West Melbourne residents to select new council members

Six candidates will vie for three seats on the West Melbourne City Council this fall.

Bill Mettrick, John Tice and Deborah Raskett will appear on the Nov. 8 ballot as well as incumbents John D'Amico, Andrea Young and Andrew Jones.

Bill Mettrick, 63, has resided in West Melbourne for seven years.

He said the top issues impacting West Melbourne include public safety, taxes and accountability.

Firstly, he said the city should keep the police department fully staffed to maintain a low crime rate.

"We, in West Melbourne, are fortunate to have a police chief with 31 years' experience with our great city and high morale within the department,"

Mr. Mettrick said.

Secondly, Mr. Mettrick stressed the importance of keeping taxes low, while providing residents and business owners with excellent services, even through tough economic times.

Finally, he said each council member should be held accountable by the taxpayer, and the city should spend within its means.

Mr. Mettrick previously served on the council for four years and enjoyed making decisions that helped the city progress. He said he is looking forward to the opportuni-

visions of the place that you live and advocate for your passions and the passions of others," he said.

Mr. Mettrick is a retired banking and financial manager and serves as the president of the West Melbourne Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association. He and his wife, Janice, have two daughters and three granddaughters.

John Tice, 59, has lived in West Melbourne for the majority of the past 50 years, leaving for a brief time in the 1970s to attend college in Virginia.

He said the issues West Melbourne must address involve water, the city

Railroad work will close some streets

MELBOURNE - Three major Melbourne streets will be closed temporarily in order for the Florida East Coast Railroad to replace rail crossings.

Each of the affected crossings will impact traffic flow along the U.S. 1 corridor, according to Ray Roden, an FEC Railroad spokesman.

The railroad will post signs and message boards to direct motorists to alternate routes, Mr. Roden said.

The closings include:

- Work on Strawbridge Avenue was expected to be completed by Sept. 21. During that closing, traffic was to be directed to Hibiscus Boulevard by way of Hickory Street.
- Hibiscus Boulevard will be closed at the railroad tracks from 7 a.m. on Sunday, Sept. 25, until 6 a.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 28.
- Traffic will be directed to Strawbridge Avenue by way of Hickory Street.
- Sarno Road will be closed at the railroad tracks from 7 a.m. on Sunday, Oct. 2, until 6 a.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 5.
- Traffic will be directed to either Eau Gallie Boulevard or Babcock Street.

Brevard schools meeting economic challenge,

Turning down the heat in offices means a balanced budget

VIERA - Dr. Brian T. Binggeli, superintendent of Brevard Public Schools, said he felt like Ebenezer Scrooge when he ordered all thermostats turned down when students were out of school during winter break, but employees were at work.

"At least Bob Cratchit got one piece of coal," Dr. Binggeli said. "We shut the power off completely."

But employees didn't complain, he recalled. They knew the belt-tightening challenges all schools face.

Like everyone else, Brevard Public Schools is battling the economic recession, Dr. Binggeli told a meeting of the Melbourne Regional Chamber of East Central Florida.

Dr. Binggeli spoke at the chamber's "September Education Breakfast" at the Holiday Inn Melbourne-Viera Conference Center Hotel.

The district's belt-tightening is no small challenge, Dr. Binggeli said.

The district trimmed \$18 million in order to meet its current budget.

"That wasn't a bunch of vacant positions and stagnant programs, those were real programs and real people," Dr. Binggeli said.

Dr. Binggeli said the district has done a good job of facing its economic challenges.

He said one milestone was meeting the state-imposed class-size man-

Stabbing victim: 'I forgive him'

MELBOURNE - Nubia Casabuenas began feeling uneasy when the short drive she was going to take to an Orlando bank with her ex-boyfriend turned into an excursion from Orlando to the beach at Patrick Air Force Base.

She began to panic when the man threw her cell phone out of the car window, along with his.

He was nervous and visibly distraught, and blocked her way when she tried to leave the car at red lights.

In a few hectic moments his life would be over. Ms. Casabuenas would suffer more than 30 stab wounds, but survived the ordeal.

