**Martin continues CRA streamlining process**

**LPA recommends approval of Jensen Beach, Rio Community Redevelopment Area Glitch Bills**

STUART — The Martin County Local Planning Agency voted 3-1 June 7 to recommend approval of the Jensen Beach and Rio Community Redevelopment Area Glitch Bills as part of the county's ongoing effort to streamline the CRA development approval process and make the program more successful.

Growth Management Department Senior Planner Irene Szedlmayer said the Jensen Beach Glitch Bill was less complicated than that of those previously approved on Hobe Sound, Old Palm

City and Port Salerno. The county will lack only the Golden Gate CRA once the current glitch bills are approved by the County Commission.

"The intention of the glitch bill is to eliminate ambiguities, inconsistencies and redundancies and at the same time minimize substantive changes," she said. "The issues in the Jensen Beach CRA are very similar to those of the other CRAs. One of the big issues of applicability that appeared in some of the other CRA codes -- what code requirements apply in the zoning overlays and which code requirements apply outside the overlays -- doesn't arise in Jensen Beach because all of Jensen Beach is in a zoning overlay. So therefore the changes proposed in the Jensen Beach Glitch Bill are fewer."

Ms. Szedlmayer emphasized that she had streamlined both the permitted use and development standards tables, as well as reducing the minimum height of landscaping trees from the

**Artist unveils latest military sculpture**

**Eduardo Gomez Rojas created female soldier sculpture for Distinguished Service Memorial in Stuart**

STUART -- Jensen Beach sculptor Eduardo Gomez Rojas unveiled his latest tribute to the military during Military Appreciate Day held in Memorial Park.

Mr. Gomez-Rojas said he spent the last 10 months creating "Unconditional," a bronze bas-relief depicting a female soldier and her young child after researching the topic of women in the U.S. Armed Services. Using his own daughter and granddaughter as models, he borrowed a uniform, boots and a backpack from a female army colonel who also helped serve as a consultant on the project.

"My research showed that Florida had the third largest population of veterans in the USA, but I knew of no memorials in Florida which honored female veterans," he said. "It struck me that a female soldier leaving her child to protect ours had to be the ultimate sacrifice. I decided to create a work of art to convey this thought and the emotion attached to it."

"Unconditional" is now on display next to his previous military piece in the park, "Above and Beyond," a sculpture of two male hands holding the folded flag against the heart. The City of Stuart and the Stuart Rotary Charitable Foundation sponsored both artworks and wanted to have the same artist create them for cohesiveness.

"I was the author of the sculpture on stage No. 1 of the Distinguished Service See SCULPTURE, page 3

Memorial, which was unveiled on Memorial Day in 2017," Mr. Gomez-Rojas added. "This piece was very well liked by the general public and veterans alike. The Rotary Club Foundation, as well as the city, wanted to maintain the artistic unity of the first and second stages of the memorial. The two sculptures sit next to each other, and they wanted to have the same visual language on both sides of the monument, even though the subject matter was different."

Mr. Gomez-Rojas emphasized that creating a low-relief such as "Unconditional" can be much more difficult than a 3D sculpture due to "issues of perspective and foreshortening that are 2D technical problems." He said he purposely left much open to interpretation by the viewer with this piece.

"It struck me visually that the size of the backpack was overwhelming," he explained. "I felt that this was a visual metaphor for the size of the burden placed upon this soldier, who is in a semi-kneeling pose while hugging her child. The soldier seems lost in her thoughts as if she is considering the enormity of the situation. She could be praying. She could be leaving or returning. She could be thanking God for protecting her and her child... or asking him to

do so."

Mr. Gomez-Rojas compared the creative process of his artworks to giving birth.

"When I am working on the clay model, at some point the sculpture takes on a life of its own," he said. "I find that I have to get my ego out of the way and let the sculpture be born. I know this may sound somewhat odd, but I really believe the work becomes infused with its own visual energy and wants to be born. I feel I am just a midwife, but when the baby is born, I fall in love with it."

