Second pleads guilty in bribery case; sentencing in September

SOUTH DAYTONA — The man who served as the city's special magistrate from 2004 to 2010 pleaded guilty to accepting a bribe.

Jerome Mitchell, 42, entered his plea before U.S. Magistrate Judge Gregory J. Kelly in a federal courtroom in Orlando, admitting he took a

bribe of \$5,000 to assist in the reduction of city code enforcement liens on the River Club Condominiums, according to the U.S. Attorney's Office.

Mr. Mitchell's hearing came just days after Ron Clifton, a former councilman and mayor, pleaded guilty to accepting \$7,500 in bribes and lying to FBI agents about his involvement in reducing the liens.

Both Mr. Mitchell and Mr. Clifton were not jailed as they await sentencing; they will be sentenced before Judge Mary Scriven on Sept. 15.

Mr. Mitchell surrendered his passport and was advised not to leave the Central Florida area

Schools: Follow dress code or get uniforms

VOLUSIA COUNTY — If a dress code doesn't get students to pull up their pants, take off their caps and cover their cleavage, Volusia County School Board members are ready to require uniforms.

"The ball's in their court," board member Judy Conte said. "They can show us our confidence in them was well founded or not."

At a recent meeting, the board adopted a dress code similar to one Seminole County started in the 2010-2011 school year. A dress-code committee headed up by Nancy Wait, director of communications, had considered uniforms. With direction from the board, the idea was put on hold in favor of a less stringent dress code. The board will do a compliance review in January. If members feel students aren't complying with the new dress code, uniforms might be next.

"This will be fun, ha ha, for the first couple weeks," board chair Stan Schmidt said at the meeting. "It's up to the stu-

dents where this will go beyond this."

Walt Griffin, executive director of high schools in Seminole County, said implementation of the dress code there went smoothly, and compliance came easily. He said much of the reason for this was a vigorous public-awareness campaign that started seven months before the dress code went into effect. Volusia has far fewer months to publicize the dress code; the school year begins Aug. 22.

Mr. Griffin offered Volusia officials a tip for getting middle and high schoolers to comply with a dress code.


"Engage students in the process from the very beginning," he said in a telephone interview. "Most of the schools did something positive."

Some Seminole schools had fashion shows early in the academic year featuring trendy attire that conformed to the new dress code. That's an idea at least one Volusia principal is willing to try.

"We might look at some

New program will help shoppers 'Buy Volusia'

VOLUSIA COUNTY — With a click of the mouse one can send dollars and jobs somewhere else.

"When someone sits at their computer and is about to hit the "buy"

button, that takes money out of the county," Phil Ehlinger, Volusia County's director of economic development, said. "That threatens the job of the guy down the road. The more you do Internet shopping the more you hurt your own community."

But, Mr. Ehlinger and other local business supporters want to

change that soon. "Buy Volusia" is a program that will create an Internet site populated by Volusia County businesses. Local shoppers can still search for and purchase goods from the comfort of their computer chairs, but the money will feed the local economy rather than be spread all over the world.

"It's a program to educate citizens and reward customers and a program to promote our local business community," Chamber president Larry McKinney said.

According to recent reports from the Agency for Workforce

Old police headquarters may become business incubator

PORT ORANGE — A place where some people went when they were in trouble may soon be a place to go when they are doing well.

City officials will consider using the old police department building on Dunlawton Avenue as a business incubator, where an emerging busi-

ness owner leases space and gets support to help them develop that business successfully.

The building, constructed in 1986, was home to the city's police department until their new headquarters on Clyde Morris Boulevard opened in January 2010.

In addition to serving as the former police headquarters, the building also contains the

city's emergency operations center, as well as dispatch operations for the Regional Communications Center, which handles dispatch for Port Orange, New Smyrna Beach and Edgewater.

Officials looked to consider a new use for the building as far back as when the new police station was in development. They're looking to make a



Volusia schools top state average

The percent of Volusia schools earning an "A" or "B" exceeded the state with 77 percent of elementary schools and 100 percent of middle schools making the mark.

