Government shutdown affects local wildlife refuge, nature center

MARTIN COUNTY — The national government shutdown has affected cities and counties across the country and Martin County is no exception.

While local city and county governments and their various departments remain intact, the Hobe Sound National Wildlife Refuge is among the more than 400 national parks, including Yellowstone and the Statue of Liberty, that is forced to close.

The Refuge, which is managed by the U.S. National Park Service and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, will be closed until the government reopens.

The nearly 1,000-acre park was established in 1969 and offers peaceful walks among abundant plant and animal life. It's also home to the Hobe Sound Nature Center, which is also closed.

The Nature Center offers education on Florida's unique environment through awareness programs and wildlife presentations, but all functions, including special week-

end events and seasonal lectures, have been cancelled.

Permits issued for special events on park grounds have also been rescinded and park employees don't know when they'll be able to return to their jobs.

According to a press release from the National Park Service, "The shutdown will affect more than 20,000 National Park Service employees, who are furloughed until an appro-

priation is passed (3,000 employees continue to work, providing essential services, including See **REFUGE, A2**

Bagel shop goes pink to fight breast cancer

MARTIN COUNTY — This month local Panera restaurants, along with bakery-cafes across the country, are going pink for breast cancer awareness.

Pink buttons, pink hats, pink decorations, and most importantly, pink ribbon bagels.

The special bagels that are only on sale for about two months out of the year from mid-September to mid-November are especially popular in October, breast cancer awareness month.

It's in October that customers flock to Panera in droves to get their hands on the limited edition bagel that is not only delicious, but helps a good cause.

During breast cancer awareness month .25 from the sale of every bagel flavored with dried cherries, cranberries, vanilla, honey and brown sugar goes straight to MD Anderson in their effort to Strike out Breast Cancer.

The funds will ultimately be used help women with breast cancer with the cost of after care.

But during one energetic and awareness-raising day on October 18, 100 percent of all pink ribbon bagels sold will go to MD Anderson.

"It's such a great campaign," said Dana Trabulsky, Director of Marketing for Panera. "It's for such a good cause."

Since the "Panera goes Pink" campaign started 12 years ago the company has raised over \$1.3 million and sold 9.5 million pink bagels. At the East Coast stores from Martin to Flagler County, including the Jensen Beach location, over \$6,000 was brought in just from the sale of pink ribbon bagels.

This year Ms. Trabulsky hopes the stores sell at least 10,000 bagels with the addition of the new Stuart restaurant.

"We're going to rock it this year," Ms. Trabulsky said.

In addition, during October all money collected in Panera's Operation Donation boxes in the cafes will go to Breast Friends of Florida

Washington waterway advocates speak before Congress

TREASURE COAST — Despite the national government shutdown, local politicians made headway in Washington D.C. last week in the fight to save Florida waterways.

A group of Martin County commissioners, staff and residents trekked up to the nation's capital with politicians and individuals from 16 other Florida counties that comprise the South Florida Water Management District. They met with members of Congress and demanded attention be paid to local rivers and estuaries.

Twenty-two members of Congress showed up for the briefing co-hosted by Patrick Murphy, an incredibly high number according to Martin County Commissioner Doug Smith who was among the group that presented in D.C.

Mr. Smith believes the government shutdown may have even aided their cause as members of Congress were

not preoccupied with as many meetings and hearings as they normally would have been and so were able to attend.

"It was over the top amazing," Mr. Smith said. In 13 years of traveling to D.C. to speak up for various issues he's never seen such an enthusiastic response from politicians.

Doug and Kate Parmlee, from the Martin County administration office, were both thrilled by the level of acceptance and support by the local community. At least 100 river advocates drove north for the briefing to support their message.

Even House Minority Speaker Nancy Pelosi and U.S. Senator Bill Nelson were present at the briefing that was so packed it afforded standing room only.

"It was very powerful," Ms. Parmlee said.

Part of that power came from the unified front the advocates presented. Mr. Smith said it's not often that 16 counties representing nearly eight

million people come together with a single mission to fight for what they want.

"That's a significant block of people that you can't dismiss as irrelevant," Mr. Smith said.

The group asked for four things from the government: to complete the C-44 and Kissimmee River Restoration projects, fix the Herbert Hoover Dike, and authorize the 2013 Water Resources and Reform Development Act which include the C-43 project.

He's certain it was the strong united message the group presented that attracted attention and ultimately got the projects moving in the right direction. If all goes well, it will be discussed in the House in 2-3 weeks according to Mr. Smith.

"The challenge for us all now is to keep the pressure on," Mr. Smith said. The politicians were receptive to the ideas, but, "It's up to us as a community to make them follow through."

He suggests communicating frequently. See **WATERWAY, A3**

quently with Florida delegation and sharing with them the community's support. He also cited social media as a beneficial way to keep up with what's happening and spread the word that South Florida isn't backing down.

