## Municipal Golf Course clubhouse approved

New 3,600-square-foot facility goes to design stage along with proposal to potentially eliminate nine holes

STUART — If Martin County Commissioner Doug Smith has his way, golfers at the Municipal Golf Course will be able to enjoy a new clubhouse, new restroom facilities and improved course conditions for at least part of the 2020 winter season.

Commissioner Smith made the motion Oct. 9 after a lengthy discussion on the best future for the course, which Parks & Recreation Department Director Kevin Abbate admitted had a "growing" subsidy. He directed part of his comments to fellow Commissioner Harold Jenkins who had already emphasized he would only support the motion if it included the future elimination of nine holes on the course.

"I'm not sure there's three votes to get anything done today, and that's a problem because we will have kicked the ball down the course again," Commissioner Smith said. "And so I'm going to try and convince you and Commissioner Ciampi that maybe there's a compromise somewhere here, if we were looking at a

## Bestselling author and inspiration for "Mean Girls" Movie to speak at Stuart event



# The ins and outs of downloading

One of the things I often hear when I ask a new user what they want to learn about their computer is, "I want to learn how to download."

Of all the things people can do with their machines, downloading seems to be a concept that's shrouded in mystery. We hear about it all the time, "just go to www.whatever.com and download your copy today," or "I just downloaded an update to my anti-virus software; my machine should be well-protected now."

What exactly do they mean by downloading? How come no one ever explains it? Well, it's one of those concepts that, for the most part, is 90 percent automatic. That's why there isn't much written about it for the end user.

Let me explain. Whenever you visit a Web site, any picture, sound, text, etc., displayed is stored on the computer that hosts it. When you access the Web site, all of that stuff is transferred from their computer down to yours, so it can be displayed. Since this transfer is going from the Web site down to your computer, the data is said to be downloading.

So basically, every time you access a Web site, you are automatically downloading lots of stuff.

The direction the data flows is what makes the difference between downloading and uploading.

Data that comes down from the 'net to your machine is considered downloaded, while data that leaves your computer and goes up to the 'net is considered "uploaded."

When you send your mail, the data goes from your computer, up to the mail server; it's uploaded. When you get your mail, it comes down from the mail server; it's downloaded.

Now, when typical stuff is downloaded from a Web site, it's usually displayed as it is being downloaded (back in the days of dialup, the pictures would seem to slowly form before your eyes).

The confusion about downloading comes from those times when the file you are trying to access is something other than a file that can be displayed as it comes in. In these cases, you have to save the file to disk and then access the file manually.

This isn't as complicated as it may first seem. When you encounter a file like that, typically a "save as" dialogue box opens and the computer wants to know where on your computer you want to save the file. This is logical; the machine needs a place to store it as it comes in. Some browsers will be set up to automatically save things to your Downloads folder while other browsers may have to save things manually. Save it to the desktop or create a folder specifically for it on the hard drive but, regardless of where you save it, you need to note what

folder it is being saved in and what the file is named. That way, after the download is complete, you can navigate to that folder and double-click the newly downloaded file.

The next thing that tends to cause confusion is what happens when you download something that your machine doesn't know how to open – for instance, say you just downloaded a .pdf file but you have no .pdf reader installed on your computer. Then, when you go to open it, the computer displays a message asking you what program to use! This can be very intimidating if you don't understand the message but you know what? The download worked fine! The file did indeed transfer from the internet down to the computer, the computer just doesn't know what to do with it and is relying on you to tell it what program to use.

(Not sure what program to use yourself? Here's a hint – take the three letter extension at the end of the file name (in this example .pdf) and ask google "what program opens .pdf." Google will then come up with a list of what programs will open your file).



Another area of confusion comes from things that automatically downloaded – things like antivirus or Windows updates are often downloaded in the background so there is usually little (if anything) that you have to do but, since everyone knows how important updates are, people can get stuck trying to figure out how to download things that are already taken care of. The trick there is learning how to verify that automatic downloads worked the way they are supposed to have.

