive computing works; at no time did I ever get the urge to go get a book or call tech support for help, I kept in mind what I was trying to do and, after seeing what options were available, discovered the answer on my own. Instinctively.

Now, I know what a lot of you are thinking; that the things you have trouble doing are far more complex than just changing the characteristics of text, how can this possibly help me? And to that I answer the lesson is not in how to change the font size, the lesson is where to go for your answers!

Notice that the pull down menus I looked at were all within the program I was using. You should look at the menus and options available within the program where you are stuck. Also notice that each pull down menu is a category; all filing options are under "File" and we found our Font options under the "Format" pull down menu. That was no coincidence. I would have been very surprised to find the Fonts option under the File pull down menu but starting at File and moving to the right covers all the bases and rapidly gets you familiar with all the menus available.

consumer advocate, you might be surprised to know that Toyota doesn't like it either. Toyota created a contractual document several years ago entitled the Toyota Dealer Ad Covenant, TDAC. The primary motivation for this document which all Toyota dealers must sign and agree to was to keep dealer advertising on the "up and up". But there's also language in the TDAC which prevents one Toyota dealer from being critical of another. It makes no difference whether the criticism is true and factual or not. The rationale behind this rule is that Toyota does not want its dealers to "damage Toyota's brand".

This is what I have a problem understanding. The Toyota brand is based on the quality of the cars they build and the positive perception of the Toyota manufacturer as a company that shows care, concern, empathy and integrity toward their own employees and their car owners. The Toyota brand ranking has always been very

high. It slumped slightly after the sudden acceleration recall, but has currently risen back to #1 among all auto manufacturers.

The public sees the Toyota brand as separate and apart from the dealer brand. The brand of "John Smith Toyota", the dealer, is based on how he treats his customers, how he advertises, and how ethical and honestly he sells and services Toyotas. Unfortunately, Toyota dealers' brand image has been ranked consistently below average by JD Powers's surveys of all other makes for many years, while Toyota, the manufacturer's brand has always been very high. When a Toyota dealer damages his dealership brand, Toyota buyers give their business to the dealers with the better reputation. This is the way the free market place is supposed to operate and is what competition is all about.

By "keeping quiet" about problems that Toyota dealers have, one prolongs the process of correction. In their advertising, all competing retailers compare their strong points to their completion. It's survival of the fittest in the marketplace. There is very

little, if any, correlation between Toyota's brand and Toyota dealers' brand; If there were, how could Toyota's brand remain the highest and Toyota dealers' brand remain near the lowest for so many years?

Toyota dealers compete against each other to a greater extent than they compete against other makes. Car buyers usually make up their mind which make they want to buy before they select their dealer. Their next step is to choose the dealer that they can most trust to give them a good price and treat them with courtesy, respect and integrity. For all Toyota dealers to be contractually forbidden to speak even the truth in criticism of another Toyota dealer seems almost like a restraint of trade.

The car consumer should be entitled to all of the facts about the advertising and sales practices of those retailers that they buy from. Toyota dealers know more about this subject than anybody else. A Toyota dealer can tell you that the Honda dealer is using bait and switch advertising but he can't say that about his Toyota

competitor. But, with that said, I signed the TDAC and I will honor my commitment.

Unfortunately, there's been some conversation recently about gagging the "other Earl Stewart," Earl Stewart, the consumer advocate.

It's been suggested to me that I may be in violation of the Toyota Dealer Ad Covenant if I post a YouTube video of another Toyota dealer's unethical TV ad on [www.YouTube.com/EarlOnCars](http://www.YouTube.com/EarlOnCars), a website that Earl Stewart the consumer advocate uses to expose illegal and unethical advertising by car dealers of all makes, including Toyota. Toyota is the largest seller of new cars in this market and for me to exclude them from criticism would come across as wrong and self-serving.

I didn't forfeit my first amendment rights when I became a Toyota dealer. I remain a U.S. citizen and retain my rights of freedom speech as an individual and as a member of the press (my book, radio show, blog, and *Hometown News* column). I have to draw a line in the sand if anyone tries to take away my constitutional rights.

# Don't be lazy in the heat of summer, just go catch some fish

August means the lazy days of summer and I seem to fit right in. Summer temperatures make me want to sit, sleep and do as little as possible... I may even use live bait. I know, hurry up, and let's go catch a fish. Summer's bright sun and high water temperature mean you have to fish early in the day. If you're looking for trout, it's best to be in the water before sun up,

because once that sun comes out the fish (as I) will be looking for a comfort zone. Bite time is very narrow; from dark to that 7 a.m. That is when the fish are looking to eat and you need to be there. Tarpon and snook, with a mix of jacks, will be at the bridges, power plant, and in the surf... just about anywhere there is bait. Low light is the key. I'm not

going to say they will not be there midafternoon, but I'm lazy and need to be in my comfort zone. There are good catches of trout, with a few reds in the mix, but only if the blue