She said she is thankful God spared her life, and grateful that a Brevard County Sheriff's deputy performed his role heroically and saved her life.

In a conference room in Holmes Regional Medical Center, before being released from the hospital, Ms. Casabuenas recounted in halting tones a nightmarish episode.

Ms. Casabuenas, 45, a native of Colombia, said

budget and infrastructure.

He said he would like to assist in working out an equitable water contract between Melbourne and West Melbourne.

"As a coach for many years, I understand the importance of working together and compromise," Mr. Tice said. "I can offer insight on helping bridge the gap."

In addition, he said the city must be cautious with its spending and "do more with less, as that's the new reality of America."

Finally, Mr. Tice said he wants to maintain old underground utilities, such as sewer pipes, which were installed in the 1950s and 1960s.

Mr. Tice is a retired coach and athletic director who began his career in 1979. He is a chairman of the Parks and Recreation Committee.

He and his wife, Chris, have six children. Deborah Raskett, 52, is an eight-year resident of West Melbourne.

Her focus is to create a pro-business environment that will encourage growth for the city. She said she wants to annex county land, bringing more businesses and jobs and eventually lowering residential tax bills. By being proactive in her position, she said she can help the city grow.

"As a business owner, I am aware of the need for long-range planning," she said. "I plan on bringing this experience to the City Council in the areas of budget planning and infrastructure maintenance."

As a court-appointed guardian advocating for senior citizens' rights, Ms. Raskett said she will work hard to represent senior citizens in the West Melbourne City Council.

She also aims to increase police presence in neighborhoods and create neighborhood watch programs.

Ms. Raskett holds a Bachelor of Science in psychology and health education counseling and is a county mediator for the Florida Supreme Court.

Councilman John D'Amico, 75, is an 11-year resident of West Melbourne.

Councilman D'Amico said he wants to provide residents with the best quality of city services at the lowest tax and ensure tax money is not wasted on foolish projects and higher bidders.

He said he would like to complete various road projects for public safety and decided to run again to complete necessary projects, such as the intersection improvements at Fell Road and Hollywood Boulevard, as well as other infrastructure needs.

"Also, I am extremely concerned with the spending spree that has taken place with this current council—in particular, the awarding of the waste water contract of almost \$1 million over the bid of the former provider," Councilman D'Amico said.

He said he also is concerned with the purchase of the West Melbourne Community Park, formerly called the Max Rodes Park. He said the city has duplicated an already existing park located a third of a mile away.

"Not only is there duplication, but in time, more personnel and equipment will be needed at the taxpayer's expense," he said.

Councilman D'Amico holds a Bachelor of Science in industrial education with a minor in political science. He is a retired lieutenant colonel for the U.S. Army and is active in his homeowner's association.

He and his wife, Jeanette, have three children and

eight grandchildren.

Councilwoman Andrea Young, 59, has lived in West Melbourne for nine years.

She said she believes the top issues facing West Melbourne are the economy, the infrastructure and the businesses.

As for the economy, Councilwoman Young said there is a need for jobs that provide sustainable incomes for families in the city. She added that property values are on the decline as vacant and foreclosed houses rise.

Councilwoman Young said she wants to strengthen the city's infrastructure by supporting adequate and dependable lift stations, building new and maintaining existing roads, and maintaining adequate drainage and run-off water management.

Finally, she said the council should work with builders and business owners regarding city codes and ordinances. She said it is imperative to promote West Melbourne to bring new businesses to the area, which would increase employment.

After serving residents through the council for two years, Councilwoman Young said she wants the opportunity to finish the job.

"West Melbourne is home to many veterans and others who have served this country well," she said. "Participating on West Melbourne City Council is my way of putting the needs of someone else first."

Councilwoman Young holds Bachelor of Science degrees in business administration and in business administration finance and accounting. Her career is in finance and banking.

After several attempts to contact him, the sixth candidate, Councilman Andrew Jones, was not available for an interview in time for deadline.

after hearing a loud crash that shook the two-story house, left a hole in her roof and sliced through two window screens.

She said the noise was loud enough to startle her next-door neighbor, who quickly spotted a piece of the camera lens next to a truck parked in his driveway.

