There are a lot of myths surrounding computers out there, some based on reality, some based on "the way technology used to be" and some based on plain old fear and paranoia. Governor honors man for valor

MARTIN COUNTY — Governor Rick Scott recently honored a Martin County detective for a selfless act of bravery committed while on duty.

During the Aug. 19 meeting of the Florida Cabinet, Gov. Scott awarded Martin County Sheriff's Office Detective Robert Smith the Medal of Heroism for his valiant efforts last year during a U.S. Marshals Regional Fugitive

Task Force operation in Highlands County.

A violent confrontation erupted when the force attempted to apprehend two suspected felons in Sebring Nov. 19, and the officers came under fire. With two officers wounded and another pinned down by the gunfire, Detective Smith calmly instructed another detective to block the suspects' view with a patrol car and then used a ballistic shield to reach the trapped officer and get him to safety. He also made contact with the sus-

pects inside the residence and convinced them to surrender.

Mr. Smith declined to accept praise for actions, claiming they were simply part of the instinctive behavior related to his duties.

"I wasn't really thinking," he said. "I was just reacting to a situation where a friend needed some help."

New rehab center opens in Palm City

TREASURE COAST — Martin County and Treasure Coast residents struggling with alcohol and drug addictions now have a place of refuge and hope with the inauguration Aug. 18 of the Dream Center for Recovery in Palm City.

Located near the intersection of SW Martin Downs Boulevard and High Meadows Avenue, the 15-bed residential living facility will offer an array of inpatient and outpatient services for men and women age 18 and older who suffer from severe substance abuse and addiction issues. Christina Tucker, the founder and CEO of Dream Center for Recovery, says the serenity of the rural environment surrounding the facility will enhance the recuperation process.

"The rehab program is centered on a completely controlled and sober living environment set among eight spacious acres filled with an abundance of all things natural—air, trees, plants, fruits,

Sentencing announced for man convicted of arson

MARTIN COUNTY — Chief Financial Officer and State Fire Marshal Jeff Atwater announced that Joseph Edward Haas has been sentenced to 65 years in prison for setting a house fire in 2012 that injured four Martin County firefighters. Haas was convicted last

month for attempted manslaughter, arson and arson resulting in injury. He also faces \$1.3 million in restitution costs.

"Florida's firefighters risk their lives for the protection of others, and any action that deliberately puts their lives at risk will not be tolerated," said CFO Atwater. "This conviction is the latest example that arsonists will be held

accountable for their life-threatening crimes."

In late December 2012, Martin County Fire Rescue personnel responded to a fire on S.W. Blue Water Way, in Stuart. Four members of the search and rescue team were injured while inside the residence checking for occupants who may have been trapped. A subsequent investigation

into the fire conducted by the Florida State Fire Marshal's Office, Martin County Sheriff's Office, Martin County Fire Department and the Martin County State Attorney's Office provided supporting evidence that led to the defendant's arrest on Jan. 24, 2013.

A circuit court jury required less than one hour to reach a guilty verdict on all counts.

some big company database or stories about some poor people getting their identities stolen, but the fact of the matter is most hackers just aren't interested in you. Hackers tend to go after the "big" targets, such as corporate databases, and don't spend too much time hunting individual end users.

But that's not what the Internet security software companies want you to think. There is a big market for computer security programs and firewall software, but if it's not configured or installed correctly (which is most of the time) it can bring your machine to a crawl and still leave you vulnerable.

As long as you have a quality, up-to-date anti-virus program installed and running, and have all the current operating system updates installed,

you should be safe plugging your machine into the Internet.

If it is identity theft you are worried about, I would be more concerned about all those big corporate entities out there that already have your personal information on file. Databases such as those that are the real targets. Why take the time to hack into one user's machine for one identity when there are so many other systems out there that hold thousands (even millions) of identities in their databases?

Another common myth that I run into is, "regularly defragging my hard drive will make it run faster." This myth has its origins from the way technology used to be. Sure, if you are running an old 486 machine with Windows 95 and a 1 gig hard drive, defragging it periodically will clean things up a bit and give you a noticeable increase in performance. If, on the other hand, you are running something a little more modern (any machine built within the

last five years) defragging the hard drive all the time to increase performance is often just a waste of time. Furthermore, Windows operating systems from Vista on are set up to perform this chore automatically.

