## County approves 24 new fire-rescue personnel

**Fire chief says department struggles to meet minimum fire-rescue times with current staffing**

STUART -- The Martin County Commission voted 4-1 May 22 to approve a Fire Rescue Department request to begin hiring 24 new employees in order to maintain minimum response times mandated by the county's Comprehensive Growth Management Plan.

Martin County Fire Chief Bill Schobel described the need for additional fire-rescue workers as critical due to rising call volumes, particularly in the outlying regions of the county where his forces are stretched thin.

"We're having a rough time keeping up with that call volume," he said. "The isolated areas in the county -- County Line Road Station, Stuart Beach Station -- are very challenging to get to in an expeditious manner. We're not meeting the level of service that's laid out for ALS [advanced life support] with eight minutes. We're falling short."

Commissioner Ed Fielding wanted to ensure the chief had investigated alternate methods of meeting minimum ser-

# More than 100 high school diplomas presented at IRSC ceremony

TREASURE COAST - More than 100 Indian River State College High School and GED Preparation graduates participated in the Adult Secondary Education Graduation Ceremony on Thursday, May 24, in the McAlpin Fine Arts Center at the IRSC Main Campus, 3209 Virginia Avenue, in Fort Pierce. Commencement speaker Dr. Alfred Williams, Associate Professor and Department Chair of Fire Science, addressed the graduates with inspirational remarks about their educational journey and career paths.

Many of these graduates will continue their education in one of IRSC's certificate or degree programs. Dr. Kelly Amatucci, Assistant Dean of the School of Education, explains, "Students enrolled in IRSC Adult Education program shave the opportunity to simultaneously begin their career while completing their high school credential. Ongoing support is provided through mentoring and career inventories. Financial support is also available for students in need who would like to register for college courses."

Students in the IRSC High School program earn high school credits in traditional and online courses, while students in the GED Preparation program progress at their own pace to review high school subjects prior to taking the GED exam.

The IRSC High School and GED Preparation programs award thousands of dollars per year in scholarships through the IRSC Foundation Inc., and this year, 33 students received scholarships totaling \$35,000.

Kendy Campusano received the Ann Polk Memorial Scholarship, which is awarded to a student majoring in education, early childhood education or nursing. Campusano has earned an Associate in Arts degree from IRSC and is in the process of applying for the registered nursing program at IRSC.

Along with the 33 students who received scholarships, 13 members of the Class of 2018 were inducted into the National Adult Education Honor Society. Raheem Brown, Treasa Cornwell, Megan Crews, Jonathan Crofford, Devin Ferguson, Vianet Dominguez Gonzalez, Barbara Gaal, Benjamin Hanner, Liliana Martinez De Colon, Noah Pulido, Gloria Salazar, Rita Salazar and Kurt Wagner were selected by faculty for outstanding cooperation, attendance, perseverance and self-reliance in the GED Preparation Program.



# Check engine light shining?

Imagine for a minute that you and your family are on the expressway on a Sunday afternoon, driving to your favorite vacation spot. All of a sudden, your red check-engine light comes on! What are you supposed to do? You are hundreds of miles away from home and it is very unlikely that you will find dealers' service departments for your make of car open on Sunday. Should you keep on driving? Your only alternative under these conditions is to try and find a motel for the night and find a dealer the next morning.

Unfortunately, the answer is that you should not continue to drive the vehicle any further than you absolutely have to. The problem that caused the check engine light could be any one of hundreds. Potentially, it could be a very serious problem that could be made more serious (and more expensive) by driving the car. It could also be something so inconsequential as you failed to twist the gas cap tightly enough the last time you filled the tank. I have never completely understood why car manufacturers don't enhance the warning system to differentiate between small problems that can wait and those that could be catastrophic. What a shame it would be to ruin a family's vacation because they failed to

screw down their gas cap tightly or some other minor problem that could have waited weeks to address! My guess is that the reason manufacturers do not enhance their check engine light computer system is simply because of the increased cost. I'll bet that the cost of a motel overnight would be a lot more than the manufacturer would have had to spend to make the stay unnecessary.

