Nana's House community close to completion

WEST MELBOURNE— "Dream" is a word in which for some people their ideas never amount to much more than that, but for one woman, her dream of seeing a community built to help neglected children has finally come to fruition 10 years later.

"(I) literally had dreams that wouldn't go away at night, that were waking me up, and it took about two years for me and my husband to be on the same page before we decided to start it," said Kim Frodge, founder and executive director of Nana's House.


Nana's House is a 501(c)3 Christian-based nonprofit created by a woman dedicated to serving neglected, abused, needy or abandoned children (the words behind "Nana") in Brevard County.

Through the generosity of volunteers and companies providing time, supplies and dedication, Nana's House has been able to build eight homes in a gated community in West Melbourne.

"We take in neglected, abused, needy or abandoned children and we provide a family home for them," Mrs. Frodge said. "We never have more than five kids in each home and the idea is to just love them like they're our own. You can't expect a kid to grow up and run a normal home if they've never experienced one. So, we try to role-model what it's like to be in

Woman celebrates 106th birthday, surrounded by family and friends

WEST MELBOURNE - When thinking of the events and changes that have occurred in the last century, most people recall what they've read in history books.

Alice Good actually lived them.

Ms. Good celebrated her 106th birthday Feb. 2 with friends and family at Brookdale Senior Living in West Melbourne where she resides. Those in attendance included her sister, Marie Chalker; her son and daughter-in-law, Robert and Beverly Good, as well as other family and residents at Brookdale Senior Living. Chalker is Alice Good's youngest sister at 94.

"She's the oldest and I'm the youngest. They call us the 'Bookends,' " Chalker said.

Brookdale uploaded a Facebook post a week prior encouraging anyone interested to send cards to Mrs. Good. Some 26,853 people got the post. Of those, 416 liked it, 221 shared it and 134 left congratulatory comments. She received 120 birthday cards from residents in the area - all of whom were complete strangers - and 273 cards in total.


Cards came from local elementary schools, other senior living facilities and the Girls Scouts of America. One card came all the way from a stranger in Alaska.

"It'll keep me busy, opening the cards," Ms. Good said. "I think it's just wonderful. I got a lot of cards from the other Brookdale, from people I don't even know."

Ms. Good has been a resident of Florida for 25 years and lived independently with the help of friends, family and neighbors until last year, when she moved into Brookdale Senior Living

Ms. Good was born in 1912 in Seneca Falls,

Local families realize dream of home ownership

MELBOURNE - Cedarwood Drive in Melbourne was lined with families, volunteers, city officials, and church and business leaders on a recent Saturday morning to celebrate the dream of homeownership for two local families.

For the Hutker family, more than two years of hard work came to fruition as the family of six received the keys Jan. 27, to their four-bedroom home. For the Callaway family, raising the first exterior wall signaled the reality for this mother and son that sometime this year they will have a home to call their own.

Habitat for Humanity Site Supervisor Bruce Challender gave a heartfelt introduction of Tim and Tracee Hutker's family, which includes four children, Onnah, 8, Cole, 6, Scarlett, 4, and one-year-old Mia.

"It's been a long struggle for this group," Challender said. "There were four generations of Hutkers working on this house and four generations of devotion to family. We've helped them create an environment where they can raise their family in security."

The average time a family spends in the Habitat program, from application to closing, is two years. The Hutker family's process took two years and three months.

"While working through the program, the family lost the home they were renting

due to major repairs being needed," said Pam Davis, vice president of development and marketing for Habitat. "They entered a transitional housing program before owning their Habitat home."

Habitat families are required to complete of minimum of 200 hours of sweat equity per adult. On the Hutker home, the city of Melbourne Purchase Assistance Program required an additional 50 hours per adult, which brought the Hutker's total to more than 500 hours.

Harris Corporation was the major partner on the project, donating \$60,000 and more than 200 volunteer hours. Other partners included The Heinzel Family Trust and the city of Melbourne.

Melbourne City Councilwoman Betty Moore said that she recently reviewed the crime statistics in the Booker T. Washington area, which is where Cedarwood Drive is located, and she noted a decrease in crime activity.

"I give the law enforcement credit, but I

also give the homeowners credit," Ms. Moore said. "Everyone here is concerned about each other, and with more of these homes, it's only going to get better."

Habitat has provided more than 50 families homeownership opportunities in the Booker T. Washington neighborhood since 1992.

"We are continuing to revitalize the area with the last remaining 15 lots on Cedarwood Drive," Ms. Davis said. "Through dedication, hard work and community support, Booker T. Washington area is once again a safe place to call home."

As part of the dedication, the family received gifts from the community of blankets and quilts, cleaning supplies, decorations, garden supplies, books, toys and a gift certificate for food.

