

Ponce Inlet appoints Planning Board chair to town council

PONCE INLET — Officials selected the chairman of the Planning Board to fill a vacancy on the Town Council for five months.

Gary L. Smith was appointed to Town Council Seat 3, which opened up when Tom Rutledge vacated the seat to become mayor following the resignation of Kris Derr.

Mr. Smith, 72, was one of six applicants to express interest in the vacancy, the third over the past six months. Prior to Ms. Derr's resignation last

month, Tony Goudie and Barbara Davis resigned their seats.

He will serve until Nov. 17, when a new council will be sworn in. Partly due to the temporary appointments, all five council seats are up for election; Mr. Smith told officials during the meeting he filed to run for the mayor's seat.

A full-time resident of Ponce Inlet since 2006, Mr. Smith has 40 years of professional experience, divided between the private sector and county government.

He spent 24 years working for several companies in land development

and construction positions and 16 years working for Broward County's Public Works Department, serving 11 of those years in the Environmental Engineering Division before becoming director of project management and construction.

Responding to a question from Councilman Don Romanik, Mr. Smith said the one thing he hopes to help resolve as a councilman is the

Farmton finds support in wake of political changes

Environmental concerns still linger

VOLUSIA COUNTY — A few years ago, when Miami Corp. first submitted its plans for developing the 59,000-acre tree farm called Farmton, the odds were against approval for the 25,000 homes and four million square feet of commercial space included in the plan.

Environmentalists spoke out often and loudly against it. The project conflicted with land use plans in Volusia and Brevard counties, state officials said. Probably most importantly, it faced opposition from the Florida Department of Community Affairs, the state's powerful growth management agency.

But that was before the 2010 election.

After Gov. Rick Scott was elected and appointed a new director for the Department of Community Affairs (instead of shutting down the agency all together, as he had considered) state objections of Farmton were settled. The settlement included a minor

enlargement of land set aside for conservation.

Then, others jumped on board. At least one environmental group, the West Volusia Audubon Society, expressed support for the development plan in writing to Volusia County.

MyRegion.org also supports Farmton's plan for the tree farm located south of Edgewater and west of Interstate 95, extending south into Brevard County. MyRegion is an organization of government, business and civic leaders spanning Central Florida.

"It's a wonderful example of a landowner who really respects the land," said Shelley Lauten, MyRegion.org president. "I've never been more impressed than with the process Farmton went through."

Miami Corp. officials say the company will immediately set aside about 40,000 acres for conservation, development will be clustered together to limit

the amount of land impacted and other environmental standards and policies will be set in place.

Ms. Lauten praised the clustering strategy as a way to set aside larger swaths of land for wildlife corridors.

She also complimented Miami Corp. for conducting community meetings (during which, records show, many more voices spoke against the Miami Corp. plan than for it).

Despite the many opposing voices, the Volusia County Council approved Miami Corp.'s plan on a 5 to 2 vote in March.

Barbara Herrin of Edgewater Citizens Alliance for Responsible Development expressed frustration with the vote. She said Volusia County Council members only care about their campaign contributions.

In their most recent elections, two County Council members received legal campaign donations from Glenn Storch, the Miami Corp. attorney. Councilwoman Pat Northey received \$500 and Councilwoman Joie Alexan-See FARMTON, A12

Road projects stopped in their tracks by money shortfalls

VOLUSIA COUNTY — Continued budget woes are causing road construction and maintenance projects to come to a screeching halt.

"There is no money for any new road construction," said Dave Byron, Volusia County's Community Information Director.

The coffers used for road work projects are now running on empty. The two avenues the county uses to fund

roads — gas taxes and building impact fees — have both been impacted by the economy. People are driving less due to higher gasoline prices, which affected gas tax revenue. The housing bust has continued, and limited new construction has reduced impact fees designated for road repairs.

The county maintains a five-year road plan with the projected work that needs to be completed in that time period. It is a working plan, and cur-

rently shows unfunded road projects of more than \$176 million. Among the projects that the county has had to halt include the Hand Avenue extension and the four laning of Taylor Road and Tymber Creek Road. The projects on the five-year plan are in various stages of planning, from permitting to engineering.

Gerald Brinton, Director of Engineering and Construction for the county's Road and Bridge

City officials respond to scandal

SOUTH DAYTONA — Officials fear the corruption charges against former mayor Ron Clifton and former special magistrate Jerome Mitchell may affect how citizens view their city representatives.

Mr. Clifton and Mr. Mitchell are charged with accepting bribes of \$5,000 each last year in exchange for reducing city code enforcement liens on the River Club Condominiums. Federal officials say Mr. Clifton later accepted an additional \$2,500 for agreeing to help reduce Volusia County tax liens, and lied to the FBI about his role in the case.

City leaders condemned the actions of both former officials, while encouraging citizens to maintain their trust in the City Council.

Councilwoman Lisa O'Neal said the situation affects officials' ability to do their job.

"(The citizens) elect people to do the right thing and he didn't do the right thing,"

Ms. O'Neal said. "I hope they can look at every one of us and see we are accountable for our own actions. We are not responsible for what happened."

Ms. O'Neal, wife of the late mayor Blaine O'Neal, was appointed to fill the vacancy on the City Council left by her husband's death and Mr. Clifton's ascension to the mayor's seat in April 2010.

At the time, Mr. Clifton said his leadership would mirror Mr. O'Neal's; that he shared a similar vision for the city.