The vast majority of the time the check engine light comes on, it is not serious enough to rush to your dealer. The problem is that you can't say for sure if this is one of those times. In fact, the service advisors in many dealerships are so used to check engine lights coming on for minor problems like loose gas caps that they often mistakenly advise customers not to worry about it and to bring the car in "when you get a chance". This works 90 percent of the time, but that 10 percent when it is serious can be very expensive. In fact, if the car is under warranty and you continue to drive the car when the check engine light comes on, you could void your warranty. If your check engine light comes on, pull over to a safe place and check to be sure your gas cap is screwed on tightly. That is the problem more than half of the time. If that doesn't

make the light go out, bring the car to your dealer ASAP.

The dealer has a diagnostic machine, called a "scan tool" which deciphers the trouble codes stored in your car's computer. This code doesn't necessarily tell the technician exactly what the problem is. Usually it just indicates an "area of concern". He must do further diagnostic tests to determine the exact problem. Often there are more than one problem and symptom. Sometimes a problem will cause the check engine light to go on and then the problem "goes away". If the problem does not reoccur during a certain number of times that you start the engine, the trouble code is removed from memory. Most of the reasons your check engine light will come on are environmentally related. If our cars did not have to meet such tight emission standards, you would practically never have a check engine light go on. This is one of the prices we are paying for clean air. All too often, the check engine light will come back on right after you have had your car worked on for that very reason. Many people immediately assume that the dealer did not fix the car right the first time and charged them for work that wasn't necessary. This can be the case if the dealer's technician was careless or wasn't properly trained. But, not infrequently, the technician can do everything right and the



light still comes back on after the repair is made. This is because there are often multiple problems that contribute to the symptom causing the check engine light to go on. Or, there could be a completely new problem unrelated to the first. Remember that there are hundreds of reasons that this one red light can come on. It takes a very well trained, conscientious technician to come up with the right fix. The best thing you can do is to choose the dealer to whom you trust your car with great care. Check with the Better Business Bureau, County Office of Consumer Affairs, and the State Attorney General's office on the track record of the service department you choose. Ask friends and neighbors who drive your make of car where they have their car serviced how satisfied they are.

# Community notes

## Bacteria levels advisory in effect

An advisory is now in effect for the waters near Sandsprit Park, Leighton Park and the Stuart Sandbar. Results from samples taken on Thursday show higher than normal levels of enteric bacteria. The Roosevelt Bridge has been under advisory since May 25.

Enteric bacteria inhabit the intestinal tract of humans and animals and their presence in recreational waters is an indication of fecal pollution. The presence of these bacteria may come from storm water runoff, pets, wildlife and human sewage.

Potential health risks for those who ingest or come in contact with the water include upset stomach, diarrhea, eye irritation and skin rashes.

The advisory will remain in effect until results show consistent readings in the good range. The areas will be tested again on Monday, June 4.

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection has been notified of the rise in bacteria levels for review and follow-up.

The Florida Department of Health in Martin County conducts weekly water sampling at four sites along the St. Lucie River including the Roosevelt Bridge, Sandsprit Park, Leighton Park and the Stuart Sandbar.

Martin County beach sites are sampled every other week.

vice times rather than simply adding additional employees per vehicle, such as sending an ambulance instead of a fire truck to less dire emergencies. Even though the Department would initially pay for the new hires with Staffing For Adequate Fire & Rescue federal grant funding, he worried about the financial impact to the county once the funding ended in three years.

“So now we’re going to have three [staff per vehicle], and why don’t we have five? I’ll say that because I don’t know... actually what’s going to happen in a few years when the full brunt of what we’re doing will hit us.”

Chief Schobel explained that he had already added an ambulance to the Kanner Highway station to better serve the increasing 911 calls in the northern part of the county but wanted to avoid the mistakes made by other departments of prioritizing emergency calls due to short staffing.

“When we look at putting paramedics in the dispatch center to prioritize, you still end up with call stacking, and that exposes the county to great liability,” he said. “They can’t reach out and diagnose that person on

the other end, so the best thing to do is to get a unit there as quickly as possible, even if it is a fire engine with a paramedic on it, and to determine whether that ambulance is needed or not.”

