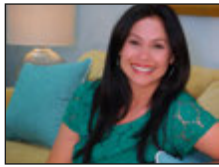

Controversial Cove Road project approved

MARTIN COUNTY — The County Commission unanimously approved the controversial Cove Royal project March 26 in spite of complaints by neighboring property owners and a 2-1 vote by the Local Planning Agency recommending

denial earlier in the month.

With the latest vote, Palm Beach County developer Brian Tuttle won the right to proceed with his planned 118-unit residential development wedged between environmentally sensitive lands and private land owners along the busy Cove Road corridor. Hepatitis A wave declared

At least 16 confirmed cases and two deaths reported since Jan. 1, with two-thirds reported since April 1

MARTIN COUNTY — Fire-Rescue, government, health and law-enforcement officials held a press conference in Stuart April 5 to announce a hepatitis A outbreak in Martin County after the county listed its 13th confirmed case of the highly contagious liver infection.

As of press time, Martin County has 16 confirmed cases of Hepatitis A. There have been more than 1,200 confirmed cases of Hepatitis A statewide. The Florida Department of Health considers a community "high risk" when the confirmed number of cases reaches 5. Martin County reached high risk status with 5 confirmed cases as of Monday, April 1.

The day prior to the press conference, the medical examiner's office released the autopsy results of a Palm City couple, Jeffrey and Nancy Kirsch, both 62, who Martin County Sheriff's deputies discovered dead in their home March 28 from complications related to hepatitis A. According to friends and family members, the couple told them they were fighting the flu.

Health Department Environmental Health Manager Todd Reinhold helped field questions from the media, emphasizing that people should not do as the Palm City couple did and self-diagnose.

"Self-diagnosing and reporting on your own is not the proper way to do it," he said. See HEPATITIS, page 11

Harnessing power for your computer

Let's talk about power. Not the kind of power that we usually think of when we think of computers and power. I don't mean processor power measured in gigahertz or anything like that. Let's talk about the power that your computer needs to run. Good, old-fashioned AC power - all computers need it to function, but not many people understand just how critical "clean" power is for the proper operation of a machine.

The power we get raw out of the wall can fluctuate, sometimes wildly, due to any number of environmental issues - from thousands of users suddenly kicking on their air conditioning all at the same time to solar flares causing glitches in the power grid. In order to "clean up" power, it's recommended to plug a surge suppressor into your wall outlet and then plug your computer equipment into that. But what does that do? How does that help ensure that your machine is getting that squeaky clean power that it needs?

Well, surge suppressors are devices that are designed to clean up the normal fluctuations in power that is common on all power grids by keeping the voltage at a constant cycle. The surge suppressor will clip off any spikes in the voltage that could cause damage to sensitive hardware in your computer, but there are some things that your average surge suppressor can't do anything about. For instance, if the voltage drops due to a brown out, your surge suppressor can't really do anything about that (it's an "under-voltage" situation, not an "over-voltage" or "surge") and if you take a direct hit from a lightning strike, forget about it; all bets are off. A lightning strike has so much power behind it (think "hotter than the sun") that it usually flows right through your average surge suppressor, toasting everything in its path, including the surge suppressor itself! Many people are really surprised to learn after suffering from a lightning strike that their surge suppressor did nothing to protect their equipment. The mistake here is that people think of lightning as just another surge in power, and the surge suppressor is there to handle surges. Unfortunately that's not entirely the case. For a direct lightning strike, there is not much available to protect equipment save unplugging all your equipment during a storm. And with the frequency of storms that we get around here, that's not always practical.

OK, so that covers lightning, but what

about a "brown out?" A brown out is a phenomenon that is just the opposite of the surge. When everyone suddenly kicks on their AC and all the lights go dim for a few seconds or even minutes, that lower voltage can often cause machines to act squirrely. But since it's a low voltage situation instead of a surge in voltage, most of your basic surge suppressors are unable to supply the extra power to keep it at the proper levels for your computer.

And then there are the outright power outages that can last for seconds, minutes and even hours. For these kinds of power conditions, the best thing you can add to your system is an "Uninterruptible Power Supply" (also known as a "UPS" or "Battery Backup.")

Most battery backup systems come equipped with surge suppressor circuitry so you get the best of both worlds; you get the benefit of clipping over voltage spikes from your system, and you get a constant flow of balanced electricity regardless of whether the power coming from the wall drops due to a brown out or cuts out altogether.

The thing to keep in mind about UPS systems is that they are not designed to allow you to keep working through a power outage; they are there to allow you just enough time to save your work and do a controlled and proper shutdown of your system rather than having the system just drop out on you.

