## New truck for fire department

MELBOURNE — The Melbourne Fire Department is determined to improve its fire ground operations, with the purchase of a new vehicle.

The department

acquired a new aerial platform truck, a Sutphen SP-95, on Jan. 26, and the fire staff began training exercises the last week of January.

"The truck will allow the department to mitigate situations more safely and at a higher level than our

existing trucks," said Chuck Bogle, assistant chief of operations for the Melbourne Fire Department. "The new Sutphen aerial has a 95-foot ladder with a platform (bucket), in which firefighters can work from

MELBOURNE — Spanning generations with their music, these kings of harmony have traveled the globe and shared the stage with artists worldwide.

And this month, Brevard County is fortunate enough to experience its legendary sounds, as the Beach Boys, including several of the group's original members, will perform live at The King Center for the Performing Arts in Melbourne Sunday, Feb. 16.

In anticipation of the big day, Mike Love, one of the founding members of the family band, took some time to share his thoughts with Hometown News, covering everything from music to meditation, in a recent phone interview from his home in Los Angeles.

• HTN: Well, I'll be honest. The Beach Boys was my parent's generation, not mine, but I did my homework. Tell me how you feel about today's music. Who is your favorite contemporary artist?

• ML: I really like Bruno Mars. He really knows how to put on a show. I had a chance to meet him at the Grammy's 50th Anniversary celebration. He did a James Brown tribute. He is a fantastic singer, dancer and songwriter and really knows how to combine the new with the old.

• ML: We were just at Howard Stern's Birthday Bash and did a tribute parody of California Girls: "I wish we

## Local college in running for national honor

MELBOURNE — Eastern Florida State College continues to collect a wide range of accolades in recent months.

On Thursday, Jan. 23, Eastern Florida State College was named among the top 150 colleges in the nation, vying for the 2015 Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence.

The Aspen Prize is a highly prestigious award, given to the best community or state college in the nation for high levels of student

success, innovative strategies and workforce achievement.

Eastern Florida is among 15 colleges in the Florida College System up for the Aspen Prize.

"The criterion to be considered for the prize is student success in persistence, completion and transfer, consistent improvement in student outcomes, over time, and outcomes for students of all racial, ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds," said John J. Glisch, associate vice president of communications at EFSC.

Eastern Florida was chosen from more than 1,000 colleges, nationwide, to advance to the second round of the competition. Mr. Glisch said that there are three rounds total in the Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence.

This also marks the second straight year that the college is in the running for the \$1 million award, which is to be announced in December.

The 10 finalist schools will be named this fall.

"We have among the top graduation rates in the 28-member Florida College

System, which includes Eastern Florida, and the highest graduation rate among state and community colleges in Central Florida," Mr. Glisch said.

College president Dr. Jim Richey credits the school's student-centered approach as the key to its place in the nation's top educational tier.

"Everything we do at Eastern Florida is geared [toward] providing students with an excellent education that will lead to a good job and successful career upon

## 'Children, helping children' theme of walkathon

WEST MELBOURNE — Students at Calvary Chapel's Melbourne campus will be helping other children in the community by raising funds through a walkathon on the school campus from 9 a.m. to noon Wednesday, March 12.

"If every kid brings a dollar, we can raise \$500," Ms. Richardson said.

The event will not be operated on the pledge system, as Ms. Richardson said she does not want families to feel pressured to donate more than they are able to.

The students, in grades kindergarten through eighth-grade will complete the nearly half-mile walkathon on school grounds. Parents are invited, and other activities are planned for the event.

The community is also welcome to support the students' efforts.

# Wildly fun races at zoo this weekend

MELBOURNE — Lace up your sneakers, and bring the family along for a one-of-a-kind race this weekend.

On Saturday, Feb. 15, Running Zone will host its

eighth annual 3K at the Brevard Zoo. There will be two back-to-back races.

“No Monkey Business,” the first race, begins at 7 a.m. and is geared toward more serious runners. The second race, “Scenic Route,” begins at 7:35 a.m. and is for individuals and families,

who would like to take their time on the trail.