Well, that's downloading in a nutshell, I hope this helps!

year's construction, we'd be thinking of opening up that work in January of 2020, which is still a full year off, so that's where I'm suggesting that we push. My concern is if we wait much longer, we'll lose all of 2020's season as well."

Commissioner Jenkins ultimately seconded the motion, which passed 3-2 with Commissioners Ed Fielding and Sarah Heard dissenting, but only after dropping the bomb that he'd changed his mind since the May meeting during which the Board had directed Mr. Abbate to continue on with plans to keep all 36 holes on the course.

"I think the first thing we should be doing is the exotic plant removal," he said. "The other thing I'm going to probably make a few people angry with is I have changed my tune on keeping it a 36-hole

golf course. It's not sustainable, especially after approving the last round of supplemental income to the Golf Course, so I would like you in your plan to proceed with also adding how we take nine holes out of play."

Commissioner Jenkins made reference to the rapidly increasing subsidy required by the course, which Mr. Abbate admitted was at \$626,000 as of the beginning of the fiscal year Oct. 1. Commission Chairman Ed Ciampi initially rejected the idea of shrinking the course due to the majority support by area golfers for maintaining 36 holes expressed at a charrette held at Indian Riverside Park to gauge public opinion.

"It was overwhelming that the 150 people that showed up wanted 36 holes," he said. "That was sort of the battle cry, and when this Board agreed that we were going to keep it, those people went home and said 'okay, we won that one.' We can't do a bait and switch as far as I'm con-

cerned on any topic.”

Commissioner Fielding, however, insisted he had made no such promises to the golfing community and reminded the Commission that experts testifying during a hearing last year emphasized that clubhouses never made money for a golf course.

“I think that would be totally imprudent to make that decision contrary to the economics and the logic of the situation,” he said. “There were two or three of those [experts] that actually owned courses, and their uniform suggestion was you don’t make money at a clubhouse. That’s really not an investment, that’s a loss... and currently that’s not a good investment of taxpayers’ money.”

Commissioner Heard concurred, saying the construction of any future clubhouse should be tied to the performance of the course after all other improvements have been made. She also favored eliminating half the holes of the Blue & Gold Course after Mr. Abbate admitted that section had much less rounds than the Red & White Course.

“That means we’re paying a whole lot of maintenance for 18 holes that not very many people are using,” she said. “If we’re going to move forward, then let’s concentrate on Red & White improvements and see how that goes. Let’s see if our revenues are up and then make a decision about the clubhouse.”

The majority of the Commission, however, said a clubhouse should be a priority and not an afterthought.

“And after [playing] golf they have what is known as the 19th hole,” Chairman Ciampi explained. “It’s when you go after the round and you talk about how you played, you have a drink and you’re in the air condition-

ing and you’re just relaxing for a little bit. A golf course has to have a clubhouse, and it can be modest... but to say we should have none, is wrong.”

All the commissioners agreed that new bathrooms were a necessity and that golfers were tired of having to use portable toilets installed to replace the bathrooms eliminated when the old clubhouse was torn down a few years ago.

“Here we are today four years later still with no clubhouse, no adequate bathroom facilities and we’re wondering why our rounds are going down,” Commissioner Smith fumed. “You’ve got to have a clubhouse, you just can’t put toilets out there for people because that’s not what they want. Our other parks don’t treat constituents in that way, and I don’t think we should treat our golfing constituents in that way.”

The chairman also insinuated that a different Board majority a few years ago had purposely sabotaged the Municipal Golf Course by tearing down the old clubhouse that he believed could have been gutted and rebuilt for much less money at the time.

“They could have saved the building, saved a fortune, keeping it back to its historic footprint and probably spending hundreds of thousands or a million dollars and creating a clubhouse with the bones of the original one,” he explained.