A native of Bogota, Colombia, the sculptor earned both a bachelor of art in economics and a masters in social work at the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee before eventually pursuing a degree in fine arts from the University of Arkansas. He helped found the Arkansas Sculptor's Guild before relocating to the Treasure Coast 11 years ago. A resident of Hutchinson Island, he now works out of his own private studio in Jensen Beach and serves as a faculty member at the Lighthouse Art Center in Tequesta.

"Unconditional" was unveiled during the rain-delayed Memorial Day activities, which also paid homage to the military service of late local resident U.S. Navy Seaman John "Jack" Matthews, whose name was added to the Distinguished Service Memorial adorned by the artist's sculptures.

previous “14 to 18 feet” and incorporating a new description of mixed-use developments to include horizontal as well as vertical projects.

“In all the CRAs, it prescribes the mixed-use by first floor as non-residential, the second floor as office or residential and the third floor as residential uses only,” she said. “In working with some potential developers within the CRAs, we realized mixed-use doesn’t have to be vertical; mixed-use can be horizontal, and so we’re suggesting that that usage by floor be eliminated. The Jensen Beach Neighborhood Action Committee approved a reduction in the minimum height of trees to be planted... to 12 feet. I recommended that because different landscape architects and developers over the last couple of years have been asking the NACs for flexibility with regards to the heights of the trees.”

A Martin County resident, in fact, had complained at a NAC meeting about having to drive to Miami to get the right height tree for her single-family home.

“I remember a person had gone down to Miami-Dade County to get some silver buttonwood trees because the standard said 15 feet, and she couldn’t find that size in Martin County,” Ms. Szedlmayer added. “And I said it’s not in our code to support our local nursery men but we really should.”

In response to a question by Board Member Don Foley II on why the senior planner had removed the stormwater section of the

CRA code, Ms. Szedlmayer emphasized it was to simplify the code.

“Basically we removed the section where it says a stormwater management plan will be developed for the entire Jensen Beach Community Redevelopment Area,” she said. “They have produced various CRA plans, so we don’t need the code to say the CRA shall spend its money for that purpose.”

Some members of the County Commission, in particular Commissioner Doug Smith, have complained about the CRA program in recent years, which has in effect triggered the glitch bill process. During the approval of the Port Salerno Glitch Bill in 2017, Commissioner Smith insisted the county completely overhaul the CRA program because so many developers had balked at doing business in them due to the higher cost of development.

“The reason why not much has really occurred in the redevelopment area from a physical new construction type is because it’s very complicated and difficult to do,” he said during that November meeting. “We have all sorts of other layered costs on top of that program. Even if we get things more clarified, it’s still a very difficult process to fit into a shoehorned slot. The banking industry still struggles with recognizing and understanding how you finance a project that fits into an existing box.”

LPA Board Member Joseph Banfi echoed that same sentiment during the recent meeting before casting the lone dissenting vote on the Jensen Beach Glitch Bill, with Chairman Jim Moir and Board Member Kimberly Everman absent that evening. He also lamented the fact that no county residents had attended the meeting.

“I think the code is far too complex: I don’t understand it, most people don’t understand it and architects don’t know how to work with it,” he said. “I think the fact that there are conventional land-use policies over the area and then CRA policies on top of that, straight zoning underneath and overlay zoning on top of that, and depending on who’s in charge, there are different interpretations and different ways of applying this.”

Mr. Banfi compared the limited growth in the Jensen Beach CRA during the last 30 years to that of other nearby areas.

“We’ve seen Fort Pierce transform to what it is today, Downtown Stuart transform to what it is today, West Palm Beach transform to what it is today and Delray Beach, but we’re still stuck in the same place, just sputtering along, getting a McDonalds here and there or a Dollar General and gas stations,” he added, “all vehicle dependant. We can’t seem to make any progress in our CRAs. I think there’s something wrong and it requires a major overhaul.”

Ms. Szedlmayer then tacked the Rio Glitch Bill, admitting that interpreting that particular CRA code in the past has been challenging.

“There was always a little cringe when someone came in and asked a question about the Rio CRA,” she said as others chuckled in the audience.

