Top principal, assistant named

STUART — The Martin County School Board named J.D. Parker Elementary School Principal Chris Jones and Pinewood Elementary Assistant Principal Cristina "Crissy" Smith its 2018 Principal and Assistant Principal of the Year.

Superintendent Laurie Gaylord visited the campus of each administrator Oct. 26 to officially deliver the news along with flowers and balloons.

"There aren't enough superlatives to express the leadership demonstrated by Dr. Jones and Mrs. Smith," Ms. Gaylord said. "Both Dr. Jones and Mrs. Smith have truly gone the extra mile to ensure their schools are positive and supportive climates focused on academic achievement for all students. I am honored to have them represent the Martin County School District as our Principal and Assistant Principal of the Year."

A native of Long Island, Dr. Jones, 46, originally came to Martin County for a one-year graduate internship nearly 20 years ago and fell in love with the place and his new career in education.

"I always knew that I wanted to become a teacher," he said. "I couldn't imagine doing anything else."

Dr. Jones joined the Pinewood Elementary staff as a third-grade teacher in 1999 and subsequently served as a reading coach at Crystal Lake Elementary for a year before beginning his administrative career as assistant principal at Pinewood Elementary School in 2008. He then spent the next three years as an AP at Port Salerno Elementary and one year at Palm City Elementary before taking over the helm of J.D. Parker in 2012. He admitted his first year as principal was fraught with challenges due to "significant changes to the education system" that year.

"The implementation of new instructional standards and new assessments proved to be a challenge for J.D. Parker as well as other schools in Martin County and many others around the state," he said. "Despite the hard work of our teachers and students, our school grade

Commissioners support Stop Harmful Discharges bill

Martin County Commission openly endorsed Rep. Brian Mast's legislation shortly before election

STUART -- The Martin County Commission voted 4-1 Oct. 23 to officially support legislation recently authored by 18th Congressional District Rep. Brian Mast to stop the massive discharges from Lake Okeechobee that have caused a plague

of blue-green algae on both coasts.

Normally such environmental concerns prompt both politicians and their backers to at least temporarily take off their Democratic and Republican labels, but all but one public speaker during the meeting begged the Commission to postpone the endorsement to after the Nov. 6 election to avoid the appearance of partisan politics. Rep. Mast — a Republican — is running for re-election against Democratic candidate Lauren Baer and will have either won or lost his bid for re-election shortly after press time.

Wheel misalignment: the 'silent killer'

Estimates on the number of cars on the road right now that need an alignment range from as low as 25% to as high as 75 percent! Even if you have the best tires and vehicle that money can buy, all it takes is a little pothole or a curb to cost you a new set of tires. This can cost you anywhere from \$300 to over \$1,000. If you live in an area with unpaved roads or lots of roads in need of repair and being repaired (Like South Florida) you're especially vulnerable to potholes and other road obstacles that can knock your front and rear wheels out of alignment. One of my "favorite" ways to misalign my wheels is curbs...I can't seem to avoid them when I'm parking, especially backing into a parallel parking place.

Most people know that if their car is pulling to the left or right, they need an alignment. Most also know that if they see wear on the edges of their tires, they may have an alignment problem (It could also be under inflated tires). But what most people don't know is that your wheels can be badly out of alignment with no symptoms whatsoever. It's like high blood pressure and that's why I used the phrase "silent killer" in the title of this article. Some people can tell their blood pressure is high from headaches or dizziness, but most feel no difference.

Most people learn that they have hypertension only when their doctor measures their blood pressure. Unfortunately, many never find out until it's too late.

Last year I had to replace a nearly new set of tires which had only about 5,000 miles on them (it cost me over \$1,000) because all four of my wheels were out of alignment. There were no symptoms whatsoever. My car didn't pull, my steering wheel was perfectly straight, and I saw no abnormal tire wear. I brought my car in for its routine 5,000-mile service and when my technician put it up on the lift to rotate and balance my wheels and tires, he found that the inside of all four of my tires was severely worn. When you have offsetting misalignment on opposing wheels, there is no pull and when the wear is only on the inside of the tire, it's invisible until the car is up on a lift. I had my car aligned only a few months ago but I knocked it out of alignment again without even realizing it.

