Martin County benefits from water-quality project

MARTIN COUNTY – A new water-quality project is up-and-running and helping the environment every day. The St. Lucie Shores Water Quality Project opened in early April, and Martin County officials say it's going to provide a big boost to thwart the effects of nitrogen and phosphorous in the Indian River Lagoon and elsewhere.

The project is one of more than 30 within the county, and they are designed to treat stormwater runoff before it enters the IRL and St. Lucie River Estuary. It is located on the "All American Ditch Watershed" –near Mapp Road in Palm City – and

St. Lucie Shores could reduce pollution about 40 percent in the case of nitrogen and a 70-percent reduction in phosphorous.

Also, it is located on what was one of the most-polluted waterways on the Treasure Coast. It took about two years to build from start to finish and came in at a total price tag of roughly \$5.2M. The treatment process takes about 54 days.

"The project serves a 268-acre watershed, and the majority of the land was first platted in the 1920s," said Greg Nolte, Martin County's senior project engineer for the Ecosystems Management Division of the Public Works Department.

County shuts out Harmony Ranch

County Commission rejects massive project west of Hobe Sound

STUART — The Martin County Commission shut the door April 24 on a developer's request to amend the Comprehensive Growth Management Plan to extend municipal water and sewer services to a massive development proposed near the intersection of Southeast Bridge Road and Pratt Whitney Road.

The developer of the 2,600-acre Harmony Ranch project, Thomas Kenny III, wanted Martin County to ask the state to approve an amendment to the Comprehensive Plan extending both the Primary and Secondary Urban Service Districts to incorporate the property in order to provide county utilities to the homes. The Local Planning Agency had previously recommended denial of the amendment March 14. Samantha Lovelady, a principal planner with the Growth Management Department, read from a definition of urban sprawl incorporated into the Comp Plan before also recommending denial of the project.

"The proposed expansion of the primary urban service district covers 788 acres, and the proposed expansion of the secondary urban service district covers 1,111 acres," she said. "Urban sprawl is defined as a development pattern requiring the extension of public facilities and services in an inefficient manner and failing to provide a clear separation between urban and rural uses. Although the Harmony Ranch property is close to the Martin County Utility Plant, the development pattern proposed cannot be considered an efficient expansion of public facilities."

Clyde Dulin, Martin County's comprehensive planning and site compliance administrator, concurred with that assessment.

Community notes

School immunizations available for uninsured, underinsured children

As the school year will soon be coming to an end, the Florida Department of Health in Martin County is encouraging parents to begin planning now to ensure that their student's immunizations are up to date prior to the start of the next school year in August.

#680 Forms: Proof of certain immunizations, on a #680 form (Florida Certificate of Immunization), is required for school entry if a child is entering kindergarten, seventh grade or is moving to Florida from another state or country. Additional information about immunizations is available here: <http://martin.floridahealth.gov/programs-and-services/clinical-and-nutrition-services/immunizations/index.html>

7th grade Tdap requirement: Students who are entering the seventh grade are required to show proof of the Tdap booster vaccine, which provides protection against tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis, on the #680 form. If students have already received the Tdap booster, parents should deliver the #680 form to their child's school before Monday, Aug. 13.

Vaccination appointments: To avoid the back to school rush, parents should contact their child's pediatrician now to schedule an immunization appointment.

The Health Department in Martin County is offering school age immunizations for

children who are uninsured or underinsured. Call (772) 221-4000, ext. 2242, to schedule an appointment.

drain the land as quickly as possible and get stormwater runoff to the river, but with that came the pollutants. To combat that problem, this project will run the water through filters and then will be discharged to the river at a more normal rate of speed.

The project was built with the help of about \$3M in grants from the State of Florida and the other \$2.2M came from local funding. As part of that grant fund-

ing, Public Works will monitor the project over the next year to see if it removes the targeted 350 pounds of nitrogen and 170 pounds of phosphorus.

"We will see at the end of the year how the project performs," Mr. Nolte said. "What the project does is provide storage and it provides 51 acre-feet of volume of water-quality treatment and a residence time of 54 days."