High school grades will not be released until November because the additional data that is now included in the grade calculation will not be available until that time.

While the rigor has increased, the percentages of A and B schools has remained relatively stable.

Elementary: 77 percent received an A or B (Florida 76 percent)

- A - 24 schools
- B - 12 schools
- C - 9 schools
- D - 2 schools
- F - 0 schools

Fourteen elementary schools improved by at least one letter grade, an improvement over last year's results in which only three schools improved. Twenty-three maintained their grade and 10 schools dropped one letter grade. Six of those schools were reduced a letter grade because of lack of progress in reading for the lowest

quartile students and two schools were reduced a letter grade because less than 50 percent of students made progress in reading for two consecutive years.



Take cover, mosquitoes back

The rainy season has arrived, and the mosquitoes won't be far behind.

"The annual onslaught of mosquitoes has been delayed by a late rainy season, but it's starting to pick up," said James McNelly, Volusia County's new mosquito control director. "We're seeing more mosquitoes in our traps and expect residents to start noticing them in their backyards very soon."

Mosquitoes usually emerge in large numbers five to seven days after a major rain. They lay eggs on dry ground, and as standing water builds up, the eggs hatch.

Mosquitoes are most active at dawn and dusk. If you must go outside at these times, wear long pants, long sleeves and shoes with socks. Apply mosquito repellent to clothing and exposed skin, and use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months.

"Take a walk through your yard so you can see where water is collecting," McNelly advises.

He offers these suggestions:

- Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and broken appliances
- Turn over empty pots and buckets
- Replace the water in birdbaths and pet dishes at least once a week
- Clean out eaves, troughs and gutters
- Pick up beverage containers and cups
- Drain water from boats and tarps
- Cover windows and doors with screens
- Avoid over-watering your lawn
- Maintain the proper chemistry in swimming pools, and empty plastic pools when not in use

Mosquitoes can transmit serious diseases including West Nile virus, Eastern Equine Encephalitis and St. Louis Encephalitis virus.

According to the Centers for Disease Control, the chance that a person will become ill from a single mosquito bite remains low. The risk of severe illness and death is highest for people older than 50.

Symptoms of a mosquito-transmitted virus include fever, headache, tiredness, dizziness and confusion. West Nile virus also may cause a rash or muscle weakness.

Animals can get sick from mosquito bites, too. Horses should be vaccinated against Eastern Equine Encephalitis and West Nile virus. Cats and dogs should receive monthly heartworm treatments.

During the peak mosquito season, May through October, Volusia County ramps up its mosquito-control efforts, which include stocking ponds with minnows, managing production sites on tidal wetlands, and spraying with trucks and helicopters.

Memories will be all that are left of shuttle

It's not about spinoffs. It's not about experiments. It's not even about jobs. It's about leading the way. It's about the Final Frontier. About the adventure, the beauty, and the risk of spaceflight. That's what space shuttle flights mean to me.

I approach every shuttle launch with a mixture of dread and anticipation. I've covered more than a hundred launches for WESH-2. Memories of the worst are inseparable with memories of the best. I've seen what can go wrong when rocket engines ignite or when a shuttle lands, and I can't forget those things as I approach the launch of Atlantis on STS-135.

Nor can I forget the

serene feeling of weightlessness, which I experienced on a NASA training flight. I'll always feel privileged to call people like Story Musgrave, Bob Sieck, and the late Guenter Wendt my friends. And I can't forget the beauty: the orange and white smoke and steam clouds of liftoff, the amazing blue of the Earth seen from space, and the contrails streaming off the wingtips of a landing orbiter in the morning sun. I love the drama of the

shuttle's predawn final inspection, when a small team peers through the vapor clouds that hiss from the engines and relief vents of a fueled shuttle.

The space shuttle is the most successful but least appreciated spacecraft of all time. Flying the shuttle for 30 years is an extraordinary, even stunning accomplishment on the part of the technicians and engineers of the Kennedy Space Center. And when I talk to them about the end of the Space Shuttle Age, they don't lament their own loss of income. They don't talk about their mortgage payments or their children's college funds.

