**Toys 'R' Us
closes
doors
for good**

MELBOURNE — After 71 years in business, the Toys "R" Us franchise announced earlier this year that it would be going out of business June 29 and closing the doors of all 735 of its U.S. store locations, including the longstanding Brevard County staple along Route 192 in Melbourne.

"I remember coming here as a kid; it was always such a treat. My little guy loves it, too," said Tammy Farmer of Indian Harbour Beach, who scoured the rows of empty aisles at the Melbourne Toys "R" Us June 25 with her 4-year-old son, Brady. "It's just sad that he will never know the true joy of growing up a Toys 'R' Us kid."

U.S. employees have been scheduling protests after learning that they wouldn't be paid severance after losing their jobs. Some 31,000 workers were let go and given 60 days' notice, as required by federal law.

The closure includes Babies "R" Us, and stores have been closing nationwide, along with stores located in Puerto Rico. To date, Toys "R" Us remains open for business in Canada.

Liquidation sales began in March and customers flocked to the stores to find discounted items. The company filed for bankruptcy September, 2017, and failed to bounce back with Christmas sales.

Florida Tech hosts corrosion congress

BREVARD COUNTY — One of the more difficult aspects of material and structural efficiency in a marine environment is corrosion and fouling.

On June 24-29, Florida Institute of Technology recently hosted the 19th International Congress on Marine Corrosion and Fouling.

There were presentations from academics, government officials such as Congressman Bill Posey, and industry officials during the event, who spoke on possible solutions and anti-fouling efforts.

The ICMCF originated in Juan-Les-Pins, France in 1964. Since then, the ICMCF has been held in various locations around the world.

"This conference [has] kept with past ICMCF traditions by providing an interdisciplinary program that will highlight research efforts in understanding and combating biofouling and corrosion of materials and structures immersed in the marine environment," ICMCF officials stated. "It is ICMCF's goal to bring experts from around the

world together to discuss the latest basic and applied research advances in biology, microbiology, chemistry, physical chemistry, coatings, and materials to help face the challenges of biofouling and corrosion."

"Florida Tech is home to the Center for Corrosion and Biofouling Control, led by Geoffrey Swain, one of the world's preeminent anti-fouling engineers," Florida Tech officials stated in a recent press release.

Geoffrey Swain provided the first discussion of the ICMCF event, speaking about the Center for Corrosion and Biofouling Control, its research, and highlights from the past 30 years of research.

Some of the topics covered at the ICMCF were 'Biomimicry, Bioinspiration and Natural Anti-foulants'; 'Fouling as a Vector for Invasive Species'; and 'New Anti-fouling Technology', among others.

by Macaroni Kids for two or three years in a row now," she continued. "So, our goal is to no longer be the best-kept secret. It's time to get the word out."

Morgan's Place is a facility for inclusive and cooperative play for children who need a sensory controlled environment and/or wheelchair accessibility, according to the facility's website.

It first opened its doors in Brevard County in 2012, and is part of the M.O.R.G.A.N. Project, which was founded by Kristen Malfara in 2001.

The M.O.R.G.A.N. Project began as a support organization for parents raising children with special needs. The organization was named after Mrs. Malfara's son, Morgan, who was born with a terminal illness called leukodystrophy, and has him physically and developmentally disabled.

"We're extremely proud of the fact that we're still here," Mrs. Malfara said. "The community helped build and support this place, and rebuild this place. I have no doubt that they'll be here for us for the long haul, just like we're here for them."

The remodeled facility includes two new rooms along with updated play areas for children.

The sensorium features a waterbed, ball pit, fiber optics and a newer area of tactile elements. Everything in the sensorium has been custom built to Mrs. Malfara's specifications.

"I'm really excited that we were able to build it to the needs of our clients," she said.

A returning feature is the Morgan's Place

"technology zone," which includes an interactive floor by EyeClick. There are 30 different games the children can interact with, which is projected on the floor.

"Our sensory dog was playing soccer on the interactive floor the other day, it was hysterical," Mrs. Malfara said. "He was popping bubbles and playing soccer."

A new "Ultraviolet Room" features black lights and is similar to the sensorium. An ultraviolet shelf changes colors under the black lights, and various tactile elements are available for children to interact with in this room.

Another new room is the "Rainbow Room", which has a climbing apparatus and HugglePods (hanging chairs), as well as a "Dignity Room" for nursing mothers.

Mrs. Malfara explained that the Dignity Room also serves as a quiet room for children experiencing meltdowns or for private therapists to meet with clients.