In a nutshell, the least desirable way to set up your computer equipment is to just plug everything right into the wall. The next best thing is to plug your equipment into a surge suppressor of some type; that way you at least have a way to clean any normal spikes from your power. The best solution is to get a UPS and plug your monitor and tower alone into it. That protects you from spikes and brownouts and full-blown power outages.

Understanding 'I ask'

Since 2001, our country has observed Sexual Assault Awareness Month every April. Just as every cause, movement and epidemic has designated colors, ribbons, slogans and walks, so does sexual violence. The stark difference between sexual violence and all of the other worthy causes is that so many of the survivors of sexual abuse, rape, molestation, incest, stalking and sex trafficking live a lifetime of shame and silence. And most of their perpetrators are never held accountable.

The theme of this year's Sexual Assault Awareness Month is "I Ask." It is meant to spark a conversation around consent - how we ask for it, what it is, and how to get comfortable with the language in the new era of "hook up" culture and the #MeToo movement.

But, "I ask" when will we finally lift the stigma surrounding sexual violence? When will our ability to talk about it become "normal" so we don't need a special month or designated ribbons, so there is no shame in living through these experiences and survivors can come out of hiding? As we share stories, education and awareness we create a safer place for future generations. Yet despite enormous progress, in many communities and walks of life sexual abuse and rape are topics that we rather pretend doesn't exist, perpetuating the guilt and shame.

One in four women and one in six men will be a victim of sexual violence in their lifetime. It is hard to believe such staggering statistics. As the founder of a nonprofit dedicated to survivors of rape, sexual abuse and sex trafficking, I know first-hand just

how on point these statistics are. At every community event we attend, someone opens up about their story, often for the very first time.

There are survivors in our churches, schools, workplaces. They are in our clubs, live next door and in our families. So, this April, I ask - isn't time we start talking about sexual violence without shame once and for all?

Farms District to planned unit development resulted from the concerns of two of the three members present on the area's poor stormwater drainage and worsening traffic congestion.

Mr. Tuttle's local landscape architect, Don Cuozzo of Stuart, explained during the latest meeting that his client had since added to the planned drainage culverts under an east-west dirt path on the 97-acre property.

"We have now increased the number of crossings there to seven," he said. "So, the drainage really now goes beyond the 500-year storm. We really think that it's going to do two things: one, it will prevent the drainage from being impacted to the north of us, and two, I think it will actually supply more water to the Seabranche [Preserve State] Park, which eventually gets to the headwaters of the South Fork of the St. Lucie River."

Some of the adjacent residents familiar with the property complained to the LPA about water flowing across the aforementioned pathway after a storm, which Mr. Cuozzo said during the recent meeting bisected the wetlands and could not be done nowadays "because environmentally we wouldn't be able to get the permit."

One of those was Lisa Ares, whose family has lived for decades on the adjacent land and complained bitterly to the LPA about the proposed development. While admitting that "developers were nice enough to meet with my family and myself" two weeks prior to address concerns, Ms. Ares still remained unsatisfied about drainage issues and the potential for wildfires on the property's preserved wetlands.

"I had hoped to see this in writing for approval at today's meeting," she said. "As the site plan does not have these updates, the flooding to my property still remains an unresolved concern. Another concern was this development is being built in a community with a history of wildfire on adjacent property for the last three years. The developers at the LPA meeting stated the future Cove Royal HOA will have a committee of homeowners to police the property according to fire-wise standards, but in the current PUD I don't see any mention of mandating the creation of this committee."

Her mother, Lillian Ares, also credited the Cove Royal representatives with addressing some of the family's concerns but insisted the preexisting residents would bear the brunt of allowing developers to build with-

out sufficient infrastructure already in place.

"We need to have stewardship of the land," she said. "We have developers come in, develop their developments, take their money and leave, leaving us who live here -- especially along Cove Road -- to deal with overloads of traffic, our children having to go into portable classrooms and us dealing with life-saving minutes lost because EMS and fire units have to come from a different sector to cover what is an over-burden on them."

One of her neighbors, Lauri Shingledecker, bemoaned both the increasing traffic and the overcrowded schools, both of which she said were negatively affecting her family's quality of life.

"It took me 11 minutes last week to get out of my driveway to get my grandson from Anderson Middle School," she lamented. "I volunteered at Anderson Middle a couple weeks ago where the assistant principal said they already have 1,071 children. My granddaughter's already in a portable at Crystal Lake Elementary. They're putting the cart before the horse here, and the almighty dollar cannot always have the last word."

