ne of the things that I've noticed over the years is that it's real easy to forget to pay attention to what the mouse is doing.

Palm City youth aids Salvadoran school

PALM CITY — Amid hugs, laughter and tears, 16-year-old Evan Farrara of Palm City saw the fulfillment of his promise to a new-found friend to help buy furniture for a poorly equipped school in El Salvador.

Evan visited the San Mauricio public school in San Salvador on July 18 to watch the culmination of his vision, known as Daniel's Dream. Named after Daniel Valle, a young Salvadoran who Evan met in 2013 while attending the Young Global Scholars Program at Yale University, the project raised more than \$5,000 for new desks and chairs for the school. What overwhelmed the young man was the incredible reception school staff had planned for his visit to show their gratitude.



Steps to work on to become a better investor





Thy don't you include the profit you make on your dealer fee in the price of the car you quote to your customer? If you will answer this question truthfully then I pledge never to raise the issue of the dealer fee again.

The reason that I do hear from car dealers and the Florida Auto Dealers Association, FADA, as to why most car dealers charge a dealer fee is that it's an "economic necessity." Dealer margins are so low, the economy is so bad, and the car buyers are so armed with information on dealers' costs and profit margins via the Internet that dealers need the extra profit they make from their dealer fees. OK, I'll give you the benefit of the doubt and stipulate that this is a fact. I won't even argue that I



don't charge a dealer fee and have been profitable for many years and even through this Great Recession.

Now answer my question because you can still charge the extra profit you must have to "survive" economically if you simply include your dealer fee in the prices of the cars you sell. Don't add the dealer fee to the price if the car after the customer commits to buy at a lower price. Don't hide the amount of your dealer fee in the fine print. Don't tell the customer that the price is "plus tax, tag, and 'fees'" fooling her into believing "fees" are state, federal, or local taxes. Don't tell the customer that "all dealers charge a dealer fee" which you know to be untrue. Don't tell her that the law requires that you must charge her the dealer fee because you charge others,



which you also know to be untrue. Don't tell the customer that the dealer fee is not a profit but expenses that you must recoup like doc fees, preparing the car for delivery, and administrative costs. When you went to school you should have learned in Economics 101 that the definition of profit is "the difference between the selling price of a cost or service and its total costs". Besides, you don't even pay to prepare your new cars for delivery because you are reimbursed by the manufacturer and you are not allowed by law to charge doc fees.

When I ask car dealers or FADA officials this question they always give me the same answer...Hamma,

Hamma, Hamma, just like Ralph Kramden of the Honeymooners. You know what I mean..."the deer caught in the headlights" or the politician on "Meet the Press" when the moderator shows the video of something the politician said on camera two weeks ago that directly contradicts something he just said.

ÓK car dealers and FADA, if I'm wrong about this, here's your chance to shut me up about the dealer fee forever. All you have to do is give me a truthful answer to this question. Why don't you include the profit you make on your dealer fee in the price of the car you quote to your customers?



"The whole school took a holiday while I was there and they put on a huge show with dancing and music," Evan said. "During the performances, the new furniture was delivered."

Mr. Valle, for whom the project was named, also attended the celebration. During their time together last summer in Connecticut, he told Evan about the deplorable conditions of the furniture at the K-11 school in San Salvador where his mother worked as a teacher. While trying to sleep that night, Evan couldn't help thinking how blessed he was to be from a country with so much wealth and



having the opportunity to be named a Young Global Scholar. Thinking back on his mother's recovery from a life-threatening operation in 2011, he felt his chance meeting of Mr. Valle at Yale might really have been what he terms "a Godincident" or a divine appointment.

"Daniel was telling me all about El Salvador, and I thought maybe that's why I was selected in the program and we had the opportunity to meet," Evan said.

Soon after their return to their respective hometowns, the two international friends began brainstorming on how to raise the funds. The young Salvadoran created a video of the school and its furnishings to promote the fundraising efforts and uploaded it to Youtube.

The pair debated the idea of a 5k run but realized there were a number of similar runs already planned around the same date they wanted. Evan's parents suggested the idea of a golf tournament, which eventually gave birth to the Daniel's Dream Charity Golf Tournament held at Eagle Marsh Golf Club on May 3. The tournament, which also included a luncheon and auction of items the two friends solicited from area businesses, raised a total of \$5,540. Since Evan is the vice president of the Key Club at Jensen Beach High School where he'll be a senior this fall, he also had the backing of area Kiwanis Clubs.