Any increase in performance gained by defragging will typically be unnoticeable. Sure, it's nice to see all those red areas turn blue when you do defrag a modern machine, but don't be fooled. You aren't gaining much. I will concede that running defrag periodically to "tidy up" is good practice, but it's not the cure-all that some people still think it is.

The next myth comes from unclear advertisements that some computer manufacturers run. Many ads today for new computers tout their systems as being "wireless ready" right out of the box. And, to a degree, this may be true, with things such as WiFi chips being built into the motherboard, but the thing that the ads tend to leave out (or bury in fine print) is that you need to

be in an area of wireless service for it to work.

If you don't have wireless Internet access and are contemplating buying a new computer that's wireless ready because you are under the impression that it will connect to the Internet right out of the box, you are about to make a mistake. All this "wireless ready" stuff means is that you won't need any extra hardware to connect to an existing wireless service. It doesn't mean that you can just turn it on and be online as some people have been led to believe. In order for these systems to work, they need to be in a wireless "cloud;" either your own wireless service, DSL or cable plugged into a wireless router, or a public wireless hotspot, such as those found in many hotels, airports and coffee shops.

This article was written by Alan Napier, my Body Shop manager. I've owned and operated body shops for over four decades...at one time I owned five! I've never had a body shop manager as qualified as Alan and never had one that put the customer first 100 percent of the time the way Alan does. By putting the customer first, I mean considering the customers' needs above those of the insurance company that pays us for repairing the customer's car. Please read what Alan has to say carefully:

"So, you had an accident and called your insurance company to report it and things seemed to be going pretty smoothly.... Then you told them you were taking your car to Earl Stewart and everything started getting weird.... The claims adjusters' demeanor inexplicably just changed.... And not for the better!! Suddenly they're telling you they that have a perfect shop in mind for you that will get your car in and out in a hurry and the whole process will be effortless for you. Yep, it'll be such a

great experience, you'll be glad you had an accident. You thank them politely and tell them you're just more comfortable repairing your vehicle at Earl Stewart, where you bought the car and know and trust the people.

Now it seems like the adjuster is downright angry with you and the real pressure tactics start!! They start making vague yet ominous sounding statements about Earl Stewart Toyota, almost as if they're letting you in on a dirty little secret.... "We can't guarantee their work...." "We've had problems with that shop...." "They charge more than we allow for repairs and you will have to pay out of pocket..." "If you take it to our shop, you won't have to wait for an adjuster..." "They ignore our estimates..." The list goes on and on, but, they're planting their seeds of doubt... And now you're concerned and thinking "Earl Stewart Toyota must have done something to cause this hostility by my insurance company...", after all, your insurance company only has your best interest in mind...

Well, you're right, we did do something to cause your insurance company to hate us and I'd like to tell you what... We actually had the audacity to tell your insurance company something that they're not used to hearing.... "No!!" and they reacted like any spoiled three-year old would who's never heard the word before.

But wait, you're still "in good hands" right? Wrong! Your insurance company will instruct "their" repair facility to install untested aftermarket crash parts on your vehicle, even knowing that these parts can absorb crash energy differently and affect the timing of your air bag deployment, resulting in possible death and serious injury.

Here's the really crazy thing.... The insurance company's "approved" repair shop will do it! Do you see what's going on here? Everybody's making out like Jesse James! The insurance company is saving money, the body shop is making money, and you? You're getting scammed! Your insurance company has been provided with countless documents, provided by the vehicle manufacturers that state that these "cosmetic crash parts" are actually "designed and tested as part of the overall vehicle and may help send impact energy to the SRS sensors. In addition, some of these parts may help GM, Chrysler, Ford, Toyota, for

Nissan vehicles comply with several Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards including hood intrusion in the passenger cabin, preservation of proper door operation following a collision and proper airbag function.

You may be thinking, "Well, if these parts are that bad, surely there's a law against using them without my permission..." You're right again!! Florida statute 626.9743 states "An insurer may not require the use of replacement parts in the repair of a motor vehicle which are not at least equivalent in kind and quality to the damaged parts prior to the loss in terms of fit, appearance, and performance." Sounds like an open and shut case, eh? The law doesn't say "if the insurance company believes they're the equivalent." It doesn't say anything about "if the insurance company hopes they're the equivalent."