After reviewing Payne's mailed-in police report, officers are now tracking the lens' serial number and working with the Petaluma Airport and the Federal Aviation Administration to determine whether the part may have fallen from a plane.

Payne said she didn't see any aircraft near her home at the time of the incident. FAA spokesman Ian Gregor said that while he's never heard of a camera lens falling from an aircraft, objects such as plane parts and ice chunks do sometimes fall during flights, though rarely.

Art of Sand shapes creativity in Brevard

Sand creations by 17 renowned sculptors to be featured at Space Coast Stadium Oct. 14-23

Next month, residents from Brevard County and beyond will have the opportunity to view a variety of elaborate, larger-than-life sculptures, made entirely from sand and water.

"It's something you have to see to believe," said Denise Dotson of Melbourne, who attended last year's event, alongside her two children. "My kids talked about it for months afterward. They were blown away, and so was I. We can't wait to go back this year."

Now in its second year, Art of Sand is a sand-sculpting exhibition, featuring the work of 17 international master sand sculptors, representing seven different countries.

This year, the Brevard Cultural Alliance has teamed up with The Viera Company to host the 10-day event, Oct. 14-23 at Space Coast Stadium in Viera.

"It's such a unique and appealing art form, and these artists are the best of the best," said Sherry Burklew, information services manager for the Brevard Cultural Alliance. "They've actually drawn quite a fan base. This event truly allows us, as a community, to create a sense of place — one that many people want to come visit and explore all of the things this area has to offer."

More than 1,000 tons of sand, filling up four truckloads, will be brought in for the event in the coming weeks from an sand distributor in Davenport, said Jill Harris, one of the event sculptors, who is responsible for coordinating the various artists, alongside business partner, Thomas Koet, who is the current world champion in sand sculpt-

ing. Both Melbourne residents, Ms. Harris and Mr. Koet opened their own Brevard-based sand-sculpting company 15 years ago, known as Sandsational.

"There's nothing really like Art of Sand; it's definitely one-of-a-kind," Ms. Harris said. "There are a lot of contests and small sculpture exhibits, but nothing to this extent that spans over a 10-day period."

The 17 artists, who come from Canada, The Netherlands, Italy, Ireland, Singapore and Russia, in addition to the U.S., will travel to Viera about a week prior to the exhibit opening to start working on their creations.

"You have to be flexible when working with sand, and some of the artists may not have experience with this particular type of sand," Ms. Harris said. "Most come with a design plan and a general idea of what they're going to create before the event, but should still have the flexibility to add certain details or tweak portions of their design, while they're creating it."

While it may appear the same, the sand used for the exhibit is not the same type of beach sand Brevardians are used to seeing on their coast, Ms. Harris said.

Because it has been rolled around for years in the ocean, Florida's beach sand is a lot smoother and cleaner and not as easy to mold, while the sand used for sculpting comes from a glacier ridge in the middle of state and is "spikier" and more versatile, with edges that can be easily grabbed on to, Ms. Harris said.

"The materials aren't fabulous," she said. "All we do is add water. But what's special is the talent of the artists and the knowledge to create something amazing that

makes it so unique."

The sculptures vary in size from 75 to 100 tons and have been known to stretch as tall as 18 feet tall.

In addition to the sand-sculpting exhibition, the event will also feature a corporate challenge and a schools' sand-sculpting competition, which allows local businesses and students to create sand sculptures of their own.

There will also be sand-sculpting lessons on Saturday and Sunday, a hands-on sculpting area for children and adults, as well as live entertainment.

But perhaps the most interesting perk of the event is an opportunity to see Ms. Harris and Mr. Koet in artistic action, as they create a sand sculpture from start to finish, for guests to witness, during the 10-day exhibi-

tion. "This will provide guests with an opportunity to see the finished products, as well as a work in progress," Ms. Harris said. "It's something we really enjoy, as well."

The theme of this year's sand sculptures is "Travelers," which Ms. Harris said should have many of the artists thinking way outside the box with their designs.

New this year, Brevard County will provide a handicapped-accessible ramp from the concourse to the field, so more people will have an opportunity to tour the exhibit.