Commissioner Smith concurred.

“The Board at the time wanted nothing to do with that and tore it down, and I think that cost us 10,000 rounds a year,” he said. “Clearly the facts prove that was not a good decision, and we should never have torn that building down without a plan to replace it.”

Commissioner Fielding, however, defended the decision by the former Board majority and stood by his vote to tear down the aging structure.

“The existing clubhouse had asbestos and

black mold and there were immediate health issues,” he insisted. “We had to shut those serious long term health issues down -- that was the reality.”

For his part, Mr. Abbate urged the Commission to take some sort of positive action that day in order to see conditions at the municipal course improve.

“Without having some sort of improvement to the golf course, we are not going to see any new golfers going forward, our costs will continue to increase, and our subsidy quite frankly will continue to increase,” he said.

Before Commissioner Smith could make his planned motion of accepting staff’s recommendation of a scaled-down clubhouse but with the future potential elimination of nine holes, Commissioner Fielding beat him to the punch with an alternative motion.

“I’d like to make a motion that we request staff to go forward with the design that would improve the course, that we would reduce to 27 holes, that there would be bathrooms at the start and that the clubhouse potential would be considered later,” he said.

Commissioner Heard seconded that motion, and then Chairman Ciampi invited the two public speakers on the topic to address the Board before the vote. The first was Stuart land-use attorney Bob Raines, who emphasized that he had previously spent 15 years as a golf professional and that each of the commissioners had expressed valid points during the discussion..

“Commissioner Heard is absolutely right,” he said. “The priority is getting the golf course in condition because it’s the condition of the course that will drive the play -- period, end of discussion. Commissioner Fielding is correct in that clubhouses are just loss-leaders... however, it’s important that you have some sort of a clubhouse, and I think the key term is modest.”

Mr. Raines also agreed with Commissioner Jenkins’ change of heart.

“Commissioner Jenkins is correct in that we need to have 27 holes -- 36 holes makes absolutely no sense financially,” he added. “The sweet spot is 27 holes. Commissioner Ciampi and Smith are right in that we need some sort of clubhouse facility at the beginning, so like I said, I think it’s a mixture of all of those, and that’s really kind of the sweet spot.”

The second public speaker, Dwight Caserta of Jensen Beach, expressed a new insight, insisting Golf Course administration needed to improve customer service at the municipal course.

“it is too hard to get on this golf course to golf,” he said. “You have to pay to put your tee times on credit cards and that has to end, “Because if somebody calls out, now I got to pay for that, because I usually make tee times for my friends. Seriously, one of you guys needs to go in like a regular person and see how rude these people are. It takes 10 minutes to pay, they’re on the computer, they’re on the phone and the people are stacked up behind. Me and four people walked out because we couldn’t even pay.”

Commissioner Jenkins expressed concern about such alleged treatment, and Chairman Ciampi assured Mr. Caserta that Golf Course administration would check in to his complaints before calling the vote on Commissioner Fielding’s motion. That motion failed 2-3, with Commissioners Ciampi, Jenkins and Smith dissenting.\

The subsequent motion by Commissioner Smith to amend the Capital Improvement Project sheet to include the clubhouse and other Golf Course improvements including the elimination of exotic vegetation and the potential future elimination of nine holes passed 3-2.



# Mums can add color to your garden

With the thoughts of Thanksgiving and Winter in our near future, Fall Mums come to mind.

Garden Mums come in many colors and styles. Garden Mums are a staple to the holiday season and represent the end of summer and the beginning of fall. Mums are actually fairly easy to grow and can withstand both low and high humidity situations. Mums can actually mimic the look of other flowers such as the smaller flower of a daisy (Daisy Mums) or the larger and fancier varieties that can almost look like Roses. You can get Chrysanthemum plants in almost every color but blue.

