Martin County Fire Rescue keeping close eye on fire danger

MARTIN COUNTY — The Treasure Coast has seen very little rain in recent weeks, and any time somebody sees smoke on the horizon the high winds will rattle a few nerves. Because of the dry spring so far, Martin County Fire Rescue has ramped up patrols and is tracking the fire danger index to prepare for and respond to needs quickly. "Right now, it's getting worse with the fact that we still haven't had any significant rain and the winds and cold air are keeping humidity down and drying everything out," said MCFR Bureau

Chief Karl Holtkamp. "The most recent fire close to Martin County was near Becker Road in St. Lucie County and there was significant acreage burned. Martin County hasn't been affected by any fires, but the MCFR team has increased its response times to get enough trucks to potential sites early to threats. "Fortunately, we've had no major problems," Chief Holtkamp said. "Typically, if we get a call for possible brushfires we send one brush unit. But since these dryer conditions, we're sending at least two brush units out to the main fire so the backup See FIRE, page 2

Indiantown elects first mayor, village council

INDIANTOWN — The newly minted Village of Indiantown now has a governing body and village staff will soon follow. Indiantown, which voted in favor of incorporation last November, has five council members: Jackie Clarke, Anthony D. Dowling, Janet Hernandez, new Vice Mayor Guyton Stone and Mayor Susan Gibbs Thomas. There were 10 candidates for the positions and during the March 13 election the council members were elected.

During a recent March 21 village council meeting, Vice Mayor Stone and Mayor Thomas came out on top, although it took six tries to come up with an agreeable vote for mayor. Indiantown has a similar construct to Stuart's City Commission in that the role of mayor is largely ceremonial and works mainly to sign city documents and official business. Mayoral and vice mayoral terms on the governing body will be one year, although a new mayor and vice mayor will again be named in September and each one thereafter.

Interim Village Attorney and former Stuart City Manager Paul Nicoletti is one of the members of the transition team for Indiantown and he said the process has been an interesting one to watch because the fledgling incorporated village has many important steps to take on the way to being fully up-and-running.

"The council, itself, gets to decide who the mayor and vice mayor will be, and they're all elected and equal from that standpoint," Mr. Nicoletti said. "The mayor is the presiding officer at meetings and is the person designated to sign contracts and official documents on behalf of the village. ... But the village council can reorganize any time they want.

"I think the village council has done very well, they've had one meeting and See INDIANTOWN, page 4

Community notes

Martin County shore protection project begins

Martin County launched a shore protection project on Tuesday, March 20. In partnership with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Jacksonville District, Great Lakes Dredge & Dock of Oak Brook, Illinois will begin to take offshore sand and place it on four miles of eroded shoreline.

While nearly all beaches are naturally prone to gradual erosion, Hurricanes Matthew and Irma along with high tides, strong winds and heavy surf conditions this winter, caused a significant change in some Martin County shorelines. "Nourishment projects are a normal part of conservation and coastal management and we're looking forward to strengthening this section of the beach," said Kathy Fitzpatrick, Coastal Engineer for Martin County.

The project will consist of placing nearly 400,000 cubic yards of sand on four miles of eroded beach, widening the beach berm and raising the elevation of the beach. Martin County Ocean Rescue will be on-duty during the project, increasing the use of ATVs to manage the guarded area and constantly patrol the beach ensuring the safety of beach patrons and swimmers. Beach goers can get current beach conditions by calling (772) 320-3112.

The south end of the Jensen Beach parking lot will be closed to store equipment during construction. Additionally, small sections of the beach, including beach access points will be closed sequentially as

the work progresses down the beach.

is already on the way knowing there's going to be delay because they're not coming from the same station.

"So, instead of waiting for our units to get there and assess the situation we're going ahead and sending the second unit at minimum so that there is no delay."

Martin County Fire Rescue works side-by-side with the Florida Forest Service and they are called immediately in the event of a fire. Personnel also performs the "prescribed burns" designed to keep fire danger at bay, and they work with MCFR's brush units when an emergency occurs for extra manpower.

The Wildfire Index scale is measured up to 800, and Martin County's was sitting at about 522 at press time. But there is a website that has an index for every county and region in Florida. The county is currently in the "extreme" category on the chart, which is the highest level. There are now

eight counties that have burn bans in effect, although Martin County is not one of them.

