Veteran, firefighter crowned Samoan high chief

BREVARD COUNTY — Volunteer firefighter, retired Army officer and chainsaw artist, Jay Palepoi Mauga, recently returned from his coronation ceremony or Soifaiini Sapapalii Savaii in the Samoan Islands. Mr. Mauga was crowned Muaausa, a high chief title from the Sa Malietoa bloodline. Two years ago, celebrity Dwayne Johnson also received his chiefly title of Seiuli from the same Malietoa bloodline.

Muaausa Mauga is the descendant of two royal bloodlines. His great-grandfather, Paramount Chief Palepoi Mauga, was one of six recognized chiefs to sign the treaty that annexed Samoa as a territory of the U.S.

Muaausa Mauga's coronation ceremony stretched over two days filled with traditional song, prayer and speeches from the sitting chiefs of the existing families and host villages. Eight families gathered and presented roughly five nominations for various positions that needed to be occupied. Lower chiefs, not from

the royal bloodline, lined up outside the ceremonial Fale (traditional Samoan hut) to present gifts and pay respect.

Approximately 1,000 people congregated along the outskirts to listen and take pictures. Custom dictates that everyone who attended the ceremony be served a meal, so a bounty of food was prepared, including bananas, breadfruit, fish, corned beef, rice, chop suey noodles, chicken and sausage. A number of pigs were also sacrificed.

The chieftain receives a title, land and attends to matters of significance to the larger family. The position means that he is a permanent servant to his family and their representative to preserve, protect and honor the Samoan Way or Fa 'Samoa. It also secures the lineage for his children and preserves the title for his family, Muaausa Mauga said.

The chieftain hopes to represent Samoans who reside in Florida as well as their culture. Both his island roots and artistic abilities are showcased through his chainsaw carvings.

Orchestra to debut new youth musicians

MELBOURNE — A group of talented, young musicians will take the stage for the first time under the direction of professional concertmasters and conductors as part of the rising Space Coast Symphony Youth Orchestra.

The group formed in August with the assistance of the Space Coast Symphony Orchestra, and has since grown to 98 members between the ages of eight to 18 years old.

"Fanfares and Salutations" is a free concert with no ticket required. It is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 4 at Highland Avenue Fellowship, 1591 Highland Ave., Melbourne.


"We wanted to introduce the ensembles to the audience through a musical dialogue of fanfares and emotional greetings as we venture on a new musical journey," said Maestro Mark Nelson, who will conduct the advanced Philharmonic Orchestra. "Our selections evoke a spirit that is uplifting and stirring. The music sparks feelings of optimism and pride."

Students have been divided into three musical groups based on age and experience level.

The Philharmonic Orchestra will open the concert with an upbeat "Festive Overture" by Dmitri Shostakovich. The Academy Orchestra's beginning string players will be led under the direction of Carey Moorman, who serves as Academy Orchestra Director. Intermediate players of the Symphony Orchestra will be led under the direction of Samantha Ferber, orchestra director at Heritage High School.

The evening will also feature Antonin Dvorak's Ninth Symphony "From the New World," which was written after Dvorak's visit to America.



Senior Living offers one-of-a-kind memory care

BREVARD COUNTY — It's no secret that Brevard County is the place seniors want to live, and to accommodate senior living, a resort-like community is on the rise in Suntree.

Chateau Madeleine Senior Living & Memory Care offers one and two luxury bedroom apartments designed to help seniors age in place with independent and assisted living. It is a pet-friendly and non-smoking facility, with many amenities.

One of these new features includes a 325-square foot custom designed "multi-sensory therapy room" for residents with Alzheimer's, dementia or other memory issues.

Inspired by a Dutch-designed multi-sensory environment known as a "Snoezelen," this specially created space will engage residents with bubble tubes, color-changing fiber optics, laser stars, solar projects and a GestureTek Cube, which projects images to stimulate the imagination.

"Seniors with Alzheimer's, dementia and other memory related diseases see the world fragmented; they experience isolation, confusion and sensory deprivation," said Yvette Jenkin, director of sales and marketing at Chateau Madeleine. "The Snoezelen therapy room will help seniors by stimulating the

primary senses like hearing, touching, smelling and seeing."

