Inaugural 5K kicks cancer in the 'Booty'

MELBOURNE — A Brevard-based cancer charity and local doctor are coming together to create a unique race, with the aim of decimating a strain of one of the most feared diseases.

On Saturday, May 17, lace up your running shoes for a fantastic cause, as "The Booty Run," created in honor of Dr. Rachel Lefebvre, aims to kick colon cancer to the curb.

The 5K walk and run, which begins at 5:30 p.m., will be hosted at Ballard Park in Melbourne, and features music by Deluxe Mojo, food, vendors and cancer-resource booths.

There will also be games,

drawings, giveaways and prizes for the best-dressed booty and best team spirit, as well as awards for the top male and female finishers in their respective age groups.

Registration is \$32 for adults, \$20 for children and \$30 for team members. Interested participants may print out an entry form from www.RunningZone.com.

All proceeds will be donated to the Toni Keen Memorial Fund, a 501(c) 3, supporting Brevard County cancer patients.

Last year, Melbourne-based psychologist Dr. Lefebvre was diagnosed with Stage Four colon cancer, the most advanced

Northrop Grumman announces largest expansion project in the United States

MELBOURNE — Brevard County will soon be the home of the largest economic development project in the country, officials said.

The Economic Development Commission of Florida's Space Coast announced on May 8 that Northrop Grumman Corporation has selected Brevard County for an expansion project that could create 1,800 jobs, with an average annual salary

of \$100,000.

The project was secretly known as "Project Magellan" throughout the due diligence phase, as part of a confidentiality agreement between the company and the Space Coast, officials said.

Northrop Grumman plans to invest approximately \$500 million in new capital investments at Melbourne International Airport, according to reports.

"This is a huge victory for families on the Space Coast," said Florida Gov. Rick Scott in a statement to the press. "We are

excited that Northrop Grumman has decided to expand here in Florida, which could bring up to 1,800 new jobs to Brevard County. We've worked to grow jobs and opportunities for Florida families by cutting taxes, paying down debt and cutting government waste, and this announcement is a testament to our success in creating an opportunity economy."

Gov. Scott said he expects this deal to

Melbourne man, charged with battery of school official, held without bond

MELBOURNE — A Brevard County man, who is charged with battery on a school official and disruption of an educational institute, is being held without bond at the Brevard County Jail Complex.

Ronald Dan Brown Jr., 28, of Melbourne was arrested on Thursday, May 1, following an altercation at Meadowlane Primary School in West Melbourne.

Authorities said Mr. Brown arrived at the school at dismissal time to pick up his children.

As he approached a classroom to pick up one of his children, authorities said the teacher asked that Mr. Brown provide his identification to prove that he was the child's father.

Authorities said that Mr. Brown left the room and then returned with his wife's identification, prompting the teacher to once again ask for his personal identification.

Mr. Brown then began to scream obscenities at the teacher and forced his way into the classroom by shoving the teacher out of the way, authorities

said. The suspect then left the classroom with his child.

Mr. Brown's wife appeared and then confirmed her identity with school officials, police said.

Both of the couple's children were released to the mother and all parties left the campus.

Authorities said that Mr. Brown's actions caused the teacher to initially fear that the incident may have been a kidnapping.

Mr. Brown was charged with battery on a school official, following the incident, as well as possession of less than 20 grams of marijuana, possession of drug paraphernalia, disruption of an educational institute, possession of a controlled substance and violation of felony probation.

In 2010, Mr. Brown was found guilty of driving with a suspended license, according to public record.

Representatives from Meadowlane Primary School said the school had "no comment," regarding the incident.

The teacher's name has not been released.



Children's choir to host auditions for upcoming season

MELBOURNE — One of the Space Coast's most elite children's music ensembles will host an open audition for students this weekend.

On Saturday, May 17, the Brevard Children's Chorus will host auditions for singers in fourth through 10th grade from 9 a.m. to noon at Suntree United Methodist Church in Melbourne.

Membership within the nonprofit chorus is open to students in public, private, charter and homeschools, and both boys and girls are encouraged to audition.

