review postponed

Planner requests second postponement on LPA site plan approval request for controversial charter school

STUART — The public speakers against a controversial charter school planned for Cove Road discovered Feb. 7 they faced a second delay of the quasi-judicial hearing before the Local Planning Agency with the developers of the Treasure Coast Classical Academy.

The Medalist Building Group planner for the project, Ella Taylor, requested the LPA postpone the hearing until March 7 in a letter drafted to Growth Management Department Director Nicki van Vonno on Feb. 4 without specifying a reason for the second delay. The hearing had originally been scheduled for Jan. 17 and then postponed until the recent meeting.

County holds Common Core meeting

School Board members ask state for clarification and put new math textbooks on hold

STUART - Leary of throwing \$1.4 million away on mathematics textbooks incorporating now-defunct Common Core national standards and unsure how to proceed, the Martin County School Board held a rare emergency meeting Feb. 5 to determine the District's next

The meeting came on the heels of Gov. Ron DeSantis' Jan. 31 announcement he was scrapping the Common Core Standards launched in 2010 by the National Governors Association and the Council of Chief State School Officers and would have newly installed Education Commissioner Richard Corcoran begin an extensive rewrite of the controversial standards. Florida was one of 45 states that adopted Common Core but did some tweaking of its own four years later and renamed them the Florida Standards.

Chairwoman Christia Li Roberts explained as she opened the emergency session that both Superintendent Laurie Gaylord and District 3 Board Member Victoria Defenthaler had attended a meeting of the Treasure Coast Working Group four days prior and came away determined to ask the Florida Department of Education for more guidance. The



ou can use this word track to buy a car online, via regular mail, over the telephone, or in person. I strongly recommend that you use online, but I know that some car buyers, seniors like me, are not as comfortable with buying over the Internet. Using this word track in person can work, but it will be much more difficult and take a lot longer. Only a person with very strong will, stamina, and a very thick skin should attempt face-to-face negotiation. I strongly recommend that you don't.

1. Dear Car Salesman, "Within the next two weeks (enter your own time frame), I will be purchasing (leasing) a (fill in the specific make, year, model and optional accessories)." (You should carefully research the vehicle that you decide to purchase using all sources of information available such as Consumer Reports. You should also test drive the car to be sure it feels and drives the way you want it to. It is vital that you not change your mind during the purchasing process. If you do change your mind, you must begin all over again. Never let a car salesman change your mind for

you. That is one of their favorite ways to charge you more money than you had anticipated paying.)

2. "Please quote me your lowest price on (your specific car). This price must be an out-the-door price with only state sales tax and the license tag fees paid to the state. To be sure there is no confusion, please understand that the only dollar amounts that I will pay in addition to the price you quoted are taxes and fees paid to the government. I will not pay dealer fees by any name such as electronic filing fees and tag agency fees."

3. "I understand that my request may not be one you wish to comply with because you are concerned that I will shop and compare your price with other car dealers. Your concerns are valid because this is exactly what I will do. You may be asking yourself, 'why should I do this if I know that my lowest price may not be low enough and that I will show it to your competitor to get an even lower price?' My answer is quite simple; you may have only a



nimal hospital offers veterinarian services

STUART — Dr. Lynnly Miller believes that your pet is part of your family and should be treated as such. Nearly three years ago, the Ohio native proudly relocated to Stuart with her family to take over the practice started by Dr. James Wonnell at Animal Medical Hospital.

The 2005 graduate of Ross University Veterinary School in St. Kitts had already found career success in her home state but missed the personal touch of one-on-one relationships with families and their pets, so she jumped at the chance to own the Martin County facility.

"I was a department chair of a vet tech school," she explained. "I also worked at a very busy emergency/referral hospital in Akron Ohio. Working for this large hospital, which can be very impersonal, really drew me to the chance to own my own practice."

Dr. Miller firmly believes that animals, like their owners, need a comprehensive annual physical in order for her to better understand their health and get to know their owners as well. During this routine exam, she and her staff will chart a complete medical history of your pet, make nutrition recommendations, assess his or her behavior and review any known medical conditions. The physical covers various procedures including an ear and eye examination, cardiopulmonary (heart and lung) analysis, temperature reading, abdominal palpation, dental exam, dermatological exam and musculoskeletal evaluation. She believes these annual checkups provide some very important benefits.