The insurance companies need to prove these cheap parts are the exact equivalent to the original factory parts to be in compliance with the law or stop mandating their use. Right? I thought so too... So, I wrote a letter to the Florida Office of Insurance Regulation! Went right to the top, straight to Commissioner Kevin McCarty (well, his office anyway.... he's got "people" for that...). After much arm twisting via the Florida

CFO's office, the FL OIR begrudgingly agreed to "investigate" our concerns. After a couple of months, we received their response "We have concluded our investigation and found no violation of the Florida Insurance Code.", and my favorite part.... "Generally speaking, the burden of proof that an aftermarket part is not

of like kind and quality or as safe as an OEM part rests with the one making that assertion, as opposed to one having to prove that the aftermarket part is of like kind and quality and as safe as OEM." Huh?? That one left me scratching my head. Why have a consumer protection law at all then? Your insurance company can mandate the usage of any part they desire, so long as it looks the same. Nobody really complains though because, as they say, "dead men tell

no tales..."The jury's still out on this one, but rest assured we will not use aftermarket parts to repair your vehicle (p.s. Also check out Title 49, Chapter 301 Subchapter II Sec. 30122 "Making Safety Devices and Elements Inoperative" in the Federal Code-you can Google it).

How about used crash parts then?? Your insurance estimator will tell you "they're factory original parts taken off of a car that's just like yours". Really? Was your car damaged so

severely that it was deemed a total loss and ended up in a junk yard? The car they want to cannibalize to get your replacement parts was. We won't even know if the donor car was damaged in an accident, a flood or even a fire and quite frankly, we don't care, -we're not going to use these parts either."



Seniors 'R' Us: If you build it, they will come

To service the burgeoning number of elderly consumers, stores and departments for seniors will soon emerge as part of America's new retail landscape, says Jo Ann Tilghman, founder of Granny Jo Products.

If you walk into any department store and ask the nearest salesperson to point the way to the "Infant Section" or the "Misses Section," chances are you will get a pleasant smile and some simple directions. But walk into that same store and ask the same salesperson how to get to the "Seniors Department," and watch the confusion flood over their face.

Why? Because despite the fact that, at more than 110-million-strong, Baby Boomers and seniors represent the single-largest consumer group in America, most retailers have not yet figured out the wisdom of providing these aging shoppers with their own designated departments or even their own designated end-cap displays.

"It won't be much longer before the

"If the aisles and racks were properly spaced to allow access by shoppers using walkers and motorized carts, a 'Seniors R Us' could be the hotspot for the town's senior community. Include a few investment seminars, weekly indoor gardening workshops and an occasional antique/classic car show, and your problem would be not how to attract senior shoppers to the store, but how to provide them all with parking."

Watch out for some common poisonous plants

Although I have written about this topic two years ago, I am getting a lot of e-mail requests to talk about some of the most common poisonous plants in Florida. I have compiled a list of some of the most common plants that we all have in our yards and gardens. Some of the varieties that are poisonous will shock you.


If you look around your yard and neighborhood, you will find ornamental plants of almost every size, shape and color. What you don't know about some of these common plants can be deadly. Some parts of the ornamental plants or flowers in your yard may contain deadly poison. The most susceptible to being harmed by these plants are children and pets. One of the most toxic and common poisonous plants is the Oleander. The Oleander plant contains a deadly heart stimulant that resembles the prescription drug digitalis. If a child eats a single leaf or two from this plant it could be deadly. There have been several instances where people have died from eating meats that were roasted from a wood fire that contained Oleander twigs or branches.

Dieffenbachia, which is a common tropical that many of us have in our homes, is also a highly toxic plant. All parts of this plant are poisonous. If eaten, the plant can cause intense burning and irritation of your mouth. The plant can be deadly if enough swelling occurs to block your airway. You should always wash your hands after handling this or any of the listed poisonous plants.

Another surprising plant is the Azalea. All parts of the Azalea plant can be toxic if ingested. The symptoms include nausea and vomiting and possibly coma. The end result can be fatal. Even the berries of Jasmine plants can be toxic. They can cause digestive problems along with nervous system disorders.