"We usually put out warnings to the community that there should be no burning and hopefully most people abide by that, and typically that's the way it does go," Chief Holtkamp said. "Most people know to not burn except on a grill or something. But no open burning."

State-wide, there have been 989 total fires so far this year, with 928 occurring on state lands and 68 on federal. Meanwhile, wildfires have consumed 34,162 acres so far in 2018. Martin County's at-risk communities exist closer to tree lines, particularly in Palm City, where there is not as much separation between the tree lines and houses.

Your first step should be to communicate your complaint ASAP to the General Manager or, preferably, the real owner or the real general manager. A General Manager is over all employees in the entire company. A general "sales" manager is not a General Manager. If you can't reach the owner (Many car dealerships are either publicly owned or owned by absentee owners), ask to see the General Manager. Often times the owner or General Manager is not aware of everything that goes on with all of their customers and employees. They might have new employee that should not have been hired or received inadequate training. Or, they may simply have a "rotten apple" that should not be working there. The ease and speed with which you can meet and speak to a General Manager or an owner is a pretty good measure of the integrity of the company as whole. If the owner or General Manager cares enough about her customers to allow total access, it is probably a very good place to do business. In fact, it is a good idea to find this out before you do business.

If you cannot reach the owner or General Manager, contact the manufacturer who franchises the dealership. Car dealers have a contract with the manufacturer called a franchise agreement and this contractual agreement requires that they treat their customers with courtesy, efficiency and

integrity. Most manufacturers have a customer hotline that allows you to call and register a complaint directly. The owner or General Manager of the dealership will be made aware of your complaint. As you might guess, the manufacturer has quite a bit of clout with their dealer. If a dealer does not live up to his side of the contract, his franchise could be canceled or not renewed.

The third step I recommend is to contact a consumer agency like The Better Business Bureau or the County Office of Consumer Affairs. These will send your complaint to the dealership and request a written reply. No car dealership or business wants an unanswered complaint in the file of a governmental or private consumer agency.

The fourth step is to call the Florida Department of Motor Vehicles, DMV, and/or the Florida Attorney General's office. These are extreme steps to be used for serious, even illegal, activities. The DMV can suspend or cancel a dealer's motor vehicle retail license, putting him out of business. The Attorney General's Office can file criminal charges and assess large fines, even jail terms. The DMV phone number is (850) 617-2000. The Attorney General's phone number is 866-966-7226.

This website provides you with three forms to download, from the Florida Attorney General, Florida Department of Motor Vehicles, and the Florida Office of

Consumer Affairs, www.FloridaCarDealer-Complaints.com.

Your last resort is to contact an attorney. Hiring an attorney just about eliminates the possibility that you can quickly, amicably and inexpensively resolve your differences with the car dealer. Be very careful which attorney you choose. Try to choose one that is primarily interested in helping you and not in generating large fees for him. Under the Florida Deceptive and Unfair Trade Practices Act, an attorney is entitled to his fees and costs from the defendant in a lawsuit if he wins. These fees can be much larger than the amount of your claim, motivating an unethical attorney to spend more time than is needed and dragging out a case to generate more fees than are necessary. This can be very dangerous for you because the car dealer's attorney's fees run roughly parallel to your lawyer's and you can be held liable for those if you lose the case. However, there are honest and talented consumer advocate attorneys that will counsel with you at no charge. They will tell you whether or not you have a lawsuit you can win. If you do, the car dealer will pay your attorney's fee.


Hopefully you never have to resort to the final step of hiring a lawyer. In trying steps one, two, three and four try to present your complaint as concisely and politely as possible. You have every right to be angry when you are taken advantage of, but try to let your anger subside before you speak to or write to someone about your problem. We all react negatively to someone who is profane, raises his voice, or is sarcastic. Your goal of communicating and resolving your complaint is best reached by communicating clearly, politely and concisely.

it's just an interesting time out there to have five new council members elected all at once means they haven't had a chance to work together much, but they will over the next several weeks and months. It's fascinating to be a part of and hopefully we will get it right if we get everything organized and set up."

Mayor Thomas wasn't available for comment at press time, but Vice Mayor Stone said he anticipates a bright future for Indiantown because the village will have its own autonomy and ability to make decisions for the well-being of citizens and the business community.