Aligning the four wheels of your car, like everything else, is a lot more complicated than it used to be. Cars shocks' and suspensions are more complex today. When most cars had rear wheel drive, aligning was simple. Now we have mostly front wheel drive and even some all-wheel drive cars on the road. We no longer do just "front end"



alignments we must align all four wheels. In the "old days" service departments routinely checked the alignment for all cars that drove in. There was a simple machine built into the service drive that registered the measurements when you drove over the track. Some service department still use these dinosaurs, but they are not accurate on today's cars. Nowadays, some older alignment machines are so complex that it takes almost as long to measure your alignment as to adjust it. For this reason, many service departments will charge you the same to measure your alignment as they do to align it, even if the measurements find it is perfectly in adjustment. Modern machines will quickly measure alignments, but some service departments don't have these.

There are three basic measurements that must be exactly right for your tires to be in See STEWART, page 7



align, castor, camber, and toe-in. This website links to a video that gives a very clear, easy to understand explanation of these measurements, www.TireKiller.com. The video was produced by the manufacturer, Hunter, who is the largest and best manufacturer of alignment machines in the world.

When you buy a new or used car, you should insist that the dealer check the alignment. A new car can be knocked out of alignment in many ways. Transporting the car to the dealer from the manufacturer and driving it on or off a ship, truck, or train can do it. A technician can do it during a pre-delivery road test or a car salesman or prospective customer might during a test drive. Remember that a demonstration drive in a new or used car won't necessarily reveal any symptoms like a pull or abnormal tire wear. Many manufacturers will allow one alignment under warranty for a short time and mileage period (like 1 year or 20,000 miles), but some will only permit

the dealer do a check on your alignment if you complain about a pull or abnormal tire wear. Manufacturers consider alignment a maintenance item that is your responsibility. Therefore, it's important to be sure your new car is aligned when your car is still within the alignment warranty time and mileage.

When the service department measures your alignment, be sure that they use the latest equipment. A modern alignment machine is computerized, measures all four wheels, requires that your car be elevated on the lift, and the technician must be fully trained. And they are very expensive, about \$60,000 for a state-of-the-art machine. Many independent service departments and some dealers can't afford these. You should ask for a copy of the computer printout showing the specific measurements before and after your alignment. You should have your alignment checked every time you bring your car in for service, approximately every 6 months or 5,000 miles. If you hit a curb, pothole or other obstacle in the road or notice abnormal wear on the edge of your tires, bring it in for an alignment check immediately.

Does my new computer have enough RAM?

One of the questions that I am asked frequently by people who are looking to buy a new computer is whether the machine they are looking at has enough RAM. Usually I ask them what they are planning on using the machine for and how much memory the machine has.

It's very common today to hear things like "well it only has 4 gigabytes of memory and all I'm planning on doing with it is email and surfing the web. Will 4 gigs be enough?" Or, "I don't use the machine for much, I just mainly use it for email and Quicken. Quicken is very important to me and I want to make sure my new machine is going to be able to run it OK. Are you sure that just 4 gigabytes is going to be able to do the job?"

And, "the ad says this machine can take up to 16 gigabytes. Maybe I should get sixteen just to be safe. What do you think?"

It's at that point I usually have to stifle a chuckle because I can remember, not too long ago, when just the idea of having just one gigabyte of memory in your home

computer was the stuff of science fiction. I can even remember writing a column in 1996 explaining to readers how they should be able to run their machines with just 16 megabytes of memory. (Just to put that in perspective, 1,000 megabytes equals 1 gigabyte).

Again, don't get me wrong, I'm not saying you can run one of today's machines with only 16 mb; you certainly do need considerably more than that to run Windows but even with a fancy operating system such as Windows 10, the basic tasks haven't changed much and 4 gigs of memory will be just fine to check email, surf the web and run Quicken.

Another way to put the whole memory

question into perspective is to think of it in terms of money.

Back around 1996, when Windows was still in its infancy, RAM was very expensive. At the time that I wrote that previous column saying 16 mb was enough, RAM was going for about \$50 per megabyte, meaning that the 16 mb I was advocating cost about \$800. So that means a gigabyte (1,000 megabytes) back then would have cost about \$50,000!

Another factor that I consider is the level of machine that they are replacing. Very often, I will speak to someone who is replacing an old system (maybe an old Windows Vista machine with 2 gigabytes or ram or something) and they wonder if 4 gigabytes will work for them on the new machine. Doesn't it stand to reason that if you were able to surf the Web, check your email and run Quicken on the machine you are replacing, then a new machine, with double the memory, shouldn't have a problem handling those same tasks?