Flood insurance rates to decrease in Martin County

Local lenders, insurance and real estate agencies were notified that the premium cost of flood insurance for the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) policies issued or renewed in Special Flood Hazard Areas on or after May 1, 2018 will be given an additional 5 percent discount, for a total discount of 20 percent.

"The discount confirms the county continues to implement activities which go above and beyond the minimum flood protection standards," said Lisa Wichser, County Engineer/ Flood Plain Administrator. As a result of the county's efforts, the floodplain management activities implemented by our community qualify Martin County as a Class 6 in the NFIP Community Rating System (CSR).

Martin County provides digital copies of the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) at www.martin.fl.us/Flood.



New apprentice program coming to IRSC

TREASURE COAST - Local manufacturers are about to get a big boost of potential employees. A local manufacturing apprenticeship program, the first of its kind in Florida, will allow 30 locals to learn a skilled trade while earning a living.

The program is a "dynamic, fast-track comprehensive manufacturing apprenticeship program," a press release stated, "and it is a combination of paid on-the-job learning and related classroom instruction that is sponsored by the Treasure Coast Manufacturers Association (TCMA) and funded by CareerSource Research Coast through a Sector Strategies Grant from CareerSource Florida.

The 30 men and women will participate in an 18-month, 3,000-hour "earn-while-you-learn" program, making at least \$11 at the start of the program and - with wage increases every six months - and can earn up to \$18 per hour at the completion of the program.

"The majority of the training takes place on the job itself, and the classroom is two nights a week," said Marcelo Dossantos, vice president of strategic development for CareerSource Research Coast. "The beauty of it is that it can go across multiple industries, so you can be a marine manufacturer, aircraft manufacturer or a general manufacturer and that's why we put it into this format."

"We have six participating employers now and are looking for more," said Susan Haggard, sector strategy coordinator for CareerSource Research Coast. "They all seem pretty excited about it, and they are just trying to retain the skilled workers that they have and some desperately need more because a lot of these young adults will leave town looking for work when there are great manufacturers here and they don't have to."

The apprentices will be selected by the TCMA Apprenticeship Committee. Once approved, apprentices begin their on-the-job learning immediately through employment with local manufacturers. Evening classes will start this summer through the Indian River State College's Corporate and

Community Training Institute (CCTI).

"Our members are excited that our organization, just 18 short months after its founding, is part of this first-in-the-state breakthrough opportunity," said TCMA President Jerry Jacques in a press release. "And, we are grateful for the commitment and dedication of everyone at CareerSource Research Coast, the EDC and IRSC who helped make the apprenticeship program happen."

"The manufacturers we have participating in this program are among the best in our region," added Pete Tesch, president of the Economic Development Council of St. Lucie County (EDC). "This is an unmatched opportunity for our manufacturers and for the apprentices."

It also has the potential of offering not just a job to candidates, but a career instead.

"Not everybody goes to college, and that's one thing we've struggling with," Mr. Dossantos said. "So every year, we have hundreds of kids graduate from high school and we don't know where they're landing ... and this is going to be us getting out there to these folks and saying, 'Look, here's a career

path, where you can earn a sufficient wage and pay a mortgage and feed your family and have that to strive for."

As part of the program, apprentices will earn a national, industry-recognized credential: the Industrial Manufacturing Technician (IMT) and the Manufacturers Skills Standards Council (MSSC) Certified Production Technician (CPT) certification. Among the skills that will be taught in the program are how to set up, operate, monitor and control production equipment, improve manufacturing processes and understand the business of manufacturing.

Organizations combine to host 'dog wash' event

MARTIN COUNTY – Pet pampering will be the order of the day at the Palm City Animal Medical Center Dog Wash, which will be hosted by Palm City Animal Medical Center and the Humane Society of the Treasure Coast. The event will be on Saturday, May 5 from 1 to 3 p.m. at the medical center, located at 3090 S.W. Mapp Road, Palm City.

The medical center's doctors and staff – along with Humane Society of the Treasure Coast volunteers – will be bathing dogs for a small donation. HSTC staff and shelter pets for mobile adoptions will be on site the day of the event. Tours of the medical center will be available, too.

