Florida Tech alumna to launch from U.S. soil

MELBOURNE — The Florida Institute of Technology has long been at the forefront of science innovation and so has its alumni.

One alumna, Sunita L. Williams, who earned her Master of Science in Engineering Management in 1995, has been selected for the first mission to the International Space Station on Boeing's Starliner capsule, along with astronaut Josh Cassada. The date of the mission has yet to be determined.

Ms. Williams joined NASA in 1998 and has since flown a total of 322 days in space on two shuttle missions.

"This public-private partnership marks the beginning of a new era of human spaceflight," NASA officials said regarding the Boeing CST-100 Starliner. "NASA has worked closely with Boeing and SpaceX as the companies design, develop, and test their systems to ensure safe, reliable and cost-ef-

fective commercial transportation for astronauts to low-Earth orbit. This will be an unprecedented achievement for the commercial space industry, and will allow NASA to focus on deep space exploration with NASA's Orion spacecraft and Space Launch System, as we return humans to the Moon and on to Mars."

The Starliner launch marks the first human launches from U.S. soil since 2011.

"Today we are taking a step that advances our great American vision and strengthens America's leadership in space," said Jim Bridenstine, NASA Administrator, in a NASA press release. "These accomplished American astronauts, who will fly on new spacecraft developed by our commercial American partners Boeing and SpaceX, will launch a new era of human spaceflight."

Melbourne launches recycling program

MELBOURNE — The city of Melbourne has launched a new, personalized outreach program called Curb Contamination, to help residents understand changes in Curbside Recycling.

Due to recent changes in recycling and waste management, items such as plastic bags can affect the recycling process, and cannot be accepted in the recycling bin.

"Plastic bags are by far the most common item found that shouldn't be in the carts," Melbourne officials stated in a press release. "While the bags can be recycled at many grocery stores, they are not acceptable in curbside recycling carts. Plastic bags get tangled up in the machinery at the recycling facility where Melbourne's recycling goes for processing."

"In addition, Waste Management can no longer accept clam shell containers, the type that hold strawberries and salad mixes, and has never accepted polystyrene, such as egg cartons," officials added.

The Curb Contamination program involves routine checks on recycling on Wednesday mornings, which is recycling day throughout Melbourne. If there are any incorrectly placed items, homeowners will be notified with an informational door-hanger.

According to Waste Management officials, there have been four rounds of surveys so far, resulting in 375 carts being checked; of these, around 62 percent of them had items that didn't belong in the carts.

"I think a lot of the contamination is from 'wish cycling,'" said Michelle Smith, the City's Environ-



Superintendent shares goals for school year

BREVARD COUNTY — During the summer break, Brevard County School Board members convened to select a new superintendent for Brevard Public Schools.

Dr. Mark Mullins was voted in on June 12, and he has since transitioned from his previous role as deputy superintendent. “Being able to service as the superintendent in this district, where I started as a teacher, is really a phenomenal honor,” Dr. Mullins said.

In an interview with Hometown News, Dr. Mullins described his experience with changing career tracks from banking and finance to education, and shared his goals for the upcoming school year.

“I’m somewhat of a second-career educator,” he began. “I moved down here after my wife and I got married; She’s a ‘Brevardian.’ We were also working with our church and youth group, mentoring kids. Just as I continued my education and the joy of working with young people and helping them find their path, that led me to math education.”

Dr. Mullins then attended Florida State University for his bachelor’s degree, followed by earning his master’s and doctorate degrees in educational leadership from the University of Central Florida.

“When I was looking for a job, Brevard County came to the table and offered me an opportunity to come teach here, 24

years ago,” Dr. Mullins said.

He served as a math teacher for Cocoa Beach High School in 1994, eventually moving on as assistant principal at Palm Bay Magnet High School and Southwest Middle School, then principal at Clearlake Middle School and area superintendent for the south region of the district.

“That’s the joy of teaching, seeing kids discover and really light up about the opportunities for their own future,” Dr. Mullins said. “The leadership and dedication of our teachers, staff and our leaders is amazing. [They have] such passion, such conviction to serve our kids with excellence.”