Mrs. Jenkin further added that the therapy room can accommodate up to three residents at a time under supervision, and residents will typically spend 15 to 30 minutes inside the room.

"It also helps with calming seniors with dementia [and] Alzheimer's when they are stressed," she continued. "It provides a great environment for bonding between seniors and the therapist and family members."

Family members can help in the comfort of their loved one's sensory therapy session by providing photos or videos of a resident, which can be implemented by projections on the walls.

"There is a concept with this room called 'sensory magic,'" Mrs. Jenkin explained. "When a resident in memory care comes in, a therapist will do an assessment, which will let us know what their life was like. Were they raised and spent most of their by the ocean? Or maybe it was on a farm or in the city, or up in the mountains. So, based on that we will input all this information on sensory magic and every component in the room will make them feel like they're back in that experience."

The Snoezelen therapy room will be the first of its kind in a memory care

setting in Brevard and Central Florida, according to Mrs. Jenkin.

Chateau Madeleine is currently in the pre-leasing stages. It is anticipated to open by early 2019.

The community living offers three chef prepared meals daily, transportation, LOX hair salon, a movie theater and lounge bar included in a monthly rental price.

Licensed health care professionals are available 24-hours and remain on-site to provide emergency response monitoring and peace of mind for residents and their families.

Muaausa Mauga carves tikis, totems and other types of art as a method of treating the post-traumatic stress disorder and severe depressive disorder he was diagnosed with after returning from his second deployment to Afghanistan in 2005. He uses his artistic skills to combat the psychological and physiological effects he experiences. His artwork can be viewed on Instagram at Broken_Warrior_Designs.

“Carving wood with a chainsaw is like meditating for me and helps me reflect my inner emotions and express what I can no longer convey through words alone,”

he said.

Muaausa Mauga enlisted in the Army from American Samoa in 1989 and earned his commission in 1993. His career culminated with the California Counterdrug task Force and he retired in 2009 after 21 years of service as a Field Artillery officer with a Joint Services functional category. Today, the high chief serves as a volunteer firefighter and lives in Indialantic with his wife and three children. He decided to join the department so that he could invest in the community, get to know its residents and because he missed the adrenaline of serving in the Army, he said.

“I’m thankful for the opportunity to share the Samoan culture with the readers. It is such a different world and way of life that I was raised in,” he said.

Orchestra to perform tribute to Pulse victims

BREVARD COUNTY — The Space Coast Symphony Wind Orchestra will perform a Pulse Tribute and “The Lord of the Rings” during the next concert in their 10th anniversary season, which will take place on Nov. 3 at 7 p.m. in Suntree.

Space Coast Symphony Orchestra Artistic Director, Aaron T. Collins, welcomes composer and guest conductor Joshua Hobbs for the symphonic tribute to the Pulse victims.

“Joshua Hobbs’ moving work is one we all felt strongly we needed to perform,” Mr. Collins said. “We are pleased that he will be conducting the piece himself, which will feature the outstanding horn player, Juan Berrios. I believe the audience will also be captivated by the stirring first symphony by Johan de Meij, ‘The Lord of the Rings.’ He was inspired to put Tolkien’s story to music decades before the movies were ever conceived.”

Virtuoso horn player from the Dallas Brass, Juan Berrios, will join SCSO to perform “Many Hearts One Pulse.” The piece was composed by Joshua Hobbs as an elegy for those killed in the Pulse Nightclub tragedy. On June 12, 2016 a gunman killed 49 people and wounded 53 others in an attack inside the Pulse nightclub in Orlando.

“I’m reminded of the famous quote by Danish author Hans Christian Andersen, ‘When words fail, music speaks,’” Mr. Berrios said. “The chance to move and help people through our art and music-making is exactly why we hone our craft as musicians. I’m

beyond humbled and honored to take part in presenting a work that embodies hope, peace and healing for all those affected by the tragedy that took place at the Pulse night club in Orlando.”

Performing this piece for the Pulse victims and survivors means a great deal to Mr. Hobbs as well.