"A yearly physical exam allows me to get to

and abnormal. We can also preform preventative care such as vaccines and routine blood work to 'catch' any ailments that may not be noticeable to the owner."

The Ohio native said she first discovered her love of medicine while working as a corpsman in the U.S. Navy and now finds helping families and their pets truly satisfying.

"As a veterinarian, I really try to take into consideration the entire family," she emphasized. "This could be cost, but it is also the treatment plan. It is very rewarding, when someone is very worried about a pet, to see them feeling great again and the family happy."

Dr. Miller and her family are pet owners as well. Her family includes her husband Manuel, an educator in St. Lucie County; their two children, Emmy, 8, and Manny, 9; their boxer, Sadie; and their cat, Humo.

For this reason, she's particularly sensitive to the emotional needs of pet owners when it's time to say goodbye to a cherished friend and family member. It's one of the reasons Animal Medical Hospital provides affordably priced, in-home euthanasia services as an option.

"The pets have the benefit of being at home in their own space," Dr. Miller said. "This helps with anxiety and stress and allows the family to mourn at home, without having to drive and be uncomfortable. We offer several pet memorial options and keepsakes, including paw prints, urns and box engraving."

Dr. Miller is a also a huge fan of trap, neuter and release efforts to help control the feral feline population and works closely with Caring Fields Felines and Operation Cat Snip to provide low cost spay and neuter services.



small chance of winning my business if you do give me your lowest price, but you will have ZERO chance of winning my business if you do not, because you will never hear from me again."

4."I will sell my trade-in to the highest bidder, just as I will buy my new car from the lowest bidder. I will also finance my car at the lowest interest bid by a bank or credit union. If you can meet or beat other dealers and banks, I will trade my car into you and/or finance with you."

5. "If you quote me your lowest out-thedoor price and I come to your dealership to purchase my car, please don't even think about: (A) Telling me that the car I specified was sold and that you would like to show me other cars just like it. (B) Telling me that the car I specified has some accessories/ options that you installed like nitrogen in the tires, glass etch, pin stripes, floor mats, paint sealant, etc. (C) Telling me that you priced in rebates and incentives that I don't qualify for like college graduate, military, customer loyalty, customer conquest, etc. (D) The price you quoted me is only valid if I finance my car through you. If you do any of these things, I will not only not buy from you, but I will report you to the Florida Department of Motor Vehicles, BBB, the County Office of Consumer Affairs, Florida Attorney General, and your manufacturer.

6. "If everything goes well with no shenanigans, I will write a letter of commendation to your owner and manufacturer. I will also tell all my friends, neighbors, relatives, work associates, and club mem-



bers about my wonderful experience with you and your dealership. I will also post recommendations on Google, Yelp, Instagram, Facebook, and Twitter."

7. The choice is yours and I hope that you see the benefits of selling me a car at the lowest price you can afford to give me. I also hope you can see the dangers of giving me a dishonest price so that you can get me into your dealership and try to charge me more than we agreed."

8. "I wish you the best of luck and I sincerely hope we can do business and have a long car buying and servicing relationship."

If you apply this word track and do not vary from it or weaken to the car salesmen's objections, you will buy your next new or used car for a very low price and without the haggle, hassle, and resulting anxiety and anger that you've experienced in the past. Good Luck.

Help with car haulers

Can or will the sheriff office ever do something about the Car Haulers on US 1 blocking the road and view on US 1??? Yesterday I was leaving Tropical Isles (east side of road) on US 1 (across from the KIA dealership next to their excess lot) there was a Car Hauler parked on the east side in front of the KIA excess lot un-loading KIAs, he was parked partly on the side walk and partly in the far right lanecause he had a clear view of the north bound traffic blocked, I could not see traffic traveling north, so I had to ease out to see and I was almost hit in my drivers side door. Second jobs aren't always an option
The rant titled "The Government shutdown" on Feb. 1 is very inaccurate. It suggests that government workers "could treat the shutdown as a paid vacation."

First, federal employees are limited in the second jobs they are allowed to accept. Finding a job for an uncertain employment period is not easy. And some federal employees work in remote locations with few temporary employment options.

