## Brevard Zoo to open 'Treetop Trek' attraction next month

The notion of strapping yourself to a harness and zipping across a mountain or through a canopy of trees is becoming one of the most popular outdoor adventures for thrill seekers.

The sport that has evolved as a tourist attraction in many locations throughout the world, including the rainforest in several Latin American countries, as well as throughout the United States, will now be avail-

able beginning July 2 at the Brevard County Zoo.

"Treetop Trek Aerial Adventures" will debut as the newest attraction on the 72-acre grounds of the zoo in Viera and hopes to offer guests a chance to explore the world up in the trees," said Andrea Hill, Brevard Zoo marketing director.

The new outdoor attraction, which cost a little more than \$500,000 and took almost six months to construct, will offer people young and old wanting to

## Beachside Girl Scouts prove passion for pets

Community efforts earn junior troop Bronze Award

Owning a pet can be one of the most rewarding things in life, members of Girl Scouts Troop No. 1969 say.

And following eight months of hard work, the girls proved exactly that to one another, as well as various members of the community.

The Indialantic-based troop, sponsored by Holy Name of Jesus Catholic School, consists of 16 members, who will enter fifth and sixth grades next year.

Thirteen of the girls earned the Bronze Award this April, which is the highest award in Junior Girl Scouts, and is awarded based on leadership and planning skills and the ability to make a positive impact on the community.

In order to qualify for the award, the girls first agreed on a topic of interest - animals.

From there, they were required to earn several leadership badges, which in their case, was a veterinary care badge and a wildlife badge.

Health First conducts free seminar at Space Coast Stadium

ROCKLEDGE - People don't always experience a medical emergency while inside a hospital. And during a weather crisis such as a hurricane, an ambulance can't always get to an emergency patient instantly.

So Health First has decided to teach some basic life-saving skills to the public.

That's why about 2,100 people streamed into Space Coast Stadium in Viera on Saturday for a free class on the life-saving technique of CPR.

Families filled the baseball field to learn the resuscitation method that can be used in an emergency.

Elliot Cohen, a Health First spokesman, said the 2,100 people trained in CPR will enhance the county's survival rate

## Secretaries have evolved into administrative professionals

Celebrating 50 years, modern office aides don't make coffee, take dictation

MELBOURNE - Sandy Chandler remembers the bygone days when she was an office secretary and typed business letters on a manual typewriter.

Becky Inman, a Harris employee, remembers the days of carbon paper, when her hands were smudged with ink at the end of the day.

Patty Harris didn't like to be called "Girl Friday" back in that era.

The former secretaries can recall memories - good and bad - of a long-ago era. They aren't even called secretaries anymore - they're "administrative pro-

professionals." Members of the International Association of Administrative Professionals reminisced about those former days during a dinner celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Melbourne chapter of IAAP.

The members met at the Hilton Melbourne Rialto Place to celebrate 50 years as an active organization.

As guest speaker, Ms. Chandler, a past IAAP president, marveled at the rapid changes in the field of secretarial work.

But mostly, the members reminisced.

Computers, e-mail, cell phones, voice mail and other technological advances have transformed

the roles of secretaries. Known today as administrative assistants, they work on computers, not taking dictation. In the new-age era of multi-tasking, they create budgets, agendas and travel plans on line.

A degree in office administration is a requirement because the computer-based workload requires a professional's skill set.

That means the boss is just as likely to make the coffee nowadays.

Chapter President John B. Munns said the role of secretaries has diversified because of technology.

"Secretaries have now broadened into administrative professionals," Mr. Munns said. "They are tech-

experience a challenge with thrilling elements such as tightropes, crab walks, jungle bridges, nets, as well as a zip line courses.

"We are very excited to bring this new attraction to the county, and think that it will appeal to all age groups. It will be perfect for both nature lovers and thrill seekers and we are expecting a busy summer season with the new addition at the zoo," said Ms.Hill.

The adventure will encompass three courses, featuring a variety of different skill levels for participants as young as 4 years of age.

The 'Chutes and Ladders' adventure is a course designed for children 3 to 5 feet tall, and will allow participants to explore 20 treetop games plus two zip lines and a zip slide. Children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian to experience this adventure and the cost is \$15 per person.

The Canopy Walk, an introductory course for anyone more than 54 inches tall, will offer five treetop challenges and two zip lines, allowing guests to experience multiple facets

of the zoo and enjoy nature. The cost for this attraction is \$25 per person.

The third and most advanced course, "Treetop Challenge," will include a canopy walk plus multiple high-stake challenges and a large zip line rising 40 feet above the ground. The cost for this adventure is \$40 per person.