“Two friends of my family tragically lost their lives in that terrorist attack and so many people were affected,” he said. “I hope that this piece can help the survivors find solace and continue to move forward in their lives.”

Mr. Hobbs wanted to honor the 49 Pulse victims in some way, so he incorporated a time at the beginning and at the end of the composition when the piano (beginning) and vibraphone (ending) repeats one note 49 times in a row.

“I knew that the arc of the piece was going to begin with despair and end with hope,” he said. “As I wrote the piece, I was very conscious of the tone of the music. It was a terrible tragedy, so while the music should reflect that at times, I didn’t want the piece to only inspire those dark thoughts. I wanted to, above all, pay respect to the victims and survivors.”

Even the piece’s title, “Many Hearts One Pulse” reaches for Mr. Hobbs’ goal. The title refers to the huge, spontaneous up-welling of love, support and solidarity for the victims and their families from the Orlando community and across the nation. Ultimately, Mr. Hobbs stated that he hopes that piece will reflect both the intensity of grief and power of empathy.

The concert will also feature Dutch composer Johan de Meij’s first symphony, “The Lord of the Rings”. Inspired by the literary work of J.R.R. Tolkien, Mr. de Meij composed the work in 1988 that made him world renowned as a top composer for wind orchestra. The program also includes Frank Ticheli “Angels in the Architecture” and Joshua Hobbs “Into the Blue.”

“I have been wanting to perform Johan De Meij’s Lord of the Rings Symphony for many years now,” Mr. Collins said. “The opportunity presented itself and I jumped all over it. It is an immense work that is one of the most popular for wind bands all over the world. It is cast in five movements/scenes that are very descriptive. I think the audience will fall in love with this work.”

The Pulse Tribute and “The Lord of the Rings” concert will take place on Nov. 3 at 7 p.m. at the Scott Center for the Performing Arts at Holy Trinity Episcopal Academy, which is located at 5625 Holy Trinity Drive in Suntree.

Advance tickets are \$25 for adults and are available through the orchestra’s website www.spacecoastsymphony.org or at the orchestra’s new official Brevard ticket outlet: Marine Bank and Trust in Suntree. Tickets are \$30 at the door. The concert is free for those aged 18 and under and those with stu-

Scouts to pick up food for Second Harvest

BREVARD COUNTY — As residents begin to ponder what dishes to prepare for Thanksgiving and what they should be thankful for this year, there are others who live among us that are struggling to have enough food for one meal a day.

Central Florida Scouts will spend the weekend putting up door hangers throughout neighborhoods in Brevard, informing residents about an annual food drive that will benefit Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida.

The door hangers will have information printed in English and Spanish. Local troops from Boy Scouts of America will collect non-perishable food items on Saturday, Nov. 10.

"They used to tie a bag to the door and you would fill up the bag. It was kind of wasteful, I think, with some of the bags that didn't get used," said Paul Yelvington, assistant scoutmaster for Troop No. 757. "This is the second year they've done it without bags at the door."

All residents have to do, according to Mr. Yelvington, is leave non-perishable food items outside of their door or anywhere that is convenient outside the house. Scouts will come by to collect it between 9 a.m. and noon.

The Central Florida Council of Boy Scouts of America aims to collect 500,000 pounds of food. Second Harvest Food Bank helps feed people in Orange, Seminole, Osceola, Lake, Brevard, Volusia and Flagler counties.

"They've been successful in the past, and it keeps the shelves stocked food at the food pantries for months, well into next spring," Mr. Yelvington said. "It's something that happens across the country, too."

"It doesn't look like it's making a difference, but it actually is," Luke said. "It's a silent way to help."

"One of the challenges of the food drive is getting into gated communities," Mr. Yelvington said. "A majority of these neighborhoods are not accessible to troops, despite its mission to help those in need of food."

Community members in gated neighborhoods who would like to donate can bring non-perishable food items to a local Second Harvest location or local food bank.

Hackathon aims to craft lagoon solutions

BREVARD COUNTY — You know an event will be busy when the weekend schedule starts with a midnight snack and then moves directly into workshops all night until breakfast at 7 a.m.