Second, few government workers have the financial resources to spend money on a "paid" vacation when they have no idea how soon they will be paid. Travel is not feasible when you could be recalled to work at any time. Also, children are in school and employed spouses are not on vacation. Many federal workers are located in very high cost-of-living areas with long and expensive commutes. It's tough to save money, particular since federal salaries and pay raises are below those in the private sector. This is even worse if both spouses are both federal employees.

The result of the shutdown will be that employees eligible for retirement are more likely to do so. Potential employees in high technology fields (e.g. cybersecurity) are less likely to seek federal employment. It's a mess!

Tailgating is a serious problem

The advantages of a portable computer

ne of the features that make laptop computers so appealing is the fact that they are portable. With a laptop you are free to roam where you want to.

A laptop with a wireless internet connection gives you the ability to work in any room in the house and even beyond. With a laptop you have the freedom to leave your home (or office) entirely and still have the full blown computer power that you would expect to have with a desktop machine. And with free wireless "hot spots" popping up all over the place the possibilities are endless – you can get the same amount of work done that you would expect to get done if you were confined to a desk all day from places like coffee shops, airports, the lobby of a fine hotel or even (if you live in a gated community) down at the clubhouse by the pool!

But (as is true with all good things) there are a few "gotcha's" that you have to be aware of if you decide to take your machine out on the road.

One issue that causes a fair amount of confusion for the budding "road warrior"

confusion for the budding "road warrior" is the inability to send email from on the road. Receiving mail is usually not a problem but the inability to send mail when you are on a connection other than your home network is a complaint that I used to hear quite a bit.

Now, not everyone has this problem. There are plenty of people out there who are able to use their laptops wherever they

want and sending isn't a problem but there are others who (try as they might) can't send an email when away from home to save their life. The answer usually lies in what email service their system is set up to use when the mail fails to send versus the email services that works no matter where they are.

Confused? Let's back track a bit and talk about the typical home internet service and what's included. When you sign up for internet service for your home one of the things that you get with that service is an email address. Your Internet Service Provider (ISP) gives you access to the internet from home and sets up a username which typically becomes your email address. Then your email program (Outlook, Windows Live Mail, Etc.) gets set up with your username, password, "POP" and "SMTP" settings. Now the POP settings (POP="Post Office Protocol") are the settings that tell your email program from where on the internet your incoming mail can be retrieved and the SMTP settings (SMTP="Simple Mail Transfer Protocol") tells your mail program where

on the internet your outgoing mail needs to go when you click the "Send" button. The problem sending mail usually lies with the SMTP settings.

You see, Internet Service Providers take SPAM (junk email) very seriously and in an effort to try to thwart SPAM, some providers will prohibit relaying outgoing mail through their SMTP servers. What this means is that when an outgoing mail message is being sent

from within their network, it goes along without a hitch. But when you try to use your machine in a network that is different than network you use at home (maybe your home network is AT&T and the coffee shop you are trying to send email from is Comcast for example) then the SMTP server rejects the outgoing mail because it's not originating from within its network but from some other network. The message gets blocked as part of the service provider's efforts to thwart SPAM.

So what do you do? And why is it some people have no problem sending mail and others can't?

Well, many ISPs have a different SMTP address for people when they are on the



road but one of the easiest ways to work around this issue is to set up a free "Web Based" email service like Gmail so it doesn't matter where you are when you try to send email. With an email services like Gmail you can set up your SMTP settings in your email program to point to Gmail's server and bypass your ISP's SMTP settings altogether. It's a simple fix and using a Web Based email service also lets you keep using the same email address even if you move or change internet service providers. But that's a whole other issue altogether isn't it?

Group consists of educational representatives from three Indian River, Martin and St. Lucie County school districts

"All the districts across the State of Florida are in the middle of a textbook adoption period that has a very specific timeline that is running, and we need some direction as far as where we should go, what we should do and how we should act," Chairwoman Roberts said. "So, all the people there were kind of on the same page that this is something we need to address as soon as possible, come up with some kind of response or action from the School Board, move it forward and get it off our plate."

Chairwoman Roberts then told the Board that District Attorney Molly Shaddock had since drafted a resolution to send to the State Board of Education and she herself had contacted State Board Member Michael Olenick.

"I talked to Mr. Olenick today who has told me he has a call in to the Commissioner of Education [Richard Corcoran]and was expecting something back," she added. "I just checked, and he doesn't have anything for us yet."