It will truly be a "dog's day," and the services will be performed for a minimum donation of \$10. All proceeds will benefit the HSTC, and it is one of the biggest and most popular fundraisers of the year for the HSTC after more than 10 years of existence. It was started because the first week of May is National Pet Week.

"It's gone well, and we usually raise \$2,000 or so for the Humane Society," said Rex Sentell, owner and veterinarian at PCAMC. "Ever since I moved to town in the early 80s, I've tried to work with them, and we do free work for them and discounted work for them. We've got a pretty good relationship."

Dr. Sentell added that his staff performs

free radiographs for the Humane Society, and they bring in more than 250 animals per year for x-rays. They also treat animals in other ways for the HSTC.

"It's grown into a tremendous success, and the staff Dr. Rex Sentell are huge supporters of ours and do a lot of good for our organization," said Courtney Zanetti, director of community outreach at the HSTC. "It's just a good opportunity for us to raise money for our organization and for them to get the word out for all the work they do at Palm City Animal Medical Center."

"The amendment does not discourage the proliferation of urban sprawl under four of eight criteria found in Florida statutes," he said.

Mr. Kenny unsuccessfully playing the environmental card of sanitary sewer services in an attempt to persuade the Commission to give his proposal a chance at the state level.

"We are here to ask that the portion of our property designated as Secondary Urban Service District be allowed water and sewer service," he said. "It doesn't make any sense to most of us to encourage or require septic tanks when you have a property that can be --and should be -- serviced by central sewer and water. This is not a project approval; this is a transmittal approval. A transmittal does not vest any right to a future approval."

His words also failed to sway the more than three dozen members of the public

signed up to speak out against the proposal. Jupiter Island Commissioner Peter Conze warned those in attendance that county residents could end up bearing the cost of providing essential services to the proposed subdivision. The land is currently zoned for 20-acre ranchettes, but Mr. Kenny proposed a mix of two-acre and five-acre homesites, along with residential estate density allowing two units per acre.

"The proposed amendments would establish a dangerous precedent and create a domino effect by opening up land between U.S. 1 and I-95, which now has very low density," Mr. Conze said. "Consequently the fiscal impact on Martin County taxpayers is potentially enormous."

Martin County resident Carly Batts reminded commissioners that the county had previously purchased adjacent lands to set aside for the Indian River Lagoon South segment of the Everglades restoration project and asked them to carefully weigh their decision.

"By expanding the urban service boundary and changing the future land use on

these remaining parcels, we may not know what effects it will have until it's too late," she said. "As county commissioners, you have the opportunity to protect the land, not once, but twice."

Thomas Hawkins, the policy and planning director for 1000 Friends of Florida, made the trek down from Tallahassee for the meeting and lauded the efforts of county staff to properly analyze the proposed amendment, which he believed failed to address key concerns.

"It does not address issues like conserving open space, conserving agriculture, conserving water or building a community that incorporates non-residential uses so folks can walk to nearby shops," he said. "Simply put, this application doesn't have those kind of commitments to future high quality development in Martin County that you would want from a change that's as substantial as this."

Unlike most controversial development requests in Martin County, none of the commissioners opined on the issue before voting unanimously to deny the request.

With gas prices rising, some tips to save money

TREASURE COAST — If you pay attention to gas prices, you've noticed them creeping up all across the Treasure Coast. From Sebastian to Stuart, gas prices are higher than they were at this time last month and last year.

According to GasBuddy.com, which provides crowd-sourced details on prices at over 135,000 gas stations, gas prices have reached their highest prices since at least 2015. Just in April, prices surpassed recent highs three times.

On April 12, GasBuddy reported a national average of \$2.68 per gallon for regular gas, which it said was the highest since July 2015. By April 23, the average had risen to \$2.76. On April 29 it had shot up to \$2.808.

"Gas price increases gripped 49 of the nation's 50 states again last week as oil prices continued their upward move to new multi-year highs," said Patrick DeHaan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy. "In addition, government data highlighted a new record for gasoline demand was breached last week, and we're not even into the summer driving season yet. The road ahead at the pump looks quite ominous if that demand number proves common in the coming weeks."

