Logging on to the internet for the first time can be very confusing. There is a whole new vocabulary to learn and a new set of guidelines to follow.

Primary election maintains status quo

MARTIN COUNTY — Martin County voters upset the political aspirations of challengers to the District 4 seat of the county commission and the Group V seat of the Stuart City Commission after the tally of unofficial results from the Aug. 26

primary.

Martin County District 4 Commissioner Sarah Heard handily defended her three-term seat against Republican challenger Barbara Clowdus, while incumbent Stuart Commissioner Eula Clarke will retain her Group V seat on the city commission after winning more than 52 percent of the vote against Robin Hicks-

Connors.

Almost 25 percent of Martin County's 104,000-plus registered voters participated in the primary, which cemented both Ms. Heard and Ms. Clarke's political future for the next four years. Both enter the November elections unopposed.

South Fork holds first 'Parent U'

MARTIN COUNTY — Many parents drop off their children at school Monday through Friday, but about 200 showed up at South Fork High School on Saturday Aug. 23 to take part in Parent University.

After a one hour presentation by Martin County School District Superintendent Laurie Gaylord and other officials, parents, guardians and other family members then chose from a variety of breakout sessions designed for the parents of either elementary or secondary students.

Ms. Gaylord says Parent University was created to provide information to parents and guardians about all the district's academic and support programs available.

"With the changes in education in Florida, we wanted to communicate what's new directly to parents," Ms. Gaylord said. "We also wanted to

Commissioner Heard noted after the primary that the race for the District 4 seat reflected the highest voter turnout in the county with a total of 24,764 votes cast.

“That tells us that this was the most critical race for Martin voters,” Ms. Heard said. “Martin County’s quality of life and our protections were on the line. By choosing me, voters showed confidence in my ability to protect them and our precious resources.”

Martin County District 2 Commissioner Ed Fielding defeated two chal-

lengers for his seat, Stacey Hetherington and John ‘Trapper’ Schierbaum, with more than 46 percent of the vote. Mr. Fielding will now face independent candidate and executive director of the Jensen Beach Chamber of Commerce Ron Rose in the Nov. 4 election. If Commissioner Fielding succeeds in holding on to his seat, he and Commissioner Heard will continue to steer the commission toward limited or no commercial growth in the county. The two have succeeded in swaying the majority of commissioners to vote against several major developments proposed for Martin County over the last four years, primarily in the Hobe Sound area.

The commission has been reluctant to create new land-use categories for the area along Bridge Road near I-95, which is zoned agricultural and allows only the construction of service industries for the motoring public.

Ms. Heard says she’s not against growth but wants it to be compatible with the county’s comprehensive growth plan, which the current board has been reinforcing.

“Good development protects natural resources, protects our valuable agricultural lands, keeps our taxes low, is compatible with existing development and provides the infrastructure necessary to support that new development,” she said.

In the race for Martin County School Board seats, voters gave Tina McSoley the victory over incumbent Maura Barry-Sorenson in the race for the District 4. While Ms. McSoley will claim her seat during the school board’s Nov. 18 meeting, Christia Li Roberts and Lorie Shekailo will face each other in a runoff for the District 1 seat after receiving most of the votes in the race against Jennifer A. Doak. The seat was vacated by Michael Busha who decided not to seek reelection.

Although the majority of Martin County voters wanted Steven Ziskinder to be the next Seat 4 judge on the 19th Judicial Circuit, they were outnumbered by voters in Indian River, Okeechobee and St. Lucie counties who wanted Port St. Lucie trial attorney Michael Heisey for the job. Unopposed in the November



elections, Mr. Heisey will begin his six-year term next January.

The majority of the 16,194 Martin votes cast in the race for the U.S. Representative in District 18 went to Republican candidate Carl Domino, who will now face Democratic incumbent U.S. Rep. Patrick Murphy on Nov. 4.

Florida incumbent Sen. Joe Negron won a landslide victory in the District 32 primary race against Brandon Cannon, with more than 85 percent of the votes cast. Sen. Negron will busy on the campaign trail this fall as he heads into the November elections in the race against write-in candidate Matthew Loew and Democrat Bruno Moore.

Former Florida Governor Charlie Crist will battle it out in November against incumbent Gov. Rick Scott after beating Nan Rich in the Democratic primary. Florida voters gave Gov. Scott a landslide victory against Republican challengers Yinka Adeshina and Elizabeth Cuevas-Neunder.