"The lobby has been re-done to include interactive features, so the minute they walk in, they immediately get to start interacting with the environment," Mrs. Malfara said.

The outside has been spruced up to include a water feature area, and a new Morgan's Place sign has been put up.

"We decided that if everything inside was going to be new, we had to make everything outside new too," Mrs. Malfara added. "The whole place is just beautiful. Absolutely nothing from the fire is left behind, which of course, was critical for us because we have children with medical needs. So, we had to make sure that it was done properly for these kids. I can't wait to see their faces. I can't wait for them to see this place."

Hometown Heroes

New deputies will be on the scent

PALM BAY — Jet and Blue are on the case, or at least they will be in a year or so when they grow into their big, floppy ears and undergo extensive training.

The Brevard County Sheriff's Office recently received the two bloodhound puppies from the Florida-based Jimmy Ryce Foundation, which advocates for the rescue of missing and abducted children.

JetBlue Airlines provided the funding, which allowed the dogs to be given at no cost to the BCSO.

"As a show of appreciation, our two newest team members are being named Jet and Blue to express our gratitude," said Sheriff Wayne Ivey.

According to the Jimmy Ryce Foundation, bloodhounds are the only dogs that can follow a human trail that is more than a few hours old.

"The bloodhound's ability to smell is much greater than that of a shepherd," said Lt. Todd Maddox, who oversees the BCSO K-9 Unit. "They're used specifically for tracking nonviolent offenders such as a missing child or an elderly person with Alzheimer's."

Deputy Michael Nettles, who serves as a K-9 handler and will work closely with Jet and Blue, said bloodhounds have a unique ability to store information in their nostrils and their brain.

"The best way to describe it is if you ordered a pizza at your house, you would smell the pepperoni or whatever else you ordered on the pizza," Deputy Nettles said. "The bloodhound can smell the

yeast and the water that was used, and the cologne of the delivery guy and can identify if that guy has dogs at home."

Although the bloodhound puppies were given to the BCSO at no charge, a few community members have balked at the cost to feed, train and keep the shots up to date for the dogs in the BCSO K-9 program.

But Deputy Nettles argues that it's hard to put a price on a human life.

"The first time we find a missing child or adult, the dog's worth its weight in gold," he said.

With 60 times more sniffing power than other dogs, bloodhounds are often called on dual hunts with patrol dogs.

"Once the bloodhound leads to a site where the bad guy may be in a building or a house, we'll pull the bloodhound back and let the patrol dog go in for the bite," said Deputy Nettles.

That's because bloodhounds are notoriously docile and gentle, especially with kids.

"It's good for kids to see dogs that don't bite," said Deputy Nettles, who regularly leads demonstrations. "When you have 60 to 70 kids pulling on them and they won't bite, it shows their good temperament."

Deputy Nettles has grown especially fond of Blue, who "constantly has his nose to the ground," he said. But there's still plenty of time for Jet to pick up his sniff-

ing game since the duo have at least nine months of training before they'll be certified and out and about with their handlers.

"It's a different process for the bloodhounds," said Lt. Maddox. "With the patrol dogs, we usually get them at 12 to 24 months, a full-grown dog. With the bloodhounds, we have to get them as puppies, seven to eight weeks, and we begin the training process immediately."

Currently, the BCSO K-9 program has 13 patrol dogs, four single-purpose dogs at the jail, eight bloodhounds including Jet and Blue, and seven dogs at Port Canaveral that monitor the cruise ships. One of its patrol dogs, 7-year-old Arco unexpectedly passed away in his sleep on June 28.

"These dogs are part of the family," said Deputy Nettles. "When they hurt we hurt."

The BCSO received its first bloodhound from The Jimmy Ryce Foundation when the organization was formed in 1996 by Don and Claudine Ryce following the abduction and murder of their 9-year-old son, Jimmy.

It was the family's belief that Jimmy may have been found sooner if police would have had immediate access to bloodhounds.

Since starting the organization, the Foundation has donated more than 600 certified bloodhounds to law enforcement agencies.

"We were the very first recipient when they first started that foundation," said Lt. Maddox. "We've always stayed in close contact with them."

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, does hereby name the soon-to-be-constructed bridge over the FEC railroad on Pineda Causeway the 'Major General John Cleland Memorial Bridge'. Let this serve as a reminder to all of the life of this great public servant. DONE, ORDERED AND ADOPTED in regular session, this 22nd day of May, 2018."