"We've got a lot ahead of us that we need to do, and we need to be prepared and make sure that we're doing the right thing for the community," Vice Mayor Stone said. "We definitely need jobs and we definitely need some housing that people can afford and is of quality.

"I ran on bringing manufacturing jobs and we need youth programs, and those are

definitely some of the things that I believe we need in Indiantown. So far, we had one meeting and it went well. There were a couple of hiccups, of course, because it took six votes to get the mayor in place, but for the most part I think we're all on the same page as far as the lifestyle of Indiantown."

Interim Village Manager Teresa Lamar-Sarno said the process has been interesting from the start, and she thinks it's an incredible opportunity for the village council, transition team and most importantly the residents.

"We get to decide how we're going to be in the future and what we're going to look like," Ms. Lamar-Sarno said. "It's an honor, honestly, to be part of it, because there are not a lot of new cities. The last city was the Village of Estero down in Southwest Florida in 2014, so this is awesome and exciting.

"I've been very lucky, because I worked with the transition team and now I have a council that's set with a mayor and vice mayor and we're trying to get to work."



The pros and cons of using a laptop

One of the features that make laptop computers so appealing is the fact that they are portable. With a laptop you are free to roam where you want to.

A laptop with a wireless internet connection gives you the ability to work in any room in the house and even beyond. With a laptop you have the freedom to leave your home (or office) entirely and still have the full blown computer power that you would expect to have with a desktop machine. And with free wireless “hot spots” popping up all over the place the possibilities are endless – you can get the same amount of work done that you would expect to get done if you were confined to a desk all day from places like coffee shops, airports, the lobby of a fine hotel or even (if you live in a gated community) down at the clubhouse by the pool!

But (as is true with all good things) there are a few “gotcha’s” that you have to be aware of if you decide to take your machine out on the road.

One issue that causes a fair amount of confusion for the budding “road warrior” is the inability to send email from on the road. Receiving mail is usually not a problem but the inability to send mail when you are on a connection other than your home network is a complaint that I used to hear quite a bit.

Now, not everyone has this problem. There are plenty of people out there who are able to use their laptops wherever they want and sending isn’t a problem but there are others who (try as they might) can’t send an email when away from home to

save their life. The answer usually lies in what email service their system is set up to use when the mail fails to send versus the email services that works no matter where they are.

Confused? Let’s back track a bit and talk about the typical home internet service and what’s included. When you sign up for internet service for your home one of the things that you get with that service is an email address. Your Internet Service Provider (ISP) gives you access to the internet from home and sets up a username which typically becomes your email address. Then your email program (Outlook, Windows Live Mail, Outlook Express, etc.) gets set up with your username, password, “POP” and “SMTP” settings. Now the POP settings (POP=“Post Office Protocol”) are the settings that tell your email program from where on the internet your incoming mail can be retrieved and the SMTP settings (SMTP=“Simple Mail Transfer Protocol”) tells your mail program where on the internet your outgoing mail needs to go when you click the “Send” button. The problem sending mail usually lies with the SMTP settings.

You see, Internet Service Providers take SPAM (junk email) very seriously and in an

effort to try to thwart SPAM, some providers will prohibit relaying outgoing mail through their SMTP servers. What this means is that when an outgoing mail message is being sent from within their network, it goes along without a hitch. But when you try to use your machine in a network that is different than the network you use at home (maybe your home network is AT&T and the coffee shop you are trying to send email from is Comcast for example) then the SMTP server rejects the outgoing mail because it’s not originating from within its network but from some other network. The message gets blocked as part of the service provider’s efforts to thwart SPAM.

So what do you do? And why is it some people have no problem sending mail and others can’t?

Well, many ISPs have a different SMTP address for people when they are on the road but one of the easiest ways to work



around this issue is to set up a free “web based” email service like Gmail so it doesn’t matter where you are when you try to send email. With an email services like Gmail you can set up your SMTP settings in your email program to point to Gmail’s server and bypass your ISP’s SMTP settings altogether. It’s a simple fix and using a web based email service also lets you keep using the same email address even if you move or change internet service providers. But that’s a whole other issue altogether.



County approves CRA plan update

STUART -- The majority of the Martin County Commission agreed March 13 to accept an update to its Countywide Community Redevelopment Area Plan in spite of opposition from two commissioners on the plan's growth projections and continual reliance on the Tax Increment Financing funding method.