Overcrowded conditions prompt discounts

PALM CITY — It's doing more than raining cats and dogs at the Humane Society of the Treasure Coast. The Palm City shelter is “flooded” with adoptable animals that are now lining the non-profit organization's hallways. To ease the overcrowding, the HSTC is deeply discounting its adoption fees until fur-

ther notice. The adoption fee for dogs, normally \$120, is now \$25, and cats, usually \$40, are now \$5.

The HSTC serves as Martin County's only designated animal care and control facility and as such, must accept every animal that is brought to its shelter. Other animal care organizations have the option of selecting only those animals they wish to take in.

“We are the only open access shelter from Vero Beach to Fort Lauderdale that does not euthanize animals when we are overcrowded,” said HSTC President and CEO Frank Valente. “Because we never turn an animal away for any reason, we find ourselves in this position from time to time and we need help.”

Vermillion Parish Deputy Sheriff Allen Bares was gunned down by two men just last June 23 in Louisiana. Deputy Bares was white. His two killers, Quintlan Richard and Baylon Taylor, were black. Was Obama outraged? Did Eric Holder rush to Louisiana to make sure that the family of Deputy Bares found justice?

In Killeen, TX, Detective Charles Dinwiddie of the Killeen Police Department was murdered by Marvin Lewis Guy, a black male. Officer Dinwiddie was white. streets of Griffin, Georgia? No. In fact, I don't recall hearing about this one in the news, as well. Why? You can draw your own conclusions. Blacks complain that white officers threaten black men more aggressively on the street. You can draw your own conclusions on that one, as well.

A couple observations

The intersection of 53rd Street and U.S. 1 has been a topic of discussion recently. The speed limit set on U.S. 1 North of the 53rd Street traffic signal is flowing at the rate of 55mph. The speed limit set on US 1, south of the 53rd Street traffic signal, is a much more reasonable 45mph. I have noticed that because of the 'width' of the intersection (four lanes), attempting to turn left from U.S. 1 onto 53rd Street, heading West, is always a challenge. Not to mention trying to cycle or as a pedestrian walk across U.S. 1 without having to sprint!

I do not look forward to the eventual addition of yet another traffic signal at the intersection of 53rd Street and the Indian River Blvd (bypass). The future traffic load will require a safer way of exiting Indian River Blvd onto 53rd,

particularly heading West. Within 1 mile there are already three traffic signals in that particular area of 53rd Street. Do we want a 4th traffic signal in that already frustrating area? Traffic circles (Roundabouts) have their opponents but yet there are just as many supporters (come on, come forth!). If it hasn't been thought out already, I sure hope there has been some consideration for a traffic circle at this intersection. If future development (retail, housing and hotels) does come to the area, we will only have worsening traffic flow issues. It would be an enhancement for Grand Harbor, it could possibly be a fuel saver and make for a more pleasurable experience for those visiting our beaches. I have seen an increasing number of traffic circles in communities recently visited, they could be on to something.

Well, what about Earl Stewart overcharging for labor? That sounds pretty shady... Let's talk about it... I recently had my lawn mower repaired and it cost me \$65 per hour and having an electrician fix my air conditioning at home cost me \$75 per hour (plus gas & travel time), plumbers and a/c repairmen are \$100+ per hour. If you have mechanical work on your car, it's liable to cost you anywhere from \$100 to \$200-plus per hour, depending on the repair shop and type of car.

The insurance companies feel that \$42 an hour is more than fair to have your collision damaged vehicle repaired and they won't pay a dime more. If you want to repair your vehicle here, they will tell you that you'll have to pay the difference out of pocket or, well... they know a guy..... Ironically, back in the early 70s, when Allstate and Sears were all part of the same company, Sears wouldn't repair your toaster for less than \$12 an hour while at the same time Allstate wouldn't pay more than \$7 an hour to have your vehicle repaired. Take your time with your message and if you are trying to be funny or sarcastic, use a "smiley" or "emoticon". These are little faces created with the characters on the keyboard, and when looked at with your head tilted to the left, look like little facial expressions.