“About the rules, not about the community,” clarified Growth Management Department Director Nicki van Vonno.

“Right, not about the community, but on how are we were going to answer the question,” Ms. Szedlmayer replied, “and were we understanding and interpreting these things

consistently.”

The senior planner briefly read through the Rio code, explaining that it did not include a permitted use table, but instead listed “prohibited or non-permitted uses.”

“The Western District has some non-permitted uses, the Town Center, some non-permitted uses, so everything... is permitted but for these exceptions,” she said. “Then, of course, that’s not completely true because you have future land-use designations and you’re not allowed to have an industrial use in the residential future land-use for example.”

“Joe, I feel your pain,” interjected Vice-Chairman Watson talking to Board Member Banfi about trying to understand the complicated Rio code.

“You don’t know,” Mr. Banfi replied laughing.

Ms. Szedlmayer then detailed some of the changes she had made in an attempt to simplify the code in the glitch bill, which included rewriting the permitted use table and a description of “porches, awnings, canopies arcades and balconies” as potential encroachments in the minimum setbacks or public rights of way, along with other changes in the description of such setbacks.

Vice Chairman Watson then lauded her efforts.

“The fact that you have to handle more than one CRA is just mind-boggling, and you’ve done an excellent job at doing the best you can,” he said. “It’s impressive and I know you put a tremendous amount of effort into this.”

The Board subsequently voted 3-1 to approve the Rio Glitch Bill, with Board Member Banfi dissenting.



## Learn about PrEP at free HIV, STD, Hepatitis C tests

The Florida Department of Health in Martin County recognizes June 27 as National HIV Testing Day. This year's theme is "Test Your Way. Do It Today," which serves as a reminder that HIV testing has never been more convenient because there are more ways than ever to get tested.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that all individuals 13-64 years old be tested for HIV at least once during their lifetime, and persons at increased risk for HIV infection be tested at least annually.

Free HIV/STD & Hepatitis C Testing:

- Monday, June 18 - 2-6 p.m., Golden Gate Center for Enrichment, 3225 S.E. Dixie Highway, Stuart
- Thursday, June 21 - 1-4 p.m., FL Dept. of Health, 16401 SW Farm Road, Indian-town
- Friday, June 29 - 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., FL Dept. of Health, 3441 S.E. Willoughby Blvd., Stuart

With early diagnosis, individuals can begin appropriate treatment and care resulting in better health outcomes. Studies have shown that providing antiretroviral therapy as early as possible after diagnosis improves a patient's health, reduces transmission, and can eventually lead to undetectable HIV viral loads.

HIV-negative individuals are encouraged to reduce the chance of contracting HIV by

using prevention strategies. Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) medication is now available through the Florida Department of Health in Martin County. PrEP is a once-daily pill that can reduce the chance of acquiring HIV in HIV-negative individuals. PrEP should be used in conjunction with other prevention methods like condoms to reduce the chance of infection. According to CDC, taking PrEP daily reduces the chance of getting HIV by more than 90 percent.





# Many state constitution amendments on next ballot

TREASURE COAST — Voters in the 2018 Florida General Election will face the most confusing ballot in a generation, especially regarding the proposed constitutional amendments. Understanding the proposals and figuring out how you wish to vote on each will take some time and independent research.

The Florida Constitution can be changed in four ways. The legislature can propose a change by joint resolution. Citizens and nonprofits can follow an initiative process including the gathering of large numbers of signatures. The Constitutional Revision Commission can propose changes, and the Taxation and Budget Reform Commission can propose changes.

Proposed amendments require 60 percent approval from voters to pass, per Florida Constitution, Article XI, Section 5(e).

For the November, 2018 general election, 13 proposed amendments will be on the ballot. Of these, eight were submitted by the CRC, three by the legislature, and two by citizen petition initiative.

The CRC meets once every 20 years. Florida is the only state with a constitutional amendment commission.

The CRC, created by Article XI, Section 2 of the Florida Constitution, has 37 members. The constitution sets the Attorney General as the only automatic member. The Governor appoints 15 commissioners including the commission chair. The President of the Senate appoints nine, the Speaker of the House of Representatives appoints

nine, and the Chief Justice of the Florida Supreme Court appoints three commissioners.