All courses will require participants to complete a brief training session, where the safety features will be explained and capabilities of each individual will be accessed.

All "Treetop Trek Aerial Adventures" will not require general admission to the zoo.

Sharon Connelly, director of operations at the zoo, said that she is very excited about the new addition at the park.

"We will provide a staff of highly trained personnel who will be knowledgeable in CPR and first aid, so that the adventures will be safe for all," she said.

The Brevard Zoo is open daily from 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. and is located a half a mile east of Interstate 95 on Wickham Road.

"It's all a bit embarrassing, and I got pretty fed up with people asking me if I had hit an iceberg," Wilkinson said. He was headed back from a fishing trip when the newly purchased boat went down, according to a story on Yahoo News. He clung to nearby pilings until rescued.

The harbor master who rescued Wilkinson said the breach in the Titanic II's fiberglass hull might have happened because a repair job deteriorated, according to the *Christian Science Monitor*.

From *sfgate.com*: **Facebook party spins out of control**

Better check your Facebook settings before posting a party invitation online. A teenage girl in Germany who forgot to mark her birthday invitation as private on Facebook fled her own party when more

than 1,500 guests showed up and around 100 police officers, some on horses, were needed to keep the crowd under control.

Eleven people were temporarily detained, one police officer was injured, dozens of girls wearing flip-flops cut their feet on broken glass and firefighters had to extinguish two small fires at the 16th birthday party in Hamburg, police spokesman Mirko Streiber said.

The birthday girl, identified only as Thessa, went into hiding, Streiber said, but "nonetheless the party was a hit." Thessa had only wanted to ask some friends over to her home in Hamburg-Bramfeld when she posted her invitation on Facebook, but mistakenly she published it so that everyone on Facebook could see it.

The invitation quickly went viral, and some 15,000 people confirmed online they would come to the party without even knowing the girl, weekly paper *Bild am Sonntag* reported.

When Thessa's parents found out, they made their daughter cancel the party, informed police and hired a private security service to protect their home on Friday night. Despite public announcements in Hamburg that the party had been canceled, some 1,500 teenagers and young adults showed up on the street in front of Thessa's home, Streiber told The Associated Press.

Connecticut police say a man punched himself in the face, tore his shirt and threw his wallet and keys in a river to convince police he had been assaulted.

Farmington police said Daniel Vagnini was arrested after reporting he had been assaulted, then admitting he made up the story. According to police, the 22-year-old sped through a stop sign and nearly crashed into a car. Police say they later found his car and heard Vagnini in the woods. He told police he had been drinking in Hartford and was assaulted and blacked out.

but now we have computers and people do their own correspondence," Mr. Munns said. Mr. Munns said a typical inter-office memo is more of a newsletter that requires "editing, formatting and processing" to make it stand for an organization. Bosses type their own memos nowadays, and they are sent by e-mail, said Pat Gibbs, who retired from administrative work at Harris Corp. "We don't take shorthand anymore. They don't even teach it anymore," Ms. Gibbs said. "It's not just a job nowadays, it's a career." Ms. Gibbs said she attended secretarial college, "but now you can go to Brevard Community College and get

an associates degree in administrative technology." Ms. Chandler, who spent 27 years with Suntrust Bank after a previous career with a Virginia law firm, recalled the frustration of making a typo in the era before Wite-Out. Legal documents, of course, could not be altered with Wite-Out. "I started out with a Royal manual typewriter 44 years ago," Ms. Chandler recalled. "With a legal document, there could be no errors. So you might spend all day, eight hours, typing a will or a deed." Some retired members of the Melbourne IAAP chapter reminisced about relics such as carbon paper, taking dictation, and using ink-linking mimeograph machines. "Back then, if I got to the last line of a letter and made

an error, I had to yank the paper out of the typewriter and start over," Ms. Inman recalled. "It was frustrating." The former secretaries found it amusing that today, a "c.c." copy of an electronic e-mail refers to a "carbon copy" — even though carbon paper barely exists anymore. Still, there will always be a role for administrative assistants, Mr. Munns said. "Bosses are allergic to paper," Mr. Munns said. "You don't want to see them breaking out." Mr. Munns said administrative assistants tend to be the glue of most offices. "You can get by with an incompetent boss, but if you have an incompetent administrative assistant, the place will fall apart," Mr. Munns said. "With an incompetent boss, you can just let him sleep."

### How they can collect money for the red light cameras and avoid due process

This is a "Traffic Law 101" course for all the idiots who support red light cameras.