By the end of the discussion, Commissioner Fielding had decided to support the request, while Commissioner Sarah Heard continued her opposition, casting the lone dissenting vote on the grant proposal. The latter compared the growth of the Fire-Rescue Department by 41 new staff since 2008 and the Sheriff’s Office reduction of 23 positions during the same time period.

“Now you’re proposing to add probably \$2.5 million a year with personnel costs plus capital equipment, plus new ambulances, so we absolutely cannot afford these kinds of increases,” she said. “We cannot add on, on top of the \$5.3 million that we’ve added on in the last 10 years, another \$2.5 million every year. You know that grant is real helpful for the first year, somewhat helpful the second year, and by the third year it’s on the backs of the taxpayers of Martin County again.”

For his part, Commission Chairman Ed Ciampi disputed Commissioner Heard’s comment that the county had too many “unmet needs” to dedicate so much funding to just one single department.

“The concept of comparing Sheriff’s deputies to Martin County Fire Rescue paramedics... I don’t see it being comparable at all,” he said. “They have a whole different model, their requirements are different and their training is different, I think that every reasonable thinking person would say that if you were going to allocate a limited amount of money, first and foremost it would go to benefit people in terms of lifesaving.”

Commissioner Doug Smith asked Fire Rescue Administrator Matt Resch about the effectiveness of the SAFER grant approved by the county several years ago to hire new employees to stem the multimillion-dollar tide of soaring overtime costs.

“For the three years leading up to the SAFER grant, we were averaging about \$2.75 million, not including personnel fringe benefits, which would bring it up to about \$3.5 million,” Mr. Resch responded. “There was a process to get the hiring in place, to get the EMTs [emergency medical technicians] trained to the medic levels, and we saw a decline to a low of \$179,000 in FY 12.”

Commissioner Smith then made the motion to accept staff recommendation to approve the latest Fire-Rescue Department grant request.

“Apparently we’ve run into another crunch time relative to our staffing and rela-

tive to the call load, and it’s time to catch up again,” he said. “I think the first grant was incredibly effective. I’m glad it’s still available, and I think it gives us an opportunity to catch up and get us to where we need to be.”

In response to further questioning by Chairman Ciampi about the Department’s true staffing needs, Chief Schobel admitted his request for 24 new employees was really “a stop-gap measure” and emphasized the need would be even greater if call volumes continue to rise as they have in recent years.

“Looking at call trends over the next three to five years and if we end up in that 35,000 call range and stay trending upward about 7 percent per year... you’re looking upwards of 70 [new] personnel by year five.”

Chairman Ciampi reminded his fellow commissioners that the earlier SAFER grant request was made in the height of the recession, while the latest request is being made during a much stronger economy.

“I agree with you chief, I think it’s reasonable and what I believe residents expect to be job number one,” he said. “As long as I’m sitting up here, I plan on pursuing the additional fire stations and the rebuilding of fire stations. If you need equipment and personnel, you can count on me to advocate strongly among my colleagues.”

# The pitfalls of wireless printing

**W**ireless printers seem to be all the rage these days and why not? The convenience of being able to place your printer anywhere in the room, even in another room altogether and still be able to print, makes them very appealing indeed. And with just about everyone equipped with a wireless router today, picking a printer that is WiFi enabled makes sense. To top it off, the technology has gotten so common that it can be hard to find a printer that is not wireless capable.

But what about the pitfalls? What are some of the “Gotchas!” that you need to keep in mind when considering a wireless printer?

On the surface wireless printing looks like a great idea but, like most things computer related, it comes with a price; in this case, the price is a combination of reliability and complexity.

I say reliability because wireless printers are notorious for dropping off line for no apparent reason. Usually right when something important needs to be printed, like an airline boarding pass or court document, you go to print and... nothing. Worked fine yesterday but today, not so much.

Now I know that some of you are reading this and thinking “what? I’ve been using a wireless printer for years and have never had a problem!” and to you I say “Great job!” but keep in mind, people don’t call me when it’s working, they call me when it stops and I hear it from different people all the time. And it’s typically the same story

every time – wireless printer, working fine yesterday, something really important needs to be printed today and now, nothing... Or a message pops up telling you the computer can’t communicate with the printer but it doesn’t matter, the end result is the same – nothing comes out of the printer. That’s when I get the call.