The Treasure Coast was represented on the CRC by Bob Solari of Vero Beach and Jacqui Thurlow-Lippisch of Sewall's Point. Both were appointed by the President of the Senate, Joe Negron.

The CRC held 15 public meetings across the state and reviewed thousands of public comments, before rejecting some proposals and combining others into its eight proposed amendments.

Making this year's process especially challenging is that the CRC "bundled" different issues into the same amendment. Of the amendments proposed by the CRC, only two, No. 12 (Lobbying and Abuse of office by Public Officers,) and No. 13 (Ends Dog Racing) deal with one clear-cut issue. Each of the other six from the CRC combined different proposals.

These will be the most difficult decisions for voters, as there are many people who agree with part of an amendment and disagree with the other parts, but you must vote either in favor or against the whole bundle. For example, No. 9 prohibits offshore oil and gas drilling and prohibits vaping in enclosed indoor workplaces.

Listed below are brief summaries of the amendments on the ballot. Each is excerpted from the state website, and in some cases there have been disputes regarding whether the state's summary accurately reflects the



proposed amendment. Voters are urged to do research and review the pros and cons. Search the internet for the title and number of the amendment and you will find a variety of viewpoints for each.

(1) Increased Homestead Property Tax Exemption, proposed by the Florida legislature. Increases the homestead exemption by exempting the assessed valuation of homestead property greater than \$100,000 and up to \$125,000 for all levies other than school district levies.

(2) Limitations on Property Tax Assessments, proposed by the legislature. Permanently retain provisions currently in effect that limit property tax assessment increases on specified non-homestead real property, except for school district taxes, to 10 percent each year.

(3) Voter Control of Gambling in Florida, proposed by a citizen initiative group called Voters In Charge. Ensures that voters shall have the exclusive right to decide whether to authorize casino gambling by requiring that all casino gambling must be approved by voters. Defines casino gambling and clarifies that this amendment does not conflict with federal law regarding state/tribal compacts.

(4) Voting Restoration Amendment, citizens' initiative proposed by Floridians for a Fair Democracy, Inc. Restores voting rights of Floridians with felony convictions after they complete all terms of their sentence including parole or probation. The amendment would not apply to those convicted of murder or sexual offenses, who would continue to be permanently barred from voting unless the Governor and Cabinet vote to

restore their voting rights on a case by case basis.

(5) Supermajority Vote Required to Impose, Authorize, or Raise State Taxes or Fees, proposed by the legislature. Prohibits the legislature from imposing, authorizing, or raising a state tax or fee except by a two-thirds vote of each house. This proposal does not authorize a state tax or fee otherwise prohibited by the Constitution and does not apply to fees or taxes imposed or authorized to be imposed by a county, municipality, school board, or special district.

Proposed amendments 6-13 are all from the Constitutional Revision Commission.

(6) Rights of Crime Victims; Judges. Creates constitutional rights for victims of crime; requires courts to facilitate victims' rights; authorizes victims to enforce their rights throughout criminal and juvenile justice processes. Requires judges and hearing officers to independently interpret statutes and rules rather than deferring to government agency's interpretation. Raises mandatory retirement age of state judges from seventy to seventy-five years; deletes authorization for judges to complete term if one-half of term has been served by retirement age.

(7) First Responder and Military Member Survivor Benefits; Public Colleges and Universities. Creates mandatory payment of education and compensation benefits to qualifying survivors of first responders and military members who die performing official duties. Requires supermajority votes by university trustees and state university systems. See AMENDMENTS, page 12

tem board of governors to raise or impose legislatively authorized fees. Establishes existing state college system as constitutional entity; provides governance structure.

(8) School Board Term Limits and Duties; Public Schools. Creates a term limit of eight consecutive years for school board members and requires the legislature to provide for the promotion of civic literacy in public schools. Currently, district school boards operate, control, and supervise all public schools. The amendment permits the state to operate, control, and supervise public schools not established by the school board.