Last week marked a milestone in the effort to clean

Mr. Smith compared it to halftime at the Super Bowl. The game has begun but it's time to fight, break out a winning strategy, and finish strong.

"It's our time to get it fixed and get it righted," Mr. Smith said. "We can do it but we've got to stay focused."

Take extra precautions to avoid mosquito bites

The Florida Department of Health in Martin County has announced that regular monitoring of strategically placed sentinel chicken flocks has

revealed the presence of the St. Louis encephalitis virus. The virus was found in sentinel chickens in the Jensen Beach and Indiantown areas.

St. Louis encephalitis virus is a mosquito-borne flavivirus that is main-

tained in a cycle between Culex mosquitoes and birds. Occasionally, an infected mosquito will bite a human, causing disease. Less than 1 percent of St. Louis encephalitis viral infections are clinically traceable and the vast

majority of infections remain undiagnosed. Symptoms appear four to 21 days after the bite of an infected mosquito. Most infections don't result in sickness, yet when symptoms occur they range from fever with headache to meningitis, encephalitis and coma. People over the age of 50 seem to be at greater risk for severe disease. Anyone suspecting they are ill should contact their physician immediately.

The Florida Department of Health reminds the public to remain diligent in their personal mosquito

protection efforts. These include remembering to "Drain and Cover".

DRAIN standing water to stop mosquitoes from multiplying

- Drain water from garbage cans, house gutters, buckets, pool covers, coolers, toys, flower pots or any other containers where sprinkler or rain water has collected.

- Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that aren't being used.

- Empty and clean bird-baths and pet's water bowls at least once or

twice a week.

- Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.

- Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.

COVER skin with clothing or repellent

CLOTHING - Wear shoes, socks, and long pants and long-sleeves. This type of protection may be necessary for people who must work in areas where mosquitoes are present.

REPELLENT - Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing.

- Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective.

- Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months old.

COVER doors and windows with screens to keep mosquitoes out of your house

Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.

Tips on Repellent Use
Always read label directions carefully for the approved usage before you apply a repellent. Some repellents are not suitable for children.

Products with concentrations of up to 30 percent DEET (N,N-diethyl-m-toluamide) are generally recommended. Other US Environmental Protection Agency-approved repellents contain Picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, or IR3535. These products are generally available at local pharmacies. Look for

active ingredients to be listed on the product label.

Apply insect repellent to exposed skin, or onto clothing, but not under clothing.

In protecting children, read label instructions to be sure the repellent is age-appropriate. According to the CDC, mosquito repellents containing oil of lemon eucalyptus

should not be used on children under the age of three years. DEET is not recommended on children younger than two months old.

Avoid applying repellents to the hands of children. Adults should apply repellent first to their own hands and then transfer it to the child's skin and clothing.

If additional protection is necessary, apply a permethrin repellent directly to your clothing. Again, always follow the manu-

facturer's directions.

The Department of Health continues to conduct statewide surveillance for mosquito borne illnesses, including West Nile virus infections, Eastern equine encephalitis, malaria, and dengue fever.

A reminder about computer repair

This column ran last year, but because of the number of people who have asked about computer repair, I'm running it again.

Computer repair is a tricky business - you never know what kind of problems you are going to be asked to solve and there is always pressure to get it done quickly. Every call is a different challenge and most of the time it can take a half hour or more just looking around trying to get a handle on what's going on before the repairs even start.

Virus and malware cleanup calls usually always involve running one or more scans to "sweep" the computer for infected files and these scans can really run up the clock. There is nothing more frustrating than having to wait for a scan to complete and watching as the progress bar inches its way across the screen. The temptation to do other things while a scan is running is high but doing other things while a scan is running on an already sick machine can just make matters worse. It's best to tackle additional tasks after an infection is cleaned.

Let's face it, computer maintenance is expensive. At the typical hourly rate one unexpected glitch like a virus infection or registry problem can quickly add up to hundreds of dollars. And who's to say that next month it won't be something different?

And to add insult to injury, most of the issues that I regularly clean up wouldn't be an issue if people would just take the time to keep their machines properly maintained. But what steps should people take? "Everyone" knows that they should have their system backed up and their antivirus up to date but hardly anyone takes the time to learn how to do it properly let alone do it every month!

Most computer manufacturers assume that everyone already knows what they need to do to keep their new machine maintained properly but that can be an unreasonable assumption to make especially if the new computer owner has little or no experience. And with computers as inexpensive as they are today more and more people who have never used one before are coming home with powerful systems that can confound even the most seasoned computer user. Without proper maintenance it's only a matter of time before something goes wrong and the repair bill can approach the price of a new machine!

"We have a lot to be proud of," said Gene McHardy, East Stuart Centennial committee member.

