## Epilepsy Walk returns to Brevard

Fall event to feature music, food, children's activities

One of the most serious neurological disorders, epilepsy affects more than 50 million people worldwide and about 353,000 people in Florida alone.

"That's 1-1/2 to 2 percent of the state's population," said Chuck Carmen, executive director of the Epilepsy Association of Central Florida.

For nearly 50 years, the nonprofit organization, which covers Orange, Seminole, Osceola and Brevard counties, has been dedicated to improving the quality of life for children and adults with epilepsy and seizure disorders.

Its staff provides medical services and case management for uninsured or economically disadvantaged families, as well as prevention, educa-

tion, information and referral services for the community as a whole.

To help offset the cost of these programs, the organization will host its second annual "Brevard County Epilepsy Walk" Saturday, Nov. 12 at Gleason Park in Indian Harbour Beach.

The event, which featured more than 200 participants and raised more than \$20,000 last year, will include live music, food and a variety of activities for the kids.

Guests of all ages are invited to participate in the walk, while strollers and leashed-dogs are also permitted.

"We have no restrictions regarding the length of the walk," Mr. Carmen said. "People can walk the track once or walk it all day. It's meant to be just a fun, family-friendly opportunity for people to come out and support our cause."

In lieu of registration fees, participants are encouraged to gain sponsors to help raise donations for the organization.

Within the next few months, guests are invited to register via the Brevard Epilepsy Walk website, where they can create their own personal webpage and keep track of the sponsorships they earn.

The best part of the event, Mr. Carmen said, is that 100 percent of the funds raised stays directly in Brevard County to help residents living with epilepsy, which, according to the organization's website, affects more people than muscular dystrophy, multiple sclerosis, cerebral palsy and Alzheimer's disease combined.

She reminisced about meeting her husband, George, over a game of bridge and enjoying a 60-year marriage.

She had two sons with George, an electrical engineer who died in 1994.

One of her sons, Donald Phillips, 72, of Melbourne, was on hand to wish mom a

## Father, son bike from New Jersey to Brevard for autism awareness

**Duo completes 1,257-mile trek in 11 days**

There are many ways to get from New Jersey to Florida – plane, train, car or even boat. But Brandy Boyle and his 13-year-old son, Jacob, decided the most challenging and adventurous way to make the 1,257-mile trek would be aboard a pair of bicycles.

So that's exactly what they did.

Beginning Aug. 1, the father-son duo embarked on a nine-state journey from Highlands, N.J., each equipped with a water bottle and a printout of their makeshift route, courtesy of Google Earth.

Eleven days later, they reached their goal, crossing over the Brevard County line

and into Indialantic, where Jacob and his father lived for five years before moving north in 2009.

The pair appeared surprisingly energized and only a little sunburned as they cruised into the Paradise Beach parking lot last Thursday to meet up with some old friends.

"Well, we made it," said Mr. Boyle, who is a former member of the Eazy Riders cycling group of Palm Bay. "We're alive and well."

So how does one decide to embark on such a unique venture?

A few years ago, Jacob, who lives with his mother in Ohio for most of the year, told his dad he wanted to start training for a triathlon.

But he quickly came across some difficulties, discovering that most public pools in the New Jersey area, where Jacob spends his summers, require children to be at least 16 to swim – even if they have a parent present.

"So, then I had this crazy idea – hey why don't we ride our bikes to Florida instead?" Mr. Boyle said.

After getting permission from Jacob's mother, the two began training their bodies and their Giant TCR and Masi Alare road bikes for the big trip.

They even participated in the 100-mile Ride For Autism event June 10 at Brookdale Community College, in support of a friend of Mr. Boyle's, whose grandson has autism.

The cause made an apparent impact on the Boyles, prompting them to use their trek as a way to raise funds for Autism Speaks, a nonprofit organization designed to increase awareness of autism spectrum disorders, while funding research for its causes.

So far, the pair has raised nearly \$500, but hopes to exceed that number, as word of their journey spreads.

**A Taxing Trek**

Throughout their ride, Mr.

Boyle and his son braved all types of elements from 100-degree heat and hammering rain to relentless gnats and rough terrain.

They traveled mostly through back roads and dirt trails, riding anywhere from 76 to 160 miles per day.

"I'd have to say Maryland was the worst; it was an absolute nightmare riding those hills," Mr. Boyle said. "There's not a flat spot in that entire state."