Ms. Shingledecker saved her harshest words for the surveyors she felt were infringing on her private property rights in preparation for the turn lanes being added along Cove Road for the planned development.

"No one has bought the frontage of my property yet that is adjacent to Cove Road, and there have been surveyors out there numerous times," she added. "They have not once informed me that they were coming on my property, in writing, a phone call or knocking on my door. They have cut branches off trees and bushes and left them there. I can now see through the woods and the cars driving by that I could not see for 20 years."

As soon as Principle Planner Peter Walden finished his subsequent presentation on the project, Commissioner Doug Smith asked for information in order to address Ms. Shingledecker's private property concerns.

"There was a question that was raised earlier about the right-of-way width," he said. "When I looked at the map, it appeared that from the edge of pavement south there was about another 75 feet to the property line. Do you know for all the turn lanes that are proposed to be built, do you know if that's all accommodated in the existing right of way?"

Development Review Administrator Michelle Cullum provided the commissioner an affirmative answer.

"Yes, there is sufficient right of way from the edge of the pavement to the right-of-way line that will accommodate the turning lanes," she answered.

Due to the comments about crowded school conditions, Commissioner Stacey Hetherington questioned Mr. Walden about his direction to remove a previously required special condition of the PUD agreement regarding school impacts.

"I guess they [the School Board] did some recent reevaluations of school capacity," he responded. "I guess there was a drop in some of the enrollment at South Fork, which was the one school that was insufficient at this time."

Martin County School District Capital Planner Kimberly Everman then offered further clarification for the commissioner.

"When this was coming forward last year, we had some deficiency in concurrency at the high school level," she explained. "After working with the capital planning department, we were able to reduce the number of concurrency seats that were in our concurrency reservation for the School District. With a decrease in enrollment and doing a reevaluation, we had enough seats, so it did pass at the high school level. So, there are available seats for this particular development."

Another member of the Ares family, Lillian Ares' husband James, also addressed the Commission, admitting that Mr. Tuttle's development team had done "one hell of a bang-up job" meeting the county's wetland preservation requirements but insisted the county was messing up its residential density transitions by allowing the clustering of residences around the property's preserve area.

"You're supposed to have negative or urban and urban and suburban and then you get country," he said referring to the changes in density. "But what I got is urban, urban, suburban and urban again, because they're going to be shammed up on top of themselves with zero lot lines."

For his part, Mr. Cuozzo emphasized that Cove Royal had been "one of the most scrutinized projects from a staff review perspective" he'd worked on in more than 30 years but insisted his team had complied with Martin County density requirements.

"It is obviously a difficult site and has been a difficult site," he said. "It is true that we do have a lot of environmentally sensitive lands on this property, but our requirements for open space and upland preserve from the code are enhanced because of the way the property lays out. Since we do back up against a lot of five- and 10-acre tracks along Cove Road, we had to meet the densi-

ty transition requirements that are currently in your Comprehensive Plan. We have less than the maximum two units per acre."

In his presentation, Mr. Walden agreed with that assessment while admitting the LPA had recommended denial.

"The Development Review staff has reviewed the application and finds it in compliance with the applicable regulations and the Comprehensive Growth Management Plan," he said.

For her part, Commissioner Sarah Heard tried unsuccessfully to convince Mr. Cuozzo of the need to pay for a traffic signal at the entrance to the development and bemoaned what she referred to as the county's lax PUD requirements.

"This appears to comply with our regulations, and it's unfortunate because I think our regulations are too lax," she said. "4,000 square feet for a PUD parcel size is way too small. I'm afraid that if this becomes the default, then it becomes the precedent, along with the eighth-acre lots on this parcel. The Ares are absolutely right: This is transitional land in our county and we're treating it like it's part of Downtown Stuart."

Even with her opposition, Commissioner Heard insisted she had no choice but to vote in favor of the development.

"Unfortunately, I don't have the legal ability to say no," she explained. "I just think that Martin County is making some mistakes on this application and this project. I've talked about PUD standards for a long time, and there wasn't the appetite to take them up because there wasn't much construction going on. Well, now we have new applications and they're all PUDs, and... one of the bigger advantages is smaller lot sizes."

Commission Chairman Ed Ciampi then asked the developer and his representatives to keep Ms. Shingledecker and her family in the loop for future work in and around their property. Both Mr. Cuozzo and Mr. Tuttle agreed.

"I'll make sure my surveyors go meet with them and the Ares, and we will at our cost provide a survey boundary line on their property," Mr. Tuttle said. "We'll send a surveyor out and we'll put flags every 10 feet so they understand where their property is and where the right of way property is."