Today, the tasks haven't changed. It's still

email, the Web and yeah, maybe some critical program such as Quicken or something, but whenever I hear people pondering whether 4 gigabytes will do it for them I can't help but hear that little "grampa voice" in the back of my head saying, "back in my day we couldn't afford a gigabyte. We got by with 16 megs and we liked it!"

Back in 1996, I don't think I could have ever imagined being able to get a gigabyte of RAM, let alone pay less than \$100 for it. The whole thing makes me wonder what things will be like a decade or so in the future.

In 10 years will we have people wondering if 1 terabyte (1,000 gigabytes) will be enough or if maybe they should spring for two? Regardless, I'm sure they will probably still only use their machine for checking email, surfing the Web and running Quicken.

had been in decline and we were struggling to adjust."

That same year Dr. Jones put a new plan into action for teachers to implement 'authentic, engaging, and effective instructional practices' across all grade levels. He invested Title I funds in teacher and staff training and strived to revitalize the J.D. Parker school culture and strengthen the institution's ties with community partners such as the Martin County Airport and the City of Stuart. He said the action plan got the results he'd hoped for.

"Over the course of the next few years, we stuck with our original plan as we started seeing the positive results of our work," he explained. "I was very pleased to see an increase in nearly all areas of our school report card this past year. However, I am the most proud of our school when I walk into our classrooms. Our teachers are second to none in the way they connect with students and in the way they help make our school feel like a second home for everyone who spends time here."

For her part, Ms. Smith, 38, said she was shocked when Ms. Gaylord showed up at her office that day with the news.

"Martin County has an abundance of innovative and inspiring leaders, so being recognized with this honor is absolutely incredible," she said. "I am blessed to work with a team of professionals who inspire me

with their fierce advocacy for all students."

A native of Boston who has lived on both coasts and even in the heartland where she studied at the University of Colorado, Ms. Smith has called Martin County home for the last 15 years and admits education was not initially her career goal.

"I graduated college with a degree in sociology but quickly realized that my passion was in education," she explained. "I went back to school to pursue my dream and eventually earned my master's degree in educational leadership and policy studies."

Ms. Smith joined the Martin School District in 2005 as a teacher at Port Salerno Elementary where she taught every grade but third and kindergarten for the next 11 years, as well as serving as a math coach and working as program specialist for the Martin Family Language Involvement Program and Port Salerno Talks Early Language Initiative. In 2016 the District promoted her to assistant principal at Pinewood Elementary. She said Port Salerno, and in particular her fifth-grade classes, will always hold a special place in her heart for years she spent there.

"Each grade was wonderful in its own way, but fifth grade is such a special grade to teach," she explained. "I love the community we made in our class and cherish the relationships we built together."

Now in her third year as a Pinewood Elementary assistant principal, Ms. Smith said she finds the transition from classroom teacher to school-wide administrator more stimulating rather than challenging.

"There are so many remarkable aspects to

the job, but being a part of a larger school community and collaborating with teachers, staff, students, and families is most certainly my favorite," she said. "I find it exciting to be a part of a school-wide community focused on the singular goal of doing what is best for all children. At Pinewood, there is a tremendous spirit of collaboration and team work. Everyone on the campus brings their best for our students and families, all day, every day."

Ms. Smith said the caliber of her coworkers makes her proud to call the Martin County School District home.

"The District is filled with individuals who are passionate about making a difference in the lives of children," she said. "Every day I am in awe of the expertise and enthusiasm that our teachers bring into their classrooms."

Dr. Jones echoed that sentiment, emphasizing the importance of building a community between all local stakeholders in education. "I consider myself very fortunate to have spent time at several schools in Martin County and have seen fantastic teaching in every building," he said. "I have been lucky to build relationships with teachers, staff and students around the county, and I've made some amazing friends here."

Both administrators will now compete on the state level for Principal Achievement Award for Outstanding Leadership and Outstanding Assistant Principal Achievement Award. The Florida Department of Education will announce those winners next spring.

election to avoid the appearance of partisan politics]

The Commission originally intended to handle the resolution without public discussion as part of its Consent Agenda but more than one commissioner requested it be pulled due to comments such as those expressed by Stuart attorney Virginia Sherlock that morning.