For the first Indian River Lagoon Hackathon, organizers mean business. From 5 p.m. Nov. 2 through 2 p.m. Nov. 4, The Indian River Lagoon National Estuary Program and Melbourne-based Groundswell Startups will work all day and through the night to discover and plan implementation of solutions to the biggest environmental problems facing the Indian River Lagoon.

The Indian River Lagoon is the most biodiverse estuary in North America. It is home to thousands of plant and animal species. Scientists call the lagoon “the ocean’s nursery,” as it serves as a spawning ground for hundreds of species.

Due to decades of pollution, aggressive algal blooms, over-development, and the introduction of invasive species, the lagoon is sick and, according to the Indian River Lagoon National Estuary Program, “is no longer the biological powerhouse it once was.”

Hackathons bring together tech enthusiasts, students, entrepreneurs, and professionals of all ages from diverse industries to

identify and solve problems through technology, hopefully in the course of one weekend. Hack the IRL is designed to inspire real tech solutions for the serious issues plaguing the lagoon, with mentors and hackathon veterans guiding participants while encouraging new thinking and innovation.

Knowledge of coding is not required, but is helpful.

Attendees will work in groups of no more than four. Singles are welcome, as a mixer will be held to form teams early in the program.

All food will be provided free, with plenty of meals, snacks, and coffee.

Bring a laptop and any other equipment or hardware you think you might want to use. Mentors will help realize your ideas with web, mobile, hardware, design, and development assistance.

What would I do if I were a senior?

If I were a senior, and I am, how would I answer the title of today's article? That depends on who you are asking, but read on to find my answer.

For the first 25 years of my life, I was either in school or an enlisted person in the Navy. While a student I was most concerned about rabbit and squirrel hunting (meaning skipping eighth period), playing sports, acquiring a summer job, and dating pretty girls. Politics certainly was not a priority. For the next 30 years I served as an officer in the Navy and, while I participated in national elections, local politics was still not a major factor in my life.

Now that I am well past those first 55 years, politics interests me more, especially as it affects seniors or caregivers. Since working as an advocate for seniors, I better understand the forces aligned

against seniors trying to survive their golden years with dignity. And, as a retired Captain, I can best describe these challenges using some military terminology.

Navigating a minefield, whether it be at sea or ashore, is fraught with danger. I remember spending 30 anxious days in the Vietnam War on a submerged patrol next to an enemy minefield. Thinking back to those times, I can well imagine the anxiety that some seniors experience when they have little food in the pantry,

electrical bills several months behind, or the water about to be shut off. Do you think I am making this up? I am not, for I have listened to seniors telling me these very things in Brevard County.

We just handed out thousands of pounds of candy on Halloween. At Thanksgiving, we will eat huge amounts of food and donate to food pantries, Daily Bread, Meals on Wheels, and sharing centers to feed the homeless or families in need. But what about the thousands of seniors in Brevard that do daily battle just to survive? Homelessness, poverty, inadequate housing, and no transportation are a real and present danger to seniors in our county.

These things all exist, so what are our county leaders doing about it? In a county that ranks seventh highest in the U.S. in terms of number of seniors, are our

elected officials developing a plan for seniors? The Advocacy Council of Helping Seniors identified such factors in a paper to the Brevard County Commissioners in 2016, wherein they outlined the development of a County plan to meet the rapidly increasing numbers of elders in Brevard.

As you decide how to cast your vote in the forthcoming election, consider what it will mean to seniors if we do not address needs to which seniors are entitled. I do not mean a handout, rather a well conceived plan to care equally about people of all ages, especially seniors who are frail, disadvantaged, and unable to care for themselves. If I were a senior, I would think a little with my ballot and vote for those willing to support seniors and others who need help.

Power Day to give those with Parkinson's hope

BREVARD COUNTY — Each year, a new wave of people are diagnosed with Parkinson's disease, a chronic and progressive movement disorder that continues to worsen with time.

According to the Parkinson's Disease Foundation, nearly a million people are living with Parkinson's disease in the U.S. The cause is unknown and the cure has not yet been discovered.

