## Council member challenges Goudie for mayor

PONCE INLET — Seat 1 Council member and Mayor Tony Goudie will be challenged in November's election by a familiar face to him — Current Seat 5 council member Jack Sturno.

Ponce Inlet elections are town-wide, and not based on zones or districts, so residents can run for any seat.

Mr. Goudie has served on the Council since 2002. He was Vice

Mayor in 2004. He moved from the Seat 2 position on the Council to the Seat 1 position and became Mayor in the last election.

Mr. Goudie has served as the Ponce Inlet representative to the Volusia Council of Governments and served on the council's executive committee in 2007 and 2008. He has also served in several capacities for the Florida League of Cities from 2006 to 2009.

Mr. Goudie served as the Chair for the Land Acquisition Advisory Committee and is a former member on

the Board of Adjustments. He served as a member of the Visioning Task Force in 2001 and 2002.

Among his accomplishments, Mr. Goudie cites his leadership during the town budget review that created a reduction in taxes in excess of \$1 million and reducing the property tax rate from \$4.17 to \$4.03.

As Director of Facilities Opera-

tions for Embry Riddle Aeronautical University, Mr. Goudie said he is responsible for the develop-



## City offers grants for business beautification

SOUTH DAYTONA — If it's not pretty, they won't come.

That's the philosophy behind a city program to help some business owners beautify their properties.

Businesses located in the city along the U.S.1/South Ridgewood Ave. corridor can now receive matching grant money of up to fifty percent to improve the exteriors of

their properties through the city's newly funded Façade Improvement Grant Program.

"We offer the façade improvement grant to businesses located along South Ridgewood Avenue in our CRA to improve the appearance of this important commercial corridor as well as assist business owners in making an investment in their business and our community," said Patty Rippey, redevelopment director for the city. "An

improved exterior appearance in commercial buildings can help attract more shoppers and increase sales for our local businesses."

The city will match up to \$5,000 per individual business and up to \$15,000 for multi-storefront properties. Monies can be spent for improvements such as landscaping, planters and irrigation or structural façade improvements such as new awnings, paint, stucco, masonry and signs and windows.

Funds will be provided as reimbursement upon the completion of pre-approved projects.

Businesses that wish to participate in the program should contact Ms. Rippey to learn more about what is required for participation and to obtain an application form.

Commercial properties represent a little more than 50 percent of the total geographical area of the city

## Local hospitals, doctors face conversion to electronic records

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Thick, messy patient charts, hard-to-read physician orders, duplicated procedures — these will someday be things of the past as hospitals and physicians convert from paper to electronic records in coming years, hospital officials say.

It will be an enormous project for health care providers costing billions of dollars. Local hospitals say they are well on their way to meeting the standards while local physicians are at various stages in the conversion.

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act has a "Hitech" provision to encourage the health care industry to convert to electronic medical records, said Lori DeLone, chief information officer at Halifax Health.

There is a timetable for health care providers to achieve certain goals beginning next year and to

become fully operational with electronic medical records by 2015. The goal, according to ARRA documents, is to improve safety, quality and efficiency in health care.

The ARRA provides penalties as well as incentives for meeting the deadlines for electronic medical records.

Ms. DeLone said providers, both hospitals and doctors, will receive bonus payments for Medicare and Medicaid patients beginning in 2011 if they are on schedule for conversion.

In 2015, she said, providers will be penalized in terms of Medicare and Medicaid reimbursement if they have not met the EMR standards.

Ms. DeLone said health care providers face a massive undertaking.

She said there are tens of thousands of providers, both hospitals and physicians, in the country and

## Town urges participation, caution for 2010 census

PONCE INLET — The 2010 Census has now begun and the Town of Ponce Inlet wants residents to know how to determine that it is in fact a federal census employee at their door or on the phone so that residents can feel confident in answering their questions.

Here is some information to be aware of as the census workers begin their door-to-door canvassing in the area. Census workers will carry a badge, a hand held device, a census bureau canvas bag, and a confidentiality notice. Residents should ask the workers for badges and identification before talking to them.

Census workers will not ask for social security numbers, bank account numbers, credit card numbers, or any specific account information.

Census workers will not solicit for donations — do not give anyone any money.

Census workers will not contact residents by e-mail — do not respond to anyone claiming to be with the U.S. Census by e-mail.

Census workers will not ask to come into a home and residents should not invite them.

Responses to the 2010 Census are important to the financial future of the town, so take the time to answer census questions, but they strongly encourage residents to use the information above for their protection.