"I'm asking you this morning to reverse the increasing trend toward lack of transparency reflected in your use of the Consent Agenda to avoid public discussion and disclosure of how decisions are made in our local government," she said. "Many of the items on today's Consent Agenda deserve public discussion and I thank you for pulling a lot of them from the darkness into the sunshine. The resolution for support for Resolution 6700 will be discussed and debated, only because citizens demanded that opportunity, not because you invited public participation."

Jensen Beach resident Jackie Trancynger concurred.

"You continually put items on the Consent Agenda that do not belong there," she said. "Today you want to pass a resolution approving House Bill 6700 two weeks before the Congressman has to run for re-election and when Congress is not even in session. I can't shake the feeling that the timing of HR 6700 was a political ploy as was today's resolution hidden in the Consent Agenda."

Paul Lara, who normally identifies himself as a member of the Treasure Coast

Democratic Environmental Caucus but did not do so during the meeting, also suggested postponing the resolution of support.

"The question I'm asking is why the rush to get this resolution approved," he said. "There has been very little discussion by many groups on the concerns of lack of detail in the bill. We hear that the lack of detail is because it is a politicized timeframe. It's an election period, and approval of a resolution today is a form of candidate endorsement for Mr. Mast."

Laurie Prim also accused both the Commission and the Congressman of rushing the resolution and the legislation through right before the election.

"I don't think this is about the bill, or for that matter about water at all, but a larger political agenda," she said. "Here we are in front of our County Commission that is supposed to represent all of us, essentially making a partisan-political endorsement, with no discussion, with no public notice. What's the rush, what's the rush on a bill that's been thrown together 60 days before the election, when the person writing the bill has been in Congress for two years already?"

One of the region's most familiar environmental voices, Indian Riverkeeper Marty Baum, also called for restraint on the part of the Commission.

"The Commission's non-partisanship must be protected," he said. "If you take a vote today, it will not matter how you vote: Half of this room will forever believe that you made a partisan vote."

Palm City resident Kimberly Streiber cast the only vote of support for the resolution, expressing incredulity that anyone present

would oppose supporting the Stop Harmful Discharges Act.

"For the first time in my life we have a representative in D.C. who is actually pushing initiatives that can make a huge impact on our water problems," she said. "People need to see through politics and actually support progress because at this point in time I think they're impeding it. To see people who openly support a certain party say the Commission should not support this resolution until after the election in the name of political favoritism is purely political -- the hypocrisy is amusing."

Right before ending the public comment portion of the meeting, Commission Chairman Ed Ciampi warned those in opposition that pulling the item off the Consent Agenda for public discussion might have the opposite effect they intended.

"Now if you were thinking from a political strategy point of view, it was on the Consent Agenda, which it this particular case meant it would not have come up for a large conversation and you wouldn't have heard Congressman Mast's name," he insisted. "It would have been voted on and either approved, or taken off and failed, so it's gotten more attention this morning than it would have had, had it just been voted on regularly."

Chairman Ciampi emphasized that Commissioner Sarah Heard had submitted the idea for the resolution and was one of those who requested it pulled from the Consent Agenda.

"I didn't think that when Commissioner Heard had brought this forward -- and anyone of us could have -- that it would have turned into an issue such as this because I

was pleased that our elected officials from either party were working on [environmental] situations," he said. "I understand the concern that maybe the timing on this looked appropriate, but I'm telling you if Congressman Mast was a Democrat, I don't believe we would have had the uproar this morning that we've had."

The Commission did not take up the discussion again until later on in the day when there were few, if any, of the original public speakers still in the chambers. Commissioner Heard said that afternoon she concurred with Chairman Ciampi's earlier assessment of the debate.

"I feel that we do a very good job of representing all residents in Martin County and not just Republicans," she said. "When we're trying to protect our water resources. I think we do everything that we can in order to protect them, and I think that we do fairly represent all political parties in Martin County, and I don't think this was a political stunt. I think it's a bill that's aimed toward providing some additional protections and additional regulations for Martin County that don't exist right now."

Commissioner Ed Fielding also supported the idea of the resolution, saying there had already been non-partisan cooperation on the issue.

"It was not of a political nature," he exclaimed. "The Congressman [Mast] has helped in many areas about water issues. Sen. Nelson's helped in many areas about water issues. Sen. Rubio has been more helpful about various water issues as well of late, and so this isn't a political thing. This is a living thing, this is a standard of living, this is a quality of life thing."