Mums have been around for a long time and I am sure that many of you have helped your parents or grandparents display these colorful gems during the holidays. Most of the varieties that we use here in North America are simply known as Garden Mums with the botanical classification of *Dendranthema grandiflorum*. About 80% of all garden Mums are sold during the fall

and early winter. The reason that these colorful plants burst into bloom in fall is because the shorter days, cooler temperatures and longer nights all contribute to the triggering mechanism that causes these plants to burst into color. Since this winter is going to be an El Nino winter, the forecast is for a wet and cool winter season in Florida. This should be great weather for Mums and other winter flowers that love cooler temperatures!

Many people simply buy their Mums in the fall already in bloom from retailers while still others like to plant their own plants and watch them mature and bloom

in their own gardens. If you decide to try planting your own, do so in the spring so the root systems can have a chance to get well established to ensure a happy healthy plant. Mums should be planted in a location that will get only a half-day of sun or slightly less. This is especially true in the areas south of Vero Beach. The areas north of Vero Beach will probably have better results with growing Mums in your garden as the harsh effects of the sun are slightly lessened. You can ensure you will get more flowers in the fall if you pinch back the top inch or so of growth about every 3 weeks until about mid July. This process will help to promote heavy flowering in the fall. Please note you only do the above process if you plan on growing and maintaining your garden Mums on a year round basis.

Mums will grow in a variety of soils as long as it is well drained. Mums do not require a lot of fertilizer but will appreciate a light feeding about once a month with a water-soluble fertilizer such as Miracle Gro.

It will also help if you stake your plants, as this will help them to support themselves and keep the heavy Florida rains from knocking them over.

If you plan on only using your Mums as a potted decoration for the holidays, many of the same rules will apply. Keep the plant in a bright, well-lit area of the house and do not let the plant get too dry between watering cycles. Remember that potted plants will dry out much faster than plants that are placed in the ground. A/C will also have an impact on your plants moisture level.

As you can see, having and taking care of Mums does not have to be difficult. Growing and viewing these plants can have so many rewards that any work involved in keeping them looking nice will be well worth it.

smart readers. In 2017, Indian River Magazine named the club the Best Place to Play Golf.

The membership structure is simple. Everyone is a full golf member and everyone pays the same amount. This creates a harmonious community and financial stability for the club. The golf course is the community's greatest asset and having everyone support it, makes for a first-class club and community.

A couple weekends ago, I was invited by Pegi Austin, the club's Membership and Marketing Coordinator, to come out and experience Piper's Landing first-hand. I brought a colleague along for the experience.

When you arrive at Piper's Landing, the first thing you notice is how beautiful and well-kept the landscaping is. Every yard is pristine, the common areas are groomed to perfection, the flowers are in bloom, the staff is warm and friendly. You feel relaxed almost immediately.

While everything leading up to that first tee shot may relax you, the golf course itself can be as challenging or relaxing as you desire. The par-72 layout has six sets of tees

with a course rating ranging from 66.1 to 74.2, and a slope rating that ranges from 122 to 149.

Piper's Landing was designed in 1984 by native Floridian, Joe Lee, and measures as long as 6,922 yards from the tips. Lee has designed and renovated more than 250 courses in his career, including Bay Hill, Doral's Blue Monster, LaCosta, and Cog Hill. Lee is famous for his straightforward designs. No fancy bells and whistles, or gimmicks, just a course that's easy on the eyes and fun for golfers of every level.

A redesign in 2007 by Gene Bates bettered the course's drainage and irrigation while maintaining the original integrity and design principles.

The course is a wonderful blend of challenge and fun, with conditions that rival the best courses you will play. Playing from the correct set of tees, one will find themselves hitting nearly every club in the bag.

The toughest hole on the course comes up quickly. The par-5 second hole features a split fairway with the preferred side being narrowed by bunkers and out-of-bounds. Not many reach the green in two. In fact, my colleague decided to play in the sand the entire way to the green.