## TV star Shroyer visits area man

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Ormond Beach resident Ralph Campbell, 70, is a man of many interests.

During a lengthy career in the banking industry in West Virginia and since his retirement to Florida, he accumulated a wide range of memorabilia of his favorite things and an even wider range of friends, many made as he rode his bicycle for exercise and recreation.

Now sidelined with illness, Mr. Campbell has often reminisced with family and friends about the enjoyment he got from the "Dukes of Hazzard" television series and the spin-off series "Enos," built around the adventures of "Enos Slate," the bumbling deputy of the Dukes.

So when Mr. Campbell's caregivers of Vitas Innovative Hospice Care learned that actor Sonny Shroyer, who played "Enos" and has appeared in many other movies, including "Forest Gump" and "The Longest

Yard," was to appear at Port Orange Family Days last weekend, they made contact to see if Mr. Shroyer might look in on Mr. Campbell.

After a long day of signing autographs at Family Days, Mr. Shroyer headed to Ormond Beach to sign what he said was the best autograph of the day — adding "Enos" to the hood of Mr. Campbell's model of the Duke boys' car, "The General Lee." In full "Enos" uniform, Mr. Shroyer posed with Ralph while Mr. Campbell's nieces snapped pictures that will become treasured family memories.

Mr. Shroyer not only left autographs, but got one for himself when Mr. Campbell signed a picture commemorating the 34,340 miles of cycling he documented while wearing out three bikes.

"It's a blessing to me to be able to visit with great people like Ralph who've made my career possible and who make our country such a wonderful place," Mr. Shroyer said.

"maybe one percent" have converted to electronic medical records. She estimated an initial cost of \$36 billion for nationwide conversion.

Ms. DeLone said Halifax Health began converting to electronic medical records in 2002 and there are many advantages.

"When a health care worker is with a patient that is when they are making decisions," she said. "Having all the current information immediately available to them (with a computer) allows them to make the right decisions."

She said a good example of electronic records enhancing patient safety at Halifax Health is Bedside Medication Verification.

In this procedure, she said, a bar code on the medication and a bar code on the patient's wrist band are verified by the computer to make sure the medication matches the patient.

Ms. DeLone said they are ahead of schedule for meeting the federal deadlines.

Karen Rodriguez, director of health information and compliance for Florida Hospital Memorial Medical Center, said the hospital currently has an electronic record system and is "well positioned" to meet all federal deadlines.

"The problem with a paper record is that only one person can use it at a time," she said. "Electronic records can be used a multiple locations."

Information in the computer carries over multiple visits for continuity of care, Ms. Rodriguez said.

"If a patient has an allergy, and perhaps forgets to tell you, the allergy will show up as an alert on the computer," she said. "Also, you can see if a test has been performed and have immediate access to the results. This reduces the

chance of repeating tests, which saves cost and improves efficiency."

The Hitech provision contains security standards for privacy, Ms. Rodriguez said.

"There's a lot involved in encryption of data and there are safeguards all along the way to prevent unauthorized people from getting into the system and also each program," she said.

Local doctors also face federal deadlines.

Barry Mayer, office manager for Dr. Craig Miller of Ormond Beach, said their office is "two-thirds there."

"Dr. Miller has been using electronic records since 2001. When you come in our office you don't see any paper charts," he said. "We expect to get new

software next spring and we'll be completely up-to-date with the new standards."

Other doctor offices are still using paper.

"We haven't started yet," said Judy Driscoll, officer manager for Dr. John C. Cullen of Ormond Beach. "We know we're going to have to convert eventually."

Ms. Driscoll said she heard from other doctor offices that the cost would be from \$20,000 to \$30,000 to scan the current paper records into a computer system.

Ms. Rodriguez said the goal at Florida Hospital is to have all associated physicians converted over to electronic medical records in the third quarter of next year.

but generate less than one-quarter of the tax revenues because commercial property values have been stag-

nant for many years while residential property values have increased, according to information provided by the city.

The City's cost of providing services to the commercial areas has exceeded

the tax revenue generated. The City's goal is to increase the valuation of the taxable property without increasing the tax rate by improving the appearance of the U.S.1/Ridge-wood corridor. The recent

removal of overhead power lines and pending sidewalk and other right-of-way improvements are, in part, to help achieve that goal, according to city documents posted on the CRA Web site.

## School bus driver retires after 34 years

**VOLUSIA COUNTY** — After 34 years of transporting her “precious cargo,” Louise Fink parked her school bus in the terminal for the last time Oct. 1.