In Stuart, the lowest prices were \$2.72 at RaceTrac, 1755 NW Federal Hwy. and 16th Place, \$2.72 at Mobil, 5275 SE Federal Hwy. near Salerno Road, \$2.72 at Speedway, 3201 SE Federal Hwy. and Indian St., \$2.72 at Speedway, 100 SW Monterey Road and S. Kanner Hwy., and \$2.72 at Shell, 5750 SE Federal Hwy. and Cove Road.

In Vero Beach, the lowest prices for regular gas as of April 29 were \$2.59 at The Beverage Stop, 310 27th Ave. SW, \$2.64 at 7-Eleven, 210 Highland Dr. SW & 2089 Old Dixie Hwy. SW, \$2.67 at RaceWay, 9490 108th Ave. and Fellsmere Road, \$2.68 at Sam's Club, 5565 20th St., and \$2.69 at Mobil, 3365 Aviation Blvd.

In Sebastian, the lowest prices for regular gas were \$2.65 at Mobil, 9490 90th Ave. and CR-512, \$2.67 at BP, 10950 CR-512 and I-95, \$2.69 at Sunoco, 9020 Fellsmere Road & Watervliet Ave., \$2.69 at Cumberland Farms, 957 Sebastian Blvd. and Barber St., and \$2.69 at Speedway, 700 US-1 & CR-512 (eastbound).

In Fort Pierce, the lowest prices were \$2.64 at Mobil, 2200 S US-1 and Virginia Ave., \$2.64 at Speedway, 3045 S US-1 and Emil Road, \$2.65 at BP, 1203 South US-1 near Park Way, \$2.65 at Sunoco, 3110 S. US-1 & Edwards Road, and \$2.65 at Chevron, 511 S US-1 and Delaware Ave.

In Port St. Lucie, the lowest prices were \$2.61 at Sam's Club, 1754 SW Gatlin Blvd., \$2.64 at 7-Eleven, 1650 SW St. Lucie West Blvd. and California Blvd., \$2.64 at Speedway, 149 NW Bayshore Blvd. and Prima Vista Blvd., \$2.64 at Shell, 701 N. Airoso Blvd. near St James Dr., and \$2.64 at Walmart, 902 SW St. Lucie W. Blvd. and Wakulla River Trail.

Across all of Florida, the average on April 29 was \$2.719, compared to \$2.629 one month ago and \$2.412 one year ago. The lowest price reported in the state was \$2.34 at a Shell in Deerfield Beach. The highest price in the state was \$3.97 at a Chevron in North Miami Beach.

Across the U.S., the average April 29 was \$2.808, compared to \$2.658 one month ago and \$2.386 one year ago. The lowest average

prices in the U.S. are \$2.491 in Oklahoma and \$2.496 in Louisiana. The highest average prices are \$3.593 in California and \$3.564 in Hawaii.

"All signs point to some additional upward movement before prices peak and perhaps drop slightly around Memorial Day into the month of June," said Mr. DeHaan.

GasBuddy says the sudden surge can be blamed on oil prices rising to nearly \$67 per barrel, the highest level since 2014, on fears of military action in Syria and trade conflict with China. U.S. oil inventories also stand 20 percent lower than a year ago, the result of higher crude oil exports and OPEC's agreement to cut oil production, now in its 15th month.

"Higher oil prices have enticed U.S. producers to ramp up crude oil exports, effectively draining U.S. oil inventories at a higher pace than that oil is being replaced," said Mr. DeHaan.

Fuel Saving Tips

GasBuddy offers the following tips to save fuel. These tips closely mirror those of AAA and others.

1. Avoid high speeds. Increasing speed increases aerodynamic drag exponentially, dramatically increasing fuel consumption.

2. Avoid frequent accelerations and hard braking. Simply trying to maintain a consistent flow can increase fuel economy by 20 percent.

3. Keep tires properly inflated. One tire underinflated by two PSI can increase fuel consumption by one percent. Pay attention to manufacturer recommendations for air pressure and check them regularly.