FAITH asks council to use only companies that hire local workers

Group wants neighborhoods with high unemployment targeted

VOLUSIA COUNTY — With a little bit of FAITH, companies bidding to do business with Volusia County might soon hire more

locals. "Basically we want to keep tax dollars here in the county and the region and clean up some of the blighted neighborhoods of high unemployment," said Joyce Pearce-Riddel, chair of the Fighting

Against Injustice Towards Harmony jobs committee. At a recent Volusia County Council meeting, Ms. Riddel and other members of FAITH presented a proposed ordinance that would have given preference to compa-

nies bidding on county contracts if they employ local residents. County Council member Carl Persis was supportive of the proposed ordinance.

"I feel that we owe it to our businesses and residents here in Volusia County to implement it," he said in an interview after the meeting.

The council rejected the proposed ordinance without a vote, but agreed to seek a way to create competitive preferences for companies that employ the county's residents. The council directed County Manager Jim Dinneen to set up meetings with staff, employers and others to examine ways to craft a local-hiring preference system.

A sticking point of the proposed ordinance was a tiered preference system based on the U.S. Census Bureau's data regarding areas of highest unemployment. The proposed ordinance identified the five areas of highest unemployment in the county and would have given companies that hired residents of those areas more preference in getting county contracts than those that hired residents in other parts of the county.

The areas include the blocks between Main Street and Oakridge Boulevard east of Ridgewood Avenue, where the U.S. Census Bureau reports unemployment at 28.8 percent; the blocks between Nova Road and Ridgewood Avenue just south of International Speedway Boulevard (27.5 percent unemployment); the east side of Ridgewood in the blocks between Orange Avenue and Beville Road (23.5 percent unemployment) and the area just north of International Speedway Boulevard between Nova Road and Ridgewood Avenue (24.7 percent unemployment).

Council Chair Frank Bruno and others rejected the tiered-preference system. He said unemployment exists everywhere in the county, and any ordinance had to address the problem evenly.

"I believe the intent is good," he said at the meeting. "We need to get all of our residents in Volusia County employed."

Rev. Dr. L. Ronald Durham said FAITH hopes to work with the county as it crafts a revised ordinance.

"I believe we have to table with whoever the other participants are and come up with an acceptable hiring preference for Volusia County," he said.

Rev. Durham noted that the local social-justice organization with more than 20 member churches has studied other counties' and cities' local-hiring preference ordinances for about three years.

"We were asked to put something together when we first approached the County Council with the concept," he said. "We did exhaustive researching on what we felt would be a solution to unemployment for our county. At this point what we need to do is to make sure (Ms. Riddel), or someone else, is at that table to draft an acceptable replacement."

Ms. Riddel said she hopes the county will find ways to encourage companies to hire from the areas of highest unemployment.

"They incubate drug trafficking, prostitution, crime and other problems," she said. "Give opportunities to those neighborhoods to start training and hiring, and we could turn those neighborhoods around."

SHARK BITE CAPITAL boasts 'World's Safest Beach'

Summer is at hand, and it is time for Volusia County to begin in earnest defending its title as the shark bite capital of the world.

Locals and tourists are doing their part by hitting the beach in record numbers. The sharks are also cooperating by taking their usual place behind the breakers.

It has long been my contention that our unique natural environment is responsible for the high number of bites.

The Mosquito Lagoon south of Ponce Inlet is one of the world's most prolific breeding grounds for fish and crustaceans. On the outgoing tide, all of those tasty morsels are washed out of the inlet and north and south along our beaches. The sharks are well aware of this bounty and gather to feed.

When you add this to the fact that we have the nation's longest stretch of public beach, you are bound to have encounters.

Many of those encounters take place along New Smyrna Beach's north shore. That area is filled with swimmers and surfers each day throughout our long summer.

Ironically, New Smyrna long ago adopted the slogan "The World's Safest Beach."

I find it hard to reconcile that with the parallel title of shark bite capital.

Most of the bites in Volusia County are minor and don't even require a trip to the doctor, and the ones that do are usually repaired with a few stitches.

We don't normally see the carnage that was depicted in the movie "Jaws." When that movie came out in 1975, it changed everything for us and the sharks.

Budding directorial genius Stephan Spielberg, while trying to deal with a mechanical shark that would not perform, managed to turn a simple concept into a masterpiece of suspense that would have made Alfred Hitchcock proud.

If the fake shark had worked properly and been clearly visible throughout the film, "Jaws" might have turned out to be more of a comedy. Instead, Spielberg only gave us glimpses of the thing and allowed our own minds to create the drama.

Never again would we be comfortable in the ocean. Before that movie, I enjoyed night fishing in the surf by wading out to my armpits to cast. Once I saw "Jaws," that was over.

The sharks did not fare well either. People began to kill them for no other reason than the bad impression left by the movie. Luckily, the furor has receded some, and the sharks are not under the same pressure they were in the '70s and '80s.

Another contributing factor to our incidence of local shark bites is the lack of water clarity along area beaches. When feeding, small sharks will hit anything that moves, and at times, that is human feet and hands. In the clear water of the Keys or Florida's west coast, sharks can recognize that people are not a food source.

Ten for the year is considered high, and in many years, the number of local shark bites is closer to five.

My advice to you is to avoid the water in early morning or late evening when fish are more likely to be on the prowl for food.

Enjoy the beach, forget "Jaws" and revel in the fact that we are No. 1!



Ponce Inlet memorial to be complete by Veterans Day

PONCE INLET — Bill Wester is just one of many military veterans who call Ponce Inlet home, yet the town does not have a memorial that recognizes their service.

“We don’t have one (a veterans memorial), but we have a lot of veterans,” said Mr. Wester, a retired lieutenant colonel of the U.S. Marine Corps who earned a Silver Star and three Purple Hearts during the Vietnam War.