She retired after driving 730,000 miles for Volusia County Schools without a preventable accident and receiving several top awards.

Along with the miles, she logged many memories, including the smiles of special-needs children and the excitement of chasing a man fleeing the police.

Ms. Fink was named Volusia County Bus Driver of the Year in 2003 and both Florida Bus Driver of the Year and National Bus Driver of the Year in 2007.

In 1992, she was certified by the state to train other drivers for their commercial drivers license.

Ms. Fink was one of a kind, said Chip Kent, assistant director of operations for school transportation for east Volusia County.

“She was involved in all aspects of our department

from helping develop our training program to mentoring new drivers,” Mr. Kent said. “She set an example for others to follow and cared deeply about the students she transported.”

Ms. Fink said driving a school bus is a big responsibility.

“You cannot replace what I transport,” she said. “I think about that every time I get behind the wheel. If you’re a driver and you have problems you better forget them and pick them up when you get off.”

For the last few years, Ms. Fink drove a bus for special needs children in Ormond Beach.

“These were my favorite years out of all 34,” she said. “They appreciate everything you do for them. If you put a smile on their face during the day it makes your day. It really touches you.”

Ms. Fink was known for her safety initiatives and served as Volusia County transportation safety officer for several years, responsible for investigating accidents and problems at bus stops.

All others opposed this motion. Then Carl Persis made a motion to go to a millage rate of 4.9 mills. This was voted on and the ones that approved this millage rate were Mr. Persis, Mr. Hayman and Mr. Kelly. All others opposed this rate.

It is apparent that Carl Persis, Andy Kelly and Jack Hayman "get it" and they are a true voice of the citizens of this county and of those that spoke up against the budget. Please e-mail these councilmen and thank them for their efforts.

# Is it time to redefine poverty?

The U.S. Census Bureau released its latest figures on poverty this past week. No surprise, it has increased.

It is at an 11 year high of 13.2 percent, or 39.8 million people. The poverty rate for children is at 19 percent. In Central Florida this equates into just over 100,000 kids.

Local schools are reporting large increases this year in the number of children who are attending and are homeless.

The Merriam-Webster Online Dictionary defines poverty as: "The state of one who lacks a usual or socially acceptable amount of money or material possessions."

This definition is fairly subjective, and relatively speaking, can put a lot of people into the same boat.

The U.S. government's definition of poverty is stated in different terms and is based on a 50-year old formula of three times the typical food bill and doesn't take into account the rising costs of medical care, transportation, child care and housing expenses.

The U.S. poverty rate for a family of four equates into approximately \$21,000 of annual income. Do the math; you cannot make ends meet, even when you have income as an under-employed person — if you're fortunate to have a job. And based on how the unemployment rate is calculated, we are given a skewed picture, it's actually worse. Some government

calculations report it close to 17 percent.

The typical American household made less money last year than it made a decade ago, according to new figures from the Census Bureau. Economic growth in the current decade has been slower than in any decade since before World War II. Income inequality also expanded. There are now more than 2.1 million people in the state of Florida receiving Food Stamp benefits as opposed to just over a little over 1 million two years ago.

After Hurricane Katrina, the former head of FEMA commented, "We're seeing people we didn't know existed" in reference to the overwhelming poverty in the Gulf Coast. The comment was somewhat prophetic because today, in this slow moving disaster of economic meltdown, many people who didn't imagine themselves out of work and money are seeking help for basic human needs. It took a while for them to surface because of pride, embarrassment, and even shame. People can only hold out for so

long, eventually they need to eat. These are people at the poverty level, up to 150 percent of that level, including blue collar and some college-educated white-collar workers.

The top three requests for emergency help through the 2-1-1 Call Line are utilities assistance, rent, and food. At Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida, our partner feeding programs are experiencing increases for food ranging from a "low" of 30 percent upwards to 400 percent. We're distributing at or near disaster relief levels. The major increase in demand is driven by first time users of the food assistance system. Existing recipients are benefiting from our services more frequently.

The Central Florida community has come together in the past during disasters, we can do it again. While poverty may or may not need to be redefined, the current situation certainly shows a whole new added population- needing help.

Martin Luther King said, "The time is always right to do what is right." Please consider helping any number of local non-profit organizations providing basic human needs during this slow moving economic disaster. To paraphrase Merriam-Webster's definition of poverty, it's socially unacceptable to have so many people in need of basic human services; especially the kids.

## Shores, Ponce Inlet offer unique attractions

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Daytona Beach Shores is a small community with 4,500 residents but it is capable of hosting up to 30,000 visitors during special events like Bike Week.