"When we first started the Habitat program, we didn't know this was going to be so much more than a program," Mrs. Hutker said. She described the family atmosphere of volunteers and the friendships that have already formed in the neighborhood. "We're not going to stop here. We're going to keep on building."

Frances Callaway, whose two-bedroom home is being built two doors down from the Hutker's, described a similar family atmosphere in the neighborhood.

"What I love most is just being out here," Ms. Callaway said as she stood next to the

BREVARD COUNTY — Store shelves are lined with greeting cards and restaurants are gearing up for romantic dinners, and while a certain amorousness is present with Valentine's Day this week, love is always in the air for local romance writers

SpacecoasT Authors of Romance (STAR) is the Brevard County chapter of the national Romance Writers of America, and the group gathers the fourth Saturday of every month at West Melbourne Public Library, 2755 Wingate Blvd.

With nearly 60 members, the group is comprised of writers of all ages and achievement levels, who are pursuing the publication of book-length fiction.

"One of the things that attracted me to STAR was the high level of professionalism of these writers, and many of them have the successes to prove it," said STAR President Chris Kridler, who lives in Rockledge. "We have writers who've made the bestseller lists, and we have writers who are just starting out. All of us have an opportunity to learn craft, publishing and marketing through one another's experiences and guest speakers."

Barbara Barrett drives from Celebration to West Melbourne each month, and says traveling is "worth the time and gas," because of the support she receives.

"I joined STAR nine years ago when I was new to Florida," Ms. Barrett said. "I

had been writing for several years and had finished several novels that were unpublished. I not only was seeking continued information about our craft and the publishing world, but also a place where others understood my ambitions and frustrations. They were there to celebrate with me when my first book was published in 2012."

Alethea Kontis of Titusville experienced a similar welcoming.

"When I first moved here, I didn't know anyone," Ms. Kontis said. "The members of STAR instantly welcomed me and understood how important my career was to me. We brainstorm, share trials and errors, tips and tricks, and support one another as often as we can."

Each meeting includes a sharing time, discussion of industry trends, brief business meeting, and a guest speaker or workshop.

Naomi Bellina of Cocoa has been a member of STAR since 2011, and cited the benefits of gathering in person versus in a virtual setting.

"We have guest speakers at our meetings, share about writing and publishing, congratulate our successes, and commiserate when things aren't so great," Ms. Bellina said. "Virtual groups are good, but there's something about meeting in person

that's especially enjoyable. And some members like to bake. You can't eat virtual chocolate. I've tried."

Jennifer Perkins of Palm Bay has been writing on and off for years, but started writing seriously about two years ago. For her, celebrating the accomplishments of other members is fulfilling and inspiring.

"STAR is a group where friendships are made and kept," Ms. Perkins said.

In order to be a member of STAR, individuals first must become members of the national organization, RWA. Visitors are invited to attend two STAR meetings before they are asked to join.

While every romance novel has a central love story, Ms. Kridler explained that romance comes in many forms.

"Romance is not just one genre," she said. "It can have mystery, vampires, family drama, seduction, Amish farmers, dukes and duchesses, soldiers, computer hackers, business executives, lawyers, bakers. Technically, anything labeled romance in publishing has a 'happy ever after' or 'happy for now' ending."

A cursory glance at Amazon book rankings shows the popularity of romance novels, and a more detailed search into the statistics reveals that this billion-dollarayear industry is poised to keep growing.

And with the writers of STAR involved, there will be no shortage of happily ever afters.

Do I need to lose weight?

doday's column will probably upset my readers as much as anything else I could write about. However, it affects more Americans than many other health issues. It takes a brave writer to even mention the topic, but once mentioned brings a sigh of relief from most, as it is a growing concern among many Americans.

When I was 12 years old I weighed 210 pounds and wore a size 44 man's suit. I was pretty hefty. My idea of pie a la mode was to surround a large slice of pie with about 8 scoops of ice cream. We had a restaurant, and my mother said I ate the profits off a 5-gallon container of ice

This all changed after my first high school dance when I found out that girls did not like fat boys; hence I lost 30 pounds the first month of my diet. Until lately I have been pretty successful in keeping it off, but a combination of age, health issues, and inability to exercise have all contributed to the rise (but not fall) of my weight issue. Now - what to do

Years ago I could cut back my food intake, head to the gym at Patrick Air Force Base, do some walking around the block, and fix the problem. Sadly, declining health and the accumulation of issues that affect most of us as we age

make it harder to lose weight. Most important, we have to be careful about whatever we do, for our bodies do not respond as quickly as they did years ago. Our well-intended actions may cause more harm than good. So be sure to consult your family doctor before you begin a planned weight loss or exercise

I talked to my doctor, rather he said to me, "Have you gained this much weight?" to which I had to say yes. He knew I had resolved on a corrective course of action, so he was nice and reminded me to take it slow and easy on new exercises. I assured him that I would do so. And, with fibromyalgia and related arthritic conditions, taking it easy will not be a problem. Still, I must consider an exercise program that will point me in the right

first wall of her home. "Now that I'll be living here, these aren't just my neighbors, these are my friends."