Cops sip coffee, discuss issues, build relationships

PALM BAY — The number of cop cars parked in front of Heritage High School in northwest Palm Bay on a recent Friday morning signaled trouble brewing, but inside the situation was relaxed as officers sipped coffee and chatted with residents.

A dozen or so officers rotated in and out of the school in shifts, depending on calls for service, during the hour-long Coffee with a Cop event. They had three goals in mind: discuss community issues, build relationships and drink coffee.

"What makes it nice is it's a completely open forum," said Palm Bay Police Lt. Steve Bland. "Most conversations start with questions about the officer. People get to know the officers personally and that's something that really never happens when officers respond to a call."

Other topics of discussion ranged from traffic and speeding problems to neighborhood nuisances.

"The majority of the contact law enforcement has with the public happens during emergencies or emotional situations," said Palm Bay Police Chief Jim Rogers.

"Coffee with a Cop provides a unique opportunity for community members to ask questions and learn more about the officers who work in their neighborhood every day."

Coffee with a Cop is a national initiative started in 2014 and supported by The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services. Similar events are held across the county, as local police departments strive to make lasting connections with the communities they serve. The program aims to advance the practice of community policing through improving relationships between police officers and community members one cup of coffee at a time.

The Palm Bay Police Department began hosting Coffee with a Cop in conjunction with the first national event and hosts hour-long sessions every two-to-three months at different locations throughout the city.

In May, officers gathered at the McDonald's inside the Walmart on Malabar Road. The next Coffee with a Cop event will take place from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. Friday, Aug. 24 at the standalone McDonald's near I-95 at 1179 Malabar Road.

Artist designs chaplains monument pro bono

MERRITT ISLAND — Shortly before its Memorial Day ceremony several weeks ago, the Brevard Veterans Memorial Center, at 400 S. Sykes Creek Parkway, held a dedication for its newest monument, the All Chaplains, Four Chaplains Monument, which commemorates the acts of four chaplains who died aboard a U.S. Army transport ship that sunk in 1943.

The monument was designed by artist Jeanne Weaver, who previously designed two other monuments at the center — one in memory of those who served in Afghanistan and another dedicated to those who served in Iraq.

"As the art designer, I designed what the [chaplains] monument would look like," Ms. Weaver explained. "It would be four sided with a different Bronze panel on each side."

Ms. Weaver noted that in addition to serving as the art designer for the entire monument, she also created an oil painting on which one of the four bronze panels would be based.

"The other three panels would give information about the four chaplains, chaplain corps in general, and specific examples of valor," Ms. Weaver added, noting that each panel was fabricated by American Bronze Foundry in Sanford.

Additionally, the top of the monument was to be a pinnacle, and the trapezoidal structure would rest on a cement block that would function as a bench.

Ms. Weaver said she first became inspired to work on the Four Chaplains monument while attending a commemorative ceremony in Feb. 2016 led by Brevard Veterans Memorial Center Chaplain Chip Hanson, who told the story of the "Four Immortal Chaplains."

General Cleland served in the U.S. Army for 37 years. He enlisted at 17 years old and retired in 1980. He had been commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant of Infantry from the Infantry Officer Candidate School and had commanded all levels of Infantry units.

Gen. Cleland served as a Parachute Infantry unit commander in World War II, Korean War and Vietnam War.

General Cleland was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal with oak leaf cluster; the Silver Star Medal; the

Defense Superior Service Medal; the Legion of Merit with three oak leaf clusters; and the Purple Heart Medal with oak leaf cluster.

General Cleland was a member of the U.S. Army Infantry Hall of Fame and served as the Honorary Colonel of his Korean War Regiment.

Upon retiring from the Army, General Cleland worked as a Defense Analyst and a consultant to private industry for 20 years.

"I am very happy and thankful that they are honoring him," Ms. Cleland said. "He deserves the honor. I think John would be very pleased, but he also

felt that people should not be honored this way when they were still alive. If this had happened while he was living, he would have said 'no'."

Retired U.S. Army Lieutenant General Bennett L. Lewis added, "John Cleland was a genuine hero. He was a friend who spoke up and gave his opinion freely and clearly. He was an effective member of 'Veterans in Defense of American Liberties' and for three consecutive years, John testified before the Florida Legislature to achieve passage of a law that restricts the use of foreign law in the Florida courts. His many achievements have made Brevard County and the State

of Florida a better place for its citizens."

In addition to being a member of Veterans in Defense of American Liberties, General Cleland served as Commodore of the Eau Gallie Yacht Club and was Senior Warden of Holy Apostles Episcopal Church.