The city is also home to the Shores Spa Resort and Hotel and the Living Legends of Auto Racing Hall of Fame Brick Walk.

The Living Legends of Racing Inc, is a non-profit organization that oversees the Walk of Fame located at 3050 South Atlantic Ave.

The bricks are dedicated to former great racing pioneers and highlights the area's racing legacy.

"The history of the whole racing thing started here," said Olin Hopes, a member or Living Legends of Auto Racing. "It started up in Ormond back and reached Daytona by the (19)30's then came down in this area in the (19)40's. The sport went inland in the 50's when the Speedway was built."

Many great racing legends are commemorated in the bricks, including William 'Bill' France, Mad Marion MacDonald, Rapid Roy Hall, Ethel Flock Mobley, Vicki Wood, James Jerome 'Red' Voigt and more.

"If you are a racing fan it's nice to see," Mr. Hopes said. "People don't realize

that where City Hall sits at in the Shores is part of the old race track and grand stand. AIA was also part of the old track. It all had to be moved basically because people could not make it to their homes."

The group also runs the Living Legends of Auto Racing Museum located in the Sunshine Park Mall in South Daytona.

The Shores Spa & Resort is the Daytona area's premier resort and spa. It offers luxurious rooms with spectacular views of Daytona Beach, the Atlantic Ocean and Intercoastal waterway.

"We have a 10 story luxury resort and spa that is Daytona's only four diamond hotel. It is really an unexpected luxury," said Susan Keavbney, the resort's marketing director. "Actually we have a lot of locals who live in Port Orange, Daytona and Ormond come take advantage of our Indulge Spa and Azure fine dining restaurant."

The resort contains warm hues, Italian marble restrooms, pillow top beds and chic furnishes. Rates start at \$109 per night.

"It's really a cool and fun undiscovered hang out space," Ms. Keavbney said. "It is refreshing and quiet and at this time of year we are not as busy, so locals

can really take advantage."

Just south of the Shores, in Ponce Inlet, is one of the state's most recognizable attraction — The Ponce de Leon Inlet Light Station, located at 4391 Peninsula Drive. It stands 175 feet and is the tallest lighthouse in Florida. It is also the second tallest masonry lighthouse in the nation.

The 203-step structure attracts 175,000 visitors a year. Admission is \$5 per adult and \$1.50 per child under 11. It opens every day at 10 a.m. Closing times vary per time of year.

Today the structure con-

sists of the tower and a museum with memorabilia and historic facts on the lighthouse and the surrounding community.

The lighthouse was constructed in 1883 and opened in 1887 as the Mosquito Inlet Lighthouse, which was the name for the surrounding area. The Lighthouse name changed in 1927 when Mosquito Inlet was renamed Ponce Inlet.

Kerosene lit the structure up until 1920 when a generator was installed making the transition to electricity.

In 1998 the structure

became a National Historic Landmark. The Ponce Inlet Lighthouse Preservation Association maintains and runs the structure.

"Those who visit will see on of the largest collections of lighthouse optics in the world," director of operations Mike Bennett said. "The Lighthouse also gives visitors a sense and feel of what life was like at the turn of the century for Florida's coastal residents."

Marion Dickerman, a bus driver attendant, said that Ms. Fink started the Turtle Patrol to help prepare elementary students for riding the bus for the first time.

"There were 10 adults in the patrol. We danced and did skits," she said. "We let them know where to stand and other things for safety. Louise started that and a lot of other safety-related improvements."

Ms. Fink said the day she helped a Daytona Beach policeman catch a fleeing suspect in 1989 was a very memorable day.

"I was driving the bus and I saw a policeman running after a fellow and the fellow was getting away. I opened the door and motioned for the policeman to get on. As we caught up to the fellow the officer hung out the door with his gun, yelling 'Hit the ground, hit the ground.' Then he jumped out of the bus and caught the guy."

Ms. Fink said she never found out what the crime was but she got a nice letter from the chief of police at the time, Paul Crow.

Ms. Fink saw many changes since she started driving a bus in 1975. The most noticeable change, she said, was the loss of respect for the drivers from both students and parents.

"They don't realize what a big responsibility we have," she said. "We have to concentrate on driving as well as all those students behind us," she said.

Ms. Fink said a bus driver must draw a fine line between being too strict and too nice.

"You have to communicate. I tell them I have rules and procedures to follow," she said.

Ms. Fink said a driver needs a lot of patience in dealing with students, but there are also special moments.