They talk about losing world leadership in space

exploration. They talk about a retreat from the Final Frontier. They talk about dismantling the most talented team of space professionals ever assembled.

So that's what I'll miss: the vision. The true believers who process and launch the shuttle are sure that they are on the doorstep of the future. They, too, love the adventure and the risk and the beauty of spaceflight.

Now we're left with a lot of memories and a lot of knowledge. And both will fade unless we keep using them.

type of a fashion show if that was student driven," Jim Trager, principal of New Smyrna Beach High said. "I think the fashion show is a neat idea."

Ms. Wait said that when she visited Seminole schools the students were largely complying with the dress code.

"At the elementary and middle, they're neat and orderly," she said. "At the high-school level, I was surprised by the high level of compliance. I maybe saw three students out of compliance, and those were shorts."

Under the new policy, students can wear nothing on the head, except with administrator permission for medical, religious, or school-activity reasons. That includes hats, visors, hoods, bandanas, and sunglasses.

Shirts must overlap belt lines, and those that hang to mid-thigh must be tucked in. Tops must cover the chest shoulder to shoulder. Shorts, skirts and dresses must cover to at least mid-thigh. Pants and shorts must completely cover undergarments and the buttocks. Cleats, slippers and shoes with

wheels are banned from campuses, with some exceptions.

Principals may permit cheerleading uniforms — which don't otherwise comply with the code — and grant other exceptions related to "school sponsored activities or programs."

Ms. Wait said last October about 4,000 people took an

online survey about implementing a dress code. She said there was strong support for uniforms.

"Significantly, most people who responded were parents," she said. "About 75 percent. Then we had some students, some teachers and some members of the public. Eighty percent felt a district-wide dress code should

be established, and they were leaning toward it being more stringent."

Under the adopted policy, individual schools may require uniforms that include "collared shirts, sleeves, khaki or dark pants or shorts." Allowed shirts could be school colors. In an informal survey of some middle- and high-school principals, all said they would give students a chance to comply with the district dress code before considering uniforms.

Details of the dress code are at the district's website, myvolusiaschools.org. Additionally, Ms. Wait will use the district's robo-call system, Direct Connect, to advise parents of the dress-code policy in July, and again in August. She's also asking schools to put announcements about the new dress code on their marquees and websites.

Bob Wallace, principal of Seabreeze High, said he believes students may grumble about the new dress code, but will adhere to it.

"I'm sure they'll do a good job in compliance," he said. "I think our kids understand what's required of them."

decision in the near future to put it to use after dispatch operations cease in October when Volusia County introduces its countywide dispatch service.

Kent Donahue, Special Assistant to the City Manager, said some of the options considered were to put in a business incubator, move the information technology department to the building, or clear the lot for future development.

He said officials are leaning towards the business incubator option, adding the building is desirable to businesses due to its visibility, high traffic location, access, and the presence of a broadcast tower in the backyard.

"It's a great opportunity," Mr. Donahue said, "not only for the city, but for small businesses."

The city's incubation site would not be affiliated with the University of Central Florida's Business Incubation Program, which is scheduled to open a site at the Daytona Beach International Airport on July 27.

UCF currently has eight incubator sites — the Daytona location will be the ninth — which collectively helped create about 1,700 jobs in the Central Florida area since the incubation program began in 1999.

A decision on whether the Port Orange building will be used as an incubator is unlikely to come until after October because the communications center is still operating.

Mr. Donahue also said the building would continue to function as the emergency operations center because the existing equipment in the building is designed to accommodate advanced emergency communica-

tions in the event of a hurricane or brushfire.

But he suggested officials could separate the business from the emergency operations center to provide some office space.

"You can block off those two sections and do something upfront for a business starting out," he said.

Debbie Connors, Executive Director of the Port Orange-South Daytona Chamber of Commerce, said the Chamber is enthusiastic about the concept.

"We love the idea," she said. "We're planning on working with (city staff) on it to try to get it going."