Commissioner Doug Smith cast the lone dissenting vote, saying he sided with some of the opinions expressed by the opposing speakers.

"I agree with the speakers this morning from the respective of the timing: This isn't as drop-dead urgent as is the communication and conversation relative to everybody having time to adequately engage," he said. "We as a Board have not had a conversation as to what we think is important relative to what's being asked for. Two or three week's time or a month's time to further engage with everybody and get everybody on the same page will be much more productive."

Commissioner Heard subsequently made the motion to support the resolution, which was seconded by Commissioner Harold Jenkins who made no comments on the matter. It passed 4-1.

Fiorentino's Cuisine: a Stuart legacy of longevity

STUART — For nearly 13 years, Fiorentino “Tino” Estrada has served up cuisine reminiscent of his native Calabria, a stone’s throw from Sicily, in the heart of Stuart’s popular Cedar Pointe Plaza.

Stuart and the rest of Martin County have only benefited from Chef Tino’s culinary expertise because his sole effort to leave the restaurant business behind him failed to satisfy. The immigrant from the Italian Boot originally planted himself in Broward County in 1985, where he served up Italian delicacies in both Margate and Coral Springs for years. After buying a home in St. Lucie County, he briefly traded in his chef’s apron for a chauffeur’s cap but found the hours of a limousine service even longer than his accustomed restaurant trade and really missed the call of the kitchen. Before long he began scouring the area for his next gastronomic endeavor and launched Fiorentino’s Cuisine in December 2006.

The following summer, my wife Gloria and I visited the relatively new restaurant for one of the first dining reviews that I did for the Hometown News as a recent transplant from Miami that same year. Fiorentino’s was one of the first Italian restaurants

we’d visited on the Treasure Coast, and unbeknownst to us at the time, Martin and St. Lucie counties was experiencing a much newer wave of Italian/American immigration from both New York and New Jersey so significant that the region was becoming known gastronomically as the Little Italy of Florida. Indeed, Fiorentino’s was the first place I’d ever tried the Francese method of food preparation. For the uninitiated, this yummy lemon-butter-and-white-wine sauce makes a great deviation from the typical red-sauce so endemic to Italian/American cuisine and is frequently used as a preparation method for chicken, veal and fish. So our recent visit was a coming home of sorts and indeed, when Chef Tino got a break to come out and chat, he remembered us and even where we’d sat 11 years prior (now that’s a mind for details!).

For this more recent visit, we started out with an appetizer of Fried Calamari. Now I must admit Gloria is much more into squid than I am, but Chef Tino’s version came out delightful crunchy on the outside and chewy and succulent on the inside. Of

course, I dipped them generously in Fiorentino’s homemade marinara sauce. Since all entrees here come with either soup or salad, I opted for Pasta Fagioli, a typical Italian soup chock full of white beans and pasta in a very creamy base. Gloria requested the house salad, which she topped with Chef Tino’s homemade creamy Italian dressing, one of the best I’ve ever tasted.

Fiorentino’s boasts quite an extensive menu, so it may take you some time to fig-

ure out exactly what you want for the main course. Here lingering over the menu with a glass of wine and an appetizer is not a bad idea. There's a broad range of dinner specials (think veal and chicken in every preparation method known to Italians), more than a dozen variations of pasta including Manicotti and Lasagna, a huge variety of seafood and even a few options from the grill. The restaurant also features an ample kid's menu if you're dining with children or grandkids.

For our entrees that evening, I opted for the Filet of Sole Francese at our server's suggestion, while Gloria selected the Chicken Cacciatore. While my wife's main course came sautéed with tons of onions, bell peppers, mushrooms and olives in the chef's homemade red sauce, my sole was accompanied by a side of delightfully crunchy broccoli sautéed in garlic and olive oil. When I took one bite of the tender and delicate breaded fish swimming in its pool of Francese sauce, I knew my server had led me down the right path. When I passed a taste over to Gloria, she so enjoyed it she had to know the name for sole in Spanish. When she realized it's called lenguado, she remembered it was one of her favorite types of fish in Colombia as well. Because I mis-

takenly thought Gloria was initially going to order Eggplant Rollatini (one of my favorite Italian/American dishes), I also ordered a small portion here, which did not disappoint with its yummy red sauce and filling of stringy mozzarella and ricotta cheeses.