Throughout his experience working with Brevard Public Schools, Dr. Mullins said that time has taught him that, “Brevard takes care of Brevard.”

“We’re only the 10th largest school district in the state, but we’re the second highest financial contributor to a United Way campaign,” Dr. Mullins said.

He added that he’s amazed to see more than 750 businesses and organizations in the community contribute to helping Brevard Public Schools.

One such organization is The Children’s Hunger Project, which provides weekend meals for elementary school students who would otherwise go without eating until back at school on Mondays.

“We’ve got some great initiatives that really are on the eve of launch that I’m very excited about,” Dr. Mullins said. “Clearly,

our safety and security initiative will be a priority this year to ensure that we meet the needs of our students’ and staffs’ safety in a very strong and focused way.”

Earlier this year, Brevard Public School worked with local law enforcement agencies and

the Brevard County Sheriff’s Office to create a security plan for schools.

With the help of the BCSO, drills will be implemented to train students and staff on how to manage and respond to an active shooter situation.

Each Brevard Public School in the new school year will see the addition of a law enforcement officer or armed presence as part of the new security measurements.

“Another [initiative] is our expansion and enhancement of mental health support for students,” Dr. Mullins said. “We’re going to be adding several social workers to our staff this year, or have added, that will be supporting our schools across the district.

“We’ve also added school psychologists,” he continued. “We’ve contracted with some of our counseling agencies right around us to provide counseling services to our kids. Our guidance offices and our risk assess-

ment teams will continue to evaluate our students who may need to be referred and provide some additional support.”

Some other new hires include additional instructional assistants to support guidance offices.

“We’ve really taken a holistic approach to helping our students recognize that they’ve got support right at school,” Dr. Mullins said. “We can provide them support outside of school, and they have vehicles to communicate when and where they may need some additional assistance.”

Brevard Public Schools will also expand the utilization of the Speakout hot-line through local law enforcement. The Speakout hot-line was launched last year and can be reached by calling (800) 423-TIPS (8477).

One other initiative includes continuing to recruit high quality teachers and workers to join Brevard Public Schools.

“We need virtually every skilled type of worker across the district from trades to four year degrees, in the classroom but also outside the classroom,” Dr. Mullins said. “We want the best and the brightest coming to teach here and lead our kids to their futures. We will continue working on competitive compensation.”

Brevard Public Schools was ranked No. 2 among Florida’s 14 large districts in 2017 for overall student achievement, and No. 2 for college and career acceleration.

paper, you can vote with confidence knowing that you have chosen the best candidate for the job with knowledge, not emotion.

A reader recently suggested that voting for Gwen Graham offered a great opportunity for Florida voters to elect the first woman to office. Voting for someone based on their sex, race, religions, sexual preference, etc. is one of the stupidest ways to pick a candidate. Why? Easy answer. You cannot guarantee the positions of a candidate on any of the pigeon holes that you place people in. For example, while one woman is pro-choice, and totally support laws that all abortions are paid by tax-payers, another is pro-life and support all abortions should be outlawed. A divorced woman would support laws for alimony for life but a woman believing that divorce should be a rare event would support laws that make divorce difficult to obtain.

All candidates may be for reforming our judicial system, but that could mean two very different things. One could be for mandatory sentencing, while the other could be for the judge to have total control of the sentence.

Read the candidates' websites.

Complete candidate research, then ask: Does Florida need this? How are we, as taxpayers, going to pay for it? Is this something that is possible to accomplish and at what expense, like loss of freedom (government telling us how to raise our

kids, being forced in using solar energy) or loss of jobs?

My best research is talking personally with the candidate. If a candidate knocks on your door or approaches you in a public place, be prepared to ask questions.

A school board candidate approached me and asked me for my vote. I knew he was for raising teachers' salaries and lowering class size. I asked him why all teachers? How high do you plan on raising salaries? To keep up with what others are paying; then when will you stop? All classes? What is the perfect class size number and why? How do you attract the best teachers, but first, how do you define the best teachers? Some teachers are great for one type of student but bad for others, how do you determine that and how do you accomplish getting the right students to the right teachers? The candidate answered a couple of questions with vague answers, ignoring my request to be more specific and then walked away.

