Cocoa, Melbourne water deal to save taxpayers millions

MELBOURNE — Following discussions regarding the shared water utility systems of Cocoa and Melbourne, the two municipalities have decided to work together to improve water management.

Last month, the city of Cocoa and the city of Melbourne proposed and accepted an agenda to enter into a joint purchasing agreement to install additional water mains to the Barrier Islands.

"The city of Melbourne water distribution system provides water to its beach side service area via two 20-inch water mains that cross the Indian River Lagoon," Melbourne officials stated during the deciding council meeting. "These two crossings are in excess of 30 years old and while neither has exhibited any issues, the expansion in the overall distribution system has begun to manifest itself in lower pressures and flows in the beach side service area."

Officials also mentioned that the pipes will

Melbourne reviews historical properties

BREVARD COUNTY — Taking account of local history is an important part of a well-rounded society, and the city of Melbourne recently did just that in an open workshop.

On June 5, the city of Melbourne hosted an open workshop to review Downtown Melbourne's historic properties. The Historic Properties Survey for Downtown Melbourne has not been observed in 27 years.

Melbourne officials also called for any residents that may have more information regarding their own historical sites.

"City staff [discussed] the state-funded project to survey buildings in the downtown area for inclusion in the State of Florida's inventory of historic resources and [debuted] an interactive map of downtown's historic survey information," Melbourne officials stated in a recent press release. "If [your property was mentioned], we would like to learn more about the history of your site — previous ownership, prior exterior modifications, property photos, and any other information that you feel would contribute to creating a robust inventory of the historic properties in Downtown Melbourne."



Along East New Haven Avenue alone, there are 62 sites that were marked as 50 years or older, and on East Lincoln Avenue, 45 sites. In the

entire area surveyed, there are hundreds of such sites, along with many other Florida Master Site File -surveyed structures.

MegaCon Orlando: bigger and better? Yes!

Maybe it's the high-profile celebrities or the added features such as a "Harry Potter" Escape Room and Nerf war room, but MegaCon has certainly seen an increase in guests milling about dressed as their favorite characters.

MegaCon once again returned to the Orange County Convention Center in Orlando for four days during the Memorial Day weekend.

Each year, thousands of people flock to the convention center, which serves as a pilgrimage for fans of all kinds of entertainment and there is no shortage of fun things to do to pass the time.

In the main hall, rows upon rows of vendors display their unique wares – some of which are homemade arts and crafts, or professional goods that are hard to find in stores.

Famous Faces & Funnies, a local comic book store in Melbourne, returned to MegaCon Orlando and store owner Rick Shea said he noticed a particular increase in guests attending this year's convention.

"We've been coming here since MegaCon first started with its original owner, in about 1998 or 1999," Mr. Shea said. "We've grown from attending with one or two booths to eight booths. We do really well here. MegaCon has really stepped up its game. On Thursday, we doubled what we made compared to last year's Thursday, and we've kept

increasing our sales since."

Mr. Shea attributes some of his store's success at MegaCon by having a great staff that makes sure attendees are having fun and by giving the people what they want: Funko Pops.

"We brought about 2,500 different Pops with us and we've been selling them like there's no tomorrow," Mr. Shea said. "We also sell Gundam Wing and graphic novels. There's something here for everyone."

Funko Pops have certainly taken over most fans' interests. It was hard to walk anywhere in the vendor hall without seeing a wall of Funkos.

For those unfamiliar with the item, Funko Pops are small, toy figures of characters that have made a popular wave within the past few years. Characters typically range from popular TV shows, movies, video games and more.

My main mission upon attending MegaCon Orlando was to search for a "Sherlock Holmes" Funko from the BBC series "Sherlock." After browsing hundreds of Funkos from two other conventions I'd attended in the past and not finding Sherlock, I had little hope

The average Pop figure sells for \$11, but I finally found my Sherlock for \$20 and I just had to get it! There was one other Sherlock left at the stall, and probably the only one left for sale at MegaCon.

While walking throughout the vendor rows, it's hard to miss the amazing cosplay (modern term for

"costume play") out and about. Attendees come dressed as anything or anyone you can imagine.

"Pennywise" the clown from Stephen King's novel-turned-movie "It" was a popular character, as well as Disney princesses, Marvel's "Deadpool" and many more.

convinced he was "Rick Grimes" from the AMC television series "The Walking Dead" that I had to pause and stare.

A tiny corner of MegaCon was dedicated to prison walls and a look-alike character from the popular zombie show. That was Cecil Garner, a Melbourne resident who travels to various conventions to pose with fans as Rick Grimes.

The area served as a photo opportunity for guests, and fans could pose with plastic weapons and made-up zombies to capture a moment in time as if they were living in "The Walking Dead" world.

Mr. Garner took on the persona of "Cecil Grimes," his take on the character who is one of the main protagonists in "The Walking Dead." He began his cosplay career after growing out his beard for "No-shave-November" and being told many times by random people that he looked similar to the character.

add “resiliency and redundancy” to the current water utility system.