(9) Prohibits Offshore Oil and Gas Drill-

ing; Prohibits Vaping in Enclosed Indoor Workplaces. Prohibits drilling for oil and natural gas beneath all state-owned waters between the mean high water line and the state's outermost territorial boundaries. Adds use of vapor-generating devices to prohibition of tobacco smoking in enclosed indoor workplaces with exceptions.

(10) State and Local Government Structure and Operation. Requires legislature to retain department of veterans' affairs. Ensures election of sheriffs, property appraisers, supervisors of elections, tax collectors, and clerks of court in all counties; removes county charters' ability to abolish, change term, transfer duties, or eliminate election of these offices. Changes annual legislative session commencement date in even-numbered years from March to Janu-

ary; removes legislature's authorization to fix another date. Creates office of domestic security and counterterrorism within department of law enforcement.

(11) Property Rights; Removal of Obsolete Provision; Criminal Statutes. Removes discriminatory language related to real property rights. Removes obsolete language repealed by voters. Deletes provision that amendment of a criminal statute will not affect prosecution or penalties for a crime committed before the amendment; retains current provision allowing prosecution of a crime committed before the repeal of a criminal statute.

(12) Lobbying and Abuse of Office by Public Officers. Expands current restrictions on lobbying for compensation by former public officers; creates restrictions on

lobbying for compensation by serving public officers; provides exceptions; prohibits certain abuses of public office for personal benefit.

(13) Ends Dog Racing. Prohibits gaming or pari-mutuel entities from racing dogs in connection with wagering; eligibility of such entities to conduct other authorized pari-mutuel and gaming activities is not affected; prohibits wagering on outcome of in-state live dog races.





# The car dealers dirty little secret

Hopefully by now, all but my newest readers know about the infamous “Dealer Fee”. If you don’t know, it’s a hidden price increase on the car you purchase disguised to look like a federal, state, or local tax or fee. It’s 100 percent profit to the dealer. “Dealer Fee” is the most common name for this disguised profit, but it goes by many names such as doc fee, dealer prep fee, service fee, administrative fee, electronic filing fee, e-filing fee, tag agency fee, pre-delivery fee, etc. The names are only limited by car dealers’ imaginations. Almost all car dealers in Florida charge a Dealer Fee. The dealer fees range from around \$700 to as high as \$2,000!

This is the Florida law that is supposed to regulate the Dealer Fee:

“The advertised price must include all

fees or charges that the customer must pay excluding state and local taxes.” The law also requires that the Dealer Fee must be disclosed to the buyer as follows: “This charge represents costs and profits to the dealer for items such as inspecting, cleaning, and adjusting vehicles and preparing documents related to the sale.”

This law is very weak and almost never enforced. When enforced, it isn’t enforced by the letter of the law; it is done to “accommodate” the car dealers. The law is “weak” because it requires only that the dealer fee be included in the “advertised” price. The word “advertised” is narrowly interpreted to mean a specific car shown in a newspaper, TV, radio, or online ad, but, what about when you get a price on the phone, online, or from the salesman? You

don’t find out about the Dealer Fee until you’re in the business office signing a tall stack of papers spit out by the computer. The dealers get around including their dealer fees in advertisements very easily by including a “number” in the fine print. This number is their “stock number” that designates ONE specific car. When you respond to the ad, this car is no longer available (sales people are usually not paid a commission for selling the “ad car”). The advertisement might say “many more identical cars are available.” It’s true that identical cars are available for sale, but they are not available for sale at the sale price because they’re not the advertised stock number car. If you buy one of those “exact same cars” you will pay from \$700 to \$2,000 more.

The reason I’m told that the law is rarely enforced is that the Florida Attorney General’s office is understaffed and too busy enforcing other Florida laws. I’m also told that Florida car buyers don’t file very many complaints against car dealers for violating the Dealer Fee law. I don’t believe that there can be too many other infractions of the law that take more money annually from consumers than dealer fees take from car buyers. Just one car dealer selling 1,000 cars a year and charging a \$1,000 dealer fee is taking a \$1 million annually from car buyers. Most car dealers in South Florida sell more than 1,000 cars annually and many charge more than \$1,000 dealer fee. I believe that the reason more complaints aren’t filed on the dealer fee is because most car buyers don’t know that they are being duped. They either don’t notice the fee or

assume it’s an official federal or state fee. Dealer often tell their customers that all dealers charge it and that it’s required by law.