As part of a PUD, the Cove Royal developers had to provide a required public benefit. This included leaving up to 76 percent the property, or 74.06 acres, as open space; constructing a sidewalk from the project entrance to Anderson Middle School; and purchasing a passenger van for the adjacent Samaritan House for Boys.

“Proper hygiene and dealing with your physicians, that’s how we control this, that’s how we get through this.”

County Administrator Taryn Kryzda told those in attendance that Sheriff William Snyder contacted her about holding a public meeting April 4 upon learning the results of the Kirsch autopsies.

“The Health Department reached out to us and the sheriff, and that’s why we had our meeting this morning, so that we could bring those individuals together to make sure that we’re given the information and that we’re now communicating it to the public,” she said.

Martin County Fire Rescue Chief Bill Schobel began the press conference by assuring the public present that a hepatitis A outbreak was not uncommon and was a state-mandated classification when any county reports its fifth confirmed case of the year.

“What I want to let you know is, as a community, things are under control,” he said. “This is not an unusual thing to occur even throughout our nation. The state has identified approximately half the counties of having an outbreak. There are actually 1,200 cases statewide.”

When asked by a reporter if the cases were centralized in any particular part of the county, Mr. Reinhold stepped up to the microphone, emphasizing that HIPPA (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act) privacy rules prohibited him from releasing much information about individual cases.

“At this point, no,” he responded. “I can’t provide individual information, but at this point we’re not seeing that.”

For his part, the fire chief said officials had yet to isolate a particular source for the Martin

outbreak when questioned about local shellfish, but both he and Mr. Reinhold emphasized regular hand-washing as a prevention tool and referred to the Florida Department of Health website for more detailed information.

“If anybody contracts this, they are questioned, because we want to isolate as quickly as possible,” Chief Schobel insisted. “But that’s only one type of source of where it could spread in Martin County. On the website, it talks about shellfish, it talks about any uncooked food or a salad bar and so forth. Unfortunately, it’s an oral fecal transmission, so it would have to be someone who didn’t provide good hygiene and then handled your unprepared food, and then you ate it.”

Mr. Reinhold emphasized that his office had been in contact with both the state Department of Business and Professional Regulation and the Florida Dept. of Agriculture to help get the word out locally for food service employees to be extra cautious.

“They are doing their due diligence and informing those areas where there are restaurants and to inform them of just basic hygiene,” he said. “It’s something that these restaurants and groceries go through on a daily basis: hygiene and hand-washing and making sure they’re implementing their policies.”

Sheriff Snyder also fielded questions about protections for his own officers who visited the Kirsch home both the day before they died and the next day, but he insisted his office only found out about potential exposure to the disease upon the release of the autopsy reports.

“First of all I was saddened -- I peripherally knew one of the victims in that case,” he said. “I was alarmed that people not in the target [high-risk] group -- you know we keep talking about my jail and we talk about homeless -- neither one of these fit that. These were your everyday persons, and we don’t know how they got it. So, we’ve offered the full service of

the Martin County Sheriff’s Office to help backtrack it if the State Department [of Health] gets a lead.”

Commission Chairman Ed Ciampi also spoke to the reporters present but specifically addressed his comments to Palm City residents, where at least three of the county’s 15 cases have been reported.

“I’m a Palm City resident and a Palm City parent, so I just wanted to reassure -- not just the residents of Martin County, but specifically the folks that live in Palm City -- where tragically Mr. and Ms. Kirsch lived and passed away,” he said. “Our hearts go out to the Kirsch family. This is a very personal issue where two members of our community have lost their lives, and it’s sort of been the rally cry.”

Chairman Ciampi believes any concerned Martin County residents should seriously consider getting the two-part vaccination in addition to their regular hygiene methods.

“We’ve always heard about hand-washing, but I think the vaccine is a smart choice,” he said. “There is really no down side to having the vaccine and then it does, after the two [injections], sort of vaccinate you for life. So, considering there’s really no down side, why wouldn’t we consider that as a safety precaution?”

When asked by a reporter what he would take away from the outbreak news, Sheriff Snyder said he would do just that.

“I plan to get vaccinated myself,” he said. “Of course, you could say I’m in the high-risk group. Although most of my day is spent here safely in my office, I do go out on the streets. I think that anybody that eats out, eats at salad bars, eats sushi, -- yeah you can wash your hands all day long -- but if they’re serving you your salad, that’s not going to help you a whole lot.”

For his part, Chief Schobel attempted to prevent a vaccination stampede by insisting

concerned residents visit their primary care physicians first if they think they may have contracted hepatitis A.