The new water mains extending to the Barrier Islands will improve upon the previous system, providing additional support and saving residents money on water utilities.

“The city of Cocoa and city of Melbourne are excited about the opportunity to move forward with this project and save our customers millions of dollars,” said Assistant to the City Manager and Public Relations Specialist for the City of Cocoa Samantha Senger, and Public Information Officer for the city of Melbourne Cheryl Mall. “Adding redundancy and resiliency in our system means having multiple crossings that can provide

water to our customers should one of the pipes fail. If one fails, we would then have two other avenues to deliver water to our barrier island customers.”

The proposed work on the water mains is expected to extend to the next three to four years.

“The project is multi-jurisdictional, which means the various organizations that are all involved [must work together] for permitting purposes,” Ms. Mall and Ms. Senger said. “The location is also along two major highways and thus could pose some traffic challenges.”

By sharing resources, the project is expected to save taxpayers and residents \$3 million dollars.

Brevard County seniors need advocacy

My work with Brevard seniors started in 1993 when I became Director of the Alzheimer's Association East Central Florida Chapter. During these past 25 years, I have observed several swings, both positive and negative, in support of elder programs. To my chagrin we are now in a negative swing, and this is not a good time to be in such a position. The percentage of seniors in Florida, already the highest in the nation, is projected to increase from 20 to 25 percent (5.9 million seniors) by 2030.

Yet on May 20, Florida Today published an article entitled "It's time we fund Children's Services Council." The article described the need for more financial support for children in Brevard to include caring for them in the 18 hours they are not in school. The common rationale is that these children come from situations that mitigate against them having an equal opportunity to grow up as do other children.

However, we have two county based funding programs and United Way,

which focuses on education and providing a healthy environment for families. Not to mention money collected through our taxes for schools and a new half-cent sales tax that will assist children. When will enough be enough? Do we really need to fund another government entity to "ensure the best use of taxpayer dollars" and "determine the specific needs of (our) children?"

I was appointed 10 years ago to the Children's Services Council of Brevard and served until my term ended this past March. I attended Council meetings over the years, but saw nothing accomplished. However, there was always a desire to get funding for it on the ballot. A seldom known fact is that the Children's Services

Council is designated as a taxing district. This means that if funded by a general vote, the Council can distribute whatever funds come to it through an ad valorem tax. The article cited a property tax not to exceed a half mil. For your information that is the maximum amount prescribed by law.

While all this sounds perfectly good, I caution you to become fully informed of the ramifications of passage of said referendum if placed on the ballot. Creation of new government infrastructure typically entails generous salaries and overhead costs. The 10 CSCs in Florida manage an average of \$48 million annually in taxpayer money, a hefty sum that is overseen by a small group of appointed citizens. In my opinion this adds to an increasing bureaucracy that takes control away from the public. Here I side with Commissioner Tobia in reducing Citizen Advisory Boards, for the Children's Services Council is that and much more.

Remember that we have more seniors over the age of 65 than we do children under the age of 18 in Brevard. Cases of elder abuse in Florida have nearly doubled in the past five years, and we had 65,000 on the Medicaid waiting lists last year, the majority of whom were seniors. Why not Senior Services Council? Would that get the attention that will inevitably be brought to bear on school safety to support this referendum for funding the Children's Service Council? Be informed.

School donates blankets for homeless veterans

BREVARD COUNTY — With the end of another school year come and gone, teachers and students of St. Teresa Catholic School were proud to end it on a high note with a special presentation during its last assembly.

Throughout the year, teachers and students collaborated on a project aimed to help homeless veterans without a bed to sleep on.

A collection of thousands of recycled plastic bags turned into 13 ground covers that homeless veterans and their families can sleep on top of. Each blanket measures at about 6-feet long and 3-feet wide.

St. Teresa Catholic School invited George Taylor, founder and CEO of National Veterans Homeless Support in Brevard County, to say a few words during a presentation of the ground covers at the school's last assembly.

"The impact of homeless veterans is real in our community," Mr. Taylor said. "People don't go to school thinking, 'I think I'll grow up and be homeless.' That's not their dream. I started this [organization] because in 1989, I was homeless.

"I walked away from my church, I walked away from my job, and it wasn't because of drugs and alcohol," he explained. "I came back from Vietnam and I just didn't want to talk to anybody... I was fortunate enough to be involved in a program in Miami for combat veterans,

and they explained what Post-Traumatic Stress was and why I had issues after coming back from Vietnam."

In 1992, Mr. Taylor rejoined his community and found a new mission. It was finally in 2008 that he started the National Veterans Homeless Support to help veterans facing similar issues.

Since its inception, the organization has seen an 88 percent reduction in homeless veterans in Brevard in 10 years.

Mr. Taylor invited a guest he had brought to speak on his experience about being homeless after losing a job in Orlando and having nowhere to live in Cocoa Beach.