The two long-distance friends wanted to find a way to introduce other youth in their respective countries to the same type of international friendship they enjoyed. Their brainstorming led to a novel idea for foreign language students in both nations.

"In early February, Daniel and I were

going back and forth trying to discuss how to make more of an impact than just monetary funds," he said. "That's when we came up with the idea of a pen pal program in order to establish other friendships like ours in which each student could learn about the other's cul-

In order to get that idea off the ground, Evan first had to convince his school administration it would be a valid educational experience. His Spanish teacher loved the idea, and shared it in turn with the school's other Spanish teachers. Evan was invited to speak to the incoming Spanish students at the school, and this fall they'll be writing both English and Spanish letters to their new pen pals.

"When Daniel came up, he brought up

about 150 letters from students," Evan said. "I am going to present them to the students this year.'

While in San Salvador, Evan visited another school known as the American-Salvadorian Cultural Center to enlist them in the pen pal program and convince them to form a Key Club.

"I immediately had 25 students pledge to join and form their own Key club, as well as having teachers and administrators step up to be advisers and sponsors," Evan said. "This is now "Daniel's Dream": Salvadorians helping Salvadori-

While in El Salvador, Evan also met with U.S. Embassy staff to discuss his vision for cultural exchange between the

"By far, the biggest economic factor is going to be tourism," Mr. McDonald said. "That's where the lion's share of Hope Town's economy comes from, and it's a large share of our economy as well.

Jeremy Sweeting, chief counselor, or mayor, of Hope Town, had his own Treasure Coast connection in the past when his sister-in-law lived in Fort Pierce for a time. He attributes Stuart's Bahamian immigration to geographical proximity.

"Bahamians began migrating to the area in search of employment, as in those times the Bahamas did not enjoy high employment levels as we do today," Mr. Sweeting said. "West Palm Beach and Stuart are almost directly west of Abaco, Grand Bahama and the Bahama Banks, so it made Stuart and the Martin County area a natural choice.'

Ricardo Treco, Bahamas Consul General to Miami, also traveled to Hope Town to sign the sister-city agreement. Mr. Treco says the idea for the sister-city relationship birthed during his visit to Stuart for the city's centennial celebration last

May.

"The city of Stuart was an obvious of Hone Town, primarily because of the geographical location of both cities," he said. "The cities also share other similarities like, tourism, fishing and boatbuilding.'

While in Hope Town, which lies just east of Marsh Harbour on Great Abaco, Mayor McDonald admired the town's charming architecture and visited a boatbuilding facility.

One of the things that I want to do is focus on how the marine businesses in both cities can learn how to better work together," he said.

Mr. McDonald also experienced the town's Martin County connection first-hand.

"I probably met 12 or 13 people from Stuart, two of whom I already knew," he said.

The sister-city agreement signed by

all three officials designates both cities as official gateways to the other

'We are listed as a gateway to the Bahamas from the states, and Hope Town is listed as a gateway to the United States from the Bahamas,' Mayor McDonald said.

Mr. Treco says he's also aware of the significant Bahamian connection to the Port Salerno community of Martin County. Port Salerno hosts the annual Bahamian Connection Festival every October, during which non-Bahamians can get a taste of Bahamas cuisine and enjoy music by the archipelago's

famed Junkanoo musicians.

"I intend to return and host a meetand-greet for the Bahamian Diaspora in that specific area," he said.

In order to continue fostering the

new sisterhood and develop business partnerships, the mayor has planned a business roundtable in Stuart for Aug. 30 and invited business owners from both cities to participate. Mr. Sweeting says he never could get enough of the Treasure Coast while visiting in the past and is anxiously awaiting the business summit.

"I am looking forward to my upcoming visit with great anticipation of carrying this sister-city relationship further," he said.

buttons icons and such, will respond not just when clicked, but often when the mouse just passes over. These "mouse-overs" can be the source of many a hint to help you on your way.