Cost to participate in the races is \$28 in advance and \$31 on race day. Proceeds will benefit the Brevard Zoo.

The Brevard Zoo offers 50 percent off admission to all race participants on race day, as well.

“In 2006, Brevard Zoo was approached by the owners of Running Zone, Don and Denise Percy, to see if we were interested in hosting a race on zoo grounds,” said Michelle Smurl, director of animal and conservation programs. “The zoo provides a unique venue for race participants and an opportunity to see behind-the-scenes areas.”

Ms. Smurl added that Running Zone has been generous to the zoo, donating \$41,000 of race proceeds to date.

Just as in previous years, the 3K races are animal-themed.

“We are celebrating the opening of a new meerkat exhibit in Expedition Africa that will also feature African rock pythons and ‘Dik-Dik,’ a small antelope,” Ms. Smurl said. “All participants are welcome to dress like a meerkat.”

This Saturday’s race will take runners through a 1.8-mile course, starting at the front entrance of the Brevard Zoo, that winds throughout the zoo grounds. The trail will give participants plenty of opportunities to view ani-

mals along the way.

There were not always two races for runners of different disciplines, however.

Ms. Smurl said that the zoo implemented the two back-to-back races in 2013 to prevent overcrowding on the course.

With photo opportunities with “Zippy the Gecko” and a special Meerkat Lil Kids race, where all runners receive a special prize, the 3K races hosted at the Brevard Zoo are a great time for all participants.

“This is the only zoo race in the county. It is a family-friendly event and fun for all ages,” Ms. Smurl said. “The course is unique, and animals are visible along the entire race course. Zoo keepers are available after the races for meet-and-greets with special animal guests and Running Zone provides great awards and prizes.”

## Tails from the Vet

There are times when your family veterinarian needs to send your pet to the specialist. Most of the time, we can figure out what is wrong with your little one, but sometimes more intricate diagnostics tests are needed. Some of these are ultrasound, MRI, CAT scan, and endoscopic studies. Also, there are emergency facilities that specialize in emergency care and have greatly enhanced the care of your primary veterinarian for these serious issues. If your pet has complicated eye issues there are veterinary ophthalmologists available in the area. If your pet has broken bones or back trouble, you most likely will be sent to an orthopedic veterinary surgeon, and in some cases, to a veterinary neurosurgeon.

Make sure you ask if your pets’ care is better suited at a specialty practice. Most of the time, your veterinarian will refer you to a specialist if he/she feels that your pet needs that extra care.

# Brevard man turns 104, credits golf, his wife

MELBOURNE — According to Berkeley scholars, the life expectancy in 1910 was 48.4 years old.

Viera resident Bernie Hutten has more than doubled those odds, and will celebrate his 104th birthday in March.

His secret to longevity? "I never smoked a cigarette, I never drank alcohol, and I golfed damn near every day," Mr. Hutten said.

This is not to say, he hasn't had close calls. In his early 20s, he suffered a football injury, was hospitalized, and caught tuberculosis, while in the hospital. This led to a six-month stint in a sanatorium.

"Back then, the treatment was bed rest. He had to lie flat on his back for six months," said his wife of 61 years, Helen Hutten.

A recent fall resulted in a lower back fracture, limiting Mr. Hutten's mobility, and causing him considerable pain. At 91, and probably half his size, his wife, Helen, helps lift him into and out of his chair.

"My wife — she's a gem," Mr. Hutten said.

She spends her days as a caregiver, and, yet, still manages to golf at least twice a week.

"I can't trust anyone to

care for him the way I do," she said.

Mr. Hutten was an avid athlete, who enjoyed tennis and football, but his favorite game has always been golf.

In fact, when courting Helen, who he met at a dance, his golf game took precedence until she set him straight.

"Every time he asked me on a date, it was for Sunday," she said. "I finally had to tell him: 'I'm available on Saturday night.' That's when he told me he didn't often go out on Saturdays because he got up early on Sundays to play golf."

She eventually learned to play golf and they became

lifelong partners on the green.