"We currently have 24 members," said Joani Slawson, director. "No qualified children are ever turned away."

Ms. Slawson added that the ideal

size of the Brevard Children's Chorus would be 40 members.

The select group of youth singers performs at venues and events throughout Brevard, performing at an average of eight events each year.

Recent performances include a family concert with the Brevard Symphony Orchestra at the King Center for the Performing Arts, a Viera and Cocoa Beach holiday concert with the Indialantic Chamber Singers, Carmina Burana with the Brevard Community Chorus and more.

Although any audition process may be daunting, Ms. Slawson said she hopes each child comes to the audition with great enthusiasm.

"Students may choose a piece to sing at the audition or they may sing the first verse of 'America (My Country tis of Thee)," she said. "I will also have

them sing a few simple warm-ups and some ear-training exercises."

The Brevard Children's Chorus meets every Thursday night for rehearsals from August through May at Suntree United Methodist Church. During rehearsals, Ms. Slawson leads the group through basic music theory, sight-singing and music history, in the hope of making the experience meaningful and fun.

The Brevard Children's Chorus will host auditions on Saturday, May 17 from 9 a.m. until noon at Suntree United Methodist Church in Melbourne.

Auditions are open to both boys and girls, grades four through 10.

attract more businesses to the state of Florida.

Officials said that the expansion will feature two phases: Phase One is the construction of an approximately 220,000-square-foot building, as well as the addition of 300 jobs by the end of 2015; phase two will be the construction of an additional 500,000-

square-foot facility and the creation 1,500 more jobs.

"Northrop Grumman's ultimate decision to choose the Space Coast for this competitive project would not have been possible but for the outstanding support of Gov. Scott, Enterprise Florida, Space Florida and the EDC team," said Lynda Weatherman, president and CEO of the EDC. "Our success in bringing this project to Brevard demonstrates just how important economic development incentives are to winning a game changing project,

such as this."

Officials said that the project has been in the works for more than year.

The new facility is expected to be operational by 2015.

Currently, the average wage for Brevard County is \$44,159.

Anticipated capital investments for this project are expected to be nearly \$500 million, with 557 new indirect jobs, in areas that have not yet been determined, expected to be created to support the development of the project.

The total gross domestic product impact is expected to be more than \$290 million annually, and the total net new wage impact is expected to be more than \$240 million annually, officials said.

The unemployment rate in Brevard County is currently listed at 7 percent, according to public record.

Local woman charged with taking nude photos of daughter

Woman and her boyfriend told investigators the young girl wants to pose for Playboy

MELBOURNE — A Melbourne woman, accused of taking explicit photos of her 12-year-old daughter, is scheduled to appear in court on May 27.

Leslie Gay, 34, and her boyfriend,

Christopher Lucas, 43, of Melbourne were charged with lewd or lascivious conduct on a victim younger than 16 years old and use of a child in a sexual performance on April 25.

Ms. Gay told authorities that

she allowed Mr. Lucas to take explicit photos of her daughter because the young girl wanted to be a model for Playboy, according to police records.

Melbourne police officers and Department of Children and Family investigators received an anonymous report of child neglect and found photos of the girl on Mr. Lucas' personal laptop computer.

An investigation of the laptop for child pornography is ongoing.

The couple was arrested on April

25 in Melbourne and may face further charges, depending on what investigators find on Mr. Lucas' laptop.

Police said they believe that Mr. Lucas took nude photos of the young girl in sexual poses for months.

The charges against the couple are felonies in the second-degree.

As of press time, Ms. Gay remained at the Brevard County Jail on a \$70,000 bond.

Mr. Lucas has since bailed out of jail.

Keeping our promise to military veterans

It's important that we fulfill our commitment to our military veterans for their service. Their service on the front lines of freedom has prospered our nation and enabled generations of Americans to live free.

We took an important step in early May to keep this promise. We approved a Veterans Administration budget that fully funds veterans retirement benefits and veterans medical care, while providing millions of additional funding to end the VA's disability backlog.

And we include accountability provisions that hold VA employees, responsible for malfeasance.