The pair passed their share of cows and horses, did their best to avoid rodent road-kill and got chased by at least 10 dogs in the Carolinas alone.

They jumped into lakes, got separated in a thunderstorm for just a few short hours and shared their story with dozens of people along the way.

But the duo didn't complete their journey entirely alone. Jacob's grandfather followed them all the way from New Jersey to Florida to help carry their gear and be there in case of an emergency, which luckily, didn't happen.

They also made it the entire trip without a single flat tire,

injury or bike crash, a feat both cyclists were quite proud of.

When the boys were hungry (which was a lot more often than originally planned), they stopped at the nearest restaurant, and when they were tired, they spent the night at a hotel or campsite before continuing on early the next morning.

"Yeah, and Dad would wake me up by deflating my air mattress," said Jacob, rolling his blue eyes at his father.

"That part I definitely won't miss. The rest, it was a lot of fun, but I'm not ready to do it again any time soon."

"If we make the decision to go again, we'll definitely map a more detailed course and leave in September when it's a lot cooler," Mr. Boyle added. "But this year's goal has been reached. We'll be taking an airplane home."

The third annual Cocoa Beach Air Show will take place on Nov. 5 and 6., potentially providing the Space Coast with an economic boost in one weekend.

This year's show will celebrate the Navy's contribution to human space-flight and will feature top military and civilian pilots soaring over Cocoa Beach's oceanfront.

Bryan Lilley, the event's founder and president, said he expects the air show will maintain the success of last year's event,

which brought roughly 100,000 spectators on Saturday and 60,000 on Sunday. Each attendee spent an average of \$100, not including the cost of a hotel. About 44 percent of the spectators stayed in hotels last year, Mr. Lilley said.

"Hotels were pretty much sold out from last year's event," said Rob Varley, executive director at Florida's Space Coast Office of Tourism. "The air show has brought a lot of publicity to our area. I definitely expect the same success as last year."

Mr. Lilley said taxpayers' dollars are not affected by

the event. Costs for extra law enforcement used throughout the weekend is reimbursed through sponsorships and ticket sales.

Mr. Lilley believes the end of the Space Shuttle program won't negatively affect ticket sales. He said it makes this year's Cocoa Beach Air Show a greater significance to the community.

"It gives us a chance to tie the two together and keep the interest alive," he said.

happy 100th birthday. His brother, Stuart, 66, lives in Ohio. Ms. Phillips has five great-grandchildren.

Ms. Phillips recalled the nostalgic days of going to a silent movie to see Rudolph

Valentino, and watching women in the audience swoon over the famous film star.

She recalling that movies were big entertainment in those pre-television days.

She remembered going from Eastern Long Island to Staten Island for Italian food, a trip that took almost all day.

Ms. Phillips, it turns out, has a sophisticated background. She was born in 1911 to Italian-born parents who worked in a cigar factory. Her dad repaired watches, as well.

Ms. Phillips, named after a popular Italian song, grew up enjoying cultural delights such as opera, and she occasionally sang at family gatherings.

"I remember going with my mother to see La Boheme, and when Mimi died, my mother cried," Ms. Phillips recalled of the famous tragedy.

"Back then, my sister would play the piano and I would sing," Ms. Phillips recalled. "We had a door that led out to a balcony, and I would leave the door open so the boy downstairs could hear me sing."

"It was like an Indian love call," Ms. Phillips said flirtatiously.

She also enjoyed such cultural institutions as the Museum of Modern Art and the Museum of National History during her days in New York, where she worked as a secretary for Underwriters Laboratory.

Ms. Phillips recalled striking up a conversation with a total stranger on the subway -- something that would be risky today.

But the woman turned out to be Ms. Phillips's best friend for many years.

Today, Ms. Phillips lives independently in her own apartment, taking care of her own needs and exercising three times a week.

Ms. Phillips lived in Sebastian for 25 years before moving to Buena Vida Estates eight years ago.

"She is remarkable," said Debby Curl, activities director at Buena Vida Estates. "Ms. Phillips lives independently in her own apartment. She stays busy playing cards, and is very active in our community."

Ms. Phillips marveled at reaching the century mark.

"My mother died at 36," Ms. Phillips said. "When that happened, I said, 'I'm not going to live very long.' And here I am."