For example, :) is your basic smiley, :(is the same guy only in a bad mood, this ;) emoticon is a wink ;) and this :(emoticon is crying. Emoticons can be used to put the emotion back into a message that's become sterile and mechanical. Using an emoticon can be essential to let your email recipient know when you are "just kidding."

If you have a word processor or email client with a spell checker, use it when you compose your message. Also, watch out for the "caps lock" button on your keyboard. Typing in all capital letters is

considered 'shouting' and should be avoided. I've heard the argument that typing in all caps makes it easier to read but if you have trouble seeing when you are typing your message, there are other ways to increase the font size. Learn how to increase your font size and don't rely on caps lock, it can really get on peoples nerves.

Remember that email has flaws. Avoid foul language and "private" or "confidential" messages. E mail routers aren't perfect and your message may be accidentally sent to Mrs. Smith's first grade Discovery class. Never send anything you'd be embarrassed for your Mom to see (a deleted message can have copies archived all over the place). If you send an e mail message that can get you in trouble, Murphy's Law will kick in and you will (usually long after you thought the message in question was "deleted.")

These guidelines apply not only to e mail but even more so to message boards and "blogs." Message boards are

an area where netiquette is of the utmost importance, they are online bulletin boards that are read every day by countless people all over the world and if you post a bad message to one of these boards, you may find yourself the center of a "flame war" and your e mail box flooded with hundreds of nasty responses. Use common sense when posting messages to message boards or blogs. If you have a gut feeling that maybe you shouldn't post a message, don't. Once you post a message you usually can't take it back and you may offend thousands.

Other pitfalls to avoid in the message boards are the "trolls". These insidious little messages are designed to generate outrage and flames. Again, you'll recognize them when you see them, don't respond. That will only encourage them! Remember these words of wisdom – "don't feed the trolls!"

And lastly, don't fall for any of the countless "get rich schemes" on the 'net.

They're there and you'll know them when you see them. Trust me, there is no money waiting in Nigeria, you didn't win some foreign lottery and you'll do nothing but annoy people if you forward that chain letter. If it sounds too good to be true then it's probably a scam.

Take the time to find out the rules of the road before you try to communicate with the masses. Usually checking the "FAQ" (frequently Asked Questions) before posting messages can help prevent your e mail box from overflowing with flames.

All of these suggestions also apply to instant messenger programs and texting as well. It is easy to forget about manners and grammar when sending text messages and sure, it may be "just an instant message" but remember – there is someone on the other end. Be nice!

stress the importance of parent and family involvement.”

Before separating for the breakout sessions, participants learned about the latest in Florida education and the new Florida State Assessments, which are taking the place of the FCATs; the district’s new classroom technology program known as “Bring Your Own Device”; and information on bullying, school health programs, discipline and other subjects.

The separate sessions taught by school district staff included methods the parents of elementary age students could use to help their children do better in reading and mathematics; information on STEM (the integration of science, technology, engineering and mathematics); ways to connect and conference with school teachers; and how to stay safe in school and cyberspace.

High-school sessions covered some of the same topics, along with providing information on requirements for graduation, options for career and technical education afterward and planning for and obtaining financial aid for college. Some of the sessions were even offered in Spanish.

More than 30 community partners participated in the event, enabling parents and guardians to gather information from various agencies scattered throughout Martin County and the Treasure Coast.

Palm City resident Renay Rouse has two daughters at Hidden Oaks Middle School this year and came to the Parent University in search of information. She left impressed by the caliber of the breakout sessions.

“As a parent you have to be involved and you have to know what’s going on in the school,” Ms. Rouse said.

“Sometimes it’s hard to get the information you need, and I was happy to go and see what they had to share.”

Ms. Gaylord herself stressed the importance of parental and family involvement during the first hour of the event.

“Get engaged and be involved,” she said. “Students whose families are involved in their learning earn better grades, enroll in higher level programs, have higher graduation rates and are more likely to enroll in post-secondary education.”

Shalini Jakhete of Stuart says the Parent University was a good experience and provided her a lot of information for her son, a student in South Fork’s International Baccalaureate program.

“There were things for the students as well as the parents,” she said. “One of the breakout sessions was on financial assistance for the kids going to college, and I got a lot of information out of that.”

Ms. Jakhete says she wasn’t even ready to leave when the event ended at noon.

“I would have loved if they had extended it for the whole day,” she said.