Boosting funding for veteran services:

Compared to last year's budget, the House bill increases funding for veterans programs by 7 percent or \$10 billion. VA medical services are funded at an increased level of \$45 billion, which will enable 6 million additional patients to be treated within the VA next year. We also direct resources to further support suicide-prevention, mental health, traumatic brain injury, homeless veteran programs and rural health initiatives.

Ending the disability claims backlog:

My staff and I are more than disappointed with the VA's failure to address the veterans-claims backlog that has forced many veterans to wait nine months or more for claims to be processed.

This is completely unacceptable. We

increase spending to \$344 million to modernize the VA electronic health record system and hold VA and Department of Defense (DOD) accountable for meeting specific timelines and thresholds.

This includes another \$173 million for the paperless claims system to enable the VA to end the disability claims backlog by 2015. Enhancing digital health-record scanning and centralizing the mail will enable the VA to process claims in a timelier manner.

It also ensures better care by facilitating timely and accurate exchange of medical data between VA, DOD and the private sector. It's time to move veteran care into the 21st Century, and we should use current technology to speed up the process so veterans can get better care and faster service.

Holding the VA accountable for bad service and malfeasance:

Honoring our commitment to veterans involves upholding a higher standard of care and service at VA medical facilities.

Some VA medical facilities are top-notch, while others have been demonstrated to provide poor service to our veterans.

We have also read stories that are horrifying and perhaps criminal.

Holding VA managers and other employees accountable for the quality of services, provided to veterans under their management, is one of the biggest steps we take in this bill.

I supported amendments to the VA budget bill that will do this.

No one should get a bonus for working at the VA just because they have a job there. Any such payment should be earned by providing exceptional service to veterans under

Florida Tech team takes second in national science competition

MELBOURNE — A team from the Florida Institute of Technology finished second in a national science competition earlier this month.

The team, which designed a system involving large-scale emulated computer networks, placed second and won \$5,000 in the Eighth Annual National Security Innovation Competition in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

The FIT team was from the Harris Institute for Assured Information, which was comprised of graduate student Evan Stoner and undergraduates Tony Toggweiler and Kevin Manzotti.


The team was guided by research professor Thomas Eskridge and Department of Computer Sciences faculty advisor Marco Carvalho, who is also director of the Harris Institute.

“The team did very well,” Mr. Carvalho said. “The students were all engaged throughout the projects, and, in fact, they took the initiative to register and participate in the event in the first place. They worked together on the design, coding, test and validation of the emulation environment. We are very proud of the Florida Tech team and their work.”

The team’s entry was the Virtual Infrastructure for Network Emulation, or VINE.

VINE is an environment that allows researchers and educators to build large-scale emulated computer networks and scenarios for cyber security experimentation and training, Mr. Carvalho said.

It recreates the relationship between high-level mission tasks, operational settings, adaptive attackers and is currently being used in support of a num-

ber of research projects at Florida Tech.

“This is a great opportunity for our students and for Florida Tech to show some of the cybersecurity research being conducted at the Harris Institute for Assured Information,” Mr. Carvalho said. “The work presented by the

team is currently used in support of several research activities and well represents the quality and value of the applied research conducted by our students at Florida Tech.”

Mr. Carvalho said that this was the first time a team representing the university had entered this competition.

form of cancer, just a few weeks after her 40th birthday.

“The news came as a shock, as I had consulted my primary care physician for symptoms of fatigue,” Dr. Lefebvre, a mother of two boys, said. “I had experienced some GI rumbling and cramping, but had thought nothing of it.”

Dr. Lefebvre’s doctor sent her for an ultrasound, based on the fact that her liver enzymes were slightly elevated, which she believed was an unnecessary procedure.

“It probably ended up saving my life,” she said. “A shadow was seen on my liver, which led to more tests to discover that my liver was invaded with tumors that had spread from my colon.”

With no time for surgery, Dr. Lefebvre was immediately sent in for chemotherapy.

“Although I was deemed incurable and given a grim prognosis, I have, so far, responded very well to treatment, and after six months of intense chemotherapy, my doctor believed that 95 to 99 percent of the cancer was

gone,” Dr. Lefebvre said.