The foliage from oak trees can be toxic but the effects are gradual. If foliage is ingested, it can slowly affect your kidneys. You need to ingest a substantial amount for severe poisoning to occur.

Lantana, which is commonly used by many as a colorful ground cover, is another specimen that is toxic if ingested. Acute poisoning can cause

hemorrhagic diarrhea and rapid heart rate.

Although this list includes some of the most common plant varieties, there are many more that could be added to this list including Milkweed, Narcissus, Daffodil, poison Oak, Purslane and Snow on the Mountain. Bear in mind that just because some of your favorite plants can be toxic if ingested, common sense and keeping these plants out of the reach of small children and pets can totally avoid tragedy.

We have talked a lot about common and seemingly innocent plants that can be toxic but here is one plant that many people think is deadly poisonous but in reality, it is harmless. The plant I am referring to is the Poinsettia. The Poinsettia plant is one of the most widely produced plants in the country. During the holidays, almost every household has at least one Poinsettia adorning their décor. Fear not as today's commercially distributed varieties are not poisonous. There are some people, however, that may get a mild allergic reaction to the milky sap if it comes in contact with their skin. The affected areas can be washed with soap and water to remove the sap if irritation develops. Poinsettia plants are not a serious risk for animals although it is always best to keep any plant out of the reach of pets if they like to chew plants.

Finally, there are also several common houseplants that can be toxic to animals and children. Probably the most common is the Philodendron. The toxic part is the leaves. If ingested, it can cause burning of the lips and mouth and can also cause contact dermatitis if the plant juice contacts the skin. Similar symptoms can occur with Pothos, Golden Pothos and Devil's Ivy.

STUART — Diners who are seeking elegant dining, impeccable service and exquisite food, need to look no farther than Chophouse 88.

The upscale restaurant serves high quality steaks, seafood, pasta dishes, lamb and racks of ribs. There are comfort sides to accompany the entrée's and wine and beer pairings to complete each course of meal.

My guest and I were delighted to find out that the chef had prepared a special six-course meal for us to enjoy. Each course was paired with a wine, which accentuated each of the incredible tastes.

We started our meals with gazpacho andaluz, a delightful Spanish soup served cold. Finely diced tomatoes, onions, cucumbers and celery were covered in a tomato based broth. It was something I'd never tried before, and proba-

bly wouldn't have ordered, but after trying the delicious soup, I'll definitely order it again.

Next, we were brought a Chophouse wedge, a fresh and crispy iceberg lettuce wedge served with Bleu Cheese crumbles, applewood smoked bacon, heirloom tomatoes and Blue cheese dressing.

As we were finishing our salads, we were brought a crispy kurobuta pork belly with a pickled cucumber salad. The tender piece of pork was covered in a Coca-Cola Kim-Chi syrup. It was magnificent.

As we enjoyed the end of our Pinot Noir, we were brought out a mango sorbet to cleanse our palate. The sorbet was accompanied by a glass of light, fresh white wine that paired perfectly with the fresh, sweet sorbet.



Is it safe to go to the beach locally?

ST. LUCIE COUNTY — “Flesh eating bacteria” has been a popular local and national news topic recently and many people have been scared away from Florida’s beaches.

Clint Sperber, Deputy Administrator for the Florida Department of Health in St. Lucie said, “There are no cases of Vibrio vulnificus in the county, and it is definitely a misunderstanding about it, so public health, is here to educate.”

All residents and visitors that have certain health conditions are urged to avoid eating raw oysters and exposing open wounds to seawater and estuarine water, which may harbor bacteria called Vibrio vulnificus, occurring naturally in the warm coastal waters, particularly during the summer months, because it has the potential to cause serious illness.

Persons who have wounds, cuts or scratches and wade in estuarine areas or seawater where the bacteria might be present can become ill. Symptoms of

Vibrio vulnificus in wound infections typically include swelling, pain and redness at the wound site. Other symptoms of Vibrio vulnificus infection include; nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, diarrhea, fever, chills, and the formation of blistering skin lesions. Individuals experiencing these symptoms should contact a physician immediately for diagnosis and treatment.