District 2 Board Member Marsha Powers then questioned the need for calling the emergency meeting, worried that the Board may have inadvertently violated Florida's Sunshine regulations.

"From a procedural standpoint, I think calling an emergency meeting was probably out of order – it doesn't fit the bill," she said. "This could be addressed at a regular meeting, so I'd ask the attorney what those guidelines are for calling an emergency meeting."

School Board Attorney Anthony George then explained that the aforementioned regulations required a minimum of seven days' advance notice for such meetings but that the administrative code allowed for certain extenuating circum-

stances

"If an agency, in this case you all operating as a Board, finds an immediate danger to public health, safety or welfare that requires immediate action, the agency may hold an emergency public meeting and give notice of such meeting by any procedure that is fair under the circumstances and necessary to protect the public interests," he said. "The agency at the time of or prior to its action needs to publish the specific facts and reasons for finding an immediate danger to the public health, safety or welfare and its reasons for concluding the use was fair under the circumstances."

The attorney's explanation failed to give Ms. Powers the comfort she sought, although she admitted she saw at least the need for clarification.

"I think that we should give guidance to the superintendent on textbook adoption because we certainly don't want to make that investment," she added. "But if we're going to have something like this, we need to give the public adequate time to respond and participate in the process. This in my mind does not impact health, safety or welfare, but I do think it is appropriate for us to give guidance."

District 5 Board Member Michael DiTerlizzi partially disagreed, saying the resolution was "really just asking for assistance from the governor"

"I would think that kind of money is certainly in the best interest of our community and public welfare, so I think it satisfies the welfare requirement of this to have an emergency meeting," he said. "I don't want to spend \$1.4 million if those books are going to be useless."

District 4 Board Member Tony Anderson concurred.

"I think that word welfare may be the catch there because we're all scrapping for dollars," he said. "To go out and foolishly spend some money, that's not going to do us any good. That would not be a wise decision."

Ms. Powers stood firm, however and did her best to debunk the reasoning of her fellow board members.

"Well this resolution doesn't address the spending of dollars -- that isn't what this resolution does," she exclaimed. "This resolution asks for direction."

"With all due respect, I don't want to wait for them [Florida Board of Education] to give us direction," Mr. DiTerlizzi countered. "I think the emergency is getting the request to the governor that we want information as a Board on how to proceed forward, what books are going to be available to us, when are they going to become available to us and what do we do in the mean-

Ms. Defenthaler agreed.

"We're just trying to find out direction because sometimes decisions are made, but they don't realize the repercussions of some of those decisions," she said. "Either we move forward or we stop and wait for what they're going to tell us we need to do, but \$1.4 million is a lot of money, and we are responsible to taxpayers."

Mr. George then told the Board "the most cautious approach" would be postponing the discussion to the Feb. 19 meeting.

"That way everyone gets seven days' notice and the public's aware," he explained. "But if this Board believes there is an emergency, just make sure you're following the Administrative Procedures Act and how you make your findings for adopting the resolution."

Both Board Members DiTerlizzi and Defenthaler balked at the idea of the additional delay.

"I don't think anybody in the public's going to oppose us sending this question because they would want their taxpayer dollars to be safeguarded," the latter said. "And we're not saying anything in here that would be something that the general public wouldn't want us to do in the first place."

Mr. George subsequently recommended the Board use the same wording that Chairman Roberts had placed in an email to him earlier in the day for wording the motion on the ordinance. Ms. Powers then made a futile last-ditch effort to reason with her fellow Board members.

"I don't think we've even given an opportunity for the superintendent to do her job, which is to ask the commissioner of education or to ask the governor's office on our behalf," she said. "Because you're right, we can't do that as a group, but the superintendent can, and we haven't even done that. Instead, there is an emergency meeting called for something that could have waited."

Mr. DiTerlizzi then made the motion to send the ordinance to Tallahassee, which was seconded by Ms. Defenthaler and passed 4-1, with Board Member Powers dissenting. The entire Board consented, however, to an action item on the Feb. 19 agenda stopping the funding on the new math textbooks until further notice.

Only one member of the public spoke, local activist Laurie Prim, who cautioned the Board on potentially abusing the emergency meeting clause.