In an effort to better support those newly diagnosed or are living with Parkinson's disease, One Senior Place has partnered with the Parkinson's Support Group of Brevard to promote a day of strength and hope with "Parkinson's Power Day."

The free event is scheduled to take place from 10 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday, Nov. 5 at One Senior Place, 8085 Spyglass Hill Road, Viera.

Lunch will be provided by Courtenay Springs Village of Merritt Island.

"There are a lot of people in the community with Parkinson's and they often go unnoticed," said Barbara Fradkin, social worker and referral specialist at One Senior Place. "People with Parkinson's often will not admit they have the disease. The disease becomes a large part of who the person is, and no one wants to feel that they are not in control of their body or mind. There are so many resources out there that are not known and this community of Parkinson's patients is the

most educated, outgoing and best advocates that I have ever seen."

Parkinson's disease affects 3,000 residents here on the Space Coast, according to officials, and it is often developed in men and women between the ages of 50 and 60 years old.

Symptoms of Parkinson's disease includes tremors or shaking, often in a hand, arm, leg, jaw or face; stiff, weak or aching muscles' and difficulty with walking and balance.

Ms. Fradkin, who also co-facilitates a monthly Parkinson's Support group, explained that the idea behind Parkinson's Power Day started when she was looking for speakers who could educate her group.

"Florida Hospital has a wonderful Parkinson's Outreach program and they offered to come and do two of their programs here in Brevard County," Ms. Fradkin said. "I thought that it was a great way to educate not only the newly diagnosed, but those that have had Parkinson's disease for a while and just needed some more education."

Three main topics will be covered by experts and health care professionals during the event.

Anissa Mitchell, Licensed Clinical Social Worker from Florida Hospital Parkinson's Outreach Center, will provide a primer for newcomers titled, "Parkinson's Disease 101."

Anne Curtis, Registered Drama Therapist and Certified Trauma Services Specialist will present "CHEER UP: Creativity, Humor, Education, Encouragement, Resilience & a Greater Understanding of Parkinson's."

Fitness trainers Janice Moia and Courtney Henderson of Advance Fitness will inform and demonstrate for participants the "Rock Steady Boxing" exercise program available at Advance Fitness.

"The first steps to take after a diagnosis of Parkinson's disease is to find a doctor that you are comfortable with," Ms. Fradkin said. "You will need to work closely with that doctor to find a treatment plan that offers you the greatest relief from symptoms with the fewest side effects."

"Be honest and upfront with your care partner," she continued. "Make sure you express your feelings, and look to support systems that will work for you. Depression is very common with people diagnosed with Parkinson's disease. Find a support group that you can go to and share. The members of the support groups are very open with each other and like to share their happy and sad times with Parkinson's disease."

There are four Parkinson's support groups that currently meet in Brevard.

Parkinson Support at One Senior Place meets the first Monday of each month from 10 - 11:30 a.m. at 8085 Spyglass Hill Road.

Brevard Parkinson Support Group meets the fourth Thursday of each month from 1:30 to 3 p.m. at The Fountains, 4451 Stack Blvd., Melbourne.

North Brevard Parkinson Support Group meets the third Thursday of each month from 2 to 4 p.m. at Parish Health Village West, 931 N. Washington Ave., Titusville.

Cape Canveral veteran graves receive wreath

BREVARD COUNTY- The holiday season may be weeks away, but Cape Canveral Wreaths Across America volunteers are hard at work raising donations to ensure that all 4,600 veterans interred at the cemetery have a wreath placed upon their grave this coming December.

This is the third year that the organization is holding a wreath-laying ceremony, but they still need sponsors for approximately 3,000 wreaths.

"In 2017, we were able to honor all 2,600 veterans interred," said Betty Jo Green, location coordinator for Wreaths Across America Cape Canveral National Cemetery. "The projected rate of need per national cemetery each year is a 30 percent increase. The cemetery is projecting our need for our ceremony on Dec. 15 to be 4,600 wreaths to remember and honor each veteran at CCNC."

The organization has 10 volunteers who help with fundraisers throughout the year and 25 who assist with staging the wreaths for the ceremony.