And it's that friendly neighborhood in which Ms. Callaway looks forward to raising her 6-year-old son, Rylan. They were surrounded Saturday morning with friends, family members and volunteers from local churches who gathered together to raise the first exterior wall of her home.

The Callaway family's home is an "Apostle Build," which means that churches in the area have formed a partnership to build the home. Currently, there are 18 churches involved and the expected completion date is June 30.

Families in need of affordable housing apply for homeownership with Habitat for Humanity and are subject to qualification, which is based on their need, their willingness to partner with Habitat, and their ability to repay the mortgage through an affordable payment plan.

"Families receive a choice of south, central or north Brevard County," Ms. Davis said. "After they've completed the requirements to be eligible, they're offered a lot from our land bank in their desired area."

In the last 32 years, Habitat for Humanity has served more than 340 families in Brevard County with new homes, "recycled homes" that have been remodeled and home repair programs.





Work continues on diverging diamond interchanges

BREVARD COUNTY — Work is underway in Palm Bay and Viera on two unusual "diverging diamond" interchanges over Interstate 95.

Viera Boulevard, which opened in 2007, will be redesigned so that lanes will crisscross at a traffic light and motorists will drive on the left side while traveling on the overpass. Vehicles will return to the right side at another traffic light at the other side of the overpass. The design allows drivers to exit onto I-95 without making left-hand turns in front of oncoming traffic.

In Palm Bay, construction began in early 2017 on another diverging diamond interchange at I-95 in an undeveloped area north of Micco Road.

The \$26.7 million Palm Bay project should be completed this summer and the \$17 million Viera project should be done by spring 2019, according to Sara Shep-

herd, public information coordinator with the Florida Department of Transportation, which is responsible for design and construction of the interchanges. Both projects currently are on schedule, she said.

Palm Bay officials hope the interchange, part of the planned 1.67-mile St Johns Heritage Parkway SE that will connect to Babcock Street, will spur economic development in South Brevard County.

The Viera interchange, a joint project between the state and The Viera Co., is

meant to ease traffic tie-ups at the Fiske Boulevard and I-95 interchange to the north and the Wickham Road interchange to the south, according to FDOT planners. The Viera Co. spent nearly \$1.4 million for design and permitting work and donated the necessary right-of-way property.

FDOT chose the diverging diamond design due to the small footprint such an interchange requires, Ms. Shepherd said. "This keeps the ramps close to the interstate and away from adjacent neighbor-

hoods," she added.

Florida's first diverging diamond interchange opened last year in Sarasota at Interstate 75 and University Parkway. The 12-lane, \$74 million project reportedly is the largest such interchange in the U.S.

The Sarasota interchange "has been a huge success," Ms. Shepherd said.

"Traffic flow, safety and travel times have all improved tremendously since the interchange opened in May 2017," she said. "FDOT has received positive feedback from numerous residents and elected officials about how it has improved traffic on both I-75 and University Parkway."

Similar interchanges are planned in Miami, Naples, Fort Myers, Wesley Chapel and Jacksonville, according to the website *divergingdiamond.com*.

Some 89 diverging diamond interchanges have opened across the U.S. since the first such interchange was completed in Springfield, Missouri, in 2009, the website reported.

a normal home."

Nana's House began construction in 2015 and as of press time, three of the homes were fully completed and lived-in, with four more homes under construction. House parents are being interviewed to live in the fourth completed home.

Mrs. Frodge said she hopes to have the rest of the homes finished and ready to be moved into by the end of March.

Nana's House accepts children from newborn to 11 years old to live in a cottage-styled house with two house parents for up to a year.

"The children usually come to us for a year," Mrs. Frodge explained. "If you are in that bad of a situation, a lot of times you need time to get on your feet, and we want it to be a successful reunification. We want the parents to have their own home or apartment, a job, transportation and we're willing to help them achieve those things, but they have to take action to get that."

A resource guide is available for parents who need help or advice.

Nana's House provides housing, utilities and a van for house parents, and are looking for married couples to live in the gated community for a long-term period.

"In return, they provide a safe, loving, Christian environment for our children," Mrs. Frodge said.

The gated community will include a pond, playground, community pool and community clubhouse, along with a storage facility and an apartment provided for on-site managers and maintenance workers.

Nana's House still is looking for two house sponsors at \$100,000 each, an apartment sponsor at \$75,000, and one playground and one bathroom sponsor at \$20,000 each.

Once everyone has moved in to the community, Mrs. Frodge said she'd like to start hosting "neighbor nights" for families to get to know and bond with

one another.