You will be directed to a website that will contain a grainy video of a vehicle resembling yours and a small, separate, still picture of a license plate reportedly on that vehicle in the video.

There are no pictures of the driver, as so many idiots have claimed "Yah, they just mug it up for the camera blowing red lights."

Your insurance company will be notified, and your premi-

### I suggest a possible solution to the high price of gas crisis

Everything I have learned in my lifetime about prices in a democratic, capitalism society – which is what our beloved country is – tells me that they will respond to supply and demand.

So if we can reduce our demand, we have a chance. But reducing demand does not necessarily mean we have to stop driving.

There is a simpler way, and it involves the amount of gas we store in our gas tanks year round, (i.e. 95 percent of all motorists entering gas stations just automatically "fill it up")

What if instead of driving around with almost full tanks, we instead fill our tanks up half way, (i.e. eight gallons per visit to the pumps instead of maybe 16).

The inconvenience of having to stop at a service station twice as many times a year than we presently do will be worth it.

We will effectively have reduced our "demand" for gas in 1/2 (not actually, of course, but that is what it will reflect in prices as we will be storing one half the amount of gallons that we presently do over the course of a given year.)

Bear with me because this may sound so simple that it couldn't possibly work.

I think it can, and it's at least worth a try.

Why do I think so? because I believe "demand," per se, is a reflection of fuel consumed plus fuel in storage.

So, most people, because of jobs, health care, a million other activities just cannot reduce the amount they consume by 50 percent.

However, my thinking is that by making twice as many stops to pump gas up to the half-way point, we can cut the demand by billions of gallons; and I think \$2 a gallon gas will shortly show up at stations across the country.

Of course, this does not mean we drive out of our way to these stations; we still stop only when we are out driving as part of our normal day-to-day routine.

In unincorporated South Brevard, the days for collection of garbage, yard waste and recycling are changing.

Saturday pick-ups are being eliminated in order for both Brevard County's Solid Waste Management department and vendor Waste Management to save money and work more efficiently.

Brevard County will save approximately \$50,000 per year.

Garbage collection will be made on Mondays and Thursdays for residents between the Pineda Causeway and the Indian River County line, and on the beachside from Eau Gallie Boulevard to Sebastian Inlet.

Garbage will be collected on Tuesdays and Fridays for residents between Rockledge and the Pineda Causeway, and on the beachside from Patrick Air Force Base to Eau Gallie Boulevard.

Yard waste will be picked up on Mondays between the Pineda Causeway and U.S. 192; on Tuesdays from Rockledge south, west of I-95 and south of Wickham Road to the Pineda Causeway; on Thursdays from US-192 south to Indian River County; and on Fridays from Rockledge to Wickham Road, east of I-95.

All yard waste on the beachside will be collected on Wednesdays.

Recycling will be collected on Wednesdays throughout South Brevard. There are no cuts to

simply by being able to react in a medical emergency.

"If just one percent of those people ended up having to use CPR, that's 21 lives that are potentially saved," Mr. Cohen said.

"If you're one of those 21 people suffering a heart attack, that makes a big difference to you," Mr. Cohen said.

The free event drew families to the ballpark to learn the emergency procedure known as CPR, which stands for cardiopulmonary resuscita-

tion

Health First set up several rows of dummies, and people lined up to practice CPR on the dummies.

"There were moms and dads and their kids, all learning CPR together," Mr. Cohen said.

Volunteers from the Health First Training Center instructed the participants in a CPR method called "Friends and Family," sponsored by the American Heart Association.

"It's not the level of CPR in which a paramedic shows up at a house," Mr. Cohen said. "It's basic CPR that can help stabilize a person until a paramedic can get there."

The hospital-sponsored event also offered a demonstration on the use of an automated external defibrillator, known as an AED device, which can automatically restart a heartbeat.

Mike Means, president and CEO of Health First, said the CPR program was designed to give something back to the community. Health First is based in Brevard County.

"The people we will be training will be our own friends and neighbors," Mr. Means said.

"As a locally-based healthcare organization, we devote 100 percent of our resources to improving the health of this community," Mr. Means said.

Mr. Cohen said that in addition to the CPR training, Health First donated five defibrillators to organizations that brought the most people to the training event.

He said among the recipients of the defibrillators were a youth sports league and a local runners club.

Mr. Cohen said one recent example of the benefit of CPR occurred at a Merritt Island health club recently, when a nurse helped restart the heart of a visitor who collapsed with a heart attack.

"The reason he was saved was because the person on the next treadmill was an off-duty nurse who was working out," Mr. Cohen said. "She absolutely saved his life."