"We went to the VA and the homeless support there put us in contact with George [Taylor] and his wife, Jan, and they put me and my wife in housing," he explained. "It was a blessing to see them helping us out. Sometimes it's not your fault for being homeless when certain situations arise. Thanks to George and Jan we're in a house now, we're back on track and everything is good."

Students then presented Mr. Taylor with bags of the plastic blankets, and he explained just how something such as these ground covers makes a difference in homeless veteran's lives.

Many homeless people live among the woods, according to Mr. Taylor, and if you pick the wrong spot to sleep on, you may have a wet night. The plastic ground covers add a layer of protection from the wet ground, as well as make the ground a little

less uncomfortable from the roots of trees that stick out.

The project began when ideas floated around for a social justice project the school could get involved with.

Once the plastic bags were collected, students from the third to eighth grade participated by cutting, folding and creating "plarn" (plastic yarn) balls for teachers

to crochet into ground covers.

Each blanket used about 700 plastic bags, according to St. Teresa Principal Jackie Zackel.

"I think it's a beautiful project and we plan to contribute again in the next school year," Mrs. Zackel said.





detail in the playing. Every player is much more exposed. Every instrument is not just heard, but is somehow alive, in full characterization."

Brahms' piece might sound familiar, as it has been used in movies and television shows such as the "Sarek"

episode of "Star Trek: The Next Generation."

"I just recently listened to [Opus 18] for the first time," Mr. Collins said. "Several things struck me on first listen. There is an incredible wealth of melody. It's overflowing with beautiful tunes. There is also great clarity and lightness in texture that allows the listener to admire Brahms' use of color in the violins, violas, and cellos."

"There are many great adaptations of 'The Wonderful Wizard of Oz' but most do not use farce as the guiding muse," Mr. Bergeron said. "We took on the challenge of creating a comedy that would appeal to both adults and children."

This adaptation was inspired by "Rocky and Bullwinkle's" 'Fractured Fairy Tales,' which ran as a television series from 1959-64.

"Fractured Fairy Tales' from the '60s relied on the audience's familiarity with well-known stories," Mr. Bergeron explained. "This allowed the writers to add a satirical slant to the tale without the need of detailed exposition. This made this five-minute comedic segments just plain fun. Of course, creat-

ing a full-length comedy based on this principle is a bit more challenging."

The two-act play will include familiar characters with Ava Wolfenkoehler as Dorothy; Matt Davis as Scarecrow; Chris Tsocanos as Cowardly Lion; Katherine McCall as Tin Man and John Torres as Wizard.

Traveling with golf in mind can be costly

With my writing job, I get to travel quite a bit. I know how expensive golf travel can be. Fortunately, over the years I have learned a few tricks to keep costs down without sacrificing fun. With summer here, I am betting many of us, myself included, will be hitting the highways and airways in search of rest, relaxation, and golf.

Probably the best way to save money is to travel with a group. Get as many of your golf buddies to join you on your trip. Larger groups will find that they have leverage when it comes to negotiating lower prices for rooms, food, and golf.

If you have hotel or credit card points check to see what benefits they give you. Some credit card companies offer free room upgrades, or discounted greens fees at many resorts. If more than one in your group has a free or discounted night coming at a hotel, you could combine these to get several nights out of your stay for free or greatly reduced.

Check with your home club. Many these days are managed by a company that has many courses in its portfolio. See if you get discounted golf at other courses owned or managed by the same company.

Ask about unlimited golf packages. Many resorts offer these in off-peak

seasons to entice business. There are also packages that include lunch, drinks, and discounted replays.

If you really want to avoid the big money greens fees, steer away from the resorts advertised on television or that tout their "Home of the Blah Blah Championship" layout. While it may be fun to say that you played these courses, you will almost always pay a premium to do so. National advertising is expensive, as is maintaining the course in those fantastic conditions. In the end it all gets passed down to the customer.

If you haven't played in a while, avoid playing your first round on an expensive, plush course. Take advantage of the municipal courses and use that round to knock off the rust from not picking up a club for so long.

While it's nice to be prepared and have most everything planned and thought-out, it's to your benefit to leave some time open for a last-minute round. Once an

empty tee time is gone, it is gone. Many courses offer deep discounts if you call to fill one of those spots at just the right time. There are also several apps that allow you to find tee times at the very last moment and book them on your phone while your buddy drives to the course.

Plan your trip for mid-week. Prices on travel, hotels and golf are always higher on the weekends. Besides, it will get you away from the office for a couple extra days.

Make sure that everyone is comfortable with everything that is planned. There are times when the guys with the deepest pockets want everyone to eat at a more expensive restaurant, stay at a fancier place, play the more expensive courses. While you don't want to make one person feel unwelcome, you certainly don't want to let one person have all the say.

Next to golf, food can be the most expensive part of your trip. Look for accommodations that have a kitchen which allows you to cook meals. Find coupons for discounted meals or even visit restaurants websites and sign up with their emails to get discounts for your first visit.

Look for courses that offer walking. You may not want to walk in the summer heat of the south, but walking a course in

a more temperate climate is not only good for your wallet, but for your health as well.