She added she had initial conversations with staff from the Small Business Development Center at Daytona State College and Volusia County's Department of Economic Development, with the goal of utilizing local resources to develop the incubator.

Ms. Connors said she is pleased Port Orange is working to be more business friendly, adding she believes the proposed incubator's location will serve to benefit the city and the businesses involved.

"I'm looking forward to working with the city on it," she said. "It's a choice location, in the center of town. It'll provide great opportunities."

Local woman creates one-of-a-kind dolls

PORT ORANGE — Judie St. Onge's dolls aren't for cuddling.

Rather, they are for collectors or serious admirers of unique figurative art — dolls that are shaped, baked in her own home oven, and then turned into a pirate, a wizard, an elf or even an eloquently dressed equestrian riding a rocking horse.

The Port Orange resident has been a miniature enthusiast for more than 40 years, and started making small items such as chairs, tables and other accessories that could be used in dollhouses.

"But then the dollhouses were no longer a challenge for me because I'd done it all," Ms. St. Onge said. "Then I found out about this and it was so challenging that I loved it."

Each of her dolls is made of polymer clay, a sculpting plastic medium sold in most craft or hobby stores, she said.

A retired property manager who moved to Florida

from California 15 years ago, Ms. St Onge said she enjoys scouring yard and estate sales for clothing and tiny items she can use to make her one-of-a-kind products, which range in height from six to 12 inches. On one such excursion, she discovered a handful of tiny multi-colored parrots that quickly became part of her pirate doll.

"Sometimes I start out to make a woman doll and it turns out to be a guy," she said with a laugh. "A lot of my creativity comes from the fabric I find. Really, it takes hours and hours to make these, but I'm having a good time with it."

For example, pieces of sparkling silver fabric on a wizard doll was actually cut from a purse she found at a yard sale.

"I thought, 'Well, that's cool; that's wizard stuff,'" said Ms. St. Onge, and the character magically appeared, albeit after much deliberation to give it the right look.

She also loves to find thin leather gloves that she can transform into coats, boots

and hats. Old denim shirts can be used for work clothing, such as those worn by her wrench-wielding mechanic that has a price tag of \$75. The sleeves from lace blouses become long, flowing skirts and charms from vintage jewelry are used for fashion accessories.

St Onge even makes use of such things as yarn, ribbon, wire, fur, feathers and artificial flowers.

"It's amazing what I can find to make things," she said.

She once read that in order to be called a doll maker that you have to make at least 20 of them. With a smile accompanying her words, she noted that she's past that number.

"So, I guess I'm a doll maker," she said.

When asked what he thought of his wife's handiwork, Ms. St Onge's 72-year-old husband Rich, whom she married 26 years ago, calmly surveyed the kitchen counter filled with imagina-

tive characters — some of which took her as long as a month to complete.

"I think she's more creative that she even realizes," said Mr. St. Onge.

Ms. St. Onge is a member of the One Of A Kind Miniature Doll Maker's Guild, a local chapter of the National Association of Miniature Enthusiasts that started last year in May, as well as a group called the Daytona Ideals Miniature Enthusiasts Club, which was founded in 1971.

before sentencing as conditions of his pretrial release, Court Operations Supervisor Anita Justin said.

He also agreed to an evaluation for substance and alcohol abuse while awaiting his sentence.

"Someone will evaluate him and decide if he needs (treatment) or not," Ms. Justin said, but would not specify why the evaluation was recommended.

Mr. Mitchell faces up to 10 years in prison, and must also pay \$13,749 in restitution to City Attorney Scott Simpson, according to his plea agreement.

The agreement states he is also the subject of two separate investigations by the U.S. Secret Service and the FBI unrelated to the bribery. These investigations concern mortgage and bank fraud, including criminal charges of bank fraud, wire fraud, mail fraud, money laundering, for-

gery and lying to a federally insured financial institution.

Those charges, the document says, will be dealt with in a separate charging document and plea agreement.