"Sometimes there's this little person who comes in and brings you some flowers he picked along the road," she said. "That just really tears you up. I'm going to miss that stuff."

Ms. Fink said she recommends school bus driving to any parent or retired person who loves children and wants the summers off.

"I'll sure miss everyone," she said, "especially my precious cargo."

Vicky Beeman knew Ms. Fink for 12 years and recently was her attendant.

"She always strived for perfection," she said, "and all the children liked her."

indicate the family had been on their radar for years. Jeremiah Reese had been dead for several hours before his 14-year-old friend Max Wilhelm went to a neighbor's home for help. Wilhelm was also sickened after taking some pills, now believed to be Oxycontin, but Wilhelm will recover after days in the intensive care unit. Police said they found Jeremiah dead on the couch, surrounded by all kinds of narcotics and smoking and snorting materials. The father, 52-year-old Michael Reese, was either asleep or drugged himself, according to police and unaware

what the boys were doing Friday night and all day Saturday. Over the years, DCF has investigated the Reese home six times, but a spokesman said based on the findings each time, the cases were closed. That's despite the fact that according to DCF, the father was getting his Oxycontin prescription from Veterans Administration and sometimes trading it for cocaine. The report shows that Jeremiah had taken pills to school to sell to kids with his father's full knowledge and shows a DCF awareness of the father's drug abuse. The mother of Max Wilhelm, who nearly died with Jeremiah is relieved the father is now facing a criminal charge, but Cheryl Wilhelm doesn't

think it's stiff enough. She said Michael Reese not only regularly endangered his own son, but hers as well when he went on an overnight she assumed would be supervised by a responsible adult.

**Man turns himself in after bank robbery**

A man who police say robbed a bank in Port Orange called 9-1-1 and turned himself in about 30 minutes later. Investigators said Tony Olea Jr., 42, implied he had a weapon at the Colonial Bank on Village Trail and made off with a bag of cash that included a dye pack. Olea later gave himself up in that 9-1-1 call and police found him in New Smyrna

Beach. He had to be medically treated because some of the dye got in his eyes. During the 9-1-1 call, Olea said he did it because he is desperate. He said he has no job, lost his home and can no longer support his two children.

**Four girls nearly overdose on campus**

Four middle school students had a close call when according to officials, the eighth graders from New Smyrna Beach middle school overdosed on campus. A teacher noticed the girls acting strangely and sent them to the clinic. Investigators now say one girl brought at least three different

types of medication to school and shared it with another girl, who in turn shared it with two others. Two of the girls were taken by ambulance to the hospital, while a parent drove a third girl, and a family doctor treated the fourth. Two of the girls are facing distribution charges, which could result in being expelled from school, while the other two face charges of possession.

**Edgewater man accused of fondling underage girls**

An Edgewater man is accused of trying to fondle two underage girls. Police said Christopher Guidry,

44, assaulted the girls while they were sleeping on a couch at a home on Woodland Drive. Guidry is charged with lewd and lascivious acts on a child and child abuse.

**Man steals copper**

A Volusia County man is facing charges after he was caught red-handed with a bunch of copper wire. Deputies caught David McDonald, 35, on his bike with the copper stuffed in a bag he was carrying. They said he stole the copper from a Verizon cell phone tower site on Cow Creek Road in Edgewater. An alarm went off, alerting deputies who got there in time to see McDonald riding away.

**Common Occurrences and Treatment Strategies for Low Back Pain**  
By Dr. Joanne Eash

Chronic low back pain (LBP) costs Americans more money and time off work than any other nonfatal health condition. It is the number one cause of limited activity in persons under the age of 45. An episode of low back pain may resolve within 4-6 weeks; however, many times the first occurrence of low back or neck pain will lead to future, more frequent and more severe episodes. The good news is, over 95% of the time, the causes of LBP are musculoskeletal in nature and not life threatening. Less than 2% of spinal pain is caused by true disease, like cancer or infection. This article will discuss the most frequent causes and treatments for low back and neck pain.

The most "serious" non-fatal manifestation of LBP is probably a herniated disc. This is a relative term and may be called different things depending on the level of herniation. Disc injuries can occur for many reasons; most commonly, trauma, auto accidents, heredity or natural causes. Typically, if the spinal disc exudes its internal material into the spinal canal, surgery is usually imminent. (Fig. 1)

There are other common conditions of the spine that create LBP. Muscular sprains cause considerable low back pain. Practically every muscle in the back or neck can cause pain if provoked into spasm. Everybody has heard of the person who said, "I bent over to pick up the paper and BAM! I couldn't even stand up!" This type of LBP is very common and is caused by an error in the firing pattern of specific muscles of the back; simply stated, if the "mover muscles" fire before the "stabilizer muscles", then painful back spasms may result. Spinal joint fixations that coincide with muscular sprains or spasms are common perpetuating factors in ongoing LBP or neck pain. Manipulation of spinal joints (or any fixated joint) by a chiropractic physician is a safe, effective, and economical treatment for low back pain or joint pain.