"I think there's going to be a lot of new things in legislation coming down, and are we going to call an emergency meeting every single time?" she asked. "I'm here because I could get here today, but my phone was crazy today with parents and taxpayers who couldn't be here today. We also need to think about what's an emergency and what's not, so people can give input on these issues."

Ms. Prim also insisted that Common Core had already been eliminated when the state switched to the Florida Standards in 2014 and said what most people opposed were the standardized tests.

"What we all do agree on is testing is bad, and mandates are bad," she added. "Just let the teachers teach and pay them what they're worth. Standards themselves are not bad, we just need to let teachers teach."

Acting County Attorney Krista Storey informed LPA Chairman James Moir of the postponement, explaining that county code permitted the applicant two postponements and that no new public notices of the meeting would be required.

"So, your typical practice has been to take up that continuation request, and then if there are members of the public who are not going to be able to attend the next hearing, they are certainly welcome to speak," she said. "Otherwise for the benefit of the public -- assuming you would continue it, which I would recommend that you do -- this item would come back March 7. With that, there wouldn't be any other notices provided."

In response to further questioning by Chairman Moir, Ms. van Vonno assured him the request was in order. The former then invited the two public speakers signed up for the hearing to address the Board, both of which were opposed to the development in their neighborhood. The previous meetings on the new charter school before the Martin County School Board proved to

be contentious, with many residents opposed to the initial approval of the school and the subsequent approval of the TCCA contract with the District. The School Board approved the contract last August after initially approving the school in April. Former School Board member Tina McSolely cast the lone dissenting vote in the charter approval, while both she and Chairwoman Christi Li Roberts voted against the contract. Ms. McSolely stated last August that the proposed school did "not provide innovative methods -- there are no significant additional educational opportunities at all."

Although many of the opposing county residents in the prior meetings cited the possibility of TCCA siphoning funds away from the District's traditional public schools, the two most recent protestors complained primarily about potential traffic jams and cited environmental concerns.

Steve Martinez lives adjacent to the 14.2-acre site where TCCA plans a two-story, 65,000-square-foot building.

"I've got 50 feet between the house that's next to me, and they're going to put a two-lane road in and out," he said. "I don't want to see hundreds and hundreds of cars and hundreds and hundreds of children going in and out of the building and just facing me.

That's why I joked initially when I said build a wall -- I want a wall built up."

The other public speaker, Jerry Cline, said he lived just down the road in the gated Summerfield community. His primary concern was the number of cars needed to ferry the 600 or so students back and forth everyday since charter schools do not have to provide public transportation.

"We're going to have 500 cars, not counting staff, hitting this site in a two-hour span at the most," he exclaimed. "This is going to be a nightmare people, with a traffic light on Willoughby, there and Atlantic Ridge, and blinking yellow lights slowing traffic down to 20 miles an hour."

Although the county is requiring the school developer to incorporate both left-and right-turn lanes into the property, Mr. Cline thinks they won't be sufficient for the number of vehicles needing to access the site in a short period of time. His neighbor, he said, commutes to Palm Beach County every weekday morning and already describes the road as a "nightmare at 7 a.m." without the new charter school in place.

"Some will be coming from west to east, some will be coming from east to west, all on Cove Road," he added. The right-turn lane can go just so far because there are homes very close to where this site is. I don't know how many cars can be in those turn lanes, but I did speak with [Growth Management Department] people in this building earlier in the week – 20 cars, 30 cars, 10 cars, I don't know how many it can be."

Mr. Martinez concurred with that assessment but also worried about smells coming from the planned campus if the facility won't have access to public utilities and wastewater on the property.

"I have concerns about smell and whether the school's going to put septic systems," he added. "If you're going to put a septic system for over a thousand people on a daily basis, guess what? I'm going to hear these trucks coming in to empty that septic system every month. It's a problem."

After Mr. Cline spoke the first time, Chairman Moir reminded him of the importance of his attendance at the rescheduled quasi-judicial hearing.

"I urge you as your civic prerogative to be at the March 7 meeting as well," he said.

"I plan to as well," Mr. Cline responded. Mr. Martinez emphasized that he would also attend the rescheduled hearing.

The LPA subsequently voted unanimously to approve the postponement.

Expect to join more than 80 million people that go out to eat on Valentine's Day, which is the second largest dining out holiday behind Mother's Day.