Mr. Mitchell and Mr. Clifton were charged on June 3 with accepting bribes from an unidentified "investors' representative" to help reduce \$241,000 in city code enforcement liens on the River Club Condominiums.

In his capacity as special magistrate, Mr. Mitchell reduced the liens to \$12,500 at a code hearing on July 8, 2010.

According to documents from the U.S. Attorney's Office, the fine reduction was not on the meeting agenda and was reduced to an amount he previously discussed with Mr. Clifton and the "investors' representative." He was fired from his position as special magistrate five days after the meeting.

Minutes from the meeting show a man named Stuart Buchanan - a former city employee who currently works as a planner for Bre-

vard County - spoke at the hearing, identifying himself as a representative of Waverly Properties, the broker of the River Club Condominiums. He said he was speaking at the request of the mayor and was seeking the lien reductions so the property would be more attractive to a potential buyer.

When reached at his Brevard County office and asked about his involvement with the River Club Condominiums, Mr. Buchanan said, "I've told you all (the news media) to stop calling me at work."

The Daytona Beach News-Journal quoted Ramara Garrett, the owner of Waverly Properties, as saying Mr. Buchanan has never represented Waverly Properties. Calls to Ms. Garrett for further comment were not returned.

While Mr. Mitchell and Mr. Clifton are awaiting sentencing, the "investors' representative" has not been identified or charged with a crime.

Innovation, Volusia County's unemployment rate is at 10.5 percent, down from 11.4 percent last year. About 27,000 unemployed Volusians are seeking work.

Statewide, unemployment in May was 10.6 percent, the lowest since August, 2009. Nearly a million Floridians are unemployed.

Mr. McKinney said Volusians get about \$16 billion annually in various forms of income. He's unsure how much Internet and other forms of out-of-area buying costs the local economy.

"I think we can come up with a reasonable estimate of how much money leaks out of the county," he said. "Let's say it's 30 percent. Thirty percent is \$5 billion. If we could keep just 10 percent of that in the county, that's a lot of jobs."

To get Volusians buying at home, Buy Volusia will have several features, according to Mr. McKinney. The county will share its database of business licenses to help create an online system for shoppers to have an easier way to see if local businesses might have the goods or services they're seeking.

"The software we have will pull from the county's business licenses and populate the site," Mr. McKinney said. "They can search for a business, a product, or by someone's name if they know it. They can search by city."

Additionally, the Daytona Regional Chamber is seeking to get cities, businesses and other chambers to join in creating a shopper-rewards program that would be promoted online, along with advertising and posters.

"Businesses will give discounts at point of sale," Mr. McKinney said.

"Those purchases will accumulate points that you can go online and redeem." Neither Mr. Ehlinger or Mr. McKinney were certain how long it'll be before Volusia shoppers are carrying Buy Volusia reward cards.

"I'm optimistic by the end of the year," Mr. Ehlinger said. "It would be nice to have it by the holiday shopping season."

We'll have an incredibly easy pineapple pie thanks to my favorite beautician, Gina Thompson, and Flora Hull's pineapple cake, which comes with a very special story. All the desserts can be made low-fat or fat-free, and I promise you won't be able to tell the difference.

FLORA'S PINEAPPLE CAKE

This cake was always fat-free. By using the egg substitute, you can make it cholesterol-free, as well.

- 2 eggs or egg substitute
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1 large (20-ounce) can crushed pineapple in its own juice

Beat eggs and sugar together. Add flour and baking soda. Mix thoroughly. Stir in pineapple and juice. Pour into a 9x12 pan that has been sprayed with cooking spray or greased and floured. Bake at 350 for 35-45 minutes until a

toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

You can stop here and sprinkle the cooled cake with powdered sugar, or you can follow the original recipe and top it with cream cheese frosting. The cake is frosted while it is still warm.

CREAM CHEESE FROSTING

This frosting can only be made low-fat, not fat-free. Fat-free cream cheese becomes runny when beaten.

- 8 ounces cream cheese, regular or low-fat
- 2 tablespoons butter or a butter substitute, softened
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/2 box 10X confectioner's sugar, sifted if necessary

Using an electric mixer, beat the cream cheese, butter and vanilla together. Add sugar.