Mr. Cohen said because Health First is Brevard-based, it feels obligated to give back to the community.

"Being a corporate citizen means more than just running a business or a corporation," Mr. Cohen said. "Our mission is to safeguard the health of this community."

## Renowned pianist performs

A congenital defect in his ear kept pianist and composer Jeffrey Biegel from hearing more than shadowy sounds or speaking until he was 3. "I remember the vibrations of sound," he said. "My fascination with sound was with music from the beginning. Perhaps that's why music was my language of choice."

An operation corrected the defect, and at 16, the talented musician was accepted as a student of the legendary teacher Adele Marcus at Juilliard. He has had a performing and recording career of note, appearing with orchestras, including the Boston Pops, the BBC Concert Orchestra and the Pacific Symphony Orchestra.

In 1973, Mr. Biegel performed a new sonata by Meyer Kupferman, with the composer in the audience. This experience helped set the course of his professional life. He began what he calls the "global commissioning project," commissioning works by contemporary composers and finding the funding, from sponsors and orchestras, to enable the works to be written and performed. He has commissioned and premiered works by William Bolcom, Richard Danielpour, Lowell Liebermann and Florida

native Ellen Taaffe Zwilich, the only woman to win the Pulitzer Prize in music. The eclectic program for the upcoming performances includes a piano concerto by Keith Emerson, a founding member off the group, Emerson, Lake and Palmer; a piece by Kenneth Fuchs and several works by Leroy Anderson.

"Ken Fuchs I know from Juilliard and we've stayed in touch," Mr. Biegel said. "I formed a trio last year, Trio 21, and we'll premiere his piece, 'Falling Trio,' in September in New York."

When Mr. Biegel heard Keith Emerson's "Concerto No. 1 for Piano and Orchestra," he fell in love with it. He contacted Mr. Emerson, and they became friends.

"I took right to it," he said. "He knows the classics. I'm doing everything I can to get it out there. I like pairing it with Gershwin or Anderson because they complement each other. I'd like to record it."

Mr. Biegel's love for Leroy Anderson's music goes back to his childhood.

"When I grew up, my father had pop recordings," he said. "I thought it was too bad he didn't write a piano concerto. Then I discovered he did. I listened to it on the edge of my seat. I thought I was in heaven."

Mr. Biegel contacted the Anderson family and told them he wanted to bring

the work to audiences everywhere. He performed it with the Boston Pops in Symphony Hall and gave it its New York premiere at Carnegie Hall with the New York Pops. He recently recorded it on the Naxos label with the BBC Concert Orchestra.

Aaron Collins, music director of the Space Coast Symphony Orchestra, said the program for this concert evolved over time.

"Jeffrey and I have been talking for quite a while and formed a friendship," he said. "Last summer, the orchestra did heavier programming. This summer, I wanted to do more exciting and accessi-

ble music. "Jeffrey is the leading performer of the Leroy Anderson piano concerto, the go-to guy. The same is true for the Keith Emerson concerto. Keith and Jeffrey had a long-time relationship and Jeffrey brought it back to the concert halls. He is one of the premier pianists for commissioning and performing new works by the best composers of our day." While Mr. Biegel and Mr. Collins have long corresponded, they will meet for the first time for these concerts. Mr. Biegel has high praise for the younger

# Religious bullies need our prayers

I recently spent the afternoon working on a sermon about the early church, welcoming all who are oppressed — and how modern churches need to do this, too.

After I finished the draft and was leaving, a young adult approached me at the church door with another in the car and asked, "Is it true that this church accepts people like me? I am 'Lesbian, Gay, Bi-sexual, Transgender.'"

Of course I told them they'd be welcome and gave them information about our church and invited them to visit.

Tears came to me on my drive home that evening for two reasons.

One is that a person's first question to a church would be "Is it true that this church accepts people like me?"

It is upsetting that some churches act as if God's unconditional love is conditional.

The second reason I had tears is that the church I am at strives to be about God's unconditional love.

So without hesitation I can respond to people who ask if it is true our church

accepts people like them, "Yes, we do!"

It's so wonderful that there are religious communities (and we are certainly not the only one) committed to unconditional love. But not all religious folks cotton to that very Biblical notion.

My car was recently vandalized with another Christian's views of things written in indelible ink over our church rainbow bumper sticker that rightfully proclaims "God's Love Has No Strings Attached."

My car has been written on by the same Christian vandal before.

Two banner versions of the bumper sticker have also been stolen from our church property.

A giant car magnet was also stolen from a member's car this week, and a member has even been yelled at by an anonymous bully over the bumper sticker.