Naturally I was unable to finish my ample entrée due to so much sampling of everything else and the desire to try Chef Tino's homemade Cheesecake (again, another suggestion by our server). We opted to share a slice of this incredibly rich concoction of sour cream, ricotta and cream cheeses and definitely think it's worth saving room for in the future. One of Chef Tino's testaments to his local longevity is his survival of the recession when so many people packed up

and left town in search of greener pastures. Fortunately, he'd already managed to develop a loyal following devoted to his culinary talents as well as to his regular specials. Fiorentino's offers two separate lists of two-for-one specials for either \$21.95 or \$27.95. While the first list includes entrees such as chicken, eggplant or veal rollatini and even my savory Sole Francese, the second list features a variety of shrimp and other seafood dishes as well. Both lists are available seven days a week and provide exceptional culinary value, particularly for those dining on

a budget.

Fiorentino's Cuisine is located at 2571 S.E. Ocean Blvd. in the heart of Stuart's Cedar Pointe Plaza. The restaurant is open from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 2 p.m. to 9 p.m. on the weekends.

Test your golf game on the new and improved PGA Resort course

Most every week, serious golf fans dream of playing the courses the pros play. We want to know what they face when playing for over a million dollars. We'd love the perfect conditions. The firm fairways where the ball seems to bounce and roll forever. The perfect putting surfaces where the ball tracks true and the speeds are identical on every green.

Most of us have watched or attended the Honda Classic at PGA National in Palm Beach Gardens. The resort has been home to the Honda Classic, the Tour's longest running sponsor, since 2007. Over that time the Champion Course has seen several renovations and tweaks to both challenge the pros and make them more comfortable.

After the sun set on this year's event back in early March, the Tour and the resort heard a lot of comments from the players. Most were not the kind you want to hear from the people who make your brand popular. The players were not thrilled at all with the greens. They complained about the surfaces being too different from one hole to the next. They didn't like that some of them had bare spots that had more green sand than grass.

The PGA Tour and PGA National Resort got together and decided the time had come to renovate the greens. Over the past few years some other components of the course have seen attention. The bunkers have been rebuilt, tees have been added to change angles and add distance, and even some

trees have been planted or removed. It was time for some attention to be paid to the greens.

Jack Nicklaus Design, which has overseen most every tweak or change made to the Champion Course over the past two decades, was again brought in. Over time the grass around the greens creeps in and encroaches on the putting surface, making them smaller and smaller over the years. The Tour wanted to get the greens back to their original size and remove all the encroaching grass on the fringe or collars.

By returning the greens to their original size, there will now be more places for the Tour to put the pins over the course of tournament week. Some will be completely new, giving the pros a hole location that they have yet to see when playing the event at this course.

In all, an average of just over 800- square feet was added to each green. Couple that with bringing back the undulations the greens used to have, and you get greens that will certainly challenge the best in the business.

The Tour also likes that the greens are a

bit firmer and the new drainage system under the greens' complexes will allow the staff to better control just how firm and fast the greens are for not only the Honda Classic, but for resort guests as well.

Work began on June 4, and was completed the first week of October, with the course re-opening for play on Oct. 3. A lot of work was done in just four months. The old layer of grass was stripped and removed. New drainage was built, and a new subsurface was constructed. Then the new irrigation was put in, followed by new Tiff Eagle Bermuda for the final putting surface.

After the ribbon-cutting ceremony, we teed up to give the course a thorough testing. You immediately notice how well-groomed the entire course is. Having followed many of the players around at the Honda Classic and having played the course a couple years ago, I am well aware of what the greens used to look like. The size of the greens immediately jumped out to me. They are noticeably larger and some of the pin placements we had for the day, were ones the course hasn't been able to use since last century.

The course is best known for the Bear Trap. Holes 15 through 17 are where Jack Nicklaus decided to truly challenge the players and guests. The holes were difficult



before. Adding a few more spots to place the pin on 15 and 17, and making 16 green a lot bigger than I ever remember it being, will just add to the difficulty and pressure.

I did my best to appease the golf gods and hit a ball in the water at each of the three holes. Hopefully the leader has better luck than I come late February.

The best way to play the Champion Course and test your game against one of the toughest venues on the PGA Tour is to stay at PGA National Resort & Spa.