The net proceeds from the event will be given back to the Brevard Cultural Alliance, which in turn, will use the money to execute its



A new business venture is causing a stir in the Downtown Melbourne area – one

that has attracted small business owners and shoppers alike from throughout the Space Coast area.

In its opening month, The Petite Boutiques has already

caught the attention of many from Brevard and beyond, who say they were instantly impressed by the facility's diverse vendors and assorted collections.

Satellite Beach residents Jennifer Stutz and Maryann McLeod visited the business for the first time two weeks ago and have already been back a second time with

additional friends.

"There's just so much to look at, but not in a crowded, overwhelming way," said Jennifer, who held tight to a shimmering necklace, displayed by vendor, Monique's. "I could spend hours here, shopping around."

The Petite Boutiques is a unique concept that features collections by nearly 40 different vendors, ranging from The Soap Bakery and The Vintage Heiress to Femme Fatale Fashions and Cuba Gallery of Fine Art.

Duo arrested for stealing 260 baby alligators

Two men from Florida have been arrested for attempting to steal 260 baby alligators.

Robert 'Bo' Martin Duval and Christopher Cork Scroggins were caught leaving Lake Apopka, near Orlando, with two sacks full of the newly hatched reptiles. The pair was charged with felony posses-

sion and capture of hatchling alligators along with misdemeanor conspiracy, while Duval faced additional charges of possession of firearms and ammunition by a convicted felon.

A woman accused of assisting Duval and Scroggins is still under investigation.

"Unfortunately, there is an illegal market for hatchling alligators, and people who participate in this type of poaching have no regard for our resources or the laws that protect them," David Straub of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission told MSNBC.

Duval and Scroggins were later bailed out on \$13,000 and \$3,000 bonds, respectively.



she lived for a year with a fellow postal service worker, Heriberto "Eddie" Jimenez, 42. He had two children, she has a son, and he talked about having their own child.

But Ms. Casabuenas wanted to wait to get married in order to build her family's marketing business, while spending more time with her family.

"We broke up the relationship because I was not going to get married to him," Ms. Casabuenas said.

After they broke up, they saw each other at work, but he could not handle that.

On Sept. 6, Mr. Jimenez asked Ms. Casabuenas to accompany him to a bank so he could repay money she gave him to buy a car. Instead, he drove toward Brevard County.

On the beach, surfer Donnie Marsee, 40, who was visiting from Tampa, saw Ms. Casabuenas outside the vehicle, where Mr. Jimenez picked her up to get her back in the car.

"At first, she was running, yelling 'Help me!' so I thought her child was caught in the surf," Mr. Marsee said.

"The gentleman caught up with her, picked her up, and told me it was OK."

So Mr. Marsee dialed 9-1-1.

"That man saved my life," Ms. Casabuenas said.

Mr. Jimenez sped away, but Sheriff's Sgt. Mike Brown, responding to Mr. Marsee's call, spotted the vehicle.

Seeing the sheriff's car near U.S. 1, Mr. Jimenez drove off the Pineda Causeway and into the Indian River, where he began stabbing Ms. Casabuenas. He stabbed her more than 30

times with a 4-inch kitchen knife, striking her kidney and liver, as the vehicle filled with water.

Sgt. Brown waded into the water, smashed the car windows, and fatally shot Mr. Jimenez.

Ms. Casabuenas suffered three fractured ribs and a broken arm, which she used to as a shield.

"I saw the police approaching the car," Ms. Casabuenas said. "I feel, at this time, my God was protecting me. My God was saying to me, 'You're not going to die.'"

"I went to sleep because I was losing too much blood.

"I forgive Eddie. He was a good man, he was a very good father."

Ms. Casabuenas said her former boyfriend "lost his way,

"Maybe he liked for us to die together, by killing me and killing himself," she said.

"I have peace in my heart. I forgive him. I hope everybody understands that human beings lose their way. There is too much pressure around us," she said.

Ms. Casabuenas is expected to recover from her injuries.

However, the memory of the frightful incident will endure.

"I feel peace inside because I forgive him," she said. "I hope everybody will remember Eddie for the person he was.