I mentioned complexity as being the second trade off and here’s where that comes in. When you connect a printer to your computer with a wire (a USB printer cable with one end plugged into the back of the printer and the other end plugged into a USB port on the computer) that’s often all there is to it. Unless something goes wrong, your computer should automatically detect the printer and set it up, most often without having to click a thing.

On the other hand, when you set up a wireless printer, you have all the added complexity of having to connect the printer to your WiFi router first and that, depending on the make and model of the printer, can involve anything from having to type in your wifi password on a little control panel on the front of the printer to needing to plug the printer into the computer with a printer cable anyway and then use the

computer to program the printer for wifi access. Then you have to go to the computer and try to find and connect to the printer over the network. And when it does go offline for no apparent reason, you may find yourself reconnecting it to your WiFi router all over again.

There are so many things that can knock a wireless device off line I couldn’t possibly list them all here. Some of the more common reasons are power fluctuations that cause the equipment to restart, some cordless phones can cause a sort of “jamming” that can cause a printer to drop off line and even microwave interference can suddenly cause a device to drop offline.

The cause doesn’t really matter the point that I’m trying to make is that the wireless connection is way more fragile and easily broken than the traditional printer cable jammed into the back of the computer. Sure there are times when a wired printer drops off line but when that happens, resetting the device usually just means unplugging it and plugging it back in. With a wireless device, you often find yourself back at square one trying to re join the printer to the wireless



network.

I have a rule of thumb when it comes to printers; Even if the printer is capable of running wirelessly, if it’s going to be in the same room as the computer, save yourself a headache in the future and just connect to the printer with a cable. After all, there’s no rule that says you have to use a wireless printer wirelessly - they all have a place for a cable.

# Are you traveling with golf in mind?

With my writing job, I get to travel quite a bit. I know how expensive golf travel can be. Fortunately, over the years I have learned a few tricks to keep costs down without sacrificing fun. With summer here, I am betting many of us, myself included, will be hitting the highways and airways in search of rest, relaxation, and golf.

Probably the best way to save money is to travel with a group. Get as many of your golf buddies to join you on your trip. Larger groups will find that they have leverage when it comes to negotiating lower prices for rooms, food, and golf.

If you have hotel or credit card points check to see what benefits they give you. Some credit card companies offer free room upgrades, or discounted greens fees at many resorts. If more than one in your group has a free or discounted night coming at a hotel, you could combine these to get several nights out of your stay for free or greatly reduced.

Check with your home club. Many these days are managed by a company that has many courses in its portfolio. See if you get discounted golf at other courses owned or managed by the same company.

Ask about unlimited golf packages. Many resorts offer these in off-peak seasons to entice business. There are also packages that include lunch, drinks, and discounted replays.

If you really want to avoid the big money greens fees, steer away from the resorts advertised on television or that tout their

“Home of the Blah Blah Championship” layout. While it may be fun to say that you played these courses, you will almost always pay a premium to do so. National advertising is expensive, as is maintaining the course in those fantastic conditions. In the end it all gets passed down to the customer.

If you haven't played in a while, avoid playing your first round on an expensive, plush course. Take advantage of the municipal courses and use that round to knock off the rust from not picking up a club for so long.

While it's nice to be prepared and have most everything planned and thought-out, it's to your benefit to leave some time open for a last-minute round. Once an empty tee time is gone, it is gone. Many courses offer deep discounts if you call to fill one of those spots at just the right time. There are also several apps that allow you to find tee times at the very last moment and book them on your phone while your buddy drives to the course.

Plan your trip for mid-week. Prices on travel, hotels and golf are always higher on the weekends. Besides, it will get you away from the office for a couple extra days.

Make sure that everyone is comfortable with everything that is planned. There are times when the guys with the deepest pockets want everyone to eat at a more expensive restaurant, stay at a fancier place, play the more expensive courses. While you don't want to make one person feel unwelcome, you certainly don't want to let one person have all the say.

Next to golf, food can be the most expensive part of your trip. Look for accommodations that have a kitchen which allows you to cook meals. Find coupons for discounted meals or even visit restaurants websites and sign up with their emails to get discounts for your first visit.