"We had neighbor night at my house and all of the neighbors would come bring a dish and we'd all just get to know each other," Mrs. Frodge said. "How are you going to love your neighbor if you don't know them?"

Nana's House will also host extra-curricular activities for children living within the community. Inside the community building is a kitchen, pool table and living room with a wall full of musical instruments.

"Whatever their little love is, whatever their little heart is yearning to do, you gotta imagine, literally all of these little kids we take in have never experienced these extra-curricular activities," Mrs. Frodge said. "So, whatever it is they want to do, we want to feed that.

"We have different people in the community who will come in and volunteer and we will have an extra-curricular schedule," she added.

Once the community has been com-

pleted, Mrs. Frodge said she plans to get Nana's House a private adoption license. She added that Nana's House is looking for an attorney who specializes in adoption and would be willing to donate his or her services.

Volunteers are also needed to help run Nana's House thrift cottages in Malabar for a few days a week. Thrift store hours are from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday.

"I think we give lots of children hope who otherwise wouldn't have it," Mrs. Frodge said. "I love it. We couldn't do it without the community because we are a community children's home. They provide for everything that we have, of course, them and God."

New York, where, to get around, she rode on a horse-drawn milk wagon while her father delivered milk to the residents. Ms. Good grew up during the Great Depression, though she said she wasn't as afflicted as most Americans by the shortages during that era because her family were farmers and ultimately self-sufficient enough to provide for themselves.

Born the same year the Titanic sunk, Ms. Good remembers some of history's key events. One of her friends later in life had a friend who was rescued from the Titanic as an infant and adopted, she said.

"My hometown was the town where women's rights started," Ms. Good said. "I can remember the women on Sunday morning marching with long dresses. I think that was 1918. I was 6. I probably thought they were out of their minds."

The differences in an average Americans' lifestyles during her formative years is hardly recognizable today.

"We had no bathroom, we had no water. We drank unpasteurized milk, we drank water from a well, no chlorination and we lived," Ms. Good said. "On Facebook the other day there was a [picture of] a galvanized [bath]tub that said: 'How many remember one of these?' I do."

Ms. Good recalls being bathed with her sisters once a week on Saturdays during the Depression era. The water wasn't hot and pumped from their well. Their family did not have indoor plumbing for a number of years throughout her childhood.

She worked as a deputy commissioner of Social Services in Seneca Falls for 40 before moving to Florida in 1973 with her husband.

They lived in Airstream Park on Airport Boulevard for 20 years before moving into Tropical Haven, formerly known as Trailer Haven, and residing there for 24 years.

Ms. Good served on the Board of Directors at Airstream Park as well as holding the position of for several years. While in Tropical Haven, she worked for the senior center as president until retiring from there at the age of 90.

Ms. Good's tenaciousness at an older age is exemplified by her son, Robert, who explained that, at 90, she broke her hip, but drove herself home that same day. Despite a broken hip, she continued to drive until she voluntarily gave it up at age 92.

Even in retirement, Mrs. Good found herself making good use of her time knitting hats to donate to local hospitals. Ms. Good also embraced technological advances at her disposal, utilizing Facebook and email to keep in contact with family and friends. She says she also spends time reading on her Kindle.

Since coming to Brookdale, she's continued crocheting and adores having visitors stop by for a visit and conversation.

What's the secret to long life according to Ms. Good? Candy.

"She's big on sweets. No one can say candy will hurt you because she's living proof," Robert Good said.

Admittedly, Ms. Good says she didn't think she'd live this long, but says she thanks God each morning for the wonderful family, friends and neighbors she has in her community.



"The audience usually has a good grasp of the type of music I like to sing," Mr. O'Donnell said. "(My country music) is sort of the old traditional country, and a few newer songs that have been written in the old style, I just enjoy that type of country music, and I certainly have a love of the Irish ballads, too.

We don't do an awful lot, maybe five or six of the (Irish) ballads," Mr. O'Donnell added. "Like 'Danny Boy,' or 'Galway Bay,' or things like that. Some would be wellknown to people in Ireland, so we bring a little bit of everything with us."

Mr. O'Donnell blends a variety of musical styles together, and encourages an audience of all types.

"Even though the music is a sort of mixture of country and Irish and easy lis-

tening and even rock and roll, the very fact that I'm Irish is that I bring that with me in my person," Mr. O'Donnell said. "And I hope that those people that are from Ireland feel that connection of home. For people who maybe have no great Irish connection, that they feel if they've never been, that they may make a trip."

Mr. O'Donnell has visited Brevard County once before in the past, and said he's glad to be coming back.

"I love Florida," Mr. O'Donnell said. "I love (Melbourne's) proximity to the sea, and the ocean. I was born on the Atlantic, so it's the same ocean we trade, albeit that your coast is a little warmer than ours."