But that situation will be rectified by the time Veterans Day rolls around this November when the Ponce Inlet Veterans Memorial Association, a nonprofit formed last year as an effort to plan, construct and maintain a veterans memorial in Ponce Inlet, erects a monument at Lighthouse Park.

The memorial will have room for 1,000 commemorative brick pavers containing inscriptions recognizing the efforts of veterans.

Construction will begin following a groundbreaking ceremony scheduled to be held at 11 a.m. The monument will have its grand opening on Nov. 11 – Veterans Day.

Mr. Wester, 68, who today is an active member of the Ponce Inlet Lions Club, banded with fellow residents and veterans to encourage the town to recognize their service to their country. The Town gave the green light to the project at an April 21 Town Council meeting.

He said the project would have no impact on the taxpayers. The Ponce Inlet Veterans Memorial Foundation is paying for the construction of the monument and will be responsible for maintaining it, he said.

Port Orange-based company S.A.T. Development is the builder, said Margi Richard, the Town’s development review clerk.

“They have their permits in place and they have a groundbreaking scheduled for the end of this month,” she said.

Mr. Wester served three tours in Vietnam, starting out as an infantry officer in Da Nang. He rose through the ranks to become lieutenant colonel before he retired from the Marine Corps in 1987.

His actions during the Vietnam War earned him a Silver Star and three Purple Hearts.

Enemy forces attacked Mr. Wester’s platoon one night in September 1969, killing the executive officer and severely wounding a platoon commander.

Mr. Wester responded by urging his men to direct fire on the enemy. Although his platoon gained fire superiority, the enemy retaliated, and the ensuing bombardment left Mr. Wester seriously wounded.

Still, he refused medical treatment and decided instead to continue directing his unit until the enemy was defeated.

“I was just doing my job,” he said, downplaying the medals he received for his



bravery. Ponce Inlet's veterans community have fought in wars as far back as World War II and as recently as the Persian Gulf War, Mr. Wester said.

Veterans Day was chosen as the date for the grand opening, he said, because of the holiday's significance to veterans. He said Veterans Day is celebrated on Nov. 11 to mark the anniversary of the signing of the armistice that ended hostilities between the Allies and Germany in World War I.

About 25 brick pavers have been sold so far, and Mr. Wester is receiving anywhere between two to three orders a day as more people learn about the memorial plans.

The initial layout calls for 400 inscribed bricks. Ed Jackson, a member of the Veterans Memorial Association, said his group plans to add additional bricks to the memorial on Memorial Day and Veterans Day of each year.

Pavers can be purchased for \$100 each on the Town's website,

www.ponce-inlet.org. Inscriptions on each 12-by-12-inch brick can contain up to nine lines of copy and 25 characters per line.

"We're looking to get support from folks who want to recognize their family members," Mr. Wester said. "I talked to a lady who's buying a commemorative brick for her brother ... he'll have a nice recognition of his efforts."

Members of the Veterans Memorial Association are also looking to encourage local businesses to donate money to the project, he added.

Mr. Wester said he would purchase a brick paver in memory of his father, who served in World War II, and is considering purchasing another brick to pay tribute to friends he served with in Vietnam who were killed during the war.

He said the veterans' memorial would commemorate the actions of all war veterans.

"All of us gave some but some of us gave all," he said. "That's what this memorial is all about ... it's about everybody."

In addition to placing these lines underground, we also closed up all unused curb cuts (driveways), installed brand new widened sidewalks, and installed a new (city owned) street light system that includes decorative poles with attractive city banners. Our City Council has been adamant and has worked diligently to make sure this overall theme is extended throughout the entire city.

As such, our last phase of this project has now moved to the section of South Atlantic Avenue that is located south of Dunlawton (as well as a small section of Dunlawton itself). This last phase is much more complicated as we are reducing the number of lanes (road diet) from five to three. On the East side of the new street, there will be a 12-foot wide, meandering, multidirectional trail/sidewalk. At Emilia, the trail will cross over to the west side of the road and will continue south to the city limits. This section will only be eight feet wide. As part of this project, we are installing a new stormwater system for the County, partnering with the City of Port Orange to replace their water main, and also replacing/repairing the city's sewer line infrastructure.

Lastly and more to the point of your question, all of the overhead utility lines (power, cable, phone, fiber) along this section of roadway will be placed underground. Additionally, this section will have the same decorative street light system with the attractive banners. We hope to have South Atlantic completed before Christmas.

Why isn't there more Edgewater coverage?

Quilting circle offers warmth for both recipients and members

DAYTONA BEACH — Stitch by stitch, some "Classy, Crafty Ladies" provide relief for the needy and an uplifting social haven for themselves.

About 15 women meet weekly at the Dickerson Community Center to work on sewing, crocheting, knitting and quilting projects for nursing home residents, the homeless and earthquake survivors in Haiti.

"We had two men," said Wilma Hawkins, who runs the Senior Oasis program for the city's Leisure Services Department, "but they dropped off."

Blankets, lap warmers, hats, quilts, clothing and other items are made through the efforts of the women, who not only supply the labor, but pay for their own materials and often add toiletries for the needy who receive their products.

Efforts expanded recently to make pillowcase dresses for women and girls in earthquake-ravaged Haiti.

"We sew for charity," said Ms. Hawkins, a 35-year veteran in the Leisure Services Department. "The things we make, we donate to different places."

Ms. Hawkins said her expertise is sewing, but as with many of the other women, she picked up new skills, learning from the other participants.

"I learned how to make knit hats," she said. "With this group, I've learned how to do a lot of things."

Asked what the key is to making a knit hat, Ms. Hawkins said, "patience."

The idea for the sewing, knitting, crocheting and quilting came from participants in the city's Senior Oasis programs.