The Attorney General also “accommodates” the dealers by not interpreting the law the way it was intended. For example, the law says that the dealer fee must be included in the advertised price. The Florida Senate has ruled that the law requires that the fee be “included” rather than “specifically delineated.” But the Attorney General allows car dealers to advertise car prices without including their dealer fee in the price if they just mention that there is a dealer fee in the fine print; but they don’t state the amount. To me they are simply allowing the car dealers to break the law.

Lastly, the required disclosure of the Dealer Fee on the vehicle buyer’s order or invoice is confusing, misleading, and incorrect: “This charge represents costs and profits to the dealer for items such as inspecting, cleaning, and adjusting vehicles and preparing documents related to the sale.” It should not say “costs” because any cost that you pass along to the customer in the price of a product is pure profit. A dealer can pass along his utility bills, sales commissions and advertising if he wants to

In addition to a wonderful two-room suite, breakfast, refreshing pool, and other amenities, guests staying at any of these hotels, get early park entrance, shuttles to and from the parks, and discounts on golf and other things. Florida and Georgia residents, as well as military, education, first responders, AAA members, and seniors all receive package discounts.

Disney Springs Hotels are currently offering summer vacation packages, with rooms starting at just \$99 per night. If you stay at the Double Tree Suites (800-222-8733), you will also get those signature chocolate chip cookies at check-in and what may be the friendliest staff I have ever met. The hospitality here made us feel very welcome and set the mood for the day and evening at “magical.” The pool was refreshing, the drinks at the bar cold, and the room quite comfortable.

With all the tempting relaxation at the

hotel and the new things to see and do at the parks, it was difficult to pull myself away for a round of golf. Somehow, I managed.

When most people think about golf at Walt Disney World, they think of the Palm and Magnolia Courses where the PGA Tour once played. Some of us however, are old enough to remember when the Tour also played at Disney’s Lake Buena Vista Course ([www.golfwdw.com](http://www.golfwdw.com)).

The PGA Tour last used the Lake Buena Vista Course during the Disney Classic in 1997. The Tour may have left, but for me, the Lake Buena Vista Course is my favorite on the property. It’s not long by any means, but you can see some of the very-back tees the Tour added over time to lengthen the course enough to challenge the top professionals.

What Lake Buena Vista lacks in length, it makes up for with challenging greens, tree-lined fairways, lots of bunkers and some of the most beautiful trees and fauna on any of the Disney tracks.

Designed by Joe Lee, LBV has four sets of tees, playing to a par of 72 for the men and 73 for the ladies. The very back tees play to just a couple yards over 6,800. The forward tees come in at just over 5,200 yards.

The course starts you off with a par-5 that should allow you to get your round

going early. While it’s not a long hole, at 514 yards from the back tees, it is fraught with danger.

The front nine wanders its way through pastel vacation villas and past a lighthouse. The short par-3 seventh features an island green.

Holes eight and nine are the number one and five toughest holes on the course. The par-5 eighth will test you on your second shot as the woods encroach from both sides the closer you get to the green.

The back nine features dense woods surrounding the course. At one point you will tee off over a canal as a Disney boat meanders by.

Eighteen is a stout par four that measures well over 400 yards. The hole rewards the daring golfer who can play a tee shot from left to right with a shorter approach. This may come in handy as you must hit a narrow green surrounded by bunkers and trees.

The best thing about your entire stay is that you get to enjoy your time while surrounded by the magic and enchantment of Disney.

and call it a “dealer fee”. It should not say “inspecting, cleaning, and adjusting vehicles” because all car dealers are reimbursed by the manufacturer for “inspecting, cleaning, and adjusting vehicles”.