The par-4 10th hole is one that may be played a myriad of ways. It's not very long, but there is a large oak guarding the approach to the green. Hit your drive long enough and it's not much of a factor. Hit short and you face a longer approach

through a narrow gap. Hit your tee ball just right and you have to go over it.

At the par-4 14th, you are again posed a challenge. There is a brook running across the fairway. You can layup or drive over it. The longer your drive, the easier the approach will be. I want a mulligan on this hole!

The finishing holes are wonderful, with the 18th having a severe dogleg to the right with plenty of bunkers guarding the turn. The more daring you are, the shorter your approach.

The best thing about finishing your round at Piper's Landing, is that you can now enjoy a wonderful meal. The club features some of the most delicious meals. After our round, while we discussed how fantastic the course conditions were and how much we loved the course, we enjoyed a shrimp poo boy sandwich, French dip, lobster bisque, and cold beverages. We topped it off with some of the club's famous cookies. I'll go back just for the food!

# Is our food supply safe?

**B**ird flu, botulism, e. Coli, salmonella, food terrorists ... what's happening to my America?

Are we heading for a major food poisoning outbreak by eating food? Is Doom's Day near? Well take a deep breath, and listen very carefully to what I'm about to say. NO, NO, NO and NO.

I would like to share a trip I made recently to prove my point. My wife and I were on a trout fishing trip in Clarksville, Ga., staying with some friends. While I was there, I cooked for the family and some friends one night. During the evening, one of the guests came to me and asked if I would consider taking a tour of his food plant, which was nearby and possibly give him some culinary ideas. I told him I would be happy to. I later found out they had done a security and background check on me before I was asked to tour the plant.

The facility is closed to the public due to strict security. My friend had set this all up to surprise me beforehand, knowing I would like to tour the plant. The company was the Fieldale Farms Corp., the largest producer of cut chicken in the world. The packs of cut up chicken that you see in Publix and Winn-Dixie are just a few of their products.

The tour began with a brief introduction by the CEO. I was then given a personal security detail to take me through the plant. We entered the clean room and given a smock, rubber booties up to the knee and a hospital hair covering. She used a remote

control device to open a door to the wash room as we walked in a disinfectant form sprayed across the floor. We walked through this suds to the sinks, which were foot activated. She watched as I washed my hands for one minute with antiseptic soap and then I rinsed my hands with an antiseptic solution. I was given sleeve covers, which went from my wrist to elbow and then gloves to overlap the wrist.

She activated the exit door, and we entered a long corridor first walking through another antiseptic foam spray. This process would be repeated several times as we entered each department. Nowhere could you smell poultry. It is the cleanest facility I have ever seen.

They process chicken from eggs to fried chicken tenders. All chicks are sprayed with an antibacterial growth agent. The feeding sheds are large to prevent overcrowding and stress on the chickens, resulting in a bigger and tender product. The Humane Society of America has awarded them a Best Practice Award the last three years. All employees are required to go through the same procedures I had followed. All poultry is X-rayed and run through a metal detector



before packaging.

The cutting tool is a high speed water jet, which slices like a knife and can be programmed for any size or shape. Human hands never touch the product and it moved from one area to another by pneumatic plastic tubes and conveyor belts to box. At every stage the product is tested for temperature and bacteria count.

This company is an example of what is happening in America's beef, poultry, and pork companies. Across the country, food manufacturers are initiating these procedures. Is our food safe?

For those naysayers who state food was safer when I was young or back in the good old days, well the good old days weren't so good. In the early 1900s, people lived to the average ripe old age of 50. Hot dogs were full of mystery meat. Today we have truth in labeling and sanitation policies that are the envy of the world. Is it perfect? No, but it is better than in any time of our history. Speaking of chicken ... try this recipe.