"I just had people who wanted to have programs



going on," Ms. Hawkins said. "I asked what they wanted and this was it."

The women socialize while they work, she said, but the conversation invariably turns to where to get materials for their projects on sale.

Bettie Caswell, an Ormond Beach resident in her 60's, has participated in the group for a year.

For Ms. Caswell, who retired here 11 years ago from New Jersey, where she worked as a health services training supervisor, the sewing program provides a useful outlet.

"I get the satisfaction of giving back to the community," Ms. Caswell said. "This takes a lot of time.

She also appreciates the

companionship.

"I really enjoy it, the socialization," Ms. Caswell said. "We have a group of ladies that works together real well. We teach each other. If one crochets and the other doesn't, we teach her."

Ms. Caswell said she suggested the sewing group add pillowcase dresses for Haiti as one of their projects. Her inspiration was a program about making pillowcase dresses for Africa on the cable news channel, MSNBC.

"I said, 'We can do this for Haiti,'" Ms. Caswell said. "We're making pillowcase dresses. They're not all made out of pillowcases. Some are made out of pillowcases, but the majority are not. We're just making them out of a simple pattern."

Group president Gloria Nedd, who came up with the

name Classy, Crafty Ladies, is a Daytona Beach resident who retired from Halifax Medical Center after 27 years as a nurse. Several years ago she was making quilts with Church Women United when someone told her about the group at Dickerson.

"I would come over to show the ladies how to make lap covers," Ms. Nedd said. "I brought another lady who knew more about making quilts."

Ms. Nedd said the Classy, Crafty Ladies is like a group of sisters, enjoying each other's company, giving each other advice, sharing skills and encouragement.

"My favorite thing to make is baby blankets," Ms. Nedd said. "I have a favorite kind I like to call Teddy bear. You can see the outline of the Teddy bear I crochet."

The ladies also make something called "no sew" blankets. They put two pieces of material together, cut the material into strips and tie the tops and bottom strips together to make blankets.

"Most of the enjoyment, I think, is giving away everything we make," Ms. Nedd said. "That's our enjoyment—giving. We really enjoy the look on a patient's face when we give them a blanket."

New technology may have those with spinal cord injuries standing up to cheer

DAYTONA BEACH — It's the sort of news that Kate Abels has waited to hear for 21 years. Someone who, like her, has a spinal cord injury, stood up and walked with the help of new medical technology.

The Christopher and Dana Reeve Foundation, along with the National Institutes of Health, recently announced that research scientists succeeded in helping a paraplegic to stand and walk.

Ms. Abels, who is paraplegic, said she was happy to hear the news, even if it never benefits her personally because of the amount of atrophy in her muscles. As president of disAbility Solutions for Independent Living in Daytona Beach, a nonprofit that assists disabled residents, Ms. Abels is surrounded by many people the breakthrough can help.

"I was injured in 1990, and didn't think I'd make it 21 years later," Ms. Abels said. "The whole duration, I've been watching all the discoveries."

Researchers at the Louisville Frazier Rehabilitation Unit, using experimental epidural electrical stimulation with an implanted device, successfully mimicked the brain's signals past Rob Summer's spinal cord injury to help initiate repeated voluntary movements of the ankles, knees and hips.

In a phone interview, Mr. Summers, 25, said he hopes his medical successes, with a combination of experimental epidural electrical stimulation and intense physical training, inspire everyone to be more appreciative of what they can do with or without disabilities and to live fuller lives.

"My biggest message is

about hope and inspiring people to live the best that they can be now, and in the future," he said.

Mr. Summers, who was struck by a car in a hit and run accident in 2006, now stands for about an hour a day in a controlled setting without direct assistance. He still needs considerable support to make stepping movements. Additionally, the experimental therapy that started in 2009 has helped Mr. Summers regain lung function, body temperature regulation, and greater bowel and bladder control, along with some sexual function.

According to the Reeve Foundation, about 1.3 million Americans have spinal cord injuries. The injuries cause varying levels of discomfort and paralysis, from quadriplegia — paralysis of all limbs and torso, and paraplegia — paralysis of the lower extremities, to ambulatory — able to walk and do other activities, but usually with a great deal of weakness and pain. Men are about twice as likely to have spinal-cord injuries as women, and the leading cause by far is vehicular accidents.

The Florida Department of Health's Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program reports that about 500 Floridians are spinal-cord injured every year. The state draws many wheelchair users, because of its flat terrain, and abundance of buildings constructed after the Americans with Disabilities Act established accessibility standards. That was in 1990.

Dr. Susan Harkema, professor of neurological surgery at the University of Louisville, and director of research at Frazier Rehabilitation Institute is one of the lead researchers working with Mr. Summers. She said with his successes showing

promise for epidural electrical stimulation, researchers will test it on four others who share similar traits.

"The next step is to repeat this in people who are similar to Rob (Summers)," she said.

Mr. Summers remained athletic after his injury five years ago, has a supportive partner, and as a former college baseball player and now day trader is accustomed to keeping successes and failures in perspective.

Dr. Harkema said if there's repeated success with the experimental treatment, researchers will test it on others with different levels, types, and longevities of spinal-cord injuries. She said the electrical stimulation therapy isn't a cure for paralysis due to spinal cord injury, but is helping scientists understand the circuitry better. She said an ultimate cure will likely be a regimen of different therapies, not a single "silver bullet."

Ms. Abels participated in research studies after her injury. The side effects were devastating, but temporary. She has much admiration for people such as Mr. Summers who are willing to risk gains they've worked for to help researchers advance toward better therapies for function recovery and a cure for spinal-cord injuries.

"It's a risk," she said. "He took a risk to not only help himself but the rest of the SCI community."