Individuals with liver disease, including Hepatitis C and cirrhosis, are most at risk for developing serious illness from Vibrio vulnificus obtained from eating raw oysters. Others who should avoid consuming raw shellfish are those with hemochromatosis (iron overload), diabetes, cancer, stomach disorders or any illness or treatment that weakens the immune system. Thoroughly cooking oysters, either by frying, stewing, or roasting eliminates harmful bacteria and viruses in the meat. Consuming raw oysters that have undergone a post-harvest treatment process to eliminate the bacteria can also reduce the risk of illness.

What are some tips for preventing

Vibrio vulnificus infections?

- Do not eat raw oysters or other raw shellfish.
- Cook shellfish (oysters, clams, mussels) thoroughly.
- For shellfish in the shell, either a) boil until the shells open and continue boiling for 5 more minutes, or b) steam until the shells open and then continue cooking for 9 more minutes.
- Do not eat those shellfish that do not open during cooking. Boil shucked oysters at least 3 minutes, or fry them in oil at least 10 minutes at 375°F.
- Avoid cross-contamination of cooked seafood and other foods with raw seafood and juices from raw seafood.
- Eat shellfish promptly after cooking and refrigerate leftovers.
- Avoid exposure of open wounds or broken skin to warm salt or brackish water, or to raw shellfish harvested from such waters.
- Wear protective clothing (e.g., gloves) when handling raw shellfish.

How is Vibrio vulnificus infection

treated?

If Vibrio vulnificus is suspected, treatment should be initiated immediately because antibiotics improve survival. Aggressive attention should be given to the wound site; for patients with wound infections, amputation of the infected limb is sometimes necessary.

Quick reminder about Vibrio:

- Vibrio vulnificus infections are rare.
- Vibrio vulnificus is a naturally occurring bacterium in warm, brackish seawater.
- Water and wounds do not mix. Do not enter the water if you have fresh cuts or scrapes.
- IMPORTANT: Individuals who are immunocompromised, e.g. chronic liver disease, kidney disease, or weakened immune system, should wear proper foot protection to prevent cuts and injury caused by rocks and shells on the beach.



Be careful while fishing in the hot sun

Let's see, the temperature has been 90 degrees all week and yes, I love it.

Of course I am inside the Snook Nook with the air conditioning running, but every once in a while I stick my head out the door and enjoy it for a moment and then I go back inside. The big, bright sun and the temperatures just makes you lazy and the same goes for the fish.

Fishing off shore it is all about bottom fish, because that's where the fish are in the cool comfort zone. Water temperatures are hot and the fish are looking for cool water. Look deep, that's the

comfort zone. There are lots of bait fish, they like the warm water, but there is no one to bother with them.

Yes, that occasional dolphin or the king fish will appear, but if you are looking to take a fish home run the baits deep, and maybe a wahoo will make your day. Bottom fishing is excellent.

Five pounds of sardines will keep you busy, from 60-feet out you will find plenty.

If you're fishing at the beach, go early. That is when the tarpon and snook are there... you'll have to watch the sun come up. Be ready with baits of all sizes, you never know what they feeding on but they are feeding. Use 30 to 50-pound leader and lot of line. There are plenty of good size whiting with a mix of croaker for the day. A piece of shrimp will find them for you.

Fishing in the river there are plenty of fish, but you have to fish early the coolest part of the day.

There are plenty of trout and reds from county line north. Take your pick of the east or west side... you should be eating breakfast before 10 a.m. When the sun comes out, the fish go deep or to the shadows. Use a small jig to get their attention. There are plenty of snook and tarpon in the low light, play with your bait size, you just don't know when or what they are eating.

It is summer and it is hot and I love this place, but do not forget the water... stay hydrated in this heat.

Honoring heroes on Labor Day weekend

If you have ever wanted to be a hero, your chance to become a hero to be one to those who defend our freedom and their families comes this Labor Day weekend.

Every day the men and women of our armed forces put their lives on the line so that we can safely enjoy our swimming pools, cookouts, sports and time with loved ones. When it is time for them to come home, many return bearing the scars of combat and service. Others come home in a flag-draped coffin.

Patriot Golf Day is about these fine men and women and their families. Should you tee it up over this holiday weekend, please do so at a participating course. Proceeds from your round will go to the families of those who have been injured or killed defending our great nation.

To fully appreciate Patriot Golf Day's mission, it's important for you to know how it came to be.