4. Use air conditioning as little as practical. The air conditioner can increase fuel consumption by 20 percent.

5. Keep windows closed, but choose open windows over A/C when you need one or the other. Open windows at highway speeds can increase fuel consumption by 10 percent. That's 50 percent better than A/C, but still a loss.

6. Service vehicle regularly. Fuel efficiency gets worse if you have dirty air filters, old spark plugs or low fluid levels.

7. Use cruise control to maintain a constant speed. But avoid the temptation to move your legs away from the peddles or divert your gaze from the road, as you must remain prepared to respond to any situation.

8. Avoid heavy loads. Those bags of kitty litter or top soil or extra cases of water in the trunk will cost you more in fuel than you saved by buying them in bulk. Empty heavy items from your car as soon as you can.

9. Avoid long idles. It's often hard to anticipate how long you'll be waiting for someone outside a school or store, but the general rule is that if you will be stopped in place for more than one minute, you'll save gas by turning the car off and then restarting it.

10. Purchase a fuel efficient vehicle. People buy more vehicles when gas prices are low, and then they ignore fuel and go for a big truck or SUV. Think ahead and chose the smallest vehicle that will suit your needs, with the best rated fuel efficiency you can afford. Choosing a manual transmission will often save you extra money, though that's not for everyone.

Finally, use a smartphone app to help you find the least expensive gas wherever you are. GasBuddy is a free and easy app, but you can find others that work just as well.

Boys & Girls Clubs prepare for summer programs

MARTIN COUNTY – The Boys & Girls Clubs of Martin County's Palm City Club serves more than 300 youths and teens annually. Recently, the club director worked with members of the Palm City Torch Club – a leadership service club for teens – to identify community needs and the ways in which the club can help.

After visiting several local businesses, speaking to their employees and managers – as well as talking to the local middle school assistant principal – it was discovered that many middle school-aged kids are hanging out at local businesses after school such as Anna's Pizza, Starbucks and McDonald's. Due to customer complaints, these teens are regularly asked to leave. As a result, they are starting to hang out in business parking lots – riding bikes and skateboards – putting themselves and others in a potentially dangerous situation.

For only \$35 per year (a \$2,500 value), the MCBGC after-school enrichment program provides youth in Palm City with a fun, safe, and educational place to go after school and during the summer. Annually, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Martin County serves 3,000 youth ages 6 to 18 in 5 clubs in Hobe Sound, Indiantown, Palm City, Port Salerno and Stuart. In addition, they operate two extension sites in Jensen Beach High School and Stuart Middle School. Daily, they transport youths from school to the club, where they are provided a snack and nutritious meal, as well as high-quality programming in the areas of academic success, good character and citizenship and healthy lifestyles.

This year, the Palm City Club is re-invigorating its teen program in order to attract and better meet the needs of the youth in our community who need us most – middle school-age kids. These are the kids who are hanging out in parking lots after school, engaging in risky behaviors. In fact, the club has an asset that most clubs in the county lack – a "teen house" that is intended to be converted into a teen center so that they can provide middle and high school kids with fun, educational, and enriching activities and programs like art, robotics, STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math), music, and tutoring. In addition, teens will receive mentoring and programming in the areas of academic success, good character and citizenship and healthy lifestyles with a focus on art and culture.

Currently, the Teen House – a 900 sq. foot building on our Palm City Club property – is vacant and in disrepair. In order to make the Teen House operational, funding is needed so that staff can make the building a safe, functional and inviting place for teens to go after school. In addition, equipment and supplies are needed so that there will be a

fun, educational and enriching after-school experience for teens.

The vision for the Teen House is to create a dance/drama/music studio in one room which will serve multiple functions. With hardwood floors, a mirrored wall, and ballet bar, teens will be able to dance, play music and perform skits, facilitated by youth development professionals and community volunteers. In addition, the Teen House will feature a lounge with high-top tables, computers, and gaming chairs where youths can participate in the art and culture programs listed below, as well as hang out, study, complete homework, play video games, listen to music and complete art projects. Art and culture programming will include a mix of the following BGCA programs:


Drama Matters is designed to promote the club member's love of drama, while increasing their appreciation of this art form, building self-confidence, inspiring creativity and increasing academic achievement.