Tom Bird runs the Halifax Neuroscience SCI Support Group at the Halifax Medical Center. He used to

counsel people with catastrophic disabilities, too. He said hope is often a rare commodity for people with disabilities, and too often they choose to wait for medical breakthroughs instead of acclimating to and excelling despite their disabilities.

"A lot of time people think I'm not going to do anything," he said. "I'm not going to go get a job, I'm not going to go out. I'm not going to do anything until something comes along and I'm cured."

Mr. Bird said it's important for people with disabilities to be excited about new research and expanded therapies, but to remain active in the meantime.

Vacation season means more chance of children getting lost

A lost child is a parent's worst nightmare. And, as families plan to spend more time outdoors, on vacation and in busy public places this summer, it is important

to be prepared. A survey of parents by the Center to Prevent Lost Children showed that 90 percent of families will experience losing a child in a public place at least once, and 20 percent said it has happened more than once.

It is important to try to prevent a child from getting lost but even more important that the child knows what to do if they do get lost. Preparing yourself and a child can make this frightening situation become a bit easier for everyone involved.

•Before you go anywhere, talk to your family about what to do if someone gets lost. Discuss a designated place to go if you get lost or

advise children to stay right where they are when they feel they are lost. Tell children to find a security officer, police officer or an employee if you are in a public place, or remind them they can ask another mom with kids for help.

•Prepare your children so that they can identify themselves. For younger children, have their identification information in their pocket. If they are old enough to

speak and can relay the information, practice reciting your phone number with them, and let them know they can always call 911.

•For younger children or when clothes don't have pockets, be creative. Make a bracelet out of numbered beads or write your phone number inside a shirt collar or on a shirt tag with a fabric marker.

•Dress children in bright

colored clothing so they can easily be spotted. Lemon yellow and lime green are the suggested colors because they easily attract the eye.

•Take a photo of your child with your phone before you leave home or when you arrive at your destination. This will help police find a lost child because they will know

Clifton did not live up to that promise.

"He did not lead like my husband did. Everybody who knew Blaine knows he was an honest person," she said. "He made every decision based on what was right for the city."

She said she hopes the citizens will be able to trust City Councilors and the decisions they make, despite Mr. Clifton's actions.

"I hope the city won't look at the Council as shady people who do bad things," she said.

Councilwoman Nancy Long echoed this sentiment, adding she believes citizens will be "more suspicious" of

council members' actions because of what happened.

"It makes me sick when people like Ron Clifton take advantage of the office and the people's trust," she said.

She did not become suspicious of Mr. Clifton, she said, until his sudden resignation from the Council in January — the same day the news that FBI officials were investigating a city official was made public. She said she assumed the two events were related.

Both Ms. O'Neal and Ms. Long said they had no knowledge Mr. Clifton was involved in any illegal activity while they were serving on council with him.

Dr. T. Wayne Bailey, a political science professor at Stetson University, said it was a "sorry time" for the City of South Daytona because of

the scandal — which he said hits close to home because Ron Clifton graduated from Stetson and the Clifton family retains close ties to the DeLand college.

Mr. Clifton's parents, Dr. Ron Clifton, Sr. and Gwili Clifton, are also Stetson graduates. Dr. Clifton, a former diplomat with the U.S. Senior Foreign Service, worked as director of Stetson's Celebration campus in Osceola County from 1997 to 2005.

A press statement from Stetson's website shows the Cliftons donated \$50,000 in 2006 to fund scholarships for Daytona State College students who transfer to Stetson for their Bachelor's degrees.

Dr. Bailey said we are living in a time where citizens hold "great distrust" and "paranoia" toward government officials, a common phenomenon during times of economic turmoil.

He said corruption is more common at the local level than in the state and federal level because decisions

made by municipal boards could translate to significant monetary benefit.

"A decision on zoning or code enforcement can mean hundreds of thousands, even millions of dollars," he said.

A simple answer to the corruption problem, he said, would be to create a process of accountability that provides checks and balances limiting the power of local officials. Without checks on municipal leaders, Dr. Bailey said, "something not so good is going to happen."

Dr. Bailey said both Mr. Clifton and Mr. Mitchell must pay the consequences for their actions.

"I'd hate to think about somebody in his prime going to federal prison," he said, but because Mr. Clifton and Mr. Mitchell agreed to plead guilty to the charges, they "have to pay the piper."

Mr. Clifton did not return phone calls, and when Mr. Mitchell was reached, he declined comment.

Department said that once the current Williamson Boulevard construction project is complete, there will be no more road projects started.

"There were strong expectations that projects in the engineering phase would go forward, but there is no projected funding available for the construction of any projects," Mr. Brinton said. "Road resurfacing will also not be maintained at the levels we have in the past."

This may become a "critical" situation, officials say.

Mr. Brinton said he gets several calls from residents regarding road problems in their districts.

"I return approximately three calls per week to advise concerned residents that we may not be able to attend to the needs of their neighborhood roads," Mr. Brinton said.

Carl Persis, District 4 councilman, says that the road issues are becoming a critical issue in the county.

"During the last six months I have received requests from people about the conditions of roads in their respective areas," Mr. Persis said. "With the gas tax revenue diminishing and no state assistance, the maintenance of our roadways is becoming a critical concern. We have to use our limited road maintenance dollars to repair the most traveled and most damaged roads."

Ormond-by-the-Sea resident Stevan Simmons is concerned about the con-

tinued deterioration of roads in the northern end of the county. He has noticed numerous potholes along local roads, he said.

"I'm sure if we see a storm hit here this season, we will see where our roads are weakest," Mr. Simmons said.

Warren Pike, Public Works Director for the City of Port Orange, says his city is being impacted by the county's budget woes.