“You need to have a plan,” he said. “If you do come down with these symptoms, seek medical attention immediately and follow that care provider’s advice. The other thing is, if you’re worried about a vaccination, contact your primary care provider and they might provide it for you. Again, we don’t want to provide an overrun of the physician offices today.”

Mr. Reinhold concurred with that assessment.

“As far as our outreach efforts, the trigger on this was five cases for high-risk population, not mass vaccination of the entire public,” he said. “Of course, if you feel that vaccination is something you desire, then you can do that, and it is available at the local pharmacies.”

Chief Schobel said by the end of the day, both the Martin County and Sheriff’s Office websites would have a link to a document produced by the Florida Dept. of Health on the symptoms of hepatitis A and how to avoid contracting the virus.

Neighboring counties have not reported the same level of hepatitis A cases. St. Lucie County Health Department Public Information Officer Arlease Hall said her municipality has reported only two confirmed cases of hepatitis A to-date. She also recommended the www.flhealthcharts.com link from the Florida Dept. of Health website for people wanting to compare communicable disease rates around the state. According to that website, Martin County had no reported and confirmed cases of hepatitis A last year, while St. Lucie County reported two cases for 2018. Indian River County reported no cases for either of the two years in question. Palm Beach County has reported four confirmed cases of the virus as of April 9 of this year and had reported an outbreak last year with a total of 11 cases.

mulch, there are many other natural alternatives we can use that are both functional and also will save our natural resources. One thing we can use that we all have plenty of is natural grass clippings. That's right; grass clippings can make an excellent mulching material that you can use on almost all your plants and flowers. You do need to be sure, however, that your turf has not been recently treated with any herbicides. The herbicides may damage some of your tender plants. Place the clippings around your plants in layers. Make each of your layers thin and do not make it too thick, as the mulch will produce a smell. Apply the next thin layer after the initial layer has been allowed to dry out. As the clippings decompose, they will produce a fertilizing effect on your plants. The clippings tend to add nutrients back to the soil as they decay and work their way into the dirt. I also am using leaves as a ground cover. The leaves help to retain moisture and like the grass clippings, will naturally decompose and act as fertilizer.

Another great natural mulching material is pine needles. This material is not suitable for all plants, but is great for the majority of plants we use in this part of Florida. You can use pine clippings on any plants that are acid loving. This list can include ixoria, hibiscus, bottlebrush, azalea, gardenia, junipers, and banana trees along with many other plants that require a high acid content in the soil. Not only do many of these natural remedies save resources, they also save you money. Doing large areas of your yard with commercial products can cost a fortune. With

the money you save on mulching materials, you will be able to purchase lots more colorful flowers!

Many of your favorite plants that you have in your yard can be easily propagated into new plants without the need to keep buying new plants. Roses are a great example of this. In the spring, you can choose cuttings that are healthy and green and they will make good candidates for cuttings. Using a sharp knife cut off the soft tip of the cane and then cut it into 4- to 5-inch pieces. Each piece should have at least 2 nodes and some leaves. Strip off the bottom leaves to expose a node, and then plant the cutting in moist soil and keep it in bright shade and high humidity. You can use containers covered with plastic bags, or set them in the ground in the shade and cover them with plastic jugs. Either method should work fine. Take several cuttings to be sure you have success with at least several. You are now on your way to propagating your own Rose garden!

Remember, this year even more than ever we must take responsibility for our planet. Everything you do no matter how small it is helps. It is becoming increasingly critical to help save our planet. Every tiny thing that you do no matter how small it seems to you can help. As we pass 2019 and head into 2020, it is critical that we reduce our use of plastics and recycle everything that we can so it stays out of our landfills. If you have a local recycling program, be sure to participate to the fullest capacity possible.