## ROASTED CHICKEN

### Ingredients

- 8 pieces of cut chicken with bone; mix it up, dark and white pieces
- 3/4-cups melted butter
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 2 teaspoons oregano leaves
- 2 cloves of fresh garlic, cleaned and minced small
- 2 cups chicken stock
- Juice from two fresh lemons
- 2 baking potatoes cut lengthwise, cut in four pieces each
- 1 cup red onion sliced
- 1 cup celery, cut in 1 inch pieces
- 1 cup carrots, cut in 1 inch pieces

### Directions

Place celery, onion and carrot on bottom of a shallow roasting pan. Pour chicken stock over vegetables. In a bowl, coat all chicken parts and potatoes with the olive oil and butter mixture, place chicken parts and potatoes in shallow roasting pan with vegetables. Season with lemon juice, salt and pepper. Sprinkle garlic and oregano over all chicken.

Cook at 350 degrees for 30-45 minutes until chicken is golden brown and potatoes are soft.

Attorney General Bondi, as the top-ranking law enforcement officer of Florida, I ask you to investigate a sampling of new vehicle advertisements by Florida car dealers. These are readily available to you in Tallahassee, online from your home or office PC.

If your investigator indicates an interest in buying one of these advertised cars from that car dealer, they will discover that they cannot buy it at the advertised price “including all fees or charges that the customer must pay” according to Florida statute 501.976\*.

You probably know me. I’ve been a car dealer in Florida for 50 years. In recent years I’ve evolved into a consumer advocate helping car buyers from being taken advantage of by car dealers. I’ve been doing a weekly radio show on this subject for 14 years. Each week we mystery shop a South Florida car dealer. <http://www.mystery->

shoppingreports.com is the link to my archives of these reports. Our typical report involves responding to an online, TV, direct mail, or newspaper advertisement. We send a mystery shopper in who pretends to want to buy the advertised vehicle at the advertised price. In virtually all mystery shops (over 500), there are additional charges including “non-governmental” fees added to the advertised price.

The last time I raised this issue with your AG predecessor, General McCollum, I was told that the AG’s office didn’t have a significant number of complaints from Florida car buyers on this issue. I sincerely believe the reason for this is that Florida car dealer have been ignoring this law for so long, the law has never been enforced, and that car buyers have become “used to being deceived”. They either don’t know about the law or feel that filing a complaint is not

worth the effort.

You’ve done a great job controlling “Pill Mills,” pharmaceutical companies, and other threats to Florida consumers. Floridians spend more money on automobiles than anything except housing, and they need your protection from being over charged millions of dollars annually by hidden charges violating Florida Statute 501.976.

TITLE XXXIII  
REGULATION OF TRADE, COMMERCE, INVESTMENTS AND SOLICITATIONS  
CHAPTER 501 CONSUMER PROTECTION

501.976 Actionable, unfair, or deceptive acts or practices. —It is an unfair or deceptive act or practice, actionable under the Florida Deceptive and Unfair Trade Practices Act, for a dealer to:

(16) Advertise the price of a vehicle unless the vehicle is identified by year, make, model, and a commonly accepted trade, brand, or style name. The advertised price must include all fees or charges that the customer must pay, including freight or

destination charge, dealer preparation charge, and charges for undercoating or rustproofing. State and local taxes, tags, registration fees, and title fees, unless otherwise required by local law or standard, need not be disclosed in the advertisement. When two or more dealers advertise jointly, with or without participation of the franchisor, the advertised price need not include fees and charges that are variable among the individual dealers cooperating in the advertisement, but the nature of all charges that are not included in the advertised price must be disclosed in the advertisement.

(17) Charge a customer for any predelivery service required by the manufacturer, distributor, or importer for which the dealer is reimbursed by the manufacturer, distributor, or importer.

(18) Charge a customer for any predelivery service without having printed on all documents that include a line item for predelivery service the following disclosure: “This charge represents costs and profit to the dealer for items such as inspecting, cleaning, and adjusting vehicles, and preparing documents related to the sale.”