The inaugural “Booty Run” is the brainchild of Dr. Lefebvre, as well as a handful of friends, who wanted to help when she was first diagnosed.

“When I was diagnosed, I realized how very few resources exist here in our community, especially when it comes to helping people cope with the emotional aftermath of a diagnosis, like cancer,” Dr. Lefebvre said. “My friend Louise came up with the idea of the ‘Booty Run,’ and as the idea developed, it became clear to me that I wanted to raise awareness for colon cancer, as it is preventable with screenings and treatable, when caught early.”

Dr. Lefebvre said that the goal of the inaugural “Booty Run” is to raise awareness for colon cancer, while honoring colon cancer patients and raising money to increase resources for them.

With colon cancer ranking as the second-leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States, according to the American Cancer Society, the “Booty Run” aims to promote how important early detection is, especially since colon cancer is one of the most preventable and treatable cancers, if it’s caught early.

“I know my battle is not over, but my

results are, so far, very promising, and I am thrilled to be back at work part-time, doing the job that I love so much,” Dr. Lefebvre said. “I was a healthy, working mother of two boys, now 8 and 9, when I was diagnosed last summer.”

The inaugural Booty Run is Saturday, May 17 at Ballard Park in Melbourne, beginning at 5:30 p.m.





May is National Drowning Prevention Month

The month of May is the beginning of warmer weather, which brings a larger number of people to the water.

This brings an increase in drowning tragedies; therefore May is officially National Drowning Prevention Month.

Drowning is a leading cause of unintentional injury death worldwide, and the highest rates are among children.

Unfortunately, Florida leads the nation in drowning deaths in children between the ages of 1 and 4, and Brevard County ranks eighth in the state. It takes less than 30 seconds for a

child to drown.

Simple water safety steps can save lives. You should stay close, always be alert and watch your children at all times.

Seconds count, so all parents, caregivers and children should learn and practice survival-swimming skills, CPR and have life-saving equipment, such as life rings and jackets available for use.

You should use barriers, such as fencing, pool alarms or covers. It is also important to avoid drain entrapments. Do not let your children play or swim near drains or suction outlets.

Bringing awareness to life saving

drowning prevention methods is critical to reducing the number of drowning deaths in Brevard County.

The Florida Department of Health – Brevard County Environmental Health Services has teamed up with the Florida Department of Health's Office of Injury Prevention in participating in the WaterproofFL Campaign to help educate families on drowning prevention. DOH has also partnered with Clear Channel Media and Entertainment to broadcast drowning prevention messages on Lite Rock 99.3 and IHeart Radio. These messages are currently being broadcasted to Brevard County residents and thousands of tourists through June 2014.

In addition, DOH has provided drowning prevention brochures to mother/baby wards at two local area hospitals and all three Department of Health clinic sites.

On April 29, Coast Guard officials, "Josh the Otter," Swim Safe Forever Brevard and DOH Brevard officials were recognized by the Brevard County Board of County Commissioners, as it approved a county resolution that declared May as Water Safety and Drowning Prevention Month in Brevard County.

Search Title Before Bidding At Foreclosure Sale

Question: If I buy a property at a foreclosure sale, do I get clear title?
Answer: Not necessarily. A certificate of title issued by the clerk of the court after a foreclosure sale provides no warranties of title. A foreclosure judgment eliminates the interests of the defendants named in the judgment. A foreclosure judgment has no effect on any party not named as a defendant. It is improper to name lenders with superior liens as defendants.

For example, if a second mortgage holder files a foreclosure, the first mortgage holder would not be named as a defendant. This means that the first mortgage lien remains against the property despite the foreclosure. Anyone buying the property at a foreclosure sale would take title subject to the first mortgage. Liens for unpaid real estate taxes are superior to mortgage liens. Anyone buying the property at a foreclosure sale would take title subject to the tax liens. Sometimes a homeowner's or condominium association forecloses on a small lien. That is a red flag that there are probably larger superior liens that will not be foreclosed and remain on the property even after a foreclosure sale. It is always best to have a good title search done on a property before you bid on it.