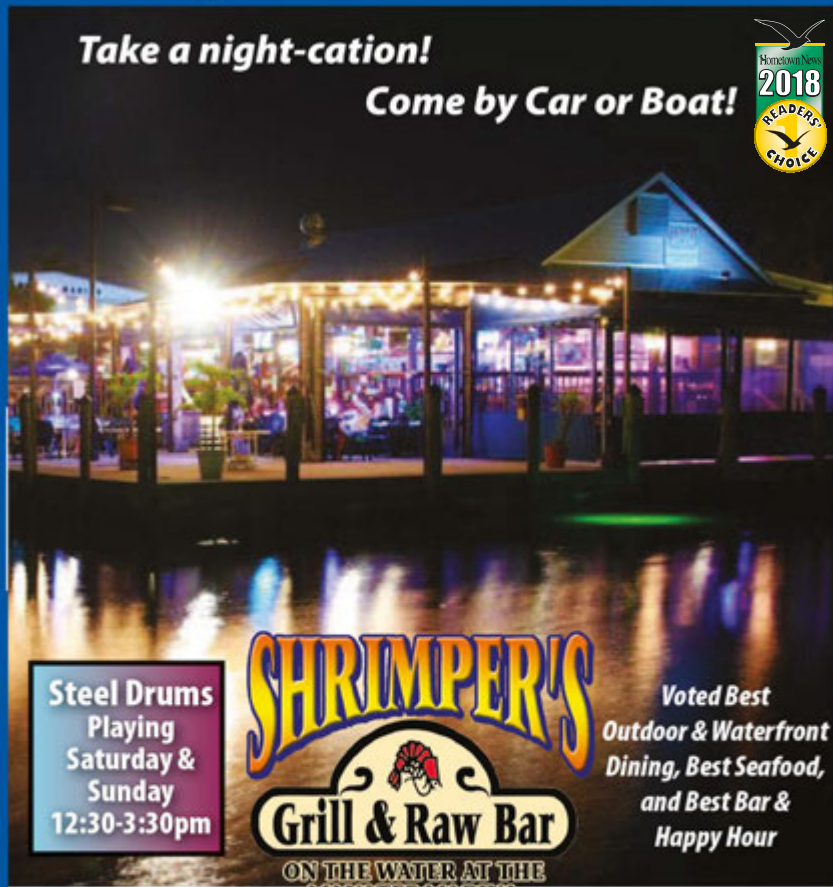

The greatest sandwich made

We all know the history of the sandwich. It was named after the English aristocrat, John Montague, the fourth Earl of Sandwich. He enjoyed eating this type of food because he could gamble with playing cards without touching the meat with his hands because it was served between two pieces of toasted bread.

This idea was born in 1762 at the London Steak Club, a local gaming establishment the Earl frequented. Patrons seeing the sandwich he had requested, ordered the same dish and called it a sandwich.

In 1840, the sandwich arrived in the United States. Now this isn't the first time food was served in this manner. Ancient Roman cookbooks reference a sandwich with cheese.

With all that said, I want to declare the grilled cheese sandwich is the greatest sandwich ever made. OK, don't start sending me a bunch of emails about the turkey club, Rueben's, Muffaletta and corned beef on rye.

Just think about it, no other sandwich has impacted our society more than the grilled cheese. In the 1920s, cheap sliced bread and processed cheese became available and the almost perfect comfort food was developed.

James L. Kraft really put the grilled cheese sandwich in everyone's home. By using a revolutionary pasteurizing process he ensured that cheese wouldn't spoil, even when transported long distances. Kraft Foods would become a

major distributor of food staples found in everyone's home.

Three-quarters of the people who buy sliced cheese make at least one grilled cheese sandwich a month. The cheese sandwich was first introduced as an open faced sandwich, which was baked in the oven. In 1939, The Boston Cooking School Cook Book encouraged cooks to sauté the sandwich in a frying pan coated with butter. The grilled cheese as we know it today was not developed until 1960 when grocery stores began selling Kraft individually wrapped processed cheese slices and sliced bread. Another slice of bread was placed on top to make it a more substantial meal and the sandwich we all love was created.

It is everyone's "go to food" when you want to feed the kids in hurry or make a quick meal. You can create your own special grilled cheese and call it your own. The possibilities are endless.

My wife likes sliced tomatoes inside the sandwich when grilled. I like to use real mayonnaise and tomatoes inside the slices and sometimes I add a couple slices of cooked bacon, then grill. Try making a



three cheese sandwich using American, Gouda and Monterrey jack on a ciabatta roll, then grill.

Don't forget the most important side dish. Sweet gherkin pickles. With all this talk about grilled cheese sandwiches, I know what I'm making for dinner tonight. How about you? Enjoy.

Jackie Robinson Game is new era for Dodgertown

VERO BEACH — The 2019 Jackie Robinson Celebration Game at Historic Dodgertown's Holman Stadium April 15 takes place during an exciting time for the legendary facility.

Jackie Robinson made his Major League Baseball debut with the Brooklyn Dodgers on April 15, 1947. In 1948, Dodgertown opened and became the first fully integrated spring training facility in the south.

The sixth annual Jackie Robinson Celebration Game, a benefit for United Way of Indian River County, will take place on Monday, April 15, at 6:42 p.m., at Holman Stadium. Fireworks sponsored by The Brackett Family Foundation will light up the sky shortly after the game.