Our church is not alone in being victimized by religious bullies.

It's sad that some religious people attack others like this, too ashamed of their acts and too afraid of their theology that they do it stealthily and criminally and in an ugly way.

And what a sad witness this and other hateful Christian conduct provides to non-Christians (like the passenger who discovered the criminal mischief on my car).

A Christian stealing and uttering hateful, hurtful words are powerful reasons to be wary of walking into a church.

Hateful religious folks need our prayers — prayers for forgiveness and prayers that they experience God's loving and comforting presence in and out of their churches, so that one day they will no longer hate and victimize those they disagree with.

Won't you pray with me?

## Schools participate in Summer Food Service Program

Brevard Public Schools will participate in the Summer Food Service Program during the months of June

and July.

Nutritionally balanced meals will be provided to all children regardless of race, color, sex, disability, age or national origin during summer vacation when school breakfasts and lunches are not available.

All children 18 years old and younger, living in the area of an open site, are eligible for meals at no charge, and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service.

The programs are only approved for geographical areas of need where 50 percent or more of the children qualify for free and reduced price meals during the school year.

Funding for this program is provided by the federal government through the USDA. Brevard Public Schools receives federal reimbursement for meals served at these sites.

# It's more entertaining to watch the birdies, not the bogeys

As I sit here in my recliner, awaiting the start of the United States Open Championship, I cannot help but wonder, "Which United States Golf Association will set up this golf course this week?"

Will it be the common-sense USGA that did such a splendid job at Oakmont back in 2007, or will we see the USGA that seems bent on embarrassing the best players on the planet with concrete greens and knee-deep rough such as we witnessed at Shinnecock in 2004?

If I were a betting man, I'd go with the later. Far too many times I have seen our country's "keeper of the game" turn our national championship into a silly, ego-driven farce.

I'm all for challenging the best players in the world. But what is more entertaining? A Sunday filled with bogey, double bogey, watch a 5-foot putt roll 20 yards

off a cement-hard green? Or this year's final round of the Masters?

To the stodgy, must-have-their-neck-tie-too-tight men of the USGA, there is nothing quite like watching six or eight guys lose the tournament and one guy hang on. Me? I prefer having three or five guys making great shots to win it. Give me the Masters any day!

Yes, the USGA rightfully wants to determine the best overall player in the field. The brass in Far Hills, New Jersey feels, as do many of us, that hitting the ball where you are supposed to should be rewarded. Accuracy should be just as important as length.

I will give them credit for finally going with what is called "graduated" rough. This means that the guy who misses the fairway by a foot doesn't find himself in the same deep, thick stuff as the guy who missed by 20 yards. Don't get me wrong, the rough is still brutal, but it is setup to hurt the truly wayward not just anyone who misses the fairway.

What I dislike the most about our national championship is the way the USGA and many recreational golfers seem to gloat at watching the suffering that the course's setup causes. The USGA has this determination that par be a great score, not just a measuring stick. A few years back they were almost giddy that not a single golfer shot under par for the final round. Do you really think these guys are that untalented? Or, is the course simply too tricked up and unplayable? I fear that once again the

powers-that-be will manage to embarrass our sport, the best players and even themselves. Anyone remember the 18th hole at Olympic where Payne Stewart's 5-foot putt from just above the hole rolled over 40 feet to the front of the green? How about the 15th at Bethpage in 2002? The USGA set the hole up so that any golfer who couldn't carry the ball 250 yards into a 20 knot wind from the tee was doomed to playing from the deep rough before the fairway. Some players had to aim for the cart path in the hopes of getting a good lie to play the ball from. Yep, that's a fair way to sort out the best players and determine our National Champion.

The USGA needs to come

to grips with par not being relevant. It needs to learn to accept that birdies are part of golf, and that setting up the golf course to prevent them is asinine. It becomes silly when the best players in the world cannot chip a ball onto the green and have it stay there, cannot hold the green with a wedge from the fairway and are putting the ball off the green. Set up a stern, but fair, test of golf and let the elements and the players' skill determine what the winning score will be. Instead we get a group trying to have the same score win every year without regard to the talent or conditions.

I'm sure there are many of you who feel that since the entire field must play the

hole it is a fair test. I'll grant you that, but if we cut the fairways only five yards wide and grew the rough to four feet, as long as we made everyone play it, would you still consider it golf? Or would it simply become too silly to bother watching?

I hope that as I sip my favorite cold beverage this weekend while watching the U.S. Open, I'm treated to some great golf shots and not a cataclysm of one train wreck after another.

But I won't hold my breath.