Music Makers is a music education program designed to promote young people's natural love of music and to increase their appreciation for music; building skills so that they can express themselves using musical instruments, as well as developing critical thinking, self-discipline, self-esteem, self-confidence and teamwork.

The National Photography Program is designed to help members go beyond snapshots and develop skills to take photographs that can truly impact the viewer. The goal is to enable youth to develop their creativity and cultural awareness through the appreciation of photography. The program provides teens the opportunity to express themselves creatively, build confidence, learn new skills and showcase the artwork of club members to the community.

MyFuture engages youth in productive after school activities, developing important 21st Century skills. Supported by Comcast NBCUniversal, MyFuture has a powerful digital presence. It is a safe, fun, mobile-friendly social platform with access to over 100 BGCA program activities in areas like STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math), leadership and visual arts including programs like: Lyricism 101 (hip-hop, musical collaboration, and performance) and Media Making (photography, audio production, video production, and design).

The goal is to raise \$6,000. This will cover rehabilitation on the Teen House so that it is aesthetically attractive, safe and functional. In addition, they will be able to purchase needed equipment and supplies including computers, tables/chairs, photography/ videography equipment and software, art supplies, drama accessories, instruments/music equipment, games, shelving, tablets, speakers, couches, gaming chairs and a television.

New owners at St. Lucie Trail

For a few years now the PGA of America has had the "For Sale" sign out at St. Lucie Trail Golf Club, in St. Lucie West. The organization purchased the club more than two decades ago when it opened the PGA Village just on the other side of I-95.

When it first opened in the late 1980s the course was the jewel of St. Lucie County. Over the years it has gone through every step of being cared for from neglect to pampering. One thing the course never lost was its variety. The course remains a lot of fun to play with a solid mix of holes that challenge you to hit every club in your bag.

The new owner is CGI St. Lucie, the same group that owns The Evergreen Club in Palm City. Having played Evergreen and witnessed the great conditions that course is always in, I am quite excited for St. Lucie Trail. Apparently the community is as well, with over 100 new members joining just in the few weeks since the course sold.

"We're excited to be here," said General Manager, Matt Boyd. "We love the layout and the design. We will do everything we can to promote golf here."

The new owners plan to address some of the drainage issues the course experiences when those summer thunderstorms move through. They are also listening to the community to see what the members and customers want.

"If the course was paid a little more attention (by the previous owner), everyone would have been thrilled," said Boyd. "We are giving it that attention."

A benefit of purchasing the course at this time of year is that business tends to be a little slow. This gives the new owners a chance to address the issues and get the course primed and ready for "season."

One thing the membership was missing was the country club atmosphere. The club has a beautiful clubhouse that wasn't being used to its potential. The dining room saw over 200 people show up for a dinner shortly after the purchase. The pool and tennis courts were also included in the purchase and the green clay courts may be the best-kept secret in the area. However, CGI purchased the club because it loves the golf course.

The course has five sets of tees and plays anywhere from just over 5,000 yards long to just over 6,900. The par-4 third hole, at 458 yards from the tips, may just be the longest par-4 in the area.

In the 2013 the PGA of America renovated the club. Dick Gray was brought in to focus on getting the course up to its tough standards. The focus was on the playable areas. Getting the course cleaned up and looking good from tee to green was first and foremost. It took a while, but the greens were rebuilt and re-grassed. With a few years of growth in them now, they are about perfect.

One recent trend in course renovation is where the areas around the perimeter of the holes are cleaned up and thinned out. Not having thick clumps of palmettos to gobble up slightly errant shots serves a trio of purposes. First, it speeds up play and, second, it makes for a less frustrating round for the average golfer. Thirdly, it creates more airflow across the fairways and greens and allows the course to

breathe.

If you played here years ago, you will surely remember the palmettos that gobbled up almost every wayward shot. Most of these are gone or well-trimmed. Fairways are wider, and the greens a bit larger. The tall grasses in the wetlands have been cut to a proper height.

Now to see what other improvements CGI makes over the coming months. I have a feeling this club is back and ready to re-take its place as a jewel on the Treasure Coast.