Mr. Hutten had to give up his golf game at age 97, but sometimes rides along in the golf cart to watch his sweetheart play.

Born in Cincinnati, Ohio, Mr. Hutten, along with his five siblings, was raised by a single mother, after his father was killed when he was just 2 years old.

The Hutten's suffered their own tragedy, when the son they adopted at age 19 months, joined the U.S. Army and was killed in a construction accident in Alabama, while working with the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers at 21 years old.

The memory still brings tears to their eyes, but Mrs. Hutten is quick to retrain her thoughts on the positive.

"Yes, we have had sadness, but you know, overall, we have had a really good life. We've traveled the world, and when we retired to Brevard County, we bought a boat and fished and shrimped, and have a lot of friends," she said.

Mr. Hutten will celebrate his birthday among more than 300 friends from their community in Grand Isle, a 55+ community in Viera, with the theme "Young at Heart."

# EDC service helps companies secure millions

BREVARD — One local program has helped Space Coast companies win more than \$6.2 million in contracts within the past four months.

Lynda Weatherman, president and CEO of the Economic Development Commission of Florida's Space Coast, said that the EDC's G.O. Contracts,

Government Opportunities Online Service, has made a significant impact on the local economy during its short existence.

"Given the important role small businesses play in our economy, the EDC is thrilled these companies have found substantial contracting opportunities through programs — opportunities they said would have gone untapped

had it not been for this innovative EDC initiative," she said. "Empowered by new procurement contracts, companies utilizing G.O. Contracts will have a better chance of growing and creating jobs, and that benefits all of Brevard County."

G.O. Contracts is a tool developed and offered by the EDC to help small and mid-sized businesses capture

more of the lucrative government contracts market.

Since its launch in September of last year, the service has helped at least five companies in the area win contracts as large as \$4 million.

G.O. Contracts provides registered users in targeted sectors with a one-stop access to a comprehensive government procurement database system, which

includes more than 700,000 government contractors, pulling its information from multiple services.

In a press release, Jeff Salter, CEO and owner of JDR Unlimited, LLC, in Melbourne, praised the program for helping his business.

"G.O. Contracts has been a huge avenue for me to keep my overhead low, keep my costs low and still keep my costs competitive," he said.

Mr. Salter won a five-year contract, supporting the Federal Highway Administration, which was worth as much as \$900,000.

## Online blog helps students get stung by spelling bee

Holy Trinity sophomore Stuti Mishra is no stranger to treating the "sting" that comes with participating in spelling bees. She has excelled in spelling and language studies since getting "stung" in the fourth grade, and earned second place in the National Spelling Bee in

Washington, D.C., in 2012. She is currently learning French and speaks fluent Oriya and Hindi.

But it's her willingness to help others taking languages and attempting spelling competitions that sets Stuti apart. Since September 2012, she has hosted "Saturdays with Stuti," a spelling and language club, held at her local public library, geared toward helping other students perform better in these disciplines by recognizing spelling and language patterns.

Now, Stuti has expanded her training program to include a new blog and video series on her website at [spellingmantra.com](http://spellingmantra.com). 

## Black and white and sometimes grey

Satellite Beach resident and software engineer Michael Dunn is standing trial in Jacksonville for first-degree murder and three counts of attempted murder.

The network media has a habit of turning tragedies into circuses, and I learned to ignore them after watching trial coverage of the George Zimmerman case.

Having worked as a legal investigator and covering crime and courts in my long career as a journalist, I've seen a lot of tragedy and witnessed injustice in many forms, but I will submit that things are never as black and white as the talking heads on HLN News Network would have you believe.

According to public records and witness interviews, Michael Dunn was an outspoken gun advocate, who always carried a pistol in his glove box.

Jordan Davis, his 17-year-old victim, was shot dead inside the red Durango where he was a passenger.

It was the Friday after Thanksgiving, and the young man, who was home-schooled before attending Wolfson High in Jacksonville, and who'd never been arrested, had just left the mall with his friends.

It was an altercation over loud rap music, which ultimately led to the 10 shots Dunn fired into the Durango.