You may have noticed while browsing the Internet that some things on websites change as you move your mouse around. Sometimes a button will change color or a pictures title will appear if the mouse is held over it for long enough. If your mouse passes over a link, the pointer may change from an arrow to a pointing finger. In

Windows programs, buttons, menus and controls often brighten as your mouse passes over them to give you a visual clue you are now pointing at a clickable control. There, again, the secret is to pass your mouse slowly over an object and pay attention in order to see anything.

The reason I keep harping on that is sometimes I work with someone who just can't resist the urge to wiggle that mouse. Every time something's loading or we're trying to work out how to do something, he's moving the mouse all over the screen. Many times we'll be trying to work out a procedure but with that mouse flying all over, we can't get any thinking done! But, as soon as the

mouse stops, and we start pointing at things and pausing and start paying attention to our mouse, we start to make progress.

So, what are some of the clues to watch for when your pointer passes over something? Well, one of the things that you'll likely see is your pointer will turn into a double-sided arrow. If you will notice, when the very tip of your pointer moves over the very edge of certain objects (like the edge of a window), the pointer will sometimes turn into a double sided arrow. This is your computer's way of telling you that you can stretch whatever it is that you are currently pointing at. All you have to do is click and hold while it's a double arrow and you should be able to change the size that object just by dragging the mouse.

In many Microsoft programs like Internet Explorer, XL and Word, holding your mouse over buttons and controls will often yield a small pop-up window with a short, two or three-

word description of the control. The thing is, many times this little pop-up doesn't appear for a second or so, so if you're all over the place with the mouse, you just may miss it.

In things like word processors or email programs, you may notice the mouse turns into this oversized capital

This pointer is called the "I Beam," and its shape is specifically designed to get right between the letters. When your pointer turns into an I Beam, that's your clue that the part of the screen you're pointing at is for typing.

Yeah, there sure is a lot on a computer that can serve to distract you. One of the best ways to stay on track is to pay attention to what your mouse is pointing at, take it easy and follow your mouse. Many times the answers that you are looking for are right under your pointer.

New tactics being used to monitor harmful algal blooms

TREASURE COAST — Florida Fish and Wildlife conservation Commission researchers have begun using new approaches to more quickly detect and track harmful algal blooms in the Indian River Lagoon, which spans 156 miles and makes up 40 percent of Florida's east coast, supporting commercial and recreational clam and oyster farming.

To provide spatial snapshots of blooms (the big picture of where

blooms may be occurring in the lagoon) the FWC established a flow-through monitoring program this year. The flow-through monitoring system analyzes water quality while the research vessel is in motion, traveling throughout the lagoon, as opposed to traditional methods of tracking blooms that require scientists to collect water and examine it back in the lab. The flow-through system pumps water from the surface through instruments that measure salinity, temperature and chlorophyll fluorescence, an indicator of algae.

This information is then integrated with GPS coordinates to create maps of surface waters that can show "hot spots" of blooms.

Monthly, between June and August (typical bloom season) the FWC maps surface waters in the Indian River Lagoon system, which includes Mosquito Lagoon and Banana River, to detect blooms and to put routine monitoring data into a spatial context. The equipment produces real-time data, which allow researchers to adaptively sample bloom patches as they are noticed in the field. At select

stations, researchers also collect samples to be analyzed for the amount and diversity of algae; this is done in partnership with the St. Johns River Water Management District and the University of Florida.

The information will help in the short term to detect blooms and in the longer term to identify the causes of blooms, ultimately leading to better management strategies.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says diseases can spread when infected people cough, sneeze, or even talk. Children may spread the flu virus for up to three days before they show any symptoms and for longer than a week after getting sick, putting their classmates at risk of becoming sick, too.

The CDC, the March of Dimes, and the American College of Obstetricians

and Gynecologists all recommend that, in addition to children, all pregnant women and those planning to become pregnant should get an annual flu shot in the fall. The normal biological changes of pregnancy put pregnant women at increased risk of the harmful effects of flu. Recent research suggests that the flu vaccine may also lower a woman's risk of having a stillbirth or miscarriage. "The flu vaccine helps protect your body from infection, and this protection is in turn passed on to your baby during pregnancy," adds Dr. Harris, explaining that immunization during pregnancy helps keep the newborn safe during the first few months of life until he or she is ready for the first set of vaccinations.