"The county's challenges have caused us to prolong our paving program," Mr. Pike said.

"Instead of completing the program in 18 to 20 years, we have had to stretch out our paving work over a 25 year plan."

Mr. Pike warns that the longer cycle may cause roads to break down beyond the ability to simply repair or resurface.

"Over time some roads might have to be rebuilt," he said.

Mr. Brinton said that going forward, the county will only be repairing roads that the engineering department deem necessary to prevent structural failure of the base material of the roadways. "Base failure," he said, means having to put in a whole new roadway.

County Council member Joie Alexander said the complaints about road repairs will become a common topic of concern going forward.

"The issue we have right now is there is a perception in people's mind that our capacity for road building has not been affected by cuts because we have done such a good job up to this point," she said. "The

problem is that we have lost our ability to do what has been successful and over time we will see an erosion in quality and capacity and then we will get more complaints."

Finding alternative funding is difficult, officials say.

Federal dollars require plans be made to higher standards, which would cost the county more in the planning stage and provide no guarantee of financial support. The Dunn Avenue extension project was paid for with federal stimulus dollars, but was the only project that met the "shovel-ready" requirement to receive that funding.

Mr. Brinton said the stalled road projects on the five-year plan will go right back to the planning stage they were in if economic conditions change and money becomes available.

Two projects that will definitely go forward are bridge projects — the replacement of the Orange Avenue drawbridge and repairs to the Turnbull Bay Road bridge. These projects have just received funding from the Florida Department of Transporta-

tion through the Federal Bridge Replacement fund. Work on these projects will begin by 2014.

exactly how they look that day.

•Positive reinforcement: Speak with your child about stranger danger, and remind them of the importance of staying with you.

Sometimes children do get lost, and it is easy for parents and guardians to forget what to do in this scary situation. Many public places have standard procedures of what to do when a child is missing, so make sure authorities and the venue's management are notified that the child is lost.

•If you are at home, search your house first before going outside. Check closets, laundry baskets and piles of clothes, in and under beds, in large appliances, in vehicles and other areas where the child may hide or play.

•If you still can't find the child in the home, call 911 to notify them and let them know if you feel the child is in any danger. Police departments would rather be aware of the situation and called back when the

child is found, rather than wasting valuable minutes to find the child. Time is crucial once a child has been separated from you.

•Stay calm. Screaming the child's name won't help you locate the child any faster if they are not close by. Plus, yelling the child's name could lure the wrong type of person to your child who may be screaming back for you.

•Make sure the phone number your child knows, preferably a cell phone, is on and is receiving a signal. Also, be sure to have a close family member or neighbor near your home phone so that you can stay in the area where the child was last seen.

Just like any other emergency plan, it is important to review and practice your family's strategy if a child gets lost. Children can be better prepared to know what to do in the situation, and will feel more confident that they will be reunited with their family if they understand the family's "lost" procedures.

der received \$750, according to the Volusia County Supervisor of Elections office.

Ms. Alexander expressed outrage that anyone would think her vote could be bought. She supported the Miami Corp. plan because the number of homes proposed was trimmed by 6,000 and the conservation area was increased by 10,000 acres from the original plan. She said carving Farmton into ranchettes (previously, Miami Corp considered the construction of 1,700 "ranchette" homesites from 10 to 25 acres in Volusia and 2,306 sites of five acres in Bre-

vard) would be an environmental disaster. Miami Corp. also must provide jobs to proceed with development, possibly by attracting corporations to transportation corridors, she said.

"I looked at it as a plan," Ms. Alexander said. "I feel sometimes we fail to plan, or plan to fail."

She expects the plan to change when details are worked out in the years to come.

"What we're looking at today, will not be what we're looking at in the future," she said.

Ms. Northey described the Farmton vote as one of her toughest as an elected official. To decide, she said she asked herself what

kind of Volusia County will exist in 2060 for her grandchild. She said she was impressed with the land devoted to conservation in the plan, water resources to be available, clustering of construction and jobs to be provided. Also, except for some construction near the Restoration project in Edgewater, there will be no development on the Farmton Tree farm for 20 years.

"In effect, a building moratorium has been placed on this land and can only be lifted when, and only if, Farmton meets the needs test," Ms. Northey said in a written message. "They cannot build the first home if the need is not there."

What about the water?

Miami Corp. plans to form a water utility to supply water to the proposed development.

A new test, Miami Corp. officials say, shows Farmton is served by a separate, distinct underground water source.

"There had been no testing for water in this area," said Mr. Storch, the Miami Corp. attorney. "Testing revealed a significant water resource at Farmton that (the) St. Johns (River Water Management District) did not know about."

Ms. Herrin scoffed at Miami Corp.'s plan to establish a water utility to serve not only its 25,000 homes and four million square feet of commercial space, but also at least some development in Edgewater, without causing environmental harm.

"I'd like someone to tell me how a water utility there (in the Farmton Tree Farm) is not going to affect wetlands," Ms. Herrin said. "The whole area is surrounded by wetlands."


Miami Corp. will require construction standards to cut water consumption and re-use treated wastewater for irrigation, Mr. Storch said.

Another big issue of concern to environmentalists is that nearly 24,000 acres of the Farmton Tree Farm is set aside as a wetlands mitigation bank.

Developers who propose construction that would destroy wetlands in one place, must pay to set aside wetlands elsewhere, in approved areas called wetlands mitigation banks, like the one on the Farmton property. Wetlands mitigation fees in Florida can run more than \$50,000 an acre.

"It is the largest mitigation bank in the United States," said Mrs. Herrin, of Edgewater Citizens for Responsible Development. "It has importance in the state and nation."