We didn't even miss one mortgage payment, and it took three years before he was back on a construction job. And, no, we didn't have to put the dog down or the cat.

Our "night out" was a "buy-one get-one free" burger from Burger Chef. We ate a lot of chicken and hamburger and I mixed our milk half-and-half with powdered milk.

There were no coupons in the newspapers then and no food stamps.

Our 8-year-old used to ask people who put out old bicycles in the trash if he could have them. They always said "yes," and he would make whole workable bikes out of those he found; and then he sold them at our annual garage sale.

Be thankful your family has no debilitating or life-threatening diseases.

You can always get another house and household goods, but you can't replace your family.

Stop feeling sorry for yourself. There are jobs out there. I saw three businesses in Titusville today that had signs out for interviews.

We have seven families and their extended families affected in our immediate neighborhood.

Two wives have continued working so they have insurance. One son went back to work after months for the same company.

All have been planning since 2006 when President Bush made his announcement, so their mortgages and credit card debt is under control and their kids can stay in college, and they all have happy healthy dogs.

You may not find something exactly to your liking or close to what you "used to make," but you can find a job, just don't swear at the interviewer.

one-more-scoop dipping sauce, which is socially acceptable, I would choose to douse all of my food in.

You can even order a traditional side salad to start your meal if you wish, complete with Japanese ginger dressing.

The best part is, all of the menu items contain no MSG and are cooked to order (sans the elaborate show) right on the in-house hibachi grill, operated by chef Oliver Roblero, who perfected his skills while training for five years in Japan.

My guest and I were fortunate enough to sample the trio of Hibachi Chicken, Shrimp and Steak, served with a savory side of fried rice and a blend of grilled zucchini, broccoli and onions.

The chicken had the per-

fect blend of teriyaki flavoring and the jumbo shrimp tasted fresh and tangy, but it was the mouthwatering bites of THE most tender steak we'd ever tasted that stole the show.

And this was just the grill portion of the restaurant – the wide selection of fresh sushi is no doubt a delectable meal in itself.

Each roll, ranging from the Rock Shrimp Avocado to the Black Dragon, is made to order, as Mr. Zheng so delicately demonstrated.

We were blown away by the fresh flavors of the Crunchy Spicy Tuna Roll, my guest's favorite, and the Planet Tokyo Roll, which was filled with shrimp tempura and wrapped with fresh tuna and avocado.

While fairly new to the sushi world, I couldn't get enough of these flavor combinations, which had my guest and I already discussing when we were coming back.

"Looks like you'll be see-

ing a lot more of us," I said, to the friendly Mr. Zheng, who encouraged us to sample a fruit-flavored Japanese soda before we left.

In addition to these one-of-a-kind treats, the restaurant also offers cold sake, a selection of Japanese beer, Japanese green tea and a self-serve soda machine. Catering and take-out from the venue is also available.

"Our goal is to provide tasty, high-quality food at a low price," Mr. Zheng said.

# Theater plans exciting season for students

# Special additions for spaghetti sauce and a creamy cake

Hello smart shoppers, hope you had a good week. Last week, I gave you the recipe for my spaghetti sauce. This week's column offers great additions for the sauce that make it perfect for a special dinner.

A Casatta cake, an Italian specialty tops off the menu. Ricotta, the soft creamy cheese used in pasta dishes is also used in fillings and frostings for cakes. Love Cannoli? The filling is made with ricotta.

## ITALIAN MEAT BALLS serves 4 or more regular or low-fat

When you use 'fresh ground' beef, meat balls can be low-fat. My meatball recipe was handed down to my mother. A combination of ground beef, pork and veal can be used but we prefer them only with beef.

I can remember as a teenager being told, "There are seven ingredients in the recipe plus the meat." You must count on your fingers: salt, pepper, egg, garlic, cheese, parsley and bread.

If you use regular ground chuck or beef, which contains a fair amount of fat, the seven ingredients still holds true. When using fresh, virtually fat-free ground beef, an eighth ingredient must be added to keep the meatballs from going flat; that is bread crumbs.

NOTE: Using fresh ground beef? Add 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil per pound.

- 1 pound fresh ground "fat-free" beef
- 2 large eggs or equivalent egg substitute or 3 egg whites
- 4 slices white bread or equivalent of Italian bread
- 2 medium cloves garlic, chopped
- 1 tablespoon plain bread crumbs
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2-teaspoon black pepper
- 5 or 6 sprigs fresh Italian parsley, chopped, or 1 tablespoon dried
- 1 handful grated Romano cheese

Note: Double or triple the recipe to freeze the extra for future meals.