Community Redevelopment Office Manager Susan Kores told commissioners the update created by Pompano Beach-based consultant Redevelopment Management Associates was long overdue.

"The plan represents a starting point to create a roadmap for redeveloping the older areas of our communities, our CRAs," she said. "The most recent planning effort to update community needs was the Neighborhood Opportunities Workshop conducted in 2010. Overtime, shifting conditions have shown that -- to be relevant -- any plan must be flexible as the economy and the demographics of the area change. Plans should be reviewed on a regular basis to ensure that they accurately depict the needs and the desires of the community."

Redevelopment Management Associates Director Kevin Crowder explained that his firm garnered significant public input in order to ensure the plan preserved the unique character of the Martin County community.

"It's really updating that countywide perspective, looking at the goals and strategies that need to be addressed," he said. "Because the CRA is based off of growing the increment in order to fund the projects that fulfill

the goals of the redevelopment plan, we look at economic growth as the thing that's going to drive it and the things that are going to influence economic growth: capital, markets and regulation. And in the market study, we looked at all of the seven different CRA areas and the differences there because the way that land or labor or the markets influence the ability of those CRAs to grow is going to be different because they all have their own individual character."

Mr. Crowder emphasized that RMA focuses its CRA evaluations on three specific principles espoused by the Miami-based Knight Foundation on its own studies of what connect people to a particular place.

"What they found consistently throughout the United States in all different types of communities -- urban, rural, waterfront, rich, poor -- is that three things overwhelmingly connected to people, even above jobs, even above schools: the aesthetics of a place, how a place looks and feels; the activities and social offerings; and how open and welcoming that community is. And so we really took that to heart; that's the approach we're taking when we look at it because ultimately economic development is about economic growth and not development necessarily and it's about enhancing your tax base to improve your quality of life."

Commissioner Ed Fielding cast one of the two dissenting votes against accepting the Countywide Community Redevelopment Area Plan created by Mr. Crowder's firm, primarily basing his opposition on the TIF funding method.

"I have a very basic philosophical difference that I think is reflected in the level of participation that we have from our citi-

zens," he said. "In my view, the step that we have taken to fund our CRAs is quite common, but I believe that step really minimizes the citizen input because it then becomes a group of people who are sort of self-related and they have the time and take the occasion, so they get involved."

Commissioner Fielding said many residents see TIF funding as a gift and believes creating Municipal System Taxing Units for the CRAs instead would draw more participation and require more accountability.

"We will have people that are giving thought to what are we doing -- we're taxing ourselves -- so we [would] want to know is this too much, too little, what can we do with it, how can we most benefit," he said. "TIF to me is a method that we have allowed people to walk away from the decision process because they see themselves as not really being affected. I don't want it to be that way: I want it to be 'we got skin in the game, I want to be there, be involved, make contributions.'"

Commissioner Sarah Heard cast the other dissenting vote, complaining that the CRAs have failed to prove successful since their original creation in the 1990s.

"We are between 16 and 18 years of our CRA so we're over half of the way through the sun-setting of the CRAs, and I think that we're still stumbling," she said. "I think it's unfortunate that we're still struggling because we should be very, very mature right now. We've been at this for so long and there are substantial funds involved now, and we still seem to be doing some things that probably aren't real productive."

Commissioner Heard also rejected Mr. Crowder's estimates on projected tax incre-

ment growth, which reflected significant growth in both the Jensen Beach and Indiantown CRAs by the year 2027.

"They're just all over the place," she said. "Jensen Beach is going from \$7,000 in 2017 to over a \$1 million in 2027, Rio's going from \$440 in 2017 to \$685 in 2027; Indiantown's going from \$5,800 in 2017 to \$783,000 in 2027. Well, the next page is a 3 percent annual growth on each one of the seven CRAs, which seems reasonable I guess. I just think that this is not fact-based. I don't have any idea what your projections are based upon because they're completely outside the realm of reality."

Although Mr. Crowder defended his projections saying they were "based on the historic growth rates of the CRAs," he emphasized that those aren't necessarily used for CRA planning purposes.

"What we always recommend from the planning side as we plan projects is to plan off of that 3 percent, off of that straight-line growth," he added.

His explanation failed to satisfy Commissioner Heard.

"I'm not going to support it," she said. "I find too many inconsistencies and misrepresentations in the work product to be able to endorse it."