So, what should you do when you are confronted by a car dealer with the “Dealer Fee”? Besides “LEAVE”, here are some suggestions that may help you:

Make it clear from the very beginning that all prices you discuss must be “out-the-door” prices. This way you don’t care if the dealer fee added up front because you will shop and compare their bottom line price with at least 3 competing car dealers. Ideally you should require that they include tax and tag in that price. If you don’t they might try to slip in something they call the “electronic filing fee” or “e filing fee” and trick you into believing that it’s part of the license tag and registration.

The dealer will often tell you that all car dealers charge Dealer Fees and that they are required by law to add the dealer fee on every car they sell. Simply tell them that you know this is not true and you can cite me and other car dealers like OffLeaseOnly.com and Earl Stewart Toyota (my dealership) that do not charge a dealer fee. Print out a copy of this article, show it to them, and tell them that you know that there is no law that says he must charge you a dealer fee.

If you and the dealer understand that the out-the-door price is the price you will shop and compare with his competition, you don’t need to be concerned whether there is a dealer fee showing on the vehicle buyer’s order. To be competitive, the dealer can simply reduce the price by the amount of his Dealer Fee and the bottom line is what you are comparing.

Be aware that dealers usually do not pay their sales people a commission on the amount of their dealer fee. In fact, dealers often misinform their sales people just like they do their customers. The salesman who

tells you that the all dealers charge Dealer Fees and that the law requires everyone pay a dealer fee may believe it. Sale people who understand that the Dealer Fee is simply profit to the dealer will be resentful of not being paid their 25% commission on it. A \$1,000 dealer fee costs the salesman \$250 in commission.

When you respond to an advertisement at a specific price for a specific model car, object when the dealer adds the dealer fee. Unfortunately, the law allows him the loophole of claiming that the ad car is a different stock number, but you might be able to shame him into taking off the dealer fee. If you raise a “big enough stink”, the dealer would be smart to take off the dealer fee than claim that technicality, especially if you were to advise the local TV station or newspaper.

There are many auto-buying services available. These third-party companies claim to get you a better price than the dealer will charge you. Some of these are quite good and I personally recommend the following: Consumer Reports, American

Express, GEICO, Allstate, AAA, Sam’s Club, AARP, and USAA. Those that I just mentioned are all partnered with TrueCar and use [www.TrueCar.com](http://www.TrueCar.com) for their member pricing. You can also go directly through TrueCar. True Car is unique among third-party auto buying services because once they show you your TrueCar member price online, they do not allow car dealers to add dealer fees to the member price.

They also don’t allowed dealer installed options to be added either. TrueCar and their partner companies allow only government fees to be added to the member price... sales tax and license/registration. Before using any third party auto buying service not listed above, verify that their member prices are the out-of-door price plus government fees only.

I hope that these suggestions help you and I hope that you will file a complaint with the Florida Attorney General, Pam Bondi. If enough consumers (who are also voters) let our elected officials know how they feel about the Dealer Fee, it will bring positive results.

## Treasure Coast Food Bank's Summer Meals program helps feed kids

Treasure Coast Food Bank's Summer Meals program began recently in Martin County to provide meals for kids who may not have enough to eat in summer without access to school cafeterias. The program expands next week to Indian River and St. Lucie counties once all schools close.

More than 46,000 students in Martin, St. Lucie, and Indian River counties are eligible for free and reduced price meals at school, and once schools close for summer, families who don't always have enough food to eat can struggle to provide the additional meals.

"No child should have to worry about where lunch will come from, and no family should worry about how to feed the children during the summer without access to school cafeterias," said Judith Cruz, Treasure Coast Food Bank President and CEO.

The Summer Meals program is open to all youth 18 years and younger at no cost to them. Treasure Coast Food Bank partners with sites throughout the region, including churches, community centers, youth development organizations and other agencies that can offer a place to feed the kids. Each site offers two of three food options among breakfast, lunch, or a healthy snack. Meal times vary by site.

Treasure Coast Food Bank prepares the meals daily. The meals typically include fresh-made sandwiches and wraps, hand-made salads, and fresh cut fruits and vegetables. Summer Meals will run every week day from now through August 10. 