According to Gene, East Stuart is the oldest black settlement in Martin County, dating back to 1913. It

was a place for African Americans to build their own lives away from the land on which they were employed. It had its own schools, gas stations and businesses then, many of which disappeared when Stuart volunteered to integrate.

The community continued to thrive and now they are celebrating how far the community has come.

"We're proud of our heritage and we're proud of our community," Mr. McHardy said, and he looks forward to celebrating the culture, education and religion that make up that community.

The festivities kicked off on Oct. 3 with a roast of Richard McHardy, 97, the oldest living resident of East

Stuart who was born, raised and still lives there.

Oct. 9 brought the community together for a Night of Historical Reflection, a video and photo presentation on East Stuart History.

But the fun really begins on Oct. 11 with a talent show at the 10th Street Community Center reminiscent of those Gene remembers from childhood. It starts at 7:00 pm and is free to any and all who want to see all the talent that East Stuart has to offer.

On Oct. 12 at 10 a.m. will be a parade that runs from Georgia Avenue and Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. to the 10th Street Community Center. It will be followed by a family fun day complete

with choirs, DJ's, vendors and more, all free to Martin County residents and beyond.

"We want you to come and enjoy the community," Mr. McHardy said.

Wrapping up the festivities on Oct. 19 at 7 p.m. is the Gala Celebration Dance at the Community Center. It will be a night of dancing, good food, and live music by Greg Jackson and the Mojo Band. Lots of bait, now we just need to know where the fish are

Mullet and more mullet! There's lots of bait, so why wouldn't the fish be here? The Indian River from north to south is full of mullet. If you're driving on the island or on Indian River drive, pay attention to oncoming traffic because that car is probably watching the

river. If you're eyeing the river, you can see tarpon jumping, jacks in a rampage, snook feeding, bands of bluefish and the dolphin look like something out of National Geographic. Now you know why you have to watch oncoming traffic.

River anglers, it makes no difference where you fish, there are plenty of trout, reds and all the rest, including mullet. At the bridge the dawn hour has been the best bet. There are lots of fish, so if it looks like a mullet cast it. Put a small weight on your bait, anglers

want their bait below the school for a ready breakfast. Shrimp will find plenty of drum, snapper and a list of others throughout the day but any time you get there you will bend your rod. There are plenty of Snook, maybe not slot, but plenty of hook ups and one might be

the score. This east wind has clouded the west shore but the fish are there, with plenty of reds and all the rest. Pick your location and start casting. There are plenty of blues and macs in the river, I even had a Pompano or two make the catch list. Does this mean winter is near?

mullet will get attention. On the reefs a live mullet will find all the snapper and grouper. They really are excellent bait. Lots of weed lines from shallows with all the peanut dolphin to deep water where the bigger dolphin are gathered. Weed lines are a gift to the off shore angler, but dreaded by the surf caster. I heard about the black fins at the hill hitting small squid chains and small wahoo in the same area. Kings have been in 70-foot north of the inlet. Who would have guessed? There are bottom fish from 40-feet on any one of many of our reefs, so go north of the inlet. There are not many anglers

He was brought in to make playable a course that had the reputation of penalizing just about every shot. Over the years, the course has continued to evolve and become even more golfer

friendly.

Those who played the course before Chi Chi's work remember a plethora of strange humps and mounds that resembled buried cars. Those are long gone, along with the severe bunkering and those annoying Brazilian Pepper Trees that pinched the fairways.

The course is relatively short, but don't let this cause you to let your guard down. If you have a club that you can hit straight, by all means, bring it!

Palm Cove measures 6,226 yards from the tips. But, there are tees for everyone, five sets to be exact. The course can play as short as 4,399 up to 5,798 with two sets of tees in-between before you have to venture all the way to the back. Most of the length is chewed up by the final pair of par-5s on the golf course.

There is a lot of water, which comes into play on all but two holes. The greens are smaller than most courses, but they should be with the

lack of length. The fairways are well famed and there is room to miss the green and still find a way to get up-and-down. This is not to say that you can spray the ball. If you do, bring an extra sleeve or two.

The par-3 eighth, in my opinion, is the best hole on the front side. The 187-yard hole from the back tees requires a very good shot to a timber-walled green. You must avoid going left or being short.

It may not look it, but there is plenty of room for your tee shot at the par-5 14th. On the card, it's the longest hole on the golf course, but smart play will yield you a good chance at birdie. The lay-up area is larger than it appears from where you're standing

after your tee shot.

The 16th hole is the widest on the golf course, and if you've been itching all day to really let the driver out, here is your chance.

Number 18 is my favorite. It's reachable in two if you want to gamble and try for eagle, or you can play safe, avoiding the water to the right, and take your par or maybe a birdie.

Palm Cove Golf & Yacht Club is a track that requires accuracy, and you can forget over-powering the course. If you get wild, it will eat you alive! Take what it gives you, use your head, play from the proper set of tees and bring a good short game for when you miss the small greens, and you'll do well.