"It is very important for everybody to stick together and help people so they don't lose their focus in life," she said.

A response to 'Lack of regulation is what caused it'

President Clinton did not reduce the deficit.

What caused the deficit reduction was the balanced budget of 1994, which was passed by a Republican-controlled Congress.

In 1993, President Clinton ushered through Congress a large package of tax increases, which included the following:

- An increase in the individual income tax rate to 36 percent and a 10 percent surcharge for the highest earners, thereby effectively creating a top rate of 39.6 percent.
- Repeal of the income cap on Medicare taxes. This provision made the 2.9 percent Medicare payroll tax apply to all wage income. Like the Social Security payroll tax base today, the Medicare tax base was capped at a certain level of wage income prior to 1993.
- A 4.3-cent per gallon increase in transportation fuel taxes.
- An increase in the taxable portion of Social Security benefits.
- A permanent extension of the phase-out of personal exemptions and the phase-down of the deduction for itemized expenses.
- Raising the corporate income tax rate to 35 percent.

According to the original Treasury Department estimates, the Clinton tax hike was to raise federal revenues by 0.36 percent of gross domestic product in its first year and by 0.83 percent of GDP in its fourth year, when all provisions were in effect and timing differences associated with near-term taxpayer behaviors had sorted themselves out.

In 1997, the fourth-year effect would be roughly equivalent to an increase in the federal tax burden of about \$114 billion.

In 1997 the Republican-controlled Congress passed a tax reduction bill, which President Clinton reluctantly signed.

This bill resulted in an increase growth in the economy and increase tax revenue.



No more cigarettes for Malaysian orangutan

A captive orangutan often spotted smoking cigarettes given to her by zoo visitors is being forced to kick the habit, a Malaysian wildlife official said.

Government authorities seized the adult ape named Shirley from a state-run zoo in Malaysia's southern Johor state last week after she and several other animals there were deemed to be living in poor conditions.

Shirley is now being quarantined at another zoo in a neighboring state and is expected to be sent to a Malaysian wildlife center on Borneo island within weeks.

Melaka zoo director Ahmad Azhar Mohammed said Shirley is not being provided with any more cigarettes because "smoking is not normal behavior for orangutans. I would say she is not addicted ... but she might have formed a habit after mimicking human beings who were smoking around her," Ahmad told The Associated Press.

Nature Alert, a British-based activist group, wrote to Malaysian officials about Shirley earlier this year, saying conservationists who visited the Johor zoo often saw people throwing lit cigarettes to her in a pit-like enclosure. The group said Shirley seemed to suffer severe mood swings, sometimes looking drowsy and on other occasions appearing "very agitated" without a cigarette.

Christmas Cottage, which many knew as a Historic Downtown Melbourne staple, in the very same location.

When her parents were nearing retirement, Ms. LoPresti, introduced an idea that would allow the Christmas Cottage to remain in business, while providing a platform for other local businesses as well.

Thus, The Petite Boutiques was born.

With support and assistance from her parents, Ms. LoPresti has rented different

portions of the 7,000-square-foot facility, just west of the railroad tracks, to a number of Brevard-based vendors.

Each bring something unique and diverse to the table, while complementing the upscale, yet affordable, mini-mall environment.

"We didn't want to feature too much of one thing, so we have four art galleries, three clothing stores and numerous jewelers, furniture and gift shops," Ms. LoPresti said. "Right off the bat, we received such an amazing response from local business owners."

Ms. LoPresti said she thinks what has made the venture such a success thus far is the

Since the facility's opening earlier this month, Ms. Forrer has brought in new shipments four to five times a week because her products are selling so quickly. "I think this concept of the Petite Boutiques is absolutely glamorous," Ms. Forrer said. "I think it's brought a lot of options to Downtown Melbourne and created a certain ambience that you can't find anywhere else."

Jim Gruntorad of Palm Bay is another Petite Boutiques vendor, whose larger-than-life creations, which he calls "Personali-Trees" are guaranteed to catch a customer's eye. From oversized witches and holiday bears to the Easter Bunny and Cupid, Mr. Gruntorad can create just about any character, using a Christmas tree as a base.