Choose summer plants carefully

If there were three words that could describe the summers in Florida it would be rain, sun and humidity. These conditions can make summer planting a real challenge and can really put a damper on your gardening for the summer months.

There are, however, plants that will do well during the hot summer months and with only minimal care. If you want your planting to be as carefree as possible, it is probably wise to avoid planting a lot of annuals during this time of year. Many of your favorites such as petunia, impatiens, vinca and sometimes-even marigolds can be a real chore to maintain during our hottest months. You have more luck if you plant hardy varieties such as Firecracker plant, Panama rose, and Fire bush. Even Hibiscus will do well if you water it at least a couple times of week. Roses will also do well if you have them in well-drained soil and spray them regularly with Orthene or Orthenex for disease control and to control black spot.

If you want a great and fast growing climbing vine for say an arbor or maybe a large trellis, try Brown-Eyed Susan or even Mandeville. The Brown-Eyed Susan is a super-fast grower and will overtake your arbor

in about a season of growing. Mine even survived two hurricanes and came back with flying colors. If you want some lower growing color, try lantana. This is just the tip of the iceberg for ideas on plants that will do well during the summer. Next we will talk a little about some of these varieties in a little more detail.

One of my favorite plants to utilize during the hot summer months is the Firecracker bush. This fern-like plant grows in a weeping pattern. The branches initially start to grow upward but the weight of the branch soon makes it cascade in a weeping pattern. This feature makes the plant very unique. The plant will produce radiant clusters of bright red flowers that resemble firecrackers. The flowers are about one inch long and can really add a splash of color to your yard. You can also put these plants in hanging baskets. The plants do well in full sun or will even tolerate some partial shade. The plant likes a well-drained soil but also likes to be watered on a regular basis. The plant will require more

water if planted in a container then if it is planted in the ground. The Firecracker plant can grow as tall as 3 feet but I have seen some older plants that have even been a bit larger. Cuttings can be easily propagated into new plants.

Another interesting and colorful plant is a plant called Panama Rose. This plant produces vibrant reddish-pink flowers that grow in clusters that resemble a rose, hence the name. The plant is actually a tender plant that does well during the warm months but cannot tolerate cold temperatures during the winter months. The plant will attract butterflies and also produces a fragrant scent after the sun sets in the evening. The plant enjoys well-drained soil but does not like to be completely dry for long periods of time. You should put this plant where it will get some protection from the hot afternoon sun.

Another tropical plant is a woody

perennial called the Fire Bush. It is a fast growing plant with elliptical shaped leaves and produces a red flower that looks similar to the Firecracker plant. The plant can get quite large and grow up to 12-feet high. The plant is a great attractant for butterflies and humming birds and also produces small fruit clusters. The plant contains anti-bacterial chemicals and can be used topically to treat insect bites and stings. The plant will do well in sun or partial shade and needs well drained but moist soil. The plant can be used successfully as a hedge or as a colorful accent plant. It can be a great addition to your flower collection!

Motor vehicle fee reduction now effective

TREASURE COAST — Reductions in Florida's motor vehicle registration fees took effect on Sept. 1. Floridians will save approximately \$17 to \$25 when renewing their registrations, depending on the size of vehicle. The fee reductions were proposed by Governor Scott earlier this year as part of the It's Your Money Tax Cut Budget, and were approved by the Florida Legislature during the 2014 legislative session. While the reductions will save Floridians millions of dollars each year, it will not affect the level of service provided by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles.

Governor Scott said, "This year, we set out to cut many taxes and fees on Florida families, and starting next week we are rolling back many of the 2009 tax increases on annual motor vehicle registrations. This fee cut will result in an annual savings of about \$25 per typical motor vehicle. Families deserve to keep more of their hard earned money,

and we will now be able to save Floridians \$400 million, because it's their money."

"The reduction in vehicle registration fees will benefit both individuals, as well as the Florida business community," said DHSMV Executive Director Terry L. Rhodes. "There are more than 14 million registered vehicles here in Florida that are covered by these fee reductions and that is a lot of savings for the people of Florida."

The reductions will apply to vehicle registrations renewed on or after Sept. 1, 2014.



The turbulent '60s - Part 2

I was in the military in the 1960s, when all the protesting was going on. I was a regular military guy, but I wasn't what they called a "strat troop" at the time, with my boots all shined up, my gig line straight and my fatigues pressed with so much starch that they hurt to wear them.