As age advances, patients tend to consult a chiropractic physician for painful, degenerative conditions. Spinal degeneration is common and may be accompanied by decreased disc height and boney overgrowth of the spinal vertebra. Canal stenosis is indirectly caused by this boney overgrowth, as the space for spinal nerves and vessels is considerably decreased. Symptoms may include centralized spinal pain with possible radiation down the legs, inability to walk even moderate distances and pain that is relieved by sitting or leaning forward (walking with the aid of the grocery cart). These degenerative conditions may occur in any joint of the spine, and are often treated by chiropractic physicians using conservative manipulation, therapeutic exercise and specific dietary changes. 

## Internet coupons: the case of the confused cashier

Has this ever happened to you? You finish filling your cart with the week's groceries, head to the checkout lane and place your items on the conveyor belt. The cashier announces the total and you hand over a nice stack of coupons. Then, the cashier pauses. You hear the words, "I don't think we take coupons from the Internet." The cashier hands them back to you and you ponder what to do next.

While most of my shopping trips run very smoothly, occasionally even your Coupon Queen encounters a cashier issue or two. So what do we shoppers do?

One of our biggest tools to deal with checkout problems is the store's coupon policy. Most stores have a written policy that states exactly how they handle

coupons presented in the checkout lane. Many stores post the policies on their Web sites and others have a copy at the customer service counter in the store itself.

What's in a coupon policy? Information that shoppers can use to better plan our shopping trips. Coupon policies state specifics such as, we accept Internet coupons, we accept expired coupons or we accept competitors' coupons. Everything we need to know about what kinds of coupons our stores should accept is spelled out for us right in the store's policy.

Armed with this knowledge, well-informed shoppers know exactly what coupons our stores should accept. The most commonly heard issue with cashiers does involve the store's

acceptance of printable Internet coupons.

If you're told the store does not accept them, ask to see a copy of the store's coupon policy. Most grocery stores and supermarkets do accept Internet coupons that are legitimately printed and are not photocopies.

Unfortunately, due to the rise in coupon fraud, stores are getting more stringent about the kinds of Internet coupons that they will accept. Most legitimate Internet coupons contain a unique ID or barcode identifiers and several other key features that stores use

to ascertain a coupon's validity.

And any time the Coupon Information Corporation, a nonprofit organization that monitors coupon fraud, identifies a new, counterfeit coupon, it sends stores an alert to watch for coupons known to be fraudulent or counterfeit.

However, when a fraud alert goes out, sometimes it has a ripple effect.

Our stores learn that a new counterfeit coupon has been spotted in circulation. Instead of homing in on the specific coupon mentioned in the alert, some cashiers may find it easier not to accept any Internet coupons. This not only hurts shoppers, it hurts stores, too, since the large number of Internet coupons are legitimate and perfectly fine for the store to accept.

Marketers reimburse stores for the full value of every coupon shoppers redeem, whether the coupon ran in the newspaper, appeared in newspaper inserts, was found on a product package or was printed legitimately from the Internet.

Would you like another piece of the cashier/coupon policy puzzle? I've heard from many cashiers that they get very little training on their store's coupon policy. This puts coupon-savvy shoppers in an unusual situation. It's possible that you may be more familiar with a store's coupon policy than the cashier is. If you find yourself in this situation, never force the issue. Simply ask the cashier to check the store's policy with the manager. You can politely

let the cashier know that you've read it to make sure that all of the coupons you're presenting are acceptable.

A cashier issue most likely stems from a little confusion that isn't the cashier's fault at all. A cashier who questions your coupons may simply be trying to protect the store and do what they believe is right. We'll continue to discuss commonly heard cashier coupon issues in the weeks ahead.

**H**ello smart shoppers. This week it's back to mom's old cookbook. Chicken breasts, when on sale, can feed an army for practically nothing. And, by adding a gourmet touch, every entree is different and delicious. Mom was constantly entertaining and knew that well.

Boneless chuck steak or round steak are steals, especially when they're offered buy one, get one free. These recipes are basically one-pot meals. They are easy and can be prepared in advance.