Service your car might be just as scary as it was buying it. However, buying a car is something you only do every few years. During the time between buying cars you will bring it in for service maybe a dozen times (and that doesn't even count repairs).

Car dealers make more money servicing your car than they do selling you one. The more service they sell you, the more money they make. Today's automobiles are of far better quality than they used to be and are much less likely to need repairs. Increasingly, basic maintenance is all you really need to do for your car. Also, many manufacturers are providing free maintenance for the first two or three years. This new dynamic is a threat to the car dealers' most profitable departments...service and parts. Many car dealers are compensating for this by selling you more service than you really need.

Did you know that virtually every employee in a service department gets a percentage of the total amount of service he sells? The guy that writes up your service order when you drive in is on commission. They are service "salesmen" but they don't like to be called that. Their title is usually "service advisor" or "assistant service manager". The mechanic that fixes your car is on commis-

sion. The service manager that supervises the mechanic and the service salesman is paid on commission. The dealer and service manager expect the service salesman to "up-sell" you. This is typically accomplished with a "free inspection" purportedly to find maintenance and repairs that you "didn't know you needed" and was probably not mentioned in your owner's manual. After the service salesman sells you as much service as he can, the mechanic's role is to find anything that needs to be fixed on the car that the service salesman or you were unaware of. He then calls the service salesman and tells him about the additional repairs you "need" ...the second "up-sell". I recommend that you stick to what your car's manufacturer recommends for maintenance in your owner's manual. When your service salesman tells you what he recommends, be sure that the manufacturer recommends it too. There are some exceptions to this, based on certain local environmental conditions, but very few. Always question any service not recommended by your owner's manual. When a repair is recommended that you were unaware of, get a second opinion from another service department, especially if it's an expensive repair. Be especially leery of transmission and radiator flushes. They're

not recommended by auto manufacturers but very popular with car dealer service departments; their high-priced and unnecessary.

Now, don't get me wrong; just because people are paid on commission doesn't make them dishonest or uncaring. However, if there's a "rotten apple in the barrel" he will take advantage of a commissioned pay plan to maximize his earnings. There are very few companies with zero "rotten apples". A good company does its best to ferret out the rotten apples but it's a constant battle. In fact, there are companies that have more rotten apples than not. When you have a department or company where everybody is on commission, it takes an awfully altruistic manager to fire a top-producer because his paycheck enhanced by that individual. The more his "rotten apple" sells the more money the supervisor earns. This applies also to the "supervisor's supervisor, all the way up to the guy that owns the company. The higher up the ladder you go, the harder it is to identify these more passive, unseen rotten apples that "aid and abet" the front-line apples. The head guy usually has what many CEO's insist on...DENIABILITY. You hear a lot about that in government scandals. The press always wants to know, "Who knew what and when did they know it?" Everybody remembers Watergate where the rotten apples extended from the bottom of the barrel all the way to the top. It took Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein over several years to follow the tracks all the way to the top of the barrel.

Often, there are people in all companies

that are honest and caring for their customers. The point of this article is that you're better served to look for that good person than only a good company. There is no surefire way to do this, but I can suggest a few methods. Clearly, you're more likely to find a good service salesman in a company that has a good reputation. You find good companies by personal experience, recommendations by friends, and ratings by various services like Google (most reliable), Yelp, Dealer Rater, and BBB. If you read the reviews, often the individuals are mentioned. If you've dealt with this company before, others in that company, like the salesman sold you the car, can refer you to a particularly good service salesman. All manufacturers measure the customer satisfaction index of every service salesman. Insist on seeing these scores and find out how the service salesman ranks among his peers, both in the company and the entire region. Finally, always make an appointment to see that service salesman you've chosen. If he's on vacation or not available for other reasons, wait for your service until he can see you.

Finally, when you find yourself a "good apple" for a service advisor, don't keep it a secret. Tell your friends and tell the service manager and the owner of the dealership. When you do this, you're doing your friends, the service advisor, the service manager, and the owner a great favor. You're also spreading the word that treating customers with honesty and compassion is good for business.