Construction of the bridge is expected to take 18 months, after which a memorial plaque will be installed. According to a press release, the bridge will allow cars to traverse the Pineda Causeway without stopping for trains.

The chaplains became known for their heroism during a dire situation aboard a sinking Army transport ship that was struck by a German U-boat while en route to an American base in Greenland the night of Feb. 2, 1943.

"Through the pandemonium, according to those present, four Army chaplains brought hope in despair and light in darkness," notes the Four Chaplains Memorial Foundation at www.fourchaplains.org.

In the 20 minutes between the time the ship was struck and the time it sank, the foundation adds, the chaplains "tried to calm the frightened, tend the wounded and guide the disoriented toward safety."

Among other valiant acts, the chaplains gave up their life jackets so others could have a better chance of survival.

After the commemorative ceremony, Chaplain Hanson asked Ms. Weaver if she would be willing to design a monument in honor of the Four Chaplains.

The artist was "pleased and honored," she said, as she not only had images in mind as she listened to the story but also has a longstanding personal connection with veterans.

"I am the daughter of a Marine who served in WWII, a daughter-in-law of a Sailor who served in WWII, the niece of an Uncle who was KIA [killed in action] in WWII, the wife to a former Army Captain, and the mother to a son who was an Army helicopter pilot and another son, an Army Ranger who gave his life for his

country," Ms. Weaver said. "I am a Gold Star Mom."

Ms. Weaver stated that she believes the monument is important because chaplains play an important role in all branches of service.

"I am sure that every person in the military who has undertaken a difficult assignment or a war assignment has experienced the compassion and humanity of a chaplain," Ms. Weaver said. "As a Gold Star Mom, I certainly have."

Ms. Weaver noted that her work on all three monuments has been pro bono.

Youth program ends with free concert

BREVARD COUNTY — After spending a few weeks learning how to play instruments, students of the Melbourne Municipal Band's Summer Youth Program are ready to share their progress in a concert open to the public.

The free concert is scheduled to take place at 6 p.m. on Thursday, July 12 at the Melbourne Auditorium, 625 E. Hibiscus Ave.

After 11 years of managing the Summer Youth Band, Art Martin is stepping down and passing the role of leadership to Kurt Schulenburg.

Mr. Schulenburg is the conductor of the New Horizons Band of Melbourne, and is a professional saxophone, trumpet and piano player. He was also an associate conductor and soloist with the Crystal Lake Community Band in Illinois for 20 years.

"I know I'm leaving it in very good hands," Mr. Martin said of Mr. Schulenburg. "It's been fun for 11 years, and yes, I'm going to miss the kids, but it's time

that I retire and let someone else handle it."

Mr. Martin said he plans to spend his future summers traveling with his wife. Meanwhile, he will still conduct Swingtime, the 22-piece big band ensemble of the Melbourne Municipal Band, throughout the year.

"Kurt has been working with me this year and I've been showing him the ropes of what I've done in the past 11 years," Mr. Martin said. "We've [also] played together in a few bands."

Mr. Martin founded the Summer Youth Program program in 2007 after receiving a \$10,000 grant from the Police Athlete League of Melbourne.

When Mr. Martin first began the program, there were only a handful of beginner to intermediate students to work with. During this past summer, 118 students from sixth to 12th grade have participated in beginning and intermediate stages.

"They're doing very well," Mr. Martin said. "They're a real nice group of kids and they work hard. It's really going to be a fantastic concert."

Fourth of July food, let's celebrate with chili mac

Le's talk about the long Fourth of July weekend we are enjoying. On the Fourth of July 1776, the Second Continental Congress unanimously adopted the Declaration of Independence. It would be 100 years later that Congress passed a law making Independence Day a federal holiday June 28, 1870.

So what did our founding fathers eat on July 4, 1776, to celebrate the birth of our country? The City Tavern in Philadelphia would have been the place, but unfortunately there is no record of the menu eaten to celebrate that very special day.

The food of the times would have been baked or poached salmon, turtle soup, local seafood, salted meats, pickled tongue, wheaten bread, and lots and lots of beer and spirits. The founding fathers loved their spirits!

Over the years, the July 4 traditions would evolve and take shape into a picnic celebration for family and friends. In the early 1900s, fried chicken, potato salad, watermelon and the hot dog ruled the day.

In the late 1940s, suburban living took hold, and with the introduction of charcoal grills, outside grilling was the method of celebrating. Cooking over cheap grills wasn't a great way to cook because most of the food was burned and still not cooked thoroughly.