"I love this idea - I've been waiting for something like this," said Mr. Gruntorad of the Boutiques concept. "With

the economy the way it is, I've been inspired to go back to my creative roots and start small. There's no way I could afford to open my own store right now, so this came at exactly the right time."

With a background in merchandising, Anna Cardone has not only displayed her vintage-inspired "Revisited" collection of furniture, jewelry and décor, she has also served as one of the go-to business connoisseurs and window-display designers for the Boutiques.

"I don't mind helping out. I really believe in what they're doing here," Ms. Cardone said. "It's a truly great way for someone to start a small business, and it's provided me with an opportunity to focus on my true passion without the worries of owning my own shop."

dates, which he said were an "enormous logistical challenge."

"We actually have \$400,000 in our budget this year that came to us from the taxpaying citizens of other counties who last year couldn't meet that challenge," Dr. Binggeli said. "They paid a penalty for that, and we got some of that money."

Dr. Binggeli said Brevard Public Schools faced major economic hurdles because it is one of the largest school districts in the state.

The Brevard school district serves approximately 73,000 students, making it the 10th-largest of 67 school districts in Florida.

The district is the largest employer in Brevard County, employing more than 9,000 people, including more than 5,000 teachers and staff.

The school district operates 86 schools in 17 municipalities in Brevard County.

The school district refrained from spending Education Jobs Bill funding that was made available to schools. Such spending would have counted against the district's budget, Dr. Binggeli said.

"We didn't spend any of those dollars," he said. "By comparison, Broward County spent every penny, and they have laid off well over 2,000 employees and cut a lot of programs."

"We are committed to prioritizing the dollars to where they count the most. We did cut a grade school opening, and we continue to be guided by our strategic plan."

Dr. Binggeli said managing the school's budget is no different from having an effective household budget strategy.

Dr. Binggeli said, for example, that the district has strived to reduce its energy consumption, saving hundreds of thousands of dollars as a result.

"In 2009-10, we dropped our kilowatt consumption by 4.4 percent, by doing such

things as window tinting," he said. "Last year, we cut our kilowatt hour consumption another 7.9 percent."

"To put that in perspective, we have cut \$1.5 million in the last two years," he said.

Dr. Binggeli said saving through energy conservation has required some personal sacrifice.

"Over two weeks in winter, we shut off the heat in every building," he recalled. "One day, I came into my office, and it was 67 degrees."

"Our administrators did not complain. They understand it is a means to an end."

He said the ongoing effort to converse energy consumption has been "through behavior modification."

Dr. Binggeli said he wishes he could be just as successful in economizing at home.

"I have a 14-year-old daughter, and I can't get her out of the shower because the hot water just keeps running," he said.

It's never too late to pay tribute to the heroes of Sept. 11, 2001. The Melbourne Municipal Band, under the direction of Staci Cleveland, will do just that on Sept. 28-29, with free concerts at the Melbourne Auditorium.

Three dinners from one roast

ROMANCING THE STOVE

Hello, smart shoppers; if you've stopped getting the Hometown News, just call, it's still free but you must subscribe. Call toll-free (866) 913-6397.

Food prices are going up like crazy and I'm sure many of you are having trouble trying to make ends meet. Buying large cuts of meat is usually cheaper, but that's not practical for a small family — or is it? My daughter and I love roast beef and pot roast — both large cuts of meat. I finally decided we're gonna have them no matter what.

Follow my lead, this is money-saving and marvelous. Bottom round roast makes a tender roast beef or pot roast. Wait for a "buy one get one free" deal and buy a large 3-4 1/2 pound roast and a free one for the freezer. The price should be a little over \$3 a pound. For your first dinner, roast beef. Cut enough for leftover brown bagging, then freeze the rest. Freeze the gravy in a separate container.

Second dinner, my mock Sauerbraten pot roast. Brown the meat and follow the recipe. Still leftover meat? Back to the freezer along with the gravy. Now it's time for my late husband's mom's Lapsgouts (Danish Stew).

ROAST BEEF SERVES 5 TO 6

There is usually a thin layer of fat on one side of the meat; leave that and trim any other visible fat.