Tickets for the expected sell-out are on sale now. The St. Lucie Mets, a Class A-Advanced affiliate of the New York Mets, will host the Fort Myers Miracle, an affiliate of the Minnesota Twins.

"United Way is proud to partner with Historic Dodgertown in the sixth annual Jackie Robinson Celebration Game," said United Way CEO Michael Kint. "This has become a phenomenal community-wide event that is inspirational, family-friendly, affordable, and lots of fun. We deliberately keep ticket prices as low as possible so more people have access to this outstanding event."

In early April, the 50-year spring training home of the Dodgers was renamed in honor of Jackie Robinson. Two months prior, the

facility became the only sports property on the U.S. Civil Rights Trail. It is now featured alongside Dr. Martin Luther King's birthplace in Atlanta; the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma, Alabama; the Greensboro, North Carolina, Woolworth's where sit-ins began; and the National Civil Rights Museum at the Lorraine Motel in Memphis.

The designation followed a similar recognition from the state of Florida. In 2014, Historic Dodgertown was named a Florida Heritage Landmark for its significance in the civil rights movement.

With Mr. Robinson's wife, daughter, and son in attendance, as well as former Dodgers owner Peter O'Malley, MLB Commissioner Rob Manfred announced that Dodgertown will now be called the Jackie Robinson Training Complex.

Indian River County Commissioner Peter O'Bryan handed over the keys to the facility to MLB.

"The relationship between the Robinson family and Major League Baseball is a special one," Mr. Manfred said at a Vero Beach news conference. "Jackie is responsible for the most important moment in the history of baseball, breaking the color barrier, and part of a movement in American history, not just baseball history, that led to greater equality in our country and really a turning point in civil rights."

Sharon Robinson, Jackie's daughter, said "It's very exciting to us because my dad was so committed to young people. While he was still playing baseball, he started with

the Harlem YMCA. He was always committed to the development of young people.”

“Dad would go meet with the young boys. It was boys back then, only the young boys, so now we’ll be reaching boys and girls and hopefully giving them a strong message and support in their lives.”

The facility will continue its focus on the development of youth baseball and softball players.

“Not only is this facility important for what happened here historically, but it’s also important for what goes on here today,” Mr. Manfred said. “Some of our most important programming is held here. It is a symbol of our commitment to making baseball look like America, providing elite playing opportunities to kids, most of color from all over the United States.”

“Dodgertown, Vero Beach played a pioneering role in advancing rights for African-Americans starting in 1948 and continuing throughout the 1950s and 1960s,” said Mr. O’Malley. “All of us connected to Dodgertown and its legacy are extremely proud of this well-deserved recognition by the U.S. Civil Rights Trail organization.”

Enjoy golf with a view of Key Biscayne

Now that we have moved the clocks ahead and we have daylight a bit later every day, the idea of taking off early on a Friday, taking a drive and playing golf may be just what someone needs at the end of a long week.

For me, that drive took me to Miami and one of my favorite courses, Crandon Golf at Key Biscayne. The course has made a bit of a come-back over the past few years. Between a bit of neglect and weather, the course looked a bit ragged a few years ago. That has changed. The fairways are lush, the greens rolling smoothly, and the beverages are cold.

Being right on the barrier island provides the course with spectacular vistas of the bay, the ocean and the Miami skyline. This also put the course right in the cross hairs for Hurricane Irma back in 2017. The course lost power, had lots of flooding and saw many trees downed or damaged. Since a golf course is rightfully down the list on priority for responders, Crandon Golf Club had to wait its turn for help to arrive.

Some regulars were pleased with Mother Nature's renovation. She cleaned out a few trees and opened many of the sight-lines that allow you to enjoy the view of the bay and downtown Miami. Some of the vistas are much more beautiful now.

Crandon has quite a unique history, having played host to the Champions Tour for nearly two decades. The course has been rated in the top-10 by Golfweek and Golf Digest rates the course in its "America's Top-75 Courses".

The course sits just 10 minutes from the

hustle and bustle of downtown Miami. Crandon is pure golf, enveloped by the tropics. The holes run through forests of mangroves and lush tropical foliage. There is an abundance of water everywhere.

The first thing one notices on the course is how secluded you feel. After driving over the Rickenbacker Bridge and past dozens of joggers, cyclists, and people just relaxing by the bay, you arrive at the course. Right next door is the Tennis center at Crandon Park, home to the Miami Open, the second largest professional tennis tournament in the United States and home court for some of the sport's top players.

At the golf course, it's easy to forget how close you are to downtown Miami until you spend a moment waiting on your playing partner and decide to glance across the bay and see the magnificent Miami skyline. If you happen to play late in the afternoon, be sure to bring your camera as the sunset can be quite spectacular.