Note: The mixture will seem extremely stiff. Do NOT add milk. As you beat in the sugar, it will melt and

soften. Add more sugar only if necessary.

GINA THOMPSON'S PINEAPPLE PIE (NIB) Regular and low-fat, serves 8-10

If you have 10 minutes, you can make this superb dessert. By using fat-free sour cream and a low-fat graham cracker pie shell (Keebler), you will have a rich-tasting yet low-fat dessert.

Keebler also makes a large pie shell, which will fit the filling, but it does not come low-fat.

Put pudding in and always has been fat-free.

- 1 regular size store bought graham cracker pie shell
- 1 large (5.1-ounce) package vanilla instant pudding, regular or sugar free
- 1 large (16-ounce) container sour cream
- 1 large (20-ounce) can crushed pineapple in its own juice

The pie shell does not

require baking, but I have found that 10 minutes in a 350-degree pre-heated oven will give you a crisper, more flavorful crust.

While shell is baking, blend sour cream with pudding powder (do not prepare according to package directions). Add pineapple and juice, blend well. Pour into cooled pie shell and chill.

Serve with whipped topping or canned whipped cream.

Get out of town and play a round at beautiful Punta Espada

There is something special about getting out of town to play golf. Head to one of the most beautiful courses and places I have ever visited and the trip becomes indescribable.

That place is Cap Cana in the Dominican Republic. I was fortunate enough a few years back to cover the inaugural Champions Tour event there and simply fell in love with the people and the resort.

Cap Cana is on the eastern tip of the island of Hispaniola and is a quick flight away from most of South Florida's airports. Constructed just outside Punta Cana on 30,000 acres of land featuring 3.5 miles of pristine white-sand beaches, lush vegetation and a limestone bluff that provides dramatic views of the turquoise-blue sea, it could easily be heaven on earth. The development is putting the final touches on its second of three planned Jack Nicklaus-designed courses. Already completed are a sprawling clubhouse

and pool, bungalows, models of the residential property you can purchase, one of the largest man-made marinas in the Caribbean, the Golden Bear Club and Spa, the luxurious Secrets Sanctuary hotel, a world-class tennis facility, a polo and equestrian center, cafes and a European-style casino.

Punta Espada (Tip of the Sword) is the original course on the development and quite possibly my favorite golf course in the world. The course begins its visual festivities at the first tee. From atop a 30-foot bluff, you can see most of the golf course, the beaches and the Caribbean Sea. The course features five sets of tees, allowing you to play the course anywhere from 5,052 to 7,396 yards.

With the prevailing breeze

coming from the northeast, you have to make your club selection very carefully. Fortunately, Cap Cana continues the Caribbean tradition of caddies. My caddie, Rolando, was fantastic. Just from watching me warm up before my round he had a good idea of giving me the right distance and club suggestions. His help on the undulating greens saved me several strokes.

In all, 15 holes have views of the sea. Eight of the holes play to, from or along the sea. There are seven holes where the green is nearly surrounded or framed by the surf. There are also large bunkers and coquina rock areas framing the lush green of the fairways and greens.

The sixth hole is a par-5 with an unusual feature.

Located down the left side of this dog-leg left is a large vertical rock sink hole. Getting to this green in two will require a bold second shot over this crevasse.

The hole most photographed at Punta Espada is the 13th. This downwind par-3 that plays a stout 249 yards from the tips is truly spectacular and requires you to carry the ball over the sea onto a large green. There is room to bail-out to the right, but your pitch shot is back toward the splashing sea.

The finishing holes run to and along the sea. If you thought your tee shot at 13 was unnerving, the one at 17 will test you, as well. Once again, you must tee off over the sea to the fairway. Being a short hole, it also

Around the corner at the great writer's real favorite watering hole, we looked for my business card among the thousands on the walls. I had placed it there more than 10 years ago, so our search was futile.


Great art museums beckoned us in, and the paintings there amazed us.