3-lb. bottom round roast 5 or 6 small onions or 2 medium onions, quartered
Garlic powder
Salt and pepper
Season roast. Place in pan and surround with small peeled or quartered onions, (hold together with a toothpick). Do not add water. Place pan in the center of a 350-degree oven; roast as follows:

Rare, 18 minutes per pound
Medium-Rare, 22 minutes per pound
Medium, 24 minutes per pound
Well, 27 minutes per pound

NOTE: When using a roast over 3-1/2 pounds, reduce the cooking time by two minutes per pound. The meat keeps cooking after

it's done. Make a gravy following instructions in previous columns.

POT ROAST (MOCK SAUERBRATEN) SERVES 6

This recipe is for pressure cookers, stove-top or oven. Invest in a pressure cooker, it will be the smartest purchase you've ever made.

Many years ago I tasted sauerbraten. My opinion: flavor too strong, time involved too long! Using many of the same ingredients and adding a few of my own, I created my mock sauerbraten. It has become a family favorite and I hope you enjoy it as much as we do.

3 lb. bottom round roast

- 1 lg. onion (3 inches in diameter), quartered and sliced
- 1/4 cup catsup
- 1/2 tsp. each, garlic powder and black pepper
- 1 tsp. salt
- 2 rounded tsp. brown mustard
- 3 tbsp. red wine vinegar
- 1 small bay leaf
- 3 or more cups water

Trim all fat from meat except what's on top. Brown meat on all sides in a large covered oven-proof pot or pressure cooker. Do not add any fat. Place meat fat side up. Add onions and cook until golden. Add remaining ingredients, leaving the water for last. Cover and cook in a 350-degree oven or on the stove for two and a half to three hours until tender and well done. Add more water if necessary.

Pressure cooker: cook at 10 pounds of pressure for 40 minutes or follow instructions with cooker.

Remove meat to serving platter. Strain liquid into saucepan, discard bay leaf, reserve onions. Make gravy, add reserved onions. Thinly slice meat across the grain.

prepare a roast beef or a pot roast cook more than you will need and slice only what you will eat. Freeze the leftover beef and gravy separately and use for this recipe.

Leftover roast beef or pot roast, thawed and cut in bite-size cubes

Leftover gravy, thawed 1 can mixed vegetables with potatoes such as Veg-All, drained, or

1 pkg. frozen mixed vegetables and 1 can whole potatoes, rinsed, drained and cubed

1 jar small white onions (optional)

Heat gravy to a rolling boil, stirring constantly. Stretch if necessary by adding water, flour and water mixed, Gravy Master for good color and beef bouillon for added flavor or you can add packaged or canned gravy. If using pot roast, add to gravy and cook for 15 minutes.

Add vegetables and cook until tender and heated through. If using roast beef, add just before serving. This is a stew you eat with a spoon.

"Cat On A Hot Tin Roof, by Tennessee Williams. In a plantation house, the members of the family are celebrating the 65th birthday of "Big Daddy," as they sentimentally dub him. The tone is light, but the

mood is somber. For a number of old evils poison the gaiety — sins of the past, greedy hopes for the future, a desperate eagerness not to believe in the truths that surround them. "Cat On A Hot Tin Roof" is

a delicately wrought exercise in human communication. Tennessee Williams' characters try to escape from the loneliness of their private lives into some form of understanding. The truth invariably terrifies them. That is one thing they cannot face or speak.

want to challenge the course, bringing the lakes and wetlands more into play. The more aggressive you play, the more you are rewarded for solid shots. The fairways are wide and the greens large and rolling.

Variety is the name of the game, as well. There are long and short par-3s. A couple of the par-5s are reachable in two and there is even a drivable par-4.

The finishing holes are

not only tough, but dramatic. Framed by the clubhouse, the 18th is a fantastic finishing hole. Playing as long as 473 yards from the tips, this par-4 requires a solid drive, skirting the water down the right side and a long-iron approach to a well guarded green.

We completed our day at the Members Beach Club, relaxing as a family on the beach, watching the most gorgeous sunset imaginable.