Years ago, upscale Italian restaurants in New York City always offered tortoni, a creamy ice cream-like confection for dessert. While looking through the cookbook, there it was. It's high fat and cannot be changed, but for special occasions it's a must have. Enjoy. See you next week.

## CHICKEN WITH ARTICHOKES (NIB) serves 4

One 15-ounce can

artichokes  
2 large boneless, skinless whole chicken breasts (a whole breast has two lobes), split  
3/4-teaspoon salt  
1/4-teaspoon each of pepper and paprika  
1-2 tablespoons Canola oil  
4 tablespoons butter or 1/4-cup butter substitute  
1/4-pound fresh mushrooms, thinly sliced  
4-1/2 teaspoons flour  
1/3-cup chicken broth  
2 tablespoons sherry

Drain artichokes well, halve and set aside. Sprinkle chicken with spices. In a large skillet brown chicken in oil for about 5 minutes, turning once. Place side by side in baking dish.

In small saucepan, sauté mushrooms in butter or substitute; cook for 2 minutes. Sprinkle with flour, stirring constantly. Add

broth and sherry; stir until thickened. Mix in artichokes and pour over chicken.

Cover and bake at 350, 35-45 minutes.

## STEAK PIZZAIOLA (NIB) serves 4

Italian beef steak pizzaiola is a delicious, easy, oven pot roast. Fresh or canned tomatoes may be used. I prefer fresh tomatoes when the price is right. I will give you both versions.

2 pounds round steak or chuck steak  
2 large ripe tomatoes sliced 1/2-inch thick, and 1/2 cup water, OR  
One 28-ounce can Italian whole tomatoes with liquid (crushed)  
3 large cloves garlic, sliced  
1/2-teaspoon oregano  
Several sprigs fresh Italian parsley, chopped, or 1 teaspoon, dried  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/2-teaspoon black pepper

Trim meat of all visible

fat. Place in metal baking pan, broil on each side in oven until browned.\* (This step will add color and flavor). Remove from oven, set controls to 350 degrees, bake.

If fresh tomatoes are used, place all over top of browned steak. Top with remaining ingredients, cover with foil and bake for 1-1/2 to 2 hours until meat is fork tender. Add more water if necessary.

If canned tomatoes are used, pour them over steak. Top with remaining ingredients and proceed as above. Do not add the 1/2-cup water.

\*Steak pizzaiola may be cooked on the stove top or in the oven. To cut the fat, I prefer the broiling method.

This is delicious served with rice.

## BISCUIT TORTONI (NIB) serves 12

Muffin pans (2-1/2 inches), enough for 12 Cupcake liners  
2 cups whipping cream

6 soft coconut macaroons, finely crumbled (1 cup)  
1/2-cup sifted confectioner's sugar  
Dash of salt  
1 tablespoon rum, light or dark  
1-1/2 teaspoons vanilla  
1/4-cup slivered almonds, toasted  
6 candied or maraschino cherries, halved

Double liners; place into 12 muffin cups. Combine 1 cup cream with macaroons, sugar and salt; chill 30 minutes. Whip remaining cream to soft peaks. Fold in chilled macaroon mixture, rum and vanilla.

Spoon into muffin cups, sprinkle almonds evenly over each, top with a cherry half. Cover and freeze until firm, 3 hours or overnight.

## AUNT JUNE'S FORGOTTEN COOKIES (DIVINITIES)

These cookies are light, low fat and delicious, not to mention easy to make.

2 egg whites  
2/3-cup sugar  
Dash salt (optional)  
1 cup chopped dates or chocolate chips, optional  
1 cup chopped nuts, optional

Beat whites until creamy. Add sugar and salt, beat until stiff. Fold in remaining ingredients. Line cookie sheets with aluminum foil. Drop batter by 1/2 teaspoons for small cookies (preferable), or whole teaspoons onto cookie sheet, spacing 2 inches apart. Preheat oven to 400 degrees for one to two cookie sheets, 500 degrees for three or four. Place sheets in oven, close door, turn oven off and forget about them until tomorrow morning or until oven is cold. Do not open door before oven is cold.

# Drum are skittish in the flats, so fish on the outer limits


Five months past the May rains and the water in the Halifax still looks like beef broth with no relief in sight.

In order to escape that mess, Al Houser and I took my little 16-foot Carolina Skiff down to the northern Indian River lagoon to hunt black drum.

We went to the same spot that Captain Leo had shown me the week before.

A school of big drum had been holding in a cove, and I was hoping to be able to find them again.