Parents, grandparents, caregivers, and anyone in close contact with an infant

should get an adult pertussis vaccine to help protect themselves and to help stop the spread of the disease to the newborns in their lives. Newborns are most at-risk for this highly contagious and often serious disease because they don't begin receiving their own vaccinations until they are two months old and may not be protected until they have received at least three doses of an infant pertussis vaccine. This year, the March of Dimes continues their work on the Sounds of Pertussis® Campaign, a national education campaign started in 2009 to help raise awareness about the potential dangers of pertussis and the importance of adult vaccination.



ful waters with."

If feeding the fish isn't part of your plans, patrons can sometimes catch a live band performing, enjoy happy hour or one of the many specials at the restaurant.

When my guest and I arrived at Shrimper's mid-afternoon and it was easy to tell that seats fill up quickly at this waterfront hot spot.

Our waiter, Don, described some of the dishes on the menu with expertise, leaving us anticipating the wonders that were in store. We started our meal with a steaming bowl of clam chowder that was creamy and full of incredible tasting clams. We took Don's advice and added a few dashes of Cholulu hot sauce which really brought out the flavors of the soup. whipped cream and tasted incredible fresh and light. I was lucky enough to try the Key lime pie. The delectable dessert was served with a chocolate sauce that put the exclamation point on an absolutely incredible experience.

hills? Yes real hills, something we don't see much of in our area.


To get the Ocala National Forest take I-95 north into Brevard County and take highway 40 west towards Ocala. It will indeed be a pleasurable experience!

Stuart offers luxurious excursion close to home

The Ocean Club Course, designed by Charles Ankrom and renovated by Dick Gray, is the jewel of the resort. This 18hole track recently underwent renovations to all of its greens. Just over two years ago the greens complexes on the front-nine were completely torn -up and rebuilt. This past winter, it was the back-nine's turn. The results are phenomenal and the course's friendly staff is rightfully proud.



I was invited out last weekend to play the course and compare it to other resorts in the area. The work on the greens may have interrupted the busy winter season for the resort's members and guests, but it was well worth it. The new greens are as close to perfect as I've seen in some time. They hold and track well. In fact, my putts rolled as if on a pool table with just enough undulations to make things interesting.

There are three sets of tees on this par-61 track that measures just over 4,000 yards from the tips. The front nine plays out to the Indian River Lagoon, while the back-nine takes you out toward the Atlantic Ocean.

At The Ocean Club, 12 par-3s await you. There are five par-4s and the finishing hole is a wonderful 485-yard par-5.

While the shortest par-3 plays just 120 yards from the back, there are two long par-3s as well to test your game. Four of the par-4s play to the cardinal points on the compass. This means that where the wind may help you on one hole, the next it could be in your face, or coming from your right or left. This course has enough teeth to test better players, yet remains fun for the true recreational

If you play from the correct set of tees, Ocean Club will surely test your game. If you can play to your handicap around this track, you have had a solid round. There is a great variety of holes here. I hit eight different clubs off the tee on the par-3s.

Every hole is well framed and laid out. The villas surrounding the course do not come into play, but do make for tricky wind patterns that add to the difficulty of the course. Being so close to the ocean and river, means that there is nearly always a breeze, and it can change from hour to hour.

The 18th hole here is a great hole. It's not often that we recreational golfers get a chance to reach the green on a par-5 in two. Playing under 500 yards long, a solid tee shot will leave most of us with a fariway wood or hybrid second shot to the green. Of course, it's not an easy shot with water lurking in front and left of the green. Fortunately, the green is very deep and receptive to long shots. Then there is always the way I played it. Hit a poor tee shot to the left and have to layup and then hit a wedge into the green.

on a patio or sunny porch. Although they are perennials in Florida, they can be grown as annuals in other parts of the country and can even be grown indoors in a sunny window.

When you are shopping for your color-

ful treasures, don't pick the flowers with the most open blooms but rather choose the ones that have plenty of buds. This will ensure a longer bloom cycle. It is a good idea to pinch the spent flowers off the plant as this will help to promote new blooms.

You should plant your colorful gems in well-drained soil in a sunny location. As noted earlier, you will need to water your plants daily and sometimes twice a day during the hot summer months. You should also feed your plants once a week with a good all-purpose water-soluble

With a little care and TLC, this is one plant that will give you many weeks of rewarding color.