For the Miami Corp. plan to go ahead, the company might need permission to reduce the mitigation bank because construction is not allowed near wetlands mitigation areas, according to Volusia County Council agenda documents.

The cost of development

Another concern among critics is the cost to taxpayers for the Miami Corp. development.

Mr. Storch asserts the developer will pay all development costs.

"I'm not aware of any additional costs to taxpayers," he said.

School construction to service the projected new population could exceed \$200 million, according to Volusia County Schools.

"We're not planning on building anything out there," said Saralee Morrissey, Volusia County Schools planning director. "If something happens sooner than later, we would not have any ability to fund it. They would have to fund it."

Before Miami Corp. could build more than roughly 2,200 homes, an agreement must be worked out on school construction between the company and the School District.

Volusia County Councilman Andy Kelly, who voted against the Miami Corp. plan, remains skeptical of Mr. Storch's claim. The public could be on the hook for \$60 million for roads during the first of three proposed construction phases, Mr. Kelly said. "Potentially no taxpayer cost — that isn't a fact,"

Mr. Kelly said. "That's a possibility."

The only protection for taxpayers is a statement in the agreement with Miami Corp. that the county reserves the right to approve development

based on the availability of funding, he said.

"We will need to hold their feet to the fire the whole way to make sure they follow through on everything they promised," Mr. Kelly said.

But he worries a future County Council might not hold Miami Corp. to its promises.

Mr. Kelly supports the clustering approach as a smart strategy to protect the land. Miami Corp.'s plan just doesn't go far enough, he said.

He appreciates the promise to provide jobs, but wonders how that will happen.

Peace in this land war should come when Miami Corp. submits detailed plans in the future, Mr. Kelly said.

Future negotiations on detailed plans should include reducing the number of homes and commercial development, while increasing the land put into conservation, Mr. Kelly said. Up to now, there hasn't been enough give and take.

"There was no, 'let's work it out' . . . It went from zero to 100 in nothing flat, with nothing in between," Mr. Kelly said.

Street into a mixed-use working waterfront.

"I think it's been getting out of hand," he said. "Instead of trying to get together, it seems we're coming apart."

Mr. Smith believes the Town Council must reach a compromise with Pacetta property owners Simone and Lyder Johnson and end the litigation as soon as possible.

In addition to Pacetta, Councilman Scott Meacham wanted to know applicants' opinions on two other controversial town issues, the noise ordinance and the sign ordinance.

Agreeing with the consensus of councilors that the noise ordinance needs to be revisited, Mr. Smith believes the ordinance should be changed to reflect that police should issue a verbal warning before a written citation is issued.

He did ask, however, why businesses "keep cranking up that darn bass."

"They (business owners) have a lot of control over the annoyance that the bass creates, and they can do something with their volume but they seem reluctant to try to do that," he said.

That was the basis for his vote in favor of suspending the amplification license for Jerry's Pizza and Tiki Bar at a recent Planning Board hearing, he said.

Mr. Smith said he considers the proposed sign ordinance too restrictive because the size of some signs, such as real estate signs from Adams Cameron placed near the Fisherman's Village condominiums, are so small that a person cannot read the sign from inside a motor vehicle.

"The Town is in a conflict that we approve a business entity but the sign ordinance doesn't allow the sign to be big enough to adequately advertise what we've approved to be in business there," he said.

Mr. Smith hopes he can bring about positive change as councilman.

"I believe that I can provide knowledge and leadership to solve problems and contribute to the future of Ponce Inlet," he said.

Come spend an evening with Alice

DAYTONA BEACH – Shakespeare's phrase "All the world's a stage" was taken very literally by playwright Alice Gerstenberg. Many of the mostly one-act plays she wrote in the early part of the 20th century could be performed just about anywhere. "The Puppeteer," for example, takes place solely on a staircase.

Ms. Gerstenberg, a native of Chicago, was a pioneer of the Little Theater movement. She believed everyone should be able to perform and see plays, no matter their lack of access to theaters or money for elaborate productions. Ms. Gerstenberg also saw these inexpensively produced plays as a

means of fundraising for communities wanting to found little theaters.

Carrie Van Tol is a fundraiser and director at the Daytona Playhouse. She recently stumbled upon Ms. Gerstenberg's work and found out about her involvement with community theater.

She was inspired.

"I realized that if it weren't for the efforts of those such as (Ms. Gerstenberg), there would be no community theater to enjoy today," Ms. Van Tol said.

To honor Ms. Gerstenberg, and – appropriately – raise a little money for the Playhouse, a three-night engagement called "An evening with Alice – a Night of One Acts" will be presented June 17-19.

"I don't think that many people

have really heard of Alice Gerstenberg," Ms. Van Tol said, "so creating this production was the perfect chance to celebrate the writings of this woman as well as the origin of community theater."

In the spirit of "access for all," tickets are priced at only \$7.

Ms. Gerstenberg's most significant contribution to the little theater movement is her founding of the playwright's Theatre of Chicago (1922-45), which was designed to offer the local playwright an opportunity to produce plays, according to novelguide.com. But it was not just her work in theater, but also her work for theater that makes Ms. Gerstenberg so popular still.

"Her plays are a humorous commentary on high society and, although they were written in the 1920s, the plays still have relevant themes today," Ms. Van Tol said.

Ms. Gerstenberg's play "Overtones" was heralded as representing a new formula in theater. Today it is still seen as a forerunner of later psychological drama by major playwrights, including Eugene O'Neill, who acknowledged its influence on his work, according to novelguide.com.