Once there, we sat quietly until the school surfaced about 200 yards away. They had moved some, but were still pretty much in the same

area.

If you have fished drum in deeper waters, you know that they are not a skittish fish. In fact, my preferred method is to anchor right over them and fish them straight up and down.

Fishing blackies on the flats is a totally different game. Once we spotted them, Al and I had to be ever so careful not to spook them. We laid aside our lure casting rigs and took up rods equipped with 3/0

circle hooks. We baited up with fresh dead shrimp and made sure everything in the boat was secured. The slightest noise and the fish would bolt.

I first used my electric motor then switched to the push pole to get into position to cast. The last 30 yards I allowed the boat to just drift over the 30 inches of water. When in place, each of us cast to the edge of the school.

When working a large school, it is always best to cast to the outer edge and try to get a fish to come out to your bait. That way, if you get a hook up you have a chance of playing the fish back toward you and disturbing the school as little as possible.

That works in theory, but when Al and I made a double hook up on our first casts mine was a real hog.

Fishing with a very light rig, I knew there was no way I would be able to assert my will on the fish, at least not for quite a while.

Once the battle was won, Al had a four-pound drum and mine was 11. The fight had indeed scattered the school, which must have been at least 50 fish.

We moved off hoping to give them time to regroup and began casting to the perimeter of the cove.

In short order, we had another double hook up. This time it was reds. Both were 25-inch fish with Al's coming

via dead shrimp and mine on my trusty chartreuse jig.

A little later, I jigged up a fat keeper trout and another red of 22 inches to release. The drum never gave us another chance, but the trip was a good one.

Despite the poor water quality there has been a pretty good shrimp run in the Halifax River.

The take has been sporadic, but the shrimp are nice sized. Up near High Bridge, I saw some netted that were as large as a 50-cent carrot. The best action has been near marker 23 and 33 with good catches coming from just a few yards south of High Bridge. Cast the center of the boat channel for best results.

Several of you have complained to me of missing the column either through lack of delivery or through misadventure. Find me on the net by searching Hometown News/Volusia and then hit "fishing" for current and back columns. If you go fishing or shrimping, be sure to take a youngster along whenever possible.

# Getting ready for the Anderson Cup

On the entry form, you can select your preference of starting time for the Saturday qualifier, with groups going out beginning at 7:30 a.m. The deadline for entry is noon on Tuesday, Nov. 3. Tee times for the 18-hole qualifier will be posted after 7 a.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 4.

Winners of each flight will receive gift certificates. The winner of the championship flight gets the prestigious Anderson Cup. Runners-up will also win prizes and perhaps bragging rights over their golf buddies.

The Saints features a fantastic clubhouse where, after their matches, golfers will be able to swap stories, while enjoying the full-service bar and grill. The restaurant is open well into the evening offering a full menu including steak, seafood and other favorites. Even non-golfers can find a relaxing spot to wait for their golfer to finish.

Mums the word for fall season

With Halloween, Thanksgiving and the holidays in the air, fall mums come to mind.

Garden mums come in many colors and styles, are a staple to the fall season and represent the end of summer and the onset of cooler days and evenings.

Mums are actually fairly easy to grow and can withstand both low and high humidity situations.

Mums can actually mimic the look of other flowers such as the smaller flower of a daisy (daisy mums) or the larger and fancier varieties that can almost look like roses.

The first batch of garden mums should be arriving in your garden center very shortly, so be sure to check frequently or ask an employee when they expect their first shipment.

Mums have been around for a long time and I am sure that many of you have helped your parents or grandparents display these colorful gems during the holidays.

About 80 percent of all garden mums are sold during fall and early winter. The reason these colorful plants burst into bloom in fall is because the shorter days, cooler temperatures and longer nights all contribute to the triggering mechanism that causes them to burst into color.

fertilizer such as Miracle Gro. It will also help if you stake your plants, as this will help them to support themselves and keep the heavy Florida rains from knocking them over.

If you plan on only using your mums as a potted decoration for the holidays, many of the same rules will apply.

Keep the plant in a bright, well-lit area of the house and do not let it get too dry between watering cycles. Remember that potted plants will dry out much faster than plants that are placed in the ground.

Once your plants have served their useful life as a holiday decoration, many people just choose to throw them away and plan on buying new next year, while others will choose to plant them and enjoy their color again next season.

If you decide to plant your gems for next year, simply choose a well-drained area that has some protection from the hot summer sun. Dig a hole about twice the size of the plants' existing root ball. Place the plant slightly below the original soil level of the pot.