Well, my family won't be dining out, that's for sure. It's not that I don't respect and love my wife, but she insists I make her favorite meal, whatever it might be that day. She has a habit of changing the menu from time to time.

At first I thought she was testing me. Over the years, I have come to realized it really is a compliment to my cooking ability.

As a professional chef and having competed in many culinary contests, my wife has come in contact with many talented chefs and we have shared some outstanding dinners together. Every time I would compete in a culinary salon, my wife would take notes as the judges discussed and critiqued all the dishes that had been prepared. This helped me in future competitions, but, unfortunately, she learned a lot about food and how it should be prepared and taste, which tells you why we don't go out to eat very often unless it's a chef buddy of ours cooking the meal!

I actually enjoy cooking for her. We are always trying different foods; it makes me a better chef and, quite frankly, it's the least that I can do for all the love we have shared for more than 41 years. I think that's what Valentine's Day is all about; a reminder of sharing love between two people.

Much like Mother's Day, we use Valentine's Day to express our love and gratitude for life together. Cadbury was a very smart businessman when, in 1861, he introduced

the heart-shaped box of chocolates that is still going strong today.

Many of us give flowers or special gifts. Sorry folks, that's not enough or personal enough for me. Nothing is more personal than cooking for someone, especially someone you care about. Yes, you're creating something with your own hands and in that moment, a memory is born that could last a life time.

Of course, you have to make sure it's a good memory. Don't try to make something fancy you've never made before. Because more often than not, you may not succeed. Keep it simple, but nice.

I think my favorite is a breakfast in bed treat. Get up early and prepare a special breakfast he or she likes. Surprise your sweetheart with a glass of champagne with a fresh peach slice. There are several rose champagnes as well. Then prepare a combination plate with fresh berries and fruit. Find a special small bowl and mix 1 cup of the fruit together. Set aside. Make a special French toast (recipe to follow). Poach two fresh, cage-free eggs. Place four slices bacon in a sheet pan and bake for two minutes, then sprinkle lightly with brown sugar and pancake syrup, bake until golden brown.

Make sure you have a nice serving tray, line with a linen napkin, wrap all silverware in a linen napkin and serve all the plated food on the tray with a single rose.

Chef Costa's Love Potion French Toast

Serves 4-5

Ingredients

One Panettone round bread, sliced 1½ inch thick

Spray butter as needed

5 large fresh eggs

2 cups half and half (eggnog if available)

2 cups whole milk

2 teaspoon butternut extracts (this is the secret ingredient; don't tell anyone)


½ cups granulated sugar Ground cinnamon as needed

Directions

Mix well all ingredients, except cinna-

mon, in a large bowl. Heat large fry pan or sauté pan over medium low heat. Soak Panettone bread, one slice at a time, in mixture until soggy. Place in sprayed heated pan, sprinkle with cinnamon and cook for about one to two minutes until slightly brown and turn over continue cooking another one to two minutes, be careful not to burn. Serve with your favorite syrup or sprinkle with powdered sugar.

Prepare for Spring

ith everybody getting his or her yards ready for spring 2018, the one thing everybody wants in their yards is color. Color is one of the main elements that make your yard stand out. One of the most practical ways is through the use of roses. Roses are beautiful flowers that symbolize love and friendship. Imagine yourself entertaining your friends in a lovely alcove surrounded by colorful flowers. Roses are relatively easy to grow and are a great choice because they will often grow where other flowers won't because of Florida's intense summer sun.

Roses can be successfully planted in either containers or in the ground. In either case, the plants should be in well-drained soil in a sunny location. If you plant your treasures in the ground, be sure the soil drains well. Dig a hole about 15 – 18 inches wide and eighteen inches deep. Put a layer of gravel on the bottom of the hole. This is to allow drainage so water drains away from the root system. The same would apply if you plant your roses in a container. The next step is to prepare the soil you are going to use to plant your roses. You should use a mix of a good quality potting soil with around half the mixture composed of organic matter such as mulch or peat. You can also use some bone meal with your soil mixture. Now, it's finally time to plant your prize. Carefully remove the plant from its original container. Place the plant in your prepared hole so the top of soil layer on the plant is the same level as the surrounding soil. Fill the gap underneath the plant with your prepared soil mixture. Now, fill the gaps around the remaining parts of the plant and pack down lightly. You are now ready to water in your newly planted rose.