fish don't cut you off from the north side of Nettles island to Bear Point. Fish top water and fish early. The bridges have snapper, black drum and a few trout eating shrimp. Fish the shaded and deeper water. As crazy as it sounds, I saw some pompano from the bridge at the east end of the causeway and blues in the flats. Surf has been hot, hot or nothing. If you're looking for tarpon, look for the bait schools; the birds will give their location. At the moment, most of the action has been south of the Fort Pierce area, but it will change as quickly as

it starts. Their eating habits keep them on the move. Look at what they are eating and match the profile. The jacks don't care... if it moves they want a bite. Fish the outer edges of the bait schools. That is where they are feeding and small baits are preferred. Rapala X-rap, MirroLure or a DOA Bair buster to name a few will get the attention you are looking for. There are plenty of whiting to take home for dinner, so don't forget the ice. Offshore, there's a good catch list this week with wahoo, kings, cobia and yes, the bonita are still with

us. Wahoo were from 80-foot out on deep baits. Finally, anglers are taking baits deep and finding some real nice fish, most in the 30-pound class. These fish were north and south of the inlet. So why am I not out there? I'm still lazy. There's a good bite of king fish. Again, the down baits are working, but there were a few dolphin and sails to get some attention, but a wahoo will start your heart. ## Florida east coast anglers asked to collect red snapper data

TREASURE COAST — Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration researchers are asking anglers to help them gather information about the important Atlantic red

snapper fishery. The recreational red snapper season is open Aug. 23 through Aug. 25 (a Friday through Sunday) in south Atlantic federal waters. FWC researchers and volunteers will be out along Florida's east coast during each day of the season, asking recreational fishers about their red snapper trips and their catch. Researchers will also collect biological samples of harvested fish, which will not affect the fillet, to help determine the age of each red snapper. Biologists sampled more than 2,000 red snapper during the federal opening in 2012 as a result of these efforts. Anglers' survey responses and biological samples will give researchers valuable data about the red snapper fishery. Fisheries scientists could use this information in future population assessments. While the federal opening will have no size limit and a bag limit of one fish per person per day, in Florida state waters there

is a 20-inch total length minimum size limit, in addition to a bag limit of two fish per person, per day. Vessels with red snapper smaller than the state's minimum size limit must travel through state waters without stopping and have fishing gear stowed. When anglers catch a tagged red snapper, FWC researchers ask that they report it to the Angler Tag Return Hotline at (800) 367-4461. When calling the hotline, anglers should indicate the species, tag number, date and time of capture, catch location, fish length, type of bait used and whether the fish was kept or released. If the fish is released, the angler is asked to leave the tag in place to help with future data collection. 

# NKF Surf Fest to attract talent, spectators Labor Day weekend

BREVARD — The Cocoa

Beach Pier will be teeming with excitement this Labor Day, as the National Kidney

Foundation hosts the 28th NKF Rich Salick Pro-Am Surfing Festival Monday, Aug. 26 through Monday, Sept. 2.

The surf fest, founded by twin brothers Rich and Phil Salick, was started as a way to raise funds to fight kidney disease and help dialysis patients. The brothers shared a love of the ocean and were professional surfers.

Rich Salick was 23 years old when he was diagnosed with IGA Nephropathy/Glomerulonephritis, a disease that breaks down the filtering units in the kidneys. He

immediately began dialysis, which Mr. Salick received eight hours a day, three days a week.

In September 1974, Phil Salick happily donated one of his kidneys to his twin.

While the transplant was successful, Mr. Salick was told that surfing again would be too dangerous.

With a lot of luck and an amazing support system, Mr. Salick was soon back in his beloved ocean, surfing in competitions and spending his last years on earth doing what he loved.

A tragic event for his family, friends and the surfing community, Rich Salick died on July 2, 2012, while undergoing emergency surgery. The 27th annual event was renamed in Rich's honor.

"The NKF was created as a fundraiser for other kidney patients, who have been struck with the disease," said Savanna Pitard, special events coordinator for the NKF of Florida. "Phil and Rich per-

sonally delivered the money they raised to those in need in a brown paper bag."

Profits raised from the surf Pro-Am will be donated to help the fight against kidney disease.

"The number of people, who attend the NKF surf fest, vary each year based on weather and swell conditions, but averages at more than 50,000 people," Ms. Pitard said. "We typically have over 500 surfers competing."

Professional and amateur surfers will hit the waves on Saturday, Aug. 31. Competitions include the Ron Jon Men's Pro, the Alison Moses Women's Pro, Anarchy Eye-wear Junior Men's Pro, Steve Casanova Men and Women's Pro Longboard. There will also be a tandem surf competition, as well as a family-friendly swimsuit competition.

"We have had several big names in surfing come out to the event in the past, including Kelly Slater, the Hobgood and Lopez brothers and many

more," Ms. Pitard added. "But this is determined on the wave conditions for the weekend, as well as if these guys are out on tour."

In addition to a wide range of events, the Taste of Brevard and a silent auction will be held on Sunday, Sept. 1 at the Hilton in Cocoa Beach.

"This year, we will be rolling out a scholarship fund, where applicants can apply and will be selected by a board of representatives that have been part of the event and close with Rich," Ms. Pitard said. "Applicants will be chosen based on several different criteria, including grade point average, community service and character."