Brad and Brock Bucklin, twins born in Grand Rapids, Michigan, were part of a family of five sons of Duane "Buck" and Dawn Bucklin.

The boys grew up to become fine young men. Trying to find direction in his life, Brock followed his brother into the military, enlisting a year after his brother in August of 2004. In the military Brock found his way and told his father that he planned to enter Officer Training School and make the Army his career.

Brock was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 68th Armor Regiment, 3rd Heavy Brigade Combat Team, and 4th Infantry

Division of Fort Carson, Colorado. In December 2005, he was called to service in Iraq.

On May 31, 2006, 28-year-old Corporal Brock Bucklin was the "acting mayor" of Forward Operating Base GABE, on the outskirts of Baqubah, 40 miles northeast of Baghdad. Just as a mayor of a town is the point person, the "mayor" of FOB GABE was the "go-to" guy when soldiers had problems or needs.

Brock's duty was to coordinate and manage the independent contractors and support resources to address those needs. On that day, he was assigned to assist a contractor in identifying equipment for transport.

The civilian contractors were responsible for moving concrete barriers, the largest 12 feet long, six feet high and four feet wide. Each barrier weighs as much as 10 tons and while they were moving them onto trailers one of the trucks became stuck.

A cargo chain was attached between the truck and another to pull it out. As the workers stood off to the side, the chain snapped and a broken link found Brock, slicing an artery in his neck.

Medics arrived and provided treat-

ment to Brock. Eighteen minutes later, a MEDEVAC helicopter transported him to LSA Anaconda Air Force Hospital. A half-hour later Brock Bucklin, having served only 22 months, had died.

"It is a tragedy when a son or daughter dies before you. It's unnatural. It's the thing that's unacceptable and most troubling," said his father, Buck.

Brad, stationed in Germany, was allowed to accompany his brother's coffin home to Grand Rapids. Then-Captain Dan Rooney, a PGA Professional from Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, and member of the Oklahoma Air National Guard, was on that same flight as it carried home the body of Corporal Bucklin.

The plane landed at 11:35 p.m., and Rooney watched through the plane's window as the Bucklin's awaited Brad and the coffin of their late son. Brock's son, Jacob, was clinging to the leg of his mother.

The pilot had requested that passengers remain in their seats until the remains of the fallen hero could be transferred to his family. Rooney looked up and saw that half of the passengers had left the plane. In that moment, Rooney was inspired to give back to the families of fallen heroes.

A little over a year after Brock's funeral, Rooney called Buck, letting him know that his son, along with all the families of those who had perished or

became disabled in the line of duty, would not be forgotten.

"I am an ordinary person that has been blessed with the extraordinary opportunity to be the flight leader on the Patriot Golf Day mission," says Rooney. "I simply planted a small seed which has been cultivated by PGA Professionals and great citizens around the United States."

Brock Bucklin's son Jacob, now 11, is the recipient of a scholarship generated from Rooney's vision for honoring fallen heroes - The Folds of Honor Foundation, and its largest fundraiser, Patriot Golf Day.

"It was good to know that something good came from this," said Buck. "There are a lot of other sons and daughters who did not come home."

"Never could I imagine what it was that Dan Rooney wanted to do," continued Buck. "But I know that my son would be extremely proud."

vegetables, eggs, milk, thoroughbred horses and more," Ms. Tucker said. "That setting provides clients with a true fresh start and the opportunity to immerse themselves into substance addiction treatment without any distractions and temptations from the outside world."

Once a patient is accepted into the Dream Center's program, a team of highly trained addiction specialists and medical professionals begins to work closely with him or her to formulate an individual holistic treatment plan tailored to the individual's unique strengths and weaknesses. The patient can then choose from a variety of outpatient services, as well as an extensive 30-day drug and alcohol rehab program. The center will also provide various

after-care services including intervention, relapse preventing skills and life skills training. While enrolled in the program, patients will have opportunities to participate in water sports as part of the ocean life component, as well as interact with the horses at the onsite equestrian center, one of the center's unique therapies.

For those with the most serious addiction issues, the Dream Center for Recovery will provide the referral to a licensed medical detoxification facility nearby to begin the first phase of the patient's recovery process before beginning the center's own 30-day program.