## ROMANCING THE STOVE with the Grammy Guru ARLENE BORG



Soak bread in water, squeeze dry. If using Italian bread (preferred), remove as much crust as possible. Place all ingredients in a bowl and mix with your hands. Shape into balls a little larger than a golf ball.

Years ago you would fry the meatballs, but now, to cut down on fat, we bake them. Place on a cookie sheet that has been treated with cooking spray. Bake at 350 for about 30 minutes.

Meatballs should be cooked in the spaghetti sauce an additional 30 minutes. Over-cooking will make them fall apart.

## ITALIAN SAUSAGE FOR SPAGHETTI SAUCE

To reduce the fat, cut sausage into 3- or 4-inch pieces. Prick all over with a fork and bake on racks in a cookie sheet at 350 for about 30 minutes. Add to spaghetti sauce and cook for 30 minutes longer.

HINT: If you use both sweet and hot sausages, place a toothpick in the hot sausage to avoid unwelcome surprises.

## PORK SPARE RIBS FOR SPAGHETTI SAUCE serves 4-5

Cut ribs apart between each bone and trim as much fat as possible. Place on rack in cookie sheet, bake at 350 for 30 to 40 minutes until browned. Add to sauce.

Ribs should be cooked in the sauce for about 1 hour or until fork tender.

## BRACIOLE

## serves 6

Ask the butcher for braciolo. Years ago flank steak was used; today we use round steak. This is my family's recipe. I recently had braciolo with a sprinkling of breadcrumbs added to the meat and it was very good.

- 1 pound braciolo or round steak
- 3 or 4 large cloves garlic, chopped
- Several sprigs fresh Italian parsley, chopped
- Grated Romano cheese
- Salt & Pepper
- White string
- Spaghetti sauce

Score meat, cover with waxed paper and pound to flatten and tenderize.

Cover meat with next five ingredients. Roll and tie securely with string. Brown in a little oil or cooking spray.

Add to sauce. Cook for 1-1/4 to 1-1/2 hours until meat is fork-tender. Remove from sauce, cut away string and slice in 1/2-inch pinwheels.

## ITALIAN CASSATA CAKE (NIB)

This recipe is from my cousin Ermalina. The cake is purchased from the bakery of a supermarket or

# Patriot Golf Day raises funds for military families

This Labor Day weekend, please think about the men and women serving to protect and defend our freedom.

Every day, the men and women of our armed forces put their lives on the line so we can safely enjoy our swimming pools, cookouts, baseball games and time with our loved ones. When they come home, many return bearing the scars of combat and service. Others come home in a simple, flag-draped coffin.

Patriot Golf Day is about all of these fine men and women. If you tee it up over the holiday, please do so at a participating course. Proceeds from your rounds will go to the families of those who have been injured or killed defending our great nation.

To fully appreciate Patriot Golf Day's mission, it's important to know how it came to be.

Brad and Brock Bucklin, twins born in Grand Rapids, Mich., were two of five sons of Duane and Dawn Bucklin of Caledonia, Mich.

Brock followed his brother into the military, enlisting a year after him in August 2004. Brock told his father he planned to enter Officer Training School and make the U.S. Army his career.

"After he got in the service, he found his way," said Duane "Buck" Bucklin, 71.

Brock was assigned to the

1st Battalion, 68th Armor Regiment, 3rd Heavy Brigade Combat Team, and 4th Infantry Division of Fort Carson, Colo. In December 2005, he received his call to service in Iraq.

At age 28 on May 31, 2006, Corporal Brock Bucklin was the acting mayor of Forward Operating Base GABE on the outskirts of Baqubah, 40 miles northeast of Baghdad. The mayor of FOB GABE was the go-to guy when soldiers had problems or needs with their facilities.

It was Brock's duty to coordinate and manage the independent contractors and support resources to address those needs. On this particular day, he was assigned to assist a contractor in identifying equipment and property for transport as FOB GABE was closing down.

The civilian contractors were responsible for moving concrete barriers. While they were moving them onto trailers for transport, one of the trucks became stuck.

They decided to pull the truck with another. A cargo chain was attached between the two trucks. As the workers stood off to the side, the chain snapped. A

broken link found Brock, slicing an artery in his neck.