We may never know for sure whether Dunn had any reason to fear for his life that night, but records show that no weapon was ever found in the Durango and there were no drugs or alcohol in Jordan's system, according to the medical examiner on the case.

Instead of calling the police after the incident, Dunn left the scene and went back to his hotel, where he ordered a pizza, then drove back to Satellite Beach the following morning.

The actual words exchanged between the two of them may never be fully known, as is often the situation in cases like this, but Dunn repeatedly told police investigators that he feared for his life.

Now, I'm not a gun advocate, nor am I opposed to responsible gun ownership. I

guess I fall somewhere in the grey. My father is a hunter, and he taught me to shoot a gun before I learned to drive a car. But, he also taught me that if I don't have anything nice to say, I should say nothing at all.

Dunn admitted to police that he could have kept his mouth shut, and, yet, insisted he was polite when asking the young men in that car to turn down the music.

We may never know why Dunn took on a "Wild West" persona, pulled his handgun from his glove box, and fired the 10 shots into the SUV that left a young man dead.

But, what we do know about Dunn is that he doesn't seem to see the grey.

Letters he wrote from the Duval County Jail shed light on a man, who may have very well been in fear, but that's more than likely because he associated rap music and young black men with what he deemed a "thug" culture, rather than entertaining the thought that they had a simple difference in musical tastes.

In a letter to his grandmother sent from jail, Dunn wrote "I'm not really prejudiced against race, but I have no use for certain cultures. This gangster-rap, ghetto-talking thug culture that certain segments of society flock to is intolerable."

So, Dunn contends he isn't prejudiced against race, but cannot tolerate certain cultures.

That's part of being human, but it doesn't justify murder. In 1999, a road rage incident resulted in a man pointing a gun at me in a convenience store parking lot. It scared me, but I didn't fight. I drove away. If only Dunn had done the same.

### In response to 'Checks and cars'

As a retiree from Kennedy Space Center after 35-plus years, let me explain Social Security to you.

I and everyone else who is receiving a Social Security check – no matter who they worked for – paid into the Social Security System, which is really an insurance plan – maybe you can understand that better, our entire working lives.

We were not allowed to NOT pay into it, as were millions of others who worked for a paycheck and not cash.

The deduction from our checks was known as FICA and also included Medicare when it was enacted under President (Lyndon) Johnson.

As a NASA contractor employee, I worked for three different companies during my tenure, keeping the same desk the whole time but in several different locations.

The first contract was more than 10 years, which provides a small pension; second contract only lasted 5-1/2 years and the law at that time only provided for 10 years to qualify for a pension; third contract was 11 years until retirement.

But for the first three years, engineering personnel were covered by a union; so no pension there.

And, no, it isn't the retirees who drive the foreign cars. We worked for the U. S. government and always drove American, and still do.

### American cars are beautiful

As you all know, the rising number of Japanese, German and Korean cars in the United States is helping their economy, not ours.

Their sale in this country is rising fast, and that's because of mostly the ads they run on television.

Brevard county has 110 grade crossings, only one of which – Pineda Causeway – is in the process of an overpass.

Based on the experience in the south, local governments seem to be told that they are responsible for fencing and increased safety at crossings, this for a private company and with passenger service abandoned decades ago.

Brevard County is to have no station. Any Brevard passengers will have to go to Orlando.

Yet from Melbourne, I drive to downtown Ft. Lauderdale for meetings in two hours 15 minutes and have a car when I get there.

One reads about the recent rail accident in the Bronx.

At this writing, that train was going too fast at a sharp curve.

All Aboard Florida plans trains at 130 mph from Orlando to Cocoa and 110 mph down to Miami.

Can one imagine trains running at 110 mph (161 feet per second) though downtown Melbourne?

Kayakers on Crane Creek note "stuff" falling off of the Crane Creek Bridge as trains pass.

Yes, the \$1.5 billion will provide improved tracks and enhanced double tracks to allow passenger trains to pass long freights, but accidents will happen.