Crandon Park offers a unique playing experience with seven saltwater lakes, mangrove thickets, daunting bunkers and dramatic views of Biscayne Bay. It's also the only course on the continent to boast a subtropical lagoon.

Four sets of tees allow you to mix and match to find a good blend for your game. If

you feel like testing your game against what the touring seniors faced, try the Championship tees, measuring just a tad over 7,300 yards.

One of the best par-4s I have ever played is the seventh at Crandon. This slight, dogleg right, plays to over 400 yards from all but the front set of tees. Golf Digest named the holes as one of its "Greatest Holes in Golf".

Throughout your round it's easy to get lost in the tranquil atmosphere surrounding the course. That is until you hit a few loose shots and find yourself looking in the mangroves for that new golf ball. The course is also home to a plethora of wildlife. Beautiful herons and cranes fill the waterways along with a couple of crocodiles. Yes, crocodiles, not alligators.

Each hole at Crandon is unique and the layout will have you using every club in your bag. Water comes into play on all but five holes. The par 3s play from as short as 130 yards to well over 200. The fourth is a true three-shot par-5 that plays to over 600 yards from all but the forward set of tees.

The final hole is a wonderful, short par-5 that features a beautiful view of downtown Miami. Just don't get too distracted as this is a great hole to make up ground on your opponents or bury them with an eagle or birdie.

Carts come equipped with GPS to aid in your club selection. Every sprinkler head is also marked to assist those who prefer to



walk. There is a lighted range for those wanting to work on their game at dusk or into the evening.

The clubhouse includes a nicely stocked pro shop, restaurant with patio seating as well as locker rooms for both men and women that include showers. Towels are available for a small fee, or you can bring your own.

Crandon Park Golf Course is well worth the drive from our area. With a beach across the street and plenty of hotels and restaurants nearby, one could turn the day into a relaxing weekend away.

Dark Side of the Moon comes to Sunrise

FORT PIERCE – One of the most celebrated albums in rock and roll history will be performed in full at the Sunrise Theatre April 13 when Classic Albums Live presents Pink Floyd's Dark Side of the Moon.

The revolving cast of musicians that make up the Toronto-based Classic Albums Live is known for note-for-note, cut-for-cut recreations of legendary albums. As Pink Floyd will likely never reunite and tour again, this may be your only chance to ever see this full album performed live.

As one of rock's first "concept albums," Dark Side of the Moon was made to be heard in sequence, beginning to end. The 10 songs that will comprise one half of the concert's tribute to Pink Floyd are, in order, "Speak to Me," "Breathe," "On the Run," "Time," "The Great Gig in the Sky," "Money," "Us and Them," "Any Colour You Like," "Brain Damage," and "Eclipse."

All of the lyrics on the album were written by Roger Waters. The full band participated in writing the music, as did a then unknown Abby Road engineer, Alan Parsons, who came up with most of the weird sounds.

The Classic Albums Live band will also perform a selection of other Pink Floyd classics.

Dark Side of the Moon is widely considered one of the best albums of all time. It reached number one on the Billboard 200 list and remained on the chart for an unheard of 937 weeks. With sales over 45 million, it is Pink Floyd's best-selling album, and it made the band rich.

Much of that revenue, true Floyd fans know, was used to finance the movie Monty Python and the Holy Grail. So if you bought the album when it first came out around 1973, not only did you help put Pink Floyd on the map, but you also helped bring Monty Python to the world.

One myth regarding the album, which the band humorously allowed to grow, was the idea that it was written as an alternate soundtrack for the 1939 film The Wizard of Oz. Since the album was first released, fans have claimed that it syncs up with the film.

When playing the film and the album together, fans insist that Dorothy begins to jog when the band sings "no one told you when to run" during "Time." Dorothy also seems to try to balance on a fence during the line "balanced on the biggest wave" in "Breathe." In a few other instances, the music does indeed seem to correlate to the action in the film.

The band members have all denied any connection, and Alan Parsons has said that the film was never mentioned once during the recording of the album.

So it's a myth, but a fun one. Google "Dark Side of the Rainbow" and you'll see countless videos of fans trying to sync the two masterpieces.

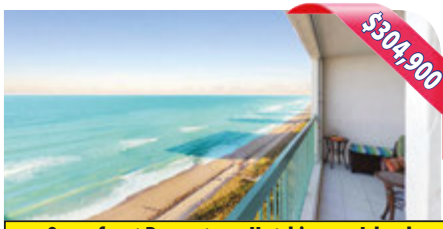