Most of us who went to Vietnam and came back did not fit that mold. We were not like some of the officers.

Many guys in my unit had applied for officer training school, but could not stand the wait to get in. Vietnam loomed over their heads, almost like the college students, who were not making their grades or were soon to lose their deferments.

After military basic training, where they took us from our families, pulled the rug out from under us and tried to conform and push us into the military life and the Universal Code of Military Justice (read UCMJ totalitarianism), many of us would not conform. We were children of the 1960s. We had already tasted and experienced individual freedom through our music, our television shows, our records and our rebellion against our parents and all other forms of authority that we thought was wrong.

At military tech school, we were of two worlds. We would gather and line up in the mornings, before breakfast and going to class, and tuck our long hair up under our "C-caps" (Some of you may know the meaning of that.) for

inspection, hoping not to catch the attention of the captain or the sergeants in charge. We wanted to look like everyone else when we went out in public in our civilian clothes. Short hair was not a good thing at the time, like it is now.

All was going well for a time, until the captain got word of it one day and called for a "hats off" inspection. We had to obey. With hair falling everywhere, that day quickly created a lucrative barracks business, called "the barber on the first floor."

After that incident, a few of us went to downtown El Paso one evening to watch the premier of "Easy Rider" at a local theater. After the show, when the lights came up, people were staring at us. I thought we were not going to get out of the theater alive; since, with our short hair, we must have looked like the two rednecks that shot Billy and Captain America in the movie. Or maybe the people just didn't like the military. It was tough being in the service in the 1960s, and even in the 1970s.

Club's early literacy program named top overall in Florida

MARTIN COUNTY — The Boys & Girls Clubs of Martin County recently received the award for top overall Boys & Girls Club program in the state by the Florida Area Council for Be REAdy, an early literacy initiative that the organization designed and created in 2012.

The Be REAdy ("Reading Enrichment & Achievement for Dedicated Youth") program, funded by the John & Jane Pratt fund at the Martin County Community Foundation as well as other supporters, targets the Clubs' youngest members (K-3) who demonstrate the greatest need for small group, twice-weekly literacy tutoring from certified teachers on site at the Clubs.

"Research clearly shows that if chil-

dren are not proficient readers by the end of third grade, they are four times more likely to drop out of high school," said Anne McCormick, the Clubs' Chief Executive Officer. "We are very proud of our success these past two years and are so grateful to those supporters that enable us to deliver this program at no charge to Martin County children and their families who need us most."

The award was presented to Ms. McCormick and the organization at the Florida Area Council's annual meeting that was held August 21-23 in Orlando. The Florida Area Council represents 41 Boys & Girls Clubs in 55 of Florida's 67 Counties from Key West to Pensacola, collectively serving over 161,000 youth between the ages of 6 and 18 annually.

Be REAdy began as a pilot program in fall 2012 with two Club branches

participating (and later expanded to all five Clubs in 2013, tripling the number of participants). It was developed in collaboration with a number of state and local reading and education experts, most notably Tina McSoley from the Stuart-based All About Achieving Learning Centers.

Participating Club members are grouped according to their specific skill deficits, ensuring children enjoy a customized learning experience. Skill areas that are targeted in the Be REAdy program include main idea, cause and effect, compare and contrast, sequencing, sight words, fluency, inference, and author's purpose.

During the 2013-2014 school year, 93 percent of 107 Club Members in grades K-3 who participated in the Be REAdy program improved their read-

ing scores this school year. Further, 86 percent met or exceeded the individual reading goals established for them at the program's commencement. The 2014-2015 Be REAdy begins in October.

Formed in 1991, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Martin County enables all young people, especially those who need us most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens. To achieve this, trained youth development professionals offer children ages 6 to 18 a very low-cost, comprehensive, and high-yield curriculum after school and during the summers.

military was split apart. Everyone kept to themselves, with their ethnic backgrounds, their beliefs, where they were from, etc.

None of us were to blame, since American had continued to help in Southeast Asia after the colonial French had been defeated in 1954 by the "Viet Minh," later name changed to the "Viet Cong." As the late actor Robin Williams said in the movie, "Good Morning, Vietnam," it was hard to find a Vietnamese man named "Charlie." They are all named "Nguyen," etc." That was for sure!