OK, you finally have your roses planted and they are bursting with color, now you need to do some periodic maintenance to maintain that beauty. Since we live in such a humid climate, certain diseases such as black powdery mildew and black spot can both be a common problem. Both diseases are much easier to control if you prevent them happening in the first place. Once established, both are very difficult to get rid of. Although there are many products on the market that are used for disease control on roses, Orthenex reigns as the king. The product controls not only diseases but also controls insect infestation as well. If you are interested in an all-natural cure for fungus, how about baking soda. That's right, baking soda. Plain ordinary baking soda added at the rate of 3 teaspoons per gallon of water. You then can add a small amount of mild dish detergent to the mix to act as a spreader sticker. This will work as a preventive measure but will not work well if an infection is present. Be sure not to make your mix too strong as damage to your roses could result.

With all the remedies that we have at our disposal for controlling rose problems, probably the best way is prevention. One way is to avoid watering late in the day so the leaves of the plant do not stay wet all night. Also it is important to have good soil drainage.

Roses are heavy feeders and like a good supply of food. Roses should be fed at least once a month. You can use a good quality commercial food or you can use your own mix, which should consist of 1 cup of bone meal, 1-cup cottonseed meal, one-half cup blood meal, one-half cup fishmeal and one-half cup Epsom salts. You can spread this mix around each plant and then water

Enjoying a couple rounds at Celebration Golf Club

When I travel to Orlando to cover the PGA Merchandise Show, I try to get in at least one round of golf while in town. Between the theme parks and family living in the area, I spend a lot of time in Kissim-

As in years past, I was joined by my best friend Dan Shube and another close friend. James Murphy. James' father Mike used to be part of our group before he passed just five short years ago. As always, it became a wonderful afternoon of golf and reminisc-

This year we took our little tour to Celebration Golf Club in Kissimmee. I remember playing the course shortly after it opened in 1996 with my father.

For the father son team of Robert Trent Jones, Sr. and Robert Trent Jones, Jr., it is the last design they did together. The course incorporates many of each designers' most notable features. The fairways are tight, but fair. The farther you choose to hit it, the more accurate you need to be. The greens vary in size from huge to downright small. There is water to be found on all but one

Celebration also features one of the most unique practice facilities you will find anywhere. The range is actually a large lake, with floating islands to use as targets. There is also a large putting and chipping area.

The Jones duo managed to sculpt a park-like course from within a natural wetland habitat. Not an easy task. The combination of rolling terrain, clusters of oak, pine and magnolia, combine to create a tranquil golf experience.



The course puts a premium on ball-striking and strategy. The greens are the course's true defense. Here you will find few, if any, straight putts. The greens feature more undulation and elevation change than any I can remember playing.

There are five sets of tees for each hole, and an additional two can be played using a combination of other tees. The par 72 course can play as long as just over 7,000 yards to as little as 5,200. For juniors, beginners, and seniors there are plates in the middle of each fairway allowing them to play a much shorter course without as much water in play.

Amenities at Celebration include a beautiful tin-roof clubhouse with a fully stocked proshop. Locker rooms provide showers and changing areas. There is a full service restaurant and lounge serving meals all day and into the evening. Carts come equipped with GPS along with two ice chests to keep your beverages cold for the entire round.

With two par-3s and the shortest par-5 on the course, the first five holes are some of the least difficult on the course. From here it gets a bit more difficult. The rest of the front nine features narrow layup areas and well-guarded greens.

The ninth may be my favorite hole on the front nine. This par-4 requires a tee shot down the left side to open up the approach to a long, narrow green sitting well right, behind a wetland area. Any miss here will leave you with a difficult chip or bunker shot.

After a quick stop at the turn to fuel up, we hit the easiest hole on the course. The 10th is a very short par-4, with a very elevated green.

Like the front nine, these first few holes will test your accuracy and mental toughness. The 12th is a double dog-leg par-5 that begs you to cut the corner down the left side. The more you can do that, the easier the layup or risky go-for-the-green-in-two will be.

The 15th is a perfect scramble tournament hole. Put one in play and let the long drivers go for the green over the trees to the right. On this hole one can card a two just as easily as an eight.

Like all the other greens, you will need to negotiate a lot of undulation and elevations to avoid a three-putt if you don't stick you r approach