The world of grilling would be changed forever, when in 1952, George Stephen, a welder for Weber Brothers Metal Works, cut a metal water buoy in half. Using the top and bottom and adding vents, he created a grill with even cooking and sealed in the flavor. I guess that is why we eat 150 million hot dogs and 750 million pounds of chicken on the Fourth of July.

That's all great and wonderful, but my

favorite is something the Navy and Marine Corps cooks prepare on the Fourth of July - Chili Mac. Now that's a real celebration in taste for the Fourth of July. Chili Mac also went to the moon with the astronauts. Try my Chili Mac, you'll love it. The Chili by itself is pretty good, too. Just leave the macaroni out and serve over mashed potatoes or one of those millions of hot dogs!

Enjoy and celebrate again this weekend. Happy Fourth!

CHILI MAC - 10 PORTIONS

Ingredients

2-1/2 pounds ground beef
3/4-cup chopped onions
2-1/4 teaspoons kosher salt
1-1/4 teaspoons ground pepper
2 teaspoons dry oregano
2 teaspoons ground cumin
3 teaspoons dry Chili powder
1 small can (16-18 ounces) tomato puree

1 small can (16-18 ounces)
crushed tomato
1 cups elbow macaroni
1/2-cup butter
1 cup chicken stock

Directions

Place meat, onion, salt, pepper, oregano, cumin, chili powder and chicken stock in cooking pot and cook over medium heat for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add tomato puree and tomato paste. Simmer on low heat for 30 to 40 minutes. Taste and season with salt and pepper if needed.

Cook macaroni following package directions. Drain and set aside. When chili is ready, add cooked macaroni and mix with butter. Top with some grated cheddar cheese to make it even better!



SUNTREE — This summer, Brevard Zoo is offering visitors a chance to keep cool and stay active from its children's water area to Treetop Trek.



Paws for a cause: Training camps are a 'go'

BREVARD COUNTY — Service dogs aren't like normal house pets; they're hardworking caretakers of their owners, and need to be approached accordingly.

On July 9 and July 30, Paws for Veterans will be offering up their 2nd Annual Junior Dog Trainer Summer Camp, which helps children learn basic dog training skills and behavioral tactics.

Paws for Veterans is a group that is dedicated to providing service dogs for veterans, as well as spreading awareness of service dogs.

The JTC is designed for children and teens, ages 5-17, which will train in separate groups according to age. Groups will be led during the week-long camp by certified professional service dog trainers.

"Kids will learn everything [with] age appropriate dog training skills, such as how to teach dogs to sit, lay down, come, stay, walk on a leash, bring and drop items

and toys, [etc.]," Paws for Veterans officials stated. "Friday afternoon, at noon, we will have a demonstration [time] for the kids to proudly show their parents all they learned."

Throughout the week, 'campers' will be participating in JTC sessions from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Parents are advised to send their child with a lunch, water bottle, and a snack.

Participants are encouraged to bring their own dog, with proper shot records and proof of spay/neuter, to be turned in before camp begins on Monday. All dogs must be on flea and tick medication, as well.

Required shots are:

Rabies

Distemper

Lepto

Parvo

Bordetella

Influenza

The camp is designed to not only be fun, but also informative for campers.

"Our [JTC] began as a way to introduce children between the ages of five to 17 the basic need-to-know of handling dogs and how to behave around dogs that you know, [you] don't know and service dogs for the safety of the community," said Siara Callahan Administrative Office Manager at Paws for Veterans. "With any pet you don't know, just running up to a dog could result in a severe accident if the dog is not friendly; many children and adults will [often] approach our service dogs, petting them without asking their handler for permission. A service dog is more of a caretaker than a pet in many aspects. They are working dogs."

Paws for Veterans is a nonprofit organization, and the JTC provides 100 percent of benefits to training local service dogs for veterans.

"Not only does this camp provide life-long information about dog handling and service dog knowledge, but it also helps provide the monetary value that it takes to buy training supplies, dog food, dog treats, dog beds, vet visits etc., all so that the veterans don't have to pay a single penny for their service dog," said Ms. Callahan. "By the end of [owner and service dog acclimation training], the owner experiences what their service dog can do for their life. You can see in their eyes that their life has changed, from that moment on, and to say it is a rewarding experience to see is an understatement. This organization does wonders, and we are eager to

Melvin retired in September 1987 from Consolidated Freight Trucking, where he worked for 27 years as a truck driver.


On September 19, 1953, he married Betty Scott in South Bend, IN. She passed away on March 10, 1998.