For his part, Commission Chairman Ed Ciampi defended the CRAs, saying the previous method of having commissioners serve as the CRA Board failed to give the areas the autonomy they really needed for success free from political meddling. He also believes the collapse of the housing market and resulting recession contributed to the early failure of the CRAs to succeed.

County health departments using new system to track influences on health

TREASURE COAST – A new tool should help county health organizations to study factors that influence health. The Florida Department of Health has recently tapped the 2018 County Health Rankings & Roadmaps tool released by the University of Wisconsin and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation for its established data, which is available at www.FLHealthCHARTS.com.

“The County Health Rankings contain 35 measures used to calculate how St. Lucie ranks across the State of Florida relative to the health measures in the reports,” said Clint Sperber, Health Officer and Administrator of the Florida Department of Health in St. Lucie County in a press release. “This year it is quite evident, that St. Lucie has seen progress where we have moved from the third quartile to the second quartile regarding our health outcomes and quality of life for our residents.”

Martin County officials said the data is valuable in a variety of areas.

“This is not a Health Department ranking, it’s a community ranking, so what this tells me – first of all – is that we have partnerships and collaborations that are good and solid that are leading to some of these positives,” said Karlette Peck, Health Officer for the Florida Department of Health in Martin County. “We are doing very well, usually, in the top five but if you look at the

report you can see that it’s not simply healthy behaviors but it’s access to health care.

“These rankings are a snapshot of the health of counties across the country and they emphasize that health is not a singular effort but a combined work in progress across all community partners,” according to a press release. “The department works in collaboration with local governments, non-profit organizations, health care facilities, business groups, schools, faith-based organizations and many other stakeholders to improve the health of all people in St. Lucie County. These rankings use data related to physical environments, social and economic factors, health behaviors and clinical care.”

In St. Lucie and Martin counties, the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) addresses specific opportunities for improved health that have been identified by the community. The department has partnered with many stakeholders to implement the CHIP and collaborates regularly to track progress.

Under the direction of Healthy St. Lucie, Inc., plans and activities have been developed that are improving the health of the county, according to the Department of Health. Some of these activities include the 2018 Billion Step Challenge to increase physical activity and reduce obesity, the Baby Steps Baby Friendly initiative to increase breastfeeding among new mothers

giving births in our hospitals, the Safety Village program to improve injury prevention efforts, the Fetal Infant Mortality Review initiative to decrease infant mortality, and Tobacco Cessation Action Plan and Students Working Against Tobacco to decrease smoking rates in St. Lucie County.

Meanwhile, in Martin County, at the facility based in the Golden Gate neighborhood in Stuart, the center has become a hub for programs that enhance health and support life skills. The Health Department offers school age Immunizations, HIV/STD testing, Hepatitis C testing, Family Planning and Nutrition/Cooking classes at the Golden Gate Center. “Bringing partners together in a unified effort is the foundation for our work,” said Rob Ranieri, Chief Executive Officer for the House of Hope. “The Golden Gate Center provides us with a unique opportunity to meet people where they live and work. Through our many partnerships, we can offer the community life changing programs that support health, build life skills and support overall well-being.”

“You’ll also see that there is an economic piece of that with unemployment rates and poverty rates, etc. It’s really a comprehensive picture of the community and it is important that you compare and benchmark yourself to other places because if there are issues that need to be addressed by looking at

these rankings you can sort of benchmark against each other to see who’s doing well in one area and who’s not doing well and pick up the phone and say, ‘How come you’re doing so well in this area?’” Ms. Peck added. “But this is not a measure of the Health Department, it’s a measure of the entire community and we have that advantage of having a community that’s very engaged.

“This is clearly done by a group that has no connection whatsoever to the Florida Department of Health, and the same criteria are used, nationally, for every county and it’s a standardized approach and an objective overview of each county.”

St. Lucie county officials expressed similar sentiments.

“There are areas of progress, and we are reaping the rewards of many of our long-standing partnerships and support of countywide health initiatives with numerous agencies, including government, faith-based organizations and community non-profits. Together we have made great strides; I am confident we will continue our forward movement in a positive direction,” said St. Lucie County Commission Chairperson, Frannie Hutchinson.

Natural gardening tips

If you go to your favorite garden center, you will see a massive variety of mulches and groundcovers. Modern mulch products can come in a variety of colors including red, brown and even black. Many of these mulch products are made from trees that are rapidly being cut down faster than they can be replanted. There are, however, other options that you can use for groundcovers that are both attractive and also will maintain a natural look in your landscape environment.