Do your research, ask questions, and vote intelligently, not for a woman because you are female, or a Hispanic because you are Hispanic, or a straight person, because you are straight, or for a Lutheran, because you are Lutheran but because the candidate is the best person for the job. After the election, whether your candidate is the winner or not, remember the school board member, state attorney, governor, sheriff, mayor etc. is your elected candidate. Support that person, but be vocal in letting him know when he is doing a good job or screwing up.

"When my husband goes in the kitchen



MELBOURNE — After 10 years of providing professional orchestral music to Brevard County, the Space Coast Symphony Orchestra announced the formation of the Space Coast Symphony Youth Orchestra.

Auditions are just around the corner for those aged eight to 20 years old, providing an opportunity for young, rising musicians to be a part of the popular music community.

dents six to 14 years old with at least one year of experience. Students will be developing first position on their instrument in this orchestra.

For this audition, students must prepare one solo and one scale of their choice. Tuition fees for the Academy Orchestra are \$175 for the 2018-19 school year, or \$100 plus 20 volunteer hours.

The Symphonic Orchestra is open to students aged 10 to 17 years old with two or more years of experience and the maturity to participate in a full orchestra. Students will continue to develop first and third positions through keys of three sharps and three flats.

For this audition, students must pre-

pare one solo, perform sight reading and scales. Tuition fees for the Symphonic Orchestra are \$225 for the year or \$150 plus 20 volunteer hours.

The Philharmonic Orchestra is open to students aged 12 to 20 with more than three years of experience, and have a highly proficient technique and are capable of the discipline necessary to perform at the highest level.

Students must prepare one solo, perform sight reading, and perform major and minor scales. Tuition fees for the Philharmonic Orchestra are \$275 for the year or \$200 plus 20 volunteer hours.

Senior defeats cancer, competes in CrossFit

BREVARD COUNTY - It's important to keep active as your body ages, whether that activity is through bicycling, walking, yoga, or sports.

For Brevard resident Ken Ogden, keeping active meant celebrating his 64th birthday by competing in the 2018 CrossFit Games in Madison, Wis.

"CrossFit has an annual world-wide competition that starts with the CrossFit Open the end of February," Mr. Ogden explained. "It consists of one different workout a week for five weeks. You are ranked each week worldwide. For the 60 plus Masters division, the top 200 advance to the Masters online qualifier which takes place mid-April. You are required to complete four different workouts over four days, and they must be videoed and judged. After that, the top 20 athletes are then invited to the

CrossFit Games in August located in Madison, Wis."

Mr. Ogden trained at CrossFit OwnIt in Melbourne, where he practiced for the CrossFit workouts by doing exercises like hand stand pushups, burpees, chest-to-bar pullups, wall ball shots, rowing, thrusters and front squats.

Not only did Mr. Ogden battle to compete in the 2018 CrossFit Games, he was also fighting a different battle: cancer in his cheek.

"After I was diagnosed with squamous cell carcinoma on my left cheek, my doctor's recommended radiation treatments; [there would be 30 treatments], once a day for six weeks," Mr. Ogden said. "The treatments were to start about the same time as the CrossFit Open. I continued to work out and compete. The doctor would tell me that I might experience fatigue and would ask me each week if I was experiencing any. I would tell him I just finished a hard workout,

so yes I was pretty tired. Some days I might have been more tired than usual, but not enough to stop the workouts.

"My gym family and coaches were always there to encourage me," Mr. Ogden added.

Fifteen supporters followed Mr. Ogden to Madison to watch him compete in the CrossFit Games. He competed in a number of events, including the Open Water Swim event, where he placed fourth.

To add to his successes, Mr. Ogden's cancer treatment was successful, and he now lives cancer-free.

"I love the challenge of working on something and I'm failing and failing and failing and failing, and then I get it," Mr. Ogden told CrossFit officials. "As you get older, you can still learn new things."

Mr. Ogden's home gym, CrossFit OwnIt, is located at 100 Southwest Irwin Ave., No. 5, in West Melbourne.