A Special Forces medic arrived to provide treatment. Eighteen minutes later, a MEDEVAC helicopter transported him to LSA Anaconda Air Force Hospital. A half-hour later, Brock had died.

"It is a tragedy when a son or daughter dies before you. It is unnatural. It's the thing that's unacceptable and most troubling," said his father.

Brad, stationed in Germany, pressed his military command to be allowed to accompany his brother's coffin home to Grand Rapids. Then-Captain Dan Rooney, a PGA Professional from Broken Arrow, Okla., and member of the Oklahoma Air National Guard, was on the flight as it carried home the body of Corporal Bucklin.

The plane landed at 11:35 p.m., and Rooney watched through the plane's window as the Bucklins awaited Brad and the coffin of their late son. Brock's son, Jacob, was clinging to the leg of his mother.

The pilot had requested that passengers remain in their seats until the remains of the fallen hero could be transferred to his family. Rooney looked up and saw that half of the passengers had left the plane. At that moment, Rooney said, he was inspired to give back to fallen heroes' families.

A little over a year after the funeral, Rooney called Brock to let him know his

son and the families of those who had perished or become disabled in the line of duty would not be forgotten.

"I am an ordinary person that has been blessed with the extraordinary opportunity to be the flight leader on the Patriot Golf Day mission," says Rooney. "I simply planted a small seed, which has been cultivated by PGA Professionals and great citizens around the United States."

Jacob is now 8 and the recipient of a scholarship generated from The Folds of Honor Foundation and its largest fundraiser, Patriot Golf Day.

"It was good to know that something good comes from this," said Buck.

"There are a lot of other sons, a lot of other daughters who did not come home. I'm a patriot and I have served in the military. We only have our freedom because of our military."

"Never could I imagine what it was that Dan Rooney wanted to do," continued Buck. "But I know that my son would be extremely proud."

**Intelligent people may rationally conclude creation is intentionally designed**

There's this sense in our culture that believing in a higher being, what most of us call God, is not intellectual; I really don't get this. If any of us encountered even a hint of complexities to things in our daily routine, we'd instantly assume some being with intellect planned and created it.

For example, if we walk into a room full of blocks stacked up in a pattern, reason dictates that something with intellect arranged it.

In our experience it makes sense that even the simplest complexity has an intentional intelligent maker.

In our world of reason, a rational conclusion when confronted with structural complexities on a daily basis is: that something with intellect creates complexities.

There can really be no reasonable denial that even ordinary things on earth are complex in structure, far more so than a room of stacked blocks.

From atoms and molecules to rocks and minerals to cells, plants and animals, the design is beyond even our human intellectual capacity in that we cannot make such things.

So how is it that when we are faced with complexities in life the argument they occur by happenstance gets more weight than what ordinary experience and reason suggest, i.e., that complexities are created by something with intellect?

I am not arguing this with disrespect to those who choose to believe creation occurred by happenstance. But I am arguing that theism is a rational and reasonable conclusion and deserves more respect that it gets in our modern world.

In short, even if we cannot detail or name or even prove what exactly the nature of the creative intellect is, there is an evidentiary basis to draw a reasonable conclusion that the universe seems to have an intentionality in its construction; which, in turn, reasonably suggests there is a maker with intellect, i.e., God ... or more to the point, intelligent people may rationally think so.

a bakery store. I presume from her instructions it is a high cake.

- 1 sponge cake
- 1/3-cup raspberry jam
- 1 cup confectioner's sugar
- 1 cup candied fruit
- 1 container (2 pounds)

- ricotta
- 3/4-tablespoon orange liqueur
- 3 squares semi-sweet chocolate, chopped fine
- 5 tablespoons pistachio nuts, chopped

Beat ricotta in a large bowl until smooth. Add sugar, chocolate, nuts and candied fruit (save best pieces of fruit to decorate

top of cake).


NOTE: Candied fruit is hard to find during the year, buy extra around the holidays or ask for it at your local bakery.

Cut cake into thin layers (3 or 4), moisten top of layers with liqueur, spread a little jam over top of layer and top with some ricotta mixture. Continue stacking layers, leaving top of cake

plain.

Chill until set, (at least 2 hours). Cover top with leftover ricotta mixture or dust with confectioner's sugar. Decorate with reserved fruit.