Mulching is primarily done for two reasons. One is for appearance and the other is to maintain good soil health. The latter is the most important reason to mulch your yard. If you look around your environment, you can find many natural and virtually free resources you can use for mulching around your favorite flowerbed. You can use pine needles, pine bark, peanut shells, straw or hay or even crushed rock. If you live on a wooded lot or have lots of trees on your property, you can purchase a chipper and turn your trimmings into a useful groundcover. Many construction areas use chippers to turn the cleared trees

into a mulch piles that you can pick up for free. In short, use your imagination. Any natural organic material can potentially be recycled and used as mulch.

Many people mulch their yards solely for appearance but the reasons for mulching go much deeper than that. Mulch can dramatically lessen the impact of high soil temperatures on your plants. A two-inch layer of organic mulch can lower the temperature of the soil by 30 degrees or more. It also helps the soil to maintain more even moisture content by preventing water evaporation. Mulch also helps to shade out weeds from your garden. By keeping at least a 2-inch covering of mulch in your garden, weeds cannot receive enough light to grow and the few that do survive can be easily taken out.

Here is a great tip you can use before

laying down your mulch. Prepare the area first by laying down a layer of wet newspapers. This not only gives you a good base for laying your mulch but it will also give you an extra barrier of weed protection. It also helps do the double duty of recycling your old newspapers. Best of all, it costs next to nothing to do! The paper will decompose in the soil and will also allow water to pass through easily.

Another great way to save money and reuse natural resources is to build a compost pile. You can do this by either using a compost bin or you can build the pile right on the ground. It would be wise to locate your compost pile as far from your home as possible so the bugs that help decompose your organic materials do not get into your structure. Using a compost bin can have the advantage of keeping critters out of your pile and also helps to maintain moisture and keeps the compost from blowing around your yard.

There are basically two ways you can build your compost pile. If you want the process to be as fast as possible, you will need to follow a few extra steps. You should

first wet the area under the compost pile and also put some twigs on the bottom of the pile. You will then want to alternate materials. You need alternating layers of nitrogen, which would be grass clippings, and you also need carbons, which would include leaves, hay and dried straw. As you layer your compost pile always moisten the pile with some water.

If you don't have the patience to do this layering process, you can also just add any organic materials such as leaves, grass or dried hay into your pile at your own convenience and add water to keep the pile moist. Keep in mind that doing it this way will result in a slower decomposing process.

When the compost is ready, the end material will look almost like humus or good grade topsoil. The entire process can take anywhere from a few months to over a year depending on which method you choose to use. The finished product can then be used on your plants or lawn in place of chemical based fertilizers.

"We switched over to an independent board and there was the process of allowing that to happen and then transition, and immediately all of those efforts were stopped for at least four years," he said, referring to the recession. "Now we're per-

fectly poised, we reconstituted the independent CRA with folks who are very well known in their communities, we reconstituted and refilled our Neighborhood Action Committees. Now I think most of them are thriving."

No members of the public spoke during the hearing, which resulted in a final 3-2 vote, with Commissioners Fielding and Heard dissenting.



Spring holiday food, time for leg of lamb

When chefs think of food for the spring holidays, my all-time favorite is at the top of the list – spring lamb. Yes, I know about the tradition of decorating eggs, and the meaning of rebirth and new life, and, of course, there are the special breads and hot cross buns, but let me talk to you about the least popular and most misunderstood red meat in America -- roasted spring leg of lamb. I can hardly wait to start cooking!

Unfortunately, for years many consumers would buy imported lamb from New Zealand and Australia, overcook it, and then serve it with mint jelly to mask the taste. The flavor would be overpowering and the texture dry and chewy.

Lamb raised in the United States is grain-fed, giving the lamb a beefier flavor unlike the imported lamb that was grass-fed, which caused a more intense flavor. Today's lamb from New Zealand and Australia is grain-fed and has developed a more delicate taste. I still prefer the domestic lamb, but I will use the imported in a pinch with no problem.

Chefs are better trained in the cooking of lamb today, and it is seen more often on restaurant menus as well as lamb shanks, my second all-time favorite meat. Lamb is very healthy to eat. It is a great source of protein, essential vitamins and minerals. It has the correct ratio of all eight of the essential amino acids.