"We need many more volunteers interested in fundraising throughout the year," Ms. Green said.

The organization invites school groups, Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps members, scouts, youth groups and adults to join in laying the wreaths, Ms. Green said.

According to the Wreaths Across America website, this nationwide effort to honor our country's veterans had a humble beginning. In 1992, the organization's founder, Morrill Worcester, donated surplus wreaths to an older and less frequented section of Arlington National Cemetery in Washington D.C.

The effort grew with each passing year and spread to more and more states. According to the Wreaths Across America website, their mission became to remember our fallen veterans, honor those who served, and teach our children the value of freedom.

In 2008, Congress voted to make Dec. 15 National Wreaths Across America Day. Each year on that date, Wreaths Across America performs wreath-laying ceremonies at 1,400 locations in all 50 states, at sea and abroad to express appreciation for our veterans and See WREATHS, page 17

American Legion hosts veteran celebration

BREVARD COUNTY — The American Legion Riders Chapter 1 in Titusville will host a Veterans Day celebration on Nov. 11 from 1-4 p.m. The event, which will help raise money for veteran charity organizations, will also include a raffle for a custom-made chopper that was donated to the ALR.

Tickets for the bike, which has only 35 miles on it, cost \$20.

The ALR will split and donate all profits made from the auction to both the National Veterans Homeless Support and the Missing in America Project.

The NVHS is a non-profit dedicated to finding housing, employment and aid to homeless veterans. According to their website, the program is responsible for “training groups of volunteers to go out into the woods and parks to find and help homeless veterans with food, tents, housing, getting in to the VA system, and connecting them with other resources in the community.”

“I believe that when they started the organization eight years ago there were over 1,500 homeless vets in Brevard,” Mr. Pannier said. “I think there are only about 50 now.”

The Missing in America Project is a

nonprofit organization that helps to locate, identify and inter the unclaimed remains of American veterans with the help of private, state and federal organization.

At their June service, the MIAP escorted the remains of a veteran whose urn was found discarded and found at a rest stop along 1-95 in Mims.

“Those remains were found in a cleaning cart at a rest area in Mims. We don’t know how they got there,” said Kathy Church, Florida State Coordinator for Missing in America Project. “They were turned over to another veterans organization who held them for many years and then we were contacted.”

Seventeen veterans will be interred on a Nov. 3 ceremony at the Cape Canaveral National Cemetery. Among them will be a Korean War female veteran as well as veterans from World War I, World War II and the Vietnam War.

This will be 17th service for Missing in America Project in the state.

The ALR will escort the hearse with ALR director, Brad Parsons, as ride leader.

“The Riders escorted about 55 remains a few months ago,” Jay Pannier, Second Vice of the Legionnaires and Secretary of the American Legion Riders **CELEBRATION, page 18**

Weekend ceremony to mark milestones

BREVARD COUNTY – Along with recognizing the contributions of U.S. service members this Veterans Day, an upcoming event at the cemetery located at 1143 Day St. will mark some significant milestones.

For one, the event – a Veterans Day ceremony beginning at 10 a.m. Saturday, Nov. 10 – will be held just as the nonprofit organization Friends of the Cemetery moves toward completing its major refurbishment of the site.

The nonprofit, which is hosting the ceremony, began the refurbishment project in 2017 and is now finalizing three of four planned phases, with the fourth phase focused on maintenance and upkeep.

Second, Nov. 11 marks the 40th anniversary of the cemetery’s founding.

Among other activities, the ceremony agenda will include patriotic music, speakers and the unveiling of a new cemetery marker that tells the story of two army veterans, Col. John D. Howard and 1st Sgt. Arthur I. Rice, who were instrumental in the site’s founding.

“I am excited about the coming to

the end of the restoration of the Veterans Cemetery,” said Sam DiBlasio, president, Friends of the Cemetery. “This has been an incredible journey. I could not have done this without the wonderful volunteers and donors.”

The volunteers included two scouts, Dylan Benson and Wyatt Webster, who also worked on milestones of their own while participating at the cemetery, Mr. DiBlasio noted.