Drivers facing twice an hour track delays – the train will go by in 7 seconds but the guards will be down for much longer – will get frustrated, let alone long freights – and go around.

Brevard leaders need to take note.

This needs to be thought through carefully.

Florida East Coast Industries needs to be taxed accordingly.

Safety concerns, environmental concerns, and noise concerns need to be mitigated.

# Coping with Stress

Stress – like the kind you get from writing a weekly article

Or another type of stress which is often thought of as a head problem. We know it makes us tired but we never really make the connection between stress and long term health issues. A science known as psychoneuroimmunology has been around for years and the connection between stress and the immune system is well documented. However recent studies have shown that stress effects the nonspecific immune response often called the "sickness" response because it triggers a series of physiological and behavioral changes, including fever, changes in liver metabolism, reduced food and water intake, reduced sexual activity, reduced exploration and increased anxiety. It also activates a classic stress response, releasing stress hormones such as cortisol.

Cortisol is a hormone produced by the human body, designed to help the body deal with mental and physical stress. High levels of cortisol in the blood may result in increased appetite, weight gain and for some, an increased risk of stroke or cardiovascular disorders and

set up an environment of depletion that will keep your energy and immune system low and your health poor.

While it is impossible to simply not be stressed in our day to day, working on what we can control is always a good start. Again here many factors play a role; a high carbohydrate diet increases cortisol release, so too does caffeine and alcohol. While exercise can reduce stress - over training or long work-outs can add to the stress levels on the body and push us into more cortisol (keep work-outs under one hour for the maximum benefit without any down side). Eat 3 meals a day and try not to skip meals, low blood sugar levels put a huge stress on the body and can increase cortisol too. Rest is a key factor (last week's article) so try to get the rest you need each night.

All of these things will help you better deal with stress and reduce the ill effects of stress itself. Supplementing to build up your defense against stress is not as hard as you might think – B-12, which we have talked about all though this series of articles, helps to reduce cortisol and increase energy. Adrenal support can be found in many forms including supplements like ashwaghandha, phosphatidylserine, and rhodiola rosea. Reading, music and meditation can be helpful in reducing stress as well.

and can accommodate persons being rescued much safer, as well.”

Mr. Bogle said that the truck, which will be placed in service in March once training has completed and all equipment has been installed, offers an additional ladder footage. Currently, there is a 75-foot ladder used for the truck now in service, as well as another 75-foot ladder for a reserve truck.

This additional height enables the department to reach nearly two floors higher.

“By purchasing this truck, we can place a second aerial apparatus in service, located in the north area of the city of Melbourne,” he said. “This will improve our service level by reducing the response times for aerial operations in the North end

of the city.”

The new truck cost \$974,627, which included \$340,000 of funding from Public Facility Impact Fees.

The remaining balance will be financed through Sun Trust Equipment Finance and Leasing Corporation for 10 years at 2.4430 percent, Mr. Bogle said.

Mr. Bogle said that Sutphen has a reputation for quality and reliability in the industry, and it is significantly lighter in weight than its competition. This will reduce overall operation costs, such as funding for fuel and maintenance, as well reduce the impact on city streets.

“Our crews are very excited about the new truck, its capabilities and the new look we are going to have as a department,” Mr. Bogle said. “It is my hope that this truck assists us in providing the best service possible to the citizens of Melbourne for many years to come.”





ing, treatments, medication and lifestyle changes that can lead to a healthier life," she said. "(It is) a very important topic for the aging population and their families to become aware of how to be proactive in their own health."

Heart disease is the leading cause of death for both men and women in the United States, with more than one person out of every four people affected by the disease, according to [secondcount.org](http://secondcount.org).

For men, the risk starts to climb at the age of 45, when

one out of every 100 men develops signs of heart disease. By age 55, the risk increases to about 2.1 out of every 100 men. By age 85, the risk for heart disease in men increases to about 7.4 out of every 100.

For women, the risk climbs with age, as well, but the trend begins about 10 years later.

Ms. Brandon said that the event, which will also provide free lunch and beverages, is an opportunity for seniors to recognize these trends.