"The Pot Boiler" (later titled "Dress Rehearsal"), a comedy about the pretensions of conventional theater, and "Fourteen," a light satire on the pettiness of high society dinner parties, along with Overtones—all appearing in Gerstenberg's second collection, "Ten One-Act Plays" (1921)—are Gerstenberg's most popular plays. They have appeared in numerous anthologies of one-act plays and have been produced by little theaters all over the U.S., England, and Australia, according to the website.

Daytona Playhouse's production is 4 one-act vignettes based on Ms. Gerstenberg's works. Twenty volunteer actors will take the stage. Ms. Van Tol both directs and produces.

"I have enjoyed working on this show because it is an opportunity to bring new stories and styles of acting to the Daytona Playhouse stage," Ms. Van Tol said. "This production is very different from what you would experience during the regular season, and that makes it both a challenge and a joy."

Ms. Van Tol said the good example set by Ms. Gerstenberg makes all of her hard work easier.

"Community theater is about people coming together and working towards a common goal," she said. "I am fortunate to have found good material to work with and a very talented cast and crew to bring this vision to life."

The dinner this year is one that he's requested himself. It's his Father's Day Fantasy Feast! So when I asked him to come up with a special menu of what he'd like to be served this Father's Day, this is what he decided would make him happy:

- Grilled Octopus
- Assorted French Cheeses
- St. Emilion Bordeaux, 1976
- Garden Salad with dried cranberries
- Filet Mignon and Lobster Tails
- Chocolate Mousse

Being of Greek descent, he enjoys Greek-style grilled octopus, often with a small

glass of ouzo. It's a classic image that comes to mind when many think of Greece: sitting at a taverna by the seaside, with a plate of freshly grilled octopus. It's delicious, and you can create the same atmosphere at home.

Years ago when my husband was president of a corporation in France, his palate was influenced by some of the finest foods in

the world. The assortment of cheeses he chose for his Fantasy Feast were Brie de Meaux, Camembert, and Chèvre (goat) cheese served with French bread. The wine that he loves best is Saint Emilion 1976 and it goes great with the French cheese assortment. He would order this wine when making sales calls in the Bordeaux region of France, which is now worth more than \$400 a bottle.

He loves a good garden salad with oil and vinegar dressing, with a handful of dried cranberries on top.

The main course, Surf and Turf, is what we served at

our wedding 22 years ago. Filet mignon is simply the best cut of meat known to man. Filet mignon can be prepared dozens of different ways, but my husband's favorite way is with a rub of Montreal Steak spice and grilled 3 minutes on both sides until just pink in the middle. The lobster has to be Maine lobster, and reminiscent of the dozens of lobsters we devoured the first year we were married. He loves his lobster steamed with a little drawn butter — nothing else.

Since it's a special day, I know he'll make room for a special dessert. He has a

sweet tooth and this is the dessert that really brings a smile to his face. Chocolate mousse is simple yet elegant. It can be made in advance.

CHOCOLATE MOUSSE:

- 4 ounces bittersweet or semisweet chocolate, cut into small pieces
- 2 tablespoons sweet unsalted butter, cut in small pieces
- 2 large eggs, separated
- 1/8 teaspoon cream of tartar
- 3 tablespoons sugar, divided
- 1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla

extract
1/2 cup heavy whipping cream

In a medium-sized double boiler (or a stainless steel bowl set over a saucepan of simmering water), melt the chocolate and butter. Remove from heat and allow to cool for a few minutes. Then whisk in the two egg yolks. Place in refrigerator while you whip the egg whites and whipping cream.

In the bowl of your electric mixer (or with a hand mixer), whip the two

Sad situation: another local bait shop bites the dust

The shrimp in the Halifax are conspicuously absent thus far. I suppose the phenomenal shrimp run of 2010 has spoiled me, but I keep expecting to see the cast netters on the river any day.

Last year, the June run began in early May and didn't stop until well into 2011. That was an unbelievable run. In an average year, we get shrimp during parts of June and July and then it's over until around Thanksgiving.

Last year while trying to fig-

ure out what caused so many shrimp to float down the river, I wrote about the old cracker belief that the shrimp run is directly proportional to the hatch of the woolly caterpillars. If there is any truth in that, then we are in for a poor

shrimp season because the hatch was way off this spring.

Last year, the roads around High Bridge were coated as though they had been freshly oiled due to all of the worms that had been run over. This year left barely a stain, and even that was very short lived.

Conversely, the bait fish run this spring was major. Mullet and menhaden poured up the Halifax and Tomoka rivers, bringing with them tarpon, snook, trout and reds. We also had a nice blue crab hatch

around the Basin.

All of that was bound to lead to good fishing, and it did. Now even the long-missing jacks have returned. These days, it is hard to fish north of Granada without getting your line stretched.

If you have not been up High Bridge way for a while, then you might not know the bait shop has closed once more. That is a sad commentary. We desperately needed that store open.

I am pretty certain that the place was the victim of local fishing methods. As I have said many times, the profit from the sale of shrimp will only pay a bait shop's overhead. Those businesses must

sell tackle and other items to turn a profit.

Although the ramps at High Bridge are some of the busiest in the county, the bait shop sells little tackle and not too many shrimp. Fishing at High Bridge has evolved to be almost exclusively based on swimming a free lined live mullet.

The mud flats in that area abound with big red fish. Almost every boat that launches first strikes out to cast net bait. With each boat providing its own bait, there is no sale at the bait shop. Too bad.

I sincerely hope someone steps up to try it anew. With all of that boat traffic, there must

be some way of succeeding.

In the meantime let's all support the tackle shop of our choice. We can't do it without them and shouldn't have to. Sure, out of necessity their prices might be a buck or two higher, but that won't kill anyone.

Take care of your favorite bait store and they will continue to take care of us. Each of us who fish or sell bait is in this thing together.