The meat has less marbling than other meats, which means most of the fat is on the outside edges. A 3-ounce portion of lamb leg has 74 mg of cholesterol compared to 70 mg in a skinless chicken breast. Calorie-wise, there are 162 in lamb to 159 in chicken.

Now here is what you all have been

waiting for, my personal all-time favorite recipe for Roasted Spring Lamb a la Costa.

ROASTED LEG OF LAMB

Ingredients

1 5-6 pound bone-in leg of lamb
1/4-cup olive oil
2 tablespoons chopped fresh garlic cloves (about 6 cloves)
1/3-cup balsamic vinegar
1/4-cup fresh squeezed lemon juice
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon black pepper
2 tablespoons leaf oregano
1 tablespoon fresh rosemary, chopped

Directions

In a small bowl, mix all the ingredients together except the lamb.

Make 8 or 9 small slices all over the lamb. Insert the mixture in the slices and rub the entire lamb with the remaining mixture.

Place in a roasting pan, fat side down. Add 1/2-cup water and 1/2-cup red wine. Roast at 375 degrees for 45 minutes to an hour or until a meat thermometer reads 135 degrees.

Florida Club re-opens to much fanfare

After months of delays, the moment finally came. On Saturday, March 11, Florida Club in Stuart re-opened for business. The course closed over 10 months ago for a complete overhaul and refurbishment and locals have been chomping at the bit to stick a tee in the ground and play the course.

Based on the response from the golfers I spoke with as they played or finished their round, the wait may have been long, but it was well worth it.

"Beautiful, fun, so much better, I love it," were just a few of the accolades I heard. The tee sheet reflects it as well, as the course has been nearly full each day and the restaurant is also hopping.

The timing of the opening worked out well for those golfers wanting to keep up with the NCAA Basketball Championship Tournament. As players finished their rounds or before they started, the televisions were tuned to the games. The restaurant had a good crowd enjoying cold beverages and excellent food.

"We are thrilled with the feedback we have been receiving," said head professional Brendan Murphy. "I am very proud of my staff and the professional service we are providing."

Soon, it was my turn to play the course for the first time in a couple of years. My best friend and colleague, Dan Shube, joined me.

The first thing we noticed was how much more room there is off all over the course. Where there used to be palmettos and other scrub pinching the fairways, or intimidat-

ing your approach, there is now groomed rough now and chipping areas. The new rough is also a lot easier to play from and the ball doesn't seem to settle down like it does in Bermuda grass. There is no shortage of bunkers, as I found one on seven of my first nine holes.

Nowhere on the course is there a better example of how open the course has become than at the par-4 12th. This long, severe dogleg right begs you to take a short-cut over the waste area and wetland down the right side. If you bite enough off, you are rewarded with a shorter approach from a better angle. In the past, there were several tall pines to navigate around, as well as a lot of scrub. It was difficult to see the fairway across and the tee shot could be quite intimidating. These have all been removed and the view allows you to pick your line much more easily.

Today, with golf balls that go a long way and clubs that assist that, the best way to defend a course that you cannot add a lot of length to is to make putting and chipping a challenge.

The greens at Florida Club are larger and feature more undulation. A lot more undulation. We had some putts and chips that broke as much to the left or right as they had to travel to get to the hole. I think

we may have found where Jimmy Hoffa's car was buried.

The par-4 16th hole has seen the most change. What used to be a short, straight-away hole, now features a green moved well to the right and guarded by water on three sides. Here you can hit anything from a hybrid to a driver and have about the same distance on your approach, just from a different angle.

The finishing hole remains one of the best in the area. The par-4 requires a well-placed tee shot to allow you the opportunity to hit a middle iron over the wetland, to the green. The cluster of pines that used to deter aiming safely left are gone. I like this as it allows golfers who cannot reach the green the chance to still go over the wetland at a shorter point and go to the green from there.

Florida Club's maintenance staff also hit the jackpot with new mowers, tractors and other equipment. Murphy, who was previously at the Breakers in Palm Beach, knows what it takes to have a great golf course. He also knows that it takes a professional staff to keep it that way.

I truly enjoyed my round here and you should make a point of getting your name on the tee sheet as well. Visit www.floridaclub.com or call (772) 287-3680 to set up your round.