By the time the '60s were over, I had been in Okinawa, Vietnam, over Cambodia and Laos and had spent a

year in northern Thailand. As my parents would later say, "I got out by the skin of my teeth."

I never really understood what that phrase meant, but I guess it was a reference to some kind of a "close call." The military and I never got along much, anyway.

I finally went home, like many of our troops, a little busted up emotionally, mentally and physically, to friends and family and a country that did not understand what I had gone through, or how it had affected me.

I came home and started playing the guitar I had bought the day I left Southeast Asia, and I guess I am still trying to figure out my life and put it all back together.

It's life. We all have to deal with it and go forward. Life goes on, and the music does help.

Palm City golf club offers top-notch course, amenities

Joining a private club can be a great thing. The course is usually in much better shape, the clubhouse and locker rooms are available at all times and then there is the socialization that you enjoy with fellow members.

If you are looking for a private, member-owned golf home community, I suggest that you put Piper's Landing Yacht & Country Club in Palm City atop your list. When you take into account the initial contribution, the refundable contribution, monthly dues and fees, this club comes out as one of the least expensive private clubs on the Treasure Coast.

No one enjoys a club where you are constantly fighting for tee times, or court time, or to get a table in the dining room. With only 302 residences and no outside memberships available, the course, tennis courts, and clubhouse are never overcrowded. That's not to say that no one is there, it's just that there is the right amount of room for the members.

The clubhouse isn't huge and ostentatious. At 29,000-square feet there is just the right amount of space for the pro shops, the dining room, the locker rooms and more. Goldilocks would certainly give the place a "thumbs up".

The membership structure is simple. Everyone is a full golf mem-

ber and everyone pays the same amount. This creates a harmonious community and financial stability for the club. The golf course is the community's greatest asset and having everyone support it, makes for a first-class club and community.

A few weeks ago, I was invited by Pegi Austin, the club's Membership and Marketing Coordinator, to come out and experience Piper's Landing first-hand. I brought a couple colleagues and my son along for the experience.

When you arrive at Piper's Landing, the first thing you notice is how wonderful the landscaping is. Every yard is pristine, the common areas are groomed to perfection, the flowers are in bloom, the staff is warm and friendly and the entire place immediately relaxes you.

While everything leading up to that first tee shot may relax you, the golf course itself can be as challenging or relaxing as you desire. The par-72 layout has six sets of tees with a course rating ranging from 66.1 to 74.2, and a slope rating that ranges from 122 to 149.

Piper's Landing was designed in 1984 by native Floridian, Joe Lee, and measures as long as 6,922 yards from the tips. Lee has designed and renovated more than 250 courses in his career, including Bay Hill, Doral's Blue Monster, LaCosta, and Cog Hill. Lee is famous for his straightforward designs. No fancy bells and whistles, or gimmicks, just a course that's easy on the eyes and fun for golfers of every level.

A redesign in 2007 by Gene Bates bettered the course's drainage and irrigation while maintaining the original integrity and design principles.

The course is a wonderful blend of challenge and fun, with conditions that rival the best courses you will play. Playing from the correct set of tees, one will find themselves hitting nearly every club in the bag.

The toughest hole on the course comes up quickly. The par-5 second hole features a split fairway with the preferred side being narrowed by bunkers and out-of-bounds. Not many reach the green in two. In fact, one of my playing partners decided to play in the sand the entire way to the green.

The par-4 tenth hole is one that may be played a myriad of ways. It's not very long, but there is a large oak guarding the approach to the green. Hit your drive long enough and it's not much of a factor. Hit short and

you face a longer approach with a through a narrow gap. Hit your tee ball just right and you likely have to go over it.

At the par-4 14th, you are again posed a challenge. There is a brook running across the fairway. You can layup or drive over it. The longer your drive, the easier the approach will be. I want a mulligan on this hole!

The finishing holes are wonderful, with the 18th having a severe dogleg to the right. The more daring you are, the shorter your approach.

The best thing about finishing your round at Piper's Landing, is that you can now enjoy a wonderful meal. The club features some of the most delicious meals. After our round, while we discussed how fantastic the course conditions were and how much we loved the course, we enjoyed Angus burgers, grilled grouper, tasty chicken salad, and cold beverages. We topped it off with some of the club's famous cookies.