In addition to raking and otherwise helping to clean up the site, the scouts each designed, developed and built large projects there: Dylan created a paver walkway and Wyatt worked on a beautification project surrounding cremated graves.

As a result of their respective projects, Dylan received an Eagle Scout Award and Wyatt is in the process of receiving one.

“Both scouts are awesome young men,” Mr. DiBlasio said, “a credit to their families and the community. I was honored to have mentored them [through] their eagle scout process and project.”

The cemetery is currently in need of Bahia sod and sprinkler system work, Mr. DiBlasio noted.

Warbird Air Museum to hold open house

BREVARD COUNTY — On Nov 10-11 the Valiant Air Command Warbird Air Museum in Titusville will host a Veterans Day open house. Past and present military veterans, their families and Florida residents will receive free admission to the event, which will feature flybys, aircraft static displays, memorabilia, classic cars, radio-controlled airplanes and model trains and planes.

Event entertainment will also include a petting zoo, pony rides and a jungle gym. A local radio control relay club will bring desktop flight simulators for children to fly and the RAT Patrol Club will have military vehicles, such as jeeps and command cars, on hand. Car and motorcycle enthusiasts will also find vehicles on display courtesy of corvette, truck and antique motorcycle clubs.

During the open house, combat veterans will be standing by the airplanes they flew while they served.

"There's an opportunity for the public to talk to the military pilots who actually flew these aircraft," said Bob Boswell, Valiant Air

Command Warbird Air Museum executive officer.

Aircraft flybys will take place each day of the open house between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. The aircraft will land and park on the ramp so visitors can view them. A couple of airplanes will also be giving rides.

The museum volunteers invite open house attendees to reflect on our nation's heritage, look at the aircraft on display and take in how they were designed, built and flown.

"Each year, we have an annual Veterans Day open house and it's primarily to honor military veterans who served in the United States Armed Forces," Mr. Boswell said. "We want to recognize military veterans who served and recognize the sacrifices that they've endured to basically keep our country free."

Mr. Boswell has volunteered for this event for 20 years and noted how it aids the museum in accomplishing its goals to honor veterans, educate the public and thank the community for the support they provide for all of the museum's program and projects throughout the year.

"We really want to express our apprecia-

tion to the communities, the residents, the leaders...that's why we open it up to the Florida residents at the same time, so they can see an educational, informative and fun event at minimal cost," Mr. Boswell said.

Museum volunteers are preparing to welcome approximately 2,000 attendees during the Veterans Day open house, which is about twice their average number of visitors. Planning for the event began about nine months ago. Hundreds of volunteer hours have been poured into organization, preparation and aircraft restoration to make sure the event goes off without a hitch.

The finishing touches are being put on a new Boeing B-52 Stratofortress cockpit exhibit. The B-52 cockpit is one of only a handful in America that is open to the public. Attendees can go inside and see where the bombardier, navigator and pilots worked. Museum volunteers have spent the last year refurbishing the B-52 cockpit in a 26,000-foot restoration hangar where they restore static displays. The team has also brought some aircraft back to flying status in that hangar, including the museum's flagship, Tico Belle.

Museum volunteers are already preparing for their next event, the Annual Space Coast Airbird Warshow, which will be held March 15-17. The spring airshow will feature North American P-51 Mustangs, Curtiss P-40 Warhawks, Vought F40 Corsairs and fireworks.

The Warbird Air Museum Veterans Day open house will be held on Nov. 10-11 at the museum, located at 6600 Tico Road in Titusville. Attendees are invited to bring a non-perishable food donation for a local food bank. For more information visit www.valiantaircommand.com.

MELBOURNE — World War I was a global war that shook each nation as alliances were made and treaties were formed. In commemoration of the end of “The Great War” in 1918, the Melbourne Municipal Band is hosting a special tribute performance for the centennial anniversary.

The Veterans Memorial Center Museum aims to collect, preserve and display artifacts of the military history of the United States. The center displays a special emphasis on Brevard County veterans, in order to educate the community and inspire present and future generations with the military's service and sacrifice, according to officials.


